

Vancouver's record row could be war zone

Vancouver's Seymour Street, dubbed "record row" is apparently being closely monitored by domestic and foreign retail giants. HMV, a major British chain, was one of the first to indicate an interest in opening in Western Canada, but not specifically Vancouver. This organization recently took over the Mister Sound and Sherman retail chain, and its president, Tony Hirsch, is involved in making major changes to the chain and acquiring top management people.

More direct in their nod to Vancouver is Tower Records, a giant U.S. record store chain with 44 stores across the U.S. as well as stores in Japan and the U.K. It's purely speculation at press time, however, insiders are confident there will be an announcement shortly.

A major factor in the rumours of more record stores on the strip, to join A&B Sound and A&A Records & Tapes, is the availability of property, some of which was recently purchased. Sam The Record Man has reportedly bought a building next to A&B Sound, but Sam's Jason Sniderman is non-committal.

It has also been rumoured that A&A would expand in the downtown core, but Peter Parrish, Vice President of National Marketing for Sound Insight, says there is "nothing in the plans for Vancouver at this

point," continuing with, "We certainly look to further expansion in Vancouver, but it's not high on our agenda by any means." He does point out however, that they are opening a store in Calgary, "one of our major street stores . . . but that's not until April."

Parrish also quashes the persistent rumours of the takeover of A&A by W.H. Smith, a major record retailer in the U.K.,

A&M scores double play with Western promotions

Bill Ott, A&M's Vice President of Sales and Marketing, has announced that Al Harrison and Greg Barkley have been promoted to positions of Director of the Western Division and Regional Manager (Alberta/Saskatchewan), respectively.

Harrison, who has been with A&M for 15 years, became Assistant Branch Manager in the West in 1977, rising to positions of Branch Manager and Division Manager, covering Vancouver and East to Alberta. His

responsibilities have increased as the company has grown and include overseeing A&M's staff of Sales, Promotion, Customer Service reps and, more recently Retail Information Coordinators, from the Manitoba border West.

Barkley has been with the label for almost 7 years as a sales rep for Edmonton-Calgary and then Calgary-Saskatoon.

"These promotions, along with the recent addition of an Edmonton-based Sales and Promotion rep and a Regional Retail Coordinator re-confirm our commitment to better serve the market," said Ott, continuing with "Harrison will now be in a position to direct the entire Western operation with Barkley assuming control of day-to-day responsibilities in Alberta and Saskatchewan."

Both appointments are effective immediately.

Pringle to co-host Miss Teen Canada date

Peter Pringle, currently starring in his one-man show, Noel Coward - A Portrait, will be co-hosting and performing on this year's Miss Teen Canada Pageant (Mar. 7). This is Pringle's fourth year as host of the pageant, which will be telecast by CTV. He will co-host with New York-based Canadian singer/actress Danielle Kiraly.

There are forty-two teens from across Canada taking part in the pageant, many of whom were sponsored, in part, by their local radio stations.

Special guests will include WEA's Frozen Ghost (Arnold Lanni and Wolf Hassel), last year's Juno winners (Most Promising Group).

Dave Evans, former president of Capitol Records-EMI Canada, has launched the Free Access Network (a.k.a FAN) for the Metropolitan Toronto area. FAN is described as Canada's "largest computerized advertising media," with offices now in Winnipeg, Calgary and Toronto, and soon to open in Vancouver and Ottawa.

Mainline features include daily news, weather, sports, electronic shopping world information, classified advertising, an electronic mail service, plus entertainment news.

"The concept of FAN is fascinating," says Evans "Just imagine . . . a computerized newspaper, accessible 24 hours a day, 365 days a year." He concludes with "Computer media is the trend of the future, which is obvious by the overall response to our project: more than 100,000 in the Toronto area in 16 weeks."

Satallites gaining on national front

The Sattalites are currently making strong national gains with their latest Axe single, Gimme Some Kinda Sign. This single is a remake of the Brenton Wood release of the '60s).

The Toronto-based band recently completed a seven-day mini tour of the Atlantic provinces which included dates in Dalhousie and Halifax. They also played Toronto's Bamboo Club for four nights over Valentine's day, playing to sold-out crowds each night.

Interestingly enough, the band used their reggae-style of music to raise money for a new bobsled for Jamaica's seven-member team, who crashed their sled (training sleds have wheels). \$15,000 was needed for a new bobsled, and the Satallites were only too willing to perform a benefit for the team at Toronto's El Mocambo. The Jamaican team made it to the Olympics, the first time they had entered the games, and were very appreciative of the help they received.

Radio may be getting a little bit stagnant

I was ready for the move from Q107 to Standard. After ten years, I felt it was time for a change.

Sure, I was apprehensive about leaving the friends I had, but I was looking forward to the challenge of CKFM with its different format. But radio is radio. It's a matter of adjusting the way you think, and there's

Cohen's new album, *I'm Your Man*, which features his own version of *First We'll Take Manhattan*, will ship shortly.

Technics introduces new SL-P1200X CD player

With compact discs becoming a priority with broadcasters and club operators, Technics increases their visibility in this professional arena with their new SL-P1200X CD player.

The new player features the 600 ohm balanced output with switchable output level (-20 dbm, 0 dbm, 4 dbm). Matching the signal output with its application on the mixing board allows the new player to be compatible with the user's professional audio requirements.

As well, a wired remote (with start, stop and pause functions) enabling more than one player to be operated from the production console. The player can also be hooked up to a computer, becoming an integral part of an audio/video production system, allowing direct access to any point on a track or precise edit capability (interface required).

The auto-cue button is another important feature which should interest the professionals. Each track can be cued up to the start of audio, for tight cueing. All of the access, speed and cueing features have disable buttons which remove them from the circuit when not in use. As well, there is the auto-space button. This inserts a 3 second pause between tracks to ensure silence-sensing search systems on tape decks.

The new player carries a suggested retail price of \$2,400.00 (MSL).

"Live" listening session for Sire's Underworld

In order to punch home the "live" on their new live to tape LP, *Underneath The Radar*, Underworld, formerly Freur, sporting a few changes, supplied the Toronto media with a rare "live" listening session. Done up in proper style - beer, wine and lots of veggies and dippins, the WEA Music crew were out in force for this Sire extravaganza. Needless to say, this British group's manager, Charly Prevost, a Canadian, was an influencing factor in the Toronto setting for the listening session.

As a point of interest, CFNY-FM will be airing the listening session, complete with the "oohs" and "ahs" and applause of the audience. As the station's PD, Don Berns, pointed out "This is the first time a 'live' listening session has been presented in this fashion." The station was the first to give exposure to the band's LP, and are leaning heavily on the title track and *Rubber Ball* (Space Kitchen), which will be released as a single within the next few weeks.

Springsteen moves out on Tunnel Of Love tour

Bruce Springsteen begins his *Tunnel Of Love Express* tour in Worcester, Mass (Feb. 25). There are no Canadian dates at time of writing, but CBS Canada execs are hopeful of summer dates for a few major Canadian centres.

Joining Springsteen on the tour will be his *E Street Band*, plus the *La Bamba* horns.

The *Tunnel Of Love* LP, has now passed the 3-times platinum mark in Canada - the first country in the world to achieve that level.

When his days of playing guitar with April Wine were quickly coming to an end, Brian Greenway discovered he had many other talents that had, for many years, been left untapped, among them: songwriting. While the band, that had been his gravy train for the past seven years, was recording their last album in 1984, Greenway hooked up with producer Marty Simon with an idea to record his own album.

"It was always Myles Goodwyn's band," he recalls. "He (Goodwyn) wrote all the songs . . . he was doing all the singing and producing. I just found that I wanted to go on and do my own project. I wanted to have my own sound and approach to my own solo project."

Three years later Greenway's self-titled debut has arrived, via Atlantic Records and courtesy of Bud Prager himself. The latter, Foreigner's manager, with his "power and clout", simply walked into Doug Morris' office and had the deal signed before the project was actually completed, Greenway informs. The old adage "It's not what you know . . . it's who you know" ringing very

loudly as the ink dried.

After meeting Simon, who took his "scattered" ideas and "put them in a direction so I could go forward," Greenway had such luminaries as Alex Lifeson, Aldo Nova and Andy Newmark record with him. "The whole thing kept growing," he continues. "Like throwing a rock into a pond: the ripples got bigger and bigger, with more and more people involved in it."

Even though a large crew was assembled over time, Greenway feels he "caught" a band feeling, nonetheless, without really trying. "I'm not saying there was a group in the studio, but we were very lucky. Even Bud says this is the most near-perfect recording situation on a project he's ever seen. We had the time to do it . . . and the luxury of knowing the people who were playing, and there were no hot heads . . . no prima donnas, there was nobody getting in the way."

The experience of recording and touring with April Wine has obviously paid dividends, with respect to the business side of the industry. Yet Greenway isn't really too sure of his songs. He knows they've changed since the demo stage; his lyrics have been added too, and his arrangements moved about, but the final mixes are what he was after in

the first place, he believes.

"Coming out of April Wine," he explains, "we had hits, and some damn good ones, but I didn't want to come off being just an offshoot of April Wine. I didn't necessarily sit down with some sound in mind, it was just the way the songs would come out on my Porta Studio. It just started to develop a sound of its own . . . with me playing all the instruments.

"When we got down to having the next stage of pre-production bringing in the other people, who start doing better demos just to see what the meat sounds like, or getting people like Tracy Howe to write some additional lyrics, when Marty and I didn't feel that the lyrics were strong enough, the way the music was sounding . . . the whole thing evolved into its own.

"It wasn't intentional that it came out sounding any way, other than the way it did, if that makes sense . . . it grew on its own. We didn't say 'we want it to sound like this or to sound like that'. There was a lot of different input that all made the one sound rather than me saying 'it's gotta sound like Bon Jovi or the old April Wine hits.' I didn't want it to sound like the past. I wanted it to sound like the future."

Greenway did have a plan at the outset: to have a number one record. However, he couldn't see the forest for all the trees, so his songs got torn apart, built and rebuilt. What was left is now his debut. There are a couple of potential hits, sleepers, but his label, stateside (he was signed directly) will have other priorities in the forthcoming months.

Mainstream American arena rock sells, but to get there takes a lot of hard work, just ask Bryan Adams - not just the "power and clout" or management. Of course, it also takes talent. However, what will be interesting is just which one has the most influence in these forthcoming months.

Axe releases new O Canada

Axe Records has shipped a newly recorded version of O Canada. The vocalist on the single is pop singer Doreen Smith, who is familiar to radio listeners as the voice behind recordings by the girl group Bijou. The keyboard work is by Peter Beacock, longtime member of Major Hoopes Boarding House.

Southside readies promo for Hott Waxx launch

With the Australian record industry beginning to heat up internationally again, the Southside label with offices in Canada and the U.S., are readying the launch of a 12" E.P. by Hott Waxx (a/k/a Wickety Wax, down under). The set is a compilation of tracks taken from the band's first and second albums, both of which were quite successful in Australia and New Zealand.

However, when the rights for the act were not exercised for territories outside their homeland, Southside sought out the deal which has seen an ongoing alliance between Paul Ewart, (the band's manager and director of one of Australia's most aggressive entertainment operations), Dan Friedman of Modern Art Music in Los Angeles; and Paul Clinch, whose entities include Mister Chris Music Productions and Publishing and who is also in charge of operations at Southside Canada.

In arranging the set, which included remakes of Bend Me Shape Me, and I Can't Help Myself, a remix was done, transcontinental style, utilizing the services of FAX and Bell, by the band's producer/arranger Geoff Wilkes and Canadian producer Paul

Bechamp's new single ushers in new name

After what has been described as "a great deal of trouble establishing a coherent pronunciation," Debbie Bechamp has become Debbie Bay-Shaw. The new name emerged with the release of her latest single, Time To Move Along, the title track from her new Big Peach LP.

The label's Director, Peter Komisar explains, "Even in French speaking parts of Ontario and Quebec, the rather uncommon French name was frequently misinterpreted as 'Beauchamp'."

Bay-Shaw premiered her new song, and her new name on the Tommy Hunter Show in

January. The single follows All I Ever Need Is You, which was popular with country programmers in several markets, and still enjoys good airplay.

Bay-Shaw has been touring Central and Western Canada extensively with her band, promoting her new LP. She will begin a second Western tour in the spring, after which she will take a break to work on her new LP.

Clinch. The masters were then edited in Toronto by Clinch and Ken Friesen to single and dance formats.

Hott Waxx have been awarded the title of Expo '88's Official Ambassadors, where they will be featured, representing the name acts from the Australian recording industry.

CBS acts get nod at British awards show

CBS acts were in the winner's circle at the recent British Record Industry awards show. George Michael walked away with the Best British Male Artist of the Year award, while Alison Moyet received the female counterpart (she also won in 1985).

Michael Jackson won in the Best International Solo Artist category, and Terence Trent D'Arby was honoured as Best International Newcomer. Ironically, both these CBS acts will be performing solo on the Grammy Awards (Mar. 2) from New York City's Radio City Music Hall.

D'Arby's debut album, Introducing The Hardline According To . . . has now passed the gold mark in Canada. It's expected he will be playing several Canadian cities in April.

Kymlicka into studios for fourth album

Milan Kymlicka, already established as one of the leading figures in Cancon instrumental recordings, will shortly enter studios in Toronto to record his fourth LP. The album is being co-produced and engineered by George Semkiw.

The digitally-produced album will feature a 30-piece orchestra, along with programmed synthesizers. Synthesizer pre-production will be done by Score Productions, using a MacIntosh midi-system and a Fairlight CMI. The final recording will be done at Toronto's Manta Sound.

The album is being produced with the assistance of FACTOR, and will be available on compact disc, and cassette with release on the Firmus label, distributed by Electric.

Hart-Rouge to Toronto for date at El Mocambo

Hart-Rouge, a francophone band from Saint-Boniface, Manitoba, will finally hit the stage in Toronto to a hopefully, more appreciative audience. The last time they played Toronto, they performed for a total audience of three. They were showcasing for a Soviet delegation, checking out the arts in Canada. The band has since played festivals, fairs, concert halls, and even opened for Glass Tiger and Red Rider last year in Regina.

Ironically, Hart-Rouge has performed more often in Saskatchewan and France than in Toronto or Montreal. They were also well received in Poland and Louisiana.

Now, they're coming back to Toronto and the El Mocambo, Mar. 8, which will serve as a showcase for their first English-language single, The Heart Of The Matter, released on Traffic/CBS.

The band's most recent TV special, shot on location as they toured the country, is being shipped by the Paradise Venture Group and a further announcement will be made as soon as dates and networks become available.

Ray/Kearney material to Halifax Chronicle Herald

The all-Canadian music nostalgia column, researched and written by Randy Ray and Mark Kearney is now featured in the Halifax Chronicle Herald.

The Herald, Nova Scotia's largest daily newspaper, is the 18th paper to publish the Ray/Kearney column, joining the Toronto Sun, London Free Press, Oshawa Times, Saskatoon Star-Phoenix, and the Moncton-Times Transcript.

The Ray/Kearney column, which reunites readers with performers they grew up with in the '50s, '60s, '70s and '80s has also appeared on an occasional basis in 12 other newspapers, including Goldmine, a U.S.-based record collector's tabloid with a circulation in the U.S. Canada, Europe and Australia. Kearney points out that theirs is the only regular music nostalgia column of its kind in Canada and appears before more than 600,000 readers each week.

Ray, Parliament Hill Bureau Chief for the London Free Press in Ottawa, and Kearney, a senior information officer with the Ontario Ministry of Education in Toronto, have compiled and published information on more than 70 Canadian artists, and the list continues to grow. These include Dennis Doherty of the Mamas & Papas, Terry and Susan Jacks, The Diamonds, Ken Tobias, The Ugly Ducklings, Little Caesar & The Consuls, Bobby Curtola, Terry Black, A Foot In Cold Water and many more.

Ray and Kearney have been relentless in their search for Cancon artists who had disappeared from their usual haunts. They found Susan Jacks in Nashville, where she lives with her husband and former CFL player Ted Dushinski; Bobby (now Bob) Curtola was located in Edmonton, where he lives when he's not performing in Las Vegas; and Ken Tobias was found in Toronto, where he has taken up painting.

Now And Zen

The former Zep frontman rocks and he rolls, and that's evident, and yet with each subsequent solo album, his yearning romanticism continues to evolve so eloquently. He has never taken a step backward - Ship Of Fools is a great example. Then why involve Jimmy Page, whose guitar work is ably and nostalgically noted by the familiar Zoex trademark, in work such as this? Heaven Knows will undoubtedly spiral up radio charts and retailers will have a field day initially; though, as with all Plant solo efforts, the music is practically addictive and the singles will therefore roll one after the other. A heavy seller right through to the summer months and his anticipated tour.

AC/DC - Rock
Blow Up Your Video
Atlantic - 78-18281-P

Stock up on this one. Sure to be a hot seller, and justifiably so, for the next few months at least. The band's latest

is preceded by their wild reputation and this production certainly allows the "bad boy" image to remain intact. Right from Heat Seeker to This Means War, the real adolescents (and those pretending to be) are going to eat this one up. Pretenders, step aside, this one's for real, and AC/DC are back in black.



STRANGE ADVANCE - Pop/Rock
The Distance Between
Current/Capitol - CLT-48550-F

Although the first single, Love Becomes Electric, didn't exactly burn up the charts nationwide, their second, Till The Stars Fall, should break this popular duo back into prominence once again. Other key tracks, including Hold You and Allen Time, will bolster support as well. This album will place the band back on the plateau that such songs as Home Of The Brave and We Ran had originally placed them. Also, an interesting and impressive list of guesting musicians and vocalists assist the work greatly.

THE GODFATHERS - Rock
Birth, School, Work, Death
Epic - BFE-40946-H

No foolin' around, these guys are here to stay, with some biting questions begging to be answered, mainly concerning time and the lack of it. Good stuff, over and over again. The label should mount a big push at retail. This band has potential this year.

STEWART COPELAND - Instrumental
The Equalizer And Other Cliff Hangers
I.R.S. - IRS-42099-J

Actually the third in the label's No Speak series, written and performed by

former Police percussionist Copeland. It's about as exciting as instrumentals get, but give credit for attempts at innovation in the rock arena, though seemingly taking off where Tubular Bells left the form originally and Jan Hammer picked it up.

NOISEWORKS - Pop/Rock
Self-titled - Columbia - BFC-44138-H

Nothing too terribly spectacular here, yet stands out as another example of Australian consistency and, as in the game of hockey, the more shots on net, the more chances of goals. The bands creating a stir from downunder, are opening many more slots for bands such as Noiseworks, who have opened up tours for both the Eurythmics and Paul Young in their homeland previously. A band to definitely watch.




ROBERT BURTON - Rock

Here's an example of real genius at work. A seasoned songwriter/performer, Albert Hall patches into the sports field with this tribute to the National Alpine Ski Team. I Want You, featuring the entire Men's and Women's National Alpine Ski Team, has been taken as a single, and programmer reaction, although slow, is beginning to pick up with the excitement surrounding the Calgary Olympic Games. Also key is There Will Never Be Another You, featuring Patrice Black. Ron Burrows produced, with the exception of Will It Be This Year and The Gift, co-produced by Ronn Dann and Ray Parker, and both key tracks.



EDDY RAVEN - Country
The Best Of - RCA/BMG - 6815-1-R-N

There aren't too many Raven singles that don't hit the charts, and he's doing it now with I'm Gonna Get You. Also key are Sometimes A Lady and Shine Shine Shine. Crossover potential is obvious. Various producers.

Increasing CD market for country releases

"There's definitely a market out there for country compact discs," says WEA's Bill Johnston, "and we're going after it."

The penetration of compact discs into retail has been growing steadily, representing up to 10 percent of the market at present.

"We release, almost simultaneously, compact discs of established country acts," Johnston continues, "but with the brand new artist, we wait for a short period of time, but we're selling astonishing numbers, pop-type numbers of country CDs. Country product customers are obviously more sophisticated in their tastes than we give them credit."

The latest to join WEA's CD release folio is Hank Williams Jr., with his Born To Boogie LP. Also enjoying good CD sales are Randy Travis and Blue Rodeo. The latter's Outskirts LP, has just been released in the U.S.

Charlie Camilleri of CBS is also impressed with the increase in CDs for CBS country product. "We're getting some decent CD numbers with our country product," says Camilleri. "Rosanne Cash has sold over 3,000 pieces and with Ricky Van Shelton, we started out selling only vinyl LPs and cassettes. He had a couple of hits, and we decided to release a CD of his LP, and zowie, we hit paydirt. He's already sold more than 1700 pieces of CDs alone."

Camilleri continues with, "We were hesitant in releasing CD country product, because country record buyers were tape buyers primarily, and I remember it took a long time for them to switch from 8-track to cassette, but that kind of thinking has gone right out the window when it comes to CDs. It's pretty obvious to me that country record buyers have discovered the sound advantages of CD and I think we're going to see a rapid switch from black vinyl to CDs this year."

Lang was a winner in last year's Junos as Best Female Country Vocalist. Her popularity in Canada was due largely to the promotion and publicity she received from WEA Music, particularly the untiring efforts of Roger Desjardins, WEA's Artists Relations Manager, who opened many doors for the Edmonton vocalist. Lang is up against K.T. Oslin, Nancy Griffith, Libby Hurley and Dana McVicker. The Best New Male nominees are Ricky Van Shelton, Larry Boone, Marty Haggard, Lyle Lovett, and Jo-El Sonnier.

Other nominees are Randy Travis, who along with Hank Williams Jr. received multi-nominations: Entertainer, Top Male, Best Single, Album and Video. Williams won the Entertainer of the Year award last year, and Travis walked away with four awards.

Also nominated in the Top Male category are Ronnie Milsap, Steve Wariner and George Strait. The latter is also nominated in the Top Single, Album and Song categories.

Nominated for the Top Female category are Rosanne Cash, Crystal Gayle, Reba McEntire, Tanya Tucker and Kathy Mattea.

AM Stereo new frequency for CHSJ Saint John

After 50 years of broadcasting on 1150 kHz, CHSJ has switched to its new frequency of 700 on the AM dial. Ken Clark, President of New Brunswick Broadcasting Co., owners and operators of CHSJ Radio, explains that the Saint John station is now "broadcasting in AM Stereo, the first station in Southwestern New Brunswick and Western Nova Scotia with full stereo sound."

Modifications to the studio equipment included the construction of two new control rooms and a completely new transmitter site, located southwest of Saint John in Seaview.

Bob Henry, the station's Program Director, points out that "Broadcasting of this AM Stereo signal allows our listeners with AM Stereo radios to enjoy the station's full stereo sound."

meaning a wider variety of country music will be heard."
