Cinram's Philosophie sees end of vinyl problems

With vinyl album sales plummeting to 40 percent this past summer over the same period last year (RPM - Oct. 8/88), and predictions of even greater decreases, it's obvious the death knell has been sounded for black vinyl. However, caught in the squeeze are the independent labels who depend on the "7" vinyl single to introduce their acts and to act as a promotional vehicle for the black vinyl album. Many recording artists realize a sizeable income from the sale of their vinyl albums and singles to club and concert audiences. "There are still 18 million turntables out there," says Bob Stone, President of World Records, a major player in the supplying of vinyl product to the independent sector. "I'm back-ordered to the point where it's an almost impossible situation, and if things don't clear up soon, there are going to be a lot of casualties in the independent field."

Isidore Philosophie, President of Cinram, the only major vinyl manufacturer left in Canada, admits there has been a major problem with vinyl manufacturing, but expects the situation to settle shortly.

"I'm not denying that September was a tough month for the record industry in general," says Philosophie, continuing with "There were two problems: the fact that CBS closed the end of August and the panic that

followed was an exceptional brutal demand for some product to beat the October 1st deadline on the price increase because of the new royalty structure, and it's just not fair to the manufacturer to be blamed for not supplying the product when September has been a very unusual month. As well, the transition period between CBS product to Cinram has also been a problem. It takes time to go from one plant to another."

Philosophie is confident, however, that Cinram is capable of filling the needs of the industry. "Let me assure you, that the record companies are getting the product they want and you can find vinyl product in the stores. Inside of the next two weeks maximum, everything will be back to normal."

Most of the complaints, however, are coming from the small Canadian independent labels, and Philosophie was asked if the needs of the independents are being looked after. "We are taking care of the independent labels and, again, let me say that we have gone through a very demanding few weeks, but it will level out within a couple of weeks. The record industry seems to have forgotten

Pioneer record retailer Mac Kenner dead at 77

Mac Kenner, highly respected record retailer who has been retired for several years, passed away in Toronto October 18th. He was in his 77th year.

Mr. Kenner and his wife Alice launched Canada's first record and book superstore on Yonge Street in downtown Toronto in 1946. Eaton's and Heintzman were the only competitors in the downtown core for this unique "Mom and Pop" record store, which Mr. Kenner named A&A Records & Books. He chose the name because it would give him an upfront listing in the Yellow Pages.

Mac and Alice were the darlings of the record industry for several years, building their stock to the point where Mr. Kenner proudly claimed they carried the largest inventory of any record store in the world. His

that the September demand has been unusually high because of the royalty increase and that's something that can't be taken care of overnight."

Philosophie was somewhat annoyed that government is being approached to remove the duty on vinyl, and suggests, "we don't have to remove the duty on vinyl. . . we have more than enough vinyl at Cinram to supply the industry. We have records in production, up to our ears with three shifts going full out. As a matter of fact, I expect that next year we will be exporting vinyl product.

"Let's be realistic about this and use a little business sense," he continues. "The demand for vinyl is going down every year and two big plants concentrating on vinyl was a money losing situation. Both plants (CBS and Cinram) were running between one and two shifts, which creates inefficiency resulting in higher costs. When you concentrate production and mobility of staff you have better costs and you are able to stabilize the costs to the industry. . . and that's what we have accomplished. The labour conditions in Toronto aren't the best, particularly for our specialized field, so we had to train new people, and that takes time. The CBS severance package was so good that many of the employees we thought would be coming here, decided otherwise. We're not trying to monopolize the industry," he stresses, concluding with, "Let me assure you that we have the industry at heart. . . because without the industry, we are nothing."

Supercorp (Labatt) buys 50 percent of Partners

Syd Kessler, President of Supercorp, an affiliate of the Labatt Brewing Company, has announced the purchase of 50 percent of Partners Film Company. Based in Toronto with offices in Chicago, Los Angeles and New York, Partners is the largest producer of television commercials in Canada.

Supercorp (Sounds Interchange), founded by Kessler and Salim Sachedina is one of Canada's largest producers of radio and television commercials. Labatt, in a move to become a heavy in the entertainment field, last year bought 50 percent of Supercorp (RPM - Oct. 31/87), plus a 45 percent interest in BCL Entertainment which owns Concert Productions International (CPI) and Brockum, a merchandising company that handles rock-oriented paraphernalia (clothing, etc.) which is sold at rock concerts.

Besides the obvious promotional advantages the brewery has with the youth market through its BCL Entertainment connection, having control of a major commercial/jingle complex strengthens its position in the market immensely. It's expected that some of the millions of dollars Labatt spends on television and radio campaigns in promoting their brand names, as well as their rock concerts, will now find its way back to the brewery.

Kessler, a shrewd businessman with an obvious fix on the total entertainment field, indicated there will be more news of expansion for Supercorp over the next few months. "The entertainment business in Canada is exciting and challenging," he beamed, "and the growth potential is tremendous. As we grow and expand, so will the industry."

The Grand wraps Rock and Roll

The Grand Theatre's production of John Gray's Rock And Roll closed in Toronto (Oct 1), after twenty-six performances in the Bluma Appel Theatre. The production, starring Doug Bennett of Doug And The Slugs, garnered rave reviews from the critics and several standing ovations.

The production, directed by Larry Lillo, was first seen in London, Ontario earlier this year and has since mounted 64 performances and played to audiences numbering 40,000 plus.

It was apparently the decision of the Grand Theatre hierarchy to invest in a series of Toronto dates as "an appropriate use of the profits from the London run." As well as showcasing its work to a wider community the additional dates provided 175 weeks of work for theatre artists.





It can never be too loud for Sons Of Freedom

Having developed a solid reputation in Vancouver within a year for playing their music loud, reportedly very loud in fact, the Sons Of Freedom made the jump from relative obscurity in Canada to relative obscurity in America very quickly following their signing to the Slash label in Los Angeles. Now the pressure is on to prove that their blatant style of rock music can win over as many supporters stateside in an equal amount of time.

Their unique brand of fiery rock 'n' roll had soon garnered the band enough exposure in all avenues of the media, though not one Canadian record label was prepared to sign the band and release their debut in America. A few hours of studio time, countless gigs and finally the all-important demo persuaded Slash to bring the boys aboard. It was actually a demo financed by Deane Cameron and Capitol Records which turned the table in the band's favour. Yet, says the band's lead singer Jim Newton, the band did not want a Canadian record deal.

"It's just not worth their while to sign us," he adds. "However, it may have worked through something like Nettwerk. But by the time we were actually talking to record labels, we'd already got management (Gangland Artists) and Nettwerk wasn't really set up to handle a band that had management. They're a bit more like an artist's collective." Newton says they've watched enough Canadian bands struggle for years, touring across the country and recording albums that never get a U.S.

release, and they weren't about to tread that same path.

"The real reason we didn't go with Nettwerk is they couldn't guarantee an American release; no Canadian label can do that apparently," he continues. "We just figured if we didn't get an American release for the first record then we'd split up and change the name of the band and do something else. It's not worth just trying to crack the Canadian market for the kind of music we're doing. We're going to sell so few records here and luckily all the labels realize that too."

So, the Newton game plan is to work the U.S. campus and college market extensively, something that does not exist in Canada which enables bands to be considered viable, especially a 'loud' band playing original material. The economics of their situation necessitate breaking in America first, as commercial airplay is out of the question, he states. Though Guns 'N' Roses and Def Leopard can be heard daily now, it did take over a year for their records to be considered commercial by radio programmers.

Another outlet for the band to explore is through video and currently they are shooting their first video for The Criminal. Also, they are expected to play at the CMJ gathering in New York with the Pursuit Of Happiness this month. Slowly but surely their debut, released simultaneously in Australia on Mushroom Records and later (Nov 11) in England on the London label, is building a respectable following and is turning some heads in mainstream circles as well. Perhaps the plan is working.

"The kind of money that the Canadian labels would have had to sink in, even though it wasn't very much, would've taken us years

to recoup here. It's a tricky situation but it's just the way the Canadian scene is set up. The pop base is just too small and, as far as demographics go, there are just as many people in Canada as there are in California, and you don't have to drive twenty hours between gigs, the weather's nice and there are hundreds of college radio stations. It's hard not to look at Canada through dry eyes when you're looking at it from our perspective.

"For all the talk about the hard-edged sound on FM radio, most of the FM I heard doesn't seem to be playing the kind of music that we play," he concludes. "Everyone seems to be playing Guns 'N' Roses now, but when they first came out they weren't getting any airplay at all. It's like when Led Zeppelin and all those kinds of bands were happening in the sixties, none of them got any airplay either. It was all done by word of mouth. So, we'll just have to wait and see and hope that people like it really."

The Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS) has announced this year's nominees for the Molson Canadian Entertainer of The Year award. They are Bryan Adams, Barney Bentall and The Legendary Hearts, Blue Rodeo, Tom Cochrane and Red Rider, Bruce Cockburn, Leonard Cohen, Glass Tiger, Colin James, K.D. Lang and Robbie Robertson. This will be the second year for the presentation of this People's Choice Juno Award, sponsored by Molson Breweries of Canada, and is presented to the nominee voted the most popular by fans across the country. Last year's winner was Bryan Adams.

There were apparently 150 nominees selected by CARAS members. Representatives from Canada's entertainment media were then asked to participate in the selection of a short list of 10 nominees. Molson Breweries will coordinate the national distribution of ballots through record outlets, newspaper and magazine advertisements and all major Molson Canadian Rocks concert events. There are over 600 record stores involved nationally for this year's voting process.

The award will be presented during the Juno Awards Ceremonies telecast live on the CBC Network from Toronto's O'Keefe Centre on March 12.

The awards, the 10th annual presentation by the Quebec record industry, were televised by Radio Canada.

Other winners were Michel Rivard, Best Male and Best Show of The Year; Johanne Blouin, Best Popular Album and Best First Album; Nathalie and Rene Simard for Best Videoclip and Biggest Selling Single; and Nathalie for Best Children's Album.







Cambium produces Luba special for CBC-TV

For three consecutive years Montreal's Luba has won the Juno Award in the Best Female Vocalist category, and this October 30 the Capitol recording artist, with her band, is featured in her first television music special. Produced by Cambium Film and Video, in association with the CBC, Telefilm and the Ontario Film Development Corporation the special is the second production in a collection of Ontario Film Development Corporation, the first being Jane Siberry.

Luba, *Between The Earth & Sky*, was directed by Don Allan, who has produced many award-winning videos for Canadian artists, and is currently working on a feature film for Universal Pictures and a Glass Tiger music special for Picture Music International. The Luba special features exclusive footage and interviews backstage at several events including the Junos. The concert was shot at Montreal's Club Metropolis, the famed theatre originally built in 1896.

Last November Capitol released the compilation, titled *Over 60 Minutes With . . . Luba*, on compact disc and later on cassette, which contained the cover and hit single *When A Man Loves A Woman*, although at this time there is no new product available as Luba's new album is not expected until next spring. A producer for the project has yet to be named by either the label or management.

The ceremony will be hosted by Dusty Rhodes of CISN FM 104 and Clay Hagel of 96 K-LITE.

Famous People Players reach out with single

The internationally-acclaimed Famous People Players, an entertainment group of dedicated people who have overcome their handicaps and are now living a normal life, have entered another phase of their career. They have released a single titled *Discover The Magic*. Diane Dupuy, the founder and Artistic Director of the group, recently toured the North American continent, speaking to groups of IBM employees about the need for human beings to help each other. She titled her talks *Looking Beyond Black Light*. Black Light is the technical name for the on-stage wizardry of the Famous People Players.





U2 - Rock
Rattle And Hum
Island - ISL-1204-J

After finding success to the degree this band has, the pressure was on to produce something even more spectacular. U2 has met this challenge in perhaps the only fashion possible. This two-record set, with its companion piece movie coming soon, containing live versions of past favourites and covers as well as new studio tracks, has something to please everyone and very little to offend. Although the Dylan classic All Along The Watchtower is less than a masterpiece, their rendition of Helter Skelter is more lively. The first single, Desire, is eating up the charts with its Bo Diddley beat and AOR is already walst deep into Rattle And Hum showing strong support for Angel Of Harlem, When Love Comes To Town (with B.B. King) and All Along The Watchtower in particular. A gospel influence is certainly evident in much of the new material, and a gospel choir is featured on the live version of I Still Haven't Found What I'm Looking For. Needless to say, this album has taken retail by storm and will be a huge Christmas item this year.



TOM COCHRANE - Pop
& **RED RIDER** - Victory Day
Capitol - C1-28570-F

Like a fine wine, Tom Cochrane just keeps getting better with age. As always, a new Red Rider album is a pleasure to listen to, and this latest effort, which has the Don Gehman stamp from start to finish, is no exception. EMI stateside should be kicking themselves for their lack of respect, though truly enough one man's garbage is another man's treasure. This is indeed a chest, full of hard to beat lyrics and matched with the band's characteristic style of intensity.

SONS OF FREEDOM - Rock
Sons Of Freedom
Slash Records - 92-57551-P

It's hard but not too fast. It's a style of music not all too often found these days. Commercial is the buzz word and give the guys credit for sticking to their guns. The test is now upon them: it's in the stores and its not about to be played on the radio, but print media has been kind, so the album must sell by word of mouth or it won't sell at all. It's a good record, not great, though there aren't many great records released to compete with today, anyway. Hopefully, the band (and others) will continue to play loud 'n' proud and hopefully, one day, release a truly great record, and not for radio, but for themselves.

VIXEN - Pop
Vixen - EMI/Manhattan - E1-48991-F

Some records just sound like experiments. Some work and obviously some don't. Apparently there must be a void in the market for an all-female rock band, but one that can play "good" songs. So, along the lines of either Heart or Pat Benatar in days gone by, enter Vixen and their little

helper Richard Marx, who produced and co-wrote their first single, Edge Of A Broken Heart. Well, if it was supposed to make one heck of a first impression, then they're going to have to go back to the drawing board and try again.

ROCK CITY ANGELS - Rock
Young Man's Blues
Geffen - XGHS-24193-P

There's a unique balance between stormy barnburners and genuine, but spirited blues on this double album set (although side four is actually a single version of Beyond Babylon), which is offset completely by the contrived oh-so-tough image portrayed by the band on their gatefold sleeves. Musically, but certainly not visually, the record's worth the price of admission.

PETE MAGADINI - Jazz
QUARTET - Live In Montreal
Briko Records - BR1003

Jazz musicians are a unique breed in the global music community. Every session is a rendering of their soul and the Pete Magadini Quartet are typical. Here, they pump out an exhausting set, superbly recorded live at Montreal's 2080 Jazz Club. Magadini, on drums, is magnificently supported by guitarist Roddy Ellias, acoustic bassist Dave Young and Charles Ellison on trumpet and flugelhorn. Ellias and Ellison do most of the writing, and key are The Clown and Looking At You. Also key are Young's Irie and Magadini's 2080 Break. Magadini produced.



STEVE EARLE - Rock
Copperhead Road
Uni - UNI-7-J

As American as a pick-up truck, Earle's brand of two-listed, country-tinged rock 'n' roll should find its way onto the charts pretty quickly. The title-track, with its folk introduction, released as a single, is seeing good radio action already, yet every song is strong and AOR programmers should be going several tracks deep fairly soon. Some of these include the foot-stomping Snake Oil, and the charming ballad Nothing But A Child, which displays the soft centre to Earle's rugged exterior. An album that definitely moves in the right direction, without pulling any punches.

JANE'S ADDICTION - Rock
Nothing's Shocking
Warner Bros - 92-57271-P

Probably the heaviest, musically, album to be released from a major this year, not in a hard core or speed metal sense, simply from power chording their way through the songs. There are obviously two aspects though to this album which will lend instant credibility on the street: a revealing jacket and lyrics that need a warning sticker. Lyrically warped and twisted, in a manner that recalls early Alice Cooper, very early, the album stands alone today. Though in parts very loud, the guitar also has a rudimentary blues vein allowing space between the continuous aural barrage. In essence, it's an album very hard to describe, so give it a listen anyway.



TALK TALK - Pop/Rock
Spirit Of Eden
EMI-Manhattan E1-46977-F

Hats off to a band that isn't afraid of thumbing their noses at formulaic, three and a half minute pop offerings. Apparently the risk-taking is paying off as the album, which incorporates numerous influences into long, experimental sound experiences, is meeting with early retail success. Alternative and campus radio (if not already) should consider this an early Christmas gift unlike any other they are likely to receive this year. The rest of the music industry might want to take note of this album as well, as the band's artistic vision found on this album is a harbinger of style for the next decade.

BIG BANG - Pop
Big Bang
SPY-1000-W

Welcome to the Juno Awards... the U2 imitation of the year category... the envelope please. Yes! Yes! Ladies and Gentlemen... Big Bang (And the crowd goes wild.) In all seriousness, the first release by SPY Records is a solid pop album. However, it is difficult to understand how any band would re-release The Unforgettable Fire as its debut effort. Musically and vocally, the performances are inspiring, and the success of Into The Night, the first single, which contains one vocal line taken directly from Duran Duran's Rio (Doo doo doo doo doo doo doo), proves there is a listening audience willing to accept a well-produced rehashing of ground-breaking sound from five years ago. Look for ponytails and a Dylan cover by the time Big Bang makes its next vinyl delivery.




THE NITS - Pop
In The Dutch Mountains
Epic - BPEC-90772-H

The word 'odd' is inadequate to describe fully this Dutch group. Musically interesting, the lyrics incorporate avant garde poetry. The song J.O.S. Days is well suited for mainstream airplay, but the majority of tracks are too left-field for anything but campus or alternative notice. The music shows a country influence in places, although myriad styles are drawn upon. Truly a neat album, it was recorded live to two-track in an old gym, yet sounds as clean as any studio recording.

DEBBIE JOHNSON - Pop
Just Like Magic
Marigold - MPL-1203-E

Primarily a vehicle for slower ballads, confusingly the first two cuts are boppy, programmed dance tracks, resulting in a package that recalls the days when the kids from Fame pranced about the screen. Johnson's sweet, clear voice is enjoyable throughout and nicely complemented in the duets with Rich Dodson (Lonely Lovers) and Demo Cates (Secret Love). The album should be quite popular with A/C and lite-rock programmers, but is really too "easy listening" in nature to break out at CHR. Produced by Dodson at his own Marigold studios in Toronto.



RICKY VAN SHELTON - Country
Loving Proof - Epic - FC-44221-H

This is Van Shelton's second album for Epic, following his highly successful Wild-Eyed Dreams, which established him as a vocal power within the new breed of country performers. He's more pure than he is traditional, and that's where the charm lays. He is just as comfortable with rockabilly as he is with ballads, displaying a unique tenderness in his interpretation of lyrics. Also key is The Picture, which he co-wrote with producer Steve Buckingham and Troy Seals.

PATTY LOVELESS - Country
Honky Tonk Angel
MCA - MCA-42223-J

Produced by Tony Brown, the first single, A Little Bit In Love, wasn't the powerhouse it was expected to be. However, she has a couple of kicks at the can yet, and could do it with the Kostas track, Timber, I'm Falling In Love (Vince Gill on background vocals), or Bryan MacLean's penning of Don't Toss Us Away (Rodney Crowell on background vocals). Loveless has one advantage over the newer breed of country singers, and that's her traditional flavouring which unfortunately, is getting a little more difficult to promote.

Two is the duo of Sandy Stubbert and Mary-Ellen Anderson. Their harmonies are reflective of the folk era, and quite beautifully executed. Although the two are a perfect mix for harmonizing, they jealously guard their own songwriting talents, solo writing, rather than co-writing all the material. The lyrics might come under criticism and perhaps could carry a little more clout, but that's a minor point. Instrumentation is superb, and Two are part of that as well, with Anderson doubling on rhythm guitar and dulcimer and Stubbert on lead and rhythm guitars and mandolin. Producer Ian Tamlyn provides keyboards, synthesizer, rhythm guitar and hammered dulcimer inserts, with drums and percussion by Al Cross and David Woodhead on bass guitar, and synthesizer accordion. This is a superbly put-together acoustic session that should be promoted quite vigorously at alternative radio and at the campus level. Recorded at Sound Path, a 16-track studio in Oakville, Ontario.
