Toll-free number to help independents sell product

Canadian independent acts who have trouble selling their product will soon have a means of making it available coast to coast.

Beginning May 26, the Independent Distributors Association of Canada (IDAC) will distribute, through a mail order format, compact discs and cassettes of acts not found on local records store shelves. A toll-free number will be given to radio stations and then passed on to listeners who can call it and order the product on the spot, says Joe Wood, the person who's putting the idea in motion.

"You can't get certain product in certain portions of the country even though they're

Randy Bachman is not touring with B.T.O.

Randy Bachman has made it known that he is not touring with B.T.O., contrary to information apparently supplied to some factions of the media and to promoters and booking agents.

Bachman, who founded Bachman-Turner Overdrive with Fred Turner, reports that because he had been successful in getting a new record deal for himself several months ago, "with the help of Graham Henderson," he had given notice to Bruce Allen and B.T.O. that he "would not be touring with them this summer as I was pursuing a dream to make some new music.

"That being accepted, it has come to my attention from several sources that Bruce Allen is lining up a summer booking schedule for B.T.O. throughout Canada and the U.S.A. and not disclosing to the agents or promoters that I am no longer with the band. They are using the logo B.T.O. and not Bachman-Turner Overdrive, and have hired a singer/guitar player (his name is Randy) to take my place."

Bachman further advises that he has been offered dates in place of B.T.O., but that he isn't interested at this time. He stresses however, that he believes it is important to do tours and public performances, "when the time is right to promote my new band and album."

getting airplay there. So we're going to resolve the problem by putting in a 1-800 number for radio to give to their listening audience when they call in. The listener can call that number and actually buy direct from a distributor with that piece of product that they're looking for."

All orders will be paid by VISA, MasterCard, money order or certified cheque. Customers will receive an updated catalogue with each order and all inquiries concerning non-catalogued items will be followed up.

Artists interested in joining IDAC are required to pay a membership fee of \$160.60 per year for the first title and \$75 for each additional title. Special rates apply for larger catalogues. Ten pieces of product are required to start and members will receive 70 per cent of the retail price. Members will receive a statement four times a year with applicable payments enclosed. The program is non-exclusive and members can use any other means to distribute their product along with IDAC.

The program will initially focus on country radio but acts from all formats are invited to join.

The Eaton's campaign is in support of Canadian manufacturing and the jobs it creates for Canadians, and focuses on Canadian superstar Celine Dion.

Eaton's will be selling an exclusive Celine Dion Celebration cassette for \$2.00 with any purchase within the store. As part of the program, the cassette will be merchandised on every cash register in every Eaton store on a national level.

Although the retail business in general has been off for the past two years, in 1991 Pindoff reportedly enjoyed "a substantial increase" with Eaton's Home Entertainment Department, and was recognized as contributing to the overall performance of the store.

PolyGram solidifies film thrust through Gramercy

Universal Pictures and PolyGram Filmed Entertainment have formed Gramercy Pictures, a new company to market and distribute theatrical films in Canada and the United States.

The Los Angeles-based company will concentrate on the North American marketing and distribution of films supplied by both partners. PolyGram's releases will come from its production affiliates which include Propaganda Films (*Wild At Heart*, *Truth Or Dare*), Working Title Films (*My Beautiful Laundrette*), and A&M Films (*Birdy*).

Current plans are for the new company to handle the theatrical release of up to eight films per year, with the number of releases expected to increase in the future. Universal Pictures' release schedule of some 20 pictures per year will not be diminished by the films it expects to supply to the new entity.

Belgian techno duo, 2 Unlimited, will play three Toronto dates at the end of the month to celebrate their debut North American album release, *Get Ready*, on May 25.







A dog and pony show . . . ! I think it's totally unfair for artists and their management to be asked to supply interventions on behalf of radio stations. These people have enough odds stacked against them already. But supporting one radio station against another is really looking for trouble. The rhetoric that's spouted out at these hearings, whether by design or accident, can be real demeaning. One country programmer, who was at the CRTC hearing in Toronto, was obviously devastated by some of the remarks that were made, albeit generalising on the state of country radio in the Toronto/Hamilton listening area. He has been very supportive of Canadian country artists and he didn't deserve to be trashed. I also wonder if the CRTC

commissioners really read all the print interventions. In some cases, the pages and pages of names resemble a phone book. How time consuming and how trite. (EC: *A dog and pony show . . . ?*)

You done good Scott Richards . . . ! Trooper lives and can you believe it . . . they packed Lulu's Roadhouse in Cambridge, Ont. to capacity with over 3,000 fans and wannabe fans. It was Scott Richards, who as president of MCA many years ago, believed that this west coast band had the makings to be a supergroup. His creativeness and dedication to the band has yet to be matched, and it worked. Trooper became one of the glittering stars of Canada's rather wanting star system of that day. Taking a quick glance through RPM's archives, there they were, Trooper: Ramon (Ra) McGuire, Brian Smith, Harry Kalensky and Tommy Stewart, on the front cover of the September 13, 1975 issue. (EC: *Amazing what can be done when the company believes . . . from the top down!!!*)

Art Graham is on the loose . . . ! I was sorry to hear that Art Graham is no longer with Sony Music. He is one of the most creative people in the business, because he's patched into the street . . . just like the suds people. Dunno what happened, but, with that kind of talent, I'm sure he won't be loose for long. (EC: *Onward and upward . . . !*)

Give me a break!!! I would like to see ONE foreign act to come to Toronto and not scream "Hello Tor-on-to" over and over again. Got news for you guys!!! Everyone of you sound ridiculous saying "TOR-ON-TO". Get a script. (EC: *Grow up!!!*)

When it comes to handouts . . . ! Attic president Al Mair sent me a chart from Culture And Communications: The Ties That Bind, a government publication. It's the report of the Standing Committee on Communications and Culture, dated April 1992, and there are some pretty startling revelations. The 1989-90 expenditures for Sound Recording was \$6.2 million . . . that's \$6 million plus, and not too shabby, you might say. But hang on. Book and periodical funding totalled \$274.3 million, 267 million, 254 million went to film and video, \$122.2 million to the performing arts and, lookee here, \$694.1 million was handed over to fund museums, archives, libraries, natural and historic parks and sites. Al broke it down for me. Obviously sound recording is the least funded, with total funding being 2.4 per cent of film and video funding, 2.3 per cent of book and periodical funding, 5.1 per cent of performing arts and .8 per cent of museums, archives, etc. Not that I believe in funding, but if the taxpayers are being gored that much, wouldn't it make more sense to give more to an industry where there's at least a return? (EC: *It's the beauties at Culture and Communication that should be gored . . . !*)

Attention! Juno people . . . ! If you're looking for a REAL set for next year's show, wander on up to Canada's Wonderland and check out the Canterbury Theatre. The set is clean and simple, moves like clockwork and doesn't take away from the players. I'll bet

you can rent it CHEAP!! (EC: *Who wants a cheap set . . . ? On the other hand, who wants a set . . . ?*)

Remember Peter Foldy . . . ? Peter had a giant hit a few years back with Bondi Junction, his only real kick at the can, not that he's a one trick pony. He always kept his hand in the music side of the business but moved to Los Angeles and got involved in movies. He has directed and produced several films and written more than a few scores. Now, he's moved up into the heavy hitters and is directing and producing *Deadly Exposure*, which he also wrote. Taking starring roles are Jan Michael Vincent and Maxwell Caulfield. The film is backed by 21st Century. (EC: *You wait long enough and doors will open . . . !*)

What's in a song . . . ? I was leafing through some old RPMs the other day and in the April 18, 1981 edition who do you think had the No. 1 record on the AC chart? It was Ron Irving and he topped the chart with *Bluebird*, the same song that won him a Composer nomination this year in the Big Country Awards. Little did he realize that 11 years later, thanks to Anne Murray recording the song, that he would be catapulted into the big time. Lee Greenwood recorded one of his songs, and they're beginning to line up for his material. What's in a song? Are you crazy? Millions of dollars. If you have a hit song, you make money even as you sleep. No more road tours and dealing with tavern jerks and unclean promoters for Ron Irving. (EC: *Unclean promoters . . . ?*)

Majors pollute!!!! When those full page cover sheets come off the fax . . . filled with chemicals . . . wasting trees, and contain only two words . . . I say, "what a waste!" When it's a major record company and 3/4 of the page is BLANK, just think of the pollution this causes. (EC: *Name that major record company!!!*) Another major polluter is RF, who must stand there and look for a long time before he flushes!!!



Part Four of a series - Videos are an important part of the music industry

Champniss looks for new alternatives in music videos

The youthful looking face and British accent of Kim Clarke Champniss have become familiar to viewers of MuchMusic and The NewMusic over the past five years. But the 37-year-old was heavily involved in the music industry for years before appearing on our television screens. RPM talked to Champniss over a couple of pints in this continuation of our series on music videos in Canada.

Champniss was one of Vancouver's most popular night club disc jockeys before he decided to leave working with recorded music and start dealing with live bands. He managed Images In Vogue for three-and-a-half years and worked as an agent for a number of alternative bands. Alternative acts remain close to Champniss' heart and he credits them with being the first to use videos extensively because they couldn't get radio airplay.

"Without them (videos), the alternative scene would probably not have grown the way it has," he says. "I despised the catering of mediocrity that radio, particularly in that era, was going through."

And despite the high costs of making

Guns N' Roses play live with Soundgarden on TV

Those fans who haven't been able to catch Guns N' Roses live have a chance to see the next best thing on June 6.

Guns N' Roses Invade Paris, a live televised taping of the band's Paris concert, will be shown here at 9 p.m. on a pay per view basis by Viewer's Choice. The show, which will cost \$19.95 plus tax, is being distributed by PolyGram Television International. Westwood One Radio will also be simulcasting the event to affiliated Canadian stations.

The band apparently has a few surprises in store for the concert, including unannounced guests. Opening the show will be Soundgarden, whose Badmotorfinger album was at No. 80 on the RPM 100 Albums chart last week.

videos, Champniss says that young independent bands are in a good position because they have to be far more creative to break through and yet aren't weighed down by a record company or imposing management. He recommends using eager film students to help out with the making of videos and applying to VideoFact to help with financing. MuchMusic funds VideoFact to assist upcoming acts and it also profiles many of them on its Indie Street program.

"Great videos can be made cheaply. But it comes back to the idea. If they've got a great idea they can do it," Champniss says.

Champniss joined MuchMusic in September, 1986. He first hosted Rock Flash, then produced and co-hosted Fax in 1989. The next year he started hosting City Limits and working on special assignments like documentaries on ska music, Bob Marley and the annual Reggae Sunsplash concerts in Jamaica. Currently he is producing and doing assignments for The New Music and he has also been a member of the powerful MuchMusic music committee for the past two-and-a-half years.

The music committee meets every Tuesday and screens an average of 60 new videos each week to decide what will make it on television. There are 105 spaces in active rotation (including heavy, medium, light, breakout and recurrent) and only 12-15 new videos are added each week. Champniss admits the competition is stiff.

"Videos vying for these 12 spots each

week have got to be fresh, have got to be intriguing, and they definitely have to get away from the visual clichés like the falling champagne glass which shatters in slow motion. Particularly given the limited budgets of Canadian companies... many directors end up going into formulated scripts and you can see it's not new, it's not unique, it's not fresh. I think that directors have to work a little bit harder to be unique. From our point of view, we are craving for creativity out there. We program what we like. There's no great magic to it."

Because of all the competition in Canada's relatively small marketplace and the harsh economic climate we're currently experiencing, Champniss thinks record companies may have to re-examine their policies on videos and either cut back on them or save them for later on down the road. From MuchMusic's perspective, he says, there are two ways of looking at the situation.

"If you do it right, it's exposure and it's breakthrough and it's beyond what radio can do because it goes nationally and it adds the extra dimension of the charisma of the artist."

"If it backfires, you've spent \$30,000 and been rejected and we won't play it. Where else are you going to go in Canada? You're left with Video Hits and Good Rockin' Tonite and whatever fringe stuff that you can get which really won't give them the breakout or the return that they need to recoup their investment."

"I don't think you can underestimate how important it is when it actually works. At its best it can change people's lives. At its worst it makes people change the station."

Trademark infringement suit filed by Fender

Fender Musical Instrument Corporation, based in Los Angeles, has filed a trademark infringement suit in federal court in Toronto (May 11), against the sale and distribution, in Canada, of counterfeit Squier II Fender Standard Stratocaster and P-Bass guitars.

Filed against musical instrument distributor Louis Musical, Ltd., of Montreal, Gordon Price Music, Ltd., of Edmonton and the five Mother's Music stores in western Canada, the suit alleges that approximately 700 counterfeit Squier II guitars were purchased by Louis Musical from an unauthorized Korean manufacturer and sold to a number of retail music stores in Canada.

The suit also includes other music stores as defendants, as yet unknown to Fender, who are believed to have purchased and marketed the counterfeit instruments.

In its suit, Fender demands an injunction against the further sale and distribution of counterfeit Fender products, and money damages.

"Counterfeiting is extremely detrimental to the reputation of Fender and its authorized dealer network," said Fender president William C. Schultz. "When we became aware of the problem in Canada, we quickly tracked down the source of the counterfeiting in Korea and distribution network in Canada. Within hours, we successfully had the counterfeit Squier II product pulled off the showroom floors."

Keeping up with The Hip will be a dizzying trip

The Tragically Hip will begin recording their new album in England on July 3, with a fall release expected from MCA Records Canada.

The album will be produced by Chris Tsangarides, who has produced the last two Concrete Blonde albums and has also worked with Ozzy Osbourne and Lords Of The New Church.

The Hip played six dates in Sydney and Melbourne in their first tour of Australia in April and early May.

A one-hour CBC documentary film focusing on The Hip's annual hometown (Kingston, Ont.) charity concert in historic Old Fort Henry will air nationally on May 29 at 9 p.m. The show will chronicle the band's thoughts and adventures on the road throughout Europe and the southern United States.

A five-day tour at the end of June will take the band through Germany, Holland and the United Kingdom. They will then return home for whirlwind performances in both Toronto and Vancouver as part of Canada Day celebrations on July 1.

The Hip have also agreed to write the full soundtrack and score for the feature film, *I Love A Man In Uniform*, which is scheduled to premier at the Berlin Film Festival next year.

The Hip's two previous albums, *Up To Here* and *Road Apples*, have both surpassed the triple platinum mark in Canada.

Canada Day celebrations to rock across country

To celebrate Canada Day on July 1, Molson Canadian Rocks and MCA Concerts Canada are presenting 'The Great Canadian Party,' a coast to coast 10 hour music festival held at four different venues.

Artists confirmed to date are: The Tragically Hip, Chrissy Steele, The Grapes of Wrath, and Spinal Tap at Thunderbird Stadium in Vancouver; The Tragically Hip, Sass Jordan, Bootsauce, and Spinal Tap at Molson Park in Barrie, Ont.; Kim Mitchell and The Jeff Healey Band at Lansdowne Park in Ottawa; and Kim Mitchell, Lee Aaron, the Irish Descendants, and Spinal Tap at Quidi Vidi Park in St. John's, Nfld. Other acts, to be announced, are also expected to perform at more than one location.

More than 100,000 fans are expected at the live shows and more than a million viewers are expected to watch a 12 hour national broadcast on MuchMusic. More than 20 radio stations will simulcast the event to 25 markets across Canada and on-site diamond vision screens will feature live broadcasts by remote satellite to each of the participating venues.




SCOTT DIBBLE & WATERTOWN -Rock

All songs were either written or co-written by Dibble and feature intelligent lyrics and sparse but effective instrumentation by his band and some special guests. Suncatcher - WB-423


Washboard Hank Fisher won't win any competition for smooth vocals, but he certainly has a handle on the comedy end of it. Most of these tracks are Fisher originals and the very titles should invite interest: Stompin' Tom For Prime Minister, Do The Prince Charles, Polyester Polly Lit A Tire Fire In My Heart, and Are You Scrubbed.

Mandolin player Ken Ramsden, banjo player Matthew Fines and drummer Mike Blacky Johnston also contributed to the writing. The big surprise here is the Joan Besen (Prairie Oyster) productions of Honky Tonky Donkey, Beautiful Belle Of Bailleboro, The Midnight Ride of Red Dog Ray and Seein' Double C&W. 
The ARC is taken from the Austin Rehearsal Complex. The Angels part I'm not so sure about, but these four guys seem to have gotten their musical ability from a higher plane. The album is dedicated to the late Stevie Ray Vaughan and all band members had connections with the Texas guitar great. Chris Layton and Tommy Shannon were the rhythm section for Vaughan's band, Double Trouble. Doyle Bramhall II was a member of The Fabulous Thunderbirds and also sat in with Vaughan. Former guitar prodigy Charlie Sexton was influenced by Vaughan's blues-rock style. See What Tomorrow Brings was written by Bramhall about his feelings after the tragic helicopter accident which claimed Vaughan's life two years ago. Paradise Cafe, Good Time, The Famous Jane, and Shape I'm In all follow in the Texas blues-rock tradition. The album was produced by Little Steven Van Zandt, who's probably best known for his work with Bruce Springsteen. (CD reviewed) -SM



SUBWAY ELVIS/MIKE McTAGGART -Rock
Inside Out
Independent - PMH-001

Mike McTaggart became known to Canadians as Subway Elvis back in 1970 when he was discovered singing Presley tunes for people awaiting trains on the Toronto underground. Since then he has recorded an album and played with some of the biggest names in retro-rock. But in the mid-'80s, McTaggart lost almost five years of his career and spent 20 months in custody after being wrongfully arrested in connection with a series of bank robberies. His name was cleared in June, 1990, and Inside Out is McTaggart's first recording since he regained his freedom. The layoff didn't affect his Elvis impersonation abilities at all. In fact when listening to the album, you start thinking that maybe the King really is still alive. McTaggart covers a variety of tunes, from the blues of Elmore James, Jeff Healey, and Stevie Ray Vaughan, to updated versions of rock classics like Sweet Little Sixteen and Dream Lover. Although he includes the Boudeaux and Felice Bryant-

written Take A Message To Mary, about a man not wanting his beloved to know he's in jail, he wisely doesn't go for the obvious and do Jailhouse Rock or Folsom Prison Blues. McTaggart wrote one original song and collaborators Ken Tobias and Denis Keldie also contributed. Guitarist Steve Briggs and keyboardist Keldie shine with their instrumentation. The album doesn't break any new ground and, at 35 minutes, it's a bit short. But I like it anyways. A book about his case of mistaken identity is in the works and a movie is also a possibility. Who knows, someday Subway Elvis might even get his own postage stamp. (CD reviewed) -SM



TERRY SHERIDAN -Country
If I Had Wings
Shadow - SHR-901

Campbellford, Ont. native Sheridan has been making good inroads with his singles released to date, and this new album should gain him a few more supporters in country radio. Six of the 10 tracks were written by Sheridan and producer Ron Demmans and recorded in Campbellford. The rest, written by various Nashville writers, were recorded in Nashville. Key here are A Long Way From Lonely, written by Billy Dean, Bill Kenner and Thom McHugh, and the title track, written by Billy Montana and Karen Staley. Also key are the Sheridan/Demmans penning of I Wanna Fly and If Love's A One Way Street. (CD reviewed) -WG



TRACY CHAPMAN -Folk/Rock
Matters Of The Heart
Elektra - CD 61215-P

Tracy Chapman surprised everyone in 1988 when she stormed to the top of the charts with both her self-titled debut album and its single, Fast Car. Her follow-up, however, was a commercial failure. On Matters Of The Heart, Chapman has set out to prove she's more than just a flash in the pan. And she has enlisted a lot of big name people to help her do it: Living Colour guitarist Vernon Reid; Bruce Springsteen keyboard player Roy Bittan; Tom Petty guitarist Mike Campbell; veteran studio guitarist Waddy Wachtel; bass master Tony Levin; and members of Peter Gabriel's band. Chapman co-produced the album with Jimmy Iovine, who has worked with Springsteen and Dire Straits in the past, and Bob Clearmountain did the mixing. But all this outside talent seems to have been wasted, as Chapman's vocals and acoustic guitar overshadow the subtle background accompaniment. The tone of the album is quite moody as Chapman sings about failed relationships and social injustice. Considering the recent Los Angeles riots, the first single, Bang Bang Bang, is unfortunately timely. The song was released before the L.A. tragedy but its lyrics eerily foreshadowed the violence that often accompanies racism, poverty and drug abuse. (CD reviewed) -SM



IAN McCULLOCH -Pop/Rock
Mysterio
eastwest - CD 76264-P

This is a pleasant album from the former leader of Echo And The Bunnymen, the influential band which McCulloch led through the '80s. Mysterio, McCulloch's second solo album after 1989's Candleland, is lighter in tone and lacks the impact of the Bunnymen's best work, but it's got enough hooks to keep you interested. Leonard Cohen is one of McCulloch's idols so it's appropriate that a cover of Cohen's Lover Lover Lover is the first single. Honeydrip and Damnation are also worth checking out. (CD reviewed) -SM



MANTECA -Jazz/World Beat
Later Is Now
Justin Time Records - JTR 8438-2

Mantecca's seventh album should make for good gentle listening on mellow summer nights. The band has added two new members: former Chuck Mangione keyboardist Gordon Sheard, who composed four songs; and Phil Dwyer, who contributes some impressive saxophone solos. Other songs were composed by Rick Tait and Aaron Davis. The sax work of John Johnson and Henry Heilig's bass also stand out. The pleasant, upbeat Boys At The Beach and the intriguing Celtic samba sound of Craiggallachie are highlights of this 10-song, 53-minute album. (CD reviewed) -SM



THE SPENT POETS -Rock/Pop
The Spent Poets
Geffen - GEFD-24467-J

This five-piece band from San Francisco is hard to categorize. At various times, their eclecticism displays elements of Lloyd Cole's whiny vocals, Lenny Kravitz's flower child soul, Beatle-esque pop, heavy feedback, acoustic guitar and piano, and a music hall/carnival-type feel. Most of the songs were written or co-written by vocalist Adam Gates. His left coast flakiness is reflected in totally irreverent lyrics and song titles like Your Existential Past, Grassheads, Walt Whitman's Beard, He's Living With His Mother Now, Ali Ali Ackbar, The Rocks In Virginia's Dress, and Why Are You Sleeping With Mr. Brown? My Useless Heart and the sweet but edgy Mr. Einstein are the top tracks. (CD reviewed) -SM



Vancouver team wins big in 125 Gold song contest

A nationwide contest to find a song celebrating Canada's 125th birthday has been won by two Vancouver songwriters.

Paul Airey and Judy Harnett won \$10,000 in the 125 Gold contest. Airey, the composer and co-lyricist of the song, has been writing and producing music for radio, television and films in Canada for 15 years. He has won several national achievement awards for television commercials and documentary/industrial videos. He has co-written pop material for Canadian artists such as Images

Canadian PolyGram acts generating excitement

Canadian acts on PolyGram continue to do well for the label.

Sue Medley's new single, *When The Stars Fall*, is just out and is quickly being added to radio playlists across the country. The video for the song is in rotation at MuchMusic and MusiquePlus. Her second album, *Inside Out*, will be released June 5. It was recorded at John Mellencamp's Belmont Mall studio in Bloomington, Ind. and mixed in a number of different locations, including Prince's Paisley Park studio Chanhassen, Minn.

Medley will be doing a national promotional tour through June and then will make promotional appearances in England and Germany in July. A Canadian concert tour is expected in late summer or early fall. Medley will also be featured on Adrienne Clarkson's television show in September.

Lost & Profound is also doing quite well with their *Brand New Set Of Lies* single and video. Last week they also appeared on the front cover of *Now*, an alternative weekly entertainment and news tabloid in Toronto. The band plans to tour to support their self-titled album but no dates have been announced yet.

Bootsauce's album, *Bull*, has just been released in the United States on the Island label. *Bull* is now available in every major territory in the world and has gone gold in Canada.

On a down note, PolyGram has elected not to pick up the option on Art Bergmann's next album. Despite widespread critical acclaim, the support of three videos and decent radio airplay, the veteran Vancouver rocker's self-titled album failed to generate much retail action.

In Vogue and Boulevard, and for American feature films such as *Best of the Best*. Other songs on the album include: *Johnny Maple*, about Canadian unity; *My Home Cradled Out In The Waves*, a tribute to Prince Edward Island; *Prairie Moon*, about western Canada; *Smile Away Your Memory*, a bluegrass number; *The Ballinafad Ball*, a fiddle dance tune; *Lena Kathleen*, a tribute to Tom's wife; and three tales of lost love in *She Called From Montreal*, *Paper Smile*, and *Looking For Someone To Hold*.

Capitol also distributed the new *Lava Hay* album, *With A Picture In Mind*. The Nettwerk album was released May 22. The first single is *Don't Tell Me*.

Lava Hay are Michelle Gould and Suzanne Little. They're originally from Toronto but are now based in Vancouver. The new album is one of the first production efforts for Bill Dillon, who is probably best known for his guitar work with Peter Gabriel, Joni Mitchell, Robbie Robertson and Daniel Lanois. Guest musicians, besides Dillon, include: Randy Bachman; Tom Hooper and Vince Jones from *Grapes of Wrath*; Bob Wiseman; and Don Harrison of *Sons of Freedom*.

The group's first album, *Blue Mood*, combines originals with imaginative covers. It will be available June 1.

DC Drive brings Detroit to Canadians on Capitol

There aren't many cities with a more distinguished musical past than Detroit. From hard rock to soul, the city has spawned some of the biggest names in the business. Now, on their self-titled debut album, DC Drive has taken the influences of its hometown and put them together in a slickly produced package.

Detroit is where Bob Seger, Ted Nugent, Grand Funk Railroad and Iggy Pop started their careers. It's also the home of the legendary Motown soul sound. DC Drive bassist Doug Kahan describes his band's approach to this musical pedigree as, "Let's put The Supremes in bed with Ted Nugent."

All the members of DC Drive were friends who played in a variety of bands before they came together as a unit in June, 1988. One month later they played their first gig in front of 50,000 screaming fans while opening for Cheap Trick.

"As soon as we played that first show we knew this thing was going to happen. The chemistry was right," says drummer Brian Pastoria.

The band soon got involved with two film projects, doing a song for the movie Iron Eagle. They worked with Vini Poncia on the song, and he later went on to produce the current album. The band (probably wisely) went incognito for its appearance in the other film, The Purple People Eater.

"It was a real low budget thing. The purple people eater looks just like a purple bath rug," was the best thing Kahan had to say about the movie.

The band had a lot of local success with a song called You Need Love which was included on a demo tape that was sent out to Detroit radio stations. An independent record promoter named Dick Williams passed the tape along and introduced the band to Deane Cameron and Tim Trombley of Capitol Canada. They liked the band and signed them up.

"They really did understand what we wanted to do and they didn't try to screw with it. They were really cool about that. They had their creative suggestions but they really respected what we were doing. That's really hard to find in this business," Kahan says of

the relationship which has evolved since the signing.

With phones, faxes and Detroit being situated across the river from Canada, it hasn't been a problem for the band to be on a Canadian label. In fact the band likes this country and believes that people north of the border are often more friendly and open-minded than Americans. The group has been playing a number of dates through southern Ontario as well as with former Kiss drummer Peter Criss in Montreal.

"Canadian crowds are a little bit more conservative, but we win them over," says lead singer Joey Bowen.

Scott Dibble sets out on unique Canadian rail tour

Scott Dibble left his home of Watertown, Ont. and arrived in St. John's on May 18 to begin a unique 42-day cross-Canada tour by rail. The tour will serve to launch his WEA debut album, *One Phoebe Street*.

Dibble is expected to stop in at least 40 cities and towns from Cornerbrook, Nfld. to Nanaimo, B.C., where he will visit with as many radio programmers, retailers and entertainment writers as possible.

This isn't the first time Dibble has done something unusual with his career. In the winter of 1991 he spent seven weeks travelling down the Mississippi River and through the southern U.S. He admits that it was a watershed experience for him and that the seeds for many of the songs that are included on his *Phoebe Street* album were planted during that trip.

"I was learning about the subtleties of the different lifestyles between the regions I was travelling through. I knew then that one day I would have to travel across my own country if I was ever to appreciate our own regional diversity."

Travelling by rail will allow Dibble the opportunity to meet and spend a little more time with people. "I like the idea of crossing the country at a leisurely pace. It's like the difference between waving at someone from behind the closed windows of a moving car and getting out, shaking hands and really getting to know them."

Cockburn, Weir, Shocked tour as acoustic package

Bruce Cockburn has been firm to tour with Michelle Shocked and the Grateful Dead's Bob Weir for 19 outdoor shows across North America. Weir will be accompanied by bassman Rob Wasserman.

Billed as "an evening of acoustic music," the tour opens July 11 in Salt Lake City and ends August 3 in Washington. It includes dates in New York, Chicago, Denver and Detroit. There is one Canadian show, to be co-headlined by Cockburn, at Toronto's Ontario Place on July 20.

Cockburn, who is currently touring Europe with his band, will be doing the summer tour solo. Earlier this year the Grateful Dead's Jerry Garcia recorded and released *Waiting For A Miracle*, a Cockburn composition.

Cockburn is currently charting on both the RPM 100 Hits Tracks and AC charts with *Mighty Trucks Of Midnight*, taken from his True North album, *Nothing But A Burning Light*.

Memphis-based producer making waves in Canada

In the past couple of years, Memphis-based producer/engineer Joe Hardy has had more success working with Canadian acts than most Canadian studio hands.

He's currently in Toronto to produce the new album for the Jeff Healey Band. But before leaving the warm sun and cold beer at his Memphis poolside, the laid-back yet clever Hardy phoned RPM to chew the fat about his past work with Canadians.

Hardy's most successful Canadian project thus far has been producing Tom Cochrane's six times platinum Mad Mad World album. Hardy had heard of Cochrane from his Red Rider days and when he received some demo tapes from Cochrane and Vancouver-based musician/producer John Webster, he was immediately impressed. It wasn't too long before Cochrane and his group were cutting tracks at Hardy's Ardent Studios in Memphis. Hardy felt that a lot of Cochrane's earlier work was "awfully machine-like" so he tried to get some of that famous Memphis soul to rub off on Cochrane in what he describes as his "odd" studio.

"It's like if (southern author William) Faulkner owned a recording studio and everybody was inbred and drinking mint juleps," the well-read producer says in his Tennessee drawl. "We have a studio pig and two cats, but it's also very modern and techno."

The assembly then moved to a house in Georgetown, Ont. which was quickly converted into a small studio for two months of overdubbing. Hardy, 39, returned to Memphis to mix the album.

"Everything went as smoothly as records can go. There are always tense moments and I guess we all yelled at each other some. But the beer really helped," he says.

Hardy's affinity for Canadian beer isn't the only reason he works with Canadian acts. He says music is often more interesting here

because both radio and MuchMusic are more liberal with their playlists than their American counterparts.

"I really do believe that Canadians have an unwarranted inferiority complex," Hardy says. "I really don't think there's a huge difference in tastes between Canadians and Americans. The only advantage the United States has over Canada is the sheer number of people.

"If Mad Mad World sold half a million in Canada, it should sell five million here. Everybody's just keeping their fingers crossed to see what's going to happen. Radio is such a fucked up thing here that almost all commercial success depends upon MTV."

Hardy also produced Colin James' last album and mixed Kim Mitchell's recent Aural Fixations release. He also mixed the upcoming Leslie Spit Tree-o album in Memphis where he says the band, and especially mesmerizing lead singer Laura Hubert, made a big impression. Hardy says Hubert soon knew every cab driver and cop in the city by name.

"By the time she left here, everybody knew her. They're all insane."

Hardy says he's sworn to secrecy about the new Jeff Healey project but he promises some surprises. "Some of the stuff they're doing really shocked me. I really like it," he says.

Because of his accomplishments in the past couple of years, Hardy can afford to be choosy about who he works with now. "When I have success with someone like Cochrane in Canada, I get a higher profile there. And people want to use successful people. Basically I just sort of do what I like. It's really hard to work with assholes so I'm determined not to do that anymore.

"Between Healey, Cochrane and Colin, I think those are the three best bands in Canada."

Hardy would welcome the opportunity to work with all three again. The same goes for the Leslie Spit Tree-o and Mitchell. When asked if there are other Canadians whose music he's interested in, he names Blue Rodeo and young Vancouver guitarist David Gogo.

And what about people he wouldn't work with?

"I don't think I'd want to do a Bryan Adams record. I wouldn't have the fortitude to work on it for two years. It seems like there was a lot of indecision and bullshit going on."

Richardson takes lead as Mabel Mercer at Senator

Jackie Richardson will portray Mabel Mercer, the legendary "high priestess" of the blues, in Mabel, set to start previews on July 2 at At The Top O' The Senator in Toronto. July 7 has been set as the official opening.

Mercer, whose distinctive style influenced many of the big names in entertainment, including Frank Sinatra, Billie Holiday, Lena Horne and many more, began her career in Paris nightclubs during the '20s and '30s. She moved to the U.S. in the late '30s where she gained a faithful following through her club dates in New York City and on Broadway.

In 1973, Mercer received the first annual Stereo Review Award of Merit, which is now renamed the Mabel Mercer Award. Four years later she starred in the film Miss Mercer In Mayfair. In 1983 she was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom, only one of the many honours bestowed on her over her 67-year career.

Richardson has been described as "the perfect singer" for the Mercer role. She has played a major role in Canada's blues community and her theatre credits include: the lead role in Salome Bey's Madame Gertrude; parts in Raisin In The Sun; and Ain't Misbehavin', which gained her a nomination for the Dora Mavor Moore Award.

ATI is readying a new 4X4, Scoot Irwin's concept of four artists each performing four songs which has become popular with country programmers. The next Quadrapak 4X4 will be released the first week in June. The lineup of talent features Dick Damron, Monika, Michael Dee and Thomas Allen Ross. Irwin explains that Damron did a session in Nashville last year to commemorate 35 years in the business, "and we are using those songs from that session." Damron's four songs are Countryfied, High On You, Susan Flowers and One Nite Stand. The bonus track will be Jesus It's Me Again. Monika, who won Alberta Female Vocalist, Calgary and Area Entertainer, and Alberta Single of the Year for Jack Daniels at last year's Country Music Association of Calgary, also contributes four selections including her current single, I Forgot To Tell My Heart. Michael Dee, morning personality at London's BX-93, makes his presence known with a re-issue of If The Jukebox Took Teardrops, which made him a few bucks last year when Billy Joe Royal recorded it. Newcomer to ATI, Thomas Allen Ross of Calgary, is poised for recognition with his 4X4 entry.

Lisa Brokop and her manager Paul Mascioli, dropped by with Lisa's just released album titled My Love. Lisa is still charting with her last single, Time To Come Back. The accompanying video for this single is doing quite well in the U.S. where it is getting good rotation on the Nashville Network and Country Music Television. The follow-up single will be My Love, written by Peter McCann, who was one of the producers of the album, and Tommy Rocco. Lisa tries her hand at writing for this album, where she co-wrote Country Girl with McCann. Ron Irving, who wrote Anne Murray's Bluebird hit, and his wife Sue, wrote one of the better songs on the album

titled Daddy Sing To Me. Well-known "tea" man, Hagood Hardy, who is also credited as producer on the album, wrote Time To Come Back Home, another key song on the album, with Marty Gillan.

Stompin' Tom Connors has more love in him than most realize. His upcoming album, Believe In Your Country, leans more toward the love angle than anything he has recorded before. Alberta Rose is a perfect example. Capitol promo hustler Roger Bartel visited with Connors recently. Between a few drafts, Bartel laid down a 75-minute interview which will be edited down for a promotion CD release to coincide with an early June release for his album.

Country Beat's lineup for May 23 arrived too late, but just in case you're one of the lucky ones who gets their RPM on Fridays, Sneezey Waters is being profiled on this edition. The Ottawa-based performer talks about his devotion to the memory of Hank Williams. Also of particular note is the inclusion of St. John's country songwriter Ron Hines, whose Sonny's Dream has been recorded by more than two dozen performers to date. Jumping ahead to June 13, videos will be showcased by Anne Murray, Asleep At The Wheel, Alan Jackson, The Razorbacks, Mack MacKenzie and Ronnie Milsap. Interviews will be with The Great Western Orchestra (featuring David Wilkie and Steward MacDougall), Alan Jackson and Mack MacKenzie. For the June 20 edition, interviews are scheduled with Diamond Rio, Ray Condo, Sid Marty, and Acoustically Inclined. Videos will be shown of Kenny Rogers, k.d. lang, Ray Condo and the Hardrock Goners, Diamond Rio, Jim Lauderdale, Beth Neilson Chapman, and Tracy Lawrence.

HMV's West Edmonton Mall store reports that Wynonna Judd's album is the top seller, followed closely by Hal Ketchum's Past The Point Of Rescue, Diamond Rio's self-titled

album, Garth Brooks' No Fences, and The Judds' Greatest Hits, which makes up the store's Top 5 sellers.




