





Music industry groups file federal cabinet appeal

The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission's decision to licence two digital audio services has been appealed by 13 music industry associations representing Canadian recording artists, songwriters, music publishers and record companies.

The proposed services will offer up to 71 channels of compact disc quality music 24 hours a day with no commercials. The majority of the channels will be programmed and controlled in the United States and fed by satellite to Canadian cable stations. Under current copyright laws, American cable broadcasters are under no obligation to pay royalty compensation to Canadian artists, musicians or record producers for the use of their recordings.

"Our members are outraged at the decision, not just regarding the derisory levels of Canadian content on the system, but also that the Commission would see fit to directly licence what is, in effect, an American broadcaster in Canada. This flies in the face of both government and Commission policy," says Brian Chater, president of the Canadian Independent Record Production Association.

The basic elements of the music industry's appeal are: 1) The decision violates the Canadian broadcasting policy and Canadian content requirements; 2) The service

should be required to make predominant use of Canadian resources in the creation and presentation of programming for Canadian audiences; and 3) It should require the Commission to conduct a public hearing when audio digital broadcasting and other new technologies are introduced into the Canadian broadcasting system.

The groups are also filing a second appeal requesting that the federal cabinet invoke section 15 of the Broadcasting Act and direct the Commission to hold a policy hearing on the issue of digital audio broadcasting services as a whole.

The groups filing the appeals are: Alliance of Canadian Cinema, Television and Radio Artists; Alberta Recording Industry Association; Canadian Conference of the Arts; Canadian Independent Record Production

PolyGram makes changes in its regional personnel

PolyGram has announced its latest wave of personnel changes in its Montreal, Ottawa and Toronto offices.

Donna Lidster has joined the central region promotion team. At the same office, Andrea Lewis has become branch secretary and Tara Corbett is now the retail information co-ordinator.

Sexton and Malone to star in CBC-TV movie

Tommy Sexton and Greg Malone will star in a new CBC television movie called *Adult Children of Alcoholics: The Musical*.

The movie, written by Sexton and Malone of CODCO fame, is described as "a dysfunctional comedy" about a comedy performer coming to terms with his past.

Phyllis Platt, executive director of CBC's Arts & Entertainment, says principal photography will begin in mid-September in Toronto and Newfoundland. She also says that CBC "enthusiastically accepted" the Sexton and Malone proposal for their first feature film. "Tommy and Greg have a great track record on CBC-TV."

Ivan Fecan, vice-president of CBC English Television Networks, says, "This is a ground-breaking, extremely moving script. It will be an important part of our schedule this winter."

The film is a CBC Television production produced by Paul Brown and directed by Laurie Lynd, the team who created *R.S.V.P.*

Brown also produced *I Love A Man In Uniform*, which premiered in the Directors Fortnight at Cannes in May. Lynd's short film, *The Fairy Who Didn't Want To Be A Fairy Anymore*, is currently in theatrical release.

Magnetic Records is Canada's newest indie

Magnetic Records is Canada's newest independent label and its first release, a four song compact disc from Glueleg called *Park Alien*, is in stores now.

The Toronto-based label is headed by Reaction Studio's chief engineer, James Stewart, Reaction founder and president Ormond Jobin, and Tom Heron.

Magnetic is looking for acts of all styles to develop and assist in gaining attention in Canada and abroad.

Anne Murray signs deal with EMI's SBK label

Anne Murray signed with the EMI group label SBK on July 1, although she will still release on the Capitol label in Canada.

Croonin', comprising 18 tracks of torch songs from the '50s which draw from Murray's childhood memories of songs by the likes of Rosemary Clooney, Patti Page, Gogi Grant and Jo Stafford, will be released in the United States on SBK on Oct. 19. *Croonin'* is scheduled for an Aug. 20 Canadian release.

Murray spent the first part of the year in the studio with producer Tommy West, laying down the vocals of such chestnuts as *Old Cape Cod*, *The Wayward Wind*, *Allegheny Moon*, and the first single, *Make Love To Me*.

Murray begins touring again on Aug. 17 with a five-night engagement at The Trump Plaza in Atlantic City, N.J. In total, more than 50 American concert dates are scheduled.

Murray will be at Toronto's O'Keefe Centre for a four-night run beginning Oct. 13.



The CARAS team on the move!!! Dave Charles and Sylvia Tyson have mapped out a campaign to strengthen the regional field. They'll be networking provincial arts organizations in the west over the next few months. They have already covered Quebec and the Atlantic provinces. The message is that wherever you are in this country, you can be in touch. That's a welcome sign from the usually arrogant approach of CARAS in the past. Speaking about strengthening the regional field, I like their idea of moving the Junos across the country as well. Vocal kudos have to go to Neeley, Anderson, Leesa Richards (Mary Magdalene) Humphrey and, of course, the Styx man himself, Dennis (Pontius Pilate) DeYoung. You've got until Aug. 22, but act fast, the tickets are going fast. (EC: *Oops . . . too late!!!*)

Comedy, not country . . . ! Those rumours about a hot shot television mogul going after a country video channel, may be just rumour. May be! On the other hand, this is for sure. Moses Znaimer (EC: *A hot shot television mogul???*), and company, which includes CHUM Ltd., is after an all-comedy speciality television service for Canada. They're already flying the banner of Comedy Central Canada, which is only natural, being that the service

Diamond and Zero aim to show that they still have it

The Kings Are Here. Again.

Almost 13 years after the release of the above-mentioned debut album, The Kings are trying to get back into people's minds with their new album, *Unstoppable*. The title song picked up adds at rock-oriented radio stations across the country and the next focus track, *Lesson To Learn*, will have a supporting video as it tries to cross over multiple formats.

But things haven't always been this rosy in the up and down careers of vocalist/bassist

Repeating history. Can't Help Falling In Love by UB40 remains the No. 1 song in Canada for the second week. That matches the number of weeks the group's other No. 1 song stayed at the top. Red Red Wine was No. 1 for two weeks in February 1984. It's getting very crowded at the top and it's tough to predict which song will be at the top next week.

Bodies of water. It's getting confusing with all the river songs on the chart. The Steve Miller Band's *Wide River* is No. 15, Billy Joel's *River Of Dreams* is No. 20, and The Tea Party's *The River* is No. 53. Through the history of RPM there have only been four songs with a body of water in the title to reach No. 1. Name them. Hint: two of them mention river, one is a larger body of water and one is smaller.

Big names with big moves. The new release from Mariah Carey makes the biggest jump on the Hit Tracks chart. *Dream Lover* moves all the way from No. 60 to No. 18. That jump is two spots more than the 40-place climb of Rod Stewart's *Reason To Believe*, which moves to No. 28. Almost all the big name artists seem to have a song on the chart. In the Top 20, only Soul Asylum, The Proclaimers and Hemingway Corner don't have a substantial Top 20 history.

Cancon adds. The top three entries on the Hit Tracks charts are Cancon songs. Gogh Van Go's *Say You Will* leads the way, as it enters at No. 71. Doughboys' *Shine* is next at No. 83, followed by 13 Engines' *Smoke And Ashes* at No. 84. In addition, Jane Siberry's *Sail Across The Water* bows at No. 89.

The retail spotlight. Here are the Top 10 selling albums at the HMV store in Mississauga's Square One Mall, as reported by Ken Kirkwood. 1. Cypress Hill 2. U2 3. UB40 4. Pure Energy 5. Moxy Frivous 6. Stone Temple Pilots 7. Lenny Kravitz 8. The Proclaimers 9. Onyx 10. Rod Stewart.

The waterbabies. The four songs with a body of water in the title to reach No. 1 are *Down By The Lazy River* (Osmonds 1972), *Islands In The Stream* (Kenny Rogers & Dolly Parton 1983), *Sea Of Love* (The Honeydrippers 1984), and *Across The River* (Bruce Hornsby 1990).

David Diamond and guitarist Mister Zero, who have comprised the core of the band over the years. After attracting the attention of Bob Ezrin, a producer with one of the highest profiles in the business at the time after completing Pink Floyd's *The Wall*, this independent band from Oakville, Ont. found themselves recording in Los Angeles. That debut album spawned the rock radio staple, *This Beat Goes On/Switchin' To Glide*, and the road to fame and fortune seemed to be opening up. But problems with Elektra veered them off on an unwelcomed detour.

"We get radio money from it, but record sales, no," Zero says of the royalty cheques one expects he would have received from the song. "We still owe the record company, according to them, a whole lot of money. We never made any money on that."

The band's second album, *Amazon Beach*, was also produced by Ezrin and didn't come cheap. And when Elektra failed to put any promotional backing behind it, the album stiffed and left the band facing steep recoupment costs.

While Diamond and Zero managed to keep working full-time as musicians for 10 years, eventually Diamond had to drive trucks and sing in commercials and Zero started working behind the scenes in television to make ends meet. But they wrote enough songs for Capitol to release a four-track EP called

Merchant leaves group; only 9,999 Maniacs left

10,000 Maniacs vocalist Natalie Merchant has left the band after 12 years because of "a desire for change and a need for growth."

Merchant says she has been thinking about leaving for two years and that there is no ill will between any members of the group. The band postponed the announcement until after its recently completed tour "to avoid the distractions a 'farewell tour' may have produced in audiences, critics and the musicians on stage," Merchant says in a press release.

10,000 Maniacs' current Elektra (Warner) album is *Our Time In Eden*. Future plans for Merchant and the remaining band members will be announced in the coming months.

Dream Warriors deal with Island dissolved

Canadian hip hop has taken a bad rap since the Dream Warriors were dropped by 4th & Broadway/Island Records, the duo's United Kingdom-based record company, due to the ubiquitous "creative differences."

However, negotiations are underway with major labels on an international level for the release of the Warriors' much delayed, and still not completed, second album, *Dream Warriors -- The Movie* (Coming To A Planet Near You). Island in Canada may still distribute the album, but further details probably won't be known for a few weeks.

R.S.V.P. and to put out a couple of radio-only singles on their own Dizzy label. They also played the odd gig around Toronto.

Enough songs gradually accumulated that over the course of a year-and-a-half, The Kings had recorded enough material for a new album. Most of the songs were self-produced but then another big name, John Punter (Roxy Music, Bryan Ferry, Procul Harum, Slade), got involved by mixing the album. He also co-produced *Unstoppable* and *Lesson To Learn*.

"He really knows the ins and outs of getting the sound better than anyone we've worked with," Zero says. "It's crucial to have a good sounding record. That's why John was such a great guy to work with. He took the tracks that we did and really made them come alive with a real record sound instead of what might have been a demo. He can take that extra step."

Diamond and Zero put out *Unstoppable* on Dizzy and the album is being distributed by Spinner out of Vancouver. While they have a lawyer in Los Angeles shopping for a deal for the album, Zero is enjoying the challenge of almost starting from scratch again.

"You don't have to be on a major to have success. And with us, with the credentials we have at radio with *Switchin' To Glide*, it makes it a lot easier to have it heard. It has to stand on its own two feet, of course, but at least they'll listen to what we're doing."

Since *Unstoppable* isn't automatically racked in every store like most major label albums, sales haven't yet matched radio interest. But The Kings are confident that things are on the upswing for them again.

"The big record companies don't have to spend a lot of money to know what they're going to end up with," Diamond says, while Zero adds, "We feel good about it. We're in it for the long haul. Everybody in the business has been through the wringer at one time or another."


Canadian artists unite to combat the AIDS crisis

dependent diabetes, when he was 12. Insulin, commonly thought of as a cure, is in fact only a drug used to control the disease.

Hunter has been in and out of hospitals throughout his adult life as a result of insulin reactions. "When your sugar is low, you can think straight, but you can't speak coherently, and, to the observer, your actions simulate drunkenness. After an insulin reaction, your brain feels like it has been drained of everything, like a zombie."

Diabetes affects one million Canadians and is the third largest cause of death in Canada.

For Hunter and the Canadian Diabetes Association, making the general public aware of the facts and exposing the fictions concerning the disease is their top priority.

"The common response to people with diabetes is 'don't eat sugar,' but it's not that simple. People with diabetes are forced to live every day with a life threatening disease and must follow strict dietary and lifestyle routines. As well as being a hereditary risk, diabetes is also known to be caused by severe stress. This invisible disease also creates problems in areas the general public take for granted, such as obtaining a driver's license or health insurance."







DOUGHBOYS - Rock
Crush

Montreal's Doughboys have been churning out punk-edged rock and pop music since 1987 but, with Crush, the band takes its first at bat in the major leagues. And when this anxiously-awaited album is at its best, it's somewhat reminiscent of prime mid-period Replacements. The first single and video, Shine, has an aggressive yet melodic pop/rock sound that should be everywhere on campus and modern rock radio. And if Soul Asylum is now being played on AC radio, the Doughboys should be given a strong shot by CAR and AOR programmers. Shine and Fix Me were co-written by the band and Wiz from England's Mega City Four. Melt, Disposable, Tearin' Away and Everything should also be given the laudatory treatment. In the mood for a cheeky title? Try Shitty Song. Neighbourhood Villain veers over to a more plodding grunge sound which comes across better in the band's hard and fast live shows. Which reminds me, after the Doughboys return from some European dates, they will undertake a full Canadian tour in September and October. Crush was produced by Daniel Rey (Ramones, L7) in New York and mixed by Dave Ogilvie (Sloan, Skinny Puppy, Babes In Toyland) in Vancouver. Although it's not noted on the album, Crush is three parts Cancon (MAL). - SM




JACKIE PAPPAS - Pop


CLINTON GREGORY - Country

Pennington composition taken as the first single, unfortunately didn't have the magic to sustain chart action. Gregory's vocal strength is in his traditional country approach. His gutsy, clipped vocals factor into this, which allows him a unique projection stretch that most country artists lack. If I Were A Painting, written by Skip Ewing and Don Sampson, is perhaps the most powerful track on the album. He also shines on Bob Dellaposta's penning of Wish You Were Here. On Ladies Choice, written by Don Singleton and Rick Yancy, Gregory's fiddle playing is at its most dynamic. Produced by Ray Pennington. - WG



EARTHEN SKY - AC
Earthen Sky - Northumberland Music

It's very difficult to place Earthen Sky into one musical category. The music has a soft AC sound to it, but there are spiritual and even Celtic overtones to it. Earthen Sky was created when pianist/composer Andy Thompson began performing with singer/songwriter Eileen March. March's vocals are crisp and clean and add an uplifting feel to the soft melodic music. This independent release was recorded in a state-of-the-art studio in a renovated barn near Campbellford, Ontario (east of Toronto). Chasing Our Dreams is a very strong track and has radio potential. No Tomorrows and I Had A Dream are other possible selections although this album is more suited for retail than radio (a la Loreena McKennitt). To that end, Earthen Sky has been playing soft-seat venues complete with a very theatrical stage presence. A very interesting CD worth checking out. - TE



ANDREW CASH - Rock

Andrew Cash caused a stir by being the first Canadian signed to Island Records in 1987, and he put out two fine acoustic-oriented pop albums for the label. But now he's with a new record company, management team and backing band, the Little Ones, and he's added more electric guitars to the mix. But people who have been saying that Hi is a return to Cash's punk roots from his former band, L'Etranger, are stretching it a bit. Listen to some L'Etranger records, if you can still find them, and tell me how much punk you hear. But Cash has always been first and foremost an intelligent, incisive songwriter, and his reputation won't suffer from Hi. An examination of a hollow man named John Endicott leads off the album. Bob Wiseman plays piano on the track and co-produced Hi with Cash at Toronto's Metalworks Studio, and his influence seems to have rubbed off on the sparse arrangement of the song. It's Over is an end of relationship song co-written by former bandmate, and current Grievous Angel, Chuck Angus. DJs should be warned that the first single, A Lot Of Talk, ends very

abruptly. This is, Song Novelty, Hey Maria, This May Be My Life But This Is Not My Dream, and No Trial are all edgy pop/rock tunes which would fit in well at CAR. The album was mixed and mastered by Joe Blaney (The Clash, Waterboys, Soul Asylum). When someone says Hi, it usually puts a smile on your face. This solid album should too. - SM



AARON TIPPIN - Country
Call Of The Wild
RCA - 07863-66251-N

There's no mistaking who's in charge here. Tippin has a perfected wildness that he vocally cajoles into flat-out entertainment with each track. He's doing it now with Working Man's P.H.D., which is working its way to the top of the charts. The album is at least five singles deep: the title track, which he wrote with Terry Brown; Honky Tonk Superman and Let's Talk About You, which he wrote with Buddy Brock; and My Kind Of Town, a powerful outing he wrote with Sanger D. Shafer. Tippin has a vocal depth and a lyrical interpretation that grooves like a well-oiled machine. He fits into new, traditional and contemporary country, and watch for some crossover action into the AC market as well. Impressive cover. Front-racking will attract attention. - WG

Reach Out


Hi-Bias/BMG - 74321-14893-2-N
Oval Emotion is the brother and sister team of Kenny Moran and Cissy Goodridge, with a big assist from producer and Hi-Bias founder Nick Fiorucci. The Toronto-based duo's first single, Don't Make Me Wait, made the Top 10 of the RPM Dance chart. The song also comes in an 'Elicit Mix.' Do It and Go Go also come in two different versions. How Do We Keep It Alive and Gimme That Love are ballads, while most of the remainder of the album consists of rather generic mid-tempo dance music. Oval Emotion apparently has had some success on the British dance charts. - SM

Marbles


Raw Energy/A&M - 74242-1005-2-Q
While King Apparatus' music is still based around ska, Marbles moves the group farther afield into other areas of rock and pop. Guitarist Sam Tallo has also taken on

Rique Franks supplies a small female presence with her background vocals on Strong Physical Urge, which is supported by a video. Lead singer Chris Murray's voice will still get confused with Doug Bennett's, but maybe to a lesser degree than on the band's last album. Chicago's Urge Overkill has had a number of critically acclaimed independent releases since its first in 1986, but Saturation marks the band's major label debut. Although it was produced by the Butcher Bros., who cut their teeth with rap acts Cypress Hill and Schooly-D, Saturation's sound is pure, guitar driven pop/rock. Although the first single, Sister Havana, is getting CAR and modern rock radio support, it's not even one of the strongest tracks on this quality album. Tequila Sundae, Positive Bleeding, Back On Me, Woman 2 Woman, Bottle Of Fur, Crackbabies and Heaven 90210 are all rock solid. The acoustic guitar, lightly throbbing bassline and simple, steady percussion of Dropout sets it apart from most of the other 11 tracks. The fashion conscious trio's offbeat sense of humour shines through on Erica Kane, a tribute to All My Children's Susan Lucci. And after the completion of the body of Nile And Grey, the listener is treated to a sample of the opening of the Mary Tyler Moore theme with band members speaking over it. - SM

It's interesting the music that's available in this age of technopop home-style studio experimentation. Tony G (Giverin), a classically-trained pianist from Kitchener/Waterloo, has put together his own jazz/pop instrumental album that shouldn't be overlooked. He uses a variety of synthesized keys, drums and recorders that allow for an intricate layering of highly entertaining instrumental effects. Radio play, as with most instrumental albums, will be limited, and interest at retail for this original alternative music will be equally difficult. Nevertheless, a writing talent like this shouldn't go unnoticed. There's an ear appeal here with Giverin's unique talent on both the electronic and acoustic piano keyboards. Key are Kick It and Wireless Jazz. Giverin looks after all the instrumentation himself. The only outside influence is Phil Cottrell, who is featured on saxophone on 56th & 7th. Awards will be presented to on-air personalities, music directors and radio stations in major and secondary markets at the broadcasters' luncheon on Sept. 18.



Chevy trucks to headline Canadian country tour

The Chevy Drive Tour, billed as "one of the most extensive country music concert events ever staged in Canada," will serve as both a Chevy truck commercial and a promotional vehicle for country music.

The tour, which will touch down in 16 cities this fall, will headline one of Canada's top country recording artists, Cassandra Vasik, with American country star Steve Wariner. Chevrolet's 1994 S-10 compact pickup truck will also be a star of the tour.

Martin Walsh, director of marketing for General Motors of Canada, explains that "with the unprecedented surge in popularity of contemporary country music, especially within non-traditional segments," the tour "will have tremendous appeal to that large and rapidly growing group of Canadians who are country music fans."

The primary factor in mounting the tour, however, is competition in the truck market. Walsh went on to explain that this competition "is so intense that the need to explore new and innovative marketing initiatives to reach today's truck buyer is continuous."

He expects the tour will give GM "an excellent opportunity to target a major segment of the population which contains potential customers for our products."

The tour is timely for Vasik, who is currently on release with her Epic album, *Feels Like Home*. She is currently charting with *Fortune Smiled On Me* (#10). *Roll Like A Wheel* was shipped to radio this week as the

Gary Slight, president and chief executive officer of Standard Radio, expressed confidence that adding Tompkins to the group, "gives us the last piece of the puzzle. We feel we now have the components necessary to put forward an excellent application for this important licence."

Standard's application for the speciality channel is the only entry taking a high profile approach. Since revealing their intentions in May, Slight, Martin and Gregg have met with several factions of the industry outlining their plans and the ultimate benefit to the domestic market should they be successful in their bid.
