

## FACTOR receives \$9 million boost from Sheila Copps

Sheila Copps, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Canadian Heritage, announced last Friday (Nov. 1) there will be a \$15 million increase in the current funding for the Sound Recording Development

the Sound Recording Development Program.

The increase in funding, which will go into effect April 1, will be utilized by FMC for the marketing and promotion of Canadian Sound recordings.

"What we've got to do over the next six to eight weeks is have a consultation with the government to determine what the terms and conditions on the funding are going to be," said Heather Ostertag, FACTOR's Executive Director. Following that, says Ostertag, there will be an

industry consultation in which FACTOR will hold a round table to discuss specific fund allocation. The consultation is targeted to take place at the latest in January 1997.

The increase in funds marks the culmination of six years of lobbying on behalf of the FMC, CIRPA and ADISQ organizations for marketing and promotion funds for the industry.

"It is such a positive signal for the industry to receive this kind of boost from the Minister and her Department," said Ostertag.

## New Bowie release falls to earth -- again

Virgin Music has announced the forthcoming release of Earthling, the newest release from David Bowie and the first self-produced album since 1974's Diamond Dogs. The album, which is currently being mixed, will see worldwide release on January 28, of the new year.

Telling Lies, the album's first single, saw exclusive wide release on the Internet last month. Heavily downloaded since that time, it remains the first song ever to do so. Earthling will also include





"We are looking forward to working with the industry to ensure these funds have the optimum impact in strengthening the position of the Canadian independent recording industry both nationally and internationally."

Not surprisingly, reactions from the

independent sector of the industry were extremely positive.

"It shows the government's commitment to a key component of Canada's cultural industry," President of CIRPA Brian Chater stated in a press release.

"Our members are fully aware of the necessity to be a force in markets around the world and this

commitment from the government will go a long way towards making their objectives a reality."

Copps has vowed to expand the cultural sector in Canada, of which the sound recording market alone is worth \$1.2 billion and employs more than 16,000 people. According to figures from the government, the industry has seen an 18 percent growth in jobs in the last five years.

Never Be A Victim, a new four-part video series from Sony Wonder, takes a realistic look at today's world and offers parents, and teachers alike, a frank manner of teaching children self preservation techniques. The home video library, already being used as part of the curriculum in some schools, features some powerful and thought-provoking subjects with Officer Jim's Ten Rules To Streetproofing, Preventing Abduction, Preventing Molestation and Building Your Family Team For Safety

Endorsed by major school boards and police services, many Block Parent groups, the Salvation Army and the Department of National Defense, Never Be A Victim offers up some grim statistics,

but in the same vein offers solutions and vital life skills to prevent crimes like abduction and molestation and reduce needless injury and deaths of children in dangerous places.

Producer Gordon formed the alliance with the Metro Police Force following the attempted abduction of a three-year-old he knew and upon realizing that there was a serious lack of comprehensive teaching programs for proper streetproofing techniques.

Police Officer Jim Byrne, known to students as "officer Jim", has spent the past 19 years teaching safety to Metro Toronto students and was chosen as the key spokesperson for the project for his common-sense approach and outstanding teaching skills. ## Trend signs Crowl to distribution deal

Trend Music has signed a distribution deal with Toronto pop artist Victor Crowl. Initial release will be The Healing, Crowl's second album, scheduled for a Nov. 9 launch at Toronto's Opera House. The launch will begin with a screening of Crowl's self-produced videos which will follow an earlier show by The Roots.

Dragon Slayer will be the first single and video released from the new album, a song that reportedly, took Crowl seven years to write. The song is described as a culmination of Crowl's "lifelong journey and the inner conflict resulting from the abandonment of his father at the age of 10 months."

In Crowl's own words, the song is "the process and conclusion of (his) healing." The Healing was mastered by Nick Blagona. Session players included drummer Graeme Kirkland, keyboardist John White and Mike Constatino, formerly of One.

The video for Dragon Slayer was shot on location in New York City, Ocean City, Maryland, Washington, D.C. and in Toronto.

Crowl will be at HMV's superstore at 333 Yonge Street in Toronto on Nov. 14.

## Benefit luncheon for Music Therapy Trust Fund

The Canadian Music Trust Fund (CMTTF) will hold its first music industry luncheon at The Vaughan Estate, 2075 Bayview Ave. in Toronto on Friday Nov. 29 at 12 noon.

Tickets have been pegged at \$100. Tables of 10 are available at \$1,000. Along with food and drink, there will be a presentation, door prize and a silent auction. For tickets call 416-488-6363.

CMTTF raises funds to support, promote research and develop music therapy projects, and also assists those who are unable to afford music therapy. As well, it is designed to encourage non-speaking children to communicate, to help youngsters, who are emotionally upset to learn to trust, and to soothe the pain and loneliness of people in hospices.

The Canadian music industry has thrown its support behind the charity. Just recently, CARAS

president Lee Silversides presented CMTTF president Fran Herman with a cheque for \$10,000 (RPM - Nov. 4/96). The money will be used to provide new instruments and equipment to such music therapy programs as Communitas: a music improvisation project for street kids in Vancouver.

At Communitas, high-risk youth are offered the opportunity to be part of a community based on music and arts rather than drugs and violence. At Maison Re-Né in Trois-Rivière, for instance, music therapy supplies comfort and support to people with AIDS who suffer loss of autonomy and are in severe pain.

The CARAS donation came from its music education fund, one of the three charities that benefitted from the sales of Oh What A Feeling, the 77-song, 4-CD compilation celebrating the 25th anniversary of the Juno Awards.

From what we've seen and heard about Rent, a younger and even more liberal audience will line up to catch this show. In fact, the producers will introduce same-day, front row tickets at \$20.00 each for those who want to stand in line. The show opens in Toronto in November of next year, and after its 20-week run, will move to Vancouver. There could be a Toronto cast recording as well. David Geffen paid just under a million dollars to record the original cast album. So, who knows?? (EC: *The Mervi do!!!*)

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

**Celine Dion** wins five more Felix awards, which are dubbed the Quebec recording industry's equivalent to the Grammys. Dion who was performing in Zurich while the 18th annual awards were being presented has now collected 33 Felixes. This year's

trophies represented: best female artist; best concert performer; most illustrious artist outside of Quebec; and Best Selling Record (Duex). Kevin Parent of Gaspé Que., walked away with five awards including male artist of the year.

## CBSC releases decision concerning comments about sexual harassment

CFTO aired a humorous segment on News Beat Today, during the piece host Robin Ward discussed Donald Sutherland's attitude towards sexual harassment after working on the set of Disclosure. In Ward's words Sutherland said he's too old to change and says he even takes off his hat when a woman comes in the room. But the last time he did that he said the woman gave him a dirty look. Ward commented "Well come on Donald, taking your hat off in front of a woman you've never met before . . . now that's sexual harassment if I've ever heard it."

After launching an official complaint to CFTO, an offended viewer took her differences to the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council, stating "the remark was offensive, and that not only does Mr Ward need to be sensitized and educated about issues of such gravity, he needs to know if he wants to share

his views he can do so in an editorialized offering."

CBSC referred the matter to its Ontario Regional Council and after viewing the tape and reviewing the complaint under the industry's code of ethics and its Sex-Role Portrayal Code which require broadcasters to exhibit sensitivity to the problems associated gender stereotyping, and to refrain from exploitation in their programming.

In its decision the council affirmed, "the remarks of host Robin Ward . . . were . . . neither intentionally nor even inadvertently heavy-handed. They were perhaps an attempt to suggest that society may be tasking itself too seriously ore going to far in sanctioning any behaviour which may be seen to deviate from some absolute norm . . . at the issue of sexual harassment itself.

Thus, Council decided that CFTO-TV did not breach the industry's codes.

Angelil was awarded manager of the year and also collected a Special Achievement Award as part of a tribute video presentation. Tarlton and Barry Garber won producer of the year for the Celine Dion World Tour and the Quebec tour with Kevin Parent.

**Strawberry Records** put out to strawberry fields. With the Toronto-based Strawberry label announcing they are officially closed down, Rymes With Orange are talking to several other labels about distribution of their first two albums Peel and Trapped In The Machine. The band is currently in Vancouver working on their third album.

**Korn has cancelled** their November 8 date. The new date for Toronto's Warehouse has been set for March 27. Refunds are available at point of purchase.

**Warner** to release album to benefit pediatric AIDS research. For Our Children Too is an album of recordings from some of the music business' biggest stars. The album was compiled to raise funds for the Pediatric AIDS Foundation in the United States. The album features performances by Seal (Puff The Magic Dragon), Celine Dion (Brahms Lullabye), Carly Simon (Mockingbird) and Natalie Cole (Both

Sides Now). A total of 18 artists offer their talents on the 16 tracks included on this set. All artist royalties and record company profits from the album go directly to the Pediatric Aids Foundation. The album is being distributed by Kid Rhino in the States and by Warner Music domestically.


## Brunet and Cormier named in Virgin shuffle



*Trinidad native takes radio by storm***Sony Music does the Camille thing**

It would be enough to say that Camille is a brilliant singer. It was her vocals that made Deeper Shade Of Love an international success and the sleeper hit of last year. The fire off that track caught early on, bulleting it to the top of dance charts and propelling sales of the single to over 1 million worldwide. When the video was voted the #1 dance music video of the year by MuchMusic, Deeper Shade Of Love became the shoo-in for the Juno Award for best dance recording, which it scooped up this past March. Then came Do Ya Own Thing, a magical piece that is quickly following in the footsteps of its predecessor and showing its mettle on Canadian music charts as well as in club circuits around the world.

The story doesn't end there however. Camille also happens to be a fierce self-promoter and administrator of her music and one of the chiefs behind BMG Music Publishing. In the vocabulary of the industry, she is simply a much sought after commodity. And people have taken notice: recently and most importantly Kevin Unger and Rick Camilleri at Sony Music Canada, who are responsible for the huge push of Do Ya Own Thing at radio. The details, however, are firmly under the jurisdiction of the resourceful singer.

"We've got different mixes that are specifically done to suit mainstream radio format," she says. "Not only do we have a dance mix for dance music stations like Energy 108 and Hot 103, we've got the soul mix and the wah wah mix, trance mix and everything to suit whatever that programme director's taste is. We're covering all the bases!"

Not surprisingly, Do Ya Own Thing is enjoying a good degree of crossover spins, undoubtedly a response from its strong lyrical content and musical pragmatism. Little wonder that

some extremely flattering accolades are being bandied about that track.

"Do Ya Own Thing to me was a song that was inspired by a lot of things," says Camille. "I look at what's happening out there with a lot of people and for me it's a song that handicapped people can relate to, a song for children who are oppressed or mentally abused or whatever, gay people; everyone you can think of who is being suppressed in our



society, in the world. The song is something to give them hope to know that they can do their own thing and not to let anybody bring you down."

Originally from Trinidad, Camille grew up in a tight community of music lovers who recognized her talents early on and signed her up with a classical trainer to do piano and vocals. Eventually,

however, she was forced out of it due to a nagging creative need.

"Classical is great but it is also sort of confined," she says. "I really loved contemporary music so I branched off."

Arriving in Canada at an early age, she undertook to get things off the ground at a record pace. She hooked up with Richard Bravo who at that time was with Beat Factory Productions dealing with groups like Dream Warriors and Mishi Mi. Soon Camille and Bravo branched out to form a company called Sandcastle Productions, which acquired a publishing deal through BMG Music Publishing within a year of its inception.


"It was because of [BMG Publishing] that I started honing my craft. Because once you are in that situation and you are being supported by a major label, you can then sit back and hone your craft."

Receiving support from the industry was, for Camille, the breakthrough point in her career in more ways than one. Having infiltrated the industry as a writer prior to as an artist, Camille was able to recognize the deep debt that artists owe to the little people who function as trampolines to stardom.

"It's not just about the artist and the material and their vocal ability," she says. "It's also the team that is in place to make this happen. And I guess for me a lot of people play a lot of major roles and don't even recognize that they play major roles because they are not in the spotlight."

"These people are the ones who, in a way, are responsible for my career in terms of clout and longevity of my material. It takes a whole team of people to make a star."

Camille and Sony have recently hashed out plans for an LP scheduled for wide release sometime next spring. And with the kind of track record she has already established on just two songs; it's not surprising that Sony has placed some high anticipations on the record. They, like Camille, understand that, with a history of two tracks which have done more than some careers, the future is rife with possibilities.





With a two guitar/drum and no bass setup that sounds like its being cranked through an electric cattle prod, The Jon Spencer Blues explosion aim to beat white shit into the very black and still-intact soul of blues. The aptly titled Blues Explosion traces its musical heritage to modern roots music and punk rock, and its historical ancestry to that cool punk rock fiasco that malfunctioned under the name Pussy Galore, as well as Boss Hog, Spencer's current side project. Like their punk siblings, Blues Explosion is a cacophony of grey noise and wise cracks that have been a pretty serious footnote to the more commercially viable quarters in the format. And a funny thing, that while this music will probably never have any substantial commercial appeal, we've yet to run into somebody who doesn't like it - even love it - if only for a single minute. Clever, honest and irreverent, Jon Spencer is probably one of the few punk enthusiasts who have intelligently evolved the format into the '90s. We reckon there won't be a single here, and it's little wonder, with lyrics like: 'Play it cool/fuck the rules, Smash a car/ make it fucked up, Skip out on the rent/make me fucked up, Hang with sluts/Spill your guts' (Fuck Shit Up). Now I Got Worry may be reserved for the alternative junk bin but, lucky for us, the junk bin just happens to be the place where the best alternative stuff is to be got. **-RG**

Lenni Jabour was discovered by none other than the guys from I Mother Earth, who were being waited on by the young pianist at a restaurant and decided to refer her to manager Bob Luhtala (who, incidentally, is also known to operate under the dubious credentials of Dinky The Clown). Now Luhtala



is managing Jabour, whom he has taken on as the newest addition for his rock based indie label. As with the rock acts the label specializes in, Jabour has had her share of the circuit, apparently battling the demons of indifference and misunderstanding in dilapidated cafes across the Toronto and L.A. -- just her and her piano. Perseverance paid off with this eight song release that tells a story of rigorous honesty and a fighting spirit which were to eventually claim notable victories with opening gigs for Blue Rodeo and Burton Cummings. Much of that has been crystallized on the album; these songs are all emotion and soul, revealing a strong internal voice which must have operated double time through the years, the rigour softened by escalating dual notes of piano and vocal. 
The alternative fringe and lovers of Rockie and Bullwinkle will recognize Huevos Rancheros as *the* domestic word on surf rock -- and we're talking all the way from Newfoundland to Vancouver (where the boys are from). It seems BMG had the insight to



pick them up for distribution, though the deal lasted about half a minute, God only knows why. Nevermind, Huevos Rancheros have paved a highly lucrative path based solely on their guitar/bass/drum and no vocal stint, a setup which has allowed them to concentrate their efforts on bringing out the TexMex in Dick Dale and wrapping it up in the clean punch of AC/DC. With several movie features and appearances on ski, surf and snowboard films from North America, Japan and Australia, the Huevos have put their flag wherever they've gone. The video for Gump Worsley's Lament, from their 1995 release titled Dig In!, set a visual mark for them on MuchMusic which was followed by the MuchMusic Best Independent Video Award 1995/96 for Rockin' In The Henhouse. 

Complete with a rooftop reunion concert and its most recognizable member conspicuously absent (of course, in this case, not deceased. "Sadly he's gone into comedy," claim bandmates), Rutlemania has returned with this collection of "vintage



recordings and newly recorded tracks." Sans creator and lead singer Dirk McQuickley (Monty Python's Eric Idle), the Rutles (Ron Nasty, Stig O'Hara and Barry Wom, better known as Neil Innes, Ricky Fataar and John Halsey) brought aboard replacement Ollie Halsall for this collection that will surely appease fans of the fictitious group of mop tops. Formed in 1978 as the comedic brainchild of comedian Idle, the Rutles released one album, All You Need Is Cash, and were in the midst of recording another album when the band "split up amid squabbles and lawsuits" With tracks like Major Happy's Up And Coming Once Upon A Good Time Band, Eine Kleine Middle Klasse Music and Back In '64, this clever Beatles parody comes fresh on the heels of the Anthology release and offers some kitschy, fun pop tunes. The first single, Shangri-La, is accompanied by an all-star video featuring the likes of Peter Gabriel, Graham Nash, Cyndi Lauper, Slash, Ben E. King, Gloria Gaynor, Richard Belzer, Janeane Garofalo and Marsha Warfield. 

Produced by Mike Napolitano, Andy Wallace and Blind Melon, Nico is almost a collection of mementos in the form of songs recorded in different situations and locations. The album combines beautiful, simple, upbeat melodies with some more ominous tones and intensely dark lyrics. And the first single,

The hugely successful Someone Who's Cool is boldly heralding this fourth release from these recently acclaimed darlings of Canadian rock. The entrance of that track at radio is indicative of a follow up in line with last year's Good Weird Feeling, which had the folks at BMG kicking themselves for not having stayed on top of their contractual paperwork. That's old news, however, and Nest the new breed of Odds to continue in the legacy of pop rock that is light in its observations and conservative in its delivery. That notwithstanding, the band has allowed a lot of colour to seep through on this release with the addition of an assortment of instruments including trumpet and mandolin, which give the songs some great character. And the album shows it; there isn't so much as a blip in the fluid motion of tracks of Heard You Wrong, Nothing Beautiful, Make You Mad and Hurt Me. Put simply, it's a privilege to hear great rock music again; the type the industry at large gets excited about, and the type radio will support till the cows come home. A groundbreaking video for Someone Who's Cool and a major tour will find Nest a permanent home on the retail charts which will go miles to supporting the idea that Odds newest is not so much a triumph for Warner as a triumph for the Canadian music community. **-RG**



ironically, is a unique take on the Steppenwolf version of Hoyt Axton's The Pusher. Some hauntingly ironic and foreboding lyrics are found in tracks like Swallowed, Pull and Hell -- one of the last pieces ever put on tape by Hoon. From the mid-Eastern rhythms of Glitch, to the slow, droning version of No Rain, Nico is rife with examples of the late singer's talent and torment. Worth noting is the funky version of John Lennon's John Sinclair, which was originally recorded to be part of a tribute album that has yet to happen. Despite the de rigueur overdubs on several tracks, many of the songs were left exactly as recorded as a tribute to the late singer/songwriter; included are the sounds of traffic passing outside the tour bus in Life Ain't So Shitty and the eerie Letters From A Porcupine, which is a song Hoon recorded over the phone directly onto the answering machine of guitarist Christopher Thorn. Fans won't want to miss this collector's item. -LT

**THE BEAUTIFUL SOUTH - Pop/Alternative  
Blue Is The Colour**



This successful, albeit low-key, UK import holds the impressive claim as having the most successful songwriting team since Lennon and McCartney. The partnership of vocalist Paul Heaton and guitarist Dave Rotheray have come up with eleven new songs for this latest release that has garnered a single, Rotterdam (Or Anywhere), that debuted at number six on the UK charts. This



is the sixth release for the Beautiful South and should be as much a phenomenal success as previous works. With five albums hitting the top ten (none peaking lower than six) since 1989, the Beautiful South have amassed quite a following -- and with good reason. The combination of mellow, breezy, acoustic sounds with some witty and oftentimes sarcastic lyrics. Don't Marry Her, the outstanding track on this release, features some cleverly vulgar relationship advice that will be appreciated by those with a sense of humour and, perhaps, cause more than a little dismay for Ms. Gore and her PMRC. But c'est la vie -- it's a good song. And for those who are multi-lingual, the liner notes include a complete lyric sheet with translations into German, Arabic, Russian, Chinese and Japanese to name a few. It looks like the Beautiful South will continue to make beautiful music for a long time to come. -LT

**THE TEA PARTY - Rock/Alternative  
Alhambra**

This six-song enhanced EP is an appeasement of sorts to fans of Canadian alt-



rockers the Tea Party until their new record is released in early 1997. Featuring alternate versions of songs from The Edges of Twilight, as well as a previously unreleased track. The band's culturally-diverse sounds have earned them a fan base that has snapped up over 300,000 copies of their first two albums. Although this release only includes 6 tracks, it also features over 47 minutes of multimedia that uses the Sister Awake video as an interface. In addition to band pictures, tour information, an extensive discography and information on the band's use of exotic instruments, a never before released video for Shadows On The Mountainside (from The Edges Of Twilight) and acoustic versions of Inanna and Silence are part of the package. Look for a tour that takes the Alhambra concept on the road as well as an acoustic Canadian tour. -LT




**SECRET GARDEN - Classical  
Songs From A Secret Garden**

Though not classical music in the usual sense of the word, these exquisite contemporary compositions of Rolf Lovland are most decidedly classic in form and substance. They are relaxing, even soothing. Yet, they must not be dismissed as mere mood music. These miniatures are suffused with the discipline of a master composer who has also arranged them thereby ensuring a deserved lush texture. There are 13 tracks and each one is a bouquet of beauty. Our favourite is Serenade To Spring, but Nocturne, Heart Strings and Chaconne are favoured as well. One is muchly reminded on all compositions of Satie, Schumann and even Chopin. This is truly a blue moon experience. Lovland directs the Irish National Choir and co-orchestrator John Tate directs the R.T.E. Concert Orchestra and soloists, among them, Irish violinists Fionnuala Sherry. The recordings were made in Iceland, Norway, Denmark and Ireland proving once again the universality of fine music. -BW

**GATEWAY - Jazz  
In The Moment**

We think In The Moment is intended as far out jazz, but if so, it slips over the edge of syncopation into exotica. Gateway is a trio comprised of John Abercrombie on guitar,




Dave Holland on double bass and Jack De Johnette, who plays piano, conventional drums, Korg wave-drum and Turkish frame drum. Starting to get the idea? The five tracks composed by them include the title song at 8:36, The Enchanted Forest (9:20), Cinucen (6:42), Shrubberies (14:01) and Soft (7:13). Now, have you got the idea? As should be

expected, tempo and beat are the joint keystones here and by and large, serve the trio well. If at times, a few of the tracks seem repetitive, it's only that the compositions are being stretched to the ultimate of aspiration and inspiration by skilled musicians in love with their craft. This auditor thinks it's good stuff even whilst admitting unsureness of intention. -BW

**FARMER'S DAUGHTER - Country  
Makin' Hay**



Farmer's Daughter are Jake, ShaunaRae and Angela. Cornfields Or Cadillac, written by Marcus Hummon, Monty Powell and Mike Noble, taken as the first single, has become the fastest moving chart single in the trio's history. Their debut, Girls Will Be Girls, an independent release, attracted a national audience and a major label, MCA. This follow-up is certainly a step-up, oozing with confidence and a seemingly, new-found freedom of spirit that literally bounces with excitement. Their choice of song material is excellent and whether by accident or design, better fits their persona. There's a heavy emphasis on emotion and key here is the Darrell Scott penning of Now That I'm On



My Own, and Walking Away From You, written by Marcus Hummon. Also a priority is What It's All About, which the trio wrote with Greg Barnhill. Most covers don't work, but ShaunaRae's spin on Bobbie Gentry's Ode To Billie Joe is exceptional, bringing this hit from 1967 into the '90s. One track not to overlook is the Beth Nielsen Chapman penning of You Said. The vocal warmth and charm plus the trio's gentle working off each other fits musically, like a glove. Produced by Monroe Jones and recorded in Vancouver at The Factory and Armoury. -WG

**VARIOUS ARTISTS - Classical  
The Russian Label - Highlights**

**Melodya/BMG-74321-27247-N**  
Though the U.S.S.R. endured seven decades of Godless communism, the performing arts, including ecclesiastical music, survived. Proof is evident on this "sampler" CD of works performed and recorded before glasnost. The first nine tracks are selected Festal Hymns celebrating the Russian Holy Easter. They were recorded in 1978 by the combined choirs of Trinity-St.Sergius Laura and the Moscow Theological (sic) Academy. The sound is deep, sonorous and ultimately moving despite a seeming lack of evangel fervour. One wonders how the works would sound if they could be performed now with exaltation added to the excellence of craft. Tracks 10 through 15 are excerpts from Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Ballet recorded on New Year's Eve, 1981 before a live audience in the Grand Hall of the Philharmonic by the Leningrad Philharmonic Orchestra. What would you have us to say? The music is timeless and if the reading given by conductor Yevgeny Mravinsky is less than inspired, it at least affords one a glimpse of a romantic time not likely ever to be seen again. Ditto for Mikhail Pietnev's piano transcription and performance of measures from the same work on the remaining tracks. They are precise and elegant. Listening to this CD might not be the visceral experience that it should be, but it's a pleasant one



nevertheless and proof that humankind will always aspire to a paradise manifest in the arts despite earthly bonds. -BW

**VARIETY VILLAGE BAND - Pop  
Take Me Home For Christmas**

A perfect holiday gift beautifully crafted to keep on giving and giving. The 12 season classics are superbly put together for a most enjoyable listen. Produced by Phil Sheridan with executive producers Kim Kelly and Ken McKinnon, musical director Bill Hughes, puts his highly-polished musicians through their paces. And they show that polish on a Yuletide Portrait, Three Moods of Hanukkah, Fireside Christmas, Eddy Graf's Christmas Waltz and, of course, Irving Berlin's White Christmas. There is also a bouncy Curzon-arrangement of a Calypso Christmas that gives a unique spin to these Christmas classics. The Newell Long arrangement of Twas The Night Before Christmas, features a poignant narration by Christine Knight of Clement C. Moore's poem. A great package of entertainment. The instrumentation is perfectly balanced, crisp and clean, and at times, symphonic sounding. Recorded at



McClellan Pathe and Puck's Farm Studios. These musicians, all between the ages of 11 and 21, perform as both a concert and a marching band. The band was founded in 1984. ## Odds create Nest egg with latest release

It was one hot year for Vancouver's Odds, once Good Weird Feeling, their Warner debut, hit the stands in early 1995. 130,000 units later (in Canada alone), there is a good weird feeling in the air that pretty fairly makes up for the eight odd years the band struggled to get some respect.

"Respect is a good word," says guitarist Greg Northey, deep in discussions prior to a cross Canada media extravaganza that will put Odds front and centre as one of next year's leading rock acts. "People have finally made a connection between us and the music they see or hear."

It sounds somewhat trite, but recognition has been an uneasy achievement for Northey and bandmates Doug Elliot, Pat Steward and Steven Drake, who for the longest time had to struggle against being unidentified with the hits they were putting out. Once signed to Zoo/BMG, Odds left the label in 1994 just prior to Good Weird Feeling, that being an important consideration. But Northey is not adamant that the confusion was due to BMG, just that the growth the band was obviously undergoing was not mirrored at the label.

"[Warner] had an opportunity to market us as more mature artists who had already done something, and BMG had to start from scratch," explains Northey. "They were scrambling to find one particular thing about us that was marketable or interesting or exciting, whereas Warner had the luxury of being able to simply say 'these are songs.'"

Although Northey swears that there hasn't been a conscious effort to achieve distinctiveness, nevertheless their newest album, Nest, has been effected with unorthodox instrumentation that certainly seems to suggest as much. Aside from the solid twin guitar, bass and drum kick which has fashioned a good deal of their radio driven hooks, Odds have now added depth and colour with trumpet, piano, mandolin and vibraphone.

"I think we're always looking to each time we go out to get emotion across in the music," says Northey, "Whatever changes we need to make, we'll do."

The band has certainly learned a lot from the recent past. Drake, the multi-instrumentalist of the group, has busied himself with recording gigs in between albums, engineering and co-producing 54-40's latest and mixing the Tragically Hip's Trouble At The Henhouse. Northey, Elliot and Stewart, for their part, worked on the score for the Kids In The Hall feature titled Brain Candy, all of which conceived a few golden eggs on Nest.

Says Northey: "We certainly had more ideas about composition and orchestration and honing in on what it is that could make our songs a little more powerful."

That power is already in evidence with Someone Who's Cool, the album's first single which has bulleted to #82 after two weeks on RPM's Hits 100 chart. The video, which features some extremely funky animation theatrics, will no doubt land it heavy on MuchMusic, just in time for a cross-Canada tour sometime next year.



**Q-107's** Jessie and Gene show became the Sharon, Lois, Bram, Jessie and Gene show this past Friday (November 8). The popular children's artists took over the airwaves as co-hosts to the regular morning team in support of their new Elephant Party CD and Elephant Party Pak, a three-pack of their best-

selling albums. The performers have three shows scheduled in Ottawa as well as eight performances at the O'Keefe Centre from December 5 to 8.

Take note Detroit radio stations...**Windsor's The River 89X** has grabbed the attention of columnist Bob Talbert (of the Detroit Free Press) with the spins of midday host Ann Delisi and her inclusion of Chantal Kreviazuk's God Made Me. The mention in his November 4 column should make Detroit station directors sit up and realize what CanCon records and Canuck broadcasters have to offer.

And speaking of what Canadian stations have to offer...how about \$60,000 in cash and prizes? That's exactly what **Vancouver's 99.3 the Fox** bestowed upon one lucky listener. Kevin Antifave of Langley was the grand prize winner of the station's recent Car, Cash and Cuba contest (see November 4 issue) and is on his way to the Club

Verdero Resort with three of his friends and \$5000 in his pocket.

**CBC Radio and Stereo** has added some more kudos to its list of accolades. War correspondent Rick MacInnes-Rae has been included in a group of journalists being judged at the Prix Bayeux, an annual international competition among war correspondents, and was awarded the Citation for excellence under fire at a ceremony held October 24 in Bayeux, France. her SGE release, *Somewhere In Between*. Written by Nashville writers Irene Kelly, Dave Robbins and Van Stephenson, the song is about domestic abuse, which gives the video a great deal of "staying power." The album was produced by Bob Bullock and Jamie Klee and was recorded at Battery Studio in Nashville and Metal Works in Mississauga, Ontario, but it's not clear if this particular track was wholly produced in Canada.

**Lyndia Scott is back** with a four-song collection which is a sampling of her upcoming album, as yet untitled. Born in Montreal, Scott now lives on the west coast. Her 1993 debut album, *Isn't It Always Love*, gained her a national audience. As *Good As You Look*, which Scott co-wrote with Jim Foster, is the first focus track. The EP was produced by Bill Buckingham and recorded at Vancouver's Crosstown Studio and Buckingham Palace. Session musicians were drummer Shawn Soucy, bassist Jim Ryan, Jim Foster on guitar and mandolin, Jim Dorin on pedal steel, keyboardist Miles Black, Keith Bennett on mouth harp, Buckingham on tambo and Scott and Rocko Vaugeois on backing vocals.

**Brent Howard** is going with a ballad, *Always Leaving Something Behind* for his next focus track. The track is included on his self-titled album produced by Tony Rudner. Rudner and Reid are credited as the writers of the song.

**Today's Country** scheduled an "exclusive conversation", with Mary Chapin Carpenter for its Nov. 10th edition. **Trina** will be appearing at a major country exhibition in New Jersey (Nov. 15-17). The Lower Sackville recording artist will take part in the official opening, perform showcases, one which will be a live radio broadcast. She will also take part in a number of meet the fans events, along with Aaron Tipping, Lari White, Sammy Kershaw, Kevin Welch, Bob DiPiero and Victoria Shaw. When she returns to Halifax, she will be a special guest on the Nov. 19 concert with Farmer's Daughter at the Rebecca Cohn Auditorium.

**Jo Dee Messina** has joined the William Morris Agency. The Curb recording artist, reportedly "discharged" CAA and retained the Morris Agency for exclusive representation. Managed by Narvel Blackstock and Jake LaGrone of Starstruck Entertainment, Messina has two singles on the chart, *You're Not In Kansas Anymore*, now descending the chart (#70) after 18 weeks, and last week's entry of *Do You Wanna Make Something Of It* (#85). Both tracks are included on her self-titled Curb/EMI album.



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
