Back in the late seventies, Francis Ford Coppola proved that art did not have to have a temporal reference to commercial work. Granted, he took some five years to crank out Apocalypse Now,

pushing the idea that the artist could take as long as he needed to get his work done; to hell with everyone else. Lorraine Segato, the sometime singer and public face for Toronto's The Parachute Club, seems to have embraced that approach, even if her

reasons were more pragmatic than artistic. She has just released Luminous City, technically her second solo effort following The Parachute Club, even if it remains her first release in eight years. The album, which consummates the artist's new deal with True

Adventures of Shirley Holmes; Jay Bucharel from My Hometown, which is also broadcast on YTV; and Nick Scoullar from YTV's in-house production The Anti-Gravity Room; and 98 Degrees.

Other Canadian presenters firmed at press time include astronaut Dr. Dafydd Rhys Williams, figure skating champion Barbara Underhill and YTV personalities Asshna, Exan, Phil, Carrie and Katie.

## EMI releases Tea Party Limited Edition to benefit White Ribbon Campaign

EMI Music Canada's Tea Party has released a limited edition, four-track sampler containing a Tom Lord-Alge and CHR radio mix of Release, their current single, a Rhys Fulber remix of Temptation, and an Alhambra tour mix of Save Me. None of these mixes are available on any other recording. All four tracks were taken from the band's Transmission album.

All profits from the sale of the CD are to be donated to the White Ribbon Campaign, a registered charity which is the largest effort in the world of men working to end violence against women.

"The song (Release) is meant to be an apology to the female spirit," says the band's lead singer and songwriter Jeff Martin, which prompted the band to release the sampler. The song opens with "I want the world to wake. I want to give you peace. I want to vindicate. You need to be released."

"The Tea Party are encouraging young men to think about their responsibility to help end violence against women," says Richard Barry, executive director of the White Ribbon Campaign. "This is precisely what the White Ribbon Campaign is about and we are thrilled to be able to help with this effort."

The sampler is available exclusively at the Music World chain.

## Ottawa's Blues Festival firmed for month of July

The Ottawa Citizen Blues Festival, Canada's largest blues festival and North America's third largest will be mounted at Confederation Park (July 1-5).

The Ottawa event, which won the 1997 International and Events Association Gold medal, will feature more than 100 artists throughout its five days.

The festival will once again return to Confederation Park in the heart of Ottawa, which is celebrating its fifth anniversary. Last year, organizers had reluctantly moved from Major's Hill Park, which the National Capitol Commission had declared "overused," and that it was suffering from "event stress." They were concerned mostly with the limited parking facilities. As it turned out, a bill of blues legends; James Cotton, Junior Wells, Roomful of Blues, Dr. John, Little Feat as well as the late Luther Allison, drew overflow crowds.



North Records, actually took some four years to put entirely together.

The album charts a sunny course through a festival of music realized by an extensive list of studio musicians -- including Kurt Swinghammer, Molly Johnson and Kevin Breit -- and a creative drive to explore new possibilities. The result is not only among the best work Segato has ever produced, but is also indicative of a new mindset with which she is approaching the art of writing music.

"I'm currently in the experience of putting forth a new face," she says, "and that involves

## Millennium classics from Universal

Coming down the pipe, Universal Music is overseeing re-mastered reissues of ten new releases from the Westminster label as part of the Millennium Classics Series. The bulk release will follow Universal's initial 41 titles on the Millennium Classic Series, released in January of last year. The new batch is in stores as of March 24 with a suggested retail price of \$6.98.

Founded in 1949, Westminster initiated an ambitious programme of recordings, based mostly in Vienna but also employing notable conductors, orchestras and performers from the US and Great Britain. Using the best technology of the time, the

## Music industry Joint Venture sets a benchmark in sales

The Joint Venture, formed in 1996 by EMI Music Canada, Universal Music and Warner Music Canada to release compilation albums, has achieved what is described as "unprecedented sales milestones" on its two branded compilation series: NOW! and MuchMusic's Big Shiny Tunes.

The two brands have chalked up combined sales of more than two million spread over four releases which consist of two volumes each series.

Each brand's second release in the series has resulted in sales increases up to 300 per cent. NOW! 2, the second volume of the Joint Venture's pop hits compilation, dominated national album sales

of the album graphic.

"Those are all elements of passion for me," explains the singer. "A lot of the times you feel desire about things but you're too afraid to be honest about what you're really feeling desire about, so you never get to the stage of lust. If there is any connection between those words and what's happening on the record, it was a reclaiming of being truthful for myself, so I could feel desire and lust in the world. Because I think when you allow yourself to feel desire and lust, you're replacing the space that fear would take up."

If one thing is absent from the record, it's a sense of being afraid about the possibilities of the future. Lorraine Segato and true North will be working the album into the year on the strength of the first single titled ??

label became established as the synonym for the term high fidelity. Once the compact disc became the popular medium, recordings not only by Westminster, but by all the MCA-owned classical labels were mostly in storage in tape vaults.

Two decades later in 1996, MCA employed highly sophisticated technology to make the transfer to the digital medium for remastering; a subject of some concern simply by reason of some of the tapes' considerable age -- some going back over 40 years. The Millennium Classics represents the first time release on compact disk of all the issues in the collection.

Big Shiny Tunes 2, which carries a MuchMusic logo and has that extra cooperative marketing effort from the national music video channel, was released in December of last year and made its debut at #1 on the RPM Top 100 CDs (Jan. 26/98) and became the first compilation album to register diamond status, representing net sales of more than one million units.

NOW! 3 is scheduled for an early May release while MuchMusic's Big Shiny Tunes 3 is expected to be released over the next few weeks.

(EC: *And it doesn't promote . . . it demotes!!!*) Give me that in Latin . . . in case someone in our industry IS that intellect-u-all! (EC: *Gosh Batman . . . we better fly!!*) BUT! JS has left the building! (EC: *Then that's the answer to everything!!!*) Yeah!

**Lest we forget . . . the debacles:** Record Club sponsorship//The book that was a remainder the day it came out//(EC: *I get the feeling . . .*)//The feeling that artists can be cheated and lied to. I could be wrong, but Air farce seems like a small budget half hour compared to the Juno extravaganza. What will it take to bring the Junos back to its past glory! (EC: *Don't suggest using foreign headliners!!!*) I knew someone would suggest that!

**If it ain't fixed!!!** Do you know that 10% of the jewel boxes received at RPM each week are broken if they aren't delivered by hand? There must be a better way to merchandise CDs. (EC: *How about an eggshell container???*) I've heard of breaking hits . . . but . . . !

**Rub a dub dub!!!** That guy in the tub . . . went on to be the Sunshine Boy last week. It must have been a big day for the circulation department. The Sun was sold out everywhere. It seems SL has a reputation that covers not only the GTA, Durham and the golden horseshoe, but the popular clubs above Major Mac where they're referring to him as the "Messiah". (EC: *Messiah of what???*)

**It's over!!!** The broom hasn't swept clean, but there's at least light at the end of the tunnel. If SK or JS or SK take over, and it's expected one of them will, we should see some positive changes. (EC: *Better PR maybe???*)

**Peter Budge has landed!!!** Nice to see Peter Budge back doing what he does best, and probably better than most and that's promotion. He's tied in with Jim West of the Montreal-based Justin Time Records, and is sales manager for Distribution Fusion. (EC: *That's it???*)

**Stern's not impressed!!!** My suggestion last week that Howard Stern should dig up some old tapes of Joey Reynolds when he ruled the American airwaves, apparently didn't sit too well with Stern. He doesn't copy anyone, which wasn't the reason I suggested he listen to Reynolds stuff, not that they would be available. It would be interesting to hear what Reynolds did back then and why he was fired from so many stations. Anyway, and for all his efforts, Reynolds has just been inducted into the Rock 'N Roll Hall of Fame, the place down in Cleveland. We haven't got ours going yet. (EC: *But we will, and very soon, and it will be in Toronto. You can bet on that!!!*)

**Disgraced singer dead???** That's the headline for the obituary on the death of Rob Pilatus the one half of Milli Vanilli, the band that had to give back their Juno and Grammy awards because they lip-synched the words to their album. So now I can say that we will no longer use photos taken by little disposable cameras or instant cameras that require extra work and cost at the printer. The industry now boasts an array of very professional and knowledgeable photogs and we have a paparazzi image that is helping us build a star system and a celebrity pool. Both are necessary for the making of recording stars with hits (EC: *. . . AND SALES!!!*) That's what it's all about!

**Sam is in good company!!!** Look at that picture of Sam Sniderman and Van Halen on page 3. It's not often the retailing icon gets to hang out with a bunch of guys his own age. (EC: *Look who's talking!!!*) Seriously though, those Van Halen boys have been around forever. (EC: *There's still life in them . . . they have a hardcore fan base!!!*)

*Hamilton trio return with third album***Language lesson for Warner's Killjoys**

For a three member outfit with humble origins and humble goals, Hamilton's The Killjoys have gotten some substantial mileage out of making music. Starry, their debut of two years back, ended up living up to the connotations in the title, having gone on to sell gold in the country. Gimme Five, their sophomore effort of '96 gave the guys some added firepower via Warner Music, who pushed the release as a domestic priority for the year and secured them a Juno for Best New Group. And while pop rock and the three chord salsa obviously remained close to their hearts, Killjoys proved with that album that radio success was also etched into their fortune.

Wherewith we pick up the story this year, with the trio's third release titled -- somewhat cryptically -- Melos Modos. And while the album offers a different approach to music making and a broadening of their musical palette, the title refers to the one thing that *has* remained constant throughout the group's as yet budding career: melody. Singer/songwriter Mike Trebilcock explains it in the following way:

"We're changing a little bit still within the confines of the sound of the band," he says, "melody is definitely a big thing. But we're not afraid of trying different things, different styles, different instruments. Whatever's lying around, we'll pick it up and play it on the record."

Naturally, a host of different instruments -- and

different people -- ended up contributing to the album. The latter included a couple of interested parties, a couple of guys who just happened to be around and even the guy who owned the studio they were recording at. One of the reasons that Melos Modos stakes its plot of land right from the pop strains of the first single I've Been Good, a sloppy mishmash of rock and pop that still goes for the throat on melody.

"There was nothing formal about this album," reveals Trebilcock. "Except maybe for the horn section, but that's just because it's the way horns come."

A resident of what he calls "the greyest town in Ontario," Trebilcock and fellow musicians Gene Champagne and Shelley Woods nevertheless continue to gain inspiration from their home city. It's become a bit of an in joke, seeing that Hamilton does not quite grow optimism in the backyard.

"It is the greyest town and it definitely has a grey atmosphere to it," he insists. "Still, it's great out there, I don't know what it is. It has a lot of interesting characters down town; it's a place where schizophrenics can blend in quite well."

Schizos and writers tend to blend well in the city, according to Trebilcock. He says he would rather eschew the kinds of issue driven lyrics for the more accessible (and infinitely more honest), day to day stuff. But he also reserves the right to be slightly schizophrenic by putting other people's


words in his mouth.

"The songs are almost exclusively autobiographical," he admits, "but sometimes I write from the point of view of someone I know so it's not all about me, contrary to what a lot of people



believe. They're usually about relationships, whether it's casual or something else. And it's not just boy/girl relationships, meeting someone that just bugs you can be a relationship as well. But relationships are more often than not just weird interactions."

**IRON MAIDEN**

If heavy metal had a relatively short run at the mass market in North America, something has to be said for its staying power. Take Iron Maiden, of the first bands who brought us the heavy metal of leather jackets and long hair, machine gun riffs and pumping choruses, twin leads and demonic artwork. Iron Maiden hardly demonstrated the potential for metal so much as they embodied it during their crucial career period of releases like Number of the Beast, Piece Of Mind and Powerslave. The peak hit ten years ago and at that time presented them with the crossroads of change versus keeping up the fight. Maiden, unlike any other metal band of its period, chose to go both ways, maintaining the signature leads and long narratives while meddling with keyboards and gradually tweaking their sound via continual line-up changes. Their current incarnation with singer Blaze Bayley demonstrates the best and worst aspects of that decision; some dependable material is still found on tracks like Futureal and Lightning Strikes Twice, but opuses like The Angel and the Gambler and Don't Look Into the Eyes of a Stranger are reminiscent -- but ultimately mock -- the textured, riff-laden network of classics like Phantom of the Opera. Worse still is that Bayley has got to have one of the most uninspired vocals to hit the metal mainstream and Steve Harris and Dave Murray are entertaining material that can hardly be considered neighbour to the Beast. Overall the album, which conceptually wraps itself around the synthetic world of VR, is quieter, older and weaker than the stuff that made these guys what they are. But we suppose that's not entirely surprising.

certainly has the right paperwork to enjoy top billing. In plain English that means that Solo Latino 2 is not your typical run of the mill homogenized Latin music for mass consumption in tin cans. There's substance here, even if a slight contemporary sound is the sound of the day. Topping the bill are names like Ricky Martin, Gloria Estefan, Luis Enrique, Lisa M. and Merenbooty Girls, as well as the ubiquitous Gypsy Kings, remixed with the requisite extra beats and simulated flavour for the dance floor. Targeted TV campaign on MuchMusic and MusiquePlus, regional radio and TV ads, target marketing for the Latin community, regional promos, in-store posters and a CD sampler for clubs and radio will make this highly visible as we head into the summer. That's proof that Sony is serious about getting some strong responses from the public. Definitely a move in the right direction from the original release in the series and something that should stack the numbers nicely over the next while.

Here's a band that has got one aspect of playing down pat; the songwriting. Funhouse, the not-too-far-from-the-truth name this quintet have chosen for themselves, goes a ways to




at least insinuating the kind of flavourful "madness" we get on their debut. It's a restrained bit of madness however, more along the Dr. Tarr and Professor Fether route if you know what we mean. At times courageously lengthy (Warrior Mohawk) and almost always schizophrenic in logic, Funhouse nevertheless do not lose themselves within their elaborate riff and roll labyrinths or the leaps of versatility from one song to the next. Soul Sucker is an acoustic ballad that purrs before kicking into full-band sound; What About You is perfect concert hall material and Heavens Gate is elaborate and interesting. There's a faint whiff of music from two decades back here, though not of the three chord variety. With the wholesale return of those kind of pop musical sensibilities, a band like this could be the pick of the crop. 





In Warner Music Canada's roster there are only three albums that sold double diamond in the country. Alanis Morissette's Jagged Little Pill, Zeppelin IV and Fleetwood Mac's Rumours. The latter two took considerably more time than Ms Morissette to reach the desired mark, but that just simply attests to the enduring appeal of the music in question -- both at retail and radio. Sure, for many, Fleetwood Mac is yesterday's mashed potatoes, but we've yet to meet someone who didn't at some point in their lives groove to Don't Stop, Dreams, Go Your Own Way or Gold Dust Woman. C'mon... fess up. Naturally, the modern music makers have come to pay their dues on this classic disk, by doing a contemporary run through the entire thing, beginning to end. There are a lot of surfer winners here, including Cranberries' flawless rendition of Go Your Own Way, Tonic on Second Hand News and The Corrs doing Dreams. Elton John is dependable if slightly askew on Don't Stop and we severely missed the inclusion of Hole's version of Gold Dust Woman (Sister Hazel gets a go of it here), but overall the package is remarkably buoyant via a vis radio and retail. Also includes Shawn Colvin on The Chain, Duncan Sheik on Songbird, Jewel on You Make Loving Fun, Goo Goo Dolls on I Don't Want To Know, Matchbox 20 on Never Going Back Again and Tallulah on Oh Daddy. 


Can anyone tell us if Arthur Lyman is related - a son or grandson perhaps - to Abe Lyman? Abe is probably remembered mostly as the music director of an old golden age radio programme called Waltz Time. But, he knew how to swing and did so with his Californians especially on the hard driving Los Chopianastas. (If our spelling is erratic, blame it on faulty memory): Arthur Lyman is best known for his South Pacific exotica including the best selling Taboo, but he too could swing, a fact largely forgotten now. Leis was first recorded in 1959 and has now been digitally



restored. The Fi is of the highest but even if it weren't, this would still be a delight as Lyman rides again with a style that could equally well be described as exotic jazz or jazzy exotica. He leads on vibes and marimba assisted by Alan Soares (piano and celeste), John Cramer (bass and percussion) and Harold Chang on other percussion. The selections are all pop standards and, mirabile dictu, present the melodies as written while eschewing the mere subliminal. There are 12 tracks and all are enjoyable. We suspect however, that the most popular will once again be Aloha Oe played with a percussive attack quite unexpected of a song adapted from the old missionary hymn, The Cross By The Sea. **-BW**



Maybe he would never have come this far with the help of others. We'll never know. But regardless of the way he did it, he did do it. But he did even more. He left his brand on his friends and fans which is possibly his greatest achievement. Much can be learned by reading his story. The highs and the lows of the country music business. Dickie, if you read this, please know you have the love and respect of many and you always will have. Thanks Dick. Thanks for the friendship and the music. God bless and keep you well.

Toronto's Jane Mallet Theatre, St. Lawrence Centre for the Arts, will be the setting May 2 for Arraymusic to spotlight seven of its accomplished alumni of its Young Composers' Workshop. These artists who span the existence of the workshop, will present a range of musical creation the workshop has been able to support and nurture.

Taking the stage will be Ronald Bruce Smith, who is currently living in the U.S. where he is a professor of music. His miniature *Catch Three* was composed for Arraymusic in 1997 and is premiered on this program;

Estelle Lemire has become one of this country's experts on ondes Martenot and has just released a solo CD featuring this exotic instrument. The program features her *Nocturne pour Arraymusic*, a work commissioned in 1993;

Luc Marcel, a Montreal composer whose work has been heard in Toronto in recent years accompanying the work of choreographer Bill James, composed his program entry, *On The Spot*, during the workshop;

James Rolfe was commissioned by his teacher, Toronto Arts Award recipient John Beckwith, to compose *Devilled Swan*, his entry for the program, the second Toronto appearance for his work. Rolfe's new opera, *Beatrice Chancy*, is scheduled for a Toronto production this June.

Toronto stage date, just days before Arraymusic launches the 12th edition of its workshop. The Arraymusic Young Composers' Workshop, Canada's longest-running and most successful workshop of its kind, was launched in 1986 by composer Linda C. 


