WEA's Kulin predicting an "excellent year"

Retail is in a slump, whether it's "traditional" or not. If the customers aren't coming into the stores - that hurts, frustrates, and creates a mild panic that inevitably finds its way back to the manufacturer's level. It was therefore, encouraging to talk to Stan Kulin, President, WEA Music of Canada, one of the major players in the industry, and one who is convinced that there is, indeed, a light at the end of the tunnel, which could be interpreted as a "good sign" for the industry - generally. Following is a free-form conversation with Kulin - his predictions and his observations.

While it appears that 1986 started off slow, in that retail continues to be fairly soft, I believe the product that has been just released and is about to be released will certainly improve things dramatically over the balance of the year and I'm personally looking forward to a 1986 that will even top the year that WEA had in 1985.

I was more than encouraged by the product presentation that was made to the WEA Managing Directors in New York City last week, from our 4 labels: Atlantic, Warner Bros, Geffen, and Elektra. We've just released Peter Gabriel, which has turned out to be the hottest album at retail over the last couple of weeks. This was followed by Genesis, which we feel is their definitive album, and Canada is the country where Genesis broke first. I have no doubt that this album will be their biggest ever.

I'm predicting that Madonna's new record will be a diamond album - at least in Canada. Her single, Live To Tell, from that album has been No. 1 on all charts over the last 3 or 4 weeks and was the last No. 1 single on the final CHUM chart.

CD manufacturing now GO in Canada

The grand opening of Canada's first Compact Disc manufacturing complex has been scheduled for June 26/86. Michael G. Sifton, President of Praxis Technologies, has announced "an official launching ceremony" which will take place directly on the premises of Praxis, located in Mississauga, Ont., just west of Toronto's International Airport.

After the ribbon-cutting ceremonies, the first ever Canadian-made CD will be introduced and demonstrated on the spot. There will also be continuous tours of this state-of-the-art facility.

"Our doors are open, and we wish to stress accessibility," says Al Elias, Senior Vice President, Sales & Marketing, "because we're fielding questions left and right on the phone about our venture. We'd like to appease that appetite." He concludes with "After all, it's only a matter of time before a Compact Disc will be as familiar in our homes as the vinyl LP is."

Paul Simon came into the meeting to play his new album for us, which will be released in August. It is one of the most exciting musical experiences I have had in many a year.

An Idle Eyes record will be released in August and the exciting news here is that Atlantic will be releasing this record in the U.S. Another Cancon release will be from Brighton Rock, a Toronto band, scheduled to have their album released the latter part of July. There was great interest in this band when I played their record, and I'm confident we're going to have a simultaneous U.S. release from one of the labels. Actually, the domestic front continues to look very strong. One To One is doing well. Honeymoon Suite's album is double platinum, and they're only on their second single from that album.

Our activity with Cancon will continue, and with some of the product being released right now, I think this will give us some good activity in that area. There will be a few other Cancon signings between now and the fall.

There's just so much great product on the way - really too much to mention here. A new Chicago, a solo LP from Peter Cetera,

Spoons pact deal with Anthem/SRO

Armed with their new label/management agreement with Anthem/SRO, The Spoons are going into studios with producer Tom Treumuth to complete their next album. They also have new band members, keyboardist Scott Macdonald, and drummer Steve Kennedy.

The album is expected to be released late summer or early fall.

Cdn gold to Jenny Rush for self-titled debut

Having already sold over 5 million records worldwide since her signing to CBS Records Germany, it came as no surprise to Jennifer Rush that her album had achieved gold status in Canada.

The North American debut for Rush is actually a compilation of 2 previous European releases. "I figured if I was going to get my shot here," she explains, "I wanted my best material."

Most of the tracks, including Destiny, the new single, were released as singles in Europe where "they were hits too," adds Rush.

Born into a classical music family who travelled frequently, Rush says she never considered going the classical route. "People seem to think that somehow I was raised, closed up in my room, studying all these instruments, but I only studied violin and piano."

The native New Yorker believes the move to Germany, after failing to secure a U.S. deal, "was strange, but it worked. It's the way to do it. I mean, music is very international," she continues. "People say, 'well, what's the European sound?' and sure, they make their own music, but if you look at the charts in Europe, it's the same that's all over the U.S."

Rush goes back into the studio in

My only concern, if I have one, is that we have so much good product coming, we're going to be fighting ourselves for chart space. Right now, we are making moves to strengthen our already leading position in the field. There's going to be some surprising and exciting news coming from WEA in that connection in the very near future.

I have to admit that I'm concerned about what's happening to the singles business. I don't see them as strong as in years past. I'm also concerned about what appears to be the very heavy return for this configuration - as a general statement. Other than that, I think we've turned the corner, and the last 6 months will be excellent for the industry.

Lyttelton appointed to Capitol Canada post

Richard C. Lyttelton has been appointed Managing Director of Capitol Records-EMI of Canada. His appointment is effective from June 17, 1986. Mr. Lyttelton will be responsible for all staffs and operating units during the absence on sick leave of David Evans. He will report to Edward C. Khoury, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer.

Mr. Lyttelton has been Managing Director of EMI Records-South Africa since January 1984. He initially joined EMI Records-U.K. in 1966 and after periods in business on his own and with EMI Leisure Enterprises in the U.K., rejoined EMI Music in 1976.

His previous assignments have included that of Managing Director-Finland, Director International for EMI Records-U.K., and his South African post.

August, but this time in Los Angeles, "with 2 very well known producers," she says. Another release is expected before Christmas.

When asked for a comment on her successes, Rush attributes the cross-over factor as the single most important reason, maintaining however, "I don't think about those things when recording, and maybe that's why I've been so lucky . . . No I can't do that," she concludes. "If I write or sing songs, I can't think about how much money I'm going to make doing it because then it's not natural."

The "suds" promotion could end quickly

The impact of Molson's and Labatt's involvement in concert promotion will be shortlived says Rob Bennett, President of RBI Productions. He believes that when new legislation is introduced restricting "celebrity-association advertising" the breweries will drop their concert sponsorship programs.

With respect to the recent announcement that Maple Leaf Gardens will allow other promoters to rent the facilities, Bennett says, "The decision will change things," continu-

ing with "It will take longer for other promoters to establish with agents that we really can work in there now, because CPI could deny it. I think that's why The Gary's wanted to get it in writing - I mean - the Gardens told me very definitely I could work there, except when I phoned to do my first show. They stumbled and didn't know what to do. Hence, they dawdled so long in getting me the

date, I put it somewhere else."

Bennett concludes with "We'll see what happens - it'll certainly make it more interesting, but we won't see anything change for 4 or 5 months."

Upcoming shows being presented by RBI include Katrina & The Waves, and The Art Of Noise. Last year Bennett booked Dire Straits to 4 shows at Varsity Arena, and he suggests they are returning, "but to a bigger venue."

Huey Lewis & News top certifications for May

MCA's Huey Lewis And The News topped CRIA's May certifications with 9 times platinum (900,000 units sold) for their Sports album

Quintuple platinum album certifications were for Whitney Houston's self-titled package, The Original Sountrack of The Sound Of Music, and John Denver's Greatest Hits.

The Pointer Sisters' Break Out album was certified as quadruple platinum, and Platinum Blonde's Standing In The Dark made it to double platinum.

Platinum albums were for Carroll Baker's Hymns Of Gold, and for Dirty Work by The Rolling Stones.

Gold album certifications were for George Strait's Greatest Hits, Fine Young Cannibals' self-titled album, Level 42's World Machine, the self-titled Feargal Sharkey, Orchestral Manoeuvres In The Dark's Crush LP, the self-titled Jennifer Rush, Rolling Stones' Dirty Work, and Turbo by Judas Priest.

There were no platinum singles certified for May, but there were 3 gold single certifications. They were for Feargal Sharkey's A Good Heart, The Power Of Love by Jennifer Rush, and Harlem Shuffle by The Rolling Stones.

Attic releases Variety's Voices With Heart single

Delayed by a month, Barry Manilow's I Am Your Child was released this past week on the Attic label. A gala launch has been slated for Massey Hall in Toronto (June 25).

Voices With Heart, a "compendium" of over 100 international artists, and their subsequent single was more than 8 months in the making, utilizing the donated services of over 130 corporate sponsors.

Labatt's Blue Live, in conjunction with Skarratt Promotions, are donating the use of Massey Hall for the launch.

The record is supported nationally by an 8½-min. film and video treatment which major theatre chains have committed to use as a trailer for feature presentations.

According to Attic Records, additional exposure of the film will occur through network TV, IMAX theatre presentations, and in-flight screenings on Canadian airlines.

As well, commitments to utilize the video have been made by MuchMusic and other music video broadcast and narrowcast outlets.

Profits generated by Attic will be donated to the Variety Club, and as Attic's president Alexander Mair explains "We're 100 percent committed to this project, and with the additional commitment of the music community, film community, and retail, we are confident that the project will be a success."

Wonderful World may be last hit from Sam Cooke

RCA is hoping to have the same success in North America as they did in Europe with Sam Cooke product. They are reissuing and servicing the classic Wonderful World by the late pop/R&B legend, a song originally released over 25 years ago.

The company is supporting the single as if it were a release by a current artist. The single will get the added support of a video which includes newsreel footage from the era described as "political in nature."

This single follows 2 key album releases, a greatest hits package titled A Man And His Music, and a new album, featuring previous-

ly unreleased material, titled Live At Harlem Square.

Wonderful World recently reached No. 2 in the U.K., No. 1 in Holland and No. 5 in Germany. The single was given an added boost in Europe with the release of a Levi jean commercial, tied into radio and TV.

More than 300,000 copies of the single have been sold in the U.K., much of this reportedly due the popularity of the commercial.

At this point, in Canada, the single is radio only. The flip is the R&B classic Chain Gang.

Do you believe it . . . ??

Ahed Corp., which has traded on the TSE at 17 cents in the last month, jumped to \$4.10 as we go to press (June 12). In the past, Ahed has been best known for their Arc Record releases. They recently announced a proposed reorganization, under which it will sell treasury shares to an investor group that, as a result, will hold a controlling interest in the company. The proposal also involves the sale of Ahed's music-related assets to its president and current controlling shareholder, as well as the injection of more than \$1 million in new capitol by private placements to the investor group.

At one place last year, the owner of the general store asked Stan to look after the store while he ran off to the

bank. His trip is twofold however. Says Stan, "When I get back I'll have a complete report as to what the dealers think of Kim Cooke's blue sheets."

It could be terminal!!

At one of those 6-martini lunches, the "health" of a certain record company was being discussed. One of the really knowledgeable types in the biz mentioned that when the going gets tough . . . these people usually lead with "how well" they are doing. Seems they really don't have a great deal going for them, and their image is mostly talk. A transfusion won't help, and we're told, they have to show a profit . . . or else! (EC: Or else what . . . ?)

It WILL be a hot summer!!

Yes . . . contrary to what you've been hearing, the summer is going to be HOT . . . for sales, and it's encouraging to see some retailers gearing up for it. As a matter of fact, I see more enthusiasm from the part-time floor staff than the dismal-looking full-timers, when it comes to checking out what's new and hot. On a couple of occasions I saw a few record salesmen in action . . . and I wasn't too impressed. If the guy who's selling the records to the retailers isn't excited, then how can the retailer feel confident. Personally, I think every salesperson should be a promo person . . . remember like it used to be with people like Joe Woodhouse, Johnny Murphy, Jimmy Gordon, Joe Fox, Charlie Camilleri, Eddie Colero, Joe Pariselli, Bud Farquharson, Taylor Campbell, Kenny McGregor, Barry Stafford, and Bill Kearns, and there's more, but I can't think of them. What a team . . . and could they sell records.

What's HOT you might ask??

There's some unbelievable product coming down the pipe . . . so hold onto your hat. Albums that should "bring 'em into the stores" include that hot, very hot Genesis

Corey Hart tops poll in Pepsi sweepstakes

In the recent Pepsi Music Poll Sweepstakes, the big news is that Corey Hart is currently Canada's Favourite Male Artist, with 24 percent of the vote. He is followed by Phil Collins (21 percent), and Bryan Adams (19 percent).

Canada's Favourite Female Artist is Madonna with 39 percent of the vote. She is followed by Tina Turner (23 percent), and Anne Murray (12 percent).

Dire Straits is the Favourite Group with 24 percent. They beat out the Beatles (21 percent), and ZZ Top (19 percent).

Whitney Houston was voted Favourite New Artist with 30 percent of the vote, over Mr. Mister (22 percent), and Tears For Fears (17 percent).

Other favourites were Kenny Rogers in the country category with 45 percent, beating out Alabama (19 percent), and Willie Nelson (15 percent). Born In The U.S.A. was the Favourite Album with 55 percent of the vote, followed by Dark Side Of The Moon (14 percent), and Thriller (12 percent).

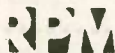
Studies are a delaying tactic!!

The Sector Analysis, The Record Industry In Ontario, which was done by Peter Klopchic Ph.D. Chief Economist Industry Research Bureau, was published in 1976. It is still the finest work on the subject, and every study either copies or repeats what was said then. The problem hasn't changed that much. Anyone who has a copy, guards it with their life. (EC: But we now have a new industry, based on just doing further studies!) Why not!!

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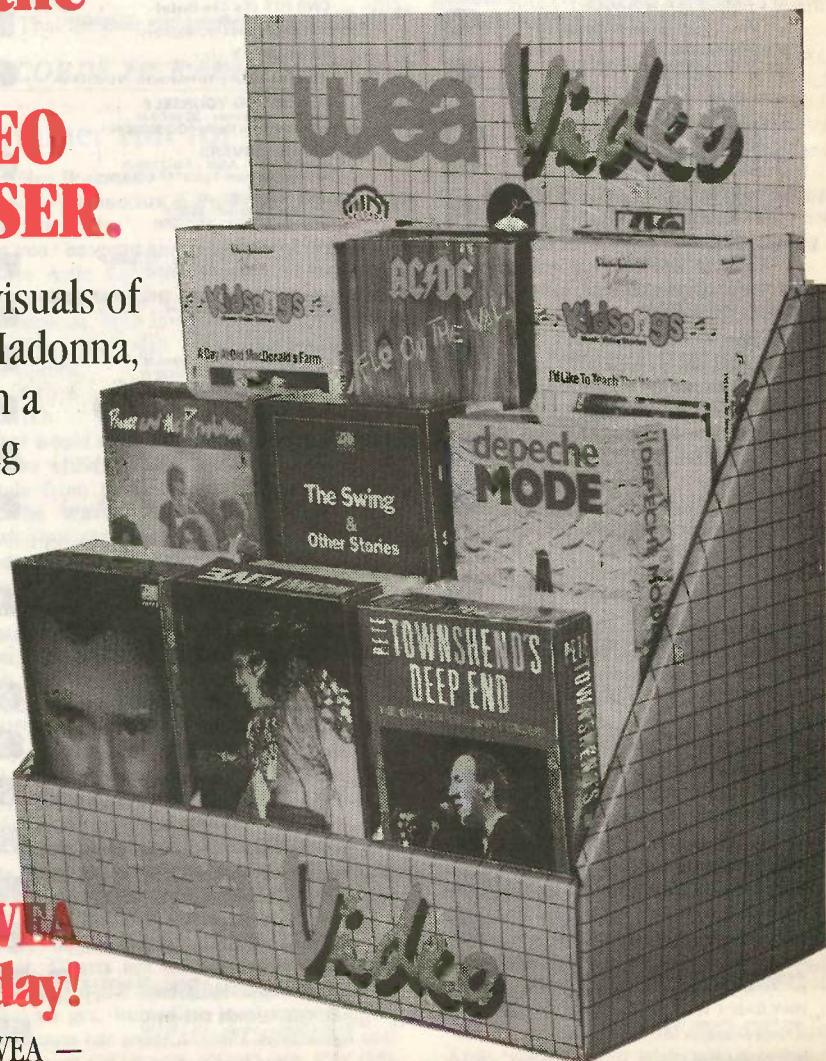

Luba's new LP takes off in wake of Secrets

It has been 2 years since the release of Luba's debut album, *Secrets & Sins*, and now the band are on release with their follow up, entitled *Between The Earth And The Sky*.

Comprising Luba are: Peter Marunzak (drums), Michael Bell (bass), Mark Lyman (guitars), Michel Corriveau (keyboards) and, of course, the band's namesake Luba, who provides vocals.

Secrets & Sins was recorded at Hamilton's Grant Avenue Studios with Daniel Lanois producing. *Between The Earth And The Sky* was recorded at Morin Heights' Le Studio and Pierre Bazinet handled the production chores, with the exception of the first single.

How Many (rivers to cross) was produced by Narada Michael Walden, known for his work with Aretha Franklin and Whitney Houston, "and was originally completed as a demo," says Luba. "We did it about 20...no 20,000 times, with quite a few different producers but it never seemed to work out."

It was while the band were working on the 9½ Weeks soundtrack that Luba met Walden, "and he expressed an interest in doing the song," Luba explains. Walden also produced Luba's *The Best Is Yet To Come* for the film. As well, the soundtrack includes her hit *Let It Go*.

Chosen among 2,035 applications, from 58 countries, to represent Canada at last year's Tokyo World Song Festival, How Many reached the finals. However, Luba comments "I suppose it was too hard for them..."

Luba says the decision to change producers was hers. "Yes, it was something I wanted to do," she maintains, "I didn't want to stick with just one individual for every album because I find you just get stuck in a rut."

When asked whether she had an idea of what the album would sound like before entering the studio, Luba replies: "We never have any idea... Whatever happens, happens. There was no preparation."

"Actually, when we went in we really didn't have any idea what the album was go-

ing to sound like," Luba continues. "I did have a couple of songs written but the majority were written at Morin Heights. Pierre did have a lot to do with the direction though."

"When you have a successful album, it is difficult to come up with something that hopefully is better," she laughs. "So, he did a lot for me, in a sense of getting my vocals...I don't know...just making me feel good about what I was doing."

Luba's *Let It Go* was one of the first charting Cancon singles when RPM switched from a Top 50 to a Top 100 format (Aug '84) and after 7 weeks had reached the No. 56 position, before finally peaking at No. 32 after 17 weeks.

How Many, after 7 weeks, is already at No. 21, certainly a strong indication of the respect radio and retail have for Luba, the singer, the band and their talent.

Last year *Secrets & Sins* garnered Luba a CASBY, for Most Promising Female Vocalist, and 3 Juno nominations: Composer Of The Year, Single Of The Year (*Let It Go*) and Female Vocalist Of The Year - winning the latter.

That list does not complete the accolades

From the Jamaican Isles: Canada, let me introduce you to Freddie McGregor. As an introduction card, you will soon be hearing the single, *Somewhere*, taken from the LP, *All In The Same Boat*. Freddie has been in the music business for 20 years, beginning his career at the age of 7 as "Little" Freddie when Bob Marley would pull him out of the audience to sing on a soapbox. Freddie has incorporated his early association with reggae with pop and R&B for a refreshing upbeat summer sound. CHUM's flagship takes 360 degree format change

Toronto's CHUM-AM listeners were caught off guard, when at 3 pm, Friday June 6, the popular AM flagship of the CHUM Group, introduced its new format. The station is now flying the banner - 1050 CHUM-AM - Favourites of Yesterday and Today.

The change came about after several months of losing listeners to CFTR, CFNY-FM, Q107, and even sister station CHUM-FM.

Genius was obviously at work with the station leaking the news to the press, resulting in major coverage and a curiosity factor from Toronto and area residents very rarely seen. The station launched its new sound with over 62 hours of commercial-free, personality-free radio for the weekend.

ficially bowed CHUM's new sound when he went to air at 5:30 am on Monday (9). The station is apparently the first in Canada to adapt this format, which was reportedly "researched and developed to meet the changing demands of the Toronto radio market."

RPM spoke with new Program Director Terry Williams, appointed only a few months ago. He was asked to cite the reasons he believed there was a decline in the station's listenership.

"Wrong approach," he said. "Our audience grew up, and we didn't. This is the format that our research told us was unserved. We're all extremely excited about the change."

It was apparently discovered that there was an unfulfilled demand for the Favourites of Yesterday and Today among adults in the 23 to 45 age bracket - the same people who had grown up listening to CHUM-AM rock.

Williams explained that although on an overview they're aiming at a target audience similar to the ages for other local stations, he stressed that what CHUM-AM is now offering is not quite the same. While a station such as CKEY, spins gold, he pointed out that CHUM-AM also plays hits from the '80s.

"The tastes of two 21-yr. olds, for instance, are not the same," he continues. "People were listening to various stations. What we're offering is what they wanted. The format will evolve as necessary to follow the target audience."

CARAS considers hiring U.S. publicist for Junos

U.S. interest in Canadian recording artists has certainly been stimulated following last year's chart successes of Bryan Adams, Corey Hart, Loverboy and Honeymoon Suite. With this interest, the question arises whether the cost of hiring a U.S. publicist for the Juno Awards would be warranted.

This interest has manifested itself recently with a rash of signings and distribution deals having been firmed. Gino Vannelli, Jim Foster and 54-40 are examples of artists signed directly to U.S. recording deals.

Distribution deals have been inked for Jane Siberry, Bruce Cockburn and recent chart sensation Glass Tiger, to name just a few. However, unlike previous deals, there is a commitment: an ad for Siberry, for instance, recently graced the back of a U.S. trade.

The total number of Juno Awards compiled by these artists over the past few years is quite impressive, and this year the nomination list is certain to include those acts who have had simultaneous Canadian/U.S. releases with subsequent chart action on both sides of the border.

"This year there will be a concerted effort to penetrate the U.S. market," says Peter Steinmetz, President of the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (CARAS), "and we're trying to open the various doors, and we'll do whatever is necessary to accomplish this."

Steinmetz explains that the idea of retaining a U.S. publicist "is one of cost," and suggests that "the committee looking at that,

At press time, Williams said the station hadn't yet received much negative reaction from the record industry level. However, they have received "a lot of feedback" from the public, which Williams describes as "70 percent positive," stressing that this same audience happens to be the age group CHUM is aiming for.

There has apparently been a 30 percent negative response, but Williams puts this down as coming from "predominantly teens."

Ironically, as trends changed, and with the rising popularity of FM radio and stereo, CHUM-FM became one of the top-rated stations in the Toronto area, resulting in CHUM AM & FM competing with each other. Williams was asked if their FM station was aware that by adjusting to a more commercial sound, it would take the listeners of their sister station.

"I don't think it was anticipated, nor was the damage AM was doing to itself," he said

He suggests however, that if CHUM-FM hadn't made the adjustment, they probably wouldn't be enjoying the success they are now experiencing. He insists that it was "undeniably" more the case of the AM station hurting itself.

"You've got to move with the times," he continues. "The 2 stations are now designed to compliment each other."

It's interesting to note that variations of the new CHUM-AM sound have reportedly met with what is described as "tremendous success" in other North American markets.

may see enough of a benefit to recommend we go ahead with it."

Steinmetz also mentions that the government's announced "foreign marketing fund," may be a way of financing "the publicity of the Junos," and if no portion of that financing is made available then Steinmetz maintains that CARAS has "other ways of addressing it," suggesting that "Maybe on a short term retainer basis for the 2 or 3 months prior to the Junos or alternatively, other publicity expenditures to contact key publicity people in the U.S."

He concludes with "It's a great idea and certainly worth looking at, but we'll test the viability of it and see if we can turn it into a reality."

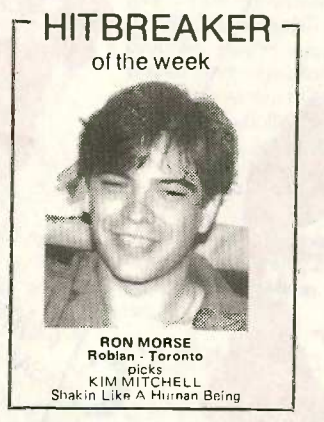

Great North American Phonodisc Co. recording artist Paul Weber sends news from the Netherlands of his successful tour of Holland and Germany. He will be back home for Canadian dates over the next couple of weeks. Meanwhile his latest GNA single, Whiskey Tears is beginning to take hold. This is a Weber original, produced by Dallas Harms and Mike Francis.

"Today's country is today's MOR" - Charles

Dave Charles, of Joint Communications, firmly believes that country music is now mainstream enough to be called "today's MOR."

The President of the radio consultant firm says country music is "very very big business" and points up that there are more formatted country stations in the U.S. than there are of any other format.

He attributes this growth phenomenon to a much higher visibility, especially on television, and the movie, Urban Cowboy. "Country music now is so accessible," says Charles, "it's reached the point of critical mass. Look at the number of commercials on TV that have a country theme - and the kinds of jingles being sung."

He continues with "Where country music was once thought of as a small format in music, it's now much more broader, because of the acceptance of prime-time TV shows like the Country Music Awards, and the country music video network."

The country music industry "is a very high growth area," he maintains, "and the reason is that a major segment of the baby boom population has 3 decades of rock and contemporary music behind them. But as you grow older," he concludes, "you look for music that has an easier feel to it - as it relates to your lifestyle - musically. Country music is a very mature, adult form of music."

Hefty summer fare from Ken Harris

Bramalea, Ont. school teacher, Ken Harris is not only getting support from his students, but from country and A/C programmers as well, who have discovered his obvious talents. Ken recently released Greek Sailor, an original penning, on his own Samantha label (Samantha is his baby daughter). The release is unique with a long version (4.20) on one side and a shorter version (3.40) on the

Moore's Comstock single enjoys success in Europe

Frank Fara, who heads up the Shawnee, Kansas-based Comstock label, was so impressed with the productions of Janet Moore, that he released one of her singles to the European market. The single, Let's Just Stop And Do Some Livin' has picked up what Fara describes as "excellent response" from radio stations all across Europe.

Fara has also prepared a special campaign for distribution of The Rugged Miner, recorded by Moore last year at the request of the Sudbury Mine Mill & Smelter Workers Union, in memory of the men who lost their lives on June 20, 1984 in a tragic rock blast. The proceeds and royalties of this single have allowed the establishment of a Janet Moore Health & Safety Seminar, which will be held in Sudbury June 18 & 19. Moore will also be in attendance at the second annual Workers' Memorial Day, which will follow the seminar on the 20th.

Yoakam / Earle to AOR? "no way" says Charles

There are some observers of the rock and country music field who believe that Dwight Yoakam and Steve Earle are rock-oriented enough to move into AOR. "I would never recommend those artists (Yoakam and Earle), because they've not had any roots," states Dave Charles, President of Joint Communications, a Toronto-based multi-format radio consultant firm.

He continues with "I think when you listen to Honky Tonk Man (Yoakam), it's pure country. In fact, it's more pure than anything I've heard in a while."

With regard to Earle, Charles suggests, "Earle has a different tempo, but a country feel all the way through, and I just don't think there's really any application for AOR."

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Country should look to A/C crossover - Solleveld

The Family Brown are a "prime example" of a group that could expand into the A/C market, says Ron Solleveld, when discussing the crossover potential of country musicians.

"The Family Brown could expand their own horizons by going the more contemporary route," says Solleveld, the Director of Music Publishing for Sunbury-Dunbar, "by attracting a different group of listeners, probably between the high 20's and low 40's, the target A/C demographic."

Solleveld agrees that the Canadian country scene is localized. "It's indicative of the whole scene because the only way they can 'earn their bread' is by playing the type of clubs which are only interested in the typical 'beerdrinking and unfortunate women' songs.

"They eventually get stuck in that mold, but that is the way they earn their living, and it's very difficult for them to take that step to get out of that situation, because that's an uncertainty."

Solleveld goes on to point out that "It's very difficult basically, production-wise and performance-wise to go into that more A/C type of situation. In order to cross-over to that A/C market, you have to spend more time on production. You have to have more elaborate arrangements, and you'll have to have more generally acceptable records.

"You can still have a country song," he concludes, "and it all depends on the vocalizing and the instrumentation, as to how much that song is going to be in the country mode. If you have a 'stone' country song, and change the arrangements around and make it more elaborate, at least you've made a serious step in the direction of A/C."

The attitude is positive!

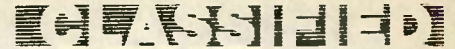
