THE OLD ROCK HAS GONE FOR GOOD

"R OCK and roll with a heavy beag is pretty much gone. I don't believe people are aware of the chance, What we do now is still catled rock 'n' roll bug it's much less rau-coes." So says Bobby Vee, currently bitting the rhares in the country with "Take Good Care Of My Ilaby" and in America with his latest disc. "Run To Hism."

According to Bobby, the earlier and wilder singers have left is for good—some with plenty of money, and others back to

"I heard of one guy who was working in a drugstore before he became a singer," he said.

"Ite had one hit dise, and that was all. He guit and went back to soda jerking."

But Bobby Vec is not altogether free from what he ealls the old rock 'n' roll.

"I used to be a pounding rock is roll singer," he admitted. It was 15. Then, we used only a guitar, bass drum, sax and broken piano. For my last recording session we used 14 violin players.

"Only three years between then and now, but I figure this gives a pretty good idea of the musical change."

NEW LOOK IS NEEDED

But tasses are changing and there are many people in the business who consider that the time is ripe for a new look at LPs.

An albom is an expensive item and the buyers are steadily like artists A and B, but not C demanding more and more value for their money. An album these days must be carefully planned and produced in order to attract custom.




