## 'Island of Dreams', The Springfields' biggest hit

# WONDERFUL, SAID TOM, BUT WHAT A SURPRISE!

OVER a breakfast of coffee, rolls and Danish pastries Tom Springfield, leader of our most successful vocal team, was raving about their sudden, and to him, unexpected hit "Island Of Dreams."

"Wonderful," he mused. "It's taken us by surprise. Who should have suddenly found its way into the charts? I've no idea."

It was the first record the group had recorded since replacement Mike Pickworth who took over when Tim Field left. Springfield said:

"Not," said Tom, "well at least I don't think so. Mike has a slightly different voice from Tim, but I didn't feel it was noticeable."

"Not, mind you, that we're

really worried about the reason, we're too pleased that it's been so well received. I wish I knew what he does that, but it would be nice to know why."

"Island Of Dreams" could easily be the million-seller because of the plugs. The Springfields were able to give it. Previously they've never been offered the chance of having been committed to long overseas tours.

"Mike," said Tom, "is a good replacement. He's a very good singer."

"We've found that if you do long seasons in the provinces you tend to lose touch with what's going

on. We've been trying to settle for a tom. Tom has taken an apartment in Chelmsford, and at the moment almost as important to him as his new car. A very active and energetic continental sports model."

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"The studio musicians, mind you, were great and they don't let me down. I'm not sure if I'll cut the album in just two days. But there was none of this inspiration 'hey, here's another idea' sort of thing. It had all been worked out before anyone set foot in the studio. A lot of rehearsals and that was that."

"The musicians they are we are very experienced. They are not at all interested doing nothing while we discussed fine points in the arrangements!"

# A bewildered Billie Davis wins 'Tell Him' race

BILLIE DAVIS was quite bewildered when I rang to congratulate her on making the charts with "Tell Him" before she thought the opposition was far too strong for her version to reach the hit parade.

"I never expected the American sounds on their pop discs, and I'm hoping we can get near the charts with "Tell Him," I said before I left. "I don't believe you stand any chance at all if you don't go after these sounds."

THE SPOTNICKS certainly deserved their victory. They've been having a rough time these last few days. Motoring to Bristol from Scotland, they stopped near Hawking, and for a while it looked as though they wouldn't believe it.

'Tell Him' race

When they finally arrived here last Saturday, their troubles weren't over, either. They had to make an unexpected stop at a service station to play a date, and then return to London immediately to tele-record "Thank You, Lucky Stars" for ABC-TV at Teddington.

"All of which means they

had their Oriole A and R man John Schroeder. So the success of "Hava Nagila" is like a tonic in the circumstances.

# Man, is this place wild!

GREETINGS again from dear Old Tahiti—and here am I having one whale of a time! This morning I got up early and walked miles along the lovely beach. This afternoon I was invited to Tahiti to see what that was pretty wild. I can tell you: Everyone is given a garland of flowers and wears a lei around their necks. They even wear like a crown called a LEI. The food (mostly meat) is cooked over a large fire. There is a large hole dug in the earth at six o'clock in the morning. Hot stones are put in the hole and top of the food and the hole is covered with earth and the whole lot is buried in the sun for several hours. Rather funny actually, some fellas were so hot they fell over and very quickly himself! Yesterday morning I took a boat to the island of Moorea, and returned to Moorea, and returned to Tahiti. The island is 12 miles away and it takes 12 hours to get there. Each



morning at 9 a.m., a small cargo boat leaves. Papeete for the island; it only holds about 30 passengers.

Over there is much prettier than Tahiti, also much quieter. The people are very friendly. Very few people, no telephone or radio; and the life is so relaxed, especially as they please, when they please.

## Swam all day

Most of the time, at least one person plays the guitar and sings the native pop songs.

I swam practically all day in and out of the coral. The most beautiful fish on this earth are over there. All colors and spots and stripes. Also the

water is absolutely crystal blue clear, just like a huge number full of sparkling diamonds.

I went spearfishing with three Tahitian boys.

The underwater world is absolutely exotic. The rest of the day is brilliant sunshine.

Tonight is Chinese New Year and there will be a similar party, dancing and everything. This is the rainy season and it has rained each afternoon, but not for long periods of time.

I am looking forward to my trip to Australia—I fly out on February 3—and I will be writing more later, interested in people and events there.

# Liverpool group takes Britain by storm

LAST week, Brian Matthew described The Beatles as "the most original musical and visual sensation since 'The Shadows'." And the off-beat writings of leader John Lennon credit them as "the four crazy, crazy things who live in Liverpool."

Whichever way you look at it, The Beatles

have favour maroon suits with waistcoats on top and a "lively" style of dancing. They're right now just about the hottest group in the British disc scene. They have smashed their way from obscurity to stardom in less than a year. Their first single, "Love Me, Do," made 24 in our Top Thirty at the end of last year, and the second, "Please, Please Me," shot straight to the top.

Merseyside coming with hundreds of groups like The Beatles, who have formulated a kind of Northern rock rhythm in blues with a twist of jazz and the americana. Most of them are way out—possibly a little staccato in their interpretation of "rhythm 'n' blues." But they all

**GEORGE HARRISON**—Lavishes claim to being one of the founder members of the group. Says he was found under a

gooseberry bush on February 23, 1943, and at 50, 11m. is still growing.

Plays lead guitar and still nurses the bruises he received as a schoolboy on his first meeting with John Lennon and Paul McCartney.

Plays one finger piano, plays egg on chin, plays the drums, party like a Liverpudlian and black, Alfred Hitchcock, record shops, driving and television.

**PAUL McCARTNEY**—Delivered by the state to his mother's womb on June 18, 1942. Paul McCartney took a full time course at the Liverpool Institute three times after leaving school, but he has spent most of his time trying to get out!

Plays bass, and is said to be behind all John Lennon's efforts as a composer. The pair have been lifelong friends, having shared many other scrapes, girlfriends and ambitions.

**Ringo Starr**—Hates the word "star" and thinks it means "the quacks," Chinese food, onions, tomatoes (which are in his face), and motor bikes.

Was forced to attend St. Silas and Dingle Vale Secondary Modern School in Liverpool, having been born there on July 7, 1940. Remembers Billy Fury as being in the same class.

Favours street names like Ray Charles and Diana Washington,

and plays drums. Says that all groups North of London are not savages.

**JUNE HARRIS**

He was working on one of the 16 tunes which will make the full-scale musical. "Three of the songs are written especially for me and the band. The rest will be fitted in generally," he explains.

# Fantastic fans keep police busy

DURING the past few days, hundreds of South African fans have been keeping vigil outside Cliff Richard's Johannesburg hotel.

At peak times, when the crowd waiting for a glimpse of Cliff and The Shadows swells to thousands, their vigil has become a legend. The police are not far from the hotel. Mr. Jim Stodel—promoting Cliff's current tour on behalf of African Consolidated Theatres—had the most interesting news by telephone on Monday of the fantastic scenes which have been repeated every time Cliff steps into the open.

## Full houses

"His shows have been playing to absolute capacity at the theater," said Stodel, "and the boys have had to be turned away. The boys are certainly very popular and the show has been sold out throughout the Union. Incidentally, it includes dancer Carole Gray—who co-starred with Cliff."

"But it has been a major task getting Cliff from the hotel to the shows—the fans have been very noisy and the police busy although, fortunately, everyone has been very good humored and nothing has been no-unpleasant incidents."

"When he's in the hotel Cliff makes frequent visits to the balcony, where he waves to the crowds—they wait hours and hours just to catch that glimpse of him; it really is fantastic."

## In the sun

"But they haven't been spending very much of their time indoors, as you can see looking like ghosts but all five have fabulous sun tan—we've made sure of that."

I asked Mr. Stodel to tell me more about their outdoor activities:

**"FANS.** They love Billy and Billy loves them, but believe me, there were times when we pulled out every trick in the book to avoid them. That's why I'd be surprised if there's a **Billy Fury fan** who doesn't want to wring my neck!"

Hal Carter, for four years road manager to Billy, reckons that his "star protection" policy has earned him the title of Public Enemy Number One by the **Billy Fury** fan club, "though it was only the crowds we tried to avoid," he added. "Don't get the idea that Billy never wants to see his fans."

"He's always having to come into his dressing room for autographs, and the fans, before or after a one-nighter show, things could get a little out of hand. I can't remember the last time we left 'officially' by the stage door!"

"We had to get up to all sorts of stunts," said Hal. "Like climbing over roofs, going through private houses and over garden walls. If he had to leave direct from the stage, then he'd do so by a door the fans least expected. We didn't like doing that, but it had to be done."

One of their favourite stunts was to arrange which door Billy was to leave by, then Hal would drive the car away and the fans would be already standing at the arranged door and give a signal on the car's horn.

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Getting into the theatres was also as big a problem. Once, when the fans had been discovered they had to go through the dancers to the stage as there was no other way in. Billy was dressed up as an ice-cream man, complete with white hats and costume.

They got within six yards of the stage, and not one of the 1,700 teenagers packed into the theatre moved a muscle. Another yard and pandemonium broke loose. A young girl had taken a closer look, and recognized Billy.

**A**T long last Gene Vincent has been accepted as a British resident! The Capitol recording star from Norfolk, Virginia, will re-commence his tour almost immediately to begin his planned album of British hits.
