



# Dave Berry: our style is simply Rhythm 'n' Blues

SIX-FEET one lach Dave Berry, whose recording of "Memphis Tennessee" stands at number 27 in DISCS Top 30 this week, has a slight trace of the Asiadic about him. And 22-year-old Dave has one hig ambition—to visit the Far East and study the lenser-known Eastern religious. Dark-haired Dave, with his backing group The Cruisers—Frank Miles (tend guitar), Roy Barber (rhythm guitar), John Fleet thase guitar) and Peter Thorston (drums)—have been a top draw in and around Sheffield and the North West generally in the four years they have been together.

Dave told DISCI. "We are extremely grateful to the Liverpool boys for giving our type of music such a boost, but we don't want people to think that we are shappy cashing in on the best trend.

"Our style is purely and simply rhythm and blues and we have not changed since we started four years 180."

Dave signed a recording contract with Decca last year. But at that time the type of material hitting the four file of the suit Dave's style, so it was not until August of this year that Dave went into the studios to record "Memphis Tennessee."
