### Two great films . . . two great albums

Wonderful Life

(Columbia 335X 1628 Stereo SCX 3515)未未未未

HERE it is! The soundtrack from Cliff and The Shads' new film, and a marvellous mixture of beaters, bright and breazy production numbers and melodically mellow sentimental ballads

and breezy production numbers and melodically mellow sentimental ballads it is, too!

It's an ideal formula for universal appeal and the film should break records set by "Semmer Hollday" if this sounditrack music is any guide.

Shads, Bruce Welch, Hank Marvin and Brian Bennett are tunorging as potential glants of songwriting. Their work in this set shows a faile for melodic simplicity and tyrics of quality that places them above most of the current crop of tunesmids.

And Peter Myers and Ronald Cass, who wrote the original story and screenplay for the film, are experts at penning the production type of song, bulancing the Shad writers contributions.

Chiff sings the film's title song over a hiting waltz background from the eschestra plus the Mike Sammes Singers. It's a melody which makes an immediate impres-sion with happy, get-away-from-it lyric mood.

A GIRL IN EVERY PORT (by Peter Myers, Ronald Cass)

Cliff works with the orchestra again, moving with nice vocal case over a Latin up-tempo in bright and breezy mood with obvious breaks for dancing.

WALKIN' (by Bruce Welch, Hank B. Marvin, Brian Bennett) The Shads' first solo track, and a

typically good instrumental workout by them. It's a fastish walk, with a kind of semi-Latin tempo and ear-some rilling from Hank B's guitar.

HOME (by Peter Myers, Ronald

A grade A production number in the good old vandeville soft shoe shuffle-type routine. Cliff handles it well with orchestra and Sammes chorus, and there are more hoofing interfudes in this one which should be a wow to watch on screen.


