issue, a veritable cocktail of all the best kit we've seen, heard and tested to the limit throughout the past year. Our Awards are a little different

from the norm. First, our performanceled approach means only the finest make the grade. We've listened to the kit, measured it, lived with it a while and sought the opinions of 'blind' listening panels before venturing our verdicts... verdicts formed by the most creditable set of reviewers around.

Then there's the fact that we don't limit ourselves to contrived product categories with a single Oscar-style winner trailed by a set of also-rans. Our winners come in four broad groups: Source Components, Amplifiers, Speakers and Cables & Accessories, ensuring all bases are covered yet only the most worthy earn the accolade of Product Of The Year. There's kit that will serve in a top-notch, low-cost separates system, components that will take you another rung or two up the sonic ladder and gear that may form the basis of your hi-fi hopes, dreams and aspirations, all presented in steps from entry-level to high-end. We've got two-channel stereo and high-quality multichannel surround, kit for purist audio systems and gear for those who want high-fidelity video too. Quite simply, there's something here for everyone, with a single common thread - scintillating sound that engages the senses so the music that moves you, moves you more.

There's plenty else in this issue too, including fresh product reviews, our regular music round-up and the usual concoction of news and opinion from hi-fi's most reliable grapevine. But first, let us take you through some of the key hi-fi happenings of the year in an Audiofile special - events that have helped shape 2003 and will influence the year to come ... Tim Bowern editor

TWEETER TWEAKING

Way back in Y2K, Tannoy surprised everyone. First by introducing a costly 'SuperTweeter', and then more importantly by scoring a considerable commercial hit with it. Although the need to extend output an octave or more above the audio band remains controversial, other brands such as KEF, Neat Acoustics and Townshend Audio have also responded.

However, two leading hi-fi speaker brands, B&W andFocal-JMlab, have both rejected the 'add-on' super-tweeter approach. Both validly point out the difficulty of integrating such a device with a normal tweeter, and instead are focusing their attentions on extending the bandwidth of 'normal' tweeters.

B&W has successfully extended the bandwidth of its 'Nautilus' alloy dome by improving its motor drive and mechanical integrity. Meanwhile, Focal-JMlab has gone one step further with a new wide-band tweeter using a pure beryllium diaphragm (pictured), with a very high stiffness-toweight ratio and good self-damping.



Other examples also exist, including the pure diamond diaphragm in the Accuton D2 20-6, from German driver specialist Thiel & Partner, which claims a bandwidth which goes up to 100kHz, and further developments may be confidently predicted.



HI-FI MEETS THE PC

PC/home audio convergence continued to evolve in 2003, with hard disk storage making further inroads from the desk to the living room. Yamaha and Cyrus (LinkServer, above) have recently joined pioneers like Imerge with hard diskbased multi-room products, and more are set to follow.

Meanwhile, people are now paying to download music, the influence of Apple's iPod player and iTunes service moving things on apace. The Media Centre Edition of Microsoft's Windows continues to point the way direct digital music distribution is here to stay...

CD'S LAST STAND?

In an era of multi-format disc players, a dedicated CD player is still the best thing to play your CDs on. The format has the best software support/sound quality ratio going and the only serious competition in popularity-terms comes from MP3, so if sound quality is an issue it remains unbeatable. DVD-Audio and SACD may have the sonic advantage but the catalogue is still less than one per cent of that for CD. At least for now...

This year, new format competition has forced CD player designers to come up with new ideas. The Resolution Audio Opus 21 (pictured right and reviewed in *HFC* 244) is a two-boxer with a difference – transport and DAC in one case with the power supply, display and so on in another. One-boxers have been getting more impressive too – Meridian's stunning 507 defines precision and we can't wait to hear its new G08, while Classé's CDP-10 brings high-end refinement to a bigger audience at a very competitive £1,599. It's also been a good year for standalone DACs, which are enjoying a renaissance thanks to the upsampling trend. Notable examples from Chord Electronics, Musical Fidelity and Nagra are setting the pace.



HI-RES LINKAGE

2003 was the year when the high-res multichannel formats finally got a digital connection standard. i.Link, or FireWire, is a single cable which replaces six analogue interconnects and features a clock link to minimise jitter. So far only Sony and Pioneer (DV-757 Ai universal DVD player and VSA-AX5i receiver

pictured) have released i.Linkable products but Marantz and Yamaha have announced that they will soon follow suit. As with any new standard the future is still not clear. For a start there's an alternative called HDMi, a sort of 21 st Century SCART that is likely to find favour as it caters for digital audio and video – you'll find it on next year's Pioneer DV-868AVi universal player and the latest Meridians. Then there's DVi, a pure video digital interface that is now appearing on plasma TVs and has a strong base in computing circles.



VINYL REVIVAL

Vinyl's minirenaissance has continued through 2003. Some of this stems from the format's unquenchable popularity among the dance/DJ fraternity, but vinyl's following in hi-fi circles remains solid, with 'audiophile'standard pressings available on the high street and many still revelling in the format's tactile quality in the face of a complex digital world.

Hi-fi manufacturers have been meeting this demand with a plethora of new decks. Some are priced almost as impulse



purchases, like Pro-Ject's £210 1 Xpression (pictured). Others, like Roksan's TMS2 and Musical Fidelity's M1 are much more costly. But the hottest price point seems to be around £1,000, with Avid, Clearaudio, Michelle, Origin Live, Nottingham Analogue and Roksan all vying for a slice of the action.

HARD TIMES FOR HI-FI

It has been a turbulent year for the hi-fi industry. The Iraq war undermined demand in the early months and trends toward multi-room at one end of the market and MP3 at the other have led to some serious downsizing. TAG McLaren is now concentrating purely on home cinema and both Denon and Marantz lost their independence to a Japanese holdings company. Yamaha reported a loss for the first time in 100 years and even Arcam had to cut 20 jobs. Meanwhile, Kenwood pulled out of audio all together.

In North America, Harman shut down its Madrigal facility where Mark Levinson, Proceed and Revel products were built and moved production to the Lexicon and JBL factories.

Having sold NHT and Rockford, Recoton filed for bankruptcy leaving the future of several brands in doubt, including Heco, Jensen and Acoustic Research (AR) among others.

THE STYLE COUNCIL

Style continues to be a key concern for manufacturers as they seek to differentiate their products in a competitive marketplace. Home cinema has had its part to play, with sub/sat packages clearly the number one growth area in the loudspeaker sector as consumers seek discrete solutions to the domestic conundrum of spreading multiple speakers around the room.

Firms like Chord Electronics (pictured), Hovland and Shanling continue to push the stylistic boundaries, while even traditional 'sound-first' brands like NAD, Naim and Orelle have smartened up their acts with distinctive new looks. Turntables are looking increasing fabulous too, even at lower price levels.

Fashion tends to go in circles, even in the hi-fi world. Through much of the 1990s, hi-fi had to be black to be taken seriously. Then, as manufacturers and punters alike sought a degree of differentiation, silver came back in and black was branded 'boring'. But now, it seems, black is 'the new silver' once again, and judging by the increasing number of raven-hued products we're now seeing in the office, black is well and truly back.



MUSCLE AMPS ON THE MAKE

Muscle power amps capable of driving everything short of the Paris shuttle are in vogue again. You can blame a renewed interest in massive high-grade speakers that need complete control and consistent behaviour over a wide bandwidth for this. Sitting pretty at the top of the market is Krell with its Full Power Balanced series, which in the stereo range extends to £15,000 for the immense 700-watt FPB 700cx (reviewed in *HFC* 234).

Mark Levinson should be a natural foil for Krell, but is currently suffering from a rather chaotic reorganisation of its business. On the other hand, we can soon expect some high-class newcomers from Canadian specialist Classé, following B&W's takeover of the brand. Other prominent names in the high-power game include Karan Acoustics with the 450-watt KA-S450, the first-ever Premier series solid state amp from Conrad-Johnson, the 350, and Musical Fidelity's three-box kW amp, which as its name suggests delivers a full kilowatt per channel. But the most extraordinary amp of all comes from Australian brand Halcro – the unfeasibly expensive dm68 monoblock (pictured right), priced at £26,600 per pair and reviewed in *HFC* 243.



AV AMPS COME OF AGE

Big home cinema amps, dripping with controls and digital sound bending circuits, used to be the laughing stock of the hi-fi industry. They were clearly over-endowed, yet under-engineered where it counted, and with all their flexibility they rarely lived up to the hype. Even simple parameters like power specs were usually missed by a mile. But slowly, things are changing. Despite their reputation, many of these amps remain prodigiously powerful, and they are also raising their game in the area of sound quality. Soundfield processing has been improving in parallel, and with the introduction of high-res, multichannel music formats, they are now beginning to attract quality-conscious, audio-first buyers. Pioneer and Denon have led the way with integrated AV amps, while some truly superb processor/ power amp pairings have blown us away this year (like the EAD kit pictured below and reviewed in *HFC* 242). With high-bandwidth capable digital interfaces like i.Link now on the uptake, 2004 should prove very interesting indeed...



GREAT UNIVERSALS

Mainstream manufacturers can barely give basic DVD-Video players away now that you can buy no-name equivalents in your local supermarket for £40. But the technology is on the move, and these very companies that have lost out on entry-level models can't lay their hands on enough of their immensely flexible 'universal' players, compatible with both DVD-Audio and SACD alongside CD and DVD-Video. In a maturing environment, there is increasing

interest in models like the Denon DVD-2900 (right), and upmarket players like Marantz's DV-12S2 an Linn's Unidisk models. Naim is about to release a DVD player that can be upgraded to SACD or DVD-Audio (but not both), and Primare has launched its first universal player.

But the goalposts are being moved by models like Pioneer's DV-757Ai, which also includes an i.Link digital interface. Even without this, the performance of premium DVD-Audio/Video players like Arcam's DV27A when playing CDs has come a long way since DVD was first launched.





HIGH-RES AUDIO GROWING FAST

In some cases it is easier and more instructive to look at what didn't happen this year than what did. What didn't happen, save for a handful of decent releases mainly from Warner, was DVD-Audio. SACD meanwhile has been making hay with the Bob Dylan and Rolling Stones back catalogues, reissued as hybrid SACD. But not all is as it seems. On the whole they are not selling because of their high-res multichannel sound. They're being purchased primarily for their qualities as remastered CDs, and they are racked alongside other CDs without even being clearly labelled as SACDs. Meanwhile, the established music retailers like HMV and Virgin are looking increasingly like outposts for the Hollywood machine. But there are finally signs that the record industry is beginning to wake up to the power of DVD-Video and DVD-Audio, so expect some action over the next year, especially when Warner starts releasing its promised hybrid DVD/CD discs early in 2004.

BRUISER LOUDSPEAKERS

Big, money-no-object loudspeakers have always been attractive, and not just to loudspeaker manufacturers who are anxious to let the world know what they can do. This year, however, has been a classic by any standards, coincidentally following a vear in which B&W made good with the Nautilus 800. First Focal-JMlab laid down a marker with its new £45,000 flagship speaker - the outstanding beryllium tweeter-equipped Grande Utopia Be. Then another major name in the French loudspeaker manufacturing pantheon, Triangle, chimed in with its impressively tall and slender £20,000 Magellan (pictured right). And last but certainly not least, Wilson-Benesch has launched the ACT

(Advanced Composite Technology) Silver at a comparatively reasonable (in this company, at any rate) £8,400. This model makes extensive use of carbon fibre, and its welded internal structure makes it one of the few designs that can boast of being assembled by a welder.

In the real world of course, very few people are going to have worry about where they're going to have to shift their furniture to accommodate speakers such as these in their homes. But a larger number will benefit indirectly from the technology and expertise that trickles down into more affordable speakers, including models like Focal-JMlab's Alto Utopia Be (reviewed last month), the next step down from the flagship Grande.





DAB MARCHES ON

Digital radio has continued its gradual penetration of the mainstream consciousness. with active DAB marketing campaigns and an increasing range of nicely designed. well-priced kit. A number of new names touting portable DAB radios have sprung up this year, while brands like Cambidge and DAB-pioneer Pure Digital have done brisk business with their tuners (Pure's DRX-702 is pictured above). Meanwhile, the news that Asda is now stocking DAB tuners in ten of its larger stores could start a trend that sees DAB radios

on UK supermarket shelves next to £40 DVD players.

Broadcast coverage is improving too – the BBC switched on more new DAB transmitters last month and aims to achieve 85 per cent coverage in the UK by mid-2004, while digital radio via cable and satellite TV services and even the internet has increased the penetration of digital audio broadcasting in the home. New features like rewind and record are expected on DAB sets next year, but sadly broadcast bit-rates show little sign of improving on the current average of 130Kbps.

DIGITAL AMPLIFICATION CREEPS FORWARD

Digital amplification has been bubbling under for some years now, but has so far stubbornly failed to make the impact it promised on the hi-fi scene. Sony and others make low-cost integrated systems incorporating digital amps, with all the promised benefits - compact construction, efficiency and low heat dissipation. Opus, Yamaha and others are using simple digital amps, in some cases 'pseudo'-digital class T circuits, in their multi-room audio systems, and Class D amps have been put to use in the limited bandwidth world of subwoofers. But the killer punch - a leap in sound quality has eluded the industry so far. Even the impressive PWM (Pulse Width Modulation) solutions pioneered by TACT and Sharp's own one-bit technology have yet to make real inroads (though a few high-end brands have made successful

digital/ analogue hybrids, like Chapter – see p64). Perhaps 2004 will mark the turning point. The recent

Perhaps 2004 will mark the turning point. The recent announcement by Sony (TA-DA9000ES pictured) of a proprietary S-Master development of PWM digital technology is being touted as the next great leap forward. It's simply too early to judge whether the technology will deliver, but the potential pay-off for a signal chain that remains digital all the way to the speakers is immense.

AUDIOPHILE VINYL

SANTANA

Abraxas

Hear The Music/CBS 180g vinyl Music: Santana's second album from 1970 remains the high point of his career. It's essentially latin-influenced

rock that works on a number of levels. Peter Green's *Black Magic Woman* has a new energy and life thanks to latin percussion that the ° original Fleetwood Mac

would never have imagined, while Tito Puente's *Oye Como Va* has a rock treatment that doesn't smother its roots but enhances the rhythmic subtleties within. Carlos Santana managed to combine a range of styles without making a mess of them or getting carried away with his own distinctive playing as tended to happen with later works.

Sound: A dense and rich recording, this pressing benefits from the skills of Joerg Kessler who mastered the vinyl for Sony Music Germany, and it delivers the energy and dynamics of the music along with the fine detail. A great result. $\star \star \star \star \star JK$

MARY BLACK By The Time It Gets Dark

Vivante/Dara 180g vinyl Music: In the early nineties Mission sponsored a Mary Black disc that brought this Irish singer's crystalline

voice to the ear of the hi-fi community and wedged it firmly on the list of great demo artists. This is her second album from 1987 and contains a dozen folk-influenced songs by

writers as diverse as Richard Thompson, Ewan McColl and Henry (Moon River) Mancini. Accompaniment is largely acoustic and lead by producer Declan Sinnott's sharp guitar picking with back-up from soprano sax, congas and cello among others. Black's voice is strong and clear, often very beautiful and she sings a sad song with tremendous feeling. $\star\star\star$ Sound: Vivante used the Metropolis half-speed cutting process and you can hear it in the clear, full highs and strength of sound. It could be sweeter but it's certainly not short on detail or power. **** JK

ISOBEL CAMPBELL Amorino

Snowstorm Music: Isobel Campbell played cello with shambling indie iconoclasts Belle & Sebastian before branching out with her own brand of fey, sweet, fine-toned pop. Eschewing guitars for the most part in favour of a sixties French pop-style palette of strings, flutes, muted horns, and accordion, it's never deep or difficult, but often beautiful. The sense of an artist stretching her wings is obvious, and perhaps there are one too many attempts to show her range - the ragtime swing of The Cat's Pyjamas sits uneasily with the imaginary Parisian spring mood of the rest of the album. **** Sound: As with much of her old band's material, the 'fi' is less than 'hi', but it

does possess a cosy warmth that's much in keeping with the mood. $\star \star \star DO$



THE BYRDS Sweetheart Of The Rodeo (Deluxe) Columbia Legacy

Music: One of the most influential records in rock history was a product of Roger Mcquinn's dreams of Americana and Gram Parsons' distillation of pure American country. Recorded in Nashville in Spring of 1968 and glistening with pedal-steel guitar, banjo, fiddle and honky-tonk piano, the most remarkable thing about the album was the songs. Dylan, Woody Guthrie and Merle Haggard populate a roster which speaks wisely of the lives of pilgrims and prisoners, sinners and seekers. This two-CD re-issue comes with 14 unreleased tracks, and a booklet full of rare photos and info. **** Sound: Vic Anesini's Super-Bit Mapping process allows the acoustic instrumentation to shine through like never before. **** MP



THE BEATLES Let It Be – Naked Parlophone

Music: Let It Be was never the farewell album the Beatles deserved. Now 33 years later, McCartney and Starr have refashioned it to give us the back-tobasics album the band intended before producer Phil Spector got hold of it. The orchestration, choirs and effects have been removed to leave the Beatles playing like a proper band again. The Long And Winding Road is transformed without the schmaltzy strings, Lennon's Don't Let Me Down has been added and the running order improved. Now Let It Be sounds like the coherent album it never did at the time. *****

Sound: Spector might be the world's most legendary record producer, but this stripped-back reinvention of the album suggests that he did the Beatles no favours. ********* *NW*



GHAZAL The Rain

FCM

Music: Ghazal consists of grown-up child prodigies Shujaat Husain Khan (sitar, vocals) and Kayhan Kalhor (kamancheh, a sort of Persian fiddle) along with relative youngster Sandeep Das on tabla. The group's usual



method is to build improvisations out of traditional ragas and modes from the classical Indian and Persian repertoire, taking them where they will, which can be quite a journey – there are just three tracks on this 53-minute album, each of them running the gamut from peaceful evocation to intense, passionate virtuosic pyrotechnics. The two main instruments complement each other surprisingly well, the jangling tones of the sitar counterpointed by the soaring, evocative sighs and elastic tone of the kamancheh. ********

Sound: This performance was recorded in a concert hall, but could have been a cathedral such is the clarity and presence of the instruments. $\star\star\star\star\star$ *DO*



VARIOUS California Cool Club Cuts

Giant Steps Records Music: This mid-price offering –

Music This mucpice offening – compiled by jazz guru Roy Carr – is billed as "The Ultimate Chill Out" album which isn't a bad description, though the word "Fifties" should probably be in there since all these jazzy, laid-back choons were laid down between 1949 and 1960. T-Bone Walker's bluesy *Life's Too Short* is probably the best of a bright bunch but Nat King Cole, Johnny Otis and Slim Gaillard are all in there too. End the week in style. ********

Sound: Despite the hiss that's audible on a couple of tracks, this is a testimony to the sound engineers of yesteryear. How briskly direct those three-track vocals were, all you needed to hear and no more. $\star \star \star PS$

EST ESBJÖRN SVENSSON TRIO Strange Place For Snow ACT CD

Music: EST's 2002 album combines groove oriented keyboard work with tight but imaginative drums and double bass to tremendous effect. The piano is similar to Keith Jarrett at his more disciplined, and there's always a hint of Svensson's hero Thelonius Monk to keep the pace just so. Dan Berglund's bass is never lazy, driving each tune with power and grace. There is plenty of variety from tune to tune, some are atmospheric while others indulge the pleasure of a good riff, the players working around the beat without letting it get away. This is modern classic jazz – not heavy, but always interesting. $\star \star \star \star$

Sound: Made up of largely acoustic instruments, this is a fine recording with a lot of fine detail to pick out and it easily sorts the great form the good in hardware terms. $\star \star \star \star \star JK$



RYAN ADAMS Love Is Hell Parts One & Two Lost Highway

Music: Rock 'N' Roll, the bombastic 'official' new album from Ryan Adams which has received mixed reviews, wasn't the record he originally wanted to release. But his record company rejected his first offering, Love Is Hell,



as 'too dark'. After threats of legal action, they've now reluctantly agreed to issue its 18 songs spread across two EPs. The good news for fans of the lyrical style Adams developed on the acclaimed *Heartbreaker* is that *Love Is Hell* is a partial return to that album's memorable bitter-sweet aesthetic. The songs are cracking, Adams sounds suitably torn-and-frayed and Lost Highway must have been mad not to have recognised its quality. $\star \star \star \star$

Sound: Assisted by former Smiths producer John Porter, the guitars sparkle, while Adams' often spooky vocals echo atmospherically around the mix, especially on a magnificently improbable acoustic cover of Oasis's *Wonderwall*.



ARNOLD BAX

Symphony No 7, Tintagel David Lloyd-Jones (conductor) Royal Scottish National Orchestra Naxos 8.557145

Music: The tone poem *Tintagel*, Bax's most popular work, is a very English piece, but with echoes of Wagner, which conjures up the majesty of the sea. The seventh symphony, written 20 years later in 1939, was Bax's last, and although it lacks the accessible charm of earlier symphonies it is full of energy and invention. Both works are played with commitment and energy, and the sound has an honesty that makes up for an occasional lack of finesse. ********

Sound: The stereo perspective is a little kaleidoscopic, but the recording, at the Royal Scottish National Concert Hall in Glasgow, is powerfully atmospheric. $\star\star\star\star\star AG$



HAYDN

String Quartet in F Maj, James McMillan Tuireadh, Schubert String Quartet in A Min The Allegri Quartet, James Campbell

(clarinet) Naim CD067

Music: James MacMillan's *Tuireadh*, in which the quartet is augmented by a clarinet, is the odd man out here, and was written to commemorate the Piper Alpha oil rig disaster during which 167 lives were lost. The work is flanked by the more classically proportioned Haydn and Schubert quartets. The latter in particular is a splendid work, lyrical and thematically refined. ★★★★

Sound: The sound is strongly focused, with a very distinctive and fairly empty sounding acoustic that gives the players nowhere to hide. But these players are too assured and virtuosic to need flattering. $\star \star \star AG$

Come Away With Me

SACD (stereo./multichannel SACD plus stereo CD layer) Blue Note

Music: This classy album made quite an impression on the hi-fi fraternity last year and this SA rendition will join the ranks of dem discs at shows in the next year and probably beyond. Her voice is reminiscent of another Jones, Rickie Lee, herself something of an audiophile darling in the eighties. Norah is a little softer and more natural, she sings with real depth of feeling



but doesn't have to overdo things for effect. The songs on here are largely romantic and beautifully played by a group of very slick dudes. Hank Williams' *Cold Cold Heart* joins original tunes including Jones' title track. Smooth music with heart and just enough edge, this sounds like a grower. **** Sound: The SA mix matches the music – smooth, clean and open, in a very slick production that's sensitive to the feel of the band. The surround mix spreads the band around the room but keeps the voice largely up front, while the stereo has more integrity and precision of imaging. ****

RACHMANINOV Vespers Op 37

St Petersburg Chamber Choir, Nikolai Komiev (conductor) SACD (stereo.'mult-channel SACD plus stereo CD layer) Pentatone Classics PTC 5186 027 Music: This devotional all-night vespers for the

Russian Orthodox church was composed in 1915 for solo voices in keeping with the requirements of the liturgy, which does not permit embellishment from added instrumentation. The rich, polyphonic writing

however is an absolute joy – colourful, varying in mood and with vocal echoes of bells and trumpet tones adding colour, it was apparently the composer's favourite of his own works, along with *The Bells* (Opus 35). The performances are top drawer, immaculately performed in every respect. $\star \star \star \star$ Sound: One of the highlights of the SACD era is the Pentatone Classics series, recorded at the old Polyhymia home of Philips recordings. This is an excellent example of a recording which reproduces the rapt beauty of the sound in a solid space while retaining a properly focused image. $\star \star \star \star AG$

REM

In Time 1988-2003: The Best Of REM DVD-Audio (24/96 surround,

Dolby Digital 5.1 and 2 Warner Video

Music: While purists may complain REM were never the same after signing for Warner, the body of work they've produced since then stands comparison with anyone's over the same period. The new tracks are first rate too, *Bad Day* (pretty much, *It's The End Of The World Part 2*) is REM near their best, and while perhaps not a killer reason to buy the disc, it's

certainly worthy of its place beside some of the band's finest moments. The only reason we wouldn't buy this disc on DVD-A is

because of the excellent bonus-disc of the CD version – why can't we have that as well! ***** Sound: One of the best surround sound mixes we've heard, a subtle and

engaging testament to the fantastic work producer Elliot Scheiner is doing with the medium. $\star\star\star\star$ *SM*



HFC: The market leaders in mini systems have moved away from supplying record decks with their products as demand at this end of the market dwindles in the face of CD, MiniDisc and the like. We'd recommend buying budget separates from the like of Richer Sounds – you can pick up CD, amp and speaker packages from around £150. You can always add further components to suit your needs – Richer's turntables start at £50, but we'd go for the Pro-Ject Debut II for £120. An alternative would be Denon's DM31 micro (pictured), which should satisfy your sonic and aesthetic needs when partnered by a good turntable and a phono stage like NAD's £50 PP2.

I notice that *Hi-Fi Choice* once rated the TDK Audio Pro as the best blank CD-R disc. However a call to TDK confirmed that these discs are now discontinued. So which CD-Rs do you think are decent now?

HFC: TDK confirmed it has stopped production of the Audio Pro discs with no real explanation why, though the fact that they were around five times the price of regular CD-Rs may have something to do with it. We'd still recommend the more affordable TDK CD-RXG or JVC's CD-R discs, but if you're buying in bulk, the cheapest store we've found is Pricebusters (tel: 0870 800 3444), where prices start at just 43 pence.

ITALIAN STALLION SEEKS HORNY PARTNER

I'm thinking of pairing a 15-watt Unison Research S2K amp (pictured) with the Unico valve CD. Being rather new to the whole valve world I'm having a few problems coming up with speakers to work with the low power output. Do you have any suggestions?

HFC: To begin with you need a shortlist of speakers with a high sensitivity rating and amp-friendly impedance. Use our *Buyer's Bible* to help create a list of candidates in your price range. Some of our favourite speakers for valve amps include the Living Voice Auditorium (£1,600) and the Audio Note AZ One (£449). You should also take a look at some horn-loaded designs if your budget allows and the fine Italian exotica available from Unison distributor UKD (tel: 01753 652669).

BELOVED PIONEER A400

I have been using my A400 amp for the last five years after buying it second-hand, (during which time it has been switched on almost constantly). I have listened to some pretty expensive kit during that time, most of which has failed to outperform the Pioneer. It's not that the expensive stuff was bad – it just wasn't better.

I have found that it can make wonderful music with almost any peripheral and it *loves* top quality equipment. My dealer, who had advised me earlier to get a new amp, has recently changed his tune, smiled, and told me I should hang onto it for a while. How does an SACD player connect to an existing separates system? Which is the best input to use? **Niall5**

HFC: If you are using an SACD player as a purely two-channel source, then the CD input on your amp is an obvious choice. For multichannel playback through an AV amp, you would run five (or six with a subwoofer) interconnects from the player's analogue outputs to the amp (assuming there's no i.Link digital connection).

Having bought an AV receiver two years ago I wonder if there is any real difference in sound quality compared to the latest offerings? Some magazines would have us believing that they're improving every day. **Moo Moo**

HFC: AV amps evolve quickly, partly owing to the nature of digital processing technology. In fact, the multichannel amps of today bear little sonic resemblance to their equivalents of just two years ago. It's not just about more channels – the quality of processing has greatly improved and the general sonics are better, partly driven by the requirements of SACD and DVD-Audio. But don't expect hi-fi-standard multichannel performance to come cheap...



SELECTING YOUR SOURCE

There's a bewildering array of formats available to the clued-up consumer out there, not to mention a wide variety of ways to play them back, so the first thing to do is to work out exactly what you want to play. Chances are you'll know if you need a turntable to play vinyl records, ditto a radio tuner – though you may need to decide whether to go digital radio-wise (DAB) or stay analogue (FM/AM). On strict quality grounds we'd still be tempted to go analogue, particularly if you can afford a good tuner and roof-top aerial, but DAB has become an extremely cost-effective solution in many areas, with an increasing range of exclusive digital stations to add to your old favourites.

Then there's CD. Most of us have built up large collections by now, and despite its age the original digital music format is set to remain the dominant commercial music carrier for some years yet – after all, it's cheap to produce, easy to market and has achieved almost blanket penetration world-wide. For these reasons, good CD replay should remain a top priority for most sound-conscious music fans, and a dedicated CD player that's optimised for the purpose may continue to provide a worthwhile investment, whether you're sticking with two-channel stereo or building a multichannel (surround sound) set-up.

Of course, you can play CDs on any DVD player, but we wouldn't recommend you bother with most of the cheaper models. That said, some of the more specialist machines have raised the bar in that regard, and most of these are also compatible with one (or both) of the newer high-resolution, multichannel-compatible music formats such as DVD-Audio and SACD. The quality and quantity of titles available on both these formats has improved significantly this year, and it makes sense for anyone building a multichannel set-up to incorporate them in his or her plans.

The neatest solution is to buy one of the new 'universal' DVD players, compatible with all current disc formats including DVD-A and SACD, like the excellent Pioneer and Denon players on p21 and p25. However, if you simply want to optimise playback of specific formats, or you're willing to incorporate several players in your system on quality grounds, there are some superb alternatives around – like Sony's audio-only SACD player on p22 or Arcam's DVD-Audio-compatible DVD player on p28.

Finally there's hard disk, now really coming of age as an entertainment storage format. Imerge (p27) has led the way in adopting this technology as the flexible heart of a multi-room audio system, with others licensing its technology and following suit, while Yamaha's implementation on p24 is a brilliantly versatile implementation for home recordists.

Incidentally, the concept of stand-alone CD recorders would appear to be all but dead judging by the dearth of new models and death of old favourites this year. Blame it on the PC... **HFC**



PRO-JECT 1 XPRESSION TURNTABLE, ARM AND CARTRIDGE

f you want a deck that will deliver the magic of vinyl but won't break the bank, the Pro-Ject 1 Xpression is a very tempting package. Included in its bargain price is a carbon fibre tonearm and an Ortofon OM10 cartridge, a needle which usually retails for £35. Built around an MDF plinth that supports a felt-covered alloy platter, the carbon fibre tonearm is its clear USP. Not so long ago this material was the sole domain of the high end and to find one on a budget player even now is remarkable.

The 1 Xpression delivers a remarkably together and weighty sound. The bass is full and fruity, and while the scale may not be as substantial as it is with more expensive decks, the sense of timing makes up for this, grabbing your ears and drawing you into the groove. High frequencies are smooth and sweet, and it has the knack of delivering most of the goods all of the time – some budget turntables can sound brash or aggressive but the Xpression is always calm and assured.

Given its price, this is a turntable with a remarkable grasp of the finer points of vinyl replay. It's sensitive to variations in pace and energy, and voices are full of expression and richness. It's capable of extracting the reverb and space in a recording too, unearthing more detail than a deck at this level has any right to. More money will buy a more substantial sound, but the Pro-Ject's delivery is far from thin and never threatens to grate on the nerves, however angular the music.

If you're looking for a low-cost turntable, ignore the 1 Xpression at your peril – it does space, light, energy and bass while keeping its finger firmly on the musical pulse. *Reviewed HFC 248*

Cambridge's real achievement here has been to combine all that's nice about DAB in terms of features with a smart and friendly appearance, sound that's as good as any, and an

attractive price. There's one interesting sonic feature in the use of selectable frequency-response tweaks, dubbed 'Natural Contour Technology'. A rearmounted switch allows the user to choose between flat response and two mildly filtered versions intended to ameliorate the often over-bright sound that results from the combination of studio practices (close miking and compression) with DAB's MPEG 2

But it still supports NTSC progressive scan pictures - PAL progressive scan should be included too by the time you read this - but earlier samples were NTSC progressive only (the moral of the story is 'ask first' if it's important). It sports all the connectivity you'd expect from such a full-featured player, including a pair of Scart sockets, and the player is also designed to be easy to use, with set-up menus to help control the bass management and some picture tweaking options.

The sound is quite laid back, especially in multichannel (more so than the DVD picture quality, which is impressively brisk and colourful), but has a consistent presentation across both DVD-Audio and SACD. The overall balance is clean and rounded, and the player never once overextends itself or sounds glassy and harsh. hile other manufacturers are producing universal DVD-Audio/SACD players, Sony's new SCD-XA3000ES is resolutely an SACD product. This is far removed from universal play, with no video component at all. To paraphrase TV's *The League Of Gentlemen*, this is an audio player, for audio people.

Naturally, with no on-screen user interface or menu system, setting up the SCD-XA3000ES could be complicated. Fortunately Sony doesn't attempt to baffle the user with a range of superfluous set-up parameters, but allows some control over bass management and has up to eight speaker size settings. The XA3000ES takes all the best influences from top-notch Sony SACD players of recent years and mixes them together while slashing the price. It takes its styling cues from the SCD-XA333ES and has the same expensive six-channel 'Super Audio' DAC configuration seen in the SCD-XA777ES. Most players tend to convert the 'pure' SACD bitstream into more conventional PCM data at some stage, thereby compromising the format's original DSD (Direct Stream Digital) ideal for the sake of convenience features or a single multi-format DAC solution. In the SCD-XA3000ES, Sony sticks to its guns – by using these Sony 'Super Audio' DACs, the data stays bitstream throughout the player.

This dedication to SACD performance is reflected in the sound quality, producing a SACD performance that cannot be bettered for the money, and beats the sound of any universal or SACD-compatible DVD player in this regard. The Sony simply creates vivid, liquid and very, very real multichannel music with effortless, almost ghost-like imaging. It's excellent in two-channel mode too, and should not be ignored for use in a stereo set-up to replace an ageing CD player.

If you are really serious about SACD, hang the expense and the extra boxes – choose this Sony for CD and SACD, and get a DVD-Audio/Video player for the other tasks. *Reviewed HFC 248*





ROKSAN RADIUS 5 TURNTABLE AND ARM

oksan's new vinyl-spinning baby is a stunner in more senses than one. First, the Radius 5 is a visual KO. The duallayer transparent acrylic plinth and matt-textured acrylic platter, with matching acrylic headshell and bearing housing on the supplied Nima tonearm, are part of the equation. But so is the superb standard of finish, and the detail design which helps prevent handling damage to the main bearing essentially the same one used on the flagship TMS2. Equally impressive is the way that, despite being a suspended player with a unipivot arm, set-up is scarcely more onerous than a non-suspended deck with solid arm bearings. There are no suspension settings to make, and the unipivot arm bearing has a lock position that is easily engaged and disengaged.

Good looks are no cover for indifferent performance, however. Happily, the Radius 5 has an easy, natural and fluid voice, with rock-solid pitch stability and no hint of ducking under transient or sustained loads, despite the extra mechanical drag. "The Radius has an easy, natural and fluid voice, with rock-solid pitch stability." Surface noise (clicks and pops), if not completely benign – this is an established weakness of vinyl replay after all – is muted. Low frequency noise is also handled well, and the player is decently immune from footfall noise and other unwanted low-frequency artefacts, as long as it is supported by a stable platform which is well anchored in the vertical plane. The Radius 5 is a grownup, stable-sounding turntable, and at

today's prices, a notable bargain.

enon's DVD-2900 wasn't the first universal DVD player, but it is one of the best, especially when no-compromise performance is needed without spending a king's ransom. This big, golden machine covers all the bases – from good ol' CD to DVD-Video and the latest SACD and DVD-Audio multichannel music formats – and there's even the chance for periodic self-improvement via Denon's firmware upgrades on CD-ROM. It may lack the AL24 processing and 14-bit twin video DACs of the huge (non-universal) Denon DVD-A1 flagship DVD player, but this 8.1kg machine does include support for the latest DTS 24/96 recordings without compromise and features a high-end 12-bit/108MHz video DAC in its own right. It even has a 'pure direct' button with two addressable modes that can be assigned to disable the video output, digital output or panel display (or all three) – such flexibility is rare at any price, but marks out the DVD-2900 as a very special player indeed.

With such configurability, the on-screen menu is comprehensive and at times bewildering, but it's worth the effort – bass management and black level settings make a big difference for both audio and video performance. And it's here where the DVD-2900 lives up to its weight. It's a fantastic all-rounder, probably the best high-res universal playback solution currently available, short of spending thousands. DVD-Audio music sounds excellent, with a fast, powerful and room-filling delivery. SACD is impressive too, almost as good as top-notch audio-only SACD players, and DVD-Video playback is simply superb. Even CD is well above average for a DVD player. he toughest player on the increasingly tough turntable scene is a newcomer. Avid's entry-level Diva is a striking stainless steel heavyweight at a welterweight price. The engineering quality is unusually high – look at the hewn-from-solid-aluminium block that forms the mechanical hub of the turntable if you need proof. It ties the deck together, supporting the bearing, tonearm and three suspension pots, each containing an adjustable spring. It'll even take a second arm if you feel the need.

Once the vinyl is clamped to the platter the fun begins, and good entertainment it is too. The Diva has a strong, definite sound that is more confident than most at the price. It has good, solid bass allied to a distinct sense of assurance – eschewing soft romance for power and detail.

You can hear all the instruments and voices in the mix and the latter can have considerable presence. The tonal balance is on the stark side, with a warts-and-all approach that cuts straight to the chase, meaning it only sounds as good as your vinyl – there are no allowances made for knackered LPs here. Yet it can open up compressed-sounding pressings and reveal their inner power, which is a rare and entertaining skill.

The Diva has a coherency and drive that most CD players would kill for. You can hear right through the music, which enhances dynamic range and allows fine detail to shine through. It has a confident and solid sound and in the context of its competition, this makes it a hard act to beat. *Reviewed HFC 247*

MERIDIAN 507 CD PLAYER

he Meridian 507 is a CD player with exceptional refinement and poise, particularly given that it costs less than £1,200. It's the brand's entry-level model but it's still equipped with a CD-ROM transport mechanism driving a double buffering technique that's designed to minimise jitter. This is combined with a DVD-Audio-style 24-bit/192kHz digital-to-analogue converter. The analogue output is produced by a direct coupled (DC) output stage while the digital feed is precision re-clocked.

In operation, the 507 produces a precise sound. It's not hard or bright, which 'precise' can sometimes indicate, it's more of a measured and exacting reproduction of notes that suggests that there is very little distortion. It is particularly acute at a micro dynamic level, the variations in level and tone of different notes is very clear. Imaging

ou may well ask, with Yamaha's hard disk recorder costing £600, and some such devices clocking in well below £400, why on earth should you pay so much for this one? Mainly because it's so much more sophisticated and versatile - and in fact it's hardly the same colour of a horse at all. The main clue to its abilities comes in the presence of three separate analogue outputs, each of which can play a different recording from the hard disk simultaneously. Simply add wire, some amplification and speakers and you've got a superflexible multi-room installation.

Now you *could* put a CD player in each room. Fine, but you'll be forever chasing round to find favourite discs and you'll miss out on the multitude of control possibilities that the S2000 offers (including the

rcam has been especially active this year, and the keynote introduction is its fully updated FMJ series DVD player, which now includes DVD-Audio and PAL progressive scan video compatibility. Canada's Magnum Dynalab specialises in analogue tuner technology, even to the extent of including valves in its more upmarket models. Besides the quirky but effective remote control, its only other concession to modernity lies in a digital readout of the tuned frequency.

he middle market for CD players has seen an aggressive year with a lot of good new players coming in, but this Classé is (forgive the pun) a class act and managed to beat all in its price range by a wide margin. This beautiful Canadian has a full-width chassis containing a Philips transport mechanism, a low jitter clock and PCM1738 Burr-Brown D/A converters running at 24-bits/192kHz. All top-notch stuff.

This is a superb player with a midrange to die for. It reveals everything no matter what you play, allowing you to easily follow each instrument in the midst of a busy passage of music. None of the competition manages this degree of coherence and engagement coupled with such strong focus on the different elements of the music. Voices offer up new layers of character - the more subtle they are the more the Classé seems to dig out of the recording. The CDP-10 is relaxed yet precise, the timing spot-on and the performance highly convincing. It's particularly adept at bringing to light notes and sounds that are lower down in the mix, which means that every 'familiar' disc becomes a voyage of sonic discovery.

Micro dynamics are well handled too - for instance, the variation in weight with which Tori Amos plays each key in the quiet opening of Pretty Good Year is clearly audible, much more so that through lesser players. The raucous outburst in the middle of the track remains strangely calm and coherent, but this is because the player isn't phased by the sudden onslaught of energy. This is a superb CD player, with the sort of high-end sound that usually costs twice as much.

D players come in all shapes, sizes, types and prices these days, but those prepared to pay good money will find that the very best CD-dedicated machines can deliver spectacular results from the silver disc. Naim Audio's £2,650 CDX2 is a splendid player in its own right, and cleverly may be subsequently upgraded to a significantly better two-box machine with the £2,300 XPS external power supply.

It has 'triptych' styling with very sturdy all-alloy (non-magnetic) build, and features careful internal shielding, short signal paths and a number of separately regulated power supplies. The disc itself is held by a magnetic puck. A pair of phono sockets augment Naim's traditional five-pin DIN connections, the simple display provides purely basic info and a 'system' handset is supplied.

Connected to a suitably capable amp and speakers, the standalone CDX2 does a splendid job of replaying CDs. It combines beautiful manners with Naim's characteristically coherent musical drive and flow well in evidence, keeping the whole musical ensemble working properly together and moving in the right direction. Everything holds together beautifully, and unlike some previous Naim components it tends to sound equally superb when heard out of a complete Naim system context.

If the CDX2 alone is very good, adding the optional XPS external supply (for an additional £2,300) produces a substantial and obvious improvement, with extra sparkle and separation that must put this combination very close to the top of the class. Individual instruments are better separated and defined, and the space around is larger and more believable. The CDX2 is an excellent CD player – not least because it can be upgraded so effectively. *Reviewed HFC 238*

ROKSAN TMS2 TURNTABLE

t was Roksan that broke the hegemony that the Linn Sondek LP12 held over the vinyl market with its first product, the Xerxes. The TMS, originally introduced as the flaghip 'signature' model, has developed over the years into this latest heavyweight, which stands comparison with virtually any turntable in the world.

What separates the TMS2 from the rest is that it presents genuine engineering solutions to the challenges posed by black vinyl replay. Unlike many of its competitors, Roksan has not opted for the obvious brute force approach, for example using the flywheel effect of a massive platter to dampen speed variations. Although based on the original TMS, which in turn was informed by the Xerxes, the TMS2 is radically different under the skin, sharing only the fundamental design of the main bearing (the construction of which has been improved significantly) and the platter. The multiple-section decoupled chassis has been comprehensively redesigned, and now offers much better environmental isolation. Mention should be made too of the flecked finish of the polymer composite chassis, which is a real head-turner.

e've heard a good selection of top-flight CD players in the last year but none of them have had the measure of this awesome Mark Levinson. The statute

A fundamental question facing anyone building a hi-fi system these days is deciding whether it's best to stick with two-channel stereo or to take the plunge into multichannel. The latter is essentially surround sound, using at least five speakers including a centre and rears, an idea first popularised in the realms of out-and-out home cinema but one that can now stake a legitimate claim in real hi-fi circles.

One of the main reasons for this is that multichannel amps are much better than they used to be. The best models have been specifically designed to work well in two-channel mode (with CDs and so on) as well as doing a good job with full-on multichannel, while the standard of digital processing modes has improved almost beyond recognition. A strong influence on all this has been DVD-Audio and SACD. The two new music formats may be struggling to gain a mainstream foothold, but their ability to deliver CD-beating high-bandwidth multichannel music has created a need for suitably high quality multichannel amplification, of both integrated and preamp/processor-plus-power amp varieties.

It should be remembered that hi-fi-quality multichannel sound doesn't come cheap (which is why the amp entry-point in this year's *HFC Awards* is £900 for the Harman Kardon AVR 550 on p35). You're buying several more channels of amplification for a start, not to mention at least five speakers instead of two. If you've got a given budget to play with it's simple maths – you're not going

to get the same level of quality per channel/speaker (though the advantages of multichannel may arguably outweigh this loss of quality). You're also going to have to pay for all that processing whether you want it or not, together with the cost of licensing incurred by the manufacturer and passed on to the consumer. And the sheer development and construction costs involved in getting something so complex to sound half decent are pretty immense. Mind you, the technology can have its purist upsides – for example, piping all your digital data (CD, DVD-A, SACD or whatever it may be) through a single link for universal conversion by high-quality DACs inside a multichannel amp is an elegant solution, now made possible by high bandwidth-capable connections like i.Link and Denon's proprietary Denon Link (see p37 and p38 for evidence).

Then there's the question of whether you really want to put good quality full-range speakers all around the room, and whether surround sound really suits your listening habits at all. Remember – most of the music you're going to be playing for the foreseeable future will have been created in two-channel stereo and presented in a stereo format, and even multichannel music discs and Dolby Digital/DTS DVD-Videos can be played back quite happily through two-channel systems. For many hi-fi fans, two-channel remains the optimal system for their needs, but don't dismiss multichannel out of hand because of some misguided purist ideal – if you cherry-pick the kit, as we do at *HFC*, the results can be startling. **HFC**

any Japanese audio brands have seemingly abandoned two-channel audio development in favour of home cinema. Rotel hasn't. Its recently introduced RA-1062 is one of the best new stereo integrated amps we've seen in a long time. Actually, technically it's not so new – it's the same basic circuit that was used in the successful RA-1060, but with extensive changes to around 60 passive components. Rated at 60 watts per channel (but delivering a healthy 95 watts into eight ohms and 145 watts into four ohms according to our measurements), the amplifier extends up to 100kHz, making it perfect for two-channel DVD-Audio or SACD replay alongside dedicated stereo sources like CD and vinyl. It even comes with an MM phono stage, a useful addition for 21st Century turntable enthusiasts.

This is an amplifier that is powerfully built, with large WBT-like speaker terminals around the back. That strength of build is reflected in the architectural quality of the sound, with music appearing solid and well constructed in front of the listener. Yet it's also detailed and thoroughly involving, with plenty of rhythmic, foot-tapping entertainment on hand when the music calls for it. Both bass and treble are notable, with plenty of bass depth and sweet high frequencies, while the overall performance ensures the listener is fully engaged, whatever the music. Usefully, Rotel has also included a 'contour' control, which permits bass and treble adjustment should a recording require it, but does so in a more elegant way than conventional tone controls.

This is a crisp, dynamic and expressive-sounding amplifier. Ally this to the excellent build quality and competitive price, and the RA-1062 will have the competition on edge. *Reviewed HFC 244*

or obvious reasons, the mid-price integrated amplifier market is hotly contested with plenty of fine-value products around. Even so, the PM7200's specification looks quite impressive, with over 100 watts on offer, plenty of inputs (including phono) and the unexpected option of switching between Class AB and Class A operation. Now, 100-watt Class A amps are necessarily pretty vast, so output is curtailed in this mode, but however one looks at it, having a choice of two amps for the price of only one seems pretty cool.

There's an irony here though, in that operation in Class AB is so good that Class A really adds relatively little. It's a good 25-watt Class A amp but technically and sonically it's an astonishing 105-watt Class AB one. It produces sounds of great refinement and precision, with some of the best-behaved bass you'll find for under a grand and very clean midrange and treble. It also manages the tricky business of keeping little details in place while bellowing forth the guts of some vast musical climax, so that, for instance, you can still hear the nuances of the solo guitar in some classic rock wall of sound, or the inner "It manages to keep little details in place while bellowing forth a vast musical climax." chorus parts of an operatic finale. or some years, Roksan's middle-market Caspian range has been a steady if unspectacular seller, backed by a fair degree of critical acclaim. But the time had clearly come for a revamp, which is what the new M Series products are all about.

The changes are modest on paper but turn out to be highly significant in practice. Power output is up 20 per cent to 85 watts per channel into eight ohms, rising to 120 watts into four, and the comprehensive, non-intrusive protection circuitry has also been improved. Unchanged is the complement of six inputs including a tape circuit, two preamplifier outputs and a power amplifier input, plus a repackaged remote control - the rather unsuitable iMac look of yore has gone. The overall appearance of the amplifier has been improved with a new self-indicating indented volume control and silver finish button tops. Internally the changes are more extensive, bringing the Caspian M closer in line with the Caspian preamplifier and monoblock power amplifiers. Mains filtering is now specified, and a number of improved passive components are used in critical areas.

On audition, the new amplifier is a very superior animal. With similar basic voicing to the old model, the Caspian M integrated amp has a new-found sureness of touch that is a clear step or three beyond its predecessor's capabilities. It sounds cleaner and more detailed, delivering a new transparency, along with greater punch. Timing is propulsive and complex rhythmic material is handled with an almost disdainful aplomb. The original was always an entertaining amplifier, but the new Caspian clearly provides a more involving and downright enjoyable listening experience, with a greater sense of authority, ultimately bringing the listener closer to the source. Those not used to the Caspian sound are in for a surprise, but it will be an extremely pleasant one. Reviewed HFC 248

PIONEER VSA-AX5i multichannel receiver

ioneer certainly stirred things up with the VSA-AX10 multichannel amp, which not only features an effective automated microphone-driven set-up, but which also premiered the use of the i.Link (aka FireWire or IEEE1394) digital interface to handle the full bandwidth multichannel output from a similarly equipped SACD and/or DVD-A player.

The problem of course is price. £3,000 is beyond the reach of many of us, and the VSA-AX5i was recently introduced to plug the gap. It retains a slightly simplified version of the same MCACC auto set-up regime, with plenty of grunt for most situations, and notably well-endowed surround sound processing with no significant missing algorithms.

But the i.Link feature is actually more useful in the AX5i. Not only are there two i.Link inputs rather than the one of

the senior model, the VSA-AX5i's D/A stage understands DSD data, the native SACD data format, which the VSA-AX10 doesn't. This means one less conversion to analogue (unless bass management is required) and a more transparent sound from SACD. Other associated benefits include full autoconfiguration to the disc type inserted, auto-recognition of the i.Link-equipped player, disc readout data and any CD/DVD Text replicated on the receiver's display, and a clock link fed back to the player to reduce jitter. The result? A much more vivid and transparent performance from almost any kind of disc. Even CD replay is transformed as the i.Link interface and strong D/A conversion in the receiver turns an unexceptional player into a classy transport. A great all-rounder, and great value. *Reviewed HFC 248*

few months back, this amp hit us like a bolt from the blue. We knew that Stroud-based AVI was capable of producing some impressive hi-fi electronics, amps included, not to mention a laudable range of speakers, but this diminutive little monster is something else entirely.

For a start, it has a ridiculously long name – the Laboratory Series Integrated Amplifier Type S21 MI, to give it its full moniker. But the amp itself is rather more compact, its halfwidth case adorned with bead-blasted aluminium controls that neatly update the traditional AVI schematic. Its looks are deceptive, however, for under the lid beats 200 watts of sophisticated musical adrenaline.

It's incredibly rare to hear such a small amp sound so big or exert such iron-fisted control over almost any speaker you care to throw at it. It delivers grip and drive in abundance, with an engagingly wide dynamic range and deep yet controlled bass. It helps make recorded music sound palpably big and physical, yet does so with considerable refinement and attention to fine detail – a mix of attributes that make you look twice at this remote-controllable amp's thoroughly realistic price tag. Denon was one of the first manufacturers to develop a proprietary encrypted digital interface capable of accepting full (native) bandwidth multichannel audio data from high-resolution,

Other highlights include THX Ultra2 (naturally), and a prodigiously powerful DSP engine for unwrapping Dolby and DTS processing, and for providing sophisticated bass management. Although principally

intended for multichannel use, the AVC-A1SR's music-playing performance will come as a revelation to those whose audio sensibilities warn them against complex, massively endowed amplifiers like this. The Denon performs musically even in its standard operating modes, thanks to unusually transparent D/A processing. There are few CD players that don't sound better by feeding a digital output instead of analogue, and allowing the amplifier to act as the D/A converter. But the Denon also has some extremely effective bypass options, including Pure Analogue Bypass. All of which makes the 7x170-watt AVC-A1SR a superb onestop shop for systems intended for stereo and multichannel audio as well as stereo high fidelity.

The amp's appeal is heightened even further when used with one of Denon's DVD-Audio players with a digital output. The icing on the cake is that Denon has included an upgrade path, with the ability to update firmware and even the key digital hardware if the occasion demands. *Reviewed HFC 232*

ntegrated amplifiers are comparatively new from Krell, and for Krell aficionados they seem almost like a concession. But one look inside the latest and greatest in the Krell integrated amplifier clan shows that it doesn't follow the usual rules – this is not just another integrated amplifier, even taking the asking price into account. Pop the lid and you'll see an amp that's been built with the precision of a Swiss watch, but also one which has absolutely no intention of merely marking time. The transformer is a massive 800VA toroid, feeding a circuit that employs Krell's proprietary CAST current mode topology, and which operates in true balanced mode from input through to output. Single-ended inputs (the KAV-400xi has both of course) are converted early in the circuit and processed as balanced.

Power output from the 24 bipolar output devices is 200 watts per channel, and remote control is provided. This is an elegant, slimline amplifier, fabricated from alloy pressings and extrusions, and styled similarly to the Showcase range. Looks are nothing short of stunning, and it's an amp that is clearly built to last.

Sound quality has the quintessentially Krell house sound, which is exactly what was intended. The KAV-400xi is blindingly quick and assured, with enormous power reserves into just about any loudspeaker load. More to the point, the amp has a typically Krell-like disdain for the load, performing consistently in every case, and irrespective of volume level. But at the end of the day, at everyday volume levels in moderately sized rooms, it is the Krell's small signal resolving power and window-like transparency that set it apart. rcam took a long time to commit to home cinema and multichannel audio, but has now done so with a vengeance, first with a range of DVD players and now with this amplifier combination, which will seed further developments in the not too distant future. With the AV8 THX Ultra2 processor and P7 7x150-watt power amp. which cost £3,000 and £2,500 respectively, Arcam has addressed the most mature high-end multichannel market in the world - the USA - where it competes on equal terms with talented opposition from the likes of EAD, Theta, Krell and others, at prices that come in below most of them.

Arcam's approach with the processor was to design a modular, upgradeable unit which won't be left behind by the fast-evolving multichannel market, and to use all its expertise to design a circuit that stands up to audiophile attention. This approach manifests itself in some surprising ways. The wide pitch between rear panel sockets means that almost any cable can be used, and a screened compartment can house a phono step-up which can feed a digital output for archiving purposes. The power amplifier is similar in conception and performance to Arcam's best FMJ amplification, and seven channels of will cover any foreseeable eventuality.

A great deal of thought has gone into the control options, which are key to the Arcam's credibility in a custom install environment. Similarly, the video switching is to broadcast standards, and is fully HDTV-compatible. The result of Arcam's efforts is a tour de force, a highly desirable and complete multichannel hi-fi and home cinema solution that will develop as the market itself develops in the years ahead. GAMUT D200 MkIII STEREO POWER AMPLIFIER

nce in a while a product comes along that is so stunning that it changes your perception of hi-fi. The original GamuT D200 was such a product and this year it was upgraded to Mk3 to tremendous effect.

This power amp has been refined and updated with changes in components and layout, a process of evolution not revolution. It continues to use a single pair of MOSFET transistors to produce a stiff 200 watts per side and operates continuously in Class A at lower levels.

This is an open, dynamic and extremely coherent amplifier which delivers a transparent and fluent sound that is very strong on presence. You are right there in the crowd while Led Zeppelin play *Going To California*, with the bass in particular driving the monster sound along in no uncertain fashion. Gamar D 200

The D200 Mk3 combines power, precision, dynamic subtlety and transparency in a way that is totally musical. You won't find a more capable powerhouse. *Reviewed HFC 247*

SUGDEN MASTERCLASS AA STEREO PRE/POWER AMPLIFIER

t takes a special blend of qualities to make the *HFC Awards* grade and this Yorkshire-born combo has them in spades. Priced at £2,300 and £3,300 respectively, this pre and power amp pairing operates largely in Class A, and delivers dynamic and tonal qualities to die for. Class A is why this is the biggest 50-watt power amp we've seen, and it needs an awesome amount of heatsinking to keep cool.

On the inside both amplifiers use gold-plated PCBs with silver-soldered connections and silver signal wires, balanced circuits, current feedback line stages, relay switching and low impedance power supplies.

This pairing is one of the most organic and dynamic transistor amplifiers you can buy – the similarities to good valve amps are uncanny. The strong biasing into class A is clearly a major factor here, though another reason might be the fullness of the bass. This could be where the earthiness comes from, as it adds a richness that makes instruments sound more real.


It has a remarkable ability to reveal the energy in music, opening up even the densest discs to tremendous effect. Not all recordings are equal, of course, and this is more noticeable than usual. Timing is also a strong point and if you listen to the way notes decay with these amps you'll wonder why more transistor designers can't do the same thing.

The Masterclass AA pairing combines the strengths of trannies and tubes in a way that is rarely encountered and is highly entertaining. *Reviewed HFC 246* "This pairing is one of the most organic and dynamic transistor amps you can buy – similarities to good valve amps are uncanny."

Turning electrical signals into sound waves, your speakers are the crucial final link in the chain between your music and your ears. But the question is, do you need two, five or even more to satisfy your lust for sensational sound?

CHOOSING YOUR SPEAKERS

Hi-fi people choose speakers based on two grounds. First, sound quality and second, size and appearance (though not necessarily in that order). It's obviously important that the speakers you choose will suit your home environment and all speakers big or small will have their sonic pros and cons. But remember that a loudspeaker exerts more tonal influence over your system's sound than any other component, and so it's vital that you get ones that suit your musical and sonic preferences if you want to enjoy your system to the full.

SPEAKERS

At *HFC* we don't forget the importance of aesthetics, but we recommend products to you based on their sonic ability – for that reason you won't find many sub/sat packages recommended within these pages, unless they're truly exceptional. We also utilise our rigorous lab testing facilities to give practical advice on amp partnering and room placement – key areas in ensuring whether a speaker is right for you. In very basic terms, big speakers don't tend to work well in small rooms, while most modern amps are powerful enough to drive most modern speakers without too many problems. But particular care is needed if a speaker offers an unusually tough load, or your amp is of, say, the low-powered valve variety.

Most hi-fi quality speakers are of the common 'dynamic driver' type, albeit with greatly varying driver size,

construction and configuration, but a few create sound differently. The most significant alternative in audiophile terms is the electrostatic panel loudspeaker. The best of these give an 'out of the box' sound that no dynamic driver design can match, though with drawbacks in terms of bass depth, drive and room/amp compatibility issues. The MartinLogan electrostatic hybrid on p48 is unusually accommodating for the breed, and hence fully deserves its place in the *HFC Awards*.

The speakers we recommend across the next few pages are stereo pairs ranging from £200 to £10,000. If you're looking for a multichannel set-up, our recommendation is simple: choose a good stereo pair first to act as your main left and right speakers - this is hugely important from a musical point of view. Also, remember that speakers that are great with music will also work well with film soundtracks, but not necessarily the other way round. Once that's done, simply choose your centre and surround speakers from the same range - most manufacturers offer compatible options in this regard, and it's important that the centre unit in particular is a tonal match for the main left and right speakers. Most of the speakers we're recommending here will perform equally well in a multichannel configuration, and that way you can create a system that's every bit as good with your music as it is with your movies. annoy's standmount Sensys DC1 delivers a stunningly high-class sound by combining the very latest dual-concentric main driver technology with a top-mounted super-tweeter. These are mounted in and on a chunky, hunky, tough little box finished in a bland but quite acceptable vinyl woodprint, which keeps the price to an ultra-competitive £450 per pair.

The DC driver has a 175mm frame and fires a horn-loaded tweeter out through the centre of the bass/mid driver cone. The super-tweeter is built into a substantial cast housing, and comes in above a nominal 16kHz. And there's a unique five-terminal connection block, allowing the main driver chassis to be earthed to the amplifier. The 15mm MDF box has additional bracing, and the sort of shape and dimensions which should work very well acoustically.

Bass alignment works best with the ports open and the speakers quite close to a wall. Furthermore, wall proximity doesn't seem to create unwanted midrange colorations. Sonically this is a very impressive performer indeed – beautifully balanced and voiced, and reasonably smooth too for such an inexpensive model, though the high-ish volume control settings on test point towards its fairly modest sensitivity.

It's notably free from boxy effects, showing impressive stereo focus with natural perspectives that serves classical material very well indeed, and reproduces live acoustic recordings like Christy Moore's *Live At The Point* with great atmosphere and delicacy, and notably convincing applause.

The bottom end is lively and agile, reaching down pretty well into the deep bass, yet more importantly staying crisp and clean throughout the mid and upper bass. The upshot is that the Sensys DC1 provides an audiophile performance at an affordable price. *Reviewed HFC 245*

EPOS ELS3 LOUDSPEAKER

G ood budget speakers aren't rare but truly remarkable ones are, which makes this little Epos all the more welcome and precious. Its diminutive nature makes it a convenient choice for surround or stereo duties, especially since the 25mm tweeter and 130mm woofer are fully shielded so that they don't upset your telly.

A two-way reflex design, it uses a 100mm polymer cone for mid and bass duties and hands the higher frequencies over to a 25mm metal dome. Sensitivity or ease of load is inevitably a bit tougher than average (87dB, four ohms) but a decent integrated or multichannel amp won't have a problem.

This is a stonking standmount that does far more than you'd expect at the price. It creates scale and depth of image with ease, so the music is wide and deep with instruments sounding more real as a result. It's also unusually transparent and coherent – you can hear right into the mix and the way the music is delivered is fluent and clean.

It even has useful bass capabilities, which while unlikely to shake the furniture will be more than enough to annoy the neighbours, tracks like Goldrapp's *Brown Paper Bag* coming across in dynamic, deep and surprisingly tactile form.

Fast, accurate timing is a major key to how the ELS3 manages to make music so inviting, despite its diminutive form. Few speakers at this price level come close to sounding as clean and convincing as the Epos. *Reviewed HFC 241*

PMC DB1 LOUDSPEAKER

t might be unbelievably tiny, but this DB1 (Dinky Box One!) is still a totally serious and extremely capable speaker. It's utterly seductive sonically, in the way it drags you into the music, yet it's an almost invisible presence in the listening room. If small is indeed beautiful – and for many that certainly applies where speakers are concerned – the DB1 should earn itself plenty of fans.

It's hard to believe that such a compact (29cm high) enclosure can incorporate a four-fold transmission line with a 1.5m effective length, but that feature helps explain why it costs a substantial £555 (in oak or cherry, ten per cent more for walnut or black). The other ingredients – two high-class drive units, a complex crossover and a wood veneered enclosure – are all of the highest quality too, while the internal partitions ensure a highly rigid box. It's equally difficult to believe that something so small can sound so big, lively, and capable. A little more weight and authority might be appreciated, especially on heavier rock and dance material, but if the bass is quantitatively close to the margin, it was also qualitatively exceptional – clean, agile and invariably informative and communicative.

The broad midband is smooth and even, with a lovely warmth, coherence and overall neutrality. Siting is tricky, since the midband and imaging are better with the speakers clear of walls, while the bass benefits from wall reinforcement. One might assume the DB1 is primarily destined for surround channel duties, but don't underestimate its capabilities as a main stereo pair, particularly if you're after an expressive speaker for a small to medium-size room. *Reviewed HFC 240*

CASTLE CONWAY 3 LOUDSPEAKER

Conway 3 is a totally beguiling and seductive package. It sits snugly quite low to the ground, is beautifully finished in a wide choice of real-wood veneers, and is realistically priced at £930. But above all it delivers a beautifully lively and well-balanced sound that will always make your music inviting and entertaining.

It's a relatively conventional two-way, with two bass/mid drive units mounted above and below the tweeter in a d'Appolito configuration, port-loaded through the base. Build is very solid, with a tasty rich red mahogany veneer, and a plinth usefully extends the stability footprint. The main drivers have cast alloy frames and 115mm woven carbonfibre matrix cones, while the offset tweeter has a 28mm soft fabric dome.

The overall tonal balance is about as

good as it gets, just slightly laid back with a beautifully judged treble end, alongside fine focus and coherence. The only criticisms are a slight lack of deep bass weight and extreme topend sparkle and 'air'. The solid enclosure probably contributes towards a notably wide dynamic range, and dynamics themselves come through with considerable verve and enthusiasm, ensuring fine expression of musical intent.

One might perhaps criticise the speaker for some lack of image height, but in all other respects the stereo soundstages are very well formed, with good depth and accurate perspectives whatever music you play. Above all, though, this speaker sucks you into the music in such a way that will ensure you and your system will enjoy plenty of use. *Reviewed HFC 237* "Dynamics come through with considerable verve and enthusiasm, ensuring fine expression of musical intent."

FOCAL-JMLAB COBALT 816 SIGNATURE S LOUDSPEAKER

brilliantly successful under-theskin makeover has transformed JMlab's original Cobalt 816 – itself a very capable design, commended in last year's *HFC Awards* – into one of 2003's star performers, with a splendidly lively and open character that fully addresses our (minor) criticisms of the original.

The 'Signature S' Cobalt 816 has much in common with its predecessor. It's a 'two-and-a-half-way' design, using two 165mm 'W-sandwich' cone drivers, and a Tioxid 5 inverted titanium dome tweeter. Contemporary styling combines 'red cherry' sides, metallic-look front and top and a perforated metal grille. Tough 8mm spikes give firm support – but without the stability of a separate plinth.

While the original version was a doughty performer, this upgrade undoubtedly represents a significant improvement, avoiding the rather 'shut in' and 'pinched' voice band of the earlier model. As a result, diction is much clearer and lyrics more intelligible, especially at low levels. Indeed, if anything, the Signature S has a slight tendency to over-project detail in the presence band.

It's a real class act sonically, delivering a rare combination of open neutrality alongside ample bass drive and weight and realistic dynamic expression. The *Live* Alison Krauss + Union Station album came across with all the verve, intimacy and dynamic tension that is the *raison d'être* of a top quality live recording.

While it might not go as loud as a three-way, this speaker's greater simplicity is reflected in its fine overall coherence, and that in turn accounts for its excellent communication skills. *Reviewed HFC 242*

dvanced drive unit technology from the biggest speaker specialist around is the basic reason why B&W's new 703 sets an enviable standard for £2,000 three-ways, delivering a magnificently wide dynamic range that provides superb rendition of subtle low-level detail. This floorstander has an extremely classy real-wood veneer covering all faces, and notably clean lines. The front and top are formed from a single piece, ensuring great structural stiffness, and the enclosure is subtly tapered front to rear, to avoid parallel surfaces.

The high-class drivers include a version of B&W's radical 'surroundless' FST midrange driver, with 140mm woven Kevlar cone. There are two 'balanced drive' bass drivers, each with 120mm paper cones, plus a 25mm alloy dome tweeter, which is tube-loaded and mounted externally through the top surface of the cabinet.

The 703 can sound a little bright and edgy at first, but any harshness is pretty much mollified after a few days. Once properly in the groove, it displays some delightful musical characteristics, with an overall performance well ahead of the chasing pack.

The strong top end can occasionally prove a trial if playing bright and edgy recordings loud – but it also adds some welcome extra low-level clarity. And that FST midrange reproduces voices with great clarity and expression, and a notably wide dynamic window. Overall it's highly engaging mix, capturing both the essence of musical spirit and its finer detail, with imaging that's beautifully spacious and free from boxiness.

The bass is arguably even better – dry, clean, deep, even, and very, very agile. Check first that the brightness balance suits your personal taste and system. If it does, you'll find a wonderfully analytical and entertaining speaker, with an exceptionally wide dynamic range. *Reviewed HFC 248*

he Clarity is a new kind of MartinLogan, one aimed at those who cannot afford, or for that matter perhaps even accommodate, a traditional electrostatic panel. Specifically, it deploys some innovative ideas to free the user from the tyranny of the listening hot spot. Other MartinLogans have addressed this problem with a curved diaphragm, which gives about 30 degrees lateral coverage, but stand up and the treble disappears precipitously as the panels act as line sources on this axis.

The principal novelty is a (switchable) verticallyoriented moving coil tweeter which is essentially inaudible when heard from in front as its prime axis is vertical, and whose effect becomes more obvious at angles that cause the panel's normally impressive treble output to disappear. Some may regard using a dome tweeter as a sell-out, but MartinLogan has used them before, for example in its centre speakers, and it merely underlines the pragmatic approach of the designer who has simply used the best tool for the job in hand. Other significant changes to the Clarity include a newly revised panel coating and new fabrication techniques, which are soon to be rolled out across the whole range. The results are said to be more consistent, and less affected by atmospheric conditions.

The Clarity is ostensibly intended as a home cinema speaker. Well perhaps, but in practice it is a very good speaker, full stop. It is not perhaps a first choice for full-blooded rock at elevated volumes, but it is a sweet, detailed speaker of considerable (but not excessive) warmth. It is well integrated despite the promiscuous mix of technologies, and it really struts its stuff with acoustic material in particular. Reviewed HFC 245



SONUS FABER CREMONA AUDITOR LOUDSPEAKER

f the tall floorstanding Sonus Faber Cremona is too big or too expensive, the smaller standmounted Cremona Auditor has all the looks and is even more flexible, for a fraction of the price of its bigger brother. Sonus Faber has a commanding reputation as the Armani of speaker builders, and the drop-dead gorgeous Cremona Auditor, on its slightly swept-back stands and with its lute-string-style speaker grilles, only reinforces the perception of Italian style.

This two-way, rear-ported standmount speaker is claimed to have an 88dB sensitivity and a fourohm nominal impedance, with an effective frequency response from 48Hz-40kHz. A well-endowed amp is required to drive a pair correctly and it needs to be carefully positioned away from walls, but if correctly set up it

returns a performance that is every bit as gorgeous as its looks.

It produces a crisp, clean and dynamic sound with stacks of treble detail and surprisingly deep bass for such a box of its size. The speakers themselves 'disappear' sonically, leaving a deep and wide holographic soundstage, with even a good degree of height information. But the Cremona Auditor is not one of those polite audiophile loudspeakers that lacks any form of heft when you move from pretty Mozart string quartets to flat-out guitar-driven rock. It's punchy, yet refined enough to cope with any form of musical genre.

Speakers that look good and sound good are rare – those that combine these traits while remaining smaller than the average fridge are rarer still. That's what makes the Cremona Auditor so special. *Reviewed HFC 246*

NEAT ULTIMATUM MFS LOUDSPEAKER

ne of the heftiest and most complex compacts around, this exceptionally elegant speaker is proof positive that very good things indeed can come in compact packages. It's a splendid example of combining the best sonic qualities of the standmount with the weight and scale typical of large floorstanders, thanks to its isobaric loading and five-driver line-up.

Neat's Ultimatum MFS is expensive, but very well equipped. Besides the five drivers – four visible, and an extra one hidden inside – classy real-wood veneers decorate the sides and back of an incredibly solid birch-ply enclosure. The 45mm-thick front and top panels use a 'sandwich' construction with a polyethylene membrane 'filling'.

This is actually at heart a two-way loudspeaker, the front panel housing

Neat's familiar 165mm main driver and a top-class Focal tweeter. The top surface meanwhile has a pair of EMIT-type super-tweeters, while a second bass driver inside provides the isobaric loading.

It seems slightly outrageous that a speaker this small should sound so inordinately large. Its superbly wide dynamic range and complete freedom from unwanted 'box' effects brings uncommon clarity to low frequencies.

With the MFS you get to hear the drive units, but not the enclosure – or for that matter the crossover network. There's a communication directness here that is totally convincing, thoroughly seductive and also ruthlessly revealing.

Few speakers can distinguish better between the various sources, or show up differences between rival components, and therefore few more

he high-end standmount market is turning into a technical *tour de force* and this year's obvious winner is the clear leader in the field. Beryllium (Be) is a dream material for high frequency domes, but it is so difficult to use that this is the least expensive speaker in the world with a pure beryllium tweeter. It is technically and sonically spectacular with a five-octave flat response, making it well suited to the 'wideband' formats – DVD-Audio and SACD.

The 'W' cone bass/mid driver is a sandwich of woven glass tissues on a foam core, the combination offering superior stiffness and damping, while drive is supplied by a Power Flower magnet which has a petal-shaped multi-ferrite 'motor'.

This speaker's strength lies in phenomenal transparency coupled with an absence of perceived distortion. There are recordings which make them sound grubby and others that make them sound crystal clear, but it soon becomes apparent that all the Micros are doing is revealing the quality of the signal. The majority of speakers sound positively crude by comparison.

Imaging is first class, and contrasts between recordings are often blinding. Tonal resolution is also extremely fine – pianos for instance sound much more real than usual

despite the ultimate bass limitation. It's as if the extra transparency and extension at HF makes up for the curtailment down below. Track after track reveals subtleties of harmonic detail that simply aren't there with the alternatives. Quite simply, the Micro Utopia Be is one of the finest compact loudspeakers in the world. *Reviewed HFC 245*

LIVING VOICE AVATAR OBX-R2 LOUDSPEAKER

n what has been a very good year for loudspeakers, Living Voice's reworking of its Avatar OBX-R has kept this cracking box right up there in the premier league of top quality air shifters. It retains the distinctive outboard crossover, but this contains a redesigned network with both the cabinet and internal wiring having been upgraded.

The Avatar is an elegant and compact floorstanding design, its beautiful real-wood veneer contrasting with twin doped paper bass/mid units flanking a silk dome tweeter. The bass/mid units may not look particularly fancy but then they were not selected for their aesthetics – this is the best 165mm driver that Living Voice says it can get. Equally classy is the Revelator tweeter, a highly respected high-end design.

This is a phenomenally dynamic

loudspeaker - it can reproduce the energy, vitality and life in music in a way that is so tonally natural that you can't help but be swept away. Not only do trumpets, guitars, voices, you name it, have more life, but the way they are played is always clear. The sound is also more substantial and three-dimensional than many alternatives - you can always hear the space in recordings. The bass is not only deep, it is elastic and fluid to boot, with rich tone and real texture. Low-level detail is always well defined and denser passages untangle themselves so that you can hear precisely what's going on.

The Avatar OBX-R2 is a musical communicator of real talent, its transparency conveying the message in an effortless and engrossing fashion. BANG & OLUFSEN BEOLAB 5 LOUDSPEAKER

The 'intelligent loudspeaker', this striking looking model is simply the most radical, innovative and complex design ever, incorporating several thousand watts of amplification plus some very clever digital signal processing. The result is a speaker that automatically aligns itself to the particular room it's in.

A four-way floorstander, the striking conical shape allows an enormous 380mm bass driver to be mounted in the base, pointing downwards. The two horizontal silver discs mount the 78mm fabric-dome midrange and 18mm tweeter, both firing upwards onto elliptical acoustic 'lenses' that ensure a consistent performance irrespective of siting.

First impression, under truly 'blind' conditions, was of this speaker's exceptionally precise and detailed stereo perspectives, and even-handed neutrality. The 'lens' system does indeed work 'as advertised', and seems to have no obvious downsides.

Coloration is exceptionally low throughout the audio band, but its cleverest trick is the way it seems to 'disappear', acoustically speaking. One simply isn't aware of the location of the speakers – only of the precisely detailed and well-focused soundstage, with all the instruments and voices of a recording portrayed with unusually natural positioning and proportions.

Loudness capabilities are prodigious and the bass alignment is about as good as it gets, imparting magnificent weight and power whenever the material requires, while neatly avoiding mid-bass thickening. Most significantly, this excellence should be consistently realised irrespective of the room in which the Beolab 5 is used – B&O has truly struck gold. *Reviewed HFC 244* "Bass alignment is just about as good as it gets, imparting magnificent weight and power when required,"

Accessories? Essentials more like. As any hi-fi aficionado knows, to optimise your system, choosing your source, amp and speakers is only the beginning...

ACCESSORIES MAKETH THE SYSTEM

Strictly speaking, there's only one hi-fi accessory that's absolutely essential – a set of speaker cables to run between your amp and speakers. (That said, wireless multi-room systems are now beginning to appear, but that's another story...) The only systems that tend to come with speaker cables are pre-packaged jobs of the mini/micro variety, so if you're buying separates you have to choose a set. That's actually no bad thing, as they can have a pretty profound effect on the overall sonic picture. The same goes for interconnect cables, which are commonly used to hook source components to amplifiers, though some lower-end components come with free ones in the box. Don't use these – even a modest set of specialist cables will have a marked effect on performance, and that goes for both digital and analogue connections.

Picking cables can be bewildering, but it's an important task because cables are the only conduits through which delicate signals travel between components. Choose poorly and your system will never perform at its best, no matter how carefully you've chosen the rest of your kit. Our reviews will tell you the strengths and weaknesses of individual models, and what sort of gear they're likely to work best with. All the cables in the *HFC Awards* come highly recommended of course, but the best way to find out what works well with your system is to listen, preferably with a home trial. In terms of budget, spend as much as you can afford but consider at least 15 per cent of your total system budget as a starting point. And remember – fatter doesn't necessarily mean better! Any decent hi-fi system also needs proper support. Standmount speakers will only perform at their best on a suitable pair of stands, while all types of equipment (particularly turntables) will benefit from a specialist rack. The purpose of a hi-fi support is to isolate, though some do this better than others. Some contribute their own effect to the sound, which may or may not appeal, but those we recommend highest are always those that

contribute least, letting your system do the talking. Beyond that, your choice of accessories will depend on what you want from your system. High-quality turntables will benefit from a well-chosen off-board phono stage, not to mention a good arm and cartridge, while headphone users will find a dedicated headphone amp will reap big sonic benefits. Mains cables and conditioners may prove highly effective too, particularly in a world where myriad appliances jostle for house space with your hi-fi and the electricity supply is increasingly polluted. And if you want to complement your hi-fi with a table radio or portable music device, or simply see what a good subwoofer can do to your system's sound, we'll tell you the best you can buy. 



CHAPTER AND VERSE

Specialist British hi-fi firm Chapter has fused technologies to create a high-end tour de force

C hapter may not be a familiar name yet but its directors have both served time with Chord Electronics and so know a thing or two about serious audio technology. Founded in 1999, the company started out with a power amp that looked exactly like the new II+ model under scrutiny here, yet featured more traditional analogue technology throughout. That amp was followed by the Preface preamp and now we have the very latest incarnation of the II, complete with a Class D 'digital' output stage.

The thinking behind this change in approach is revealed in our interview with the designer over the page, and the result is a manageable (that is, not physically backbreaking) 300-watt stereo power amp with the sort of heat sinking more associated with fully analogue designs. The weight aspect has been achieved by using a switch-mode power supply, and its cool running comes courtesy of the highefficiency Class D factor. Yet this is not an entirely 'digital' amplifier – it's a hybrid of digital and analogue technology. All the initial gain stages are analogue, while the class D section forms the final output stage.

One big problem with switch-mode power supplies is that the high-frequency switching can have a negative effect on their performance. Chapter has got around this by sharply rolling off the amp's response above 35kHz at 24dB/octave, so that by the point at which the switching is active (100kHz) there is effectively no amplification going on. The Preface preamp is no less an example of leading edge design. Parts selection is distinctly sophisticated with Burr Brown and Linear Technology op-amps, ultra-low ESR Panasonic Gold electrolytic capacitors and Linear Technology regulators keeping things clean and clear. The two mains transformers are custom made and the PCB is a full immersion gold type, incorporating surfacemount precision resistors.

Another notable variation from the norm is the inclusion of a custom-designed volume pot which uses a series of precision resistors and relays. You change level with a remote or the infinitely rotating knob which is acceleration-sensitive. Turn it slowly and volume steps are reduced to 0.1dB, but spin it with enthusiasm and you can have the sort of change rate associated with logarithmic devices. This takes a bit of getting used to but it's rare to have this degree of finesse in a remote-controllable pot. Unfortunately, the outputs. Those of us with only single-ended (SE) outputs can pick from a various unrelated input names like 'Sat', 'DVD' and 'Video'. But once you've plugged your CD player into the 'Sat' input you can go back to the front of the unit and redefine or map the name of that input to 'CD SE' or even the name of your turntable, 'SME 20' for instance. Another useful feature is the ability to change the gain of inputs or even set one at OdB, the latter being a bypass option whereby the Preface and II+ can sit between the main L/R channels and a processor in a multichannel AV system.

SOUND QUALITY

First impressions with the II+ are not necessarily the ones to go with. The loss of harmonic detail and the accentuation of compression compared to our reference Gamut D200 are dramatic, yet there is a spark to the Chapter's sound that encourages patience and in time it wins you over – in fact

remote control isn't pressure-sensitive and at higher levels (above -50dB – this is one of those 'the lower the number, the higher the output' designs) it takes a while to make a big change in effective volume.

The fascia has only the amp's name inscribed upon it – all the relevant information for the end user is to be found on the small dot matrix display. This will let you adjust a number of parameters: the usual ones, such as volume, input selection and balance, and some unusual ones like balanced or single-ended output, phase inversion and 'sleep

mode' which shuts down the display and its micro controller at pre-set times (choose between five and 60 seconds).

The selection of in and outputs on the back panel includes more balanced XLRs than is usual, with both the most popular named inputs available in this way alone. This means that the inputs named 'CD' and 'phono' can only be accessed if your CD player or phono stage have balanced it makes you hungry for more. So stark is the reduction in harmonics, however, that you have to ask the question – if this amp is right then are all other amps wrong? Are they subtly adding to the signal so that each note carries a tail of euphonic coloration, so realistic that it sounds like genuine harmonic detail or reverb? It seems unlikely, but when you remember that harmonic distortion is the technical bane of valve amps, the kings of tone colour, it might make sense that even small amounts of the stuff in many modern transistor amps has the same effect.

Whatever the Chapter amps are doing, or not doing, the end result is convincing. After a while it becomes clear that you can actually hear more of the fundamentals – little things like the low-level vocal samples on Fila Brazillia tracks make sense for a change. It comes down to two important hi-fi goals, timing and level resolution, and both seem unusually accurate here. Whatever you play – be it Chopin nocturnes or the high-speed excursions of Cornelius – the speed is spot on, and the timing gives the music a convincing ebb and flow. We played several albums that are not usually engaging and found them strangely







captivating. Anouar Brahem's *Barzakh*, for instance, often seems to lack variety, but through the Chapter combo we were drawn in and engaged by the playing and the emotion behind it. With a good ECM label recording like this you also get plenty of harmonic detail and reverb – these amps are not dry. On a less subtle tip, Marshall Mathers' pace is picked up perfectly, capturing the edge in his delivery that is so elusive. Even the small bells on *Kill You* ring out with individuality and colour.

The level resolution is most obvious when playing a variety of albums. Several can be compressed and lacking in level variation and



thus sound a bit lacklustre, yet when a wideband one comes along you know all about it – this often being the point when you wish the remote would change volume more swiftly!

AC/DC's Back In Black is disappointingly (though unsurprisingly) compressed and lacking in genuine energy while Richard Thompson's Old Kit Bag is full life and expands into the room. Any component that shows up big differences between recordings is a pretty transparent one so long as it's not merely emphasising a particular frequency, as can be the case with loudspeakers. And the Chapters are nothing if not neutral – you are



not drawn to any particular aspect of the tonal range, while the bass is clearly powerful and controlled but doesn't have the sort of signature associated with high power amps. The treble is clear and if anything slightly unusual but you soon get used to it – from then on it blends seamlessly into the bigger picture while helping to resolve fine detail.

Transparency is also unusually high albeit in a natural, relaxed way. Some electronics emphasise the treble slightly to achieve this but the Chapters merely let more of the music through, revealing details and sounds that are usually masked or lacking in distinction.

[Review] Chapter Preface preamplifier and II+ power amplifier



We talked to Chapter's Technical Director Duncan Shrimpton about what makes an analogue/digital hybrid amplifier tick.



HFC: With the Chapter II+ you have gone for a 'digital' Class D design rather than a fully analogue one. Why the big change in approach?

DS: The II+ is actually a fully analogue amplifier. The Class D topology uses an analogue hysteresis controller with a switching output stage, but it's still an analogue control loop and there is no clock. We chose Class D while reviewing designs for our forthcoming five-channel power amplifier. We needed a solution that was efficient in terms of both heat dissipation and space, hence the Class D. We discovered that if you could remove the switching component from the output of the Class D amplifier, the performance benefits of having no crossover distortion were phenomenal.

What type of digital amplifier are you using?

Our Class D design uses a fully balanced topology from input to output. RCA inputs are converted to balanced signals at the input. We use both voltage and current mode feedback to control the high-power PWM output stage with a second order output filter contained within the current feedback loop.


The Preface is a wide bandwidth preamp whereas the II+ has a curtailed response. Why?

With CD and SACD there is a lot of out-of-band noise, mostly aliased copies of the signal. In the case of SACD, this noise is very high (-20dB at 60kHz). This noise will fold down in frequency and become audible if the amplifier distortion is high above 20kHz. The preamplifier could filter out this noise, however, if each stage filters the signal then the cumulative effect introduces large amounts of phase distortion. So the Preface uses a very wide-band, low-distortion amplifier (-90dB at 5MHz) and carefully controls the gain in each section so that there is virtually no output by the time the distortion starts to rise.

It is not possible to design a power amp in this way. So we use a fourth order linear phase filter with a roll-off point of 35kHz to remove unwanted noise signals prior to amplification. The only thing that you get out of the Chapter II+ is the audio band you put in.



□ They also get the message across in no uncertain terms. Put on Aarvo Pärt's *Tabula Rasa* for instance and you can't fail to hear the intensity of emotion and the power behind the composition. If music is about bringing us closer to the soul of the artist then these amps are a powerful conduit.

Alternatively, you can be a little more scientific and listen to the differences in recording – few amplifiers reveal the sort of breadth that the Chapters do. Which is a good sign, albeit one that might rearrange the pecking order in your favourite albums list. Some won't sound as good as others but the greats will really shine, and whatever you hear it's unlikely to have come from the Chapter amps – they cover their tracks far too well. **HFC** Jason Kennedy



UNIVERSAL FOR LESS

Denon's top-end universal players are among the best yet – but do you really have to pay for quality?

W niversal players are still far from commonplace, but it's now possible to pick up a good machine that can do DVD-Audio and SACD (as well as DVD-Video and CD) for not much cash these days. Denon's new DVD-1400 is the company's entry-level player, yet at £400 it costs twice as much as the cheapest universal player currently available (Pioneer's DV-565A, commonly priced around £250 but available for as little as £180 in Richer Sounds). So why spend £400?

The DVD-1400 is a typically small, classy machine (now in silver or black – Denon's 'champagne gold' is a bit too 1990s these days), slightly taller than most cheaper players, but not too deep and quite straightforward in use. The front panel has less than a dozen buttons all of a decent size that effectively replicate most of the remote control functions well – there are also a trio of lights on the display to show when you are playing DVD-A or SACD (or have the 'pure direct' button engaged). The blue display panel below the centre-mounted disc drawer contains scant information and is limited in use.

Its rear panel is equally functional and nondescript. With a single Scart and a trio of component video sockets (without progressive scan support), this looks like the back of almost any 5.1-equipped DVD player of the last two years or so and it's only under the covers where the obvious SACD/DVD-Audio part is entailed. There, a screened can covers the circuitry surrounding the 5.1 decoder, doubtless to prevent pirates thieving away the digital data stream of SACD or DVD-Audio before it reaches the analogue outputs.

But while it may not scream 'universal player', the DVD-1400 isn't entirely nondescript aesthetically and has a few touches that set it apart. One of the most important is the Pure Direct button, which effectively disables the display (both on-screen and on the front panel). This has a noticeable effect in raising the sound quality of DVD-Audio and especially SACD, but is not bad at improving CD sound a notch in the process, too.

Another clever feature is the on-screen

set-up routine, which features a helpful picture of the remote control on the left-hand side. This tells you what button to press and when, making set-up virtually idiot-proof.

On the audio side the Denon lacks for nothing at the price. If money were no object, the lack of i.Link might be a stumbling block, but that digital connection is not yet an issue at £400. Video, however, is less well covered. By the end of the year, precious few players at the price will be supplied without progressive scan as an option. The DVD-1400 is one of the few exceptions. While this important extra is less applicable for those without the latest screens or projection systems, needed or not, it's nevertheless become something of a 'must have' video feature on DVD players these days.

SOUND AND VIDEO QUALITY

In a way, the DVD-1400 hides its light under a big bushel – Denon's own superb DVD-2900. Despite costing twice as much as the '1400, the '2900 is the model that's been getting the attention. But our advice is not to overlook this little stunner – it may not have the throw-it-down-a-liftshaft-just-to-watch-it-bounce build







quality of its bigger brother but it delivers much of the performance where it counts, and that includes the music stakes.

CD audio is a perennial problem for multiformat DVD players. Conflicts with video aside, sometimes it's as if the audio DACs inside are so geared up for replaying the more advanced digital data of SACD or DVD-Audio that they treat CD with disdain, losing the sort of cohesive, temporally correct sound a well sorted CD player can do brilliantly. The DVD-2900 was one of the few exceptions, and guess what? Its little brother is similarly well sorted in the CD stakes. Stick *Somethin' Else* by Cannonball Adderley on the tray, turn off the display and you find yourself tapping your foot along with the be-bop beat.

Moving over to DVD-Audio, the performance is just as precise and up-beat as the CD sound. Even diving through the back catalogue with old classics like Fragile by Yes highlighted the focus of the Denon player, the vocals standing out effectively from the rather dense mix. More modern recordings like Riding With The King by BB King and Eric Clapton or the majestic St Matthew Passion by Nikolaus Harnoncourt really come to life, the Denon managing to combine weight without boom, frequency extension without brightness and very fine channel separation and articulation throughout. It isn't going to make you ditch a more up-market player but its gutsy yet focused sound from DVD-A is highly enjoyable, like the DVD-2900 in miniature.

DVD-Video performance is about average for a middle-market player. The lack of progressive scan will hobble it for the videophile's plasma

screen or projector, and the picture is more relaxed and a little more grainy than some. Fortunately, it's colourful enough to make that graininess seem less noticeable. Although it attempts to replicate the picture performance of the bigger Denons, it's clear this is a player where the lion's share of the development budget has been spent on universal sound.

SACD is perhaps the weakest sonic link here, though not weak enough to receive the Anne Robinson treatment. The sound is dynamic and powerful but lacks the sheer clarity, integrity and precision of a dedicated SACD-only player or the meaty energy of the DVD-2900. The reissued *Blonde On Blonde* by Dylan is perhaps an odd choice for 'surroundificaton' but it worked well through the Denon, with plenty of earthy detail, though more audiophile recordings like the John Pizzarelli Trio playing *Live At Birdland* lacked the high-ambience, sharply defined audiophile credentials of a good dedicated SACD player.

Yes, it's possible to get a dedicated SACD player for similar money that will do a better job at playing SACDs. You can find singleformat CD players at the price that are better still at CD replay, and for the same money you can get a DVD player with extra video trimmings like progressive scan. But if you want to play all these discs, and audio quality is a key concern, you won't find a better onebox solution anywhere near the price. Equally, if you're willing to raise the stakes by buying several more specialised players it'll cost you a good deal more to achieve a notable gain.

The only comparably-priced universal playback competition comes from the Pioneer

namechecked at the start of this review. And the two offer different strokes for different folks. The Pioneer's performance is more geared toward the 'V' in 'AV' – it has a vibrant picture and an expressive sound that draws you into DVD-Videos. But Denon has the edge in sound quality, with a more balanced and musical performance from its analogue outputs, and that statement is a pretty good summation of the brands' more costly universal players too.

We began by asking "why pay more?" but the Denon DVD-1400 is so good at its musical tasks that it invites the question "why pay less?" instead. You can buy cheaper, but if you want good sound – especially from CD – you should spend that bit extra and invest in this hidden gem from the Denon catalogue. **HFC** *Alan Sircom*



Cambridge Audio's new range is very pretty but don't let that fool you, it means business



Since Cambridge Audio was taken under Audio Partnership's wing it has become a lean, aggressive brand that has a strong position in the budget market place. This is not hindered by the fact that in the UK it's sold exclusively by the most aggressive 'affordable' separates retail chain, Richer Sounds. But it doesn't rest on its laurels for long, hence the introduction of the shiny new silver Azur range. Azur contains two integrated amps, two CD players, a DAB/FM tuner and a progressive scan DVD-A player. With prices no greater than £250 for any one piece this range could slaughter the budget competition if it sounds half as good as it looks.

It's a brave company that launches a dedicated CD player in any market these days and a positively brash one that is prepared to take on a sector where DVD players are making mincemeat of the alternatives. But as anyone that cares to listen will hear it takes a stunning DVD player to beat a good dedicated CDP at its own game.

The 640C is the top Azur CD player and differentiates itself from the £200 540C with a higher-specification DAC. This component alone helps improve all the important technical measurements according to the literature. The 640C contains a 24-bit/192kHz Wolfson DAC, a Sony transport mechanism and re-clocking circuitry to keep jitter under control, and houses them in a low resonance matt silver case. It is supplied with a slimline system remote which, thanks to its aluminium fascia, is very much more attractive than those found with many CD players. Unfortunately, both remote and player share stylish but rather subtle legends, and these are printed in words rather than being represented by symbols, which makes finding the right one a little slow to begin with, especially on the player itself where the white on silver is hard to read.

As far as connections go there are no surprises – analogue and digital (optical and coaxial) outputs sit beside an IEC mains socket.

SOUND QUALITY


This is an impressively relaxed and coherent player yet it's not bland or obviously restrained. In the revealing hands of a far from budget system it delivers a sterling performance that only begins to reveal its limitations when the going gets very tough. In the context of its partnering amplifier (reviewed next month) it is certainly the stronger of the two, extracting more music than the amp is capable of making the most of. It's not a bad amplifier, it's just that amp components are inherently more expensive than those found in CD players.

The 640C produces a smooth, coherent result with all manner of material from EST's jazz grooves to the deep voices of the Overtone Choir, a recording which reveals the subtlety of bass resolution on offer. It could be more 'bone crunching' at the extreme end of the range but has more colour and variety than ostensibly heavier sounding players.

It readily makes the most of dynamic tension within the music, relaying Missy Elliott's rhythmically elastic grooves with a life and energy that budget players rarely reveal. There's a depth to the texture of instruments and voices, and scarcely any sense of strain you have to really push the Azur components hard before limitations are audible, and you can push them further musically than you might with the few alternatives at this price. For the 640C, the serious competition comes from Marantz, NAD and Sony's SCD-XB790S, the latter offering SACD compatibility. The new Marantz models may deliver better timing and the Sony is perhaps more detailed, but whether either can match the relaxed resolve and all-round finesse of the Azur is debatable.

Smarter than previous Cambridge models and even better value, the 640C is a sophisticated budget player that sounds as good as it looks. **HFC**

FULL METAL JACKET

A metal enclosure brings freshness to the styling – and perhaps the sound – of this floorstander



long with a handful of hi-tech models from brands like B&O and T+A, this 1 Austrian beauty is one of the few floorstanders to use a metal alloy enclosure. The most obvious consequence is its rather gorgeous and radical styling - with a bead-blasted, clear-anodised surface treatment (good looking though not very hard wearing), the silvery Schonberg will look exceptionally sharp in any environment designed along contemporary lines. Shallow but quite wide, it's actually formed by fixing together with fillets of damped MDF, two long curved alloy sections, front and back probably sections of architectural extrusion.

One of four models that share this styling, including three stereo pairs and a subwoofer, the Schonberg floorstander features similar drivers and casework to the Berg and Webern





standmounts. All models are magnetically shielded, and the smaller ones may be wallmounted, though no specific centre-channel model is available.

If the styling is the most distinctive consequence of the metal jacket, it has significant potential performance advantages too. It provides immense stiffness, especially with the curved profiles used here, and those same curves spread and break up internal reflections and horizontal standing waves. Yet it's also relatively thin, and therefore maximises the internal volume for the bulk.

The enclosure is split in two by a horizontal internal partition. This helps avoid the column resonance that can affect floorstanders with a continuous single enclosure, and also provides the appropriate loading for the two identical drivers that operate through the bass region, with reflex ports set into the MDF sides.

The Schonberg is actually a 'two-and-a-halfway' design, which means the lower of the two cone drivers is a bass-only device, while the upper one handles both bass and midrange duties, prior to handing over to the tweeter. Unusually, the tweeter here is set to the side of the bass/mid driver, and set slightly back to provide time alignment. The two speakers are built as a mirror-image pair, Schonberg is best sited less than 40cm from a wall, though our in-room measurements indicate that leaving a little more space behind the speaker is likely to be beneficial if mid-bass excess is to be avoided.

Under our conditions at least, while absolute extension is unexceptional (-6dB at 30Hz in-room), free space siting gave a very nice bass alignment – and indeed a good (if not particularly smooth) overall balance across the broad midband. Output falls off a touch above 1.5kHz, leaving the presence zone looking decidedly laid back. The treble proper then stages a rather peaky recovery. Sensitivity is around 90dB, close to the claimed 91dB, which is decent enough, though the load is a demanding four ohms.

SOUND QUALITY

I suspect that most of those checking out this speaker will have been attracted by its unique styling. Sound quality is unlikely to be the first priority in the decision making process, though it's important that it still achieves a good standard. And that's pretty much what you get here. It doesn't set any new standards or break any records, but it nevertheless reaches a very respectable sound quality which has more strengths than weaknesses,

to preserve visual and sonic symmetry. Most speakers place the midrange and tweeter in a vertical line, as this ensures more consistent integration through the crossover region across a wide lateral angle. Mounting the drivers laterally, as here, creates reinforcement and cancellation 'lobes' as one moves across in front of the speaker. Not a serious problem as such, but it does make it important to line up the 'toe-in' of the speaker as accurately as possible, so that both speakers are at roughly the same angle to the main listening zone.

A separate X-shaped framework, fitted with juicily fat but blunt spikes, acts as a plinth, usefully enhancing the stability and definitely improving the decorative appeal. The two main drivers here have 150mm frames and clear plastic cones 95mm in diameter, while the tweeter has a 25mm fabric dome. The speaker as a whole is magnetically shielded, and the input signal fed through a single side-mounted terminal pair.

The instruction leaflet suggests that the

and which is generally unlikely to disappoint.

Ultimately, of course, a speaker should do what the rest of the system tells it to do, and this speaker proved quite capable of revealing the quality of the components from which it was being fed, and of distinguishing between the alternatives when these were substituted.

Driving the Schonbergs from our referencelevel Naim NAC552/NAP500 combo, the restrained presence was rather too obvious, giving an overall sound that was arguably a little too much of a safe pair of hands for its own good. Voices – both singing and speaking – sound a little too 'shut in' and in consequence both consonants and dynamic expression lacked some bite. This meant that it was necessary to wind up the volume a little higher than the sensitivity might suggest in order to clarify diction – an important consideration for late-night listeners.

The strong treble provides good detail, usefully emphasising sibilants and cymbal work, which helps to compensate for the

weak presence, though some lack of smoothness and sweetness is also apparent.

Enclosure coloration is notably low here, indicating that the combination of metalwork and cunning shaping has been very effective. Even winding the volume right up while playing something suitably heavy – The Beastie Boys' *Hello Nasty* came to hand – seemed to cause no obvious tactile vibration in any part of the enclosure.

However, the heavy samples, beats and scratches on that album very much require a system to generate hard-edged sounds with serious dynamic impact and tension, and here the Schonberg really didn't cut it. This speaker is essentially sweet and gentle - something of a pussycat, in fact, but one that has suffered the indignity of being de-clawed. The trouble is, music itself doesn't always take the easy listening route. While the Schonberg is perfectly happy doing 'sweet 'n' gentle', it seems much more reluctant to do 'rough 'n' edgy'. The net result is a rather bland side to its character, which tends to leave the music lacking in tension and excitement. This is particularly apparent at the bass end of things, where the sound seems to have decent enough weight and extension, but somehow remains weak in authority and attack.

However, the payoff from the low box colour is a notably wide dynamic range and excellent 'out-of-the-box' stereo soundstage imaging. Nitin Sawhney's *Beyond Skin* has a beautifully big and spacious sound, and if 'big' was mildly curtailed here, this speaker did 'spacious' exceptionally well, even to the extent of generating some images outside the spacing of the speaker enclosures themselves.

One of the most stylish speaker designs ever created, the Schonberg combines a very clean sound with a laid-back balance. Box coloration is notably low, and the excellent imaging has a spaciousness and depth rarely found with wooden boxes. 

NO STING IN THIS TAIL

Cables made for valve components seem like a good idea, but has PM unnecessarily restricted itself?

s one of the largest valve vendors in Europe, PM naturally has an interest in furthering all things thermionic. It's a bit difficult to envisage a valve cable, so instead PM has commissioned from a "little known cable design company" some cables specifically designed to extract the utmost from valve-based systems.

According to PM, a different cable is required for valve amps because of their "higher speed" than solid-state designs. Now that's a pretty contentious claim, and a true pedant might point out that few valve amps can match the several-hundred-kHz bandwidth of the best solid-state amps... but let's not carp, there may be something in this.

Actually, valve amps vary widely in their construction, but many tend to stick to higher impedance levels than the current trend, with inputs of 100k or more and outputs of a few kilo-ohms. What's more, in the presence of interfering RF signals or possible causes of instability (including the load presented by cables) valve circuits can have subtly different behaviour from transistor types.

This is the most expensive Dragon Tails version, at a handsome premium over the Red (£50) and Black (£175) versions. All three share the most unusual feature – as well as having strands of different thickness within each core (like Kimber, for example), Dragon Tails include strands which double back within the core, increasing their length. How this will work, given that cores are not individually insulated, is not at all obvious, and the usual quick tests for basic electrical parameters gave no hints either. Three quite thin cores and a braided screen make up the basic Silver construction, and yes, there are silver strands in there, together with silver-plated copper.

SOUND QUALITY

As always, the proof of the pudding is in the guzzling, and with Dragon Tails Silver we'll certainly be coming back for more. Trying them initially in a valve system, we found them to offer a highly detailed sound with plenty of life, a good balance, strong clear bass and nice definition. A few voices and instruments developed a slight coloration, a touch of over-emphasis in the tenor register, compared with the most neutral cables we've heard, but that's the kind of thing that has very little effect in the long term and indeed can subtly enliven some slightly subdued and 'flat'-sounding speakers.

In the stereo imaging department, side-toside precision was about as good as it gets – very clearly delineated and independent in its clarity of signal levels and overall complexity. Image depth was also good, if perhaps not quite as transparently obvious as the best.

Having only one pair of DTs, it was interesting to move them round within the system, using a variety of long-term references elsewhere. At the input to a valve preamp (fed

from a solid-state CD player) they seemed happiest. At the output, feeding valve power amps, they were still very competent though slightly outdone in the clarity stakes by a couple of other models. They also gave excellent results between an all-valve source (an open-reel tape deck) and the preamp. But we couldn't resist trying them with solid-state gear and there too they made a fine presentation, perhaps not quite as revealing as some but very musical and communicative. In fact, their relatively high capacitance could lead to very mild dulling with some valve sources. All the same, the synergy claimed for them is largely borne out - but don't overlook them for solid-state applications! HFC




his smart little product would appear to be Intempo's launch vehicle, so don't be surprised if you haven't heard of the brand. Its physical appearance is not a million miles from the Evoke models of Pure Digital, but that's deceptive as it is in fact one of the few DAB tuners on the UK market that is not intimately related to those from Pure.

On switch-on, a message on the liquid crystal display announces that this is a Radioscape-based product. That means that instead of the ubiquitous chipset from Frontier Silicon it uses parts from Texas Instruments - which at least gives something to compare the FS-based models with! Sure enough, inside the case a small circuit board (comparable in size to those from FS and Roke Manor, about 2x4 inches) carries a variety of TI parts. The same board appears to carry out FM decoding as well as DAB, which means that some quite clever mixed-signal stuff must be going on in there. £120 may be a lot for a table radio but you get a fair bit of cutting-edge technology for it.

What you don't get is anything very sophisticated in the physical construction line, and the two speakers are actually very ornery three-inch jobs in a thin particle-board case. There's a cardboard reflex port on the base which doesn't seem to contribute much of anything, while a headphone socket at least allows the option of something approaching real high fidelity.

Ergonomically it's a simple enough unit to use, with four one-touch presets on each band and up/down buttons for DAB station tuning and FM manual tuning. It even displays RDS programme type and radiotext information on





FM. There's a built-in alarm clock too. Operation is only from the mains, using the supplied wall wart.

SOUND QUALITY

There's no doubt that the cabinet and speakers are the limiting factors with this tuner. Perhaps that's inevitable, so let's rephrase that and say that they are unduly limiting factors. The Tivoli FM radios have proved (for those too young to remember the golden days of Hacker etc) that good sounds can come from small radios, but Intempo has settled for something noticeably less.

You can't reasonably expect much bass from such a device, but a bit of body to the sound would be nice. There's really hardly any. Yes, you can turn it up to a fair loudness but it doesn't get any fuller, just coarser. Speech is intelligible, but only if you're actually listening. One of the toughest tests of a table radio is how easy it is to understand what's being said while there's a fair bit of background noise (washing dishes is a good example). With a Tivoli there's detail to spare and accordingly you'll understand much better than with the PG-01, where by contrast detail is in decidedly short supply.

Likewise with music: if your attention wanders even for a second you'll completely lose the thread, whereas the best radios (or any half-decent hi-fi) will keep hold of your subconscious for at least a few seconds. With some decent headphones you'll have a much better chance of staying mentally tuned. There's a trace of background noise just audible, but on the whole the sound is pretty good and clear. It also becomes evident that DAB performance is much of a muchness with the Pure Evokes, while FM is actually quite impressive, surprisingly noise-free even when the aerial is badly misaligned.

There's certainly promise here, but if DAB is being sold on improved sound quality you'll really want a better acoustical performance to hear why. **HFC**







RETRO

MISSION CYRUS ONE & TWO AMPLIFIERS

Back in the early eighties, when Mission was a young, thrusting company specialising in speakers, a decision was made to launch the Cyrus range of amps, with the imaginatively named One and Two. They first appeared in 1984/5, and went through a number of iterations. During the period they were on sale, they had a real impact, transforming the shape of the amplifier market for good.

Prior to Cyrus, the high ground in low-cost amplification was filled by the then ubiquitous NAD 3020, essentially an ordinary amplifier which just happened to sound rather nice, but there was a more direct precursor to the two Cyrus amps in a virtually forgotten design called the Mission 778. Among the first amps to take a rigorously minimalist design approach, the Cyruses had short signal paths, specialised components in critical areas, no tone controls or filters and no speaker switching. Both models were equipped with phono stages capable of handling moving magnet (MM) and moving coil (MC) cartridges, but most famously of all, they were both built into compact, 'shoebox' format boxes, like modern Cyrus components (but a little less pretty).

The Cyrus Two had an additional trick up its sleeve too, in the form of a socket which allowed an extra power supply called the PSX, and later the PSX-R to be piggy-backed onto the internal supply. The intention was never to increase power output per se. The internal Cyrus power supply took charge of the preamplifier, leaving the external heavily regulated PSX, which was packaged in a box the same size and finish as the amp, to cope with the power amp. The PSX increased current delivery and improved the ability of the amplifier to cope with adverse loads. The beauty of the PSX was that it could be bought at any time as an upgrade, but it was not essential. It was, if you like, the icing on the cake.

In the UK, the two Cyrus models were affectionately known as 'audiophile shoeboxes' (or sometimes as 'singing bricks'), which captures their essence pretty well. They were commercially very successful, and their achievement here was matched in most of Mission's export markets. The exception was the US where Mission had a hard time gaining acceptance, not due to any perceived shortcomings, but simply because they were too small.

Then and now, two Cyrus components side by side used the same space as a single standard-width component. But Mission stuck to its guns, and the US market is now much more receptive to Cyrus – sadly too late for the heroes of our tale.

The Cyrus bricks had a reputation for being true budget esoterica. In retrospect, and viewed in the context of a digital age, sound quality would now probably rank as rather bright, thin and shiny, but the Cyrus was a product of the era of analogue source components, which often benefited from this kind of balance. In addition to the Cyrus Two's fairly refined MC step-up, this model also boasted extra power – 50 watts to the Cyrus One's 25 – and the light, clear and detailed sound of both amps proved an excellent antidote to the limitations of source components of the day. They were not particularly powerful, but their consistency within their operating ceilings meant they could be driven quite hard without the sound deteriorating.

The original Cyrus amps were housed in chassis made from Nyrol, a synthetic material that was a spin-off from the space programme, capable of holding very fine detail from the mould, and which avoided becoming brittle with age. Slit foil reservoir capacitors were added to the Cyrus Two in 1987, and faster output bipolars were specified at the same time, eventually to be replaced by even faster custom-designed output devices. The case design was switched in this period to magnesium alloy, which gave the amps a much more sophisticated appearance. For a short period, the main PC boards were built in Taiwan, but this experiment was abandoned following reliability problems. In 1989, the final version of the Cyrus designs was launched, identified by the toggle power switch. The plug was finally pulled on the final production run of Cyrus Twos in 1992. **HFC**

DIANA ROSS

DIANA

By 1980 Diana Ross's superstar trajectory had faltered. Disco and punk had replaced the soulflavoured pop and power ballads which had made her a household name and she could no longer rely on the legion of fans who had supported her in her early post-Supremes success. Rumours of diva-like haughtiness and tantrums had also served to distance her from her fans, placing her in an ivory tower of her own making, while her ever more elaborate live shows emphasised her soul royalty status at the expense of accessibility. She wasn't hip, she wasn't street and in 1980 her über-diva persona meant she wasn't even sexy.

The gueen of Motown badly needed a makeover, and it settled upon one of the most successful production duos of the late seventies to do it. Nile Rogers and Bernard Edwards were effectively Chic, who had created some of the most artful and enduring disco music under their own name, as well as lending their sound and writing skills to other chart-topping acts such as Sister Sledge and as a result greatly influencing the evolution of dance music. Rogers' trademark guitar scratching and Edwards' instantly recognisable aerobic basslines, married with the pair's ear for relentless melodic hooks and funky rhythms had made them one of the most successful production teams in history by that point, and individually they would later work with some of pop's biggest movers and shakers, including Madonna, David Bowie and Rod Stewart as well as unintentionally kick-starting hip-hop when their Good Times was used as the engine behind the first ever rap hit, Sugar Hill Gang's Rapper's Delight.

But despite their name on the cover, it wasn't Chic's mix of the hits *I'm Coming Out, Upside Down* and *My Old Piano*, or indeed any of the album, that hurtled Diana Ross back to the top of both popular and critical trees. Far from journeymen producers, the pair had been keen to experiment from the start and had used the project (and Ross's clout) to incorporate new ideas which were by no means risk-free from a sales point of view. They refused to show the songs to Diana or the band before the sessions to encourage spontaneity, and incorporated awkward rhythms and time signature changes on many tracks. Creating a

gay anthem for Diana in *I'm Coming Out* occurred to Nile Rogers when he encountered a trio of Diana Ross-themed drag queens in a New York club (though fortunately, neither La Ross or Motown twigged what the song referred to at the time).

But Motown, already nervous about what they saw as a radical change of direction for their biggest star, chose to entrust the final mix to established house engineer Russ Terrana. Berry Gordy and the Motown brass weren't the only ones who were concerned. Diana herself courted opinion from virtually everyone she could, and apparently ended up in tears following a meeting with NY radio personality and producer Frankie Crocker, who heard an early mix and congratulated her on ruining hc: career.

Rogers and Edwards objected publicly to Terrana's involvement, and threatened to remove their name from the credits, though Rogers now says that he's grateful they didn't go that far.

The recent *Deluxe Edition* of the album features both the original and Chic mixes, as well as rarities and remixes from Diana's dance period. Comparing the two, there isn't as much of a disparity as one might suppose. Diana's voice has been pushed forward (different, close-miked and more relaxed vocal takes were used, rather than Chic's more impromptu, 'gutsier' versions) and some of the band's musical interludes have been trimmed. The instruments have also been separated out more, sounding the better for it, but all the basic elements were kept.

The released mix gave Ross her biggest solo success to date, and the album spent a year in the pop chart, as well as delivering three hit singles. It gave the public what they wanted – Diana as diva, but with a more approachable, down to earth and downright funky feel. It's also some of the best dance music of any era. **HFC**

MULTICHANNEL, LIKE IT OR NOT

While no-one is suggesting that two-channel audio has had its chips, the practice of listening to stereo music in the home is steadily being eroded. "But the sales of multichannel DVD-A

and SACD media are still pitifully low" I hear you cry. True, and this is despite the fact that manufacturers are falling over themselves to offer broader compatibility with these new formats with every new generation of hardware. First we had plain vanilla DVD players that would also spin a CD but not CD-R copies. Harmony with CD, CD-R *and* CD-RW slowly followed. Multichannel analogue outputs were provided (alongside a digital output for Dolby and DTS-encoded bitstreams) once the players were equipped with the appropriate decoders.

Midway through this cycle SACD, and then DVD-Audio, came into existence as competing high-resolution audio formats. The fact that DVD players were already equipped with all the analogue electronics to handle multichannel audio meant that compatibility with these uncompressed music formats was simply a matter of including a DVD-A or SACD decoder. Universal disc players are the ultimate expression of this integration, players with a single, typically dual-focus transport and decoder that will handle MPEG video, Dolby Digital and DTS data while also unpacking 'linear' multichannel audio from SACD and DVD-As.

For the average consumer, the universal player is a no-brainer. There's no need for hesitation over the future longevity of either high-band audio format because one player will suit whichever disc wins. Also, a universal player is the perfect companion for every multichannel AV amplifier or receiver, providing a digital output for Dolby and DTS sources and *analogue* outputs for DVD-A and SACD. This is always assuming that a FireWire or HDMi interface does not supersede the lot, of course.

Either way, with the larger manufacturers *only* producing multichannel disc players and amps, the range of conventional stereo kit (amps and CD players) is shrinking markedly. To an extent, the small-scale manufacturers of CD players are sticking to familiar ground simply because they lack either the financial or technical resources to design and build DVD or universal

players. Similarly, it's still a lot easier to manufacture a twochannel analogue amp than a five or 7.1-channel AV receiver. So with two-channel audio left in the hands of a relatively few specialist companies, the hi-fi separates consumer is being led, almost by default, down the multichannel road.

And once you've got yourself an AV amp and five speakers, even if they are just little satellites, plus a sub, then there's always the temptation to use all six boxes when listening to music. While DVD-A and SACD can provide discrete multichannel audio without intervention, more and more consumers are turning to DSP trickery to deliver a similar 'surround sound' from existing two-channel (typically CD) software.

Both DTS and Dolby are well aware of this change in listening habit, a knowledge reflected in the distinct 'cinema' and 'music' derivatives of the DTS Neo:6 and Dolby Pro Logic II processing modes. Both of these options provide a matrix decoding of conventional two-channel material, deriving additional 'channels' according to the relative amplitude and phase of signals on the existing two-channel source material. But what of enthusiasts who have 6.1 or even fully-fledged 7.1-channel systems? Well, now Dolby even has an answer here in the form of an extended version of Pro Logic II called (no surprise) Pro Logic IIx.

This decode format is compatible with native two-channel and 5/6.1-channel-encoded software and provides 5.1, 6.1 *and* 7.1-derived output channels. As you might expect, every upcoming 7.1 channel AV amp will have Pro Logic IIx and many specialist producers, including Denon, Marantz, Meridian and TAG McLaren will offer hardware upgrades to existing kit. All of which underlines the manufacturers' commitment to multichannel, whether it's from encoded 5.1 channel DVDs, linear DVD-A and SACD or, indeed, from plain vanilla CD. **HFC** *Paul Miller*

HI-FICHOICE BUYER'S BIBLE CD PLAYERS

CD PLAYERS Audio disc players for music only

Despite the emergence of new formats and the resurgence of an old one (vinyl), CD is still the king of formats if you require breadth of choice. And despite the fact that other sources will play CDs, if you want to hear your discs at their best there's little substitute for a dedicated CD player.

It's also the most enduring format on the market. Despite high-resolution contenders like SACD and DVD-Audio, nothing has been able to undermine this universally popular format.

CD players work by reading a stream of 1s and 0s off a disc that spins at a constantly changing speed (to counteract the increasing length of 'groove'). This bitstream is then digitally filtered before undergoing digital-to-analogue conversion in the DAC (D-to-A convertor). Thereafter, the signal is filtered



again before being amplified and sent to the output sockets.

The processes of reading the disc and converting the data are sometimes split between a CD transport and separate DAC in socalled two-box players. A popular approach with very high-end kit, this separates the electronically noisy elements from the sensitive analogue stages, but can introduce timing errors known as jitter, therefore one-box players usually offer best results where budget is a consideration.

SUPER AUDIO CD

SACD or Super Audio CD is a relatively new audio-only format introduced by Sony and Philips. It offers higher resolution than CD in the form of considerably greater bandwidth and improved dynamic range. It also has the potential for uncompressed surround sound using up to six channels, and most new discs take advantage of this. SACD discs are usually hybrids and will play on normal CD players, but you won't be able to appreciate their highest quality or their multichannel capability without an SACD-compatible player. Some SACD players also play DVD and even DVD-Audio – these are listed in our DVD section.

Q&A

WHAT'S A DAC?

A DAC or digital-to-analogue convertor is a fundamental part of any CD player and converts the digits read from the disc into an analogue music waveform which is amplified to line level.

WHY HAVE SEPARATE TRANSPORTS & DACS?

Discs are read by a transport or disc drive, which creates radio frequency 'noise'. Separating the DAC means the conversion can be done with less interference.

CAN I USE AN OUTBOARD DAC WITH My integrated CD Player?

Yes, if it has a digital output - and most do.

DO I NEED DIGITAL CABLES FOR A CD PLAYER?

No. All analogue cables are suitable for connecting a CD player to an amp. Digital specific cables with 75ohms impedance are useful when connecting the player to a digital recorder or DAC.

WHAT IS OVERSAMPLING/UPSAMPLING?

Oversampling involves multiplying the sampling frequency by a whole number, usually between four and 32, but sometimes higher, and is designed let the DAC to work in a more linear fashion. Upsampling is where the data stream is stretched out by interpolation and is typically used to refer to large changes in sampling rate such as from 44.1 kHz to 192kHz.

CAN I PLAY SACDS ON A NORMAL CD PLAYER?

Yes. The vast majority of SACD discs are hybrids, with a CD layer that all CD players can read.

CAN I PLAY DVDS ON A CD PLAYER?

No, the same applies to DVD-As. But you can play CDs and DVD-As on normal DVD players.

HI-FICHOICE BUYER'S BIBLE DVD PLAYERS

DVD PLAYERS Disc players for audio and video

DVD has proved a phenomenal success in commercial terms and has virtually extinguished the market for budget CD players – you can't really beat a multiformat player when it comes to features. Early DVD players were not particularly good CD spinners because of the enormous amount of RF interference produced by video circuits, but as this problem has been identified manufacturers have begun to tackle it. Nowadays, most DVD players are competent CD players and a few are very good – often as not they are the ones that play DVD-Audio discs as well.

The great advantage of DVD is that it offers sufficient capacity to hold a feature length movie or music concert and discrete multichannel sound on a disc the size of a CD. In the case of plain DVD-Video discs, the audio is encoded in either the Dolby Digital or DTS format, both of which use 'lossy' compression to fit the audio onto the disc alongside the video data. You can



use a DVD player with your stereo system by connecting the stereo outputs, though this won't give the surround sound benefits that the format specialises in.

DVD-AUDIO

DVD-Audio is a high-resolution format that offers multichannel, stereo and Dolby Digital



tracks on dedicated DVD-A discs. The discs can be played on any DVD player, but the CD-beating high-fidelity sound can only be appreciated with a DVD-A player. While offering similar benefits to SACD, it

has the advantage of on-screen display for information – lyrics, images and so on. To save you having to decide which format to go for, a few brands are bringing out universal players to cover SACD and DVD-A, alongside CD and DVD-Video – a neat and relatively future proof route into high-resolution multichannel music. Higher-end models featuring high-bandwidth compatible digital audio links are now also appearing, enhancing DVD-A/ SACD sound when used with similarly equipped amps.

WHICH AUDIO OUTPUTS GIVE THE BEST QUALITY?

Use the analogue outputs for CD, DVD-A and SACD, and the coaxial digital output for DTS and Dolby Digital movie soundtracks.

WHICH VIDEO OUTPUTS GIVE THE BEST QUALITY?


The best connection is component video closely followed by RGB Scart, which is clearly superior to S-video and the basic composite video option.

DO I NEED A MULTICHANNEL AMP TO USE A DVD PLAYER?

Only if you want to hear music and movie soundtracks in multichannel surround. DVD players can be used with stereo amps and just two speakers to great effect, but you'll only get stereo, not surround sound.

DO I NEED PROGRESSIVE SCAN VIDEO?

It's worthwhile for the very best picture quality, but make sure your DVD player and display device support PAL progressive.



ANALOGUE AUDIO OUTPUTS: For stereo and multichannel connections, use these for best results with DVD-Audio, SACD and CD. DIGITAL OUTPUTS: For Dolby Digital, DTS and PCM audio bitstreams. VIDEO CONNECTIONS: Yellow sockets are composite; red, green and blue sockets are for component which gives best results, while the black multipin socket is S-video, which sits qualitatively between the two. SCART CONNECTIONS: These are a goodquality option for video, especially ones that output RGB.





BUYER'S BIBLE VINYL

VINYL Turntables, cartridges and phono stages

> Record players or turntables offer the digital revolution serious competition when it comes to sound quality. Even a modest model can turn musical tricks that most CD players struggle with. Some call it vinyl warmth, but in reality it's a lack of digital hardness that makes the format so engaging. True, the software requires a bit more care, but even a knackered LP is more playable than a scratched CD.

Record players are made of three, perhaps four, fundamental parts. The turntable is the plinth and platter, usually also containing the motor and any suspension system. A tonearm sits on the plinth and allows the cartridge to trace the vinyl groove by pivoting or parallel tracking over the record. The cartridge contains the means of turning the mechanical movement of the groove wall into an electrical signal.

A fourth element is an amp dedicated to the delicate job of amplifying and equalising the cartridge's insubstantial output. This is called a phono stage and can be found in some integrated amplifiers and preamps, but is increasingly purchased separately for use with line-only amps.

There are two types of phono cartridge: moving magnet (MM) and moving coil (MC), and with a few exceptions the latter outperforms the former. But MCs produce a lower output and require better-quality amplification to be heard at their best. As a general rule, MCs offer a broader bandwidth, greater dynamics and more detail, but the better moving magnets do most things well enough to distract you from your CD collection. but the general principle is to level the platter by adjusting the suspension or, as with solid platters, the surface it sits on. Sprung suspensions sometimes require a bit of fine-tuning to sound their best, but the principle is to achieve a smooth, pistonic bounce. Cartridge set-up is even more critical, as the angles at which the stylus traces the groove affects its tonal balance and levels of distortion. A good alignment protractor is essential if you are intending to set up your own cartridge, as is a degree of patience. In essence, there are two angles you need to get right: the tracing angle as the cartridge crosses the record if you are looking from above, and the vertical tracking angle (VTA), which is adjusted by raising or lowering the arm base to bring the arm parallel with the record surface.



RADIO TUNERS

FM and DAB hi-fi separates

Radio is a fantastic musical resource that's in danger of being taken for granted, but whatever your tastes there's someone out there catering for it. If you haven't got a decent tuner hooked up to your hi-fi already, you're missing out!

DAB or FM?

Digital Audio Broadcasting (DAB) is said to be available to 80 per cent of the population and the long-term plan is to switch public broadcasting over to digital, but hardware prices have yet to come down to a point where this would be acceptable. Its advantages over FM include hiss-free reception, the potential for a wider range of stations and the ability to display comprehensive programming information. FM's RDS system means that station name and occasionally track titles are displayed, but the range of information is fairly limited.

Where FM scores over DAB is in the lower cost of hardware and the greater reception

area. It can also provide higher sound quality if reception conditions are favourable. Absolute sound quality judgements are muddied by the fact that you are listening to different forms of compression and processing at the studio for each station.

What is clear, however, is that there are more and more radio stations broadcasting on DAB that aren't available on FM. So if it's variety of programming you're after, they have a lot to offer.

RECEPTION

The quality of signal you feed a tuner will dictate its sound quality. So serious FM listeners should get a decent external aerial and connect it with as few junctions and splits as possible. Every time you split the cable (ie take a feed for another tuner) you halve signal strength! With DAB the same applies but get a DAB-specific aerial. See www.bbc.co.uk/digitalradio for details.

DIGITAL AUDIO RECORDERS

CD, MiniDisc and hard drive recorders



MiniDisc

MD's strength is versatility. You can record and then re-record many times over. Editing facilities are second to none – you can erase mistakes, name tracks and re-order a disc's contents with a few simple button pushes, making it ideal for building compilations. They're pretty robust too.

Sound quality is below that of CD-R/ CD-RW. The format uses a Sony-developed compression technology called ATRAC, which discards part of the data in order to squeeze it on the disc. If you're copying from CD to MD, the result tends to sound a little cold in comparison, lacking a degree of detail and ambience. But to most people it still sounds light years ahead of cassette – clean and hiss-free.

Recordable CD

With recordable CD you have a choice of two disc types: CD-R discs are the cheapest, but you can only record once; and CD-RW discs are a little more costly, but you can rerecord on them *ad infinitum*.

Though the latest machines incorporate some useful editing facilities, CD-R/RW is not as flexible as MD. However, sound

quality is higher – if you're recording from a CD, the best models will give you a copy that is very close to the original. In terms of compatibility, most CD players will play back a CD-R disc, but older models might have trouble with CD-RW (though you can, of course, play the disc back on your own recorder). If you want to play a CD-R/RW on a DVD player, check for compatibility.

Hard drive

The latest contender on the digital recording scene is also the most flexible. Some HDD (hard disk drive) recorders can store whole music collections if you use a compression format such as MP3. HDD recorders are taking over from multidisc CD changers as sound servers in multiroom installations, where their ability to play more than one piece of music at a time is a great boon. HDD also offers impressive editing facilities on a par with MD, and they can also record from CD (or to CD-R/RW) at high speed.

At present, sound quality isn't the driving force behind the format – flexibility and storage capacity being bigger issues – and a plain CD-R/RW machine will outperform an HDD recorder in fidelity terms.



STEREO AMPLIFIERS

Integrated and pre/power amps

Amplifiers come in two basic forms: integrated and preamplifier (pre) plus power amp combinations. Integrated simply means that both pre and power sections are in one box. There are definite advantages to separating the low level, delicate signals in the preamp from the radiations of a power amp, so the more ambitious designs come in two or more cases. In some cases, each channel has its own power amp called a monoblock.

Amplifiers use two basic technologies: transistors or valves. Transistors are popular because of their practical and technical advantages, but valves - aka tubes - live on owing to aspects of sound quality that trannies can't replicate. If you want to play your music loud, use trannies; if you appreciate acoustic music, try valves.

The fundamental of amp/speaker interfacing is power rating and speaker sensitivity. You can drive a high-sensitivity speaker with a ten watt valve amp, but it takes a 200W behemoth to get the best out of speakers which present a difficult load. As a rule, you can't have too much power.

How to choose an amp

The main areas in which amps vary are: timing, dynamics, stereo imaging and transparency. Timing is the ability to present the attack and decay of each note precisely; amps with strong timing have a snap and coherence that is very appealing.

HOME CINEMA STEREO

Stereo amps can be used in home cinema set-ups as well. You don't get the surround and centre channels, but well set-up stereo speakers do a remarkably good job of creating atmosphere for movies. Stereo amps



Dynamics is a general term for the ability to portray variations in level between individual notes and is different to dynamic range (the difference between the loudest and softest notes). Dynamically strong amps tend to have more life and energy.

Stereo imaging is how solid or three-dimensional an instrument or voice sounds. The point of having two rather than one speaker is to make it possible to recreate the soundstage of the original recording, thus amps that have strong imaging skills can create a sonic space that seems to extend the room.

Transparency of detail is the most obvious difference between amps. One amp will present more subtlety than another, but the drawback with using this as your main criterion is that a forward or 'bright' sounding amplifier will emphasise detail at the expense of overall musical coherence.

SHOULD I LEAVE MY AMP ON **ALL THE TIME FOR BEST RESULTS?**

All audio electronics perform better when they are warmed up, and this is particularly the case when it comes to amplifiers. If there's no way that you can leave it on all the time, make an effort to switch it on at least 20 minutes before listening.

WHAT IS BI-WIRING AND **BI-AMPING?**

Bi-wiring is when you run separate cables to the treble and bass/mid terminals on the speaker. In most instances, this improves sound quality so long as identical cables are used. Bi-amping is using two stereo amps to drive one pair of speakers, using one amp to drive the treble and the other for the bass/mid sections of the speakers.

WHY DO VALVE AMPS HAVE **SO LITTLE POWER?**

Valve amps are inherently low powered in absolute terms - at least when you compare them to their transistor-based cousins. But when partnered with high-sensitivity loudspeakers, they are quite capable of producing perfectly adequate head-banging levels.

AV AMPLIFIERS Surround sound amps for music and movies

The multichannel, surround sound or AV amplifier is a popular option, thanks to the success of the DVD player and home cinema. Now you can buy five channels or more of amplification for the price of two. Now that multichannel music is also on the agenda, there's a lot to be said for a good AV amp or receiver (an amp with a radio tuner built in).

So if you fancy hearing what DVD-Audio, SACD or even music DVD-Video can do, then check out a multichannel amp and speaker set-up - they're stunning with movies and none too shabby with music.

AV amps are usually designed primarily for movies and come with digital processing for the various soundtrack formats - Dolby Pro-Logic (analogue), Dolby Digital and DTS, which offer discrete surround sound in 5.1 and 7.1 channel formats. More ambitious designs also offer THX post processing, designed to emulate the sound of the mixing theatre at home.

Processing in AV amps is needed because the surround formats on DVD-Vs are compressed, limiting their high-fidelity



potential. This is why new formats SACD and DVD-A, which don't use 'lossy' compression, were created for music.

All this processing power can take its toll on analogue formats. The best multichannel amps for music are often the simplest, but any that offer a complete bypass option with six-channel input are suitable. It's also worth looking at real power - five or seven channels of amplification are not easy to produce with a feeble power supply, and the cheaper amps in particular often fail to live up to the claims.

HOW MANY CHANNELS?

Depends on how many speakers you want. Multichannel music discs come with six or 5.1 channels, but for new movies, 7.1 systems are where it's at. 7.1 set-ups also mean you have speakers directly behind you preferable for music discs.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE **BETWEEN A PROCESSOR** AND AN AV AMP?

Processors don't have amplification on board and you need separate power amps. AV amps and receivers have processing and amps in the same box.

This is the LFE (low frequency effects) or bass channel that is reproduced by a subwoofer.

With DVD-Audio and SACD offering high-quality multichannel music, surround sound is no longer just a home cinema thing. An increasing number of people want to build a multichannel system that will do their music as well as their movie DVDs justice, and the number of AV products delivering sufficient quality is on the increase. But most aren't cheap - building a top-quality system with five or more channels is inevitably more expensive than sticking with stereo.

There are some very decent integrated options below £1,000, though the best (and most costly) route is to buy a separate processor and power amp(s). Or you can add AV amplification to a stereo model you can't bear to part with.





STEREO SPEAKERS

Speaker pairs for stereo sound

While loudspeakers are relatively straightforward in construction, they have one of the most difficult jobs in hi-fi - turning an electrical signal into an acoustic one. Most consist of two or more drive units in a box that usually has a port in it to make life easier for the cone in your mid and/or bass driver. Alternatives to this arrangement include panel speakers, which use electrostatic or ribbon technology, and horns, which use drive units in complex cabinets that greatly improve efficiency.

Box speakers are either designed to stand on the floor (floorstanders) or on a stand (stand or shelfmounts). Floorstanders have greater internal volume which can translate into greater efficiency and/or bass extension, but less substantial designs also introduce cabinet resonance and thus distortion. But they don't need stands and therefore have the aesthetic edge. Standmounts have less cabinet to vibrate and often score in terms of imaging and timing, but need good stands to work well.

Positioning

The closer the speaker is to a wall, the greater the reinforcement of bass. As all rooms differ, there's no simple formula for placement and experimentation will yield the best results. Altering the angle at which the speakers face the listener can also make a difference to balance and stereo image.

Going multichannel

Many stereo speakers can be augmented with centre and surround channels from the same brand to create a multichannel system. The most important element is a centre channel, which needs to match the stereo pair as closely as possible. For the best musical results, surrounds should be as per the front left and right channels, but if space or funds don't permit, smaller designs can be used quite effectively.

Though some speakers have a power rating, this isn't as informative as a rating for how difficult they are to drive, nor does it indicate wattage extremes for the partnering amp. In practice, an amplifier cannot be too powerful. Our listings quote ease of drive to indicate how much power



Choosing speakers

Because speakers and the rooms they are used in vary so much, choosing a pair tends to be quite subjective. To find some that will suit you, try to listen to a good variety to hear how they differ, and if possible, audition some at home. Tonal balance tends to vary the most, but is less important than more subtle factors such as timing and dynamics. Finally, listen with your ears not your eyes - great-looking speakers aren't necessarily great sounding.

Spikes

Floorstanding speakers and stands have threaded inserts for spikes that allow rigid coupling with the floor. These have the advantage of draining resonance from the speaker and giving tighter bass, but can result in more vibration getting back to the electronics and often cause the floor to resonate as well.

AV SPEAKERS Speaker solutions for multichannel surround sound



Multichannel speaker systems have a front left/right (L/R) stereo pair, a centre or dialogue channel, two (5.1) or four (7.1) surround speakers and often a subwoofer. For best results, each of these speakers bar the sub should be identical. The problem is that few surround systems are dedicated to music and perform a home cinematic role as well, meaning the centre speaker has to sit above or below a

video monitor. Centre channels are usually wide and short for this reason.

This should not be a barrier to great surround for music and movies however, as many brands make centre channels with a very close sound to their L/R designs.

Music vs movies

High-resolution SACD and DVD-A music recordings tend to be mastered with

SET-UP

Ideally you should set up surround speakers with as much care as you would stereo systems, but practical issues tend to have a significant bearing on surround and centre speaker placement. Surround channels can be floorstanding or wallmounted, and centres usually have to perch on the TV or underneath it. Given these limitations, adjust your L/R front speakers to give the best tonal match with the centre. If there's more than just you listening, 'toe in' the speakers so that their axis crosses in front of the listening position – this gives a wider stereo image. And if there's a subwoofer it should be placed near the front speakers. Use a sound pressure metre (available from Tandy among others) to accurately set levels. surround speakers in the ITU standard position which is as far behind the listener as the front channels are in front. 5.1 movie soundtracks tend to place surround channels not so far behind and to the side of listeners. Usually, practical limitations will dictate a limited range of placement options, but if you are a dedicated music fan, check out the ITU set-up regulations in the booklet supplied with SACD discs.

SPECIFICATIONS

SUBWOOFERS

Subs start working where stereo speakers run out of steam at low frequencies. The idea is to create deeper, better-controlled bass rather than more of it. They usually have onboard amplification (active) and connect to either the LFE (Low Frequency Effects) channel in a home cinema set-up or the speaker terminals in a stereo set-up.

HEADPHONES BUYER'S BIBLE

HEADPHONES For your ears only



Headphones come in several varieties and some are designed for particular usage. The majority of 'cans' use dynamic cone and coil-type drive units and can be used with anything from a personal stereo to a dedicated amplifier. Other types also exist, most significantly electrostatics that use a charged panel membrane to produce a distinctly refined sound. These are supplied with their own dedicated amplifiers, which tends to increase the price.

Cans are split into several types. There are open and closed-back designs, the latter being best for noisy (or noise sensitive) environments as they minimise leakage and intrusion. Open-back types tend to have a more open, less 'in-head' sound. There are also three variants of earpad design: circumaurals enclose the ear and press on your head, supra-aurals press on the ear and intra-aurals sit in the ear and are particularly popular with personal stereo users.

Getting the best from your cans

Getting a good result with headphones is not quite as straightforward as it should be. Merely plugging them into the output on your CD player or amp will not give particularly engaging results unless you are very lucky. If you are planning on serious listening, invest in a dedicated amp – the increase in dynamics is not in the least bit subtle. A variety of models are made and prices start at around £80 for a QED, a little more for designs from, say, Creek or Musical Fidelity. And if you're really into cans, look up the valve-powered Earmax.

CABLES

Wires to hook your system together

Hi-fi cables come in two varieties: interconnects and speaker cables. Interconnects come in preset lengths, generally with RCA phono plugs attached, though some equipment uses XLR connectors for balanced connection. Speaker cable is sold by the metre and can be used without plugs or can be fitted with screw or solder-on types.

Choosing the best cables is not quite as

straightforward as it might seem. One problem is that components interact with the cables you use and this often results in audible effects, but there are few cables that are fundamentally incompatible with any components, and we recommend the advice of a good dealer. In any case, you should look to spend as much as you can afford.

Digital cables come in two flavours: electrical and optical. In most instances

electrical varieties sound better than optical, but if you are after a smoother sound the light carriers have the advantage, as they do if long lengths are needed (10m+). Optical outputs tend to have Toslink connectors (around 99 per cent), but some electrical digital outputs are of the superior BNC type, which uses a bayonet-type socket. Check which type your digital component has before buying a digital interconnect.

Equipment racks and speaker stands

In hi-fi there are two types of stand. One is a rack that holds turntables, amps, CD players and so on and is described as an equipment support, and the other is a speaker stand. The latter comes in three basic varieties, two for standmount speakers: lightweight, multilegged types; and heavy designs with fewer legs and the ability to be mass-loaded for extra solidity. The lighter variety is said to have a quicker sound, while heavyweights give deeper bass and a calmer sound. The third speaker stand type is a platform that sits under floorstanding speakers or speaker/stand combinations, the pneumatic Townshend Seismic Sink being an example.

There are two speaker-to-stand interfacing options: spikes or Blu Tak in each corner of the top plate. Try both and take your pick.



Valvelicious

David Vivian reckons valve amps are misunderstood

o here's the thing. Valve amps are back in the chair and sitting comfortably. They never actually left the room, of course. Wandered around in some dimly lit corners for a while where only the most dedicated tube-ophiles could find them. Curled up in front of the fire for, well, ages and were branded slipper.'n'-coco hi-fi by the transistor brigade. But give up their claim to the sonic high ground? Not a chance. The valve might be 100 years old but many believe completely in its superiority over the solid state alternatives. It is the very embodiment of hi-fi extreme.

And, when you consider its natural advantages, perhaps it isn't hard to see why. First, valves achieve good high-frequency power effortlessly. Not for nothing are most radio and television transmitters valved. There simply aren't any high-powered transistors that work at FM's 100mHz and television's 500-800mHz band. In fact, if you're talking about outputs of tens of kilowatts, transistors are rather pathetic, throwing in the towel well before 1 mHz, whereas just about any power valve can operate out to 50mHz without breaking sweat. MOSFETS do better than ordinary transistors but are still no match for the old glass tube.

So valves get off to the best possible start, and that's crucial. You don't have to apply a lot of corrective effort (high-feedback, highprecision topologies) to make them work well. A valve amp, because of its greater simplicity, has fewer imperfections in the hearing range that matters most. The distortions in high-spec transistor amps tend to have a lot of high-order harmonics that bother us but lower levels of classic distortion (second and third harmonic) to which we're actually quite tolerant. With a valve amp, it's the other way round.

And yet it's valve sound that's often typified as being 'characterful': warm and friendly; soft at the bottom, soft at the top; very listenable but lacking guts and drive. But, according to legendary amp designer and valve acolyte Tim

"Valve amps can't compete with the grunt offered by transistors, right? Wrong."

de Paravacini, it doesn't have to be like that.

Tim explains: "The problem is most people use traditional valve amplifier circuitry, and perpetuate the same mistakes. It's not the valve that has the 'sound', it's the collection of components that go with the valve – the transformers, the capacitors, the whole thing. When I designed the EAR 509 over 20 years ago (or the 3045 for Lux) I wanted a valve amplifier that sounded very close to a transistor amplifier. And that's what I made. It's also possible to make transistor amplifiers sound like 'typical' valve amplifiers.

"I made this Yoshino 30-amp, 30-watt singleended transistor amp with just two transistors – one big output transistor and one little driver transistor. That was it, the rest was transformers. It was expensive to make but the circuitry was utterly simple. Blindfolded, noone would know the difference between that and an equivalent valve amplifier.

"Designers brought up on transistors don't know the electronic fundamentals of valves. When they try to do it as an analogy, they get the analogies wrong because they have to realise that, if you include MOSFETs, there are three different operating principles. You have to find their equivalence – and most people don't understand that. Consequently, that's why the sounds are different rather than the valve having a 'sound' per se."

Tim's point is supported by the increasing number of valve amps that sound as fast, clean and grippy as the best high-end transistors. What about power, then? Valve amps can't compete with the grunt offered by transistors, right? Wrong. De Paravicini has made 200-watt and 500-watt power amps. "More power?" says Tim, "Use more valves in parallel. It's the same as a car engine – the same as having more cylinders, basically."

Enjoy the valve advantage while you can. Like Concorde, they won't be around forever. **HFC**
