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eard of the Hitclip, dear reader? Don't worry if you haven't, neither had I until I was browsing through the Saturday supplements (it only used to be the Sunday

papers that you brought home with the aid of a weightlifting belt). My eyes sped across the usual gadget pages and came to rest on something that seemed at the time so incomprehensible to me that I had to read all four lines of it again. It made for depressing, and to a certain extent predictable, reading. Apparently the latest "craze" in music listening is in the shape of a postage stamp sized memory card a "Micro Music Chip" - which is inserted into a marginally larger player from which the listener is treated to exactly sixty second excerpts only of his/her favourite pop stars' (Britney, NSync, etc.) hits with the aid of a single earpiece. It appears music has now downgraded itself to one-minute quick hit sound bytes and in this theoretical sphere the concentration span of children must have sunk to an all time low. Behind the idea are the makers of, amongst other things, the lovable Furby and an interactive Yoda (of Star Wars films' fame). Oh, and not forgetting the intriguingly named Super Poo-Chi. .

Apart from the obvious degradation of moving back to mono music on the move, I was more shocked at the price of this highly dubious means of musical edification for the young. The HitClips personal player is available for what seems a reasonable £7.99 from your favourite high street catalogue store but each HitClip will set you back a most unreasonable £3.99. Put this in perspective with other formats: a Playstation II console will set you back at least around £250. Would you then pay £175 for a game you can't finish? Or, slightly more sensibly, would you pay £60 for a portable (stereo!) CD, yet then shell out £30 for a disc containing a one minute blast of each track like a no option 'random intro' selection from Hell? I very much doubt it. The HitClip price seems as preposterous to me as the idea itself.

Or on second thoughts, and price apart, is the idea so preposterous from the music industry's viewpoint? Not being half as daft as we'd like it to be, the music industry is forever finding different ways of making money and protecting their interests, especially in the download age. They hate recording formats for obvious reasons of piracy but they see the consumer's attraction with the portability factor - the smaller the player the better and you can't get smaller than the HitClip at present. Also, that £3.99 sound byte of the latest pop release could well get the nation's youth hankering for more. It's like a bizarre 'What The Butler Saw' situation, just as you're getting into it...time's up! So, how do you satisfy your musical craving? You buy the CD single for your portable player, silly, at a mere £2.99 - a pound cheaper than your HitClip, and if you want even more there's always the album. And before you know it another few guid has gone toward protecting the music industry's interests!

Let's just pray to God some halfwit doesn't decide the format would translate well to the classical market. Imagine a HitClip of the Ring cycle: no sooner would we be crawling on the cold river bed of the Rhine than our precious time would be up...eternal bottom feeders until we shelled out at leat £45 for the whole of Das Rheingold. Not even the valves would have time to warm up! = _

Here's one for design freaks. Harman Consumer UK have announced that they are to be the sole UK distributor of the JBL TiK Series loudspeakers. The TiK range combines the company's driver, enclosure and crossover technologies with inventive and modern sculptural design, taking loudspeaker looks to the extremes. The range consists of the Ti10K tower, the Ti16K tower, the Ti2K bookshelf model, plus two subwoofers and a centre 'speaker. The use of curved surfaces in the range is intentionally functional as well as aesthetic, avoiding any reflective parallel surfaces. The "bent trapezoid" design consists of just five surfaces, which helps, say the company, to eliminate internal resonance and standing waves. The curvature is apparently achieved by bonding seven layers of MDF under high pressure to form a structure "far more rigid than any wood of comparable thickness."

JBL go on to claim that the TiK series uses possibly the most advanced dome tweeter in the world. This design employs a pure titanium dome placed in a soft surround which they say makes the driver's resonant frequency well outside its operating range.

Each of the Tik range mid/bass drivers is based on an inverted dome, again, of pure titanium which claims to offer near-perfect pistonic motion. All low frequency drivers are built on a cast aluminium chassis for precise alignment of the cone, magnet and voice coil and for elimination of vibration and ringing in the chassis.

The TiK range is available in natural Beech and Black Ash and also in high gloss finishes of a variety of colours. Prices range from £1250 to £2850 in natural finishes, with high gloss finishes demanding a premium.



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** ARCAM'S NEW BUDGET SPINNER



Although moving strongly into what Arcam believe is the lucrative AV market, the company is still busy working on mainstay two channel hifi products, the latest of which is the entry level CD62 CD player. Priced at £349 it shares many of the high quality components found in the award winning CD72, such as the new Sony mechanism and 24bit Burr Brown DAC. According to Charlie Brennan, Arcam's MD, Arcam "wanted to produce a player that would be the perfect solution for someone who wants to experience a great sound but who doesn't need the extra options and refinements of the CD72." Consequently the CD62 doesn't have the 72's upgrade path to the CD92 which results in a smaller transformer, as no power is needed

for the ring DAC. Intended as a partner for the new A65 integrated amplifier the CD62 is available now in the DiVA range's usual black or silver. Watch out for a review in the very near future!

ear upon year of upgrading, tweaking, soldering, sawing, repositioning, re-decorating and even re-mortgaging takes it's toll upon the exhausted audiophile. There comes a time when many just wish to settle down with something that looks uniform, sounds uniform and doesn't take up the floorspace of a Combined Harvester. When this happens, where do you turn?

Some worry that less space, clutter and ugliness results in commensurately less satisfaction. Well, this isn't so. The new breed of specialist hi-fi simply needn't be a

domestic or sonic embarrassment.

What we often forget to consider, hi-fi often being a mix-and-match hobby, is the fact that manufacturers make their products to sonically and cosmetically blend and some worthwhile products are often ill matched with ancillaries of another make, resulting in an underachieving system! Traditionally reviewers and buyers like the independence and flexibility provided by mix-and-match. Manufacturers on the other hand, typically Linn and Naim, don't like their products to be used outside their own systems. They

have a sound in their head, as it were, and if you share it then you might well be best off buying just from them. Linn and Naim are not the only ones though. Here we've gathered together four, new one-make 'separates' systems and put them to the test. There are three British specialists in the shape of Audio Note, Cyrus and Naim, plus one stylish European in the chic shape of Italy's Audio Analogue. Does system synergy really work in practice? Is it our bucks or our ears that companies are really interested in? Read on...

II > AUDIO ANALOGUE SYSTEM £2275

his stylish Italian system brings together a trio of firm HFW favourites, of which two have been updated with a new design and specification. The Paganini CD player is a totally updated design that replaces the existing model we reviewed a couple of years ago in these pages. The only thing it retains is the name, as the price is up £45 too. Gone is the Sony mechanism, to be replaced by the much acclaimed Philips 'short loader' design. The DAC is a "true" 24/96 Analog Devices AD1855 chip. This means even 16bit/44.1kHz CD code is converted at high resolution, because at the heart of this conversion system is a Crystal Semiconductors sample rate convertor previously used only in professional applications. It sends the CD data into the DAC, which features all-time upsampling where the DAC will constantly give as high a resolution reading as possible from the source disc. Symmetrically placed metal buttons adorn each side of the sleek display and slimline loading drawer.

Controlling the signal we have the tried and tested Bellini preamplifier. This is a fine sounding design with the added bonus of a quality MM/MC internally switchable phono stage which, like the preamp itself, is something of a rarity at the price. Again the PCB is stuffed with high quality components and comes with a striking, weighty metal remote control for volume and input selection.

This leaves the new Donizetti monoblocks, which like the Paganini CD player have had a bit of a makeover. Although the original Donizetti two channel power amplifier is still available, the new monoblock design raises the power output to 100W per amplifier, as opposed to the 60W per channel of the original. In weight to size ratio they are surprisingly heavy due to the use of large toroidal transformers, needed to produce the quoted power. Finish is again superb and is available, should you wish for it, in black as well as silver.

This combination has a thoroughly fluid and lyrical nature to the sound that ultimately benefits 'real music', as my old school master used to say (i.e. classical and the odd bit of jazz). CDs of string section orchestrated Beethoven string quartets (conducted by Bernstein with the Vienna Philharmonic) and Messiaen's orchestral music (Boulez and the Cleveland Orchestra) had plenty of musicality and life. The sound isn't immediate and forward, deliberately, but is highly sophisticated without being sluggish or covered there's plenty of light to be found at the upper percussive frequencies.

Strings are full bodied, but they sounded a tad thin until a good running in period had transpired, something that is essential. Then, the system proved to be less recording sensitive than the likes of the Audio Note set up. Instruments were in good balance within the overall picture and woodwind were especially spacious and airy.

Jazz in the shape of Sketches Of

Spain and a Blue Note Brazilian compilation sounded fabulous, with a good sense of timing and rhythm, but with the added touch of laid-backness that's so crucial to this music, the mood being communicated equally with the notes - an important factor.

The system also performs rock and pop with conviction, although here it's more in the appealing hi-fi credentials of sound staging and imaging that immediately impress, instead of out and out rhythmic bite. Nevertheless there's plenty of clout on hand here should you wish for it, but the emphasis is on reserve and control. Both Soundgarden's Superunknown and Paul Weller's Stanley Road delivered well in these respects.

This is a highly impressive system, mainly and ironically for the fact that it doesn't immediately impress! I find this happens with the best gear - it's stuff you can live with. Other hi-fi may immediately impress in a demo room, but when taken home will annoy the hell out of you after prolonged listening. Here is a system for the refined music listener - and suffice it to say, headbangers and rave loonies wouldn't necessarily appreciate its somewhat sophisticated manners. I do, however!

More than most here this is a system that deserves to be used as a whole. There's no point in using the 8W output monoblocks with a pair of 77dB sensitivity Magneplanar 'speakers, for example! Any high sensitivity loudspeaker of over 91 dB will suffice, providing you can find one as cheap as the AZ-Three! Also, a decent alternative DAC yielded improved results, but I'd stop there. One major factor here separates this system from the rest - the inclusion of valves. The CDT Zero transport uses a fairly standard Sony mechanism and there's plenty inside to take in the audiophile's interest unlike the fascia, which is amazingly bereft of buttons. Two 'emergency' buttons at the back open the drawer and start the player - so if you loose that remote you're basically stuffed for doing anything fancy.

If you choose the matching DAC, you'll find it a fascinating filterless design, with the company's 1 x oversampling as found in the highly expensive DAC5 Signature. Inside there is an 18bit multibit converter which can work at 44.1 and 96kHz but changes incoming info up to 24bit resolution. When it comes to the

valves there is one 6111WA anode output stage.

Like the digital front end, the pre and power amps are well put together in their midi sized extruded aluminium cases. Again, the finish is available in either silver or black. The M-One R preamp has an attractive fascia which features two rotary knobs, one for volume and the other for selecting one of the four line inputs. There are two sets of preamp outs and a tape loop.

A 6111WA valve is found in the line stage and it uses quality components such as the revered Black Gate capacitors. It comes with its own remote control so to play CD you'll have to use the CD controller in conjunction with it, doing your 'Captain Zapp' impression.

The P Zero power amps feature two ECL82 triode-pentode tubes, much favoured by radio and early TV makers. They give 8W power output when run in Class AB2 mode, and they'll apparently last a good five years at least.

When it comes to sound quality, the Audio Note combo is a real treat if you're into classical in a big way. With the selected Beethoven and Messiaen discs, both fine recordings the Audio Notes delivered a sound that you'd be very hard pressed to equal at the price. The vibrancy of the recordings was wonderfully captured, with ambience and space impressively present. Instrumental tone was near perfect and the staging was deep and realistic - a real eye opener. Indeed, this wasn't so much hi-fi as music making - and there's big difference. The same was found with the Miles

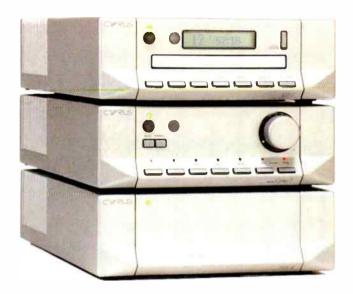
Davis Sketches Of Spain recording. It too had plenty of space and air. Instruments were clear and well rounded and the strings had body and real presence. Where the Audio Note won't impress is with 'bad' compressed rock recordings which become swamped and muddy. This is a very 'snobbish' system and anything mildly inferior will be firmly dealt with - very much in the vein of Audio Note Supremo Peter Qvortrup himself, one of the country's most avid classical record collectors. Consequently Although Paul Weller's Stanley Road was impressive enough with good imaging and drive (it's a fine recording), Soundgarden's Superunknown sounded as though it had been recorded under a wet blanket on a seventies music centre a real shock as this didn't happen at all with the other three systems. This may be due to the fact that the DAC is basically filterless and will play more or less exactly what it receives.

Despite this peculiarity the Audio Note Zero system is one of the finest music makers around at the price - and one for serious listeners, as long as they have Audio Note or other high sensitivity 'speakers that is!

II CYRUS 7 SYSTEM £1850

fter a brief and uncharacteristic spell in the doldrums, Cyrus, the Huntingdon electronics specialists are back. Their latest range of amplifiers and players offer superb sound quality and value for money - and they must have rivals worrying. Not without good cause either, as Cyrus have traditionally been ahead of their time. Using compact but sturdy cast alloy casework, right from the company's inception, rivals have become aware of the need for a stylistic re-think, in order to make their products similarly compact and domestically pleasing.

With the introduction of a DVD player and a CD/tuner receiver (the Quattro), not to mention three new loudspeakers, Cyrus have caught up with the bigger Jones's, whilst maintaining their specialist credibility. You could say now is their time.

Cyrus products almost demand to be used together because of their distinctive styling, and to retain the family sound. They naturally coalesce into a harmonious one brand system. The system we have here is perhaps one of the more 'basic' in the test but as a twist, instead of a pre/power amp combination we've added a PSX power supply unit to the Cyrus 7 integrated to give it an zest touch of refinement and grip. Incidentally, for even more refinement a PSX can be added to the CD 7 CD player, too.

The CD 7 shares little in common with its predecessor, the DAD 3, apart from its dimensions. The transport, like the Paganini's, is a Philips design and the DAC is Cyrus's

latest 24bit type. A new Q-module decoder version available for an extra £350.

It's refreshing to find a machine at this price with a rigid metal chassis, yet weighs only 3.1 kilos! You don't get the whole gamut of facilities here but the supplied remote control can be used with the complete system. The PSX 'intelligent' power supply produces between 18 and 35.5V DC according to which Cyrus product it's partnered with. The internal power supply of the Cyrus components isn't replaced but complemented, meaning both the component and power supply have to be run from the mains. Measurements are the same as the CD 7 and Cyrus 7 and the weight is a fairly heavy 6 kilos due to the 300VA toroidal transformer.

For regular readers the Cyrus 7 integrated amplifier needs no introduction. It's a line input only amp (alas, the Cyrus phono stage has been pulled from the market) with six remote switchable inputs and a host of useful electronically operated, remote control features. Power is a healthy 60W per channel, there is one tape loop and two sets of 'speaker outputs. The whole system, like the Audio Analogue, is also available in black as well as silver.

When it comes to sound quality this set up is very impressive with all types of recordings and music.

Classical discs are well focussed and rhythmic, Beethoven having an essential dance like quality. Strings are full and rounded although at the higher registers the violins sometimes sounded a tad edgy both with

Mission's 782 and Cyrus's own CLS-50 loudspeakers. The Messiaen orchestral disc had oodles of tonal colour and a pleasant sparkle, resolution of instrumental timbre being impressive for a solid state system.

Jazz music in the form of Miles Davis's Sketches Of Spain was nicely forward, with good emphasis on the placement of the instruments (this system images very well) and on rhythmic structure.

Rock and Pop demonstrated the solid and secure bass response this system has. Paul Weller's Stanley Road bounced through the speakers with verve and insight, kick drums thumping and bass guitar having a fine 'groove'. There was also a good open midrange with all guitar details present and correct - something that can often be lost in lesser systems.

Cyrus offer a well balanced and user friendly system here that delivers a fine all-round sound possessing plenty of punch and insight. It is ideal for those with a varied taste in music and not a lot of space to exercise it!

II NAIM SERIES 5 SYSTEM £2500

This system represents the new 'budget' range from Naim Audio products. Gone are the monolithic grey/green bricks and we bid welcome to the 5 series, a range of entry level products that have an attractive yet simple visual appeal -nothing flash here but it still makes a certain style statement.

The CD5, as we know from our previous review, is one of the finest CD players around at the price, with superb build - even internally! The company has paid attention to RF signal stability by designing a suspended transport located, Meridian style, in the manually operated drawer. The user must physically pull it out and push it in remarkably refreshing and quite therapeutic, incidentally.

On top of the CD sits a low profile magnetic puck for extra stability. Paths between essential components are as short as possible and there are no less than fourteen regulated power supplies on the circuit board. Individual digital and analogue transformer windings are also provided, as is additional RF interference-busting screening. As with the rest of Naim's output, additional external power supplies can be added such as the Flat-Cap or High-Cap.

Moving onto the amps, these feature the same casework as the Nait5 integrated, but the pre and power sections have gone into separate cases with a few extra tweaks here and there. Like the

whoppingly expensive, top-of-therange NAC53 preamp, the NAC112 is microprocessor controlled and comes complete with a full system remote, so volume and input switching is all operational from the armchair.

There are six line inputs and each has adjustable gain. For an extra £175 the optional StageLine phono stage can be added.

Other features include star earthing, time-aligned filter networks and optimised circuit layouts. As with the company's other preamps, the 112 is powered from the NAP150 power amplifier via a Din connector but an outboard power supply can also be used. The 150 power amplifier takes some of the circuit technology used in the awesome £10,000 NAP500. There is an output of 50W per channel - but that's 50W of Naim power - a different matter - and it can drive most 'speakers without problem.

When it comes to sound quality, those who are familiar with Naim gear will know that it has certain characteristics not found in rivals, such as an all encompassing concentration on rhythm and timing. This system, though, has a smoother presentation than predecessors, which adds a certain amount of pleasant sophistication to the equation.

The Beethoven/Bernstein recording has plenty of life and vibrancy which was somewhat lost through the 5 Series, although the sound did have an impressive urgency about it and imaging - not necessarily a Naim trademark - was very good.

Messiaen's vibrant orchestration brought out more from the system. There was more sparkle and life than with the more traditional scoring of the French master.

Jazz and Rock were more where the Naim's heart lay. Miles Davis had an excellent sense of instrumental rhythmic togetherness, with the barren trumpet blowing of Davis blending finely into the lush scoring of Gil Evans's arrangements in Sketches Of Spain. The drum kit held the whole picture together as the instruments weaved in and out of the rich performance - great stuff.

More delight was to come with Paul Weller and Soundgarden, both of which sounded fast and organic, with a fine grip on drums and bass. It wasn't the deepest or most powerful around, but it blended brilliantly with the rest of the picture.

This system is highly recommended for fans of rock and jazz, who won't be disappointed by way it grabs recordings by the seat of the pants. Those who previously regarded the Naim sound as a little forward and perhaps hard may well be pleasantly surprised by this new equipment. Good stuff, indeed.

lot of good stuff out there, it just
depends what you want from it.
Personal taste, based upon expectation, does enter into it.

The bad news is that every system here in its own right easily deserves the maximum of four globes in our World Verdict ranking system, which doesn't help matters much when it comes to guiding you as a potential buyer.

The good news is it's easy to point out the strengths of each system and any purchase should be made according to your particular taste in listening. OK, so any sensible music lover will have a pretty eclectic collection of music but there will be one common trait that should shine through in your collection - this could be the decider. Our results are below, take your pick.

The Audio Analogue system is for the person who favours more gentle strains of music, such as classical or jazz. Even though it gave good results with all music, these genres shone through. The sound wasn't forward or intrusive, so much as lyrical and flowing - a true hi-fi product in the good old fashioned mould, but with impeccable modern styling. Not that this system doesn't have plenty of power and dynamics, it does, but that is different to the sheer brute force of some set-ups. If you're into Motorhead, look elsewhere. If you're into Vivaldi and Miles Davis, don't. This system will give the right owner many years of musical satisfaction.

The Audio Note system is for the classical music lover who attends plenty of concerts and wants to relive the experience. It produces a fine, open sound that's very hard to better at the price. As long as recording quality is good it can take your breath away. Indeed, when this is

so, the system is so good it defies the term hi-fi and enters into the realms of 'music system' (not in the seventies meaning of the term, though). However, when it's bad it's bad and it's down to the recording and nothing else. The Audio Note is so finely honed as a system it will spit out anything sonically inferior with a venom I've rarely encountered! One for the real discerning listener.

If your taste is truly eclectic and you listen to virtually everything the obvious choice here would be the best all rounder which is undoubtedly the Cyrus system. OK, so it doesn't have the sophistication of the Audio Analogue sound, the openness of the Audio Note or the rhythmic control of the Naim but it will give a good account of itself with whatever you chuck at it, and it doesn't make for difficult 'speaker partnering. This is my choice for those who can mix James Last with Abbess Hildegard of Bingen (if there's such a person out there!). It has bass depth and control, a transparent and open sound which both impresses and satisfies. Highly recommended for those who wish to sit on the fence and enjoy the experience.

Next the Naim 5 Series. Here's a sophisticated performer with fantastic build quality for the price. The CD player is a cracker, having a firm control on music. Rock and pop are played with magnificent attack and speed, the bass tuneful and fast.

With classical its sound can err on the grey side, but rhythms will still cut through to give an exciting, if not utterly faithful rendition.

Such matters apart I can wholly recommend this system beyond doubt and here's why. Being the kind of greedy person that always chooses two entirely different things from the menu, I always thought in an ideal world I'd have a valve system for transparency and colour and a Naim system for its outright boogie factor. Hearing this system simply confirmed this. After all, opposites attract don't

they? This sort of sound won't suit everyone but nothing at the price does what it does as well, if you get my drift!

David Price tries to fathom Linn's impossibly expensive new Komri 'flagship high performance full range monitor loudspeakers'.

ow do you judge a hi-fi product that you - and very few others - will ever be able to afford? Here in my Hi-Fi World Reviewer's Handbook, it simply says, "on merit". Fair enough then - they're bloody awesome. Next!

But seriously, Linn's new Komri will set back the few people fortunate enough to countenance a pair the princely sum of £25,000. Of course, you don't need me to tell you how ludicrous a sum of money that is for any bit of hi-fi equipment. I'll just quietly point out that in the city of Carlisle where Peter Tyson hi-fi is the dealer that was kind enough to procure and slavishly set a pair up for me - you can buy a basic two bedroom semi for that sort of cash. Logically then, all statements about value have to be removed from the equation. However great these things are, in value for money terms ...

I have to declare a love/hate relationship with Linn speakers. It isn't that I celebrate some aspects of their performance and decry others rather, I literally adore certain models from Linn's long back catalogue and detest others. The company - in my humble opinion - has been uncharacteristically hit and miss with this particular link in the audio chain.

It was poetic justice then that the last speakers I heard before auditioning the Komris were a pair of 1986 Kans. Although they're a tragically flawed product (but let's not kid ourselves, almost all loudspeakers are), they have an essential musicality that just makes you want more, more, more. With my exhaustive knowledge of the intricacies of

speaker design, I'd already figured the vast five-way Komris (giving a claimed 20Hz-28kHz (+/- 3dB) would sound more natural at the frequency extremes, but I still carried a lingering scepticism about their ability to better the Kans in the foot-tapping stakes.

BIG BROTHERS

They're certainly imposing. At 1163.5x420x520mm and weighing 84kg a side (finished in Black, Cherry and Maple woods), they make my reference Yamaha NS1000Ms look like a pair of Vivanco in-ear headphones. Each Komri houses a super-tweeter, tweeter and midrange driver, plus one upper bass driver in an acoustic array and twin long-throw active bass drivers. These latter two drivers use a motion sensor to tailor the bass response electronically to the room (and the speaker's interaction therein), working in a similar (but far more sophisticated way) to Philips' legendary motional feedback loudspeakers of the seventies. To allow for variations in the size and characteristics of listening rooms, the roll-off characteristics of the servo system are adjustable via a soft-key control panel on the back of the speaker.

Interesting - but Linn is also very proud of its unique 4K acoustic array, claimed to give a single-point, highly defined acoustic centre with uniform dispersion for midband and treble duties. This consists of the two high frequency drivers and midrange driver closely bridge-mounted over the upper bass driver, with result that





passive crossover (don't worry - active will be here soon) uses the highest quality air-cored, litz-wound inductors and polypropylene capacitors for minimum loss and distortion. For their size and active gubbins, they give a reasonable 87dB sensitivity rating and present a nominal 8 ohm load.

The problem I have in describing the Komris' sound is their inherent lack of character. They don't - unlike almost all other loudspeakers I've heard - make you think, 'that's a very fast loudspeaker', or 'that's really warm and sweet'. Rather, I found myself running the gamut of my CD collection trying to pin down the Komri's essential nature, which was trickier than I'd expected.

The first thing that strikes the uninitiated is that they're very much a full range speaker. You're not listening to transducers which attempt to be a window on the world here, you're hearing the world itself. That means very, very deep bass - but not, I might add overblown. Indeed, the Komri's sound bass light on music without much low frequency content - which is just as it should be. The point is that they're not adding anything; no out of control cabinetry here, thanks very much.

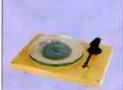
It also means very open and natural sounding treble - switch over to a pair of Ninkas (or indeed any other perfectly respectable 'mere mortal' loudspeakers) and it's like someone's started fiddling with the tilt control on your old Quad preamp. There's an obvious lack of bite to the highs - unless the occasion demands it - again meaning that not here will you witness the spectacle of a sorry high frequency transducer dirtying and

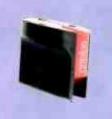
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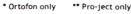

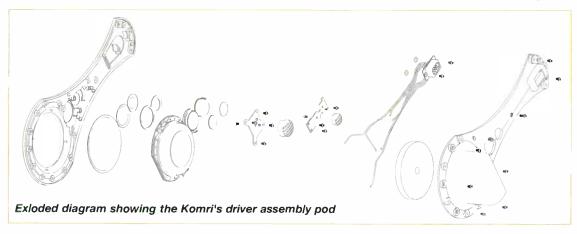
irritating all those sweet sounds coming downstream from your CD12. The frequency extremes are utterly unremarkable then - in the sense that the Komris do very little to them. They don't add, detract, multiply or divide - you simply hear what was there in the first place, to a very great extent.

If this makes for boring reading, then you won't like what I've got to say about the midband. Once again, less is more. That's less coloration, phase incoherence, muddling of the stereo image, dynamic compression, softening of transients, sullying of rhythms, distortion or any other nasties. The Komris simply let the festivities happen. Feed them with heavily compressed dance music and that's what you hear, with an incredible dynamic articulation but next to no euphonic bass boom or spitty treble to jolly on the proceedings. In an instant the Komris communicate the particular



The result is a loudspeaker that's alarmingly devoid of flaws at almost every level. My tastes would ask for a slightly sweeter, silkier treble such as that from the Beryllium unit fitted to Yamaha's NS1000M.1 could do with a tad less control in the bass sometimes it's nice to have just a wee bit of overhang and bloom to flesh out the proceedings. But these are both just personal whims - the point is that the Komris are so fearsomely capable in so many respects you find yourself wanting some coloration to give them some kind of easily identifiable character!

No doubt about it, Linn's new Komri's give an



goings on in the recording studio on the date the music you're listening to was committed to tape (or hard drive, as it is these days). You can hear the quality of the vocal mikes, the producer's thoughts on instrument placement, squeaks, rattles, noisy desks, injudicious use of EQ and so on and so forth. But unlike a number of other super-transducers (Quad 989s, for example), they're not at all deconstructive - they don't take things apart piece by piece. Quite the reverse in fact, because what they do is almost greater than the sum of the musical parts.

IMAGE CONCIOUS

The next important point about the Komris is the imaging. Wry smiles here when we remember the Isobarik (bless!), but these new Linn boxes project better than your average stadium floodlight. Given the right size room, a brace of barrel-chested amplifiers and the will to use the volume control in anger, these speakers are practically hallucinogenic.

The Komri can go boldy into the centre of the room, and fall back behind the rear wall too. Image location is pin-sharp - well, almost. I've heard Quads, Martin Logans, big Tannoys and similar electrostatic and/or coaxials do it a smidgin better. But these are all more compromised at the frequency extremes, thanks to their respective driver types or layouts. The Komris are probably the best combination of soundstaging and frequency extension I've heard - and believe me, it's rare to hear both from the same speaker.

incredibly powerful, staggeringly incisive, massively engaging and satisfying performance - with virtually none of the pitfalls associated with other, rival big hitters. They are awesomely fluid and natural sounding - they just cut to the chase and get on with getting you closer to the music - which is just how it should be. We should applaud Linn for finally giving us conclusive proof that the less a loudspeaker does, the better it surely is. As the Komri's show us, less is most definitely more.

World Verdict

Incredible in so many respects, the Komris let any music sound quite sublime.

ROSE TINTED

Mark Levinson's new Red Rose venture includes some of the sweetest looking and sounding hifi on the planet. Simon Pope encounters the Rosette 1 integrated. Will it come out smelling of them, we ask ourselves?

f you were paying close attention to a recent episode of the Channel 4 hit 'Sex And The City' (in which our journalist heroine was dating a wally beatnik Jazzer) the alert among you would have noticed vinyl treasures being played through a cute looking silver valve amp. It was one of the earlier products of the fairly new Red Rose Music company based in New York and fronted by none other than a certain Mark Levinson. It's appearance was no accident: lucky Mr. Levinson is married to Kim Catrall who plays the sassy and over-sexed Samantha in the series. Incidentally, it was also no accident that the wally Jazzer listened only to vinyl, as Mr. Levinson also has a garlicto-a-vampire reaction to digital PCM - more of which later!

The aforementioned amplifier featured on the telly was actually part of a line up that was only available in a 'system' consisting of an amplifier with ribbon tweetered 'speakers - and the price was steep.

Now the company have launched what they describe as a new range of "affordable" products (available separately), of which the electronics are solid-state as opposed to tubular. And guess what? They're made in China. Actually, the design work is done 'in house' by Levinson and Victor Tiscareno in collaboration with significant contributions from a designer in China, where the products are made, including the drive units for the new 'speakers. Doubting Thomas's had better keep 'stum' though, because build quality is

superb. More and more upmarket players are considering the manufacturing move to the Far East as belts are tightened and cash flow examined - it makes a lot of sense. This particular collaboration results in products at "price points significantly lower than any previous product conceived and designed by Mark Levinson". Well there's no denying its true, but the strikingly cute Rosette amplifier reviewed here still costs just the right side of £3000 - ouch!

It is a 50W per channel stereo design of considerable weight for the size, which is of vertical midi sized proportions and can literally be placed into a bookshelf without any trouble. It's also ideal for multiroom applications and four units can be placed side by side in a base plate for rack or shelf mounting. Both the look and electronic design of the amp is almost painfully simple yet highly effective. We have only four line inputs (there is soon to be a Rosette 2 phono stage) with a metal selector button for each on the fascia, accompanied by a rotary volume control and an on/off switch.

And that's it, no bells or whistles and not even a remote - it's as sparse as they come. However, don't be mistaken by the midi like dimensions; we're very much in high-end territory here, both build wise and sound wise. Either side of the metallic tower are massive heatsinks which apparently allow high bias currents to be applied

to the output devices. The amp is also stuffed with high grade components for a genuine 'high end' sound.

SOUND QUALITY

Never has the phrase 'keep it simple' been so aptly applied than to the Rosette. Not only is the design simple but so is the sound, and in a world of complication, that's a compliment. That's not to say it's grey or lifeless - it's far from it but it plays music so effortlessly that it's hard not to be impressed. Listening took place with a range of sources - including, shock horror, Compact Disc. It's at this point I should explain something. As I mentioned earlier Levinson has an aversion to PCM. His view is that "PCM recording and playback" is at the root of many people's dissatisfaction with modern audio. However, he is a fully paid up member of the DSD fanclub, even to the point of having an SACD recording facility in the Red Rose showroom in Manhattan. The design of this amplifier was considered by using non-PCM sources as an audio benchmark. So, I duly rolled in a Sony SACD player along with my LP12 and Michell's Dino phono stage (the Rosette 2 wasn't available for the review) and got to work. 'Speaker

were courtesy of Diapason and Red Rose's own very fine Rosebud ribbon tweeter design (much more of which next month). Cabling was Chord Company and Red Rose's own design.

A selection of SACD's showed up a very sweet and musical, yet analytical, sound. Bass, as always, with Levinson inspired gear was excellent. Fast and tuneful, the bass lines became an integral part of the music, not swamping the sound but remaining perfectly balanced. Frankie Goes To Hollywood's SACD compilation brought stunning results. Vocals were clean and meticulous and the detail was beyond reproach. A fine, deep soundstage moved the sound well back into the room.

Midrange was open and effortless and treble exceptionally sweet. Classical SACD recording, in the shape of Fauré and Debussy Piano Trios on Hyperion, was equally impressive in detail and poise.

Ploughing through my vinyl record collection brought equally fine results. Jazz was brilliantly reproduced with a smooth and silky nature and rock sounded full and detailed. Where the Rosette really shone was in intimate music such as Thelonius Monk's tinkering or Yo-Yo Ma playing Bach's sublime cello suites. Only in large orchestral music did the Rosette sometimes 'thin out' a little and loose some presence. And with CD? Well, I found no problems. With

Paul Weller's Stanley Road and Pollini playing Schumann the sound was as confident and accomplished as with SACD and vinyl. Sorry!

There is a point at which this amplifier ventures into valve territory - no surprise really. It has a sweet and subtle sound that manages to be perfectly effortless yet musically satisfying, with excellent tonal colour. It doesn't have oodles of clout or dynamics but that's not what this sound is about, although the bass has depth, control and a endearing quality to it.

Downsides? Looking at it practically the downside could be the price - it's very heavy at £3000, but it does have a sound to compete with some of the best solid-state designs at this price - if perhaps not the power reserves. If you're after a beautiful looking design with a sweet and controlled sound, and more importantly you have the money - it's the one for you.

MEASURED PERFORMANCE

This neatly packaged amplifier produces a useful 55W into 80hms and 80W into 40hms, so in spite of its small size it has a useful amount of punch - enough to give high volumes in the average sized room, using sensitive modern loudspeakers.

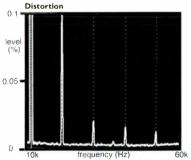
The distortion characteristic was a little unusual, with a strong second order component and extended harmonics. The latter were at a low level so they should hopefully not be audibly intrusive. Distortion levels were acceptably low at 0.1% at low power outputs and a trifle less at full

output. Bandwidth has been limited to 30kHz, perhaps to warm the sound a little.

With high sensitivity of 200mV giving good matching to legacy tuners, cassette decks and such like, plus low noise and wide channel separation the Red Rose amplifier measures well in all areas and should give a good account of itself in use. **NK**

David Price tries out Origin Live's new Ultra suspended chassis turntable kit, claimed to give the very highest vinyl replay standards in just two

hours!

turntable kit? I can't possibly do that, thought I, until I remembered that I've spent hundreds of hours crawling under a Linn LP12 (suspended between two kitchen stools with its bottom plate off) trying to fettle the damn thing. Then there's the weeks spent disassembling and reassembling my Michells - which effectively come sold as kits anyway. So I approached the task as a 'keen amateur', rather than someone with some special connection to the weird and wonderful world of turntable construction.

> Further investigation (i.e. a quick look at the bits out of the box) revealed that the Ultra is more 'screw-it-yourself' than 'do-ityourself'. You don't actually have to turn the platter on a lathe, spot weld the subchassis or veneer the plinth wood all by yourself. Nor does the motor need to be bushed or the power supply coiled - essentially, it's all done for you. This is more of a join the dots exercise, rather than some weird voyage into the tweaky unknown. Origin Live's Mark Baker reckons that it should take between one and four hours to build, depending on your level of competency. As for me, I'm pleading the Fifth Amendment.

CONSTRUCTION TIME AGAIN

Ideally, Origin Live recommend you have a ruler or measuring tape to hand, along with a marker pen, a small hacksaw or powerful snips, a cross head screwdriver, 3mm or 3.5mm drill, a pair of pliers or Molegrips, a hammer and a spirit

level. A soldering iron is useful but not essential.

First step is to undo the two transit bolts which hold the subchassis onto the top board of the turntable plinth. Then the rubber feet are fitted using four nails provided, and the lid hinges go onto the lid using the four M4 bolts and nuts. This involves drilling holes for the hinge screws in the plinth using a 3mm or 3.5mm drill. Origin Live recommend removing the lid for easier access to deck during the rest of the build.

Next, to be fitted is the motor switch and DC regulator board, attached to the plinth. The switch shaft must be cut using a hacksaw or powerful wiresnips. It can then be fitted in position by pushing it through the pre-drilled hole at the front left hand side of the plinth, gently tightening the top clamping nut

using the 2mm Allen key provided.

The standard DC regulator board is then positioned on the left underside of the plinth top board (close to the walls of the plinth front corner), via two No 6 screws and washers.

At this point three threaded support bolts are fitted to the plinth top board to take the sub-chassis. But first the bearing housing must be attached; Origin Live recommend only 'nipping' the nuts, since "more force than this is detrimental to performance", says Mark Baker. This aside, all the bolts on the sub-chassis are pre-torqued to the correct tension and should NOT be tightened. No! Stop! Even though you know you want to!

The subchassis attaches to the spring plate by one pivot bolt, which lets it swivel freely. This, too, is a

'tighten at your peril' point.

The motor is next in line for attention. It should be fitted to the motor plate using the three small machine screws supplied. Again, it's

a case of not overtightening, lest too much motor noise be transmitted into the plinth.

The springs go in next, between the sub-chassis and plinth via support rods. With characteristic attention to detail, each particular spring is of a different compliance and has to be positioned correctly, following the diagram in the instructions.

It's now time to warm up the Antex and get out the Multicore - the red wire from the DC regulator is soldered to the positive terminal on the motor, and the black one goes to the other. After dressing the power supply leads away from the sub-chassis (to avoid restricting its movement), it's time to fit the arm.

At this stage in the game, it isn't necessary to fettle the arm to the nth degree - essentially it has to go on so you can balance the suspension. All else can come later. Bolt the arm to the armboard using the large Rega bolt - to finger tightness only. The arm cable can then be fixed to the deck in the usual way

by a cable clip screwed into the underside of the plinth. As LP12 tweakers know all too well - dress the clip so that it isn't tight and there's a degree of elasticity.

Finally, it's time for the platter and sub-platter to reach their rightful place. First drop the 4mm ball-bearing into the bearing housing, assuming it isn't already there, then drop some oil in and carefully lower the sub-platter spindle down.

SOUND AFFECTS?

The deck is now a living, breathing disc spinner, but despite slavish following of the forensically detailed instructions, it still needs a bit of extra fettling. The platter has to be

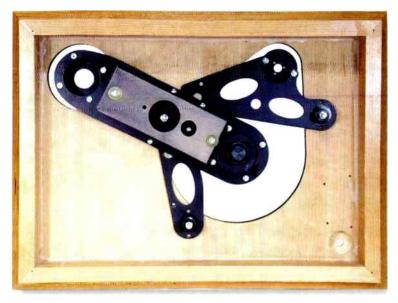

levelled using the nuts under the spring assemblies, with the belt in situ. Interestingly, Mark Baker recommends first cleaning all the running surfaces with methylated or surgical spirit - this is an old trick I tends to drift but then settles down permanently. With this in mind, there isn't much point doing your final adjustments until things have run in a bit. For this purpose, a strobe disc is thoughtfully supplied, which proved just as accurate as my very expensive SME one.

At this point, I feel bound to say that the instructions that come with the Origin Live Ultra are disarmingly good. Short of Mark Baker getting in his car and coming round to your place to personally talk you through the process, you really couldn't ask for more. Not only are they clearly and concisely written, they're packed with little asides about setting the

deck up for best sound (usually along the lines of 'don't overtighten this or that nut - just nip it'!). They could stand alone as a seminal work on classic suspended subchassis turntable set-up in their own right.

There's also tracts of stuff on arm and turntable set-up theory and practice - forget the deck - it's worth paying this much for the manual!

But seriously - the Ultra is more than just a lovely bunch of instructions. The quality of all the bits, plinth, fixtures and fittings is superb and frankly you wouldn't find this sort of class on any ready-made turntable costing under £1,000. As a gauge, the fit and finish of the bits is easily up to LP12 standards, whereas the latter doesn't have an expensive Acrylic platter or DC motor. If you've only got £500 odd to spend, I can't think of anything else this sophisticated by half.

MUSIC MATTERS

I tested the Ultra with both a standard Origin Live RB250 with structural mod, and a brand shiny new £599 Origin Live Silver RB250, via an Ortofon Kontrapunkt B and a Plinius Jarrah phono stage, going into a World Audio valve power amp and my resident monster monitor Yamaha NS1000Ms. Essentially the Ultra kit is very self-effacing. It doesn't have an obvious character in the manner of a Linn LPI2, but is clean, open and balanced with no 'hot spots' or troublesome areas. I got the impression of a Rega Planar 3-like sound, but with all the bugs ironed out. By this I mean it's extremely even handed and neutral, and just gets on with the job of playing music.

Kicking off with my evergreen reference track, 4Hero's 'Escape That', the Ultra cut straight to the chase in the way that high quality

Bitstream CD players can. There was no obvious 'character'; no discernable need or desire on behalf of the OL to editorialise. What I heard was a wide open soundstage, with fine depth perspective and tight image location - not quite as precise as Michell decks admittedly - in which all the various parts of the mix could live and breathe. Until the arrival of the Michell DC motor, this Ultra kit would have walked all over the Gyro in terms of musicality. It's extremely fast and taut, yet very 'fluent' sounding with no obvious inclinations towards the 'mechanical'.

Running the gamut of my jazz LPs, the Ultra proved extremely adept at imparting both the groove and the texturality of the sound - it swings and it sings. You hear a bunch of musicians playing together, but you can also stop to enjoy the deliciously raspy brass sounds, the deep, resonant pianos and the full bodied bass. The latter is perhaps the most impressive - there's no overhang and bags of articulation. Treble is sweet and open - although not quite as neutral as a Michell. The fact that it can be mentioned in the same breath as a Gyro SE is a remarkable feat for a £500 box of bits though - only a slight lack of clarity and grip differentiates the two.

Overall a deeply impressive deck then. It runs designs at nearly twice the price extremely close in many respects. Building it will take you an evening, but it's fun to get your hands dirty once in a while and you've got massive room for experimentation and tweaking. The 'engineering depth' of this kit is remarkable - building it gives you the impression the Origin Live have specified every last nut and bolt with sound in mind - something that auditioning only confirms. Brilliant value for money.

David Price tries out a brace of cleaning aids for your vinyl, MiniDisc and cassette sources.

he problem with record cleaning is that it's generally a case of all or nothing. You elther ship your prized vinyl down to your local Keith Monks machineowning record shop (or buy one yourself), or feebly apply your threadbare carbon fibre brush as your vinyl spins on your deck. The former approach will reward you with beautifully revitalised playing surfaces, not to mention a serious improvement in sound thanks to the dreaded Mould Release Agent being washed out. The latter will just about remove an hour's worth of dust, fluff and cat hairs, but if you've got greasy, ingrained dirt and stains then you're wasting your time.

There is a compromise though -

for a while I've been using an Audio Technica record cleaning pad. I place my gungey black plastic onto my turntable, liberally pour a mixture of Isopropyl alcohol and distilled water onto the surface, spin the platter (in the case of my Michell Orbe, using the very handy knurled knob of the record clamp), and apply the pad from the outside inwards. This works surprisingly well, but is contingent on you getting the knack and drying the disc off with another, dry pad. Unfortunately the whole process has to be repeated - because there's two sides to do, obviously - meaning it's a rather tedious and time-consuming business.

Enter the 'Disco Antistat', hor from Germany. This attempts to do similar things to my manual Audio Technica pad-based clean, but in a

fraction of the time. Upon first inspection of the packaging, and the item itself, I wasn't expecting very much - basically it's just a cheap bit of plastic. I have to admit, however, that it actually works surprisingly well. Don't get me wrong - it is not a substitute for a Keith Monks, or even a Moth cleaning machine, but it does fill the gap between the aforementioned and nothing rather well.

All you do is unscrew the knurled disc clamp, insert the record, screw the clamp back up so it's holding the disc, then place the clamp's spindle in the recess. Half of the record will now be sitting in the fluid trough, in-between a pair of stiff brushes. You just fill the trough up with 'disco-antistat mixture' and rotate the record around in the trough using the clamp. After you've done this for a minute or so, all but the deepest bits of gunk will have come out of the grooves and into the fluid. You then pull the record out of the trough, unscrew the clamp and place the record on the supplied record rack to dry. At first I thought the manufacturers had forgotten to include this, but then I realise it clips into the base of the trough! Neat. So, this may look like something made by Ronco from the 1970s, but it works far better, It comes heartily recommended - as a 'stopgap' if you can't afford anything better.

ROSS MINIDISC CLEANER £9

e all know about cleaning cassettes and CD laser cleaning discs, but what do you do about MD maintenance? Nothing, it seems, until the introduction of this little gadget. In truth, because of MiniDisc's floppy diskstyle enclosed design, it's far less susceptible to dirt and gunge sullying the laser, but it still happens. And if you're a smoker then your MD lens can very quickly get gunk sticking to it, so this becomes even more of an issue. Don't ask me how the Ross MD cleaner works, but it does - just. Living in laboratory-clean conditions as I do, with no smoke in my abode short of that from the occasional bit of burnt toast, my lens was already sparkling - but this thing still seemed to add just a touch more detail and sparkle in the treble. Once again, recommended.

his rather pretentiously named cleaning cassette is eerily reminiscent of the Allsop cleaners that sold so well back in the eighties. More than just a mildly abrasive tape spinning over the heads, it uses pads pre-moistened with Isopropyl alcohol to reach places that previously only cotton buds dared to go. It works very well

too, being second only to the aforementioned bit of fluff on a stick. Importantly though, some decks - especially car players or certain exotics like Yamaha's TC-800GL don't have removable cassette compartment doors, so cotton buds are largely useless for cleaning the capstan and pinch wheels. Here, the Bib comes into its own and does a top job. Cheap, effective, easy to use - you can't ask for more!

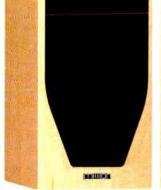

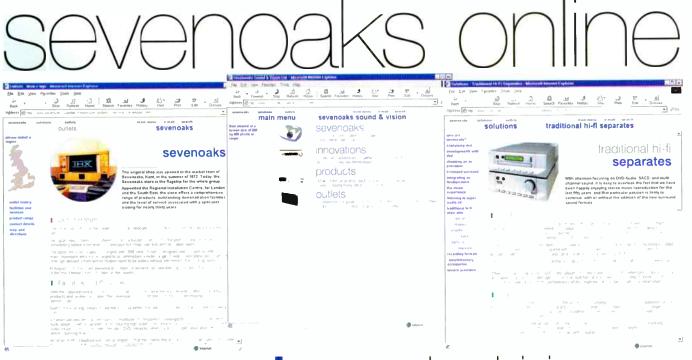

ROGUE



Andy Grove tackles a pair of American bruisers in the shape of Rogue Audio's M120 monoblock power amps.

he MI 20s are big American style power amps utilising four Sovtek KT88s per channel for their I 20W per channel output. Driving these are two NOS (New Old Stock) 5814 (ECC82 or I2AX7) valves and a NOS I 2AX7 (ECC83). The ironwork (which is hidden under the front mounted power bulge) was obviously pretty serious as these amps are heavy and would need to be placed on the floor or upon a heavy duty dedicated support, I chose the former option.

Their construction is high quality, with a solid bolted-together feel and attractive anodised front panel. My only gripe in this department was the speaker terminals which, although perfectly adequate electrically, seem out of place on the back of such a solidly engineered piece of equipment. Speaker impedance options are 4 and 8 ohms which are catered for by two independent sets of terminals. The component quality was also of high, with Dale resistors and SCR capacitors.

Unusually, these amplifiers sounded a bit dull at turn on, gaining more sparkle and openness after ten or so minutes of use. What was immediately obvious though was a

sense of latent power as I opened the evening's performance with a little of Beethoven's Fifth, conducted by another rogue, Otto Klemperer. The opening bars were typically dark and foreboding, the cellos and basses powering into the room in a sinister way.

This type of music obviously suited the M120s so I switched to the fourth movement of Beethoven's Ninth with it's incredible vocal complexity. I tried two recordings/ conductors, once again Otto Klemperer and the other Josef Krips. Here I found that the M120s sounded somewhat dull unless the volume was increased; the choir gained openness and sparkle with increased volume.

These amplifiers showed they were capable of driving my QUAD 989s to greater than realistic levels. I couldn't say which performance was the better interpretation of the composer's intent, but on this setup the Krips performance was more pleasing to me on that day. It was less dark and introverted musically and the recording had a lighter treble which opened out the soundstage.

I changed to CD and spun up Massive Attack's Mezzanine to test out the very low bass. The MI20s are certainly not lacking in this area and exposed the qualities of the big electrostatics. Bass was deep and pretty solid. I could now understand my mental notes regarding what I had heard with Beethoven. These amps have a powerful liquid bass like a dark primordial lake from which the rest of the music emerges into the sunlight.

The acoustic drum recording used on the Mediaeval Baebes CD was also reproduced with power, underpinning the lightness of the girl's voices. I don't know exactly what sort of drum it is but it seems that the musician can let the skin continue to resonate or stop it dead, an effect expressed fully by the M120/989 combination. Once again a little more volume than usual was needed to open the amps up and create a good soundstage.

More conventional rock was reproduced very well indeed; the power of these amplifiers was in no doubt whatsoever. Whether it's Korn, Metallica or Jeff Healy the M120s give a live performance in your front room. The fire and angst of the metal bands can thrust you into your sofa like a Saturn 5 launch if you want it to (and you have speakers which can

reproduce that sort of SPL). Jeff Healy's guitar work on "Confidence Man" was truly amazing. His gritty, bluesy voice came over with gusto as well; I could imagine myself in the studio with the band. The forward sound of the rock mixes suited the M120s well.

I went back to vinyl again for some lighter music and Beethoven's Violin Concerto, with Ruggiero Ricci, conducted by Sir Adrian Boult. This superb performance and recording was reproduced with true drama and passion and maybe, again, a hint of darkness. Musical expression came pouring out of the 989s. I could hear the organic woodiness of the violin's body and the shrillness of the fingered strings lighting up the performance.

Acoustic guitar was also reproduced very well (Rodrigo, Concerto de Aranjuez), although there was a trace of excessive smoothness to the sound.

The M120s have a smooth, silky presentation with very powerful, deep bass. Sometimes they could sound just a tad too dark and oily, maybe even sinister. This was great with some music but if you like a light and delicate sound then these amps are not for you. They are very powerful and seem to require a bit of throttle before they open up. Imagine

a high performance racing engine. Below 4000rpm the engine is reluctant; above that and you get neck breaking acceleration. The M120s seem to be similar, it's not until

they are working heavily that they give their best. Unusually, I

would think that speakers like those of ATC with their lowish sensitivity but very high power handling and bright studio sound would be absolutely ideal with these amps.

MEASURED PERFORMANCE

Using parallel KT88 output valves per monoblock the Rogue amplifiers produce 98W per channel from their 80hm tap. The 40hm tap is equally efficient, producing 100W into 40hms. Being 'load matched' valve amps are meant to produce the same power from either tap and this the Rogues do nicely. As valve amps go they are powerful of course and will have plenty of punch, especially since output held up well down at 40Hz and up at 10kHz, where core saturation and excessive reactance are respective problems on designs with poor output transformers. The Rogue amplifiers avoid these problems.

A bandwidth of 6Hz-24kHz down at one watt output shows

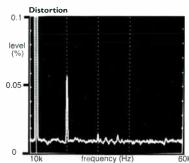
there's adequate bandwidth for modern programme, excluding SACD or DVD-A. Distortion levels were low enough, considering the main distortion component was second harmonic, levels measuring 0.14% at IW in the midband and 0.22% at full output. At high frequencies performance held up well enough, even though a figure of 1.8% at full output suggests problems. However, with 100W available it is very unlikely this situation will even be approached.

Input sensitivity at maximum was a useful 70mV and noise low at -82dB

The Rogue amplifiers proved powerful and basically well designed. They should give a good account of

themselves. NK

TURN IT ON



Arcam's top 'Full Metal Jacket' CD player has just had a thorough makeover. David Price tries out the brand new FMJ CD23T.

ith its sweet, beguiling sound, the original Arcam FMJ CD23 silver disc spinner was most decidedly not broke, so why then - I wondered did they need to fix it? The answer wasn't what I'd expected. Rather than some particular failing, fault or foible being chanced upon by the boffins up in Huntingdon, the new machine comes about thanks to the rather prosaic matter of component supply. Put simply, the CDM14 transport mechanism which the original enjoyed has now been given its marching orders by Sony and gone to the great CD graveyard in the sky. Suddenly, Arcam had to find something else to put in the hole where the old mech once was.

The answer was - surprise, surprise - a new Sony mech. But it wasn't that simple, because the new one came with a different CD Textenabled dot-matrix display, so you couldn't use one without the other, and so on and so forth. More compatibility issues ensued, and so to cut a long story short, Arcam took the plunge and decided to do a full-on revamp of their star player - which, lest we forget, had not a lot wrong with it in the first place!

Aside from the new transport (which, incidentally, supports CD-R and CD-RWs far better than the previous one), there's a new dual layer motherboard with improved power supply grounding and improved buffering of clocks and audio data to give a cleaner signal.

The Ring DAC board is revamped with an improved master clock and clock output distribution circuitry. It comes complete with Pacific Microsonics' new PM200 Digital filter, and an improved passive audio output filter which is said to reduce distortion in the audio band.

To these tweaks you can add the former player's useful vibration damping, high quality power supply and exquisitely finished metal casing and front panel, along with its standard coaxial and optical digital outs round the back.

Despite all this new digital derring do, the heart of the CD23 remains the same. This is the muchvaunted 'Ring DAC' which first appeared on the Alpha some years ago. More than just a gimmick, it deploys some serious technology refined by dCS (Data Conversion Systems) based on research done in the UK in the 1980s on military aircraft radar. Combining multibit and Delta Sigma technology, it works by continuously varying the number and positions of the selected current sources from sample to sample, as though around a circle. This ensures the inevitable slight variations in the values of the current sources are randomly distributed throughout the quantising range, effectively turning tolerance errors into random white noise rather than distortion.

Ring DAC technology addresses the failings of both multibit convertors (which work well when correctly adjusted, but are critically dependent both on the tolerances of their resistor networks and on glitch-free electronic switching) and Bitstream DACs (which give poor signal-to-noise ratios, only overcome by heavy oversampling and noise shaping). The result, Arcam say, high linearity plus very low noise and distortion.

So much for the theory - what of the practice? First, its manufacturer's recommend the FMJ CD23T should get at least 150 hours of burning in before it's used in anger. This done, I powered up my Cyrus 7/PSX-R amps and Mission 782 loudspeakers and let rip. Despite the fairly extensive surgery, the new player sounds very much like the last one, just a little more so. What you get is all of the old model's beguiling, big hearted musicality, with extra depth, detail and grip added on.

I kicked off with Appaloosa's 'Travelling' (from LTJ Bukem's 'Earth Vol. One') - a powerful, expansive piece of drum and bass. As per the old model, the new CD23 loved it, even though it shouldn't have. This kind of music thrives in ultra grippy. tight-as-a-drum machines such as Naim's CD5 and to a lesser extent, Cyrus's CD7. The FMI CD23, however, veers towards warm and sweet - so it's unusual to find a machine with 'the best of both worlds' - pleasing tonality and a vicelike grip on the rhythms. As well as summoning up big, fulsome bass lines and a panoramic soundstage, the FMJ proved incisive and grippy. 'Travelling'

AGAIN

is a rhythmically intricate piece of music, with a strong counterplay between bass, snares and looped hihats - and the Arcam signposted it up for all to enjoy.

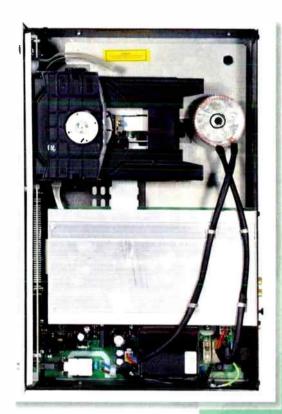
Moving to a slice of classic rock courtesy of Thin Lizzy, 'Waiting for an Alibi', the CD23 played another ace its extremely natural and clear midband. This is immediately obviously on vocals - rarely have I heard Phil Lynott's voice sound so tactile and expressive. Better still, the Arcam strings all the different bits of the mix together in an infectious way, the result being a particularly involving and organic sound - dare I say, more 'analogue' than all of its immediate rivals, save possibly the Meridian 506.24. However obstructively complex the mix is, this player just 'lets the flavour flood out'. Importantly however, it doesn't sound showy in the way that rival Japanese players do (Sony SCD-555ES, you know who you are!) - it's musical.

Fleetwood Mac's 'Sara' was a delight - on lesser machines it's a lacklustre, lolloping old piece of seventies prog, but through the Arcam it was quite hypnotic; enchanting even. The CD23 duly separated the mix's component parts

into living instruments, all playing together joyously.

Feed the FMI natural acoustic recordings, such as Lee Morgan's 'The Rajah' - using little more than a pair of crossed mics and a tape whirring away at 15ips - and you begin to suspect that this player sprinkles magic dust on everything it touches. It goes right for the musical jugular and lets the sun shine in. Put against the Naim CD5, and you begin to see what it's doing wrong. Bass is a touch too warm and possesses a little bit too much overhang, the treble is just a little too good (i.e. sweet) to be true and there's a subtle flattening of dynamics.

The new Arcam FMJ CD23 is not dramatically better than its forbear, but the mods have still injected some welcome bite and punch into what was already an extremely fulfiling listen. This player knows the difference between 'thoroughly recreating' the music and deconstructing it, whereas some of its more superficially detailed and punchy rivals do not. Better than ever, if you want a jack of all trades and master of many for under £1200, I can think of no other machine which comes close.

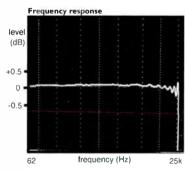
Traditionally Arcam CD players have had a response trace characterised by falling upper treble, which gives a softer sound. This new player moves away from this approach and will likely have a slightly brighter balance than the company's earlier designs. All the same, our analysis shows it is basically accurate and should, subjectively, have a natural enough tonal balance.

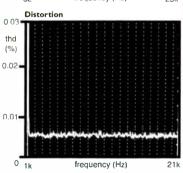
Noise and distortion levels were a little higher than the best rivals, as comparison with the Musical Fidelity convertor show, but the Arcam uses its own distinctive convertor technology and will likely have a sound influenced more by this than small measured performance differences, since the figures are still pretty good.

The CD23 measures well, even if it isn't quite a match for the best.**NK**

LIWING DOLLS

The high-spec Avatar is the middle man in Living Voice's entry level Auditorium range. Simon Pope is suitably impressed. . .

sk any member of the hi-fi crowd to sum up the British 'speaker manufacturer Living Voice in one word and you can bet you'll get "horns!" as a reply. Or perhaps an affectionate "bonkers", as Living Voice are responsible for some of the most extreme British loudspeaker designs you can lay your paws on, such as the wardrobe proportioned Air Scout and matching Bass Bin which - price wise - you could trade in for a semi in Huddersfield!

The outfit is run by the amiable Kevin Scott who owns and manages the business under the umbrella of Definitive Audio, which also incorporates a successful distribution side. Apart from horn designs there is also a trio of more affordable, yet still high sensitivity speakers in the form of the Auditorium range, of which the Avatar reviewed here is the centrally priced model.

The look is non-fussy but attractive. The cabinet sits on a spiked metal base (best secured with a dollop or four of Bluetac) which raises the cabinet off the floor and nearer to ear height. Dimensions are 220mm x 280mm x 1035mm (w,d,h) and each 'speaker weighs a sensible 20kgs. Although relatively simple and functional and elegant, there's no skimping when it comes to design. The finishes available are premium grade matched Cherry and European maple, as well as Santos Rosewood and red Santos at an extra £100, with Ebony for a further £100. The cabinet is constructed using dense hardwood particle board, not MDF, with three

unevenly spaced frame braces. The drivers are in a d'Appolito configuration and consist of a Scanspeak D2905/9500 unit for the high frequencies and two Vifa bass/mid units that employ a paper diaphragm and a foam surround.

Living Voice reckon you'd be hard pressed to find a better equipped crossover than that used in the Avatar and on paper it's certainly a high-spec. page full. There's certainly some sophisticated components to be found, such as Hovland discrete film and foil capacitors from the USA that are used in parallel as well as in series arrangements. The inductors are hand wound in-house and the resistors used are adjustable. The crossover is laid out with "mutually orthogonal component orientation" which apparently eliminated 'crosstalk' and maintains a more stable filter crosspoint. Every component is apparently toleranced to two decimal places at a controlled ambient temperature to ensure correct matching and the whole shebang is also star earthed. No series resistors are used on the drive units, whose sensitivity is matched at the design stage. This, says Kevin Scott, allows extremely good coupling of the amplifier to the drivers, which he also states is helpful when using a high output impedance valve amp.



The technology used here may seem a tad long winded on the page but believe me it pays dividends, as the Avatars are superb sounding. Give them a nice uncluttered room and plenty of space to breathe and a warm, detailed and exciting sound will soon wash over you.

I used the Avatars with both valve and solid-state power in the shape of Quad's two-forty monoblocks (with a Creek passive preamp) and Sugden's excellent Masterclass Class A pre and power amps. Both turned out to be a fine match. With a vinyl source in the

shape of Bob Marley's 'Exodus' and Keb Mo's eponymous album I was treated to a highly detailed sound that had massive depth of stage and a fantastically unrestricted nature - this was truly an out of the cabinet experience. Bass was firm and commendably deep and the midrange information, including vocal lines was open and intricate without succumbing to the high-end sterility that I find creeping in to other designs.

That's not to say that the sound isn't dry, because it is slightly, but there's plenty of ambience and life here - which is essential in a high quality design.

Imaging was impressive too, with a realistic view of studio mixes which again kept the right side of the hifi/professional monitor boundary (the latter being sterile).

It was time to move on to classical music in the shape of my favourite tester (which also happens to be a peerless reading of the work in my view), Mahler's Symphony No.5 played by the Vienna Philharmonic under Bernstein on a DG CD. This recording sorts the men from the

boys when it comes to dynamics and scale and the Avatars responded resoundingly. The opening solo trumpet passage leading into the first orchestral tutti chord was blistering. When the full orchestra let loose on their entry I was almost pinned to the rear of the sofa - it was like a door opening, literally.

Also, all the rustles and podium shuffling was discernable which I find a great addition to the notes. I don't care what anally retentive recording purists say, it simply makes it more, well, live, which this recording actually is!

Tonal balance was very good.
Strings were fluid and lyrical, brass full and rich and wood wind light and out of the box. When the orchestra played a crescendo it genuinely felt like it, delivering a full and aptly overbearing sound at the massive climaxes - a sound much bigger than the cabinets suggest.

I found the Avatars near faultless for what I seek in a box speaker. There's scale and detail (although not quite up there with my ESL-988s) as well as dynamics and punch. Bass is firm and tuneful (but can boom if not

carefully placed) and midrange open, whilst treble is smooth. These 'speakers can sound a little dry with certain over-compressed recordings but acoustic music is near perfect at the price.

The Avatars aren't a beefy big red Burgundy or a heady Claret but more of a well balanced Alsace Gerwürtzriminer, full of freshness with a little kick of sweetness and spice - those of you unfamiliar with the tipple will have to take my word for it! They won't impress your mates with drop dead looks but neither are they intrusive - and musically they're tip top. Definitive Audio? Very nearly - highly recommended!

MEASURED PERFORMANCE

The unusual treated paper drivers used in the Avatar are massively sensitive, giving this modestly sized loudspeaker a whopping 91dB SPL sensitivity figure from one nominal watt of input. It is helped in this by having a low overall impedance of 5ohms, meaning it draws more current than a true 8ohm load, for any volume control setting. Users of solid-state amps will certainly notice that the volume control can be kept down. Valve amps should be set for a 4ohm load.

Sensitive loudspeakers get the best from amplifiers and in this the Avatars are helped no end by having an almost resistive load characteristic from 200Hz right up to 20kHz, as the smooth flat impedance trace shows. This makes the 'speaker very suited to low power specialist amps and valve amps, as well as conventional solid-state designs. It is one of the best loads I have measured.

As expected the drive units are not the smoothest in response terms, but they manage respectably well all the same. There's a shelving of high frequency output, but the treble unit integrates reasonably well and is smooth in itself, suggesting clean upper treble and good detailing. The 'speaker is balanced toward having a warm, full sound.

The port is well tuned to provide optimum damping, and it extends output down well to below 40Hz.

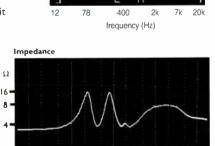

Is it true that the development of these new formats has been so slow that a well sorted CD player, such as the Meridian 506.24 you recommended last year, will outperform a similarly priced DVD or SACD player? Also, although I don't possess a turntable, I'd be interested to hear how a £1000 vinyl player would compare with a similarly priced SACD player?

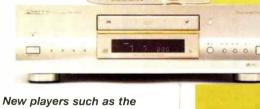

Good question. While much of the UK hi-fi press seems to be largely under-awed by either DVD Audio and/or SACD, I'm in no doubt that

they are the future of specialist audio. I say 'they' because I believe there will be more and more DVD Audio players that offer SACD thrown in, so you won't be forced to choose between the two. Compare the likes of Sony's SCD-555ES (SACD) or Pioneer's DVD 939 (DVD-Audio), both of which come in around the £1000 mark, and they'll kill any 16/44 CD player at any price when playing their respective 'high resolution discs'. What much of the UK hi-fi press seems to be obsessed about is their performance with ye olde Red Book CDs - which really isn't anything to write home about. This justifies the likes of Meridian's 506.24 or Arcam's FMI CD23T playing the same Dinosaur digital

The point then is if you want top quality 'legacy audio support' (as they say in the computer biz) then go for a finely honed 'trad' CD player, but if you intend to buy lots of new software in future then go for a new format player. Which? Get the one with the most software closest to your tastes available, and remember

the general rule - DVD-A sounds a little bright, SACD a little dry. Fortunately, us vinyl addicts who never really bought many CDs - and who still get new albums on vinyl can now safely buy DVD Audio copies of our LPs (should we wish to keep the originals for special occasions), 'go digital' and not be too disappointed! Put, say, a £1200 Michell GyroDec/Origin Live RB250/Dynavector DV10x4 against any SACD or DVD Audio player and it will still monster it, but at least you'll be able to go back to the silver disc and enjoy it, whereas the CD would probably last all of 30 seconds before you gave up and went down the pub. DP |

I wonder if you could suggest an amp and 'speakers which could do justice to my Sony CD player (CDP XB930E). My present set up is the Sony CDP with an oldish Aiwa integrated amp (XA-003), plus Wharefedale Glendale 3 'speakers. I'm sure my present amp and 'speakers are holding the Sony back, so to speak. The sound is mostly midrange thin, lacking in the high frequencies and it sounds rather muffled.

Can you suggest a good amp and 'speakers that would get the best out my Sony? To complicate matters a little, my ears are a bit sensitive to deep bass, which causes me earache! I'm looking at spending £400-£500 for each category.

I seems your new Sony CD player needs partnering with equally fresh and new equipment. The Wharedale's are knocking on a bit and have the rather covered 'traditional' British sound so beloved at the time. You'll find newer models far more clean and, well, less muddy than the Glendales. Presuming you have up to £700-£800 to spend, there's one option available to you that would really make your system sing. Invest in a pair of Wharedale's cracking new Diamond 8.1s and splash out a little on an amp such as the Cyrus 5. OK, so the Wharfedales are only £120 whilst the Cyrus is £500 but this is one combination that won't sound as unbalanced as it looks on paper. The Wharfedales are exceptional for the money, with a clean and detailed yet smooth sound and a solid cabinet which cuts down on bass boom (so you won't have to

take the pain killers). And what's more, they perform even better with more expensive amplifier partnering, a very rare trait in the budget 'speaker market. They're a great match for the Cyrus amp which will give you control and power in abundance as well as a very easy listening (in the best sense of the phrase!) appeal. The extra money from your budget will be well spent on decent 'speaker cable from the Chord Company to match your interconnect prize for getting your letter printed!



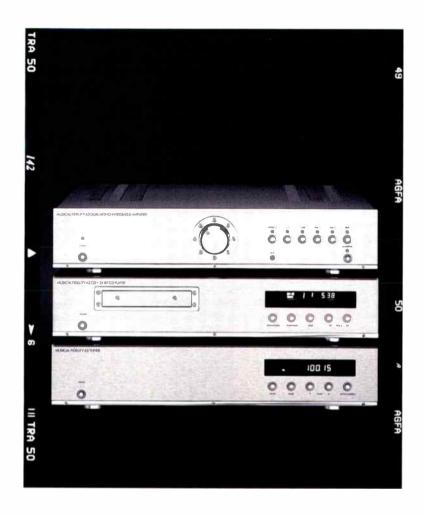

II) THE VINYL FRONTIER

I have a query regarding my current system and am frankly stumped, despite the suggestions from my dealers which seem either too expensive or just not vinyl-friendly. It comprises a Roksan Xerxes XPS2/ Artemiz/ Dynavector DV20H, sitting on a Mana Sound Frame and Target TT1 wall shelf. I have an Exposure 15 integrated amp from 1993 and some 2001 KEF Concerto 2s. Cables are VDH CS122 single wired but I've split the crossovers and just bunged on four extra plugs; all seems fine. I also have a Arcam Alpha Plus CD player and some other bits and bobs. All of this is nicely set up in a 4x4m room with a boarded floor (rugs aplenty) and lots of absorbent furniture.

I have two questions and would be grateful for some advice. At quite high volumes the system is exactly what I am





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after, sounding clean, non-sibilant and nicely balanced. This suits the jazz, funk, vocal and guitar music that I mainly listen to, and also provides a nice mellow sound for the ambient/reggae and classical stuff at the other end of my collection.

The problem is the system could maybe be a touch more dynamic. At low volumes it sounds dead boring. Since the addition of a the high output MC I am suffering from hum as I am typically having to run at around double the gain compared to my previous MM to get the same output; what can I do about this?

Money is tightish but I'd go to about £1000 if it would be a real improvement. I am also finding that I need to improve my digital source. I am baffled by SACD/DVD/CD etc. What's your opinion on the way to go, or should I just continue as is until the dust settles and a winner becomes apparent? I would really appreciate some help. Can you assist?

The weakest part of your system is probably your Exposure amp. In this situation. I'd have no hesitation in recommending either a Cyrus 7/PSX-R or Naim's entry-level '5 Series' pre-power, both of which come in at just a touch over your budget.

If you spend any less - i.e. on just the Cyrus 7 without the power supply, or on the NAIT 5 integrated then you'll get a different sound but not a significantly better one.

Which to go for then? Ideally you should dem both combos with your speakers, but generally the Naim is likely to give you far more zip and speed with a brighter tonal balance. At low volumes it will sound a lot more bouncy and you won't be able to describe it as 'boring' anymore.

The Cyrus system will give more detail and bass grip than the Naim combo, with a slightly more even handed and less 'edgy' balance - essentially it's 'like your Exposure but more'! Only you can decide which is better. Although the new 2010 Exposure integrated is a fine product (especially when used in conjunction with its power amp), it's unlikely to add the extra incision you'd get from the Cyrus or Naim.

Going for the Salisbury combo also gives you the chance to buy the matching £175 StageLine phono stage, which - with an input sensitivity of 2mV - works perfectly with the Dynavector. If you go for the Cyrus, then I'd go for a Michell Dino at £299 - regrettably Cyrus has ceased production of its matching phono stage due to lack of demand.

You could also do with setting up your Roksan again, as these can drift out of tune and give a 'sat upon' sound.

As for the second part of your query, you're right to feel that your Arcam CD player is off the pace, so read on for my thoughts on the new formats available to you. DP

is a large carpet in front. Many have suggested the problem being the speakers and that I need to invest in a better pair. I would very much appreciate your opinion(s).

I eventually ended up with a Papworth 200 mosfet integrated amplifier, Meridian 588 CD-player, B&W P6 speakers (purchased secondhand), Cardas Golden Cross speaker cables (biwired) and Harmonic Tech Truth Linc interconnects. Lo and behold, a tremendous improvement!!

The reason I went for the P6 speakers was because a friend of mine has them, and I think they sounded nice. And frankly, the secondhand price/quality ratio seemed excellent.

So what is my problem then? I have plenty of musical satisfaction, but a feeling of a lack of detail in the upper mid-range, as well as the treble. I seem to be lacking or losing some of the musical detail I would like to retain. Can the result be a product of the (mis)matching of the components or the acoustics? My listening raom is a mere 12 sq m, the speakers are relatively close to the back wall, one of them close to a corner(!) But they are placed on Nordost Pulsar Points, each on a piece of cut marble. The floor is parquet, there

amps, they have a solid and controlled sound that has plenty of musicality and drive, plus oodles of power. This shouldn't be where the problem lies.

The B&Ws are good but they can be bettered for equal money these days. Mission's 782 floorstander is a very fine example of a highly detailed and fast loudspeaker with subtlety and musicality galore. If you can grab a listen to them with your Papworth you may find more of what you require. These can be picked up new for around £600 and should give you many happy years of listening. My musical tastes range from jazz to modern to classical. The dimensions of the room are: 15.6ft x 12.6ft. The floor is wooden. I would be grateful for any advice you can give.

Hi Mr. Cooke. There are plenty of options available to upgrade your (on paper at least) well balanced system, although ironically there's little around £500 itself. Whilst the classic Pioneer amps are slightly dated they still blow many more modern equivalents into the weeds, with their grip and punch, and are suited to

many of the new breed of midrange floorstanders. For a civilised, inoffensive all rounder bang on your budget you could give a listen to Castle's latest generation Pembroke speakers, which although not the fastest around will give a good account of themselves with your broad musical taste. You could also try to seek out a pair of Tannoy's fine Revolution R3s, which although priced officially at £550 can be had for less if you look around. They are totally involving but also subtle and lyrical. The same scenario goes for B&W's workmanlike and reliable

Alternatively, spending £200 more on a pair of Mission's fine 782 floorstanders, with their mix of detail, bass drive and punch, will reap fine results even though it's quite a bit above your budget. If you want something a little rougher around the edges but perfectly fine and dandy when it comes to life and excitement Mission's m73s and the Wharfedale Diamond 8.3s can be had for around £200, leaving £300 to go towards a new conservatory or that long weekend away! SP

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II▶ MASTERING REMASTERING

Hi-Fi World is by a long way the most interesting hi-fi magazine on the market. I love the way you cover the spectrum from vintage valves to AAC - you have transformed the way I see hi-fi. It was reading World that opened up to me the possibility of transcribing music from LP to CD, and in the process removing the clicks, pops, scratches and rumble which drove me away from vinyl in the first place. I buy precious few CDs now, getting much more satisfaction from tracking down interesting music on vinyl which is unavailable on CD. My new hobby gives me great bleasure - thanks for getting me into it! I'm sure that more and more people are mastering their own CDs from vinyl and tape, so the answers to my questions on the subject will probably be of interest to many other readers.

My re-mastering setup comprises a Pro-ject Debut 2 with OEM Ortofon cartridge, Rotel RA820BX phono stage and Marian USB One, monitoring via Beyer DT231 headphones. I use Cool Edit 2000 with its Noise Reduction plugin. CD writing is organised by Easy CD Creator 4 and done by an external Hewlett Packard 7200 drive. I'm convinced that most of the rumble I hear from records is coming off the vinyl, because its characteristics vary from one LP to the next. If the rumble is in the grooves, wouldn't upgrading to a better turntable just exacerbate the problem? More generally, why should superior LP playing equipment not simply reproduce all the failings of the medium with greater precision and audibility? Fallowing on from this, what would be the most cost-effective way of spending no more than £500 on improving my hardware?

I have progressed from Easy CD Spin Doctor via Goldwave ta CE2000. I would have bought CE2000 in the first place, had I been better informed. I know of several other packages for click/pop and other noise removal (Arboretum Ray Gun and Steinberg Clean, for example). It would be invaluable to have a comparative review of the available vinyl restoration software in the magazine.

There are so many adjustable parameters in CE2000 noise reduction that it is not easy to get the best results from it without considerable trial and error. For example, it took me a lengthy process of elimination to find out that

CE2000 de-noising with FFT values lower than about 16000 can have an adverse effect on massed string tone, making it sound overly "processed"; and I didn't realise until recently that I should be recording and processing at 32-bit resolution, and converting to 16-bit only as the last stage before CD writing. It would be very useful to have a series of tutorials on general principles of audio restaration, and more specifically on how to get the best results from whatever software packages you assess as the best buys.

With regard to vinyl rumble, you make an interesting point, but it comes from incorrect assumptions. Much of the 'vinyl roar' you hear comes not from inherently noisy surfaces but the stylus's inability to track the groove properly. This is a result of an inferior pick up arm, and a poor turntable bearing that can't lock the movement of the stylus in the groove into the 'closed loop' that vinyl replay should be. Conversely, scratches, noise, clicks and pops tend to reduce - or at least become less noticeable - as you upgrade your turntable, arm and cartridge. This is because the deck lets the stylus trace the music hidden away in the groove much more accurately, and not get 'thrown off the scent' so much by all the general gunge and rubbish in the groove.

You'll be amazed by how upgrading your deck will make your disc surfaces quieter, not noisier. I can turn my system to full volume with my Michell Orbe/OL RB250/Ortofon Kontrapunkt B, whereas I wouldn't

the Project is a fine deck, but not the greatest ever made. £500 lies awkwardly between a new superdeck like the £825 Michell GyroDec SE and budget decks such as yours.

If you can't stretch to the aforementioned in one go, I'd suggest a Rega P2 and Dynavector DV10x4 as a stopgap. The more expensive Regas are fine decks of course, but leave less upgrade room. So I'd go for the P2, and when funds allow send the arm off to Origin Live for the counterweight mod. When you can afford it, bolt your arm and cartridge directly onto a GyroDec SE for a superb sound. Then you can subsequently upgrade your phono stage to a Michell Dino, as the Rotel has a rather thin and analytical sound. This done, your 'remasters' will sound stunning!

I take your points about comparative reviews of vinyl restoration products and suggestions for their precise use and set-up - if only we had the space! I think it would be interesting if readers wrote in and shared their experiences in the letters pages, so all please feel welcome to do so!

Also, check out user groups on the Internet - anyone can type the name of whatever package they use into, say, Google (www.google.com) to find them. As for me, I believe Cool Edit Pro is probably the best around right now - not because I've exhaustively tested all the packages, but from what I hear from the boys at the Beeb who also use it. You can rest assured that anything from SonicFoundry, Steinberg and Syntrillium is top banana!

Half as good, or twice as nice? David Price listens intently to NAD's brand new C660 CDR2 'double decker' CD recorder.

fter the craze for single deck hi-fi CD recorders - as started by Philips CD-R870 way back in 1998 - comes the next big thing, double CD burners. Now, NAD has been pretty quick off the mark with a range of killer budget products of late - such as the T531 DVD/CD player tested last month - so it's no surprise that it's all over this new market segment like a rash. The C660 CDR2 shows the company's commitment - one look at the spec sheet confirms that it means business. Claimed to be the 'first true audiophile dual deck CD-R/RW recorder' (and the company may just be right about this), the C660 is brimming with bits which raise it above the fray. There's real engineering depth here witness full MP3 playback with a Fraunhofer codec, which (as yours truly was the first to pronounce, way back when) is the best sounding way to play the aforementioned compressed audio files. Why play MP3s from CD-Rs? Well, apart from preserving your fave tunes 'knocked off' from the late and much lamented Napster, you can also squeeze ten hours of your own music compilations onto a single disc, with superior sound to MiniDisc. NAD points out that, working both decks in conjunction in MP3 mode gives you up to 20 hours of continuous music without

changing discs, which is a four-fold

increase over the typical 5 disc CD changer.

Serious attention has been paid to sound quality and the digital conversion process. The internal convertors (analogue to digital and digital to analogue) are audiophilegrade AKMs, which accept signals from 22kHz to 96kHz sampling rates via a built-in sampling rate converter. The MP3 decoding is handled by a bespoke DSP (Digital Signal Processing) IC, giving custom control of the decoding process rather having to use an off-the-shelf, all-in-one chip.

Being a combined player/
recorder, all copies are done in the
digital domain, with optimised and
short signal paths and all critical
circuits running from the same clock.
NAD claims this significantly reduces
jitter, making for superior copies.

Indeed, this 'computer audio' theme runs throughout the whole design of the product - which attempts to straddle the gulf between olde worlde hi-fi and modern multimedia. Essentially, the NAD features two computer CD drives - one CD-ROM and another CD-RW - giving the capacity for 4x copying, along with the aforementioned MP3 playback and CD-R/CD-RW compatibility. Additionally, the CD deck will play unfinalised CD-R and CD-RW discs, which is a boon to those who don't want to wrap up their

recordings in one go.

The NAD will read and write CD text, and dub it onto the disc being copied (assuming the source disc carries it in the first place). Continuing the 'family jukebox' theme simultaneous or sequential playback of both decks is possible.

Despite its obvious flexibility, the product's DNA makes for a sober and parsimonious user interface - no gaudy brushed aluminium fascias or multi-coloured displays here! Oh well.

The upside of this is that its ergonomics are excellent; fuss free, they let you get the job done without a worry.

The usual transport controls for both decks can be found clearly labelled above their respective disc trays, and there's a row of ten buttons centrally placed, taking care of its various recording options and playback modes. Usefully, it features a front mounted optical digital input to go with rear optical and coaxial ins and a twin optical and coaxial digital outs.

This is all good, solid NAD best practice, but if only the 435 x 95 x 300mm fascia didn't look the same as the company's drearily styled mideighties budget fare - and feel no less flimsy! Still, the 5.8kg is positively obese by NAD standards - you wonder if they've ever had to design

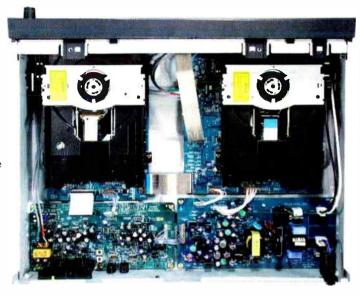
packaging capable of withstanding such loads before.

What then of the noises it makes? Well, you'd hardly expect Linn CD12 sound - but bandying the word 'audiophile' around (as NAD has done) rather raises expectations. I tried it against the aforesaid Scottish super-spinner in my World Audio K5881/Yamaha NS1000M system. Starting with the playback deck, I wasn't surprised to hear a fairly warm and beguiling sound - silky, soft but with plenty of life. This from an NAD - what are the chances of that happening? Essentially the C660 doesn't bite off more than it can chew - it invests everything it plays with a gentle musicality that when taken in isolation is most impressive. You can relax into the music, enjoy its wide soundstage, sweet highs and warmish upper bass. Only when you hear it against a pricier reference are you left wanting - the NAD lacks detail, incision, lower bass power and grip and upper midband and treble atmosphere. It obviously curtails things, but at least it does it pleasantly.

Ironically, its copying abilities far exceed its replay capability. At 1x

speed the NAD makes Incredibly close copies - with just the merest scintilla of coloration. The stereo image recedes back towards the plane of the speakers a tad, bass is just a touch looser and treble loses a touch of atmosphere. Crank the old girl up to 4x and things barely change - there's just a fraction more clouding and lack of bite. Ironically though, through the C660 none of these differences are audible - it's only when you fire up something of the calibre of, say, a Cyrus CD7/PSX-R that you notice anything. Even through the CD12 with the volume at top whack it was hard to tell the difference.

Another piece of budget esoterica from NAD, then. My thinking goes thus: If you want to get into the CD recording game, then why not buy a double decker? If you're going to buy a double decker, then this is the one to have. Use it by itself and it makes perfectly nice noises, or plug it into a decent DAC and make it sing like a thousand quid CD player. If you've already got a respectable silver disc spinner, then you can just use the NAD for copying duties, which it will perform



four times faster than any single deck CD recorder. Now, before I dissolve in a puff of logic, I shall retire to spin off three copies of the new 4hero album - all for my own use, officer.

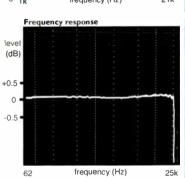
The C660 has a small amount of lift at the top end of its frequency response and may sound a little bright and forward as a result. It could well be that NAD are trying to balance out the warm sound they are known for here.

This player was very linear throughout its dynamic range, as the excellent dynamic range figure of LTI dB underlines. There was little noise or distortion from the convertors so it will come over as smooth and clear.

With good channel separation and normal output of 2V NAD's C660 measures well and should give a lively sound with little digital harshness. NK

World Verdict £®®®®

Probably the best sounding double-deck CD recorder around right now. Factor in great flexibility and useful real-world facilities, and it's a bargain.



After the praise heaped on the 3D CD player it only seemed sensible for Musical Fidelity to take the conversion and produce a dedicated DAC. Noel Keywood listens to the A3.24.

II CD players produce rubbish. This is a common mantra from old vinyl diehards like myself, but in this case I'm not insulting the CD yet again, so much as alluding to the real, measurable rubbish produced above 21kHz. You see, CD players are not meant to produce any signal at all above this frequency, but they do. Engineers use a less emotive term, they call it 'spurious output'. The problem is a little bit older than the CD, since VHF/FM tuners did the same thing, once new fangled stereo was introduced. Although we cannot hear these signals directly they can "fold down" by a process of intermodulation into the audio band, within any component in an audio system, from the player itself through to the loudspeakers. This is going to affect sound quality and some pundits would have it that the sound of a CD player is determined largely by the effect out-of-band rubbish has upon the partnering system.

Musical Fidelity's A3.24 convertor reviewed here is, they tell me, designed to minimise unwanted signals produced by the digital-to-analogue conversion and filtering process, using upsampling. This convertor accepts the digital output of a CD, SACD or DVD player and runs at either 98kHz sample rate or 192kHz. This allows more effective filtering to be used, giving cleaner output, in-band and out-of-band. In

effect, the new A3.24 lifts CD sound quality, bringing it closer to that achieved by SACD and DVD-A. Well, that's the suggestion.

The convertor is a sizable beast, taking up most of a 19in rack. It actually measures 44cm wide, 36cm deep and 9cm high. Power comes in through the usual IEC connector and there are co-axial and optical digital inputs for connection to either a CD transport or the digital output of a CD or DVD player.

A firm press of the button brings on a small array of intense blue indicators, one for power, two to show which sample rate is operating, 96kHz or 192kHz, two to show which of the inputs has been automatically chosen, and one to indicate signal lock.

Although the A3.24 successfully processes both DVD-A and SACD and can do a nice job in reproducing them - nevertheless its "reason to be" is to process CDs and move them into the sonic (if not scientific realms) of high resolution audio. Input sampling frequencies are quoted here as ranging from 8kHz right up to 108kHz, meaning the A3.24 uses a sample rate convertor to allow it to handle virtually any input. It will handle 16, 20 and 24bit word lengths. If you want to fully access DVD-A and SACD in terms of bandwidth and channels, the loop through digital output can be taken to another

convertor.

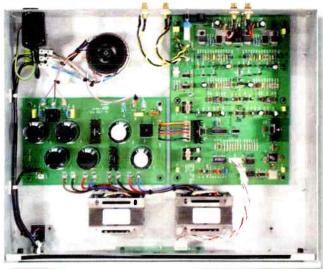
I used the A3.24 with my venerable Teac P-30 CD transport, a budget Traxdata CD player to represent an upgrade situation and a Sony DVD player. The picture that emerged was a little more complex than I had expected, because the strengths of this convertor are concealed by mediocre digital recordings, which means a lot of modern CDs, especially when they rely on synthesised and heavily processed sound. There was little to be gained from Dido's No Angel, for example, just to mention a typical modern CD. If the A3.24 possessed a consistent benefit, like, say, outstanding bass drive, it would be apparent across most types of music, making reviewing in particular a relatively straightforward business. The strengths of the A3.24 are rather more elusive I found. With many CDs it offers a smooth, balanced sound characterised by a good sense of cohesion and quite rich detailing. With conventional CDs it started to sound impressive with sophisticated productions like Sting's Brand New Day. The shaky indeterminacy of conventional 16/44 CD, that sense of fractured reconstruction that comes from ordinary players was the property most effectively tackled by the A3.24. It brought a convincing sense of cohesiveness and solidity to instruments, fleshing them out

convincingly into full bodied worldly objects, whose physical being is attested to by familiar properties such as timbral richness and variation, and good variations of scale. Brand New Day slid smoothly by, a rich vein of detail coming from a deep, quiet background. The problems of digital are as much in the recordings as in the replay equipment, especially nowadays because of the heavily processed nature of modern music. Conversely, simpler recordings, like Renee Fleming's Madame Butterfly, came over surprisingly well. Again the A3.24 showed itself to be impressively 'silent', or free from digital noise. Renee Fleming had a full bodied voice that was both richer and smoother than usual; the A3.24 again excelled. It has the ability to be very good with quality digital recordings but I found not unexpectedly that it could dig no more from many of my classical DDD CDs simply because most are pretty shaky in any case.

Hooked up to a DVD player I got

a better taste of what the A3.24 can do. Now able to play DVD-Audio discs I found the convertor could resolve their properties well, as well as get the best from good CDs. Living in your Eyes from Larisa Stow underlined how much cleaner and clearer a good digital recording can be, against what we are currently being served up.

At this point you might protest that no one who forks out for a DVD-A disc is going to be playing it through 22kHz bandwidth convertor. Perhaps. Technically it doesn't sound a very convincing idea but in practice what the A3.24 offers is quality playback of all formats, CD, DVD-A and SACD (but not mp3, AC3 or MiniDisc), giving an impressively smooth, rich and dimensional sound from good digital recordings. It's this flexibility,



coupled with excellent sound quality, that marks out the unusual ground it occupies.

The frequency response of this convertor runs flat to 20kHz when reproducing CD, with just a slight top-end lift. Against others the Musical Fidelity will have a slightly brighter presentation as a result. Like most modern high-bit convertors though this one is very linear, producing little distortion or quantisation noise relative to what has gone before. The smooth noise floor in our distortion analysis at -30dB shows this clearly. At lower signal levels the result was much the same, low levels of noise and distortion being shown by the analyser. The A3 is unlikely to suffer the graininess and harshness that digital distortion produces.

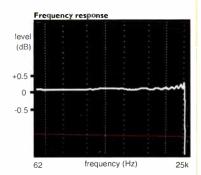

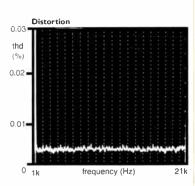

GOING FOR GOLD

Origin Live's Silver 250 tonearm is the company's best product to date, says David Price.

oy Gandy designed probably the world's finest pickup arm in history - it's just a shame he didn't finish it. Forget SMEVs, Naim AROs, Linn Ekoses (great though they all are, in their way) - it is the RB250 that has given the most happiness to the most people. At this point we should credit someone for having the sense to realise this, and to take the design a step forward to finish the job. Was it inspiration or perspiration? We don't know, but whatever, Mark Baker from Origin Live take a bow! What he's done is effectively re-engineer the original 1983 Rega design, with all the bugs ironed out. Early on in its life, though, a number of folk got out the soldering iron and started rewiring it (with good results), but it wasn't until Mark Baker's counterweight mod - which addressed the arm's mechanical (as opposed to electrical) deficiencies that the Rega arm really shone.

The OL Silver 250 is a synthesis of Rega tonearm base and OL arm tube, wiring, plugs and counterweight (and probably more, which Mark won't tell me about). At £599 it's a pricey piece of kit, but all tonearms are. Essentially you're paying for the development and build time.

Why pay six hundred spons for this when £300 (for an OL RB250) already monsters the so-called 'best pickup arm in the world'? I have to say this thought crossed my mind once or twice as I set it up on my Michell Orbe, and installed an Ortofon Kontrapunkt B.

Well now I know - it's stunning. That's as in amazing, awesome and gobsmacking. As in the difference between CD and DVD-Audio. As in night and day, good and evil, chalk and cheese. The Silver 250 is a stonkingly

good product and the very best tonearm I've ever heard. No. it still doesn't do uninivot-style 'liquid midbands', but comes ohso-close, and you also get SMEV levels of bass grip and Ekos levels of foottapping musicality too and more! The 'more

bit comes from this pick-up arm's incredible tonal and timbral realism. It isn't something you're going to notice if you play dodgy club 12 inchers, because that's all digital, but delve into the depths of your pre-eighties vinyl (before digital got anywhere near anything important) and you'll be gobsmacked by how it sounds.

To kick off, it has an awesomely tight bottom end - oh-so-close to the acknowledged guvnor, the SME V. In fact it's probably within a whisker. Then there's the midband, which is a quantum leap from the already superb standards of the OL RB250 - glass clear, incredibly liquid, fantastic image precision, walkaround soundstaging and incredible timbral realism. It really is like 'being there'.

The treble is also transformed - the arm is shockingly open and airy up top. Female vocals (packed with harmonics, obviously) just soar up to the skies. It's incredibly smooth, natural, organic (unlike the frigid SME and the Ekos with its poor tonal colouring), and just cuts to the quick.

I could go on for ever about its



new levels of insight, its incredible liquidity, its amazing grip, its stunning low level detail and resolution, but I won't. Suffice to say that - on balance - this is probably the best tonearm in the world right now, and the £599 price tag is laughably low. If Mark Baker put this in a fancy box and hired a flashy PR, he could probably charge five times this amount. But he doesn't, and it's to his credit. The only cloud on the Silver 250's horizon is ye olde humble OL modded Rega RB250, which sounds duller and a noticeably less musical. The trouble is that until you've got a top turntable. serious cartridge, high end phono stage, preamp, power amp and speakers, you probably won't hear much of a difference.

POWER PACK



The new Harman Kardon integrated amp is stuffed full of facilities and power. Dominic Todd straps himself in for the ride.

he new Harman Kardon amplifier range is a sign of the times. Where ten years ago there were at least seven amps available, now there's only one two-channel model in the range. Like everyone else, they're going for the audio/visual market with just a mere nod to good old hi-fi. Blame the Stateside fixation for home theatre.

Studying the specifications, at least HK haven't skimped on their solo model. Eighty watts per channel is claimed, with an impressive 75 Amp current swing capability to boot. Take a look inside, and those figures appear entirely believable. There's a hefty frame transformer power supply, flanked by separate left and right output stages. Each channel boasts twin 12,000uF output capacitors, explaining the serious current available.

In true Harman style, there's pretty much every feature you're ever likely to need. Twin 'speaker outputs, remote control, seven inputs and switchable tone controls are all included. Also standard are separate listen and record selectors and a moving magnet phono stage, both of which are becoming far rarer these days. An intriguing feature has to be the 'digital loop through'. This offers three digital inputs and a single

output. Perhaps it's a useful feature for someone out there, but for the majority it would seem something of a novelty.

In terms of its beefy persona and lengthy feature count the HK reminds me very much of what is probably it's closest competitor, the NAD C350. Unfortunately it's also rather plasticy at the user end, with the tone controls also being particularly fiddly to operate.

The sound quality follows form too - to a degree. With Nelly Furtado's, '... On The Radio', it was immediately obvious that this was an amp true to the powerful transistor breed. There was a bold presence to the vocals, pushing them forward well into the room. As expected, the bass was just as deep and powerful as could be hoped for in an amp of this price. Separation between the instruments was clean and focused, and dynamic range was vividly reproduced. The HK had no problem in driving my 82dB 'speakers, clearly showing that here is an amp that doesn't know the meaning of the term, "difficult 'speaker loads".

On the downside, and unlike the NAD, such power does come at a price. There were times when the balance could become rather harsh. At easily attainable higher volumes

the sheer scale of sound had no problem pinning me to the seat, yet this can be more taxing than exhilarating!

Sir Adrian Boult conducting the London Philharmonic Orchestra, in Vaughan-Williams's 5th Symphony also showed the HK670 in a mixed light. This is a late sixties recording, yet still 'lush' and a fine rendition. Tonally, the piece came across as rather grey and uninvolving. The orchestral synergy wasn't portrayed quite as well as it could have been. Nevertheless, the separation and sound and staging were fine. Not surprisingly, the Harman gave preference to the brass section, which sounded as vibrant and jubilant as one could hope for. Yet this was at the expense of the woodwind, which sounded rather grainy and synthesised by comparison. Although not the grandest or most dynamic of symphonies the amp did imbue a sense of swell to the music where necessary, and followed the score faithfully enough.

Grace Jones's 'Slave To The Rhythm' was more the Harman's style in many respects. There was the space, punch and drive that the track really needs to give of its best. Whilst it may not have captured every last nuance of percussion detail, there

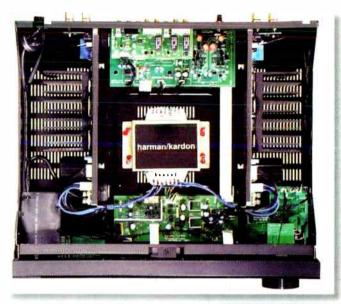
was enough to create a sense of depth and width to the sound stage. Because of the taught bassline, the timing also benefited, with there being none of the bass overhang and wallow that can afflict this track.

The same tight grip on the music also benefited Tricky's 'Black Steel'. The HK670 allowed plenty of verve and attack, whilst maintaining control, especially in respect to some of the softer, more ponderous bass notes. Unfortunately, what it didn't quite manage was a sense of listener involvement. Whilst the sound quality was technically good, it lacked that sense of engagement that its key rival is so good at.

In conclusion then the Harman Kardon, whilst having notable strengths, is compromised by the very design which gives such strengths. Although a competitor for the NAD C350, it's very much a powerful transistor amp of the old

school. That school being one of power, presence, broad staging and control. All good qualities in any amp', but not at the expense of other attributes, It's in terms of refinement where the NAD most shows up the HK670. At higher volume levels, the balance can become rather harsh, Female vocals begin to harden, and strings sound grainy and a little edgy. With gentler music, the plot is lost somewhat as the music doesn't ebb and flow, or show true timbre with acoustic instruments.

A curates egg of an amp then. For raw power, there's little to touch it in the traditional Harman mould, and you'd need to go for something like the £150 more expensive NAD C370 to get the same presence of sound. It could be ideal for anyone on a budget with a hefty 'speaker load and not too



concerned about the more delicate nuances of music. Those seeking something subtler should look maybe look elsewhere.

MEASURED PERFORMANCE

The Harman HK670 is powerful and well equipped. It produces a useful 84W into 80hms, rising to 144W into 40hms, more than enough to generate high volume, even in large rooms - always providing the 'speaker can cope of course.

Harman have long produced wide bandwidth amplifiers, with a frequency response extending past 100kHz. So this new requirement imposed by SACD and DVD-A is nothing new to the American company and the HK670 has no trouble in meeting it, with a -IdB point out at 130kHz, Harman amps have generally had a clear, open sound, partly as a result of this. At the other end of the frequency spectrum this amplifier reaches down to 15Hz. The tone control circuit affects response a little, but it can be switched out

This amplifier produces little steady state distortion, even feeding higher currents into a low 40hm

load. Levels hovered around 0.005% in the midband and at high frequencies at low power outputs. Near full output worst case distortion measured 0.06%, primarily third harmonic. Again, this is the way Harmans always measure and it's a good result.

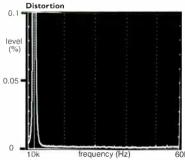
At 300mV sensitivity was high enough for most ageing sources, like cassette decks and older tuners, so this amp. can be slotted in as an upgrade.

Harman provide a phono input with accurate equalisation. However, sensitivity is relatively low and there's a little background hum measurement showed, so this is only for high output moving magnet cartridges.

The HK670 offers the usual neat set of measured results. It is powerful and distortion free.

CLASSIC CUTS

Budding saxophonist Andy Giles simply gave up learning and played the triangle instead when he first heard John Coltrane's 1960 tour de force, GIANT STEPS.

ver tried to play the saxophone? I mean, when you read that Bill Clinton puffs away at it (without inhaling, no doubt) you might get the impression that it's a doddle to play. It isn't. I tried it once – and found it a spitty, throaty instrument, not particularly user friendly. But then I'm not John Coltrane.

My first black girlfriend, at University in 1960, played saxophone and was studying Music. She lent me the latest John Coltrane LP 'Giant Steps' and, to my shame, I still have the record today – I never gave it back. It's a simply sensational recording and is right up there with Miles Davis's 'Kind of Blue' as an essential jazz fixture in any decent record collection.

Along with Charlie Parker, Coltrane is considered one of the most influential saxophonists in the history of jazz. Many tenor saxophonists have adopted his habit of playing long notes without vibrato. Others have borrowed the piercing, near-scream quality of his high notes; his extended, rapid runs up and down the range of the instrument; or his favourite melodic phrases. Numerous musicians have practiced and imitated entire solos of Coltrane's, such as his improvisation (music composed at the moment of performance) in 'Giant Steps'. Indeed, Coltrane inspired many to play the soprano saxophone, an instrument rarely used in jazz until he began playing it.

Coltrane was born in Hamlet, North Carolina, and grew up in nearby High Point. After graduating from high school he began studying the saxophone at a private music school and began playing professionally in local bands. In 1947 he switched to the tenor saxophone and toured with alto saxophonist Eddie "Cleanhead" Vinson. When he worked for trumpeter Dizzy Gillespie from 1949 to 1951, Coltrane played both alto and tenor saxophones and when he joined the group of trumpeter Miles Davis in 1955; an important phase of his career began. During the two periods he spent with Davis (1955 to 1957 and 1958 to 1960) Coltrane gained an international reputation as a tenor saxophonist.

When Coltrane began playing the alto saxophone in the 1940s, he imitated much of Charlie Parker's bebop style, in which rapid melodic patterns are continuously improvised over chord progressions. However, by the time of his first important recordings with Miles Davis, Coltrane had developed his own style on the tenor saxophone. His high notes had an intense, emotional quality, and his melodies were extremely ornate and usually played without vibrato.

There is no better example of his eventual mastery of his art than in 'Giant Steps', released in 1960. The title track had (and still has) musicians reeling from the number of chord changes Coltrane negotiates in record time. But non-aficionados will also find huge amounts to enjoy on an album, which features some of the saxophonist's finest compositions.

"The music is the whole question of life itself." said Coltrane, "I'm not sure of what I'm looking for except that it'll be something that hasn't been played before. I don't know what it is. I know I'll have that feeling

when I get it."

A quiet man, Coltrane committed his very existence to continually searching for more possibilities in his music -- and therefore, in himself. He would practice for hours, sometimes silently -- just running his fingers over the keys. He'd pick up new instruments and meditate and listen to recordings of Indian music and the sounds and rhythms of South African pygmies.

'Giant Steps' was an important development in Coltrane's career. It was the first set composed entirely of Coltrane originals. As passionate a soloist as he was, these tracks indicated how personal a writer he had become. All these decades later, the music is as fresh and invigorating as it was upon first release. 'Giant Steps' was the release that converted a number of listeners who had initially found Coltrane "difficult."

'Giant Steps' is a true masterpiece, containing two of Coltrane's most successful compositions, the full-speed-ahead title track and the lovely, subdued ballad "Naima." All the compositions are excellent, from "Cousin Mary" to "Syeeda's Song Flute" to "Mr. P.C." and the CD release is even better, with interesting alternative takes of five tracks.

Mani Sandher comes face to face with the 'baby' of the high end JM Lab Electra range, the 906.

MLab is a French company, which has been manufacturing high-end speaker systems since 1980. Landmark models include the massive Grande Utopia and smaller Utopia, both of which have received international recognition and acclaim. What differentiates JMLab from most other speaker manufacturers is its ability to produce all the components it uses in-house: drive units, enclosures and crossover/filter networks. Thus, it is able to control all aspects of its speaker research, design and manufacturing in a holistic way.

Here, we take a look at the Electra 906s, the smallest speakers in the company's Electra range. The 906s are two-way bass reflex speakers rated at a maximum power handling of 90W and an above average sensitivity of 90dB/2.8V/m. At 420x218x315mm and a weight of 10kg each, they're much lighter than I expected them to be given their build, Our review pair came in JMLab's 'Signature' finish, with red cherry veneer side panels and grey front baffles which may appeal to others but isn't my particular brew, I have to say. Unlike other French designs I can think of, such as those of Cabasse, you'll find two pairs of binding posts around the back to allow for bi-wiring or bi-amping.

The most striking feature of the 906s is the angled front baffle. JMLab call this the 'Focus Time' solution, which ensures that all frequencies from the drivers are focused on the listener and take the same time to reach the ear. The baffle itself is made of 50mm solid medium density



fibreboard, which provides a high inertia platform for the mid-bass driver and minimises baffle vibrations to the tweeter. The mid-bass drive unit is made from structural foam covered with skins of glass tissue. This involves an expensive manufacturing process, but is said to provide maximum mechanical stability and stiffness. Meanwhile, in an attempt to enhance the directivity of the speaker, the tweeter utilises an inverted dome. This gives high power handling and a frequency response that extends down into mid-range frequencies.

So, how does all this high technology sound? To find out, I connected the 906s to my reference system: Sony SCD-I (heavily modified), Pass Labs XI/Aleph4, Purenote Epsilon interconnects and speaker cables. Placing the 906s on a

pair of Im high stands ensured the tweeters were at my ear level when seated. I found this to be particularly important, as the 906s sounded distinctly odd off the vertical sweet spot. My preference was to place the 906s 0.7m from the rear wall and 2m from the sidewalls, which provided the best compromise between bass extension and tautness in my room. To ensure proper 'warm-up', the 906s were left playing before any serious evaluation.

Many components tend to immediately impress, or disappoint, in certain specific areas. The 906s give an immediate impression of sounding generally well rounded. But over an extended listening period they do stand out in one area above all, namely musicality. Timing, rhythm and pace are impressive. Get timing wrong, playing something like Tommy

Smith's 'Blue Smith' SACD and you'll know about it. The 906s did an excellent job in this respect, even on the most critical track, 'Hubba Hubba'. The same was true playing Ricky Martin's 'Sound Loaded' SACD, with the Latino rhythms coming across loud and clear, especially on the opening track 'She Bangs'.

Next, I tried one of my favourite CDs at the moment, Blue Note's 'Blue Juice Squeeze'. This is a compilation of 60's and 70's Blue Note recordings that lack bass, contain loads of hiss, but manage to sound great all the same! The 906s reproduced Ananda Shankar's 'Dancing Drums' with great musicality. I love the opening organ on this track, which seems to 'dance' with the rhythm of the drums - just wonderful. This music was reproduced with a good sense of separation and depth also, creating a realistic soundstage.

The 906s are no slouches as far as mid-range attack and dynamics are concerned. They really shone playing the Tommy Smith SACD loud. Often, horns can sound strained through

many speakers when being replayed at high levels, but not the 906s. They remained pure, retaining their leading edge kick and impact.

Turning to low-end dynamics, the 906s were less convincing. Fast Floor's 'Eternal Dream' CD contains many deep, deep transients. The 906s just couldn't reproduce these faithfully. Hardly surprising given their size, but I still feel that they should have performed a bit better here.

I have to admit to being slightly disappointed with the 906s in terms of their naturalness and texture. Playing my CD of Beecham/Royal Philharmonic Orchestra performing Rimsky-Korsakov's 'Scheherazade', the full texture of the orchestra was lacking. This remained the case even on solos. The lead violin sounded thin and weak, losing a lot of its emotive content, which is such a shame. Generally, vocals didn't fare too well either. The customary tingle down my back was missing when listening to the opening few lines of 'La Vezina Catina' on FIM's 'Audiophile Reference IV' SACD. Here, Esther Ofarim's vocals sounded thin and

slightly boxy and not tonally full and smooth, as I know they should.

Overall, I enjoyed listening to the 906s because of their musicality. They managed to convey a great sense of timing, rhythm and pace and were also dynamic to boot. But they never lured me otherwise. I didn't expect them to produce bags of bass, and they didn't. But what they did miss was the full texture and tonality in the mid-range that I love. Even my beloved Aleph4 power amp couldn't get them to blossom out here. To many, this will not be as important as the areas in which the 906s excel. For this reviewer, however, the 906s just don't hit enough of the important targets in view of their high price.

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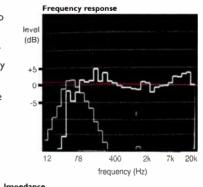
Like most French loudspeakers, although not all JM Labs, the 906 Signatures have rising treble output from their novel inverted dome tweeter. This unit has good dispersion and Is well integrated in terms of phase allgnment but the downside is that a lot of treble energy will be radiated into the room. The 906 is likely to have a fairly sharp sound as a result.

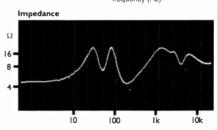
The novel bass/midrange unit has a smooth enough response, but bass output rolls away below 80Hz - quite a high frequency for the cabinet size. The port is also tuned high, to 50Hz. As a result to the 906s will likely have dry sounding bass and will suit

near-wall placement. They do not go low for their size.

Sensitivity was a good 87dB for one nominal watt of input, especially considering the 80hm impedance figure they returned under test. The bass unit dips to 50hms minimum, but in spite of this the 906 draws less current than most rivals. In conjunction with a fairly smooth impedance curve it is an easy load for any amplifier and should get the best from it. Ω

The 906 Signature is well engineered. It is likely to have a dry, bright and analytical sound that may well be a trifle cold and unengaging. **NK**

At a UK price of £278.00 all inclusive you cannot ignore Kel84. Simon Pope says, "The quality that can be gleaned from this amp is a fine introduction to the joys of the valve sound. The Kel84 will highlight all the intricaccies and depth of detail in your favourite recordings whilst retaining a warmth and fullness that is almost exclusive to pure valve amps and is rare at this price point."

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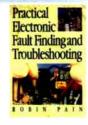
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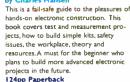
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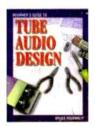
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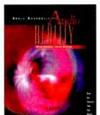


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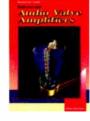
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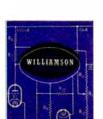


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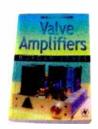


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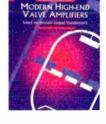
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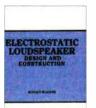
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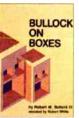
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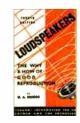
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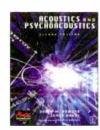
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Camels might not be pretty things but they can survive in difficult conditions — conditions where thoroughbreds would die. I'm beginning to wonder whether this is an appropriate metaphor for DVD, because whilst it might well be weird, perhaps in its own way it has the capacity to be wonderful. Camels are bad tempered, smelly and difficult to live with, but if needs be there's no alternative. DVD is difficult to live with too, but similarly

there's no alternative.

I'm a bit of a techie but much of what a DVD player has to offer I find superfluous or worse - obstructive. The main role of a DVD player is to replay films, avoiding the historic problems suffered by video tape. Quick access and usable fast/slow modes, as well as pause, are its main advantages over video tape, but zero wear and long life are also important. Yet I've largely given up on buying DVDs and now buy more video tapes. All DVDs start with a lengthy run of warnings about piracy, copying and permitted replay conditions, telling you how you must not attend public meetings with them or replay them in front of an audience for commercial gain. Carefully wrought in threatening legalese, they give the impression that to nick a jelly baby from one of your children whilst playing a film is enough to get you sent to prison.

Stab the fast forward button to get past this stuff, as well as those tacky and pointless film company logos, and what happens? A warning comes up saying "operation not permitted". DVD locks you out until you have read, for the umpteenth time, all that the film makers demand you read to understand the problems they are having making a profit, a problem that

by insinuation you are potentially a part of.

But since like most ordinary citizens I have just paid for the disc, I am not part of the problem and don't wish to know about the film maker's commercial fears. And from my visits to the Far East it looks like the people who do affect sales significantly aren't very interested in these messages either. Pirate copies of newly released films go on sale immediately for £I or so. Even I got personal attention on my last visit — my credit card was copied! All the same, I don't think thrusting a

big sign in front of hotel receptionists or restaurant cashiers telling them about the sins of copying is somehow going to stop my card being copied again, but this is the crass approach used by the film business with DVD.

The warning notices are followed by often difficult to navigate menus, not helped by remote controls loaded with small buttons, spin wheels and illegible markings. Having got through all this, DVD then shows what it can do technically – providing you connect it up properly. If perchance you do not use SCART and RGB, which I suspect many people do not, preferring the RF connection, noise from the remodulation/demodulation process can make the picture as grainy as video tape properly (RGB) connected.

In spite of all its difficulties, on balance I find video tape easier to use than DVD. I pop a tape in and wind past the opening pap, including five minutes or more of adverts for new films. Now that DVD is taking over, old films and new on VHS can be picked up for £3-£10 or so.

Some DVD players can double as very fine CD players. They use good quality chip sets, unlike some CD players that used cheap chip sets intended for cheapie portables. These things gave a hard, shaky sound, with weak depth resolution and poor low frequency dynamics.

By contrast, DVD players from major manufacturers like Panasonic and Sony commonly deliver fine sound quality from CD. They are smooth, have good detailing and add life to a performance by resolving depth perspectives, especially around vocals.

Whether most users will ever fully exploit DVD I wonder. I'm looking forward to being able edit out the obstructions on my library of video DVDs before re-committing them back to disc using a computer DVD recorder, and perhaps commit my video tapes to DVD at the same time without adverts at the beginning! Then I'll take to DVD. After getting DVD video sorted the time will come to take DVD audio on board. I see Cirrus Logic are advertising a 24/192 analogue-to-digital converter, the CS5361, which could be used in a DVD recorder. We may well see digital recorders with 90kHz bandwidth soon. I think we'll be seeing a lot more from DVD in future, but for the time being I'd rather buy video tapes and use my DVD as a CD player!





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wery month I attend a buyers' meeting for the hi-fi retailer I work for. As you'd imagine, most of the decisions aren't rocket science and aren't likely to have audiophiles drooling with anticipation.

Usually it's a case of how many of amplifier "X" we're going to need and for how much we'll sell them for. Every now and then, though, the buyers come up with something really special. There are some companies within the hi-fi industry whose blue chip pedigree ensures instant attention at the first mention of their name. Two months

ago the name to come up was Nakamichi. "How would you feel about selling Nakamichi cassette decks?" came the question. I, like the others, wasn't so sure. Five years ago or more, they'd be a dead certainty. Nakamichi decks

never hung around for long on shop shelves, and decent second hand ones still sell like hot cakes. But the recording market has moved on with MiniDisc and CDR firmly established and cassette gasping its last breath. Yet, this is Nakamichi we're talking about. Hence, we were curious and the inevitable had to be asked: "How many and for how much?"

Knowing the company well I shouldn't have been surprised that the response was, "all of them!" It had turned out that the UK importers of Nakamichi had got into a spot of bother shifting their stock. Obviously, under such circumstances the price has to be good, to allow for a substantial discount to be passed onto the consumer. In this case it was. We could retail the two-head DR-8 and the three-head DR-10 for vastly reduced prices. Now five years ago, I'd have run straight down to the bank and withdrawn the readies for a DR-10 myself! Yet in 2001 I was still rather unsure. Could we still sell these once desirable stalwarts or would it be like trying to flog a traction engine to Eddie Stobart? As my boss reassured me for the umpteenth time, "everything has a price". And lo and behold, he was right. I'd be exaggerating if I said the decks flew out the door yet the rate of sales was far greater than I'd anticipated.

Better, in fact, than our top CDR machine

Now, before anyone accuses me of using these column inches to flog kit, may I point out that by the time you're reading this they've all been sold! I'm not trying to sell anything here, but merely probing and speculating as to why certain products can still find such widespread favour under such unfavourable circumstances. In many respects I'm delighted as I've always been a believer in the adage that if something is top notch, and exquisitely designed in the first place, then it will

sell like hot cakes.

remain so for many years to come. I put the success down to three aspects: price, reputation and niche.

As I've already discussed, everything has a price. Even a DCC deck has a value, as it will play back conventional tapes. The more expensive models also had a decent DAC that could be accessed independently. A brand new Nakamichi still has a great deal more appeal than a DCC deck; therefore at the right price it would sell.

Secondly, there's the matter of reputation. For anyone who was first getting into hi-fi in the late seventies or eighties, Nakamichi were the undisputed king of cassette decks. Bearing in mind that for much of this period cassette tape was the most popular format, having a far higher profile than today.

Combine the fact that Nakamichi were the best with the inevitability that they were also some of the most expensive pieces of hi-fi, full stop, and it isn't hard to see how they became many audiophiles dream. Although their other electronics products proved to be rather average, the company did develop a fearsome reputation for incar audio based upon cassette.

These conspicuous strengths have meant that their blue chip reputation has remained intact ten years on.

Interestingly, but not really surprisingly, many younger audiophiles hadn't even heard of Nakamichi. If they had they tended to associate them with lifestyle systems - a rival for Bose, if you like. So it was no surprise to find nearly all of the units being sold (to put it politely) were to the pre-MiniDisc generation.

Finally, I put the success down to that of niche. The field of hi-fi separates has always charmed me as there's always a great deal of time for products and technologies, that in other industries would be the preserve of museums, or forgotten about altogether. If you're in any doubt here, take a look at the enthusiasm for valve and vinyl equipment that still prevails. It's not just second hand gear either. Plenty of manufacturers still turn a decent profit exclusively from these sectors. Granted they do tend to be the smaller companies, but the fact that there is still a demand within such niches is reassuring.

Maybe I should have visited that ATM after all!



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For the very latest information on new product launches check WWW.bristolshow.co.uk that in hi-fi, power corrupts and 'noisy' power corrupts and 'noisy' power corrupts absolutely. It's frightening to think that back in the dark days of hi-fi's yore, they were the only source to use if you were serious about sound - and all used AC motors with minimal amounts of filtering. Effectively, this meant that whether you liked it or not, everything going into your system had vast amounts of crap from the wife's hairdryer, next door's fridge or little Johnny's bedroom TV.

To Linn's great credit, it was the first company that took the problem seriously.

The arrival of the Valhalla board in the early 1980s pushed the LP12 to new heights, making an incredible change to the basic Sondek sound. Images tightened, the noisefloor

dropped and everything from the low bass to the high treble sounded tighter and brighter. It was the first product to truly demonstrate the difference the mains supply could make to vinyl replay.

The point was, of course, that the Valhalla gave cleaner - rather than outright 'clean' - power to the deck's beleaguered Impex AC synchronous motor, Rather than relying on the mains to provide its basic running frequency (50Hz in the UK, 60Hz in the US and parts of Japan), it featured a quartz crystal-referenced oscillator to tell it a precisely what speed to revolve. There was also a degree of filtering to pull out the noise, spikes and hash which also caused speed fluctuations due to phase shifts in the sine waves caused by shifting capacitors.

Thus began the march toward perfect power. Several manufacturers, such as Pink Triangle, experimented with DC motors. Others like Roksan, Michell and Linn strove towards ever better offboard power supplies, using ever more accurate quartz speed control and better filtering. Linn's 1991 Lingo was another high watermark, as was Michell's 1994 GyroPower QC -both improved the performance of their respective turntables incredibly.

By the late nineties, I was running a

Michell Orbe (complete with its standalone Papst AC synchronous motor and offboard QC power supply), but in 1998 I reluctantly had to retire it due to a move to Japan. As soon as I arrived in Tokyo I set about acquiring a decent system, and went in search of a high end direct drive, and in japan there are plenty. The quality of the big, late seventies Trio LO-7Ds, Micro DDQs, Technics SP-10s and Nakamichi Dragons is unarguable, but even the less exalted Sonys, Victors and Pioneers are worth looking at. If you don't mind tackiling the metro with a

weightlifting belt strapped to you, they're even worth taking home!
I ended up with a Pioneer PLI60X - a beautifully built, independently suspended, quartz locked, fully auto behemoth.

Although it didn't hold a torch to most aspects of the Orbe's performance, there was one area where it was intriguingly superior bass. Tauter, tighter and with incredible grip and articulation, it showed just how good analogue bass could sound. Returning to the UK and powering up the Orbe, it was obvious the British deck's low frequencies were lacking. Although more powerful and fluid than any other belt drive I'd heard, the Pioneer pointed to its less than perfect low frequency process in no uncertain terms.

At the time, I ascribed it to the drive system. Surely, the lack of purchase a belt has on a large, heavy platter made it susceptible - ever so slightly - to dynamic wow?

Well, the arrival of the Orbe's

DC motor and VC power supply would suggest I was wrong. To say it's transformed Michell's top deck is an understatement - the first time I cued up a record I could barely believe my ears. Things now sound so much more

'right', and far less like hi-fi. There's a new boldness and confidence to the sound, along with an ability to let you hear instruments in the background play remarkably clearly and independently from those so much more prominent in the mix. Factor in an exquisite sense of timing and incredible attack transients, and it's an important advance for the Michell Orbe. The superb Origin Live Oasis-S, also uses a state-of-the-art DC motor and power supply and shares many of these characteristics too.

Indeed the deck's designer, Mark Baker, said to me last month, "It's amazing - each new advance in turntable design shows what an incredible amount of untapped potential there still is in the vinyl disc". Never a truer word spoken, in my humble opinion!

PIONEERING

John Bamford is Pioneer GB's outspoken product manager. David Price talks to him about his company and the current state of the hi-fi world.

ohn Bamford is an extremely engaging and erudite guy - no surprise really, considering the grand job he did of editing Hi-Fi Choice magazine over a decade ago. These days he's a much smaller part of a far larger organisation, being largely responsible for Pioneer's modern UK profile which arguably stems from the famous A400 'UK-designed' amplifier.

It's hard to understate the significance of this product. Ten years ago, it was all over the UK hi-fi scene like a rash, storming the sales charts just like the original NAD 3020 had done a decade earlier. Here was a budget product (selling for around £200) which was good enough to use with sources and speakers five times its price - or more. To go with this, Pioneer produced a range of CD players employing the famed 'stable platter mechanism' (where the disc sat upside down on a platter, turntable-style) and Legato Link digital filter (using interpolative DSP to extend the frequency range of Red Book CD).

Today, along with car audio and DJ gear, these products are what most UK buyers associate with the brand. 'Twas not always the way,

however. Indeed, it's perhaps a testament to John's marketing prowess that the real Pioneer isn't known to the average British punter. This is a company that in its native Japan is not seen as a specialist in 'budget blockbusters', but rather as a extremely innovative, 'high tech', engineering led brand. This disparity between Pioneer's UK perception and its

real nature has real parallels with Honda - here they're old folks' cars, but at home they're compulsory kit for young, technology-loving tearaways. In truth, Pioneer has always been a very creative, individualistic and almost eccentric company that's been particularly good at introducing new ideas and refining old ones.

A FINE PEDIGREE

Pioneer gained international fame in 1973, distinguishing itself from a sea of rival aspiring Japanese electronics giants with its PLI2D turntable. Look at it now and it's hardly as striking as, say, a Hydraulic Reference of the same year. Yet, the deck was remarkable for its priceperformance combination. For little more than the cost of a noisy, clunky Garrard or BSR autochanger, the '12 offered a sound that didn't just lead its class, but totally redefined it. Beautifully built, with a high quality S-shaped tonearm capable of tracking top class cartridges, this turntable played a major part in the 1970s hi-fi boom and got a hell of a lot of people around the world into

The PL12D was hardly a new invention, of course. This was Pioneer doing a familiar thing better than the rest. The company continued

the winning formula with its range of late seventies cassette decks. The likes of the CTF-500 again offered performance well beyond its price tag, thanks to superb build quality and careful calibration.

Then there was the RT-707 open reel recorder. Reel-to-reel was still a force in high end hi-fi when this came out in 1979 - and Pioneer took the format and made it more accessible. This machine was barely bigger than your average rack mounting cassette deck, yet offered superb performance thanks to an exquisite quartz-locked, direct drive, auto-reverse transport.

BOOM TIME

The eighties saw Pioneer in on the CD boom, like all the rest, producing a range of distinguished high end machines which were not available in the relatively small (in sales terms, if not importance) UK market. Along with these, the company was a champion of the DAT format, being the first to offer 'super-DAT' in the late 1980s, which offered superb sound thanks to its 96kHz sampling rate. By the early nineties, the company was innovating again, by offering the first affordable domestic

hi-fi CD recorder. By the mid nineties, Pioneer had a superb sounding machine selling for under £500 in its home market.

The arrival of DVD saw the company flourish almost as if it had been waiting for the new format in order to make its mark. It played an important part in the development of both DVD Video and Audio players, and staunchly refused to limit its digital outputs to 48kHz sampling frequencies as all its rivals have done. DVD was sweeping Japan back in 1998, but has taken a little longer here. Now though, one in ten UK households have one, with 3 million players sold. By contrast, it took CD 7 years to do the same! By pushing the DVD envelope, Pioneer has thrived by association with this all-conquering format. Images of its 'black box' early nineties separates are finally being replaced by

some highly tasty DVD spinners. Pioneer's soon-to-arrive DVD-recorder will change things still

John Bamford has been one of DVD- Audio's most vocal exponents from the word go. He believes that the arrival of DVD-A players has been largely overlooked in the UK press, pointing out that Pioneer offers a sub-£1000 DVD machine capable of better fidelity than any CD player costing many times that. Why, he argues, spend £12,000 on a CD player when a DVD-939a will trounce it (with DVD-A discs). He lays the blame at the door of British hi-fi magazines, with reviewers advising readers to "hold out and get a CD player because, after all, the technology isn't sorted yet". JB thinks, controversially, the watermarking issue is a distraction,

■■pointing out that effectively, 'pure'
unwatermarked CDs are far more
compromised. As for the argument that
DVD-A has yet to approach its paper
96/192 specification, he says that 18bits
at 48 or 96kHz is better than 16/44!
Then there's the other 'purist
audiophile' argument that the video
circuitry in DVD players interferes with

the sound. John suggests people make their minds up after listening rather than before!

There are now 26 million DVD discs, over 6,000 titles, with £500m of software sold in 2001. The writing is on the wall and Pioneer for one is happy to be part of the DVD revolution. He doesn't view SACD as a threat or a rival

to DVD-A, rather he thinks it's a 'subset' which Pioneer will include on future UK players (there is already a combined DVD-A/SACD Pioneer player available in Japan, remember). Meanwhile, look out for a new, entry-level DVD-Audio player - with 24/192 capability - soon. You never know, it could be Pioneer's 21st century PL-12!

HEAD TO HEAD

DVD-Audio vs. CD - the verdict!

After the visit to Pioneer, over a slap-up Chinese takeaway, we compared CD, DVD-A and vinyl, using a selection of Max Townshend-tweaked Pioneer digital sources and his awesome Sir Gallahad 'speakers (the man behind the Rock turntable is a good friend of Mr. Bamford). It was a fascinating comparison and

one of the most interesting listening sessions I've been to in a long time.

Although we ran through a wide range of discs, the one we focused on for our A-B-C comparisons was Buena Vista Social Club, which is well done on all three formats: CD, DVD-A and vinyls. Kicking off with the CD, there was a decently large soundstage with a fair sprinkling of detail and a fairly musical sound. Moving to the DVD-A, things were transformed. This wasn't the kind of difference between a budget £300 CD spinner and a classy £1000 job -

No, it was much more than that. The DVD-A spinning around inside Max's lightly tweaked Pioneer DVD-939a totally blew Red Book CD out of the water.

The soundstage widened dramatically, the speakers dissolving and the instruments assuming their rightful position in the expansive acoustic. Such was the improvement in detail, definition and atmosphere, it was like someone had lifted Granny's woolly cardigans from both speakers. In a sense, the music sounded less 'rhythmic' as the gritty upper midband was transformed into a smooth, creamy velvet - a tell-tale sign that 16/44 was adding 'aggression' which artificially pushed the song along. Another striking aspect was the gaps 'between' the notes - these became inky black silences rather than fuzzy, muzzy

Even just a year or two into its life, on a good but not state-of-theart player, DVD-A is superb. From the outset, you're very conscious of its high resolution nature - it feels like a highly tuned racing car to Compact Disc's family hatch. I love it, but it still isn't quite there in my humble opinion. Cue the vinyl! After the differences between CD and DVD-A, I hadn't been prepared for what LP could do, It had those stunningly fast DVD-A attack transients, but took all the elements in the mix, heightened them still further, added bags of atmosphere, detailing and textural information and - here's the clincher - put them all together in an incredibly beguiling and hypnotic way. Suddenly I got the sense that I was listening to real musicians playing real music, live! DVD-A is brilliant, but is still work in progress, Rob Watts from DPA has speculated to me privately that it won't touch vinyl until it gets to 384 with 32bits. What was patently obvious, however, was how risible 16-bit sounded.

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SPEC-TALK

Pioneer's SPEC-1/SPEC-2 pre-power amplifier combination was 1970s super-fi at its most outrageous. David Price says yes to excess.

t is 1978, and you're in downtown Tokyo walking past one of the many 'kamera' shops when something catches your eye. Something strange catches your eye. You doubletake and see a huge, vast, sprawling tower of the very thickest, chunkiest brushed aluminium, complete with rack mounting grab handles stronger than a truck tow bar. It is without doubt the most outrageous prepower amplifier combination you've ever seen. It isn't built like a Revox no, it's far better than that. As far as styling goes, this combo puts even the biggest and most excessive Yank behemoths to shame - twice.

Yes, it's a silly moniker, but it sort of makes sense - if you had a check box with every feature and facet of this combo, and compared it to any other around at the time, the Pioneer would undoubtedly win the 'spec' war. 'Specs' lest we forget, were what people bought hi-fi on in those days. Many seventies audio buyers spent a lot of time looking at power output figures, frequency response graphs, signal-to-noise ratios and the like. After a visit to his local Laskys, even the most non-technical seventies hi-fi duffer would come home crosstalksavvy, and wise to the need for infinitesimally small amounts of transient intermodulation distortion!

The SPEC-I preamplifier measures a vast 480x186x445mm and weighs the best part of 20kg. Aside from looking absurdly ostentatious, its main role in life is to bring incredible connectivity to the life of any lucky purchaser. It boasts two phono inputs (one with 12dB attenuation via a 'level' control), two aux inputs, two tapes, tuner and Mic (with its own level control and mixing facility). There are two bass and

treble controls (50Hz, 100Hz, 10kHz and 15kHz respectively) with switchable defeat, high and low filters with switchable frequencies, variable attenuation, balance, headphones and speaker selection. Round the back, the SPEC-1 has a raft of

RCA phono sockets, plus no less than 5 mains outlets for the countless ancillaries any owner would doubtless own.

The SPEC-2 is the crowning glory. It shares the height and width of its partnering preamp, but is deeper still and weighs 25kg! The front boasts two vast power meters, calibrated to 500W (no idle boast!), and input attenuators for left and right channels. When you switch on, a red protection LED lights up, to stop the amp dumping its entire 250W RMS per channel into 8 ohms (twice that into 4) into your speakers. Its 'specs' are jaw dropping - how does 5Hz to 80kHz (at -1dB) frequency response and 0.05% THD at 125W continuous sound? Then there's its 1,300W power consumption to ponder. It's a big boy's amplifier, make no mistake.

So how do they sound? At this point you'd expect the bad news - after all, with all those frills and fripperies, they can't possibly be any good. Well, with this combo, Pioneer proved that if you spend enough money, you can have it all. In isolation, the SPEC-1 preamp is definitely the weaker of the two - but is still clean, clear, smooth and detailed. Drive the SPEC-2 direct though, and you hear a



gut-thumping, hear-through experience - it feels like the analogue outs from your CD player or phono stage are direct coupled to your speaker voice coils. Awesomely powerful and strong, the SPEC-2 goes at any kind of music, from drum & bass to classical, like a jackhammer. It's smooth and refined too, with only the effortless musicality of today's top Brit high-end products to show it up. So, if you're feeling down, just turn up the volume, cue up some rock or dance music and be amazed at its endless reserves of grunt and wallop. Put simply, this thing makes a Naim NAP250 sound like a NAIT I.

This is one of those Olde Worldes to die for - classic Sony V-FET transistor amps sound sweeter and Leak TL12s more musical, but if it's pure, unreconstructed power you want, there's little to match Pioneer's SPEC-1/SPEC-2. Factor in the sublime levels of build and finish, plus the imposing (some would say daft) looks of the beast, and it's a hell of a package. You can still find these around, but expect to pay £1000 plus. Best place to look is on the continent - a lot were sold to the 'high end heaven' that is the German market. Keep your eyes peeled, and be prepared to travel on spec.



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With the advent of SACD and DVDA, you may be wondering why Creek have designed a new high-end CD player. Research has shown that while these new technologies allow for increased resolution, when plying discs recorded in the new formats, they are not so convincing at extracting the best from CD's. As CD has been around for 20 years, many people have built up large libraries of discs and want to get the best from them for years to come. Creek feel that a statement product is required to achieve this and have left no stone unturned in their attempt to achieve it. The CD53 is the ultimate reference standard, achieving the best performance money can buy. The CD53 uses a Philips transport, custom Creek software, ultra-low jitter master clock and waveform shaping, for maximum signal retrieval. In addition to its no compromise power supply circuitry, it uses professional standard balanced audio output filtering and buffer circuitry to provide the lowest noise and highest fidelity signal available.

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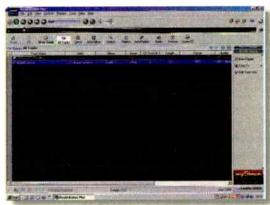
RealNetworks is a serious player in tomorrow's world of digitally downloadable music. David Price auditions its latest and greatest software product, RealJukebox 2 Plus.

ealNetworks is a company on a mission. Formed in 1994 by ex-Microsoft man Rob Glaser, it's now the biggest fish in online music distribution - much to Microsoft's chagrin, no doubt. As well as forming MusicNet earlier this year (along with Warner Music, Bertelsmann and EMI), its RealPlayer format is now incredibly popular. With over 200 million unique users (more than all the other formats put together), its Real.com website is the most visited music portal.

Mac and PC users alike will know RealPlayer, a little piece of software that lets you play downloaded or streamed music from the net. It's freely downloadable and often comes pre-installed with new computers. RealPlayer forms the core of RealJukebox, which takes the basic idea and adds a welter of extra features, most significant of which are recording and playlisting. The version you see here is RealJukebox 2 Plus (build 1.0.2.340), which comes with all the bells and whistles imaginable, and is purchasable online.

Until recently, programs of this

type used to be called 'MP3 jukeboxes'. This term now seems a little quaint, since the latest RJ2 supports not only MP3 but AAC and the new RealAudio 8 format - which is by any other name (would you believe it) Sony's ATRAC 3, as used on your very own MiniDisc player. Before you ask though - no, it doesn't do WMA (Windows Media Audio). This has probably got something to do with not giving your mortal enemy the oxygen of publicity. If that approach was good enough for Microsoft with Windows Media Player 7 (which cynically didn't record in MP3), then I guess it's good enough for RealNetworks! Still, in fairness, there's an optional, downloadable plug-in for WMA, along with Liquid Audio and a number of more obscure formats. Even so, the formats you get as standard are superbly supported, with all their possible bitrates offered. You get a bewildering choice of ATRAC 3 from 352kbps to 32kbps, MP3 from 320kbps to 32kbps (as well as Variable BitRate) and AAC from 128kbps to 32kbps plus of course good old uncompressed 16/44



WAV files.

RealJukebox Plus takes ages to install, on account of it (and all the associated bundled bits) taking up no less than 290MB of disc space. The days of MP3 players measured in KB are well and truly gone. Still, you won't complain when you finally get it going because it's mind-bogglingly comprehensive. The program defaults to HOME, which offers a long list of its available options:-

tries to go onto the net to find the track and title information (assuming you're already online), and in seconds the track numbers become names. At this point, you can play any track you like, or check the boxes next to the tracks you want to record and press the record button. This done, the software starts recording in the chosen format (you need to set this in TOOLS/PREFERENCES/AUDIO QUALITY). On my notebook, ripping into either MP3, AAC or ATRAC 3 happened at around 3.7x - but my CD-ROM is practically Steam Age. When the tracks you've selected have been ripped, you can click on the ALL TRACKS button to see them, or add them to a playlist.

Although not the most intuitive piece of code around, you'll know your way around RealJukebox after a few minutes of fumbling. This done, you've got a fantastically comprehensive resource available - it can rip in any format (including AAC), play, burn playlists to CD automatically or tune into any one of thousands of radio stations world-wide.

Reservations? Not many. First, I'd have liked it to have the Fraunhofer MP3 codec bundled as standard (like its MusicMatch Jukebox rival), but you can always install one of these later.

Kicking off with MP3 (using an external Fraunhofer Professional MP3 codec selected by Windows Multimedia control panel) I was struck by how deep and powerful the sound was. Once again, MP3 stuck two fingers up to its detractors, giving deep. growling bass. rich lower midband. clean and three dimensional upper mid with beautifully carried female vocals and sweet, crisp treble.

Moving to AAC, the energy of both frequency extremes seemed a little curtailed. Bass was a touch lighter and marginally tighter, starting and stopping more rhythmically. Moving up the frequency range, there was a just a touch less three dimensionality about the sound than MP3, although it seemed better at contrasting the respective timbres of the different instruments in the mix. The brass sound was more distinct from the female vocals, for example, standing out better. Treble was curiously less prominent than MP3, but texturally better resolved. It sounded sweeter and silkier - almost too silky in fact. The overall effect was a tauter, more rhythmic sound, but I have to say I preferred the big hearted, more



Second, I'd have liked a little switch on the toolbox which let me toggle between preselected bitrate versions of MP3, AAC and ATRAC 3, without having to fumble around in the PREFERENCES menu.



This said, it's still hard to fault. An incredibly powerful and flexible program that really pushes computer audio into the Twenty-First century, the full-on version of RealJukebox is a superb investment for anyone serious about using their computers for enjoying music. It's better than all other 'MP3 jukeboxes' I've reviewed to date, and compared to those of even a couple of years ago, it's in a totally different league. Superb.

Switching to ATRAC3 was the biggest revelation. The sound was noticeably coarser and more rough and ready. Bass was lighter than AAC and sounded far weaker than MP3, giving a mid-forward sound that was definitely more rhythmically engaging but far less tonally pleasing. I was struck by how much easier it was to focus on the counterpoint between the snare drum and hihats with ATRAC3, and how much punchier it all sounded, but also how much more lightweight and coarse it was Treble was the worst by far. MP3's highs were superb, AAC's very polished, and ATRAC3's was full of artefacts - it sounded far too phasey and splashy for my lik-

Overall, MP3 won the day, with AAC very close behind using virtually half the disc space - on a fair 128kbps to 128kbps comparison, AAC would kill MP3, and ATRAC3 too!

JUST WHAT I ALWAYS WANTED

David Price forsakes journalistic impartiality to extol his love for Edirol's UA-3 audio capture card!

ntil the advent of this product, the only way to get high quality music into your PC (for editing, audio restoration, duplication and/or CD burning) was to rip out the standard soundcard and replace it with something decent. With a good card costing anything from £100 to £250 many people are tempted to leave well alone and abandon any thoughts of getting digital music into their computers.

Well, now that's all changed thanks to Edirol's UA-3 'audio capture' USB interface.

First things first. Although Edirol is a relatively unknown brand, this product is actually designed and built by Roland, a company responsible for some of the greatest bits of electronic musical goodies ever made. Synth fans will worship at the altar of their classic Jupiter and Juno series designs, while the company single handedly changed the face of pop music with its TB303 bass synth and TR808 drum machine. The point is - the UA-3 has enviable DNA.

This is evident in its build and ergonomics, which are superb. Small, light and made from high quality, tough looking plastics, the UA-3 boasts tough socketry that should stand heavy (ab)use. It's a breeze to use. Simply plug it into the USB socket on your PC or Mac (either desktop or notebook), and it powers up without resort to an external mains adapter. You can then plug in a range of devices via the standard (6.3mm) 'jack' sockets (there's a choice of guitar or unbalanced), on the front panel, or the stereo minijack (3.5mm) MIC input, two RCA



line inputs and/or the optical digital input on the rear.

The two sliders on the front panel give mixing between the guitar/MIC inputs and the RCA, minijack and optical inputs, with peak LEDs to show when you're overloading the input circuitry. Although a little crude, this works well in practice - you just set the sliders so the peak indicators flash occasionally and then back off just a touch.

There's also a rotary output selector. You can send the signal out via the RCA line outs (for monitoring), the digital outs (for recording digitally to a DAT or MiniDisc, should you require) as well as direct into the computer for recording onto the hard drive, via the appropriate software such as Syntrillium's Cool Edit SE. Simple as that.

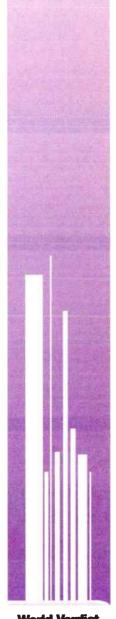
The Edirol works brilliantly. It feeds 44.1kHz, 16bit digits into your computer, with native operating system driver compatibility (either Windows MME or Mac Sound Manager) for a noiseless, glitch free feed of sound. There's even a 'Direct Hardware Monitoring' function which allows for zero-latency performance while recording, too. The result is that whatever soundcard you're running,

you get a very high quality soundstream into your computer which you can then process, edit (or whatever) to your heart's desire, and then burn to CD-R (using, if necessary, an external USB CD writer).

Obviously, the direct digital inputs give the best possible sound - so you can feed the music straight in from your DAT, CD player, satellite box or MD machine. The built-in analogue to digital converters are excellent though - they're not up to the standards of, say, a £300 standalone A-D, or those included in Sony's TCD-8 DAT portable, but they're not that far behind. By comparison, those in your average soundcard sound thin, screechy, noisy and distortionplagued. The UA-3 converters are smooth and detailed, sacrificing just a scintilla of depth, air and warmth to high end designs.

Brilliant, then. And the £149 retail price makes it all the more convincing. It's a great gadget. Along with a decent external USB CD burner (such as Plextor's S88TU), I can now turn my notebook PC into a fully specified, mobile music studio! Highly recommended - the headline says it all!

David Price finds Sony's latest CRX175 to be a shining example of the state of the PC CD writing art.

nward! The latest round of CD burners are now all at least 24x speed, meaning you can burn an average audio disc in the space of some three minutes should you desire. As I've found however, really high speed audio disc recording doesn't always make for perfect sounding CDs. Even with the best, certified media, things can start to sound a little phasey and splashy.

To this end, as far as computer audiophiles are concerned, the numbers game is becoming largely irrelevant. Rather, what people like us want is high quality, sturdy build, useful facilities and a healthy bundle of software - all of which this brand new Sony has, in spades! Right now it costs £279, but don't let that put you off. Experience suggests that within a month or two of hitting the retail ground, so to speak, Sony drives get heavily discounted and start to look far more affordable.

The drive is well built, as all Sonys are - with the exception of the Digital Relay tested last year. The disc loading tray doesn't feel like it will fall off days after the warranty period ends, and the mechanism is quiet and slick in operation. Quoted speeds are 24x10x40, making this a little rocket with everything from CD-R to CD-ROM playback. The drive records up to 700 MB of data or 80 minutes of music (depending on type of disc used), but as always with audio, if you can possibly find and use the old 650MB (74 minute) media then do, as hi-fi CD players seem to read them better.

It features Sony's new Power-Burn CD recording management system, claimed to take the worry out of CD burning by eliminating buffer underrun and optimising the burn to the brand and speed of CD-R/RW disc used. Both these features have been seen elsewhere -Yamaha (among others) has had variable

power lasers which configure themselves to individual discs for a while, whereas the famous BURN-Proof buffer underrun protection system was originally pioneered by Sanyo. Sony's Power Burn simply combines these two established good ideas - in the company's defence though, it did invent CD-ROM technology in the first place!

The package is comprehensive, as you'd expect from the old days of the 'Spressa' drives a couple of years back - there are blank CD-R and CD-RW discs, connection cables, mounting screws and excellent manuals. It also comes complete with a generous suite of software tools to help you manage and edit digital pictures and video, listen to your favourite digital music, record your own original music, and even back up your PC. To wit, the Windows version comes with B's Recorder Gold (audio and video CD production and burning). B's Clip (drag and drop copying direct to CD), MusicMatch Jukebox (audio player/recorder), Retrospect Express Back-up, Arcsoft PhotoBase, ArcSoft VideoImpression (video CD creation) and ArcSoft PhotoStudio (electronic photo album management). Sony claims compatibility with Microsoft Windows



98SE/2000, Windows Millennium Edition, and (soon) Windows XP operating systems. There's also a Mac version with a slightly different software bundle.

Fitting is a breeze thanks to the excellent manuals, and the drive just connects up to a standard ATAPI (also known as E-IDE) interface on your PC's motherboard.

I spent several days burning data discs at 24x speed without so much as a glitch from the Sony, thanks to the excellent buffer underrun protection. Audio CDs were burned at slower speeds, (4x and 8x) and produced equally impressive results. As always with top notch burners, the sound quality difference between source and copy was almost smaller than between the different brands of media used. Suffice to say, there was just the very slightest softening of bass transients and the most gentle clouding of the mid-band and treble. In truth, this is almost overstating the case - how we would have yearned for 99.5% perfect copies back in the days of cassette!

Another great piece of kit from Sony then - recommended without hesitation - but if you wait a little while you're bound to be able to buy cheaper. Solid gold, easy action!

THE FINAL CUT?

Steinberg's Clean is now in its 3rd incarnation - David Price tries out the latest and greatest edition of this classic audio restoration package.

t was back in 1999 that Computer Audio World reviewed the first incarnation of Steinberg Clean! Since then it has lost its exclamation mark and gained two revisions, the latest of which - version 3.0 - is tested

The basic package costs just £24.99, but since v2.0 it has been offered in an optional 'plus' version complete with a clever self-powered USB phono preamp, for £69.99. A small, standalone MM phono preamplifier complete with built-in analogue to digital converters, it means you don't have to move your entire hi-fi to your computer (or vice versa) for recording. Rather, you can simply place your turntable next to your PC, and plug it in into the Steinberg preamp that's connected direct to your PC.

For those unfamiliar with the original, Clean is an 'audio restoration' tool that lets you record your distressed LPs onto your computer's hard drive, process them and then burn them to CD-R using your CDwrite. The package isn't designed just for vinyl though - because Clean also works its magic on old cassette and open reel tapes, and even iffy-sounding MP3 music files downloaded from the internet.

The latest version 3.0 of Clean sports an 'IntelliAssistant', a cumbersome name for a 'wizard' that makes the process of cleaning your recordings surprisingly easy. The first thing you need to do is transfer the music to your computer. This is done via the bundled Steinberg WaveLab Lite 2.0 software, which is a high quality, purpose-designed sound recording program.

To record vinyl, you need to take a feed from your phono stage line outputs to your soundcard's 'Line In' socket.

Alternatively, you can use the

supplied USB preamp, which installs simply. The joy of this is its simplicity but those with iffy PC soundcards or notebook computers with no audio line inputs will also love it. Its built in analogue-to-digital converters are surprisingly good (equivalent, say, to a decent MD recorder), making for respectable results. True, an offboard ADC going into a soundcard's direct digital input will give better results, but will cost £300 more!

With the Clean software installed and all other applications closed, go to WaveLab's FILE menu, click on NEW and hit the red RECORD button. The program duly displays its level meters, letting you set the recording levels manually using the MIXER button. You then click on RECORD again, cue up your turntable and go. When the recording's over, you can cut out the lead-in and run-out clicks, and slice it up song by song using the editing tools

Although Clean! is the main audio restoration program, WaveLab is actually a pretty sharp tool for tidying things up. Go into the PROCESS menu and you can NORMALIZE (if you've under recorded slightly this will bring the loudest parts up to 0dB), CHANGE GAIN (bring levels up or down), FADE IN, FADE OUT, CROSSFADE, DYNAMICS PROCESS (which compresses your recording to make it sound punchier) and EQUALIZE your recording.

Once you've got the recording bit done, you can run through Clean's own digital signal processing effects. There's DECLICKER (to remove clicks and static discharge), **DECRACKLER** (to remove scratches and crackles) and DENOISER (to remove unwanted surface noise or tape hiss). Then there's BASS BOOST, STEREO SPREAD and BRILLIANCE controls, all of which are individually adjustable. You now also get TUBESIM- ULATION for a warm, 'valve' sound), plus ROOM and CARSIMU-LATION (which reprocesses the sound to match

particular acoustic environment).

Finally, VST INTERFACE lets you use Cubasis VST effects plugs-in (downloadable from the internet) for even more powerful sound shaping, should you require it.

Clean 3.0 works superbly if used sparingly. Simply cranking all the effects up to maximum will make any music sound like it was recorded in a bathroom through a rack of old rock guitar effects pedals. If you go easy and take some time to get it right, however, you'll be amazed at the music's new found clarity and lustre. Settings suitably attuned, as you go through processing each track, the program builds up a playlist for you automatically. When you're done, you can click on the CD-R/CREATE CD-R menu and watch Clean even burn the CD for you.

A brilliant package then, but there's a caveat - the more effects you run, the more your PC will struggle. If you exceed your machine's processing ability, it will start skipping like a scratched record. I found my 750MHz Pentium III with 128MB RAM could just about handle it, but anything less simply isn't enough - for heavy duty work you need a beefy PC.

- 2. Don't send cash!
- 3. Accept no verbal guarantees.
- 4. Have you heard the item or something similar? If not, why do you want it?
- 5. Don't pretend to have knowledge it's your fingers that will get burnt!
- 6. Is it working? If not, why not?
- 7. Has it been modified and, if so, have notes been kept?
- 8. Was it any good in the first place?

9. Don't send cash!

- 10. If you are in the slighest doubt, arrange an audition (see point 5). If it's too far, wait for another time.
- Either buy it or don't: vendors are excusably impatient with 'consultation' exercises.
- 12. Don't send cash!

FOR THE SELLER

- Not everyone is honest -Seller Beware!
- 2. Make no verbal guarantees.
- Even 'nearly new' is still second-hand. If the manu facturer's guarantee is no longer in force, your price should reflect this.
- There is very little intrinsic value in second-hand hi-fi; it's only worth what some one will pay for it.
- The best guide to pricing is last month's Classifieds: that a 'classic' was worth £xxx a year or two ago is no guide. Values fall as well as rise.
- Amateur second-hand dealing is not a big money game: you win some, you lose some.
- Be prompt with despatch. If in doubt about buyer's bona-fides, either wash out the deal or send C.O.D.
- 8. There will always be timewasters; be tolerant within reason!

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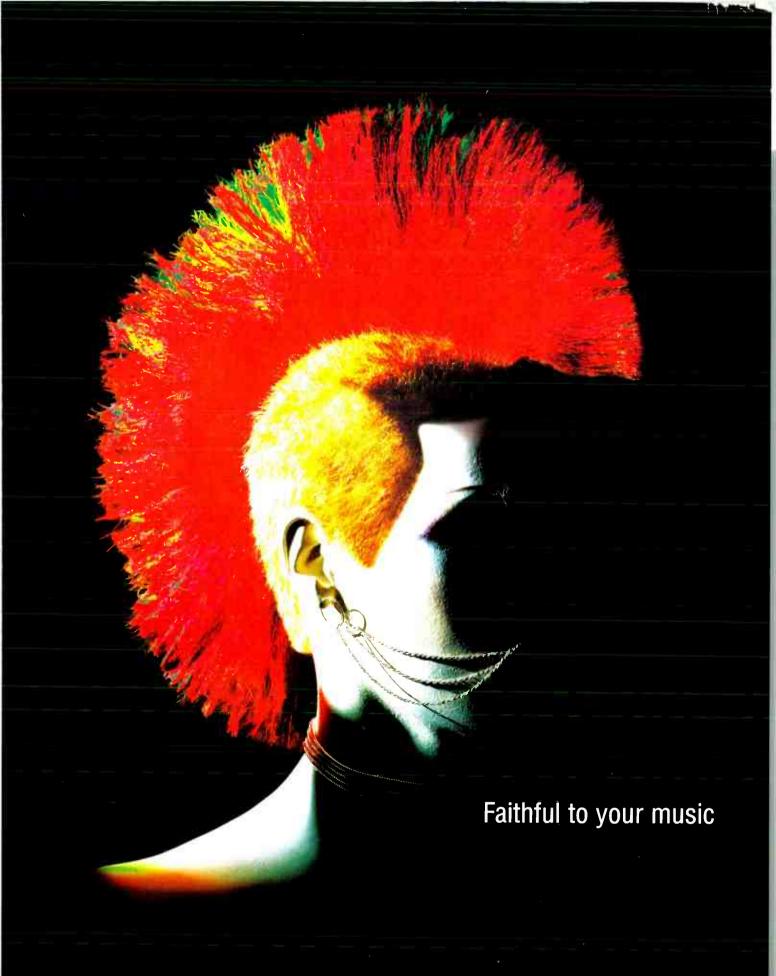
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
