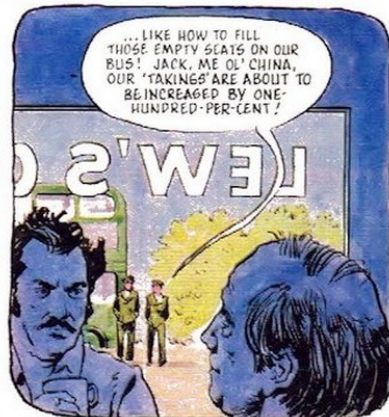

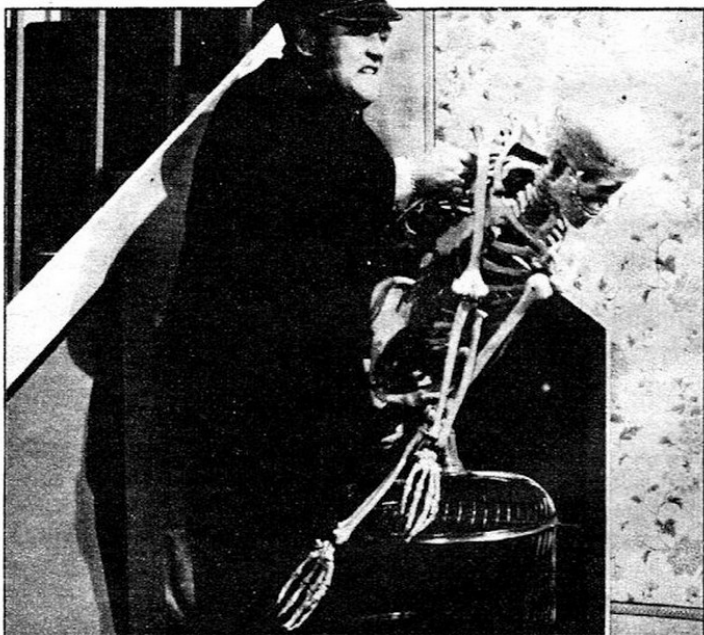

The result? Not 'boos' but the roar of hilarious laughter. The audience believed Les was being *funny*! The style stuck and with it Les climbed to the top—renowned as the dead-pan comic with an air of down-trodden desperation about him.

## STAR LETTER

My house is only about three miles away from the Cardington Airship Hangars in Bedfordshire. Last week, I went to Cardington to see the rebuilt Goodyear airship 'Europa' take off with two special passengers: Mr. Jock Armstrong, who helped build the famous airship R101, and Mr. Arthur Bell, a survivor of the R101's crash. The way in which 'Europa' took off was very interesting: several men pulled the gondola (the cabin beneath the airship, in which passengers travel) downwards and then gave it a sharp push upwards, while the pilot, Mr. Dick Widdicombe, throttled open the two engines. As the airship rose, the noise of its engines could be heard for three miles or more.

His talents were recognized when he was a boy by a family friend who made sure the young Pele joined the football club in his home town of Bauru, Brazil.

He was later taken to Santos, the famous Brazilian club, for which he has played ever since.

Pele lists Uwe Seeler of West Germany and England's Bobby Moore among his personal friends.

## CYRIL LITTLEWOOD'S... NATURE NOTES

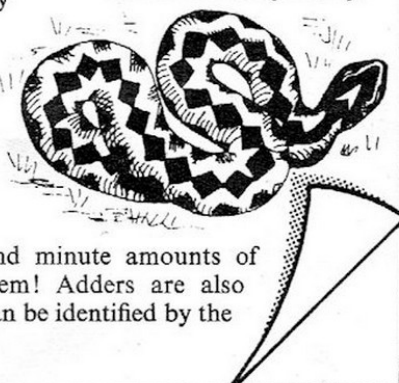
August is the breeding month for both grass-snake and adder.

The eggs of the grass-snake may be found on manure heaps, sometimes in large numbers. The transparent eggs of the adder hatch at—or before—birth. These may

number twelve and the baby adders (about four to eight inches in length) go straight off into the world, fully-equipped with tiny fangs and minute amounts of poison to arm them! Adders are also called vipers and can be identified by the "V" on their heads.

# HOW



**HOW** high is the Eiffel Tower, and when was it built?

*Lucelle Wainwright, Oldham, Lancs.*

This splendid symbol of Paris, capital of France, was built in 1889 for an exhibition in the city by an engineer named Monsieur Eiffel. It is 985 feet high and, until New York started sprouting skyscrapers, it was the world's tallest building or structure. At first, many Parisians hated the giant, claiming it was ugly and saying it ruined their beautiful city. Now all Paris is proud of it.

**HOW** did cheques originate?

*Steven Duddle, Royton, Lancs.*

Cheques started being used in Britain in the 18th century and are now used in many parts of the world, though, oddly, far more in Britain and America than in Europe. The idea dates back to earlier times when merchants began to give written notes to their creditors—the people to whom they owed money—which said that the bank would make good their debts. Modern cheques do the same on special bank forms.

**HOW** did Greenland get its name?

*K. Harrison, Bolton, Lancs.*

It received its name for a reason which we can only describe as a confidence trick! Those mighty mariners and men-of-war, the Vikings, or Norsemen, who first landed there, gave it that name to attract settlers to it. The actual confidence trickster seems to have been Erik the Red, who landed on the vast island around the year 982 and spotted a place he thought ideal for a settlement.

**HOW** did the Red Admiral butterfly get its name?

*Carol Hipkin, Norton, Worcs.*

Strangely, Carol, nobody knows for certain why these splendid-looking butterflies are called Red Admirals, though they certainly look as fine as an admiral in full dress uniform! It seems probable, however, that the word—as applied to butterflies—really means *admirable*!



**HOW** do earthworms manage to dig into hard earth?

*Lilian O'Hare, Port Talbot, Glamorgan.*

The answer is quite surprising, Lilian: they eat their way through it! The soil passes into their special digestive systems, passes out of their bodies, and is left in small heaps which are known as castings. The worms do a marvellous job of ventilating the soil and the castings help make it fertile.

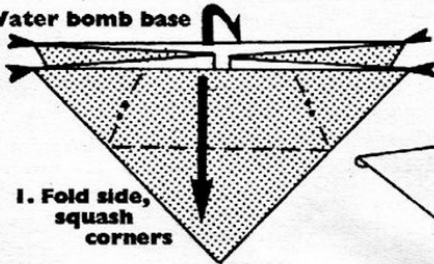

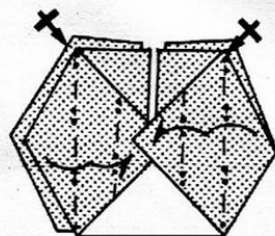

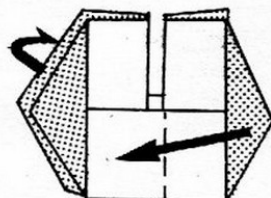
### Water bomb base



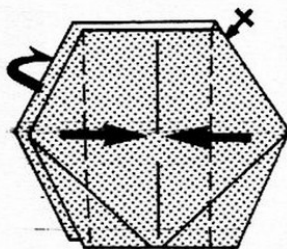
