## LIFT OFF

At the beginning of the 1960s a group called The Detours appeared regularly at many West London venues. But success seemed to elude them and hoping, no doubt, that a change of name would bring a change of fortune, they decided to switch to the High Numbers and brought out their first record 'Zoot Suit.' However, the record failed to make any impression on the British or American Top Twenty.

Then, in 1964, the group recruited the services of Kit Lambert and Chris Stamp, found a new drummer in Keith Moon, and changed their name once again to The Who, and took the first step on the road to success.



A change of name spelt success for The Who.

Their first big hit, 'My Generation', was released in 1965. It has been described as having 'all the feel of forced, fast emergence...'

The group has since appeared all over Europe, and given a performance of the rock-opera, at the Metropolitan Opera House in New York. In 1970 over 30,000 people paid £2.50p each to see them sing in Los Angeles—a point which proves their tremendous popularity!

All fans of The Who will know that their latest single is called 'Join Together' and their newest album, 'Who's Next', has received rave reviews from the critics.

# HOW

**HOW** did the Yanks get their name?

*W. Stacey, Skellingthorpe, Lincoln.*

Yank is a short form of Yankee. It probably comes from a Dutch word for John — *Janke*. Before New York was a state and even before it was a British colony, it was settled by the Dutch. New York city was originally New Amsterdam. The Dutch called the New Englanders to the north *Jankes*, which was turned into *Yankees* by the later British settlers. In the Civil War (1861-65) Southerners called all their Northern enemies *Yankees* and even today Northerners are called—more politely!—*Yankees*, especially New Englanders. We foreigners, of course, tend to call all Americans *Yankees* or *Yanks*. But never, never call a Southerner a *Yankee*!

**HOW** is Danish Blue cheese made?

*Richard Garside, Wakefield, Yorkshire.*

Those blue veins, which can also be found in the delicious French cheese called Roquefort, appear because the cheese is treated with mouldy breadcrumbs, the particular mould being *penicillium glaucum*. Richard also asked where the name Gorgonzola—a popular and strong cheese—comes from. The answer is the town in northern Italy near Milan, whose name it bears. The area is still famous for its cheese.

**HOW** many countries are there in the world? I say 72 but my friend says 91. Who is right?

*Simon Shurville, Motspur Park, New Malden, Surrey.*

You are both wrong, we're afraid, Simon. Lots of you have asked this question, and we've been rather scared of answering as new nations keep appearing these days. We may be wrong by the time this issue comes out, but the answer is 146 independent countries. However, if you count territories that are not completely independent, though separately governed, the score comes up to 226.

**HOW** long would it take for the sea to wash away a foot of a cliff?

*Lloyd Marshall, Dumbartonshire, Scotland.*

We're sorry we can't give you a definite answer to your question, Lloyd, because 'erosion'—as the eating away of land is called—varies in speed depending on the hardness of the rock or soil and on various other things. Erosion can be caused by water, by the sea or rivers or rain. The wind, too, can help the process along, so can ice or melting snow. So it might be a few minutes—or a century!

In case you haven't already heard, the big movie news recently is that Roger Moore is to take over the screen role of 'James Bond', following in the footsteps of Sean Connery and (for one film only) George Lazenby.

Although Roger is probably best known for his TV appearances as 'The Saint' and as 'Lord Brett Sinclair' of 'The Persuaders', he's no new-comer to the big screen, having made several films since his Hollywood debut in *THE LAST TIME I SAW PARIS* in 1955.



## XVI: The 'Vamp'

'Giving it the full treatment', or gaining publicity by way of weird stunts or sensational stories, has always played an important part in the movie business. One of the first stars to get 'the treatment' was a tailor's daughter from Cincinnati, Ohio, called Theodosia Goodman. When the studio got to work, Theodosia became world-famous as 'Theda Bara' (below), the mysterious daughter of an Arab sheikh. In her publicity photographs, she was shown dressed in black, surrounded by 'horror' props such as skeletons and mummy-cases, and her films, such as *SALOME* (1918) showed her as a beautiful woman whose strange powers led men to their doom. She became known as a 'vamp'—short for 'vampire'—and this word is still sometimes used to describe an actress whose charms are 'wrapped in mystery'.
