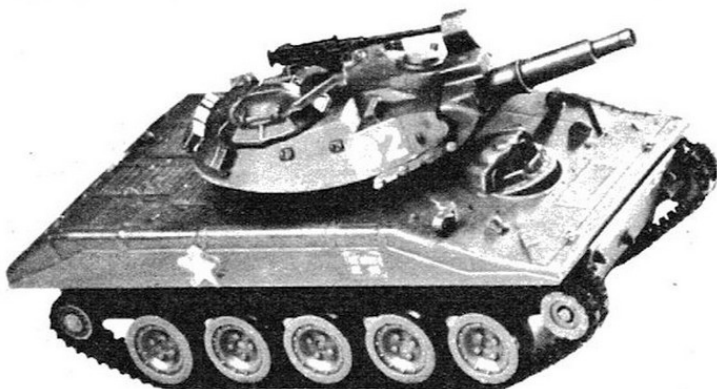

**GILLIAN (DORA)**

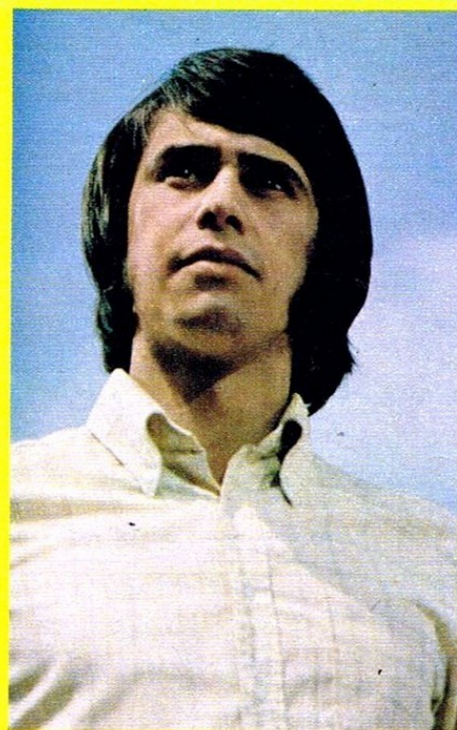

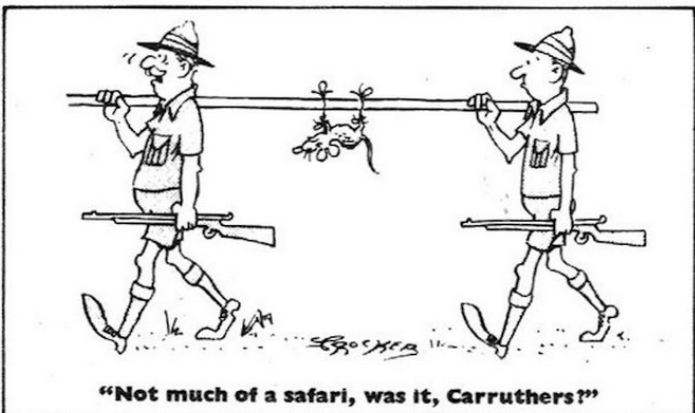
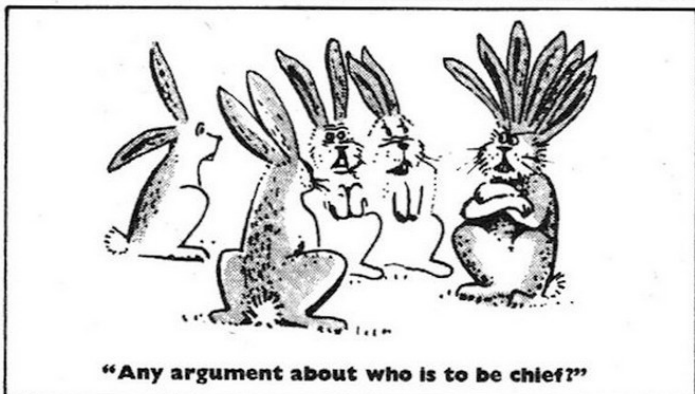
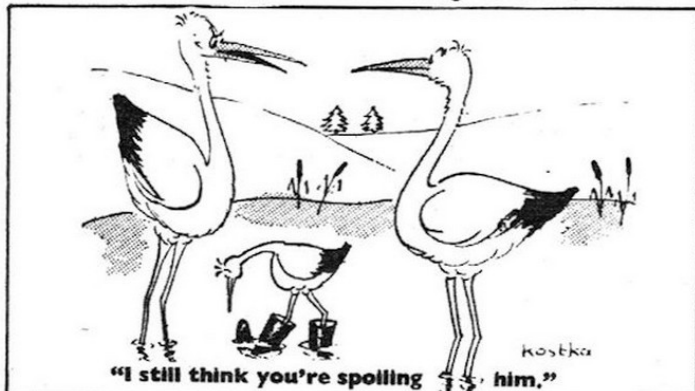


**STEVE**

His TV appearances include a walk-on part in the 'Hine' series and a more substantial role in a play called 'The Grievance'. Off-stage, Steve has turned his hand to working as a scaffolder, navy and butcher, though he relaxes by reading, writing poetry and, of course, horse-riding.

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## The Epic to End 'em All!

NEWS THIS WEEK of another exciting 'new' movie that may be on its way to your local cinema soon. In fact, this particular film is more than fifteen years old—but its appeal, like its subject, is timeless. It's Cecil B. DeMille's 'super-colossal' **THE TEN COMMANDMENTS**, made in 1956—nearly four hours long, and now bigger than ever on the extra-wide 'Cinerama' screen. With its amazing special effects (watch out for the Red Sea parting to let the Israelites through—and then rushing in to drown Pharaoh's army), it's the epic to end 'em all!

**THE TEN COMMANDMENTS** of 1956 was DeMille's second shot at the subject (see 'Movie-makers' below). To tell the story of Moses from his cradle in the bullrushes of the Nile to his glory as leader

of the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt, DeMille assembled a distinguished cast. Some of his stars, like Yvonne de Carlo, Edward G. Robinson and Sir Cedric Hardwicke, have now left the movies—but Charlton Heston (Moses), Yul Brynner (Pharaoh Rameses), and horror-film 'king' Vincent Price (in a suitably evil rôle) are still great names today.



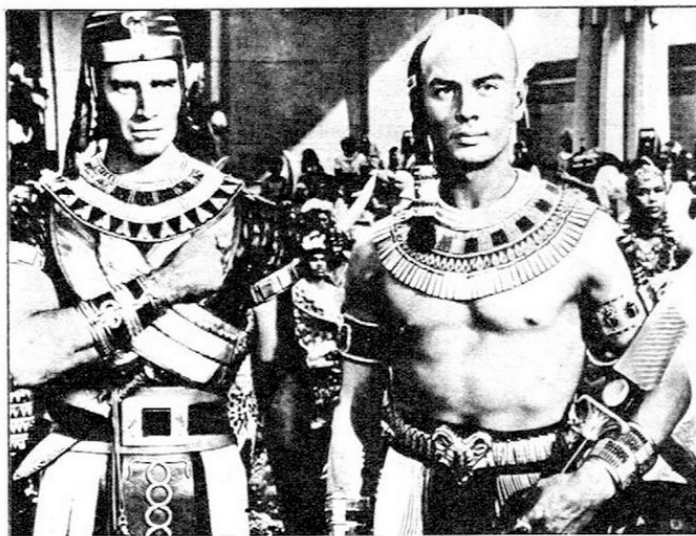

### XVII: Beating the Blue Pencil

In the early years of Hollywood there were—as there are today—many people who claimed that movies dealing with violence or unpleasant subjects were a bad influence, especially on young people. To meet this criticism, Will H. Hays was appointed 'censor' of all American films, and the 'Hays Office' drew up very strict rules as to what could or couldn't be shown on the screen.

But Cecil B. DeMille found a way to beat the censor's 'blue pencil'. His first version of **THE TEN COMMANDMENTS**, made in 1923, was extremely violent in parts, and, because DeMille used the movie to tell a modern story interwoven with the biblical one, it dealt with all kinds of 'difficult' topics—but because it was based on the Bible, few people ventured to criticise it!

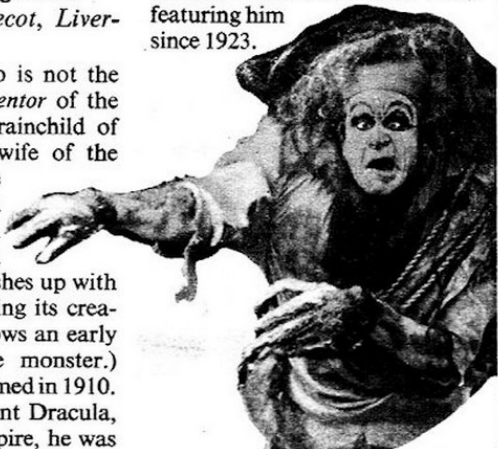


## HOW and when did the horror characters of 'Frankenstein' and 'Count Dracula' originate?

Frankenstein, who is not the monster but the inventor of the monster, was the brainchild of Mary Shelley, the wife of the poet Shelley. She wrote a book called *Frankenstein*, which was published in 1818, and which finishes up with the monster murdering its creator. (The picture shows an early film version of the monster.) The story was first filmed in 1910. As for dear old Count Dracula, the well-known vampire, he was

the creation of Bram Stoker, who wrote a classic horror novel about him in 1897—called *Dracula!* The films have been featuring him since 1923.



## HOW was hypnotism started, and who was the first person to use it?

Rosemary Smollen, Ilkley, Yorkshire.

Nobody knows who first used it, Rosemary. The ancient Greeks, Romans and Egyptians knew about hypnotism, for their priest-doctors discovered how to use it. And many witch-doctors have known the secret. It used to be called Mesmerism after an Austrian doctor, Anton Mesmer (1733-1815).


Two points: nobody can be hypnotised into a trance, which is like deep sleep, unless he or she wants to be, and anyone, given the right training, can become a hypnotist. There is nothing frightening about hypnotism, and it can help people in trouble, and in pain.

## HOW did the saying 'Bless you!' after someone has sneezed come about?

It is really 'God bless you!', Richard. One story has it that the saying started with St. Gregory (328-390), who used to say it during a terrible plague, because the first symptom of the fatal disease was a sneeze. However, another story, roughly the same, comes from ancient Greece long before the birth of Christ.

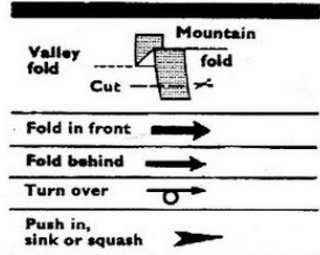
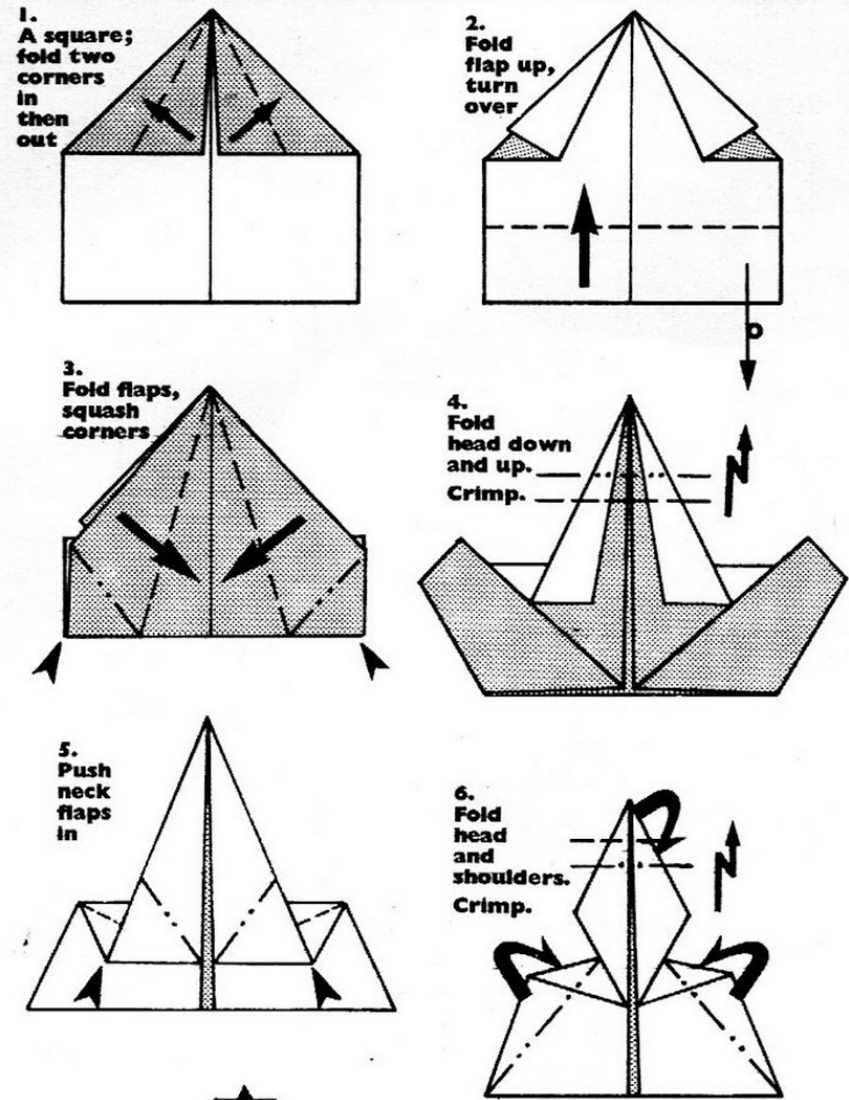

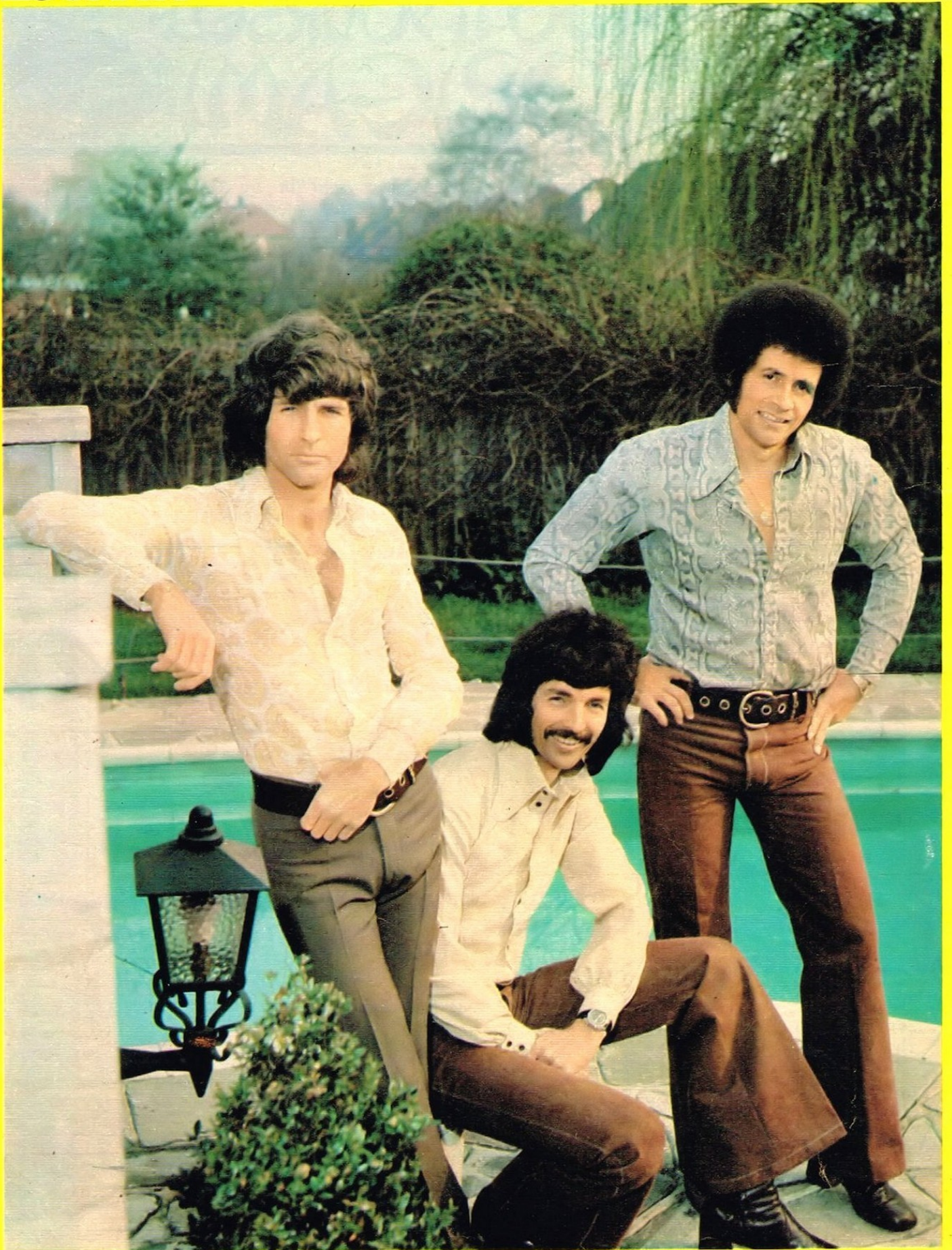
