# BLACK BEAUTY



**Y**OU'VE PROBABLY READ reports of the wonderful rewards that some top acting stars earn with their talents: country mansions, swimming-pools, holidays in the Bahamas—the best of everything. But the star of a new television series gets a very special reward at the end of each day's filming: a bowl of creamy rice-pudding! That's the favourite treat of 'Black Jet', who makes his television debut this week (except in London, where you must wait until October 21) in the 'name part' of London Weekend Television's "The Adventures of Black Beauty".

Seven-year-old 'Black Jet', bred in America but purchased by his British owner for £7,000, is a top-class performer in trotting races, a sport now becoming popular in Britain. But he faced stiff competition in his bid for television stardom. "I auditioned close on twenty horses," says Paul Kight, executive producer of the series. "Some would rear 'on cue' but wouldn't neigh at the right time. Others were good 'actors'—but just looked wrong. ➔

Of course, we needed a jet-black horse—although one hopeful owner explained that his grey horse could be made to look 'black' by the right lighting!"

### Training for TV

After winning the part, 'Black Jet' was sent to polish up his acting at a farm run by horse-trainers Reg and Shirley Dent. The farm is near Rickmansworth, in Hertfordshire, where filming for the series has been taking place. The Hertfordshire countryside provides an ideal setting for the village of 'Five Oaks', where 'Black Beauty' lives with his master, Doctor Gordon (played by William Lucas) and the Doctor's children, Vicky (Judi Bowker) and Kevin (Roderick Shaw). Like 'Black Jet', eighteen-year-old Judi Bowker is making her first television appearance.

The famous novel on which the series is based was written nearly one hundred years ago by Anna Sewell, a Quaker lady who devoted her life to the welfare of animals. Her 'autobiography of a horse' (in the book, the story is told as if by 'Black Beauty') was written to expose the cruel treatment suffered by many horses.

Miss Sewell's book was an enormous success—it is now the sixth best-selling book of all time—and the treatment of horses improved accordingly. But the author did not live to enjoy her triumph, dying in 1878, only one year after the publication of 'Black Beauty'.

In writing the scripts for the series, Lord Willis (who, as Ted Willis, is perhaps Britain's best-known writer for television) has kept the nineteenth-century English countryside as a setting and has used Anna Sewell's book as a stepping-stone to a series of exciting adventures in which 'Black Beauty' plays a leading part. The historical setting allows the writer to introduce a whole gallery of colourful characters: a bullying Squire, an ex-prizefighter, red-coated soldiers, tramps and beggars, highway-robbers and gypsies. Look out for the episode in which 'Black Beauty' helps the Gordon family to save the life of a blind pit-pony, condemned to death when it can no longer toil underground.

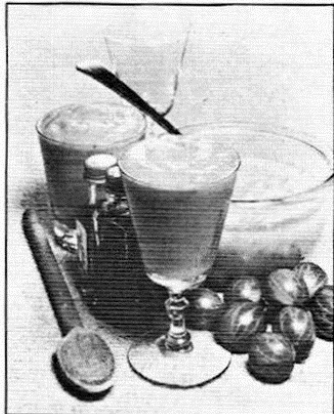

**Let's start with a recipe.**

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**Fruit Fool**

- 15oz. (375g) tin of gooseberries
- 2 tablespoons of double cream
- 15oz. (375g) tin of ready-made custard



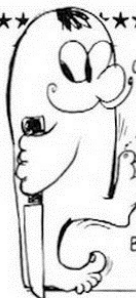
Open the tin of gooseberries and pour about half the juice into a cup. Save this. Turn the rest of the fruit and juice into a sieve standing over a basin. Use a wooden spoon and push fruit through the sieve to remove the pips and skin. Use the purée in the basin. Open the tin of custard and pour it into a basin. Stir in the gooseberry purée and the double cream. If the fruit is too thick, you can stir in a little of the juice from the cup. Add vegetable colourings if liked. Makes enough for four people.

# HOW

**HOW** long is the largest wingspan of any bird?

The wandering albatross has the largest wing-span, Elaine. Most of these birds have a span of over ten feet and one definitely had wings which stretched eleven feet ten inches. Additionally experts believe that some unmeasured wandering albatrosses have wings more than twelve feet across! A mute swan with a wing-span of twelve feet was measured in 1939, but that is most unusual as this bird generally only measures nine feet across the wings.

## XVIII: The Deadly Doctor

ALTHOUGH this series has concentrated on Hollywood, important developments in the cinema also took place in Europe, especially in France and Germany. It was a German director, Robert Wiene, who made the first great 'horror' film, *THE CABINET OF DOCTOR CALIGARI*, in 1919.

It told the story of a stage magician who hypnotised his assistant and forced him to commit murders. Because its central character was a 'madman', the movie made no attempt at realism: instead, through simple settings, sharp lighting effects and deliberate overacting, it aimed at a 'nightmare' effect.



## Meet the Wolf Man!


MOST PEOPLE seem to enjoy being thoroughly scared by 'things that go

bump in the night'. So this week we take a look at 'horror' films: While 'The Movie-makers' examines one of the first 'horror' films, below we look at — 'The Wolf Man'.

A series of movies made in the 1930s and 1940s starred Frankenstein's Monster (usually played by Boris Karloff), the vampire Count Dracula (usually Bela Lugosi) and 'Lawrence Talbot', the unfortunate Wolf Man, played by Lon Chaney jr. Chaney followed a family tradition: his father, Lon Chaney snr., had excelled in 'creepy' parts, in which his great gift for weird make-ups and disguises had earned him the name of 'man with a thousand faces'.

'Lawrence Talbot', so the story went, was an English aristocrat who was doomed to change to a werewolf—who could only be killed by a silver bullet—at the time of the full moon. At other times he was a normal man, appalled by the crimes he committed as a werewolf. Much of the character's popularity lay in the fact that audiences could feel sorry for 'Talbot', instead of just seeing him as an evil monster.


'Frankenstein Meets The Wolf Man'—1943—ended in both 'Talbot' and the Frankenstein monster being swept away in a flood.
