# LIFT-OFF BLASTS BACK!

BETTER LAY THE TABLE with the oldest cups and saucers next Wednesday, because round about tea-time so many feet will be a-tappin' and fingers a-dickin' that the family china may be in peril from people with their minds on 'pop' instead of tea. For that's when the countdown to Granada Television's new series of 'Lift-Off' ends—and the pop programme blasts back onto the screen.

Ayshea Brough (right), sun-tanned (we hope!) after summer shows

at British holiday resorts, will once again be hosting a fast-moving feast of the kind of music you like to hear, played by the performers you like to watch—because, as before, viewers' requests will play a large part in shaping the programme. "We're really thrilled at the absolutely huge number of requests we've had," says Ayshea.

'Never change a winning team' says the soccer proverb—and the producers of 'Lift-Off' agree that such a successful show is in no need of sweeping changes, even as it enters its fourth series. So old friends like The Sweet and Mikki Anthony will be in the

studio once more. And in a star-studded guest list the names of Olivia Newton John, Labi Siffre, Tony Blackburn, New World and Middle of the Road stand out. And Fred Barker will be on hand (awful joke—get it?) to make sure that things keep on swinging.

One important ingredient of 'Lift Off's' success has been the exciting routines of The Feet, the dancing team of two girls—Victoria Shellard and Kathy Collins—and two guys—Ken Martyne and Guy Lutman—featured in the programme from the very beginning. LOOK-IN focuses on the female half of The Feet.

Like Victoria, Kathy picked up some of her dancing skills as a member of the 'Young Generation' with Rolf Harris. She is a promising young actress, with appearances in 'Doctor at Large' and in a whole host of television commercials, and is also much in demand as a fashion model. It sounds like a glamorous life—but Kathy's great ambition is very down-to-earth: "I want to get married." Well, her appearances on 'Lift Off' should win her plenty of admirers!

The book is called 'The Hamlyn Book Of Stamp Collecting', and it will keep you occupied for hours. So why not buy a copy? I have.



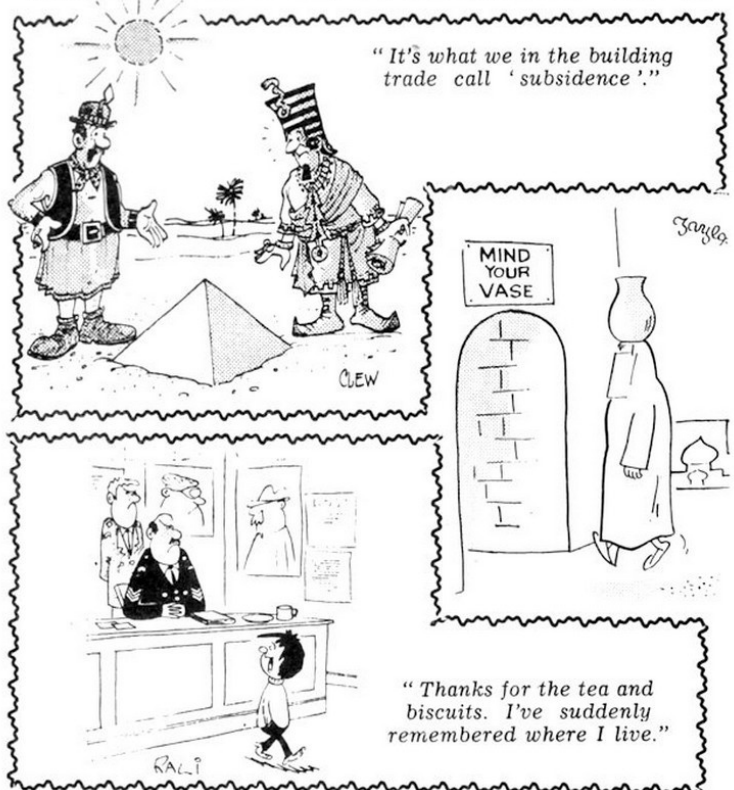

## SMILE WITH STEWPOT





LOOK-IN/NEW WORLD  
YOUNG COOKS' CLUB

Hello to all club members. No recipe this week apart from a quick look at the best way to prepare scrambled eggs. But there is something that I'm sure will interest you—the start of a series on vegetables. Why not use your felt tip pens or crayons to colour the illustrations? Chef Cat talks about 'Fats'—and he should know!—and Ferdie continues his series on fish.



**VEGETABLES I.**

It's not always easy to recognize vegetables at the green-grocers, particularly those which have a short season or are not well known. These pictures will help you to identify some vegetables and the captions give you the ways to prepare and cook them.



**Potatoes.** New potatoes should be scraped to remove the skin or simply scrubbed to remove loose flakes of skin and cooked in boiling, salted water for about 20 minutes. They are usually served whole with a piece of butter. You can add mint to the water when cooking them.



This is your old pal Chef Cat speaking. Here we go with No. 3 of the essential ingredients in food.

**FATS**  
Found in these foods:



Butter, margarine and lard are fats. So is the fat on meat, and in peanuts and other nuts, in herrings and salmon.

**Carrots.** Cut off tops and roots. Scrape if young and peel thinly when old. Cut into slices; leave whole if very tiny. Rinse them. Cook in boiling, salted water for 20 minutes until tender. Can be served with a white sauce.



**Cauliflower.** Cut off stalk and damaged leaves. Wash the white part. Cook whole in boiling, salted water for 10-15 minutes. Serve with a cheese or white sauce. The white part can be broken into small pieces for cooking.



And talking of fish, Ferdie has some more White Fish for you to look at.

**SKATE.** Only the wings are sold and the flesh is slightly pink. Small skate are the best flavour, large ones tending to

be tough. Best from October to March, and fairly expensive. Fry, poach, stew skate wings.

**TURBOT.** A flat fish with fine flesh. The flavour is delicate and the fish is usually expensive. Good all year round. Poach it, steam, bake, grill or shallow-fry.

**Onions.** Skin them and leave whole. Cook in just enough water to cover them. Cook for 45 minutes to 1 hour in boiling, salted water. Usually chopped and used for flavouring stews and casseroles.



**Cabbage.** Remove damaged leaves. Cut into quarters. Wash well and shred coarsely. Wash again and put in pan with the water clinging. Cook for 5-7 minutes adding water only if cabbage sticks. Never use bicarbonate of soda.

**Cookery Words**



**BEATING.** To beat is to mix well together usually using a wooden spoon. A sauce is beaten to mix the milk with the butter and flour.

**SCRAMBLING EGGS.** Allow one egg per person. Beat the eggs in a basin with a good pinch of salt and pepper to season. Melt a knob of butter about the size of a walnut in a saucepan with a non-stick lining.

When the butter is hot and sizzling, pour in the beaten egg. Cook gently, stirring all the time, lifting the cooked egg from the bottom to allow the soft egg to reach the heat. Cook until the eggs have just set and thickened. Serve on hot buttered toast.

## Under the Monster Mask

Although he died three years ago at the age of eighty-two, readers' letters suggest that Boris Karloff, the man behind the horrific makeup in so many spine-chilling movies, is still a firm favourite. So here, at the request of reader Leigh Jackson of Poole, Dorset, is a picture of Karloff without his 'monster' mask.



Boris Karloff (his real name was William Pratt) was born in England and educated at two famous public schools before going to North America to seek fame as an actor in 1910. By 1919 he had reached Hollywood, where he played small 'villainous' parts in dozens of silent films and early talkies. It was Karloff's deep voice, with its 'echo-chamber' effect, which won him the part of the Monster in *FRANKENSTEIN* (1931) and set him on the road to movie immortality. For more than thirty years, he delighted—and terrified—audiences with portrayals of mad scientists, monsters, zombies, 'living' Egyptian mummies and a whole gallery of other horrors.



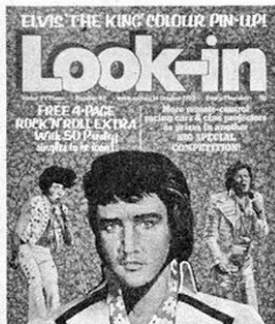
## MOTORBIKE MADNESS
