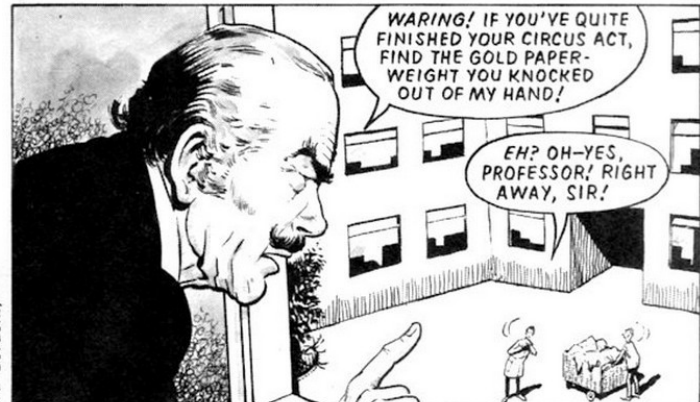

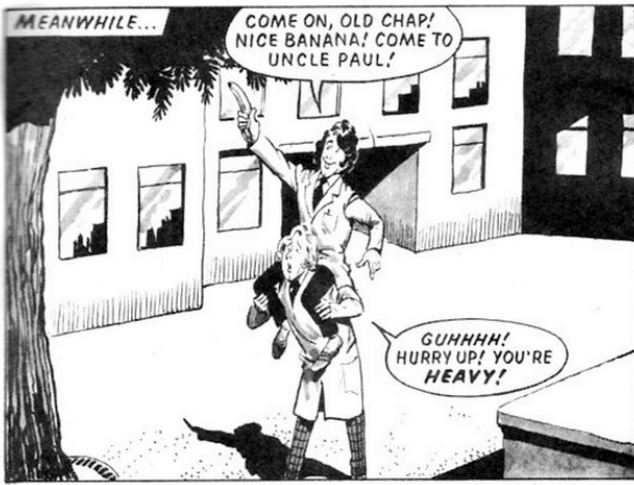

# NAMIB BY NIGHT

ROD BORLAND, 'Survival' wildlife cameraman, pumped up the Tilley lamp until it glowed brilliantly and announced: "Let's go and hunt for goodies."

We were standing in a small circle of white lamplight on top of a twelve-hundred-foot dune of bright red sand in the middle of the oldest desert on earth—the Namib desert in South-West Africa.

'Goodies' is Rod's word for the night creatures which abound in these huge dunes. He needed specimens for the 'Survival' film he is making on the secret life of the Namib. By midday, the red sand reaches boiling point and the desert seems empty of all life. Now, by night, the lamp revealed tiny tracks.

The first 'goody' we found was a brilliant mauve-and-yellow lizard — a palmato gecko. All day he'd lain hidden in the remains of his burrow which had collapsed, totally burying him, as the sun drew the morning dew from the sand. Only now was it safe for him to emerge.

A series of minute footprints lead us to the next denizen, a trapdoor spider about two-inches across, called a white lady. During the night, she cunningly excavates a tunnel. Then, with the aid of a sticky secretion, she cements a trapdoor to its lip, made entirely of sand.

As we watched, a dune cricket came hopping innocently along. The white lady moved in a sudden blur of action, seized the unfortunate cricket, whipped open her trapdoor using a couple of spare feet, and disappeared with her prey into her gruesome cellar.

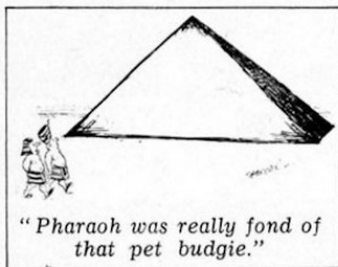
Perhaps the strangest 'goody' of all, though, was one we didn't manage to catch that night. We simply found the burrows where he'd been snuffling along for hundreds of yards beneath the sand, hunting for beetle larvae. Rod caught a fine specimen a few nights later — a rare golden mole.

By dawn all these, and many more night-dwellers, would have taken cover in the sands and the Namib desert would once again seem still and lifeless.

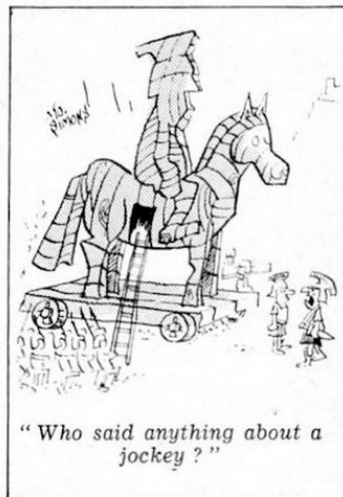
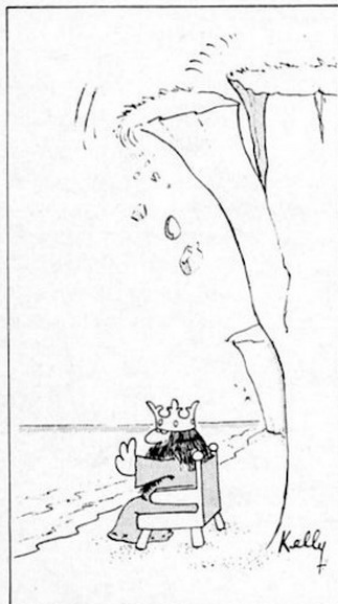

# Introduced by Kathie Webber Cookery Editor of TVTimes

This week, Chef Cat continues to explain about essential ingredients of food and Ferdie Fingers presents some more fish for you to recognize. Let's begin with part two of my series on how to deal with some of the vegetables at the greengrocers.



## VEGETABLES 2

**Leeks** Trim off discoloured tips of leaves and remove root. Wash very well. Cut into slices and cook in boiling, salted water for 30 minutes or until quite soft and tender.



water for 10 minutes or until tender and serve with melted butter. Can also be sliced diagonally for cooking and served with a white or cheese sauce.

\*\*\*\*\*

**Sprouts** Cut off the stems and remove any discoloured outer leaves. Wash well. Cut a cross in the stalk. Cook for 7-12 minutes in the water clinging to them, adding a little more if they stick.



**Turnips** Cut off stalks and root. Peel thickly and cut into 1 inch cubes. Rinse. Cook for 30 minutes to 1 hour in boiling, salted water until tender. Can also be mashed to a purée.



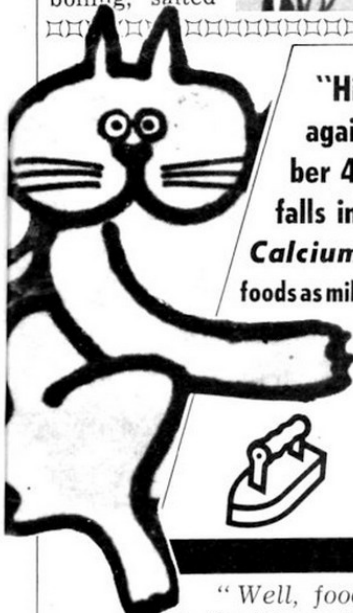

**French Beans** Cut off the ends and rinse them. Cook them whole in boiling, salted



**Marrow** Rinse to remove any dirt and thickly peel off the green skin. Cut the marrow in half and scoop out the

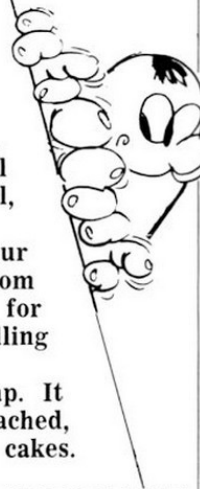
### LAST OF THE WHITE FISH by Ferdie Fingers

Here are three more types of fish that make great eating.

**COD** A fairly cheap fish, but it doesn't have much flavour. It needs additions when cooking, but it's a most useful fish. Best from October to February but good all year round. Poach, steam, stew, bake, grill, braise or fry it.

**HALIBUT** A fish with a fine delicate flavour and firm flesh. Quite expensive. Best from July to March. Usually sold in steaks for poaching, steaming, stewing, baking, grilling or frying.

**WHITING** A relation of the cod, and cheap. It has a delicate flavour and can be poached, steamed, fried, baked or used for fish cakes. Best November to February.

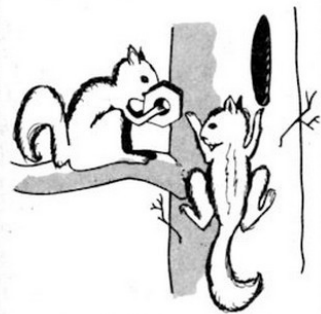

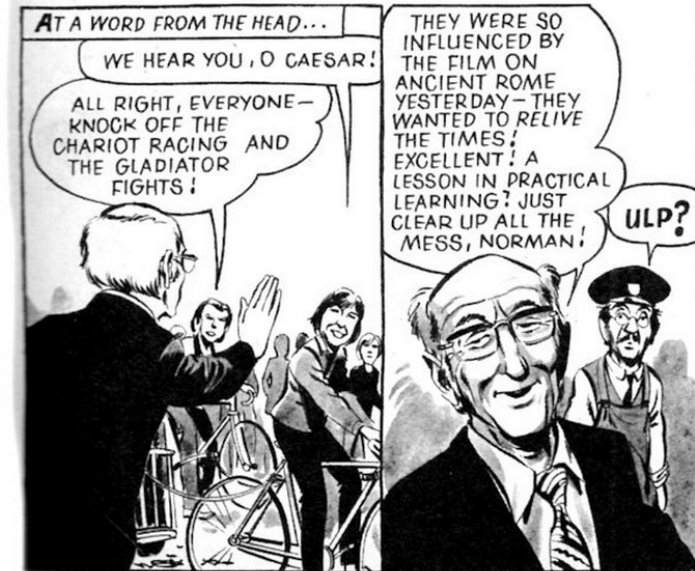

# ROCK 'N' ROLL

ROCK 'N' ROLL ARRIVES! A twenty-nine-year-old singer and his group landed at Southampton. Screaming fans packed the quayside. A special train took them to London. Waterloo Station burst apart at the seams

with the welcome. Theatres where they were booked to appear were under siege. Questions were asked in Parliament about the 'safety' of fans at their concerts.

The year was 1957. Bill Haley and the Comets had arrived. Rock 'n' Roll — in person — had come to Britain. But it had begun much earlier in America, round about 1954-55.



Bill Haley & The Comets (Left)

Bill Haley was the first world-wide rock 'n' roll star. Beginning his career as a 'country and western' singer, he began to play in a style copied from coloured American blues singers. Other singers and musicians did the same—and rock 'n' roll was born. Haley's greatest hits are 'Rock The Joint', 'Shake, Rattle and Roll', 'Rock Around The Clock', 'See You Later, Alligator'—and many more.

## STATESIDE SCENE

**Little Richard**  
(Below and front cover)  
"Everybody needs to get down with it! All the real people are down with it—but it's the squares that ain't gettin' nowhere!" Little Richard (see front cover) born Richard Penniman in Macon, Georgia, in 1935, has been 'gettin' down' with the rock since he burst on the scene in Bill Haley's film 'Don't Knock The Rock'. His first great hit was 'Tutti Frutti' in 1955; others include: 'Long Tall Sally', 'She's Got It', 'Keep A Knockin'".



**Elvis Presley** (Above)  
'The King' himself! Ever since 'Heartbreak Hotel' hit the turn-tables in 1956, Elvis has been at the top. He will probably stay there forever. But one sorrow of British fans is summed up in a newspaper headline of 1957 "Presley is not coming—this year at least". Fifteen years later, we're still waiting!



**Buddy Holly** (Right)  
Before his death in an air crash in 1959, at the age of twenty, Buddy Holly had become one of the all-time greats. His singing style, which influenced Adam Faith among others, is 'sweeter' than that of most rockers: as you can judge from his 'That'll Be The Day', 'Peggy Sue' and 'It Doesn't Matter Any More'.



**Jerry Lee Lewis** (Below)  
Great destroyer of pianos is Jerry Lee Lewis from Louisiana. A rock 'n' roll giant, Jerry Lee busted eardrums with such numbers as 'Whole Lotta Shakin' Goin' On' and 'Great Balls of Fire', before returning, later in the 1960s, to the 'country and western' style.









**This country, too, produced its own dynamic team of top rockers. Here are a few of them...**

**Tommy Steele**

In 1956, Tommy Steele was an eighteen-year-old ex-merchant seaman, playing guitar and singing in London coffee-bars. In 1957, he was an international star, presented to the Queen at a Royal Command Performance. He's never looked back.

**Billy Fury**

Born Ronald Wycherley in Liverpool, Billy Fury modelled his style on American singer Eddie Cochran. He hit the scene in 1958, made many successful records—and is still a big name in cabaret.

**Cliff Richard**

At the age of seventeen, in 1958, Cliff was a top rock 'n' roller. But he soon moved on to the tuneful style of ballad singing—'Living Doll' was his first smash hit—that has kept him at the top ever since.
