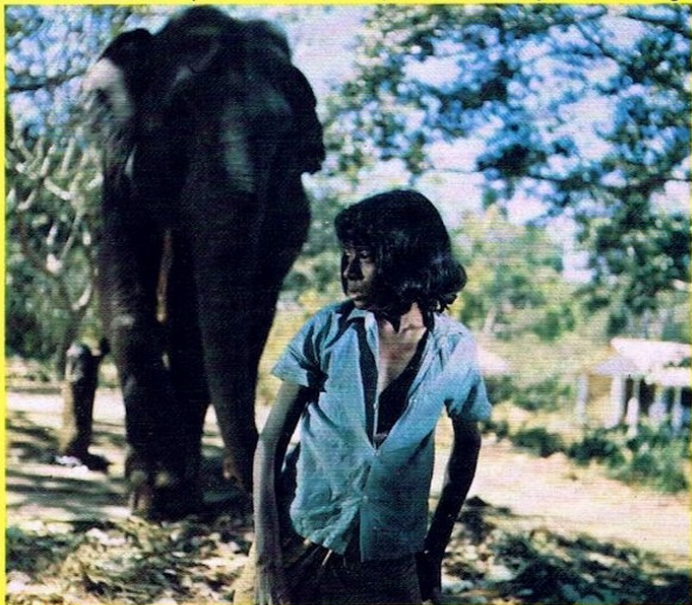

Take a Trip into the all-action world of ELEPHANT BOY

Beneath a strength-sapping sun, and surrounded by thick, tropical vegetation, the team of experts worked hard. The rattle and clatter of complicated equipment being pushed from one position to another intermingled with the many voices, issuing instructions.

Suddenly, though, there was silence and nothing moved; nothing, that is, except for a snake which appeared from the undergrowth. It was a full-grown cobra, capable of killing a man with one bite!

Fortunately, it slid off gracefully again, but it had served as a reminder to the film crew of 'Elephant Boy'. Shooting on location in Ceylon (Sri Lanka) meant danger was only too close a neighbour.

Producer James Gatwood recalled other such hazards: "Poisonous spiders, scorpions, leeches—not to mention the elephants, themselves!"

Those of you who have already seen 'Elephant Boy' on your TV screens will know it's an exciting series based on Rudyard Kipling's 'Toomai Of The

Elephants'. Filmed by an Australian company for distribution via Scottish Television, its main stars are, of course, Toomai, played by Esrom, a young Sinhalese actor and Kala Nag, the Asian elephant he controls to perfection.

Other lead rôles are those of Ranjit, younger brother of Toomai, and Chief Warden of the game reserve, Karl Bergen, played by a powerful, blond German actor named Uwe Friedrichsen. Another blond member of the cast is the veterinary surgeon, Sue Fraser, (actress Jan Kingsbury) who, together with Bergen and Toomai often have to face the not so friendly ex-Maharajah, Mr. Padam.

Each programme presents a short, complete story with guest stars—including animal as well as human actors. But persuading a fishing cat, leopard or five-ton elephant exactly when to take its 'cue' wasn't particularly easy!

"Elephants are extremely intelligent and equally strong," James Gatwood continued. "Although they are chained at night, they are capable of breaking free with little more than a sharp tug of one of their legs."

It appears their 'fear' of man, is some strange almost sixth-sense which at times—such as when the elephant is angry—it overcomes.

James also gave another example of their power.

Their diet includes the trunk of the Kite Tree. Presented with such a meal, the elephant would stand on part of the trunk and kick the other end to break the bark. Then it

would pick out the soft wood in the centre."

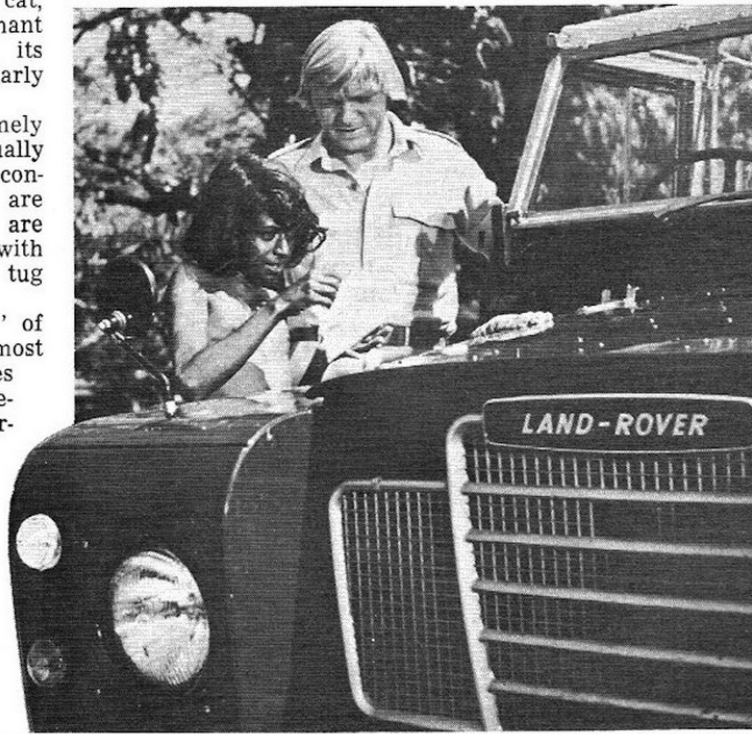
The thickness of the tree trunk? James watched one

elephant eat its way through a trunk one and half feet in diameter!

Shooting of the film took

place around a Government-owned estate, which served as the 'reserve'—and Kandy, a town in the middle of the mountain range of Central Ceylon, was picked as production headquarters.

The excitement soon drew local attention, highlighted by a visit from the son of one of Ceylon's leading officials. Everything was made ready. The elephants were put into their enclosure, a leopard—required for a film sequence—was also locked up.

The crew were ready to greet the entourage of cars which approached. But danger, once more, was just round the corner. No sooner had the young figure stepped from his car, closely followed by his attendants, when the leopard escaped. And that wasn't all. Two elephants clashed within their pen and the mahouts (elephant drivers) ran away.

There was little time for thought. The leopard, alone, offered more than a threat to human life. Someone shouted to fetch a chicken—hoping that the leopard's attention would be drawn to an easy meal.

James Gatward acted on that advice. But not being a 'local,' he didn't realize a fresh chicken was needed. Instead he ran to a nearby fridge inside the main building and reached for a pre-packed and cooked bird! A hasty throw, and the leopard advanced. But it was baffled by such civilized preparations—and didn't give the chicken a second glance!

Luckily, both leopard and elephants were quietened and settled down again. The young official continued his tour, perhaps a little less keenly though than before!

On air, 'Elephant Boy' captures all the danger and excitement from off-screen, plus a great deal more—with the help of gripping story lines that involve a variety of wild animals and human 'rogues'.

If you haven't seen the series, watch out for it when it comes to your ITV region.

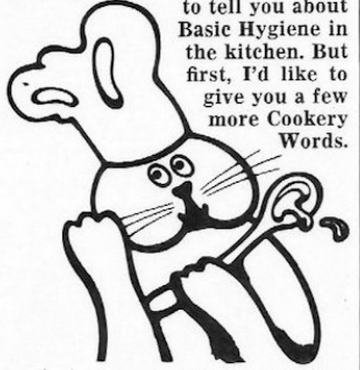

HELLO everyone, Kathie Webber here. I'm the Cookery Editor of TV Times and patron of the Young Cooks' Club.

Ferdie Fingers has been telling you in recent weeks about fish. Now I offer you the chance to use some of those fish when preparing the recipe on the left for delicious Fish Cakes.

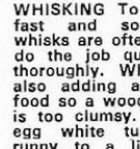
Hi, it's your old whisky pal Chef Cat speaking. Mouse has been moaning to me that we don't give him enough to do. So this week I'm going to put matters right by inviting him to



tell you about Basic Hygiene in the kitchen. But first, I'd like to give you a few more Cookery Words.



WHIPPING Another term for beating but usually applied to cream. Whip the cream using a fork and a circular motion until it begins to thicken.

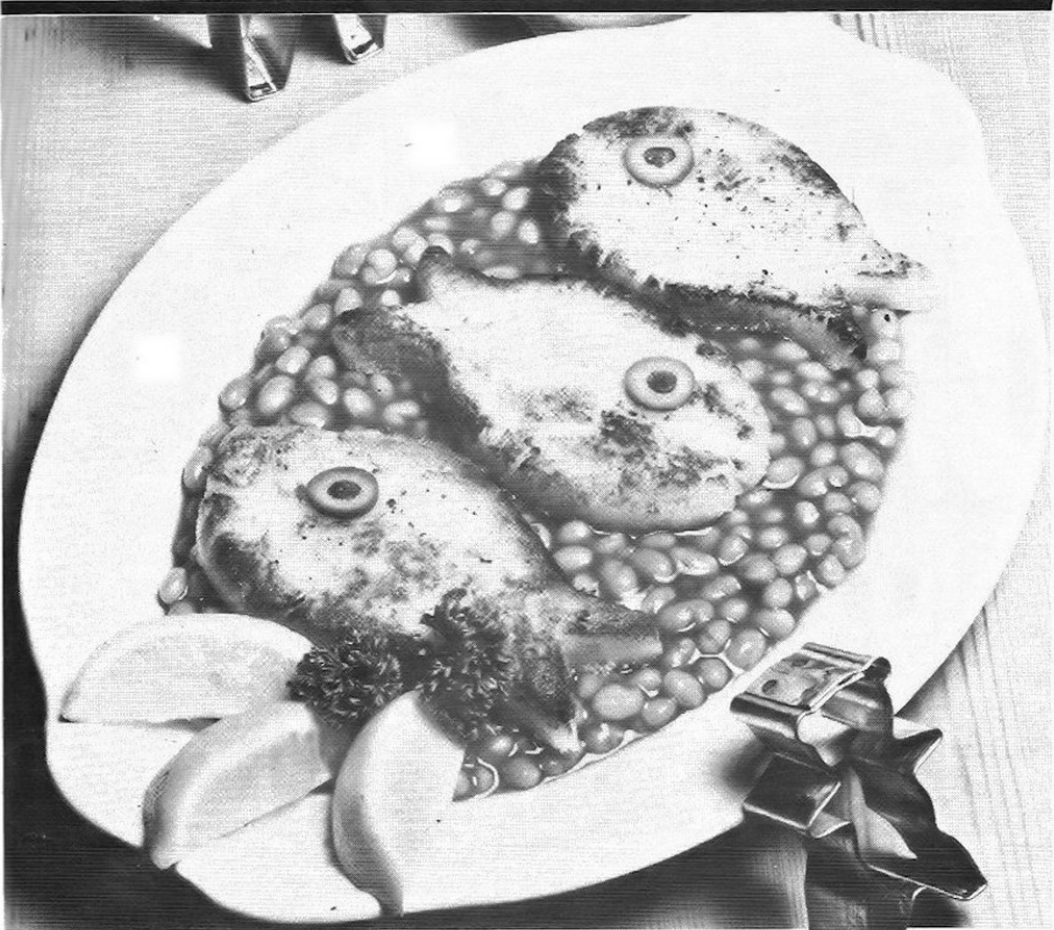


WHISKING To whisk is to beat very fast and so electric whisks are often used to do the job quickly and thoroughly. Whisking is also adding air to the food so a wooden spoon is too clumsy. See how egg white turns from runny to a light, very

white, frothy mixture when you whisk in air. You can also use a hand whisk, or a fork, but this makes the job a very long one.

FISH CAKES

- You need :*
 1lb potatoes
 salt and pepper
 1lb Cod fillet
 1oz lard
 1lb tin baked beans
 1 large lemon
 parsley sprigs
 1 stuffed olive

Mouse—who continues to remain nameless—comes into his own with a very important item

... Basic Hygiene.



When you start to prepare food you should always make sure that everything is clean.

1. First comb your hair and tie it back off your face.
2. Put on an apron so you don't dirty your clothes.
3. Wash your hands and scrub your nails.
4. Make sure your working surface is clean by wiping it or washing it if necessary, and also make sure any saucepans, cutlery or baking tins are clean too.

Peel the potatoes, rinse them and cut into small pieces. Cook in boiling, salted water for 20 minutes. Rinse the cod fillet and put it in a pan. Just cover with cold water, add a pinch of salt and bring to the boil. Simmer gently for 15 minutes. Drain the potatoes and fish. Mash the potatoes well. Flake the fish using a fork and throw away all the dark skin. Mix the fish and potato together with plenty of salt and pepper to season. Flour a working surface and form the mixture into a flat cake. Cut out shapes, or form round cakes flouring your hands each time. Shallow-fry the fish cakes in a little lard for about 1-5 minutes or until they are golden brown on both sides. Turn the fish cakes half-way through cooking. Meanwhile, heat the baked beans in a saucepan. Cut the lemon into wedges and wash the parsley. Cut the olive into slices. Serve the fish cakes on baked beans with a slice of olive for the eye and with lemon wedges and parsley for a garnish. Makes enough for six people.

Ha! You thought I'd been forgotten, didn't you . . . ? But you can't keep Ferdie Fingers out of the action. How about these really scrumptious pals of mine from the shell fish brigade?

CRAB. Usually sold ready boiled. Should feel heavy in relation to size. Make sure all five sets of claws are intact. Crabs are in season from April to September and are usually served cold.



LOBSTER. Usually sold ready-boiled and like crab should feel heavy. Best from March to October. Often eaten cold, but can be boiled, grilled or shallow-fried. Very expensive. If you want the bright red coral for garnish, be sure to ask for a hen (female) lobster.

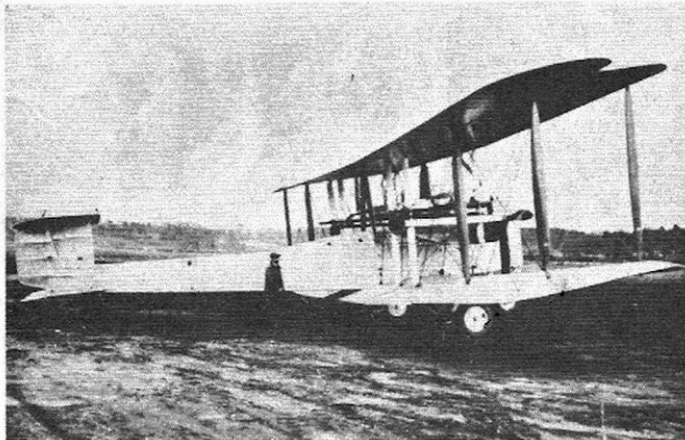

HOW

HOW did the game of bowls begin?

Some form of bowls has been played in Britain for at least seven hundred years! Southampton had a bowling club which was going strong soon after it was founded in 1299! The game that Sir Francis Drake was playing when the Spanish Armada was sighted - and which he refused to leave until he had finished it - was very like the modern sport. But bowls officially dates from 1848, when Scottish bowlers, led by W. W. Mitchell, organized the rules which are used today.

HOW old are computers, and who invented them?

These incredibly rapid calculating machines date back to 1946, when the first electronic one was finished by J. P. Eckert and J. W. Mauchly. But this computer had thousands of radio valves, and it was not until the coming of transistors that the Computer Age really began in the 1950s. However, an Englishman named Charles Babbage had the idea of storing information on punched tape back in the 1820s, but could not get a machine to make fast enough calculations. Electronics turned out to be the answer to many scientists' prayers, for electrons move almost as fast as light, and applying them to the problem did the trick.
