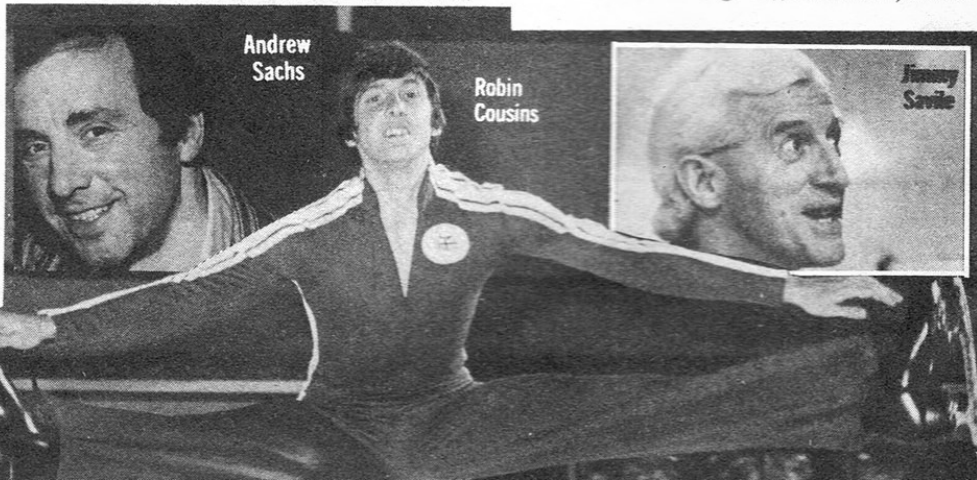

THE SUDDEN SURGE IN THE POPULARITY OF GYMNASTICS CAN BE TRACED BACK TO A LITTLE GIRL IN THE MUNICH OLYMPIC GAMES OF 1972. HER NAME WAS ... OLGA KOR BUT!

TO so many followers of sport the 1972 Olympics became the **Olga Korbut Games**. Before Munich Olga's name meant little, after the Games she was a household name. Russia produces a steady stream of gymnasts of international standard and two people knew from the start that Olga could be a worldbeater; coach **RENALD KNYSH**... and little Olga herself!

When she was twelve it was decided that Olga must transfer to sports school. She was introduced to coach Renald Knysh, the man who was to take her all the way to Munich. Knysh couldn't have been more impressed, and Olga soon became his personal pupil.

She progressed steadily and travelled to Munich as one of Russia's individual stars, and immediately captured the hearts of those who packed out the gymnastics hall in Munich. She had two movements that no other gymnast could follow. On the asymmetric bars Olga performed a half backward somersault from the top bar to the bottom, a 'flik-flak'. In training she could repeat the routine flawlessly. For some reason when it really mattered Olga slipped and lost the bars. Her confidence took a terrible jolt. She had less than a day to recompose herself. To her credit Olga came back and put on a tremendous performance on the balance beam. She was slightly behind on the compulsory beam exercise but when it came to the optional exercise Olga had her second "trick", a sensational backward somersault. This time all went well and Olga's tiny feet landed squarely on the four-inch beam. She had won her first gold medal!

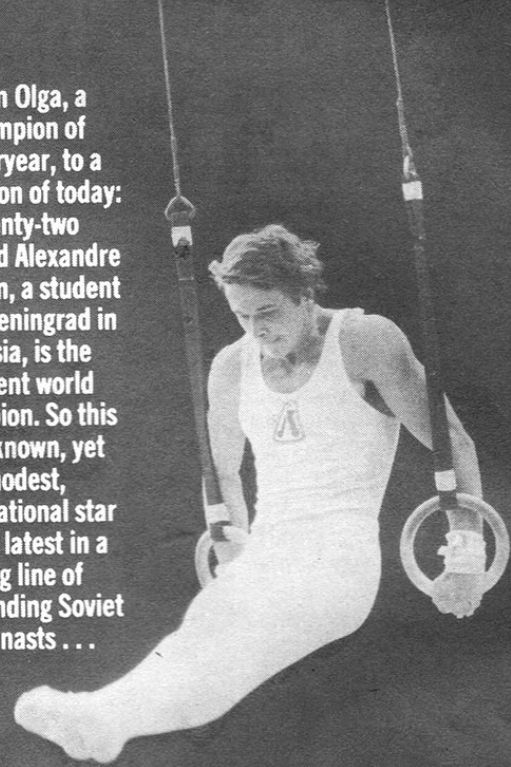
Her next great performance came in the floor exercise. Olga had actually scrapped her original routine, deeming it unsuitable to her personality and Knysh had to work out a completely new routine which Olga had to learn perfectly in just 5 days! This she did in a display that has gone down in sporting history as a memorable bringing together of gymnastic virtuosity and Olga's own elfin-like sense of expression. Another gold!

Two golds and a silver for her individual events plus a share in the team gold was Olga's marvellous haul.

This week many of the world's greatest gymnasts will be on view in the Daily Mirror sponsored 'Champions All' Competition at Wembley.

Kathy Williams, the 16 year old from Victoria Park, Manchester, became the youngest girl to win the Daily Mirror's dream trip to be coached in the Soviet Union. When she went to the Vladimir School on her scholarship, Russian coaches described her as potentially the best British gymnast they had ever seen. Kathy has certainly proved their judgment correct, coming back a much more accomplished performer. She almost retained the Daily Mirror Champions Cup title for a second time but eventually came runner-up in this year's competition to her great rival Suzanne Dando.

Kathy is coached by Janet Mitchell, who says of her: "Kathleen is absolutely nerveless. She can sit under the beam reading a comic, eating crisps, then go out and win against the toughest competitors."

Within the first few weeks of 1980, many rock critics announced that they had already chosen their Album of the Year. The debut long player by The Pretenders was hailed as a pop masterpiece.

But this was not a case of today's pop writers doing a favour for one of their former colleagues — The Pretenders' leader Chrissie Hynde used to work for the *New Musical Express*.

For, in a little more than a year, The Pretenders have zoomed to stardom, topping the singles charts, with **Brass In Pocket**, and the album charts at the same time, and playing an exhaustive list of sell-out concerts around Britain to ecstatic reviews.

At last, after ten years of hoping, Chrissie's dreams appear to have come true with a speed which has even taken her by surprise, and now this American girl and her British band have gone to the States in an effort to achieve the same as Blondie, by following their phenomenal success here with equal appreciation in Chrissie's own country.

Unlike Blondie — and The Police and Joe Jackson — who would have been happy to have made it in their own country first, Chrissie always saw herself as a star in Britain, and when she was a girl in Ohio, she had her sights firmly set.

"I always wanted to be a singer, and the first band I was in was when I was about 16 — but

then I was so shy that I used to go into another room and rehearse my vocals away from the rest of the band. I still don't like anyone else around now, other than the record producer and engineer, when I'm recording.

"As a girl I always wanted to come to England, and I used to think of myself travelling around Britain on a train, with a guitar."


Her love of Britain and British music is reflected in her choice of favourite song-writers, for she has no hesitation in nominating Ray Davies of The Kinks, as having had the greatest influence on her.

The Kinks, you may recall, were one of our most successful 1960s groups, whose sound and songs were so blatantly English that there was no mistaking them. Their catalogue of hits included **You Really Got Me**, **Tired of Waiting** and **Waterloo Sunset**.

So it was appropriate that The Pretenders' first single should be a Kinks' number, **Stop Your Sobbing**, which crept into the lower end of the top thirty.

If any more proof of Chrissie's identification with 60s rock and roll were needed, the producer of that single was Nick Lowe, the mastermind of *Rockpile* and a producer for Elvis Costello.

The Pretenders are not upset by the suggestion that they are not doing anything new, but would dispute that they are a revivalist band.

As Chrissie says: "I'm obviously

→ influenced by the 60s, because I was a teenager then, and like other teenagers I was close to a radio all the time. But I'm also influenced by the 70s — and the 50s."

She says that they are not trying to be different. "we really have no sort of style that we project. We just try to go in and knock out good songs."

"I've been writing for well over ten years, and if I wasn't where I am now, I'd still be hung up on songwriting. The thing that worries me is producing new material. We've probably got enough for another album al-

ready, but I'm always worried that the songs won't come."

For someone who had been trying to become successful for such a long time, her rise to fame caught her a little by surprise.

Chrissie remembered how nervous they were before they began on their nationwide tour. "We were number one in both the singles and the album charts and yet our stage act was a bit flaky — we didn't have anything worked out," she said.

It was not all that surprising, because the band only came together just over a year ago, although Chrissie's rock career had had a number of false starts before with musicians in Britain, America and France.

Gradually, through friends, she started to stabilise her own band, given all the encouragement and backing she needed by Dave Hill, who launched Real Records as a platform for the band.

Bass player Pete Farndon was the first to join, and he introduced two of his friends from his home town of Hereford, where all three had played in local bands. They were James Honeyman-Scott (guitar, keyboards and vocals) and Martin Chambers, drums.

"We're all like mates, the guys have known each other for years, and I get to know people really easily. The fact that I'm a girl has nothing to do with anything in the band — we are together because of the music, that's what is important," she says.

The music says everything she wants to say, so in spite of her former job as a music paper writer, Chrissie and the band are reluctant to give interviews or talk about themselves.

"When I was writing on the paper, I hated

the formality of interviewing someone whom I had idolised. I'd sooner meet accidentally.

"I'd be perfectly happy never to be quoted again, I'd much rather go home and write a song than give an interview," she says.

So she is content to let the lyrics of the songs do the talking, and she has found an audience willing to listen. The group's second single **Kid** was a moderate success and then came **Brass In Pocket**, co-written with James Honeyman-Scott, which seemed to be around the charts for an age before finally easing into the top spot.

Now there is a new single, **Talk of the Town**, which has been specially recorded and is not on the album — and which keeps that distinctive Pretenders sound up among the best sellers.

They were a little nervous about the British tour, because although they had played a few dates before, there was now an added pressure on them because of their star status.

However, they came through with flying colours, and just before they left for the States, Chrissie was quietly confident about their chances over there, because she believed that American rock was going through a bad phase.

"Our album is doing well over there — but what else have they got to listen to? I'm not surprised that people like *The Police* and *Joe Jackson* are big there, because the Americans have nothing like them."

They have nothing like *The Pretenders*, either, and it is up to Chrissie and the band to prove that they do not live up to their name — and that they are a genuine force in the rock music of the 1980s
