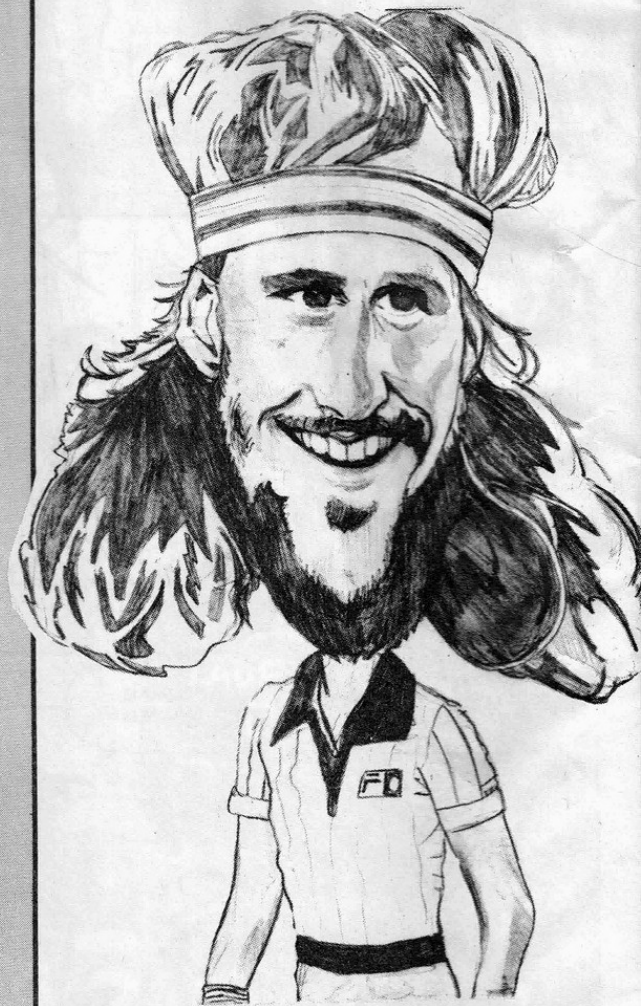

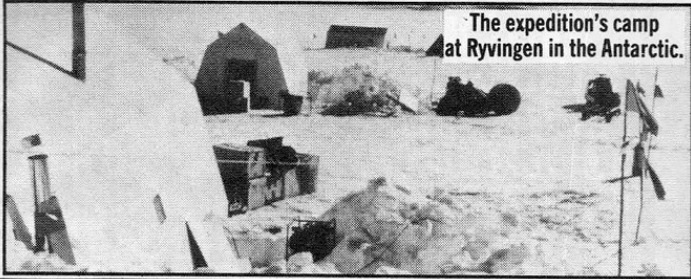
# TRANSGLOBE EXPEDITION

Did you know that while you're reading this a small team of British adventurers is making its way slowly across the South Polar ice of the Antarctic as part of one of the most exciting and dangerous expeditions ever undertaken?

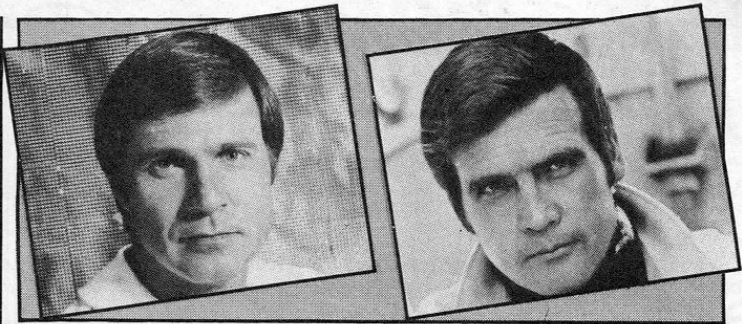
You didn't? Well the Transglobe Expedition hasn't been very widely publicised so far, but it set off from London just over a year ago to cross the world by surface transport following what's known as the earth's polar axis — that is, passing through both North and South Poles, on the way back to London across places like Africa, Australia and Canada. Summer 1982 is the time the party is

due back here, so that gives you some idea of the scale of the operation: it takes almost three years from start to finish!

We'll be bringing you occasional news (and, we hope, special pictures) of the team's progress during the coming months on what Prince Charles (Transglobe's patron) calls an expedition "in the best traditions of British exploration and scientific research".

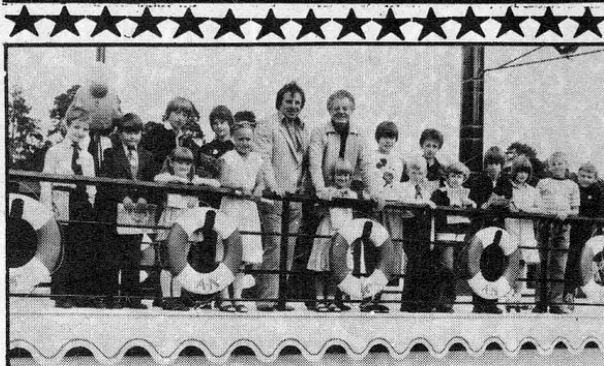
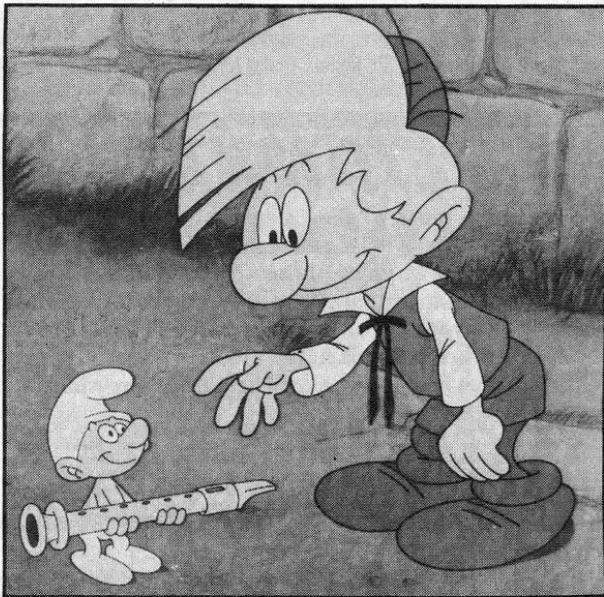

## START □ STOP □

# Two In The Bush

Alan and Joan Root are one of the world's top award-winning husband and wife camera teams and their hour-long programme took two years to make and showed in fascinating detail how Alan and Joan captured on film some of the most dramatic and dangerous wildlife sequences ever recorded.

The Roots' 'lucky escapes' have become almost legendary: Alan has a considerable scar deep in his leg as the result of a two-ton male hippo not taking too kindly to being filmed underwater. On the same occasion a huge hippo tooth tore through Joan's face mask, breaking the glass but miraculously missing her face. Alan has also been badly mauled by a leopard and lost his index finger after being bitten by a puff adder. But, luckily, Joan has been left relatively unscathed. "Except for a scorpion that stung me when we were on honeymoon," she recalls, "that was

incredible slow motion sequence of a black-necked cobra spitting venom. His wife Joan was used as the 'target' after he had first captured the snake with his very own bare hands.

quite painful."

That honeymoon was fifteen years ago and Alan organised the wedding ceremony in their favourite place, the Serengeti plains of Tanzania, where they later filmed what he calls 'the greatest show on earth': the wildebeest migration. That took two-and-a-half years to make and was shot from a hot-air balloon — ideal for filming wildlife from because of its smoothness and quietness. "One or two animals were a little bothered about the balloon's shadow," says Alan. "Some hopped a bit at the sound of the burner. But, generally, we were able to film what we liked, when we liked, unnoticed and unheard."

Indeed, one elderly buffalo watched every take-off and test flight with such a disinterested eye that they nicknamed him 'The Airport Manager'!

Alan and Joan have a beautiful lakeside

home at Naivasha in Kenya which they share with their unusual collection of around fifty 'pets', including a young orphaned hippo called Sally, an aardvark called Million (named after that well-known song *Aardvark a million miles for one of your smiles!*), an antelope, squirrels, porcupines, hyenas and mongooses, to name but a few. They spend most of their time, though, camping out in the bush waiting for the wildlife to do what they want to film.

Alan relishes a situation where danger and fear are finely balanced — a project just isn't interesting unless the odds are against him. You were able to see his excitement, for instance, in a shot of the couple filming a cheetah chasing a gazelle at 70 miles per hour across the savannah. But Joan seems to take it all in her stride — as she says: "I prefer to be with him than worrying about him, and it's good fun." "We're a team," says Alan, "I couldn't do my job without her."

And not only that, Joan keeps him supplied with spectacles! Wherever they go she carries a large supply of spare ones for him. "He's very short-sighted and has a habit of keeping them on when he's swimming," she says. "There are spectacles of his at the bottom of most of the major lakes and rivers of the world!"

The Roots' next project is a two year assignment making six one-hour films about the whole ecological system in the Serengeti. "The Serengeti is really my spiritual home," says Alan. "It's where I got started twenty-five years ago. It's also one of the richest ecological areas in the world. I just feel at home there."

That's something we can look forward to, but in the meantime we have the memory of last week's fascinating behind-the-scenes documentary. By the way, if you're wondering whether nothing worries this amazing man, well there is just one thing: spiders. "I just can't handle them," he says!

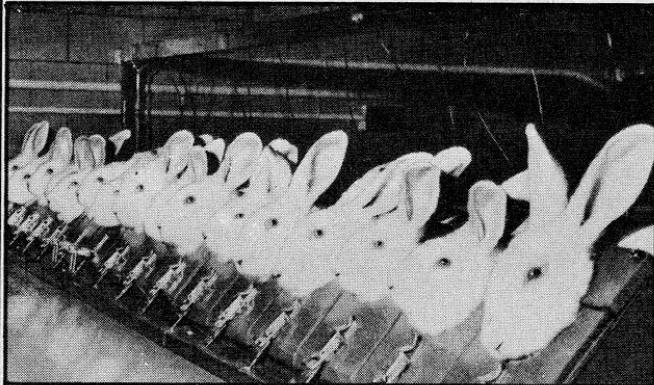


# ANIMAL ALLSORTS

This week we look at the controversial subject of  
**Animal Experimentation**

Many of you have probably seen something about animals used in experiments either on the television or in a newspaper. The animals you have seen will probably have been rats or mice, because these are the animals that are used most often, but other animals are also sometimes used; animals such as dogs, rabbits, birds, fish and monkeys.

Animals are used for experiments because they help researchers understand how a living body works, and how different things, such as drugs, affect it. The animals may suffer pain as a result of the experiment and once the experiment is over they are often killed. Not many of us will ever see any laboratory animals, but the ideas we hold, and the way in which we live, will affect them in a variety of ways. Look around your bathroom and you will see toothpaste, shampoo, soap, make-up, deodorants, hair sprays and perhaps medicines in the bathroom cabinet. Many of these products are tested on animals to find out if they could be harmful.



A picture you might have seen on an RSPCA poster at your school — rabbits being used for eye tests.

Now look around the kitchen. You may not actually be eating something like kippers and buttered peas at this very moment, but perhaps you eat them now and then. Your peas look an attractive shade of green, the kipper is brown and the butter may be a good yellow colour — that's because they have all had colour added to them. The colours are often tested on laboratory animals to find out if they will harm us.

*"Well, I suppose I could put up with grey peas and pale yellow butter,"* you may be thinking, *"but what about medicines? After all, no-one likes being ill, and surely some research on animals is to find out what makes people ill?"*

There is no doubt, of course, that some scientific researches and discoveries have led to the prevention of a good deal of suffering both in people and animals, but many animals are now used for purposes which cannot always be said to be entirely medical. Around five million animals were used last year in experiments in this country alone.

# SWALLOW THIS!

Do you know what Finnan Haddie is? It's the Scottish name for smoked haddock and is called that after the fishing village of Findon in Kincardineshire where a lot of the haddock is smoked (which means that it is cured, or dried, by treating with smoke).

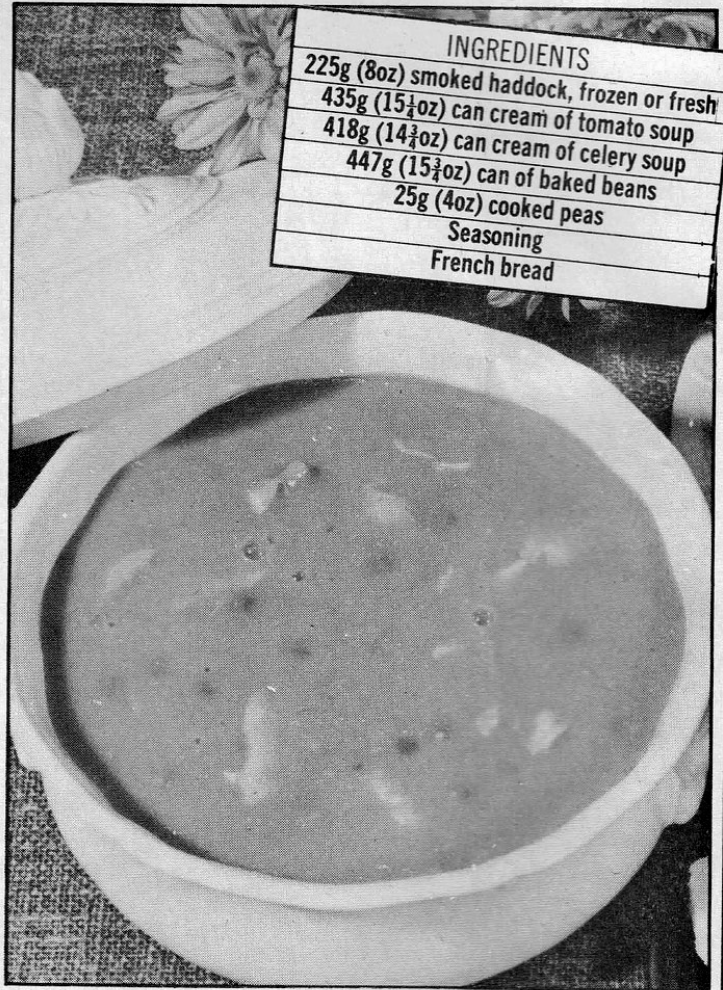
This recipe uses smoked haddock in soup, which makes a really filling and warming meal for a cold evening. It's very quick and simple to make, too.

## AUTUMN FISH SOUP

(serves six)

### INGREDIENTS

225g (8oz) smoked haddock, frozen or fresh  
435g (15½oz) can cream of tomato soup  
418g (14¾oz) can cream of celery soup  
447g (15¾oz) can of baked beans  
25g (4oz) cooked peas  
Seasoning  
French bread



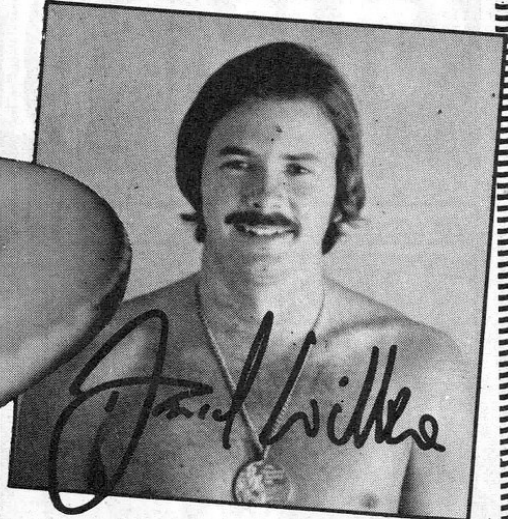
Cook the fish as directed on the packet, or, if using fresh, poach by placing in a small saucepan with a little milk and seasoning, place the lid on the saucepan and cook for about 10 minutes until flesh is soft. Using a knife and fork flake the cooked fish, removing any skin, until the fish is in small pieces. Place the fish in a large saucepan with the soups, baked beans and peas. Heat until really hot and steaming. Season to taste. Serve with slices of hot, buttered French bread.



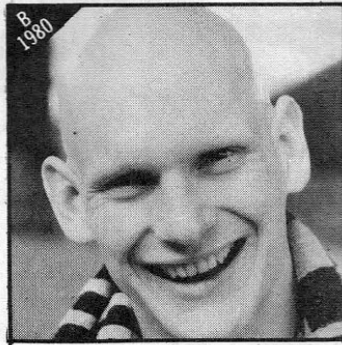

# CLIFF'S ROYAL PERFORMANCE!

Wednesday, 23rd July, 1980 was a very special date in the diary of Cliff Richard and his legion of fans. On that day at half past ten in the morning, Cliff arrived at Buckingham Palace to receive his O.B.E.

It marked the crowning glory (well, maybe he wasn't quite crowned) of a career that has spanned half his life and taken in countless British Top Ten hits, numerous successful films and a respect unrivalled in the pop music world.

Then, as if inspired by his meeting with royalty, Cliff went on to release the single, **Dreamin'**, a recent smash hit, and the album, **I'm No Hero**, which has been contradicting its title ever since the day it came out — it entered the LP chart at number four in its first week of release!

Of course, Cliff is a hero, and on that summer's day at the Palace, he proved it. He was greeted by hundreds of fans who sang **Congratulations** (his Eurovision song from the '60s) as he drove through the gates.

Upon his arrival, he was accompanied by his mother, and his manager, Peter Gormley. Proving patriotic to the end, he waved a Union Jack. After the ceremony, the youngest veteran in showbusiness, clutching his medal, said: "*Fantastic. This is what makes life so stable here. This is one of the high spots in my career.*"

Cliff is hardly known for his outrage or shock tactics, but, for his special date with the Queen, he wore a black lounge-suit — and bright red training-style shoes with matching tie and red rose in buttonhole. "*I've been here before,*" he said, "*and I knew there was lots of red in the Palace. I didn't have any morning dress, so I thought I would wear something colourful.*"

It's amazing to think that Cliff is now forty years of age. In fact, he celebrated his fortieth birthday only last Tuesday (the fourteenth) on stage at The Apollo Theatre in London, where he has been performing a string of sell-out concerts. And there will be no let-up in the touring. Cliff's off to South Africa to perform next month, and his next series of gospel concerts will be in January and February, the proceeds of which will be donated to charity.

So how does he do it? How does he keep getting the stamina and inspiration to carry on bringing out successful records and performing a strenuous round of concerts? Says Cliff: "*Vitamin pills should be on the National Health service these days — supplied for everyone. Each day I take one capsule containing the right vitamins.*"

"*One proper meal a day keeps me slim. I cannot work with a full stomach, so I prefer to eat a warm meal late at night after a show's finished, for instance, and then I can relax totally. I don't like to miss out on eating some fruit during the day, and I enjoy a glass of wine with my meal, or champagne for special occasions. But most of all I need at least eight hours' sleep to look okay around my eyes.*"

It's well-known that Cliff takes a lot of care of his body. "*I can't think of anything better than filling my lungs with fresh air,*" he says. He also likes to stroll his two dogs Kelly and Emma in the private estate around his home in Weybridge, Surrey, or spend a lot of time helping out his gardener.

"*I do a lot for charity organisations,*" continues Cliff (his own is called the Cliff Richard Charity Trust Fund). "*Money is not as important as some people think it is. I have got more than I need, though I'm not a millionaire and I'm not even interested in becoming one. I don't invest my money in such things as Australian gold mines, but I hope I invest it wisely. In my own home for instance.*"

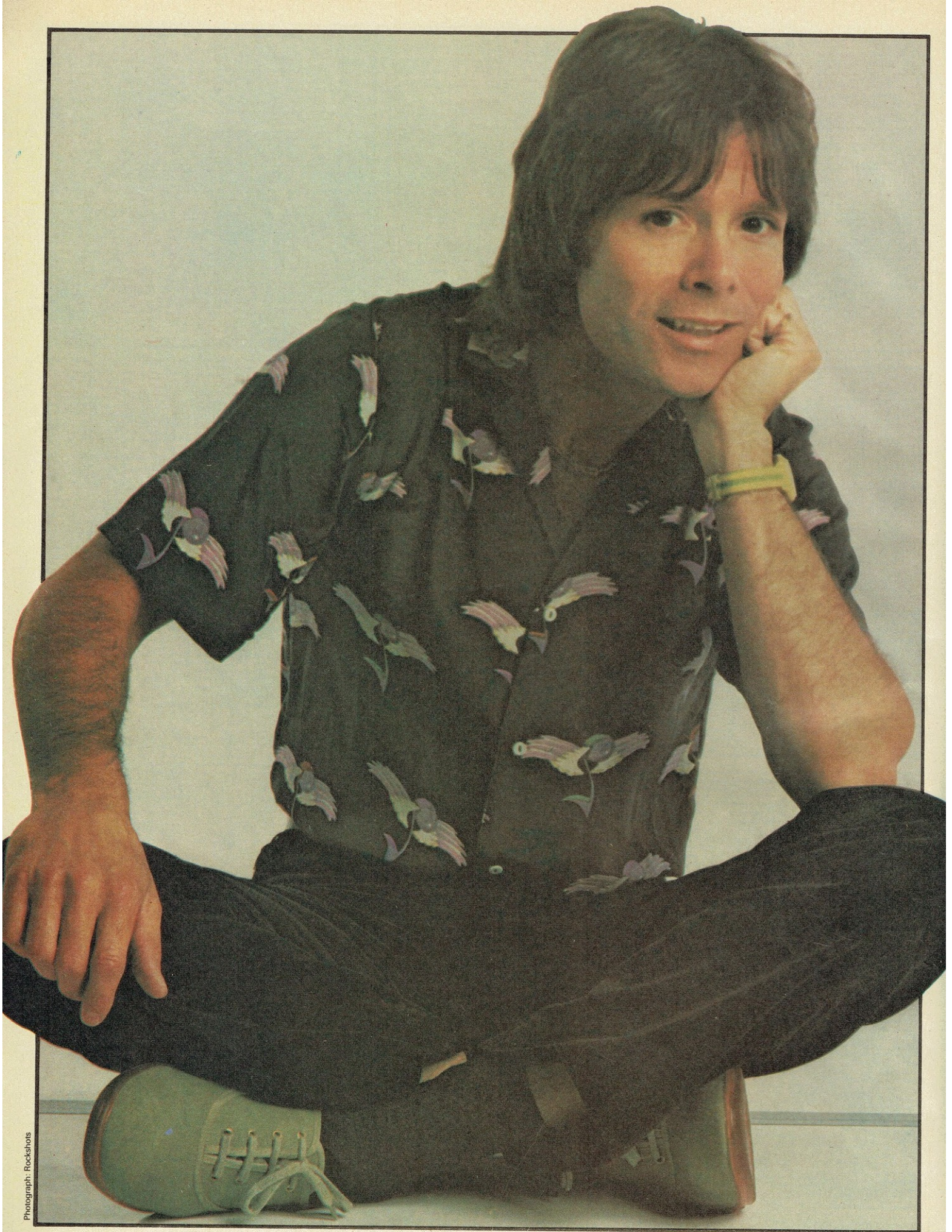

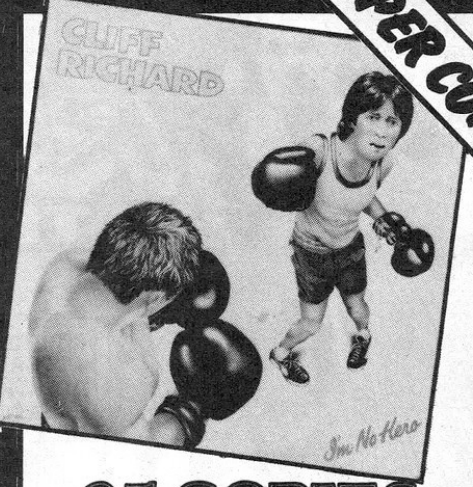

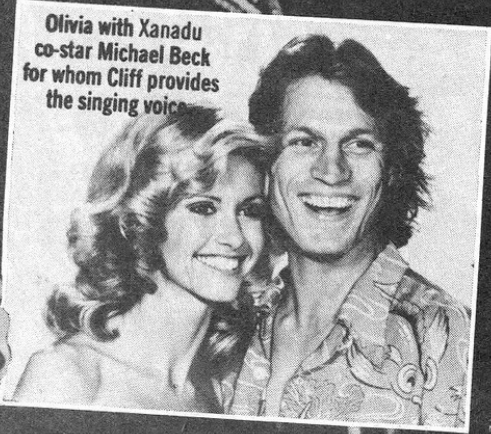

Skipper **Archie Gemmill** (right) was snapped up by Smith after being surprisingly released by Nottingham Forest and

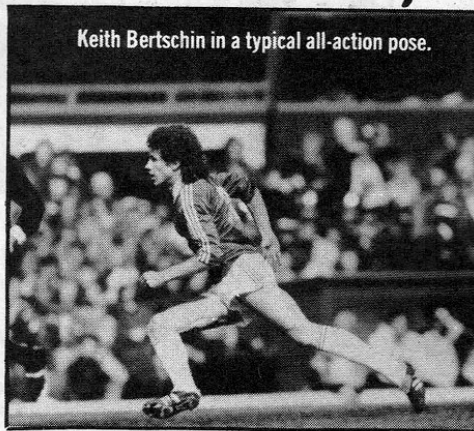
