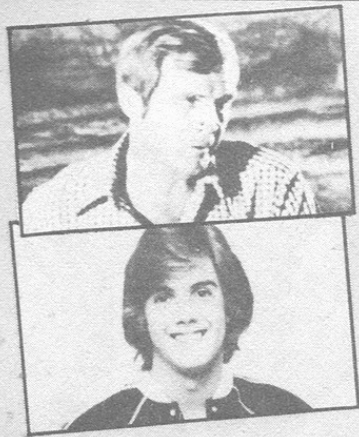


STAR SNAP

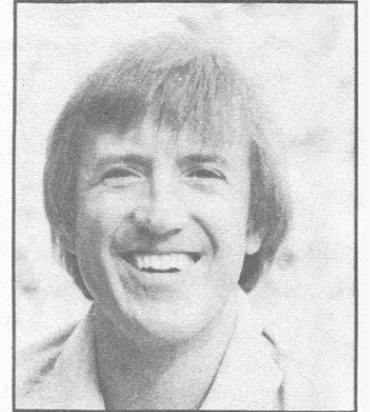
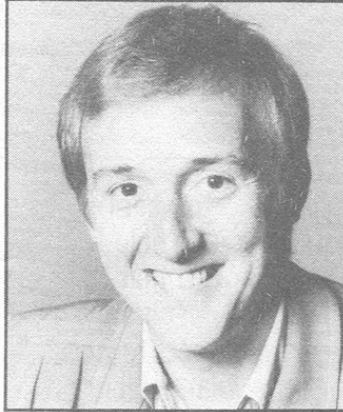

ROBIN GOES FOR GOLD!

IN 1976, John Curry won the Men's Figure Skating Olympic gold medal in Austria, and in doing so made the British public aware of a sport it had previously overlooked.

Since then, a talented young man of twenty-two has arrived to carry on that tradition and keep British interest in skating alive. That young man is, of course, the gifted **Robin Cousins**, now acknowledged as Britain's number one skater.

It's a position he has deservedly achieved. In 1978, he finished third in the World Championships and put in a near faultless performance to win the British figures title at Richmond. Not content with results like these, 1979 proved an even more fruitful year with Robin finishing second in the World Championships, and first in the N.H.K. Trophy in Japan, the Ennia Challenge in the Hague, and the Rotary Watches Ice International at Richmond.

Robin was born in Bristol and first experienced the thrill of ice skating at the age of seven while on holiday in Bournemouth. Two years later he embarked on a Learn To Skate course which has certainly stood him in good stead during his rise to the top of his sport!

For seven-and-a-half years he enjoyed the encouragement and tuition of his coach, Pam Davis. Although she had provided him with superb ground-work, she eventually advised him to go to London where he could get the international class coaching experience she herself could not offer him. Robin took her advice and moved into a London bed-sit (it was all he could afford) while he was coached under the watchful eye of the highly-respected Gladys Hogg.

Filled with drive and ambition, he worked his heart out in training, which, when coupled with his undoubted natural ability, saw him reach international standards.

Then, two years ago, all his efforts were rewarded: Robin was invited to Denver, Colorado, to be trained by Carlo Fassi, the man described by John Curry as 'the best coach in the world'. Without hesitation he jumped at an opportunity that could only

come once in a lifetime. He was, of course, sad to leave this country but he knew that if he wanted to conquer the skating world he must receive the best training possible.

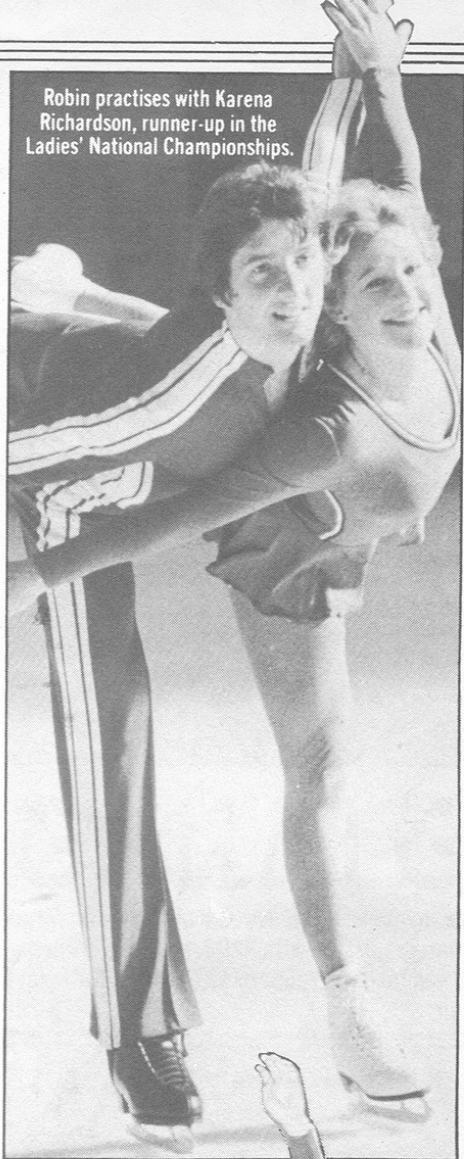
Despite the upheaval, Robin has settled down very well in the United States: after all, it is the new home of all his skating friends, too, and when he's not skating it's with these friends that he can be seen dancing away to the latest records at the local discos.

Off the ice, Robin looks younger than his twenty-two years. He always appears calm and fresh, and freely admits that he suffers from pre-competition nerves, but believes that they help him to perform well.

In fact, Mr. Cousins is quite an all-rounder. At school, he achieved 'O' level standard, and in his spare time (not that he gets much!), he enjoys swimming, diving, gymnastics, drawing and listening to music, although he won't commit himself to a favourite singer or group.

Let's hope that in addition to these pleasures, he is able to enjoy being an Olympic Gold Medallist in the forthcoming Winter Olympics at Lake Placid, Canada.

BOOMTOWN RATS The Fine Art Of Hit Records!

A lot of people were shocked when The Boomtown Rats' last single *Diamond Smiles* failed to follow their previous release, *I Don't Like Mondays*, to the top of the charts. But despite that slight hiccup in their rise to the top, The Rats are still one of the most exciting sounds in the pop world. Recently, Gerry Fallon spoke to Garry Roberts at the band's London headquarters, but more of that later.

Firstly, here's a potted history of how the band got themselves into the exalted position which they now enjoy . . .

IT'S through talent, intelligence, hard work and a willingness to be friends with music press people and the fans (most important of all) that has got them to where they are today.

Going back to 1975 the various members of the Rats were quite an assortment: Simon Crowe was an art student. Pete Briquette (real name Pat Cusack) was at college with Gerry Cott, and Johnnie Fingers (Johnny Moylett) had just gone to university . . . and left a week later! Johnnie's answer was that "it was a short course!" Which leaves Garry Roberts, whose father is a famous Irish photographer, and Bob Geldof, who had just returned from Canada where he was working as a rock writer.

All the boys were pals from days of old and the beginnings of The Rats came from their early jamming sessions.

"Bond had a flat in Dublin," Garry is fond

of telling, "and there was a shed in the garden where we used to go jamming at weekends."

"At the beginning it was more a fun thing to do and Bob wasn't even the singer, he called himself our manager. It wasn't until later that he started doing the vocals."

"Then Bob visited London and brought back two *Dr. Feelgood* albums and from then on we really took our playing seriously. At the time we were very much influenced by them and the *Rolling Stones* and *Bowie*."

The first ever live appearance for The Rats was at a Halloween Night dance at a local college in '75. From there they began to play more gigs as demand for The Rats started rising. By mid-'76 their work schedule was so tight they enlisted the help of another friend to act as manager, Fachtna O'Kelly.

At that time, in Ireland, there was not very many halls catering for rock music.

As Garry recalls: "Most large dance halls hired Irish showbands and The Rats were considered part of the new wave and punk era and a lot of people were frightened of staging our shows at their halls."

Here is where the combined brains of the whole band came into organising their own 20-date "Rock Revue" in Ireland, and the Rats were almost a household name by the end of that tour.

At the completion of their first year of being together they had earned the support of Irish fans, been on a tour of Holland and notched up 100 gigs. The next plan was to find a recording deal.

"Bob and Fachtna headed for England with a tape we'd produced for £40," Garry remembers. "Two record companies were very interested — *Virgin* and *Ensign*. We all decided to go for the second because it was a new, small independent

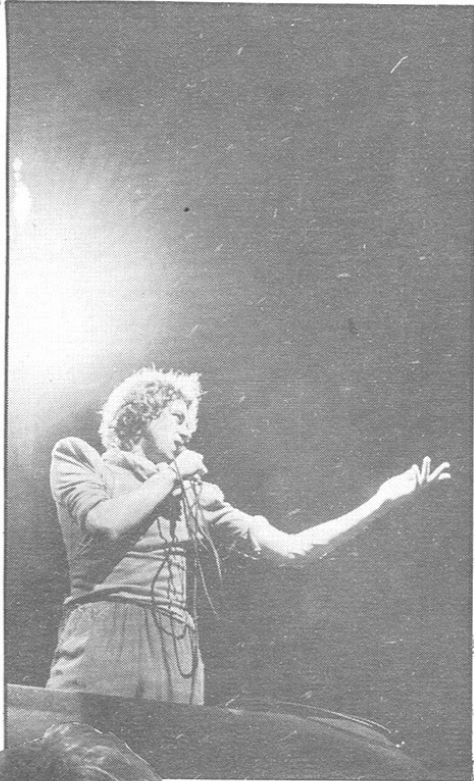

company and would have more time for us."

And so The Rats came to England and **Looking After No. 1** was released at the end of '77. It made the Top 10, a remarkable achievement for any first single from a band. And the rest, up to 1980, is something you all know about through radio, television and the press. So what now?

RATS FOR 1980

The Rats' latest single **Someone's Looking At You**, is a different mix from the same title on their album **The Fine Art Of Surfacing**. They're at present in Holland mixing a TV spectacular and then it's the start of major tours all over the world from February.

"We're in Australia, New Zealand and Japan first," Garry continued. "After that there is a two-month tour of the States but as yet, there are no plans for a big U.K. tour because our other commitments take us well into the summer."

Their Australian tour should go down very well. The single **I Don't Like Mondays** was in the Australian charts at No. 2 for four weeks. Then it went to No. 1 and remained

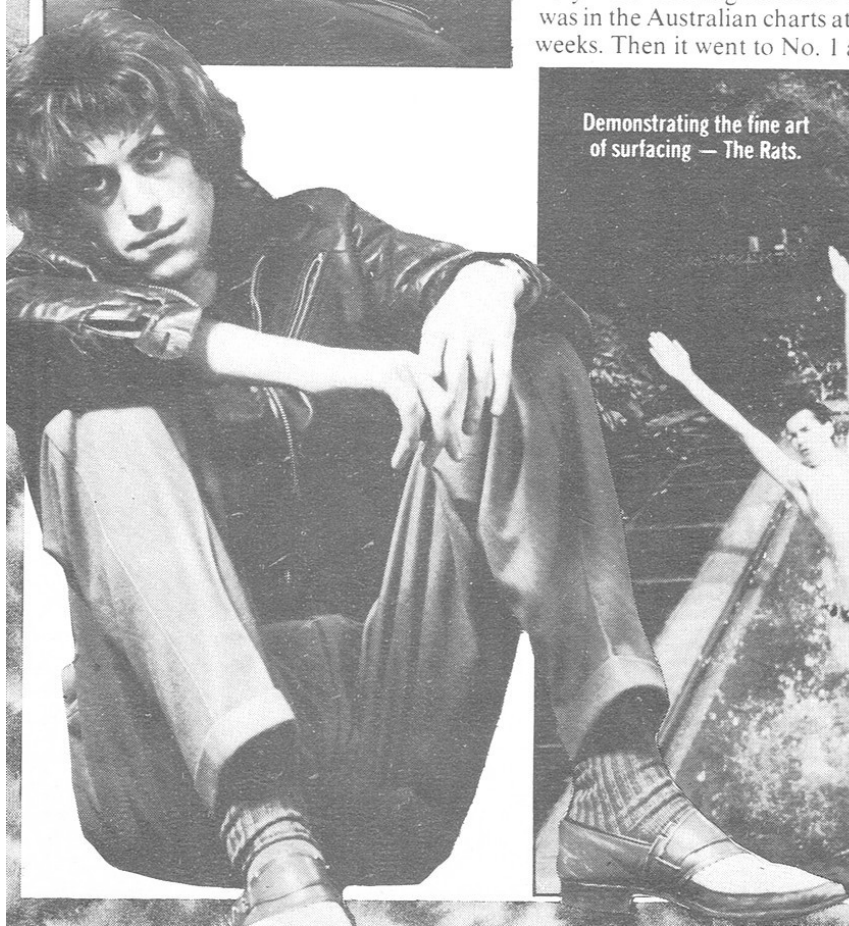
there for nearly two months!

Which leaves them with the big American market to conquer. The Rats' first stab at the USA proved unsuccessful, which could have had a lot to do with the fact that the label handling them at the beginning didn't give enough time and effort to promoting their tour. Then, to make matters worse, they used a publicity stunt of sending out dead rats with the current album to the radio men!

So it's not surprising that the Rats have various things to live down. Certain people have said that Bob is going to go solo. But the band operate very much as a whole unit and Geldof is the spokesman. Many might think that he 'runs' the band but, apparently, that's also just another rumour.

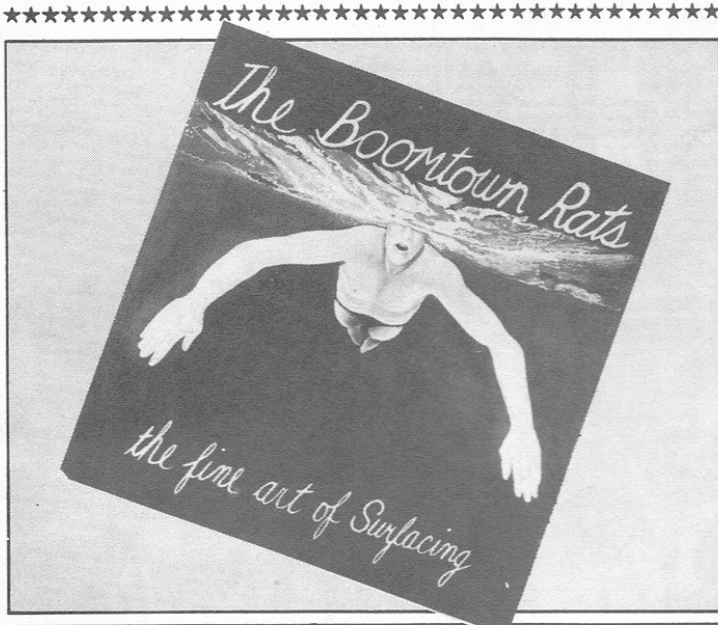

Mike Holoway's Tomorrow Today!

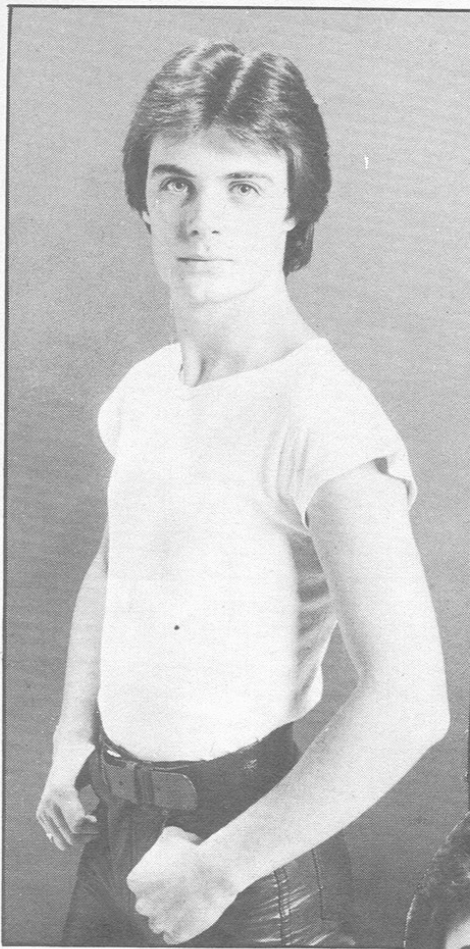
Mike Holoway's back! The young man who attracted a multitude of devoted fans with *Flintlock* is on your screens again, in the exciting repeat showings of *The Tomorrow People*, starting tomorrow (Friday) at 4.15. In the days when it was made, Mike was a newcomer to the art of acting, fresh from the drumming seat of *Flintlock*, and anxious to learn.

Now, he is a confident, fast-talking 19-year-old, and all set to take on the world a second time — as a solo artist. Richard Tippett found out the latest on one of TV's brightest young attractions in a recent interview . . .

Was Mike looking forward to seeing *The Tomorrow People* series again? "Well, it's funny actually, because that series has been running for some four or five years with me in it, but the whole series has been going for about ten now. And, unfortunately, because of

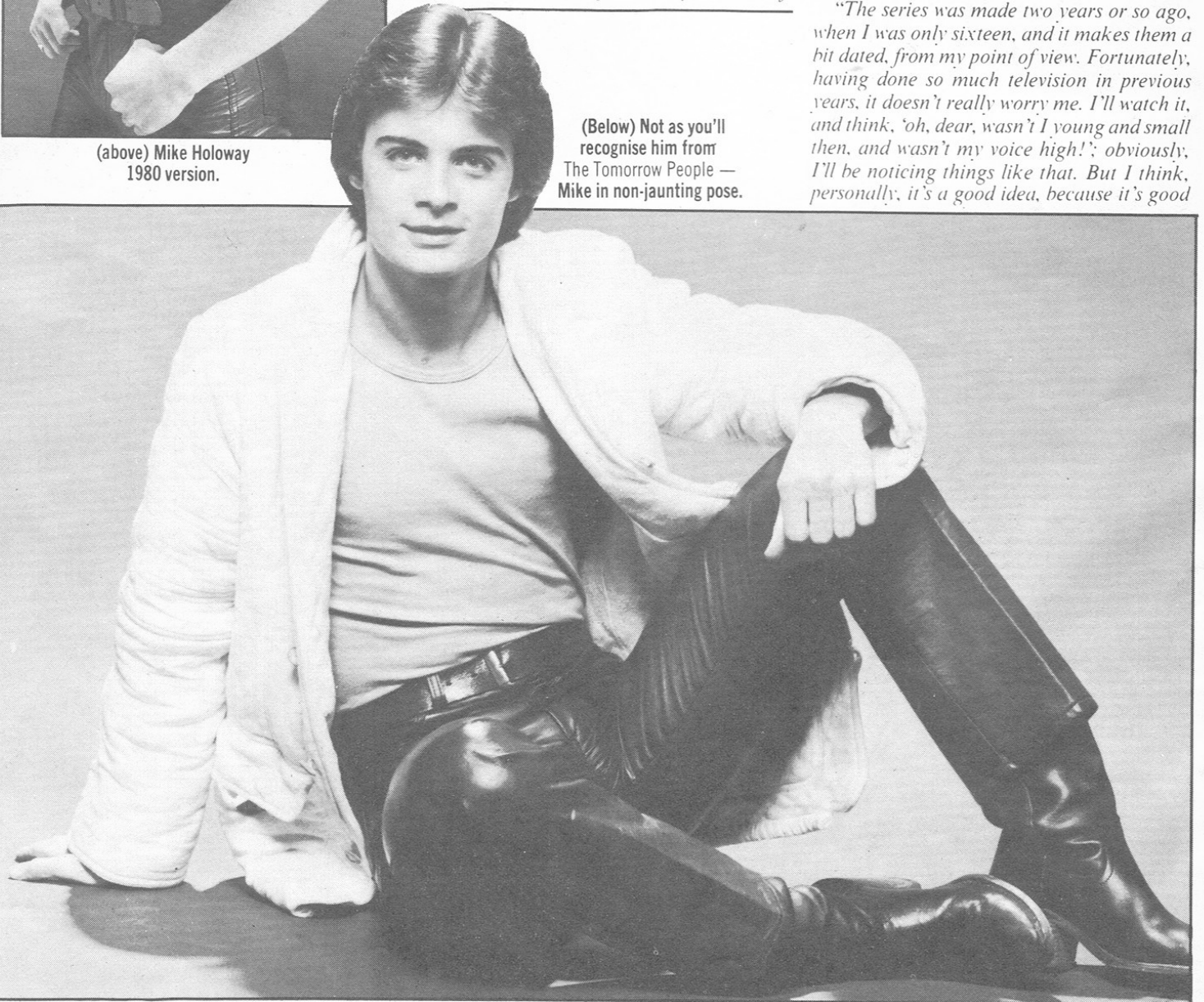
the strike at ITV last year, we weren't able to put together another series for the start of 1980, which had originally been planned. So we thought, because it was such a popular show, that a repeat would be the next best thing.

"The series was made two years or so ago, when I was only sixteen, and it makes them a bit dated, from my point of view. Fortunately, having done so much television in previous years, it doesn't really worry me. I'll watch it, and think, 'oh, dear, wasn't I young and small then, and wasn't my voice high!'; obviously, I'll be noticing things like that. But I think, personally, it's a good idea, because it's good

to have your face back on the screen again.

"Over the last year, I've been re-assessing my career, and it's great that Thames should be repeating **The Tomorrow People** series in January, because it coincides with other things that I'll be getting into then — I hope to be coming back with a big 'wow'!"

So what will Mike be up to as we forge ahead into a new decade? "Well, I won't let on any names, or name in this case, but a producer who's had lots of hits in this country, and a recent number one in America, wants to produce me. He's been a friend of Flintlock's for quite some time, and he wants to handle me as a solo artist.

"This coincides with the beginning-of-the-year tour, which I'm doing with a production company, of theatres in the south; I'm starring in a pantomime which goes to numerous venues. Unfortunately, I can't make all of them because of my commitments. The whole tour lasts about fifteen weeks, but I can only make about ten weeks of that, because of the recording schedules."

With the amount of work that Mike is involved in at the moment, what is the likelihood of him appearing in a new series of **The Tomorrow People**? "Well, there is one planned, as I mentioned earlier, but the way things are going at the moment, I don't think I'm going to be able to make it. When with the group, you can song-write — which the band are still doing, and we're still together rehearsing — but when you're on your own, you've got to take what's there, and there are lots of offers coming in at the moment."

Drumming to acting

Was it very difficult for Mike to move from drumming with Flintlock to acting with **The Tomorrow People**? "Actually," he replied. "I took to it very easily. For the simple fact that drummers are normally two different people — they're either very introverted, who let it all out when they're on the drums, or they're like me, people who can express their personality by way of drumming."

Did Mike think that his success was attributed mainly to his role in Flintlock or his appearance in **The Tomorrow People**? "I think that it was a cross between the two

because it's quite unusual for the drummer to make it to the forefront of a band. It's normally the lead vocalist, but, with the help of **The Tomorrow People**, I became the major personality in the band, tied into the fact that I was also doing interviews with the magazines.

"So I think it was really a cross between the group and my solo career that brought me to the front as Mike Holoway."

Did he think that success might have come too early, with the heights of Flintlock occurring when he was still in his mid-teens?

"Well, no, because I've been in the business since I was eight and we formed Flintlock when I was nine. We just took it all in its logical stage — we started off like all the bands do, in the local discotheques and school fetes, and we just happened to get the lucky break. I don't care what anybody says, there is no such thing as an overnight success. People think that even someone like John Travolta made it overnight; but that guy was around for something like ten years making films before **Saturday Night Fever** came along. So I don't think that success comes suddenly, and even if it does, I don't think that it should go to your head. I mean, even with the success I've had, I don't think I've ever lost my cool over it. If you're nice to people, then they're always going to be nice to you."

Does Mike think any differently now about the business from the time when he started out? "This is a question I think about a lot. I've decided that the only thing that's different now is that I know an awful lot more about the business. I've learnt a lot, and I know the way things work."

And for all those who are interested as to what has become of Flintlock, Mike put the record straight. "A few of the members have got into songwriting, but we are still together as a band; don't get me wrong.

"The thing is, I want to fulfill the opportunities I had two years ago, but because the band was so busy I never had the chance to do that."

Well, Mike certainly feels he's on his way, doesn't he? It all sounds as if a Tomorrow Person has found his feet today.

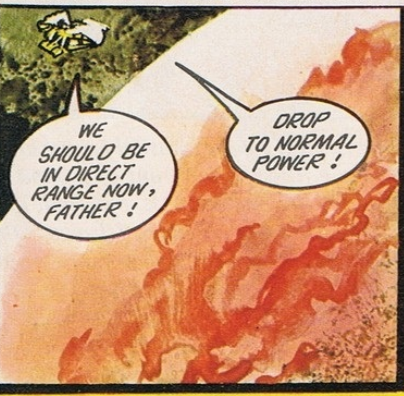
