
For **The Spoils Of War**, a derelict house was renovated in Millom. Cumbria, and iron mines and works, closed in 1965, were re-opened especially for the production.





He even asked for a transfer! Then season 1977-78 saw him getting into the side — only to suffer a bad knee injury that put him out of the action as Liverpool swept all before them in Europe. But patience brings its own reward, and this season Johnson and Dalglish have formed a deadly spearhead that will undoubtedly in the coming seasons bring even more success to Anfield!

Wheatmeal pastry gives this flan a delicious nutty taste. It's packed with proteins and vitamins because it contains eggs, milk, cheese and vegetables, and the ingredients aren't too expensive. I'm sure your family and friends will love it.

# Country vecetable flan

125g (4oz.).plain flour

pinch salt

125g (4oz.) wheatmeal flour

50g (2oz.) butter or margarine

50g (2oz.) lard

30ml (2 tablespoons) water

1 large onion

15ml (1 tablespoon) oil

30ml (2 tablespoons) Worcestershire sauce

2 medium carrots

125g (4oz.) green beans, fresh or frozen

1 tomato

125g (4oz.) Cheddar cheese

Salt and pepper


2 eggs, size 3

150ml (4 pint) milk




# METHOD

Sift plain flour and salt into a bowl, stir in wheatmeal flour. Rub in the butter or margarine and lard until mixture looks like fine breadcrumbs. Stir in the water and mix to a firm dough, add a little more water if the mixture is very dry. Turn out onto a lightly floured surface and knead until smooth. Roll pastry into a 23-25cm (9-10 inch) round and line a 20cm (8 inch) flan ring or a shallow pie dish. Place in the refrigerator until filling is prepared. Skin and slice onion, heat oil in a pan, add onion and fry until soft for about 5 minutes. Add Worcestershire sauce and fry for a further 2 minutes. Leave to cool. Peel and slice carrots, cook in boiling salted water for 5 minutes. Add green beans (if using fresh beans slice them) and cook for a further 5 minutes. Drain well. Skin and slice the tomato. Grate the cheese. Spread onion over base of pastry case. Layer carrots, beans, tomato and cheese over the top, season with salt and pepper between the layers. Beat together the eggs and the milk and pour over the vegetables and cheese in the pastry case. Bake in oven at 200 °C, 400°F or Regulo gas mark 6 for 30-35 minutes until filling has set and pastry is crisp and golden brown.
























# They're Still The Greatest... ABBA'S DREAM LIVES OM!

There aren't many groups around today whose albums go double platinum — 2,000,000 copies — before they're released, but with super-group ABBA anything is possible! The album in question is ABBA Greatest Hits Volume Two which was released last November and is following boldly in the footsteps of ABBA's Greatest Hits — two million copies and still going strong!

Being the most successful foursome since the Beatles is not an accolade that was won without a great deal of hard work. Last year was probably ABBA's most hectic twelve months so far. It started with the release of the haunting Chiquitita, followed by the smash album Voulez-Vous and the single Does Your Mother Know?

Then came the marathon tour of America and Europe. It was the first time the group had ventured across the Atlantic and, during September and October, they undoubtedly captured the hearts of the Americans and Canadians almost as strongly as they did the British all those years ago! Then they

travelled to Europe for a further two weeks' touring before making their way to Britain.

It was ABBA's first British tour for nearly three years and we certainly showed the fantastic four how much we had missed them! They played to around 50,000 people in London with six sold-out nights at the Wembley Arena, before going on to Stafford, Glasgow and Dublin.

With such a non-stop year, it's hardly surprising that the group spent most of December relaxing, and watching their last record. I Have a Dream, climb the charts. Bjorn and Agnetha stayed in their native Sweden, and Benny and Frida in the West Indies. To quote Bjorn: "It really takes it out of you, performing so frequently to so many people. At first you don't notice it hecause the nervous energy you build up on tour keeps you

going. Then, when you get back home, after a few days you start to feel it — really exhausted."

For the uninitiated, the initials A-B-B-A stand for the Christian names of the group's members: Agnetha (the blonde!); Bjorn (the fair-haired guy who produces records as well as sings on them); Benny and, last but not least, beautiful Annifrid, whose name is usually abbreviated to Frida.

But however you care to spell ABBA, there's no doubt that the name stands for an energetic, totally professional and perfectionist foursome. They aren't moody, spoilt "artistes" like many in the pop business today — they have worked hard to achieve success and they work hard to maintain their position at the top.







Without exception each member of the group is highly self-critical and with each new recording, their goal is to improve on or at least maintain the standard set by the previous disc.

Sometimes, the striving for perfection can be very frustrating, especially for Agnetha and Frida. They can spend days in the studio (ABBA have their own, situated on the outskirts of Stockholm) only to find that a song is rejected by the boys, who write the tunes and, after all, are the recording experts. On stage, it is just the same and everything has to be just right — down to the clothes. ABBA set out to stun the audience visually as well as vocally. White is, their favourite colour for stage clothes, as they believe it shows up best and is brighter than any other colour. The girls spend ages choosing their gear.

Like all the best performers, they admit to being nervous before going on stage, though they love being under the spotlights — "Ever since I was nine," says Frida, "when I made my first public appearance at a Red Cross bazaar!"

With all the recording, concerts, filming for TV, and photo sessions to satisfy the endless demands of press and fans, it's hardly surprising that they get little time to themselves. But then no one would deny that they enjoy every minute of it; they've known each other for ten years and, despite speculation to the contrary, it will be many years yet before they grow tired of the ABBA line-up.

So what are the plans of Agnetha, Bjorn, Benny and Frida in 1980? Well, at the beginning of January, Bjorn and Benny went away to the Bahamas for a few weeks to write for a new LP. The boys did the same thing last year, so they obviously feel they've found the right atmosphere in which to produce hit records!


While they were away, Agnetha and Frida started recording a new ABBA LP—in Spanish! There are few countries where the group have not been accepted by the record buying public—they're popular in Israel, India, Nigeria and Kenya, for example—and they think that the Spanish deserve a complete LP to themselves!

This month the whole group is getting together to start recording the brand new LP ... then in March they go to Japan to do a three-week tour ... then it's back to the song writing again for Benny and Bjorn ... and in May straight into the studio to continue recording the new album. No doubt when it's released it will be an instant platinum, making at least another £1 million in this country alone, and the group will be able to collapse exhausted once more. Until the urge to produce something even better forces them back to the studio again!

It's a cinema version of the all-important first episode of Dr. David Banner's bizarre story as seen in the TV series, so it isn't a brand new adventure. But what better time to catch up with the Hulk story so far...

# IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREEN

At least, that's what the latest reports from America are suggesting. It seems that even when the TV cameras have stopped rolling the Incredible Hulk continues to have a strange influence on the actors who play the twin roles of the raging green giant.

Both Bill Bixby, who portrays the mildmannered Dr. David Banner, and Lou Ferrigno, who plays the part of the monster that Banner turns into when he becomes angry, have recently split up with their wives and apparently tempers often become frayed at the studios.

Four make-up men are said to have resigned last year in protest over Lou's tantrums and their union has demanded danger money to work with the 193 cm (6ft. 5ins.) tall actor. But it's hardly surprising that Lou gets rather irritable. It takes two hours before filming starts for him to be painted pea-green and fitted with a wig. foam nose and forehead (which have to be blow-dried). contact lenses. false teeth and caterpillar eyebrows. And to top that, his trailer on the Universal Studios plot is kept arctic-cold so that his make-up doesn't run between shots. (It does when he's under the studio lights, by the way, and needs constant attention).

Away from the set. Lou's attitude is very different. According to him, there's a little bit of monster in all of us, but it's knowing how to control it that matters.


"Sometimes guys try to pick fights with me," he says. "because of my size and just because I'm the Hulk. But it's the Hulk who has taught me how to control my temper. I just walk away when there's any sign of trouble.

"I guess there's a little bit of green monster in us all. For me, knowing that I have the strength to pick a guy up and throw him away means I don't have to prove myself."

The same contradictions of character apply to Bill Bixby. He's been reported as having flown into rages in the studio, pounded his fists on the table and stormed 2 off when things weren't going his way.




