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

JOHN KIRBY, rated for years as one of the finest bass players in jazz, dier on attack of diabetes. He was 43.

Kirby, whose Seatet made jazz history in the 'thirties, first came to the attention of British enthusiats when he began recording with Platcher Hendesson in 1922.

He married singer Maxine Sullivan in the late 'thirties, but the couple separated in 1940. Born in Baltimore, Maryland, on December 31, 1968, Kirby received early training on the trombone, switching to bass several years later.
