AN EP of four songs from Love Me Tender is sure to cause a stampede among ELVIS PRESLEY fans (HMV 7EG8199). In addition to the title tune, the songs are "Let Me," "Poor Boy" and "We're Gonna Move."

The three up-tempo titles reveal that Presley has the American's innate feeling for rhythm—more than any singer I could name in Britain.

But listening to But listening to "Love Me Tender," in which he is persistently off pitch, and that final strangled note on "Let Me," underlines my conviction that Presley's "singing" is on a par with his guitar playing. And, believe me, he's no Reinbard! hardt.

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



ANY of you who write sophisticated revue material may be interested to know that the Irving Theatre Non-Stop Revue company are seeking original iyrics and sketches. This is a good outlet for your work, but don't expect a tortune from it.

I recall that Sandy Wilson started his songwriting career
with contributions to sophisticated revue. He went on to
write the book, lyrics, and music of The Boy Friend, one
of the most successful of the post-war musicals both here
and on the other side of the Atlantic.

So if any of you want your work looked at, you should write to the Irving Theatre, Leicester Square, London, W.C.2. But for goodness sake don't send pops! Note that they only ask for lyrics and sketches.

Airing fees

THE value of performance has never been more marked than with the BBC's Our Kind Of Music programmes. Many of you who have aiready had songs broadcast in these shows, have written to enquire what is the monetary value of such airings.

I have consulted the Performing Right Society, Ltd., and they inform me that a single broadcast of one song produces £56s. 11d. This is divisible between author, composer, and publisher in the case of a published work and, if you are not yet a member of PEZ. the publisher can collect your share, if he himself is a PEZ. the publisher can collect your share, if he himself is a

member.

Alternatively, if the song is still only in manuscript form, the same fee is divided equally between the author and composer. In this case, a writer who is not a PRS member, can have his fees collected for him by the Mechanical Copyright Protection Society Ltd. 29, Maddox Street, London, W.1.

Ltd. 29, Maddox Street, London, W.I. If you are thinking of sending a song for possible inclusion in the Our Kind of Music programmes, don't just send off a manuscriot indiscriminately. Write first of all and find out how your MS is to be submitted. The address is Variety Music Organiser. 'Our Kind Of Music.' BBC, Acollan Hall, New Bond Street, London, W.I., but I must warn you that there are a lot of songs on hand which have not yet come up for consideration.

Standard contract

HAVE just learned from the secretary of the Songwriters Guild that many more music publishers are taking up the Guild's standard contract for authors and composers.
