A TWIST record that should end all Twist records—but won't while the fever is running high—is "Doin' the Twist at the Peppermint Lounge" (Columbia).

Any hip Twipster—if we may coin a word—knows that the Peppermint Lounge is America's Twist HQ.

It's a Manhattan nightspot where young Joey Dee and the Starliters play nightly to the crowds that throng the dance floor and Twist into the early hours.

This disc features the Dee instrumental group—guitar, electronic organ and drums provide the main pulse—and is an on-the-spot recording made at the Peppermint Lounge, Dee announces, and the crowd noises are all there.

Twisters can have a real marathon with this one. The music—such as it is—is basic, but the beat never lets up.
