- New releases: to help dealers keep ahead of release schedules, singles and albums will be listed, when possible, in the week before release date instead of in the week of release as at present. (Two week's releases are listed in this week's issue in the crossover period between the old and new system.
- Singles chart: where applicable, 12-inch catalogue number prefixes are being included in the seven inch number
- 12-inch chart: in response to dealer demand and the extraordinary growth of the 12-inch market, the 12-inch chart will be increased to a Top 40 as from next week.

It started as a DJ service - now 90 per cent of the chart is in 12-inch

PVOL THE TWELVE-inch single has revolutionised the UK record market An

since its introduction as a purely specialist item for disco DJs and is now accounting for one-third of all single sales, according to Gallup's panel returns

Last week, 90 per cent of all titles in the top 100 were available in both 7-inch and 12-inch formats compared with 56 per cent a year ago. But as the trend towards diminishing 7-inch only releases continues, the 12-inch revolution is

by no means welcomed by all sections of the industry. "The chart is no longer an indication of what is a hit single," claims DJM's Stephen James. "The 12-inch records are distorting it."

Gallup statistics show that some 7-inch only records, mainly MOR or pop, achieve lower positions in the combined chart than in the 7-inch only chart (which is not published). It is argued that some fans are buying the same record twice when the 12-inch version has longer or extra tracks so that the

record twice when the 12-inch version has longer or extra tracks so that the chart is reflecting sales of plastic rather than popularity of a particular song. It is widely known that the 12-inch is used as a marketing tool by some companies which offer them either free or at 7-inch price to chart dealers. Independent dealers are constantly complaining about the difficulty of obtaining supplies of 12-inch versions. The 12-inch was born from a demand by disco DJs because its extra grooves give added bass response. Then record buyers started asking for them in shops and a start of the start of the top the top the top the start of the top the

and as demand grew record companies realised the benefits of the 12-inch in marketing.

But they are not always cost effective. A 7-inch record in a picture bag costs a company about 20p, whereas a 12-inch costs around 30p to press and a sleeve adds about 10p-15p. Sold at full price they are worthwhile, but marked down for marketing purposes they are lo

DJs have been hired and Caroline's new programming policy is reported to be "album tracks from the latest rock bands in long, uninterrupted doses". Founder Ronan O'Rahilly claims the station will cover the UK reaching 8.5m listeners here and on the Continent.

Would-be 'hypers' are suckers, says Gallup

SMALL LABELS and artist managers who are paying between £1,000 and £2,000 a week to have records "bought in" to the chart are being taken as suckers, says Gallup. "We are regularly removing records from the lower end of the top 100 and

up to 200 because their panel sales are unrepresentative and it is quite obvious that they are being 'bought in',' said Gallup chart manager Godfrey Rust.

"We have descriptions of the people involved and these are passed on from chart shop to chart shop and through Gallup's head office. These are particularly unscrupulous people because they are charging a lot of money for a service that simply doesn't work and they are causing records to be penalised by being removed completely from the chart.

by being removed completely from the chart.
"For us it is simply a tiresome aggravation, but anybody using them ought to be warned that they are being taken for a ride." Earlier this year Gallup was successful in tracking down the people behind an organised team "buying in" records and that team has now ceased its activities.
The new chart partners committee met with Gallup this week and had wide-

ranging discussions on current marketing activities affecting the validity of the chart. No statement was issued after the meeting, but the committee is due to meet again early next month.

MW survey of companies last week found opinion divided on the relative merits of the 12-inch. Naturally, those who had seen 7-inch only records suffer were more outspoken, like Polydor's A J Morris, former chairman of the charts committee, whose Sarah

Brightman single achieved 55 in the combined chart but climbed to 38 in the 7-inch only chart. 

A recordbreaking rockathon on BBC-2

FIFTEEN HOURS of music programming takes over the BBC2 network on August 27/28 -claimed to be the longest continuous rock broadcast in the history of UK television.

Starting at 3.15 on Saturday afternoon, the network will continue broadcasting through until approximately 6.15 on until approximately 6.15 on Sunday morning and has dubbed the event, Rock Around Clock. The

"The programming will all have a strong rock influence running through it and will be made up of live and recorded concerts, documentaries and feature films," says executive producer Michael Appleton. Rock Around The Clock is said

to be an integral part of BBC Television's increased commitment to pop/rock music. The upcoming BBC schedules include two new music-based series - Pop Carnival and Eight series - Pop Carnival and Eight Days A Week, plus the return Of Riverside. The marathon Rock Around

The Clock was, says Appleton, "conceived last October following the success of BBC's second Rock Week, and continues the tradition of Rock Specials the channel puts out at this time of year".

Warner charges for clips

From IRA MAYER NEW YORK: Demand for music video clips continues to rise des-pite disputes between labels and users over what, if any, fees

are in order. The latest wrinkle is that Warner Bros Records will charge cable and network TV broadcasters for use of its promotional clips. Only MTV – half owned by Warner's parent WCI – would be exempt from such charges. No one seems to remember that, when music video first emerged about four years ago, A&M almost immediately began charging users a \$65 (£44) fee to cover duplication costs

duplication costs. Warner has yet to efine exactly what its proposed fee would be, although it was reported by the producer of ABC TV's New York Hot Tracks as demanding \$250 (£169) per clip. In contrast, NBC's Friday Night Videos has voluntarily offered a payment of \$1,000 (£676) per showing and \$3,000 (£2,027) for a premiere entailing a two-day lead for the station over its competitors. All refer to such fees as covering administrative costs in order to avoid potential union problems since the clips in question are almost always promotional.

While Warner is the only label so far to have formally sought such payment, others are insisting on clauses in the contracts granting permission for use of a particular clip to the effect that, if any company is paid, they will be treated equally. For those interested in reaching the US market for clips, here's a rundown of top current and planned networks and shows: MTV – the 24-hour Warner AmEx service – accepts AOR acts exclusively. New York City. Programme director: Les Garland. Night Flight and Radio 1990 – USA cable network Friday and Saturday nights, also FM TV in syndication to local broadcast stations. Produced by Jeff Franklin's ATI in New York City, with a creative team of Stuart Shapiro and Cynthia Friedland. Friedland.

Friedland. Friday Night Videos is transmitted by NBC TV, NYC, executive producer Dick Bersol; New York Hot Tracks is ABC TV, NYC, producer Kevin Wendle; Night Tracks is cable channel WTBS (Turner Broadcasting System, Atlanta, Georgia), produced by Tom Lynch and Gary Biller; Playboy's Hotrocks is the Playboy Channel, Los Angeles, producer Buzz Potamkin; and Album Flash is coming in September from HBO's Cinemax service, looking for exclusivity for up to one month and willing to pay for same. same.

For full-length concert videos, MTV, HBO and Showtime are the biggest potential outlets.

THE BATTLE over distribution rights for Motown product continues to rage, with the essence of suits brought against Motown and its new branch distributor MCA raising the issue of

Motown and its new branch distributor MCA raising the issue of the validity of oral promises. Both Schwartz Bros of Maryland and the Big State Distributing of Texas cite a conference call with Motown president Jay Lasker, held shortly before the July 1 switch to MCA distribution, and assuring Motown's continued support of the independents as part of their argument contending an oral contract. Hearing of the Schwartz Bros case will be held on Sentember 19 September 19.

WITH WEA stressing the importance of developing the youth market for compact discs and most labels putting initial emphasis on mainstream rock and classical titles, RCA's first release includes two MOR left-field hits (Hooked On Classics, Vol 1 and Return Of The Jedi) and 10 Red Seal classical recordings.

AC/DC, whose total worldwide album sales are close on 25m, release their ninth album on Atlantic this month. Entitled Flick Of The Switch, it features 10 new tracks and was produced by the band who start a US tour later this month which will run through to Christmas.

Also out this month on WEA is the original soundtrack to the film Ascendancy, featuring ochestral music composed by Ronnie Leahy.

DEPECHE MODE, currently in the singles chart with Everything Counts, release their third album, Construction Time Again STUMM 13), on Mute Records on August 22. To co-incide with the release, the band embark on a major tour starting in Dublin on September 9 and including three London shows.

LEVEL 42's fourth album, Standing In The Light, is released this week on Polydor. Shakatak's new album for the same label is set for September release.

THE STRAY CATS new Arista album, Rant 'N' Rave With The Stray Cats, is released on September 3. Details of UK dates for October are expected shortly, and the band arrive in this country for promotional purposes later this month.

STIFF EXPECTS to release a new Madness album before Christmas. Meanwhile the band's latest single, Wings Of A Dove, is available in seven and 12-inch formats and as a limited edition picture disc.

Lanza to raise EMI MOR profile

EMI RECORDS is set to restore its commitment to the MOR market with the announcement that marketing and repertoire executive Vic Lanza's role within the company has been expanded to include "the selective acquisition" of artists and repertoire in the UK market field.

Lanza was general manager of the EMI MOR division until its closure two years ago during the company's financial cutbacks. Since then he has been closely involved with EMI's association with the Audio Club of Great Britain. His new brief is to bring to the company "the Bucks Fizzes and Clanaads of tomorrow" and he will also be responsible for the acquisition of product from overseas - from both EMI and non-EMI companies

companies. Lanza comments: "While looking out for overseas hit records which could be successful here in the UK, my brief is also to find artists who, like Julio Iglesias or Richard Clayderman, could have their careers developed on a worldwide level."

Porter to replace Ayres at MGM/UA

MGM/UA HOME VIDEO has appointed John Porter sales and marketing director, replacing Steve Ayres, who left MGM/UA to become MCA Record's director of sales and marketing. Porter, formerly sales and marketing director of CBS/Fox Video, takes up the post next week.

Porter's appointment coincides with a re-structuring of the MGM/UA sales operation aimed at strengthening the company's ties with key accounts and broadening distribution.

Ian Taylor, previously national accounts manager, becomes field sales manager responsible for the MGM/UA sales team and for wholesalers and key accounts, while Don Peachey, territory manager for Central London and the South East, will have additional responsibility for some key accounts' negotiation. Three new sales representatives have also been appointed: Paul Wilcock, home counties and the South; Rob Elcock, Midlands and John Morrissey, the North. As head of the new team, one of Porter's priorities will be to help dealers establish a market for video sales.

"Over the next couple of years we have a lot of work to do to convince the trade there is a genuine sales market for video ready to be tapped," he says.

Raymonde launches HM promo service

NICK RAYMONDE, until recently heading up the Kamaflage heavy metal label at DJM, and now general manager at Centre Sound Studios in Camden Town, is launching a heavy metal promotion service which will run from CSS.

The new operation, Dambusters, will promote HM records to shops, clubs and discos, including mail-outs and reaction sheets. Raymonde will also be offering press facilities. Polydor's import warning

POLYDOR HAS warned dealers that copies of Monyaka's single, Go Deh Yaka (Go To The Top), available from Holland and Italy, may be "illegally manufactured" product.

A Polydor spokesperson said: "Rights are in dispute and reputable dealers are advised not to touch these records as it may result in legal problems. Polydor is the exclusive licensee for the UK. The record will be released on August 26."


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

Disco commentary

By BARRY LAZELL

THERE ARE new number ones on both the disco/dance singles and album charts this week, although on the LP front it is quite conceivable that Shalamar may quickly give way next week to Edition 5 of Street Sounds.

On the singles chart, Herbie Hancock's Rockit is outselling everything else by a gigantic margin, — including CBS stablemates KC & The Sunshine Band's Give It Up — the reverse of the current situation in the overall pop field, where KC has of course hit the top slot.

With Rockit making the specialist-to-crossover transition at an ever-increasing rate, however, it could quite likely be the next pop number one to replace KC. The record is already Hancock's biggest seller here and a reminder that the occasional eye-opening change of style can sometimes do an established artist no harm at all.

Among the new chart entries, the reappearance of Keni Burke's former hit Risin' To The Top at 39 may have raised a few eyebrows. In fact, the record is being sought again by DJs, and has very wisely been reactivated by RCA, because it mixes so well out of the Mary Jane Girls' All Night Long.

Another reissue which is likely to be greeted eagerly is London's Manu Dibango back-to-back pairing of Soul Makossa and Big Blow (LON(X)19). As the catalogue number may suggest, the reissue was planned some months ago, but London held it back because of good specialist sales on the Arthur Bakerproduced electronic version of Makossa by Nairobi, which was on the same label.

In the event, Nairobi's success did not spread far beyond the disco chart, but in the danceorientated climate of the moment, the original could fare much better.

Atmosfear's What Do We Do, already up to a month's steady sales on the specialist chart and now all but exhausted in its original Elite pressing, has been picked up by Chrysalis for immediate reissue on CHS 122730.

Provided the label gets behind it right away, promotion-wise, this is another strong record with a very good chance of making that vital crossover. As an extra encouragement for early buyers, the first 5,000 12-inch copies will also feature the previous Atmosfear seller, Xtra Special.

NIGEL HUNTER Intersong hits out at French 'payola' PARIS: THE long-established practice by French radio stations of ecord companies to adopt a united front.

refusing airplay to a local record unless a 50 per cent share of its publishing is offered has come under fire from Jean-Jacques Tilche, president of Intersong France. Denouncing it as payola, Tilche said: "All publishers and record

companies are opposed to this co-publishing conditions, but we have to go along with it because of pressure from artists who say that if we don't, their records won't get played."

France has no law forbidding radio stations to own music publishing companies. However, some music industry executives believe that the co-publishing stinulation represents abuse of dominant position. The major French commercial

radio stations such as Europe One, Radio Monte Carlo and Radio Luxembourg have been imposing this sanction for decades, but they claim that they limit their co-publishing demand to a small percentage of programmed local material. Sceptics believe that the percentage is as high as 30 per cent.

One remedy suggested is for the French record companies to join forces in denying their product to radio stations which follow the co-publishing practice. Tilche believes it would be impossible to persuade the

Academy council split


THE FORMATION of a Radio Academy moved a stage closer when a public meeting of over 100 people in London elected a nine-member interim council comprising BBC producer Caroline Millington (chairwoman); broadcasting consultant Jamie Jauncey and Peter Baldwin, deputy director of radio at the IBA.

Joining them, on behalf of the "third estate" of interests outside the BBC and independent radio, are journalist Anne Karpf and Tim Blackmore, formerly head of programmes at Capital Radio. Representing the BBC are Radio Four announcer Laurie McMillan and Dan Gilbert, head of training at BBC Northern Ireland. Representing independent radio are Tony Stoller, MD of Radio 210 and Michael Bukht, principal of the National Broadcasting School. However, a major split among those present did occur over the criteria for membership. One faction, represented by a majority of the working party, proposed professionals-only membership (broadcasters, writers or critics) while the other wanted unrestricted membership. The argument was put against the latter that professionals might not join an organisation-they had to share with non-professionals. As one BBC man put it: "We are all consumers of civil engineering, but that doesn't mean we expect to join the Institute of Civil Engineers."

A compromise solution of a two-tier membership, in which the pros have votes and the other "associate" members have not, met some criticism. Another unresolved matter was the name of the Academy – or Society or Forum or Institute.

DESPITE AN impressive track record Music For Nations, the heavy metal specialist label, is still only eight months old.

The company was started in January by Steve Mason, managing director of the major export company Windsong, and Martin Hooker who had previously been involved with Secret Records.

MFN's most recent signing has been Manowar, one of the US's most talked-about HM bands, with a solid cult following already established in the UK and a debut LP, Into Glory Rides (MFN6) recently released.

The label has also had HM chart success with the Ratt album (MFN 2) and Tank's This Means War (MFN 3), and is hoping to emulate that with new albums by Virgin Steel (Guardians Of The Flame – MFN 5) and Metallica (Kill 'Em All – MFN 7).

The British HM front is also very important to the label and following the recent signing of Manchester "shock-rock" outfit Rox, whose debut album will be out in autumn, MFN has also signed up Northern heavy rock band Battleaxe, who debut with Burn This Town (MFN 8).

After the chart success of the Tank album, MFN recently released a 12-inch single from the LP, Echoes Of A Distant Battle, coupled with two

All these activities bring a look of quiet satisfaction to the face of Martin Hooker — he is particularly pleased with the Manowar signing which was done under the noses of several

major record companies.

"It's been a great year for us," he admits. "We have done licensing deals for our product in just about every major overseas territory and our sales in June were the best ever. Even better than that though is the fact that the July figures were half up again on the previous month."

With eight albums released so far, Hooker is planning to release at least another half dozen before the end of 1983. "We've got an aggressive approach to the heavy metal market, and we're looking for new acts constantly," Hooker says. "Apart from our own shopping-list, we receive about a dozen tapes from unknown bands every day. Specialisation is the secret of it all – people know that we're good at what we're doing, and the word soon gets around. Personally I won't be satisfied until we've become the best-known HM specialist label in the world."

Hooker is hoping to stage a Music For Nations package tour, featuring both US and UK heavy metal bands, in the autumn – dates have yet to be finalised, but will probably include Hammersmith Odeon. The label will also be releasing a HM sampler album, featuring one track each from all the bands on the MFN roster.

Prior to Secret Records. Hooker worked at EMI Records for six years, and it was during this period - while working with acts like Sammy Hagar that his interest in the heavy metal scene grew. The music he admits, is now a full-time commitment. "I try and see as many acts live as I possibly can, and a lot of time is spent just going through demo tapes. Interestingly, we receive twice as many tapes from American bands than ones here in the UK. I'm hoping to pick up some HM bands from Germany and France in the near future,' Hooker says.

Outlook hot and heavy

WEA RECORDS is planning a summertime marketing blitz in support of its two-major bands, ZZ Top and Twisted Sister, appearing at Castle Donington, while EMI has released a new Whitesnake single, Guilty Of Love, a track from the band's forthcoming LP, Slide It In, released in October.

Atlantic has just released the title track of Twisted Sister's Atlantic album, You Can't Stop Rock 'n' Roll. Available in both seven and 12inch formats, the former comes in a picture bag, and the marketing campaign includes 50p-off LP vouchers, to be given away through the press and at the festival itself.

This week (19) WEA also relaunches ZZ Top's US hit, Gimme All Your Lovin', taken from the Warner Brothers album, Eliminator.

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HEAVY METAL Neat Records: from the Tygers to Raven

NEAT RECORDS has established itself as one of the most important heavy metal specialist labels in the UK, yet – ironically – when the label started operations in 1978 its first two releases were straightforward pop/ rock singles. Three years ago the company began to concentrate more on heavy metal music, and since then hasn't looked back.

The label's success is a tribute to the determined efforts of managing director David Wood, who says: "I think that maybe a lot of dealers in the past have found heavy metal music to be an unknown quantity — but as a market, it's always there, and more and more retailers are beginning to see its full potential."

Neat started life at Impulse Studios in Wallsend, a town near Newcastle-upon-Tyne in the North East. Wood became involved with the studios 15 years ago, and even now many of Neat's bands use its 24-track facilities.

The first heavy metal band on the Neat roster were Tygers of Pan Tang, although the label did a licensing deal with MCA Records for the band's albums, Fist and White Spirit. The TOPT connection has continued through to the current indies chart single, Bridges, by Jess Cox (formerly the band's vocalist). He is currently completing his solo album at Impulse.

"Everything really grew from there," Wood says. "We started to do our own international licensing deals initially we had hoped to do just one worldwide deal, but in retrohave since had many successes both as a live band and on vinyl. Their first album, Rock Until You Drop (NEAT 1001) was released in October 1981, and charted nationally. The LP's success was a source of personal satisfaction for Wood who had spent several months attempting to get a deal with a

Another of Neat's major signings are Venom, most recently in the heavy metal singles chart with Die Hard. The three-year-old band have produced two albums to date, Welcome To Hell (NEAT 1002) and Black Metal (1005). A third, At War With Satan, is due for release in October.

The band have been making an impact on the US HM market – the Black Metal LP was at one point the biggest independent HM seller in the US – and have done gigs in New

York, supported by Metallica. Europe has also been important to them: they headlined the Aardshock Festival in Holland (where support bands included Raven, Vandenburg, Trance and Mercyful Fate).

Another Neat Records band which have been attracting a lot of attention from both media and fans are Leeds act Dedringer.

One of Neat Records' services to fans, retailers and media is a special *Neat News* magazine, sent out periodically, which provides information on all the Neat acts and upcoming product.

"The newsletter goes out to

about 5,000 dealers and fans. We have a big mailing list of hardcore heavy metal fans. Our distributors Pinnacle send the magazine to the dealers, "Wood says.

Wood thinks heavy metal is a growing market — "HM is a type of good-time rock music demand for it has always been there and always will be. DEMON (ABOVE) have marked their return to Mike Stone's Clay Records label with the new album, The Plague (CLAY LPs, distribution Pinnacle), which lost no time in notching up a top 10 position in the heavy metal top albums chart.

The group has always been handled by Clay Records' production company, but their first two albums were licensed through Carrere Records. The former, Night Of The Demon, was released in 1981, followed by the chart LP, The Unexpected Guest, earlier this year.

The return of Demon to Clay co-incides with a widening of the label's musical horizons.

The band was formed in 1980 by vocalist Dave Hill and guitar player Mal Spooner. Hill was previously lead singer with a number of Midland rock bands in the Seventies — the most successful being Iron Cross who had a minor hit with A Little Bit Of Soul — and was also vocalist with Gospel Truth who later became the Climax Blues Band. Spooner's entry into the rock world came in the early Seventies when he played lead guitar with a band called Fresh Air who released several singles for Pye.

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

THIS YEAR'S Castle Donington Monsters Of Rock Festival, billed as "Europe's premier rock event", will be headlined by Whitesnake. The rest of the line-up includes Meatloaf, ZZ Top, Twisted Sister, Dio and Diamond Head.

For Meatloaf it is his first ever outdoor concert in the UK, while for ZZ Top it is their first and only festival appearance here this year. The festival also marks the debut airing of Ronnie James Dio's new band, and will be the first time that Diamond Head have played here since their highly successful tour last year. This year's event is reputed to have cost a record £40,000 --more than a quarter of which has been spent on hiring the top three acts on the bill. The organisers are confident of attracting some 65,000 punters, which will equal the 1981 record attendance when Rainbow topped the bill.

Wooltare, the organisers, expect ticket sales to gross more than half a million pounds, and the show overall should generate more than £1m worth of business. A total of £300,000 will however be spent on sound and lighting, security, advertising, staging and other facilities.

Wooltare's Maurice Jones emphasises the importance of good sound quality at open-air festivals: "We'll be using something like £1m worth of sound and lighting, probably the biggest sound system used in this country — 100,000 watts.",

He added: "The stage itself will be 150 feet wide and 40 feet high, weighing about 60 tons, and the roof will be controlled by four electric motors, to tilt it against bad weather."

Whitesnake triumphant


WHITESNAKE, WHO have just returned from a triumphant sell-out tour of Europe and Japan, will be headlining the fourth annual Castle Donington Monsters Of Rock Festival on August 20 — their only live UK date this year.

It has been quite a year for the band who last appeared at Castle Donington with AC/DC in 1981. Their recent album Saints And Sinners was a million-seller throughout the world, while lead singer David Coverdale was voted vocalist of the year and even sex symbol of the year in readers' polls, both here and in Japan.

Whitesnake's next album, Slide It In, is due for release in November and following Donington they will be performing to a total of 130,000 fans at open air festivals throughout Europe.

For Donington they are planning a show to remember

 the theme is taken from TV'S M*A*S*H, and Whitesnake will be joined on stage by planes and helicopters to create a spectacular display for the crowd.

CASTLE DONINGTON marks the culmination of a great year for Twisted Sister in the UK. Fronted by the colourful Dee Snider, the band have gone from strength to strength, signing a major deal with Atlantic, scoring a single and album hit, with I Am I'm Me and You Can't Stop Rock 'n' Roll, respectively. They recently released a new single, The Kids Are Back.

Twisted Sister have been described as "the ultimate in shock rock" and certainly they've attracted acres of both pop and national press coverage this year. On stage they combine outrageous outfits and garish make-up with their brand of rock. Surprisingly perhaps, Dee Snider had a classical music training, before becoming hooked on rock music. After a succession of bands he formed Twisted Sister in 1976 with Jay Jay French and Eddie Ojeda.





Group steams ahead with new single, new album, new tours Back to Girlschool

AFTER AN 18-month lull in the UK, Girlschool storm back into action this month with the release of a new single on Bronze Records, 1-2-3-4 Rock And Roll, produced by Richie Cordell and Glen Kolotkin who have previously worked with Joan Jett and The Ramones.

The single, issued last week, is released in a fullcolour picture bag in both seven and 12-inch formats and includes new versions of Tush and Don't Call It Love, which were originally released on the Hit And Run and Don't Call It Love albums. The tracks, produced by Chris Tsangarides, were specially re-recorded for the US version of Screaming Blue Murder, and have never been released in the UK up until now. Immediately following its release the band start a twomonth US tour, with a UK tour lined up for early next year.



The band have just released their first single for nine months, Makin' Music on MCA, available on 12-inch as well as seven-inch, and taken from their second album, Canterbury, released on September (also available on chrome cassette).









Back into Top gear

ZZ TOP (above) whose WEA album The Eliminator is being re-launched to co-incide with Castle Donington, started out originally as two Texan outfits, Moving Sidewalk, from Houston, which featured a young guitarist named Billy Gibbons, and from Dallas, The American Blues, whose line-up included bassist Dusty Hill and drummer Frank Beard.

Both bands had made records in the late Sixties, but it was not until after the break-up of American Blues that ZZ Top came into being. Frank Beard made contact with Billy Gibbons in Houston, and they were soon joined by Dusty Hill. That original line-up has stayed together for 13 years.

The band's debut LP, ZZ's First Album, was released on the London label in 1971, and was followed up with various tours by the band,



LAST YEAR was a period of complications for Motorhead (above). They kicked off by parting company with producers Vic Maile midway through the recording of their Iron Fist album, and ended up producing it themselves. The results were hardly a failure – the LP was a top 10 hit in a dozen countries.

1982 was also notable for other reasons: guitarist Eddie Clarke decided to leave the group, and was replaced by former Thin Lizzy and Wild Horses guitarist, Brian Robertson, who originally joined the line-up for a couple of low-key festivals and tours of the US and Japan. However, such was the impact Robertson made within the band that he was asked to become a full-time member.

After six months out of the spotlight, Motorhead returned to centre stage this year — and 1983 has probably been their busiest to date, with a UK tour, and live dates in the US and Japan, all part of the year's hectic programme, not forgetting of course their latest album, Another Perfect Day, on Bronze Records.

The band have now been with Bronze for five years they signed with the label in August 1978, and issued a single, a re-make of the Kingsmen oldie, Louie Louie, which made the bottom end of the chart. The real turning point came in early 1979 when they released the Overkill album, produced by Jimmy Miller, known for his work with the Rolling Stones, and which also gave birth to two hit singles, Overkill and No Class.

Subsequent record successes for the band have included Bomber, an EP. The Golden Years, and the Ace Of Spades album which came straight into the album chart at number four.

Infidel's lead singer is Kathy Septembre (pictured below) who also co-writes most of the






Cambridge **Folk Festival**

Once again the idyllic setting of Cambridgeshire's Cherry Hinton Hall Grounds played host to this new traditional annual good-time weekend event. This year's festival was graced by the presence of such names as Alexis Korner, Queen Ida, Maria Muldaur, The Fureys, Stephane Grappelli, The Free Mexican Airforce, Fred Wedlock, a one-off reunion of The Strawbs plus a wealth of more obscure talents.

The crowd seemed quite happy to hear The Strawbs repeat what could have been their farewell concert back in 1980. They originally appeared at Cambridge in 1965 as The Strawberry Hill Boys and were joined over the years by 'Hud' Hudson and John Ford (latterly known as Hudson Ford), Blue Weaver, Sandy Denny and numerous others until in the early Seventies it seemed that their bluegrass roots would be trampled underfoot. Rick Wakeman then hear The Strawbs repeat what could underfoot. Rick Wakeman then added classical overtones and Dave Cousins picked up his electric guitar making the Strawbs a more commercially viable band.

Several years on and Part Of The Union, Lay Down and other classics showed no audible signs of wear and tear from the original line-up and tear from the original line-up who actually succeeded in rousing a vocal accompaniment from the audience. Unfortunately the only album to have survived through this inactive period is A&M's Best Of The Strawbs compilation, but one gets the impression that the band affe easer to etert of up ar and are eager to start all over again.

The Remarkable Queen Ida brought a touch of Mardi Gras to Cherry Hinton for the first two days of the festival. Two storming sets on both Friday and Saturday night

brought each day's proceedings to a tumultuous end and a large outdoor crowed were again treated on Saturday afternoon.

Despite assorted beer tents being Despite assorted beer tents being open all day long Queen Ida's blend of Country, Swing-beat, R&B and the distinctive Cajun and Zydeco rhythms from the Queen's own accordion provided a more potent and unfamiliar brew. The Queen Ida LP is available on Sonet, though recapturing this kind of live atmosphere on vinyl must have been an impossible task. an impossible task.

an impossible task. By stark contrast Maria Muldaur's set left a 5,000 strong audience hypnotised by what can only be described as a beautiful experience. The voice that could melt solid rock warbled gently through R&B, C&W, rock 'n' roll, gospel, folk and jazz with incredible ease. It has sadly been some time since any product was released in the UK, though one delightful album is still available on WEA simply entitled Maria Muldaur. A further memorable occasion was created by The Free Mexican Airforce, a band consisting of Peter Rowan (ex Wild Stallions), Flaco Jimenez, and Tex Logan. Together The voice that could melt solid rock

Jimenez, and Tex Logan. Together they successfully enlivened the audience that the previous Dylan soundalike had just spent an hour sending to sleep. As each of these musicians is a star in their own right in the US it was a rare occurrence to see the three of them performing

together. Stephane Grappelli, is, without doubt, one of the most remarkable violinists of the twentieth century. At 75, and with 60 years of public performances behind him, he never performances bening nim, he never ceases to impress his audiences. His vibrant energy seems totally inexhaustible and once again he positively delighted a rapturous crowd. A whole wealth of albums is still currently available including still currently available including Norwegian Wood on RCA, Parisian

Swing on Decca and Strictly For The Birds on EMI. Unpredictability is

what Cambridge is all about and this year was no exception. It is less of a folk event than a summer fair where absolutely anything goes, but its Club Tent (where almost anyone can stand up and play) has discovered its fair share of talents over the years. However, judging by the popularity of the event one wonders why the organisers do not persuade their television sponsors to release an annual album featuring the festival's highspots.

at the end of the year and suddenly new things began to fall into place. "We started writing in a different style. Working with Imagination we got to meet the right kind of people — the sort of people who were making the sort of electro-pop/gospel sound we wanted to move towards," Sage reca

The tour with Imagination also introduced the Technos to Gary Hughes, a new writing partner, and they now have six tracks towards a new LP scheduled for mid autumn.

In the meantime, their new single, Foreign Land, is shaping up well in the lower half of the chart with Radio One airplay to its credit. The duo are lining up plenty of PAs to back it and "PRT is really doing us proud on it," says Sage.

As if this was not enough to keep them busy, The Technos have recently sold the idea for a new Monopoly-type board game based on the music business to Virgin Games.
