

MOR pilot set for Radio Two take-off

A tentative step towards promo video protection

THE RECORD industry in the UK has taken the first step towards protecting its rights on the public and broadcast performance of promotion videos in the hope of clawing back royalty income to offset the increasingly escalating costs of producing them and ensure future earnings.

Video Performance Ltd (VPL) has been set up in parallel to Phonographic Performance Ltd (PPL) which issues licences and collects royalties on behalf of record companies for the public and broadcast performance of sound recordings.

broadcast performance of sound recordings.

Initially, VPL is setting its sights on the embryo cable operators in an effort to forestall the situation in the US where MTV is recognised as a BMI and ASCAP licensee, but is still locked in negotiations overthe level of fees to be paid which will be backdated to when it began in 1981.

But Music Week understands that VPL will not, as yet, demand royalties from broadcast television companies which record companies currently happily supply with music videos free of charge for promotional purposes. However, if the cable misic programmes in Europe become as popular as MTV and the other cable operators in the US, then VPL will put pressure on broadcast TV to come into line with the cable companies and pay for use of promo videos.

VPL will also pursue users of videos in public performance locations, such as pubs, clubs and discos, to licence them for use of videos

But the situation is being further complicated by speculation that Music Box and The Music Channel may merge in a joint deal between Thorn EMI and Virgin/Yorkshire TV.

Dutch block to the **PolyWarner**

AMSTERDAM: Whatever may transpire elsewhere, the proposed merger between PolyGram and Warner Communications has Warner Communications has apparently been blocked in Holland until 1990 unless the consent of a major publishing company, Strengholt, is gained, writes Sue Baker.
Strengholt is one of the largest

book and sheet music publishers in the Netherlands, and has applied for

the Netherlands, and has applied for and been granted a court injunction to stop the merger.

Since 1969, Strengholt and PolyGram have been working together as the music publisher Intersong Basart BV, and the partnership was recently extended to January 1, 1990. According to Strengholt, a merger of PolyGram with Warner Communications would have an adverse effect as far as Strengholt is concerned. as Strengholt is concerned.

The court president in Utrecht

granted the injunction, with PolyGram being bound over in the sum of £2½m not to proceed with the merger without the permission of Strengholt.

If the merger should take place without that permission, PolyGram would be obliged to pay a penalty of £22,000 per day up to a maximum of £6 ½ m, and the company is restrained from selling off its interest

restrained from selling off its interest in Interest and According to PolyGram, the lawsuit is "really jumping the gun". No one has shown an interest in taking over the music publishing company, and the commitment to Strengholt is "absolutely clear".

Counterfeiter must pay £69,000 fine

A MEMBER of a counterfeit audio cassette ring, David Gorman of Harlow, Essex, was ordered to pay more than £69,000 when judgement was obtained against him in the High Court last week, and the BPI said later that it would "take every step to enforce judgement, including instituting bankruptcy proceedings if necessary".

Judgement against Gorman was given on his own admission that he,

given on his own admission that he had been dealing in a substantial number of pirate cassettes. The ring has been operating in the London area distributing high-grade counterfeit cassettes of current hit albums.

Top acts in prolific music video output

THE FLOOD of music videos for the home video market shows no sign of abating and the latest batch includes a value-for-money 80-minute Dire Straits live concert, The Making Of Michael Jackson's Thriller, and the cult movie Rock 'n' Roll High School.

The Making Of Michael Jackson's Thriller will be the first UK video release from Vestron Video International. With 150,000 US sales since December 14, it is claimed to be the largest-selling music video in the US and will be available here next month.

According to Vestron International MD Colin Bayliss, the Jackson video has impelled record outlets throughout the US to stock video product, and he hopes for the same "mass distribution and sell-in here".

NBD Pictures has reached an agreement with Bronze ● NBD Pictures has reached an agreement with Bronze Records to distribute the latter's video catalogue, including material by Girlschool, Motorhead, Uriah Heep and Manfred Mann's Earth Band. Election stops blank royalty

NEW YORK: Action to institute a royalty on blank audio tapes or cassette recorders appears to be a dead issue for 1984, No new taxes in an election year, thank you, is the wisdom among electioneering Congress people in Washington, according to Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) president

Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) presidents Stan Gortikov.

In a Billboard attack on Electronic Industries Association chief Jack Wayman and the Supreme Court Betamax decision, Gortikov said: "It seems impossible to fathom the true motivations and justifications of Mr Wayman and his Sonys, Matsushitas, Sanyos et al. They want income from every product unit they create. Their own computer divisions now want insulation from program copying. They all know that every consumer pays every day for every other product and service obtained. How, then, can they justify unrestrained free access to our recordings? All we seek is equity. All we want is what they already enjoy."

HBO AND Sony have joined forces to promote the former's hour long concert tape and the latter's Video 45. HBO's Serious Moonlight programme airs for the first time on February 12, while rock clubs in 20 cities will have 14-minute trailers for showing on February 7. Each club will also have a dozen Video 45s to give away as door prizes. The 45 includes China Girl, Modern Love and Let's Dance.

CBS is standing by its \$12 (£8.57) wholesale, but easing ordering rules and eliminating allocation restrictions. \$29.95 (£21.39) appears to be a fairly unanimous price point for full-length music video releases, with little or no discounting at retail.

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New releases to feature on tape magazine

A NEW fortnightly pop music magazine recorded on a C75 audio cassette is being launched this week for sale through record shops. Called Soundwave, it is the brainchild of club disc jockey Tony Jenkins and studio designer Simon Parrat.

Unlike the previous cassette magazine, SFX, which foundered through lack of advertising, Soundwave will not depend on advertising for revenue, but will carry a retail price of £1.95 and will include at least 30 minutes of "mega-mix" clips of new releases

supplied by record companies.
"We will only be playing up
to 60 seconds of each record and we have cleared all the necessary licences with the rights societies," said a spokesman. "We feel that the most important part of a magazine like this is the music, but we will also carry artist interviews, news and gossip."

Disco commentary

By BARRY LAZELL

THE SENSATION of the past week has undoubtedly been Rockwell's Somebody's Watching Me, which Motown rushed into 12-inch with perfect timing just as the buzz about it

Motown rushed into Janes Wheelers and the voice which sounded Just like Michael Jackson. Nobody could believe he'd turned up on Motown again (albeit incognito), but this speculative interest meant a clamouring to hear the record.

Jackson's presence on the Somebody's Watching Me vocal is now confirmed, but that will hardly cause the buzz to die or the record todive; in fact, Motown should have another major pop smash here in very short order. In the dance chart it crashes in at number seven.

The other big dance singles chart entry this week is James Ingram's Yah Mo Be There, duetted with former Dooble Brother Michael McDonald, and already achieving mainstream airplay.

Another feather in the cap for WEA, which has the top two specialist singles at the moment, courtesy of Madonna (whose UK promo visit was perfectly timed to give her erstwhile sleeper just the final kick upstairs it needed) and Manhattan Transfer. The latter's Spice Of Life is yet another boost to our own superstar soul tunesmith Rod Temperton.

In the bustle of Midem last week, one of the most successful disco imports of recent weeks found a UK home amidst a small flurry of counterbidding — Trans Lux's Big Apple Noise moves to Malaco, which hopes to have a 12-inch on the streets (through PRT) this week.

On the brand-new (and notably

revitalised) import scene, Julia & Company's Breakin' Down (Sugar Samba) on the District Of Columbia label has popped up from nowhere to a great buzz in London shops, and should chart next week once sufficient stockists pick up on it.

There is also a newie on Tommy Boy from Afrika Bambaataa & Soul Sonic Force, Renegades Of Funk, jointly produced by Arthur Baker and Freez' John Robie. It will be vying for electrofunk favours with Robie's own new solo effort I Want It To Be Real, which he produced in London and then took to NY for a joint mixing session with Baker. Although not on import, it is around now as a promo on Beggars Banquet, setting the scene for full release (BEG 105T) on February 17.

Another new import 12-inch is from the recently successful Curtis Hairston, but he could have his work cut out this time as the disc is a cover version of Jimmy Cliff's We Are All One, which itself makes the dance Top 50 this week on CBS. Hairston puts extra funk into Cliff's litting reggae, and will probably therefore find his own following. The US release is on the Pretty Pearl label.

Chasing it could be two very strong cuts on Virgin — Loose Ends' Tell Me What You Want (VS 65812), the first fruit of an album session by the group with Nick Martinelli in Philly, and Bryan Loren's Lollipop Luv (VS 65812) — a ghastly title but a cool'n'strong dance track which is already getting consistent radio raves from Tony Blackburn et al.

Finally, don't overlook On The Floor (Rock-It) by Tony Cooke & The Party People, recorded by Half Moon in the US but actually rushed out here first, via Pinnacle (HM 1134). Cooke apparently used to drum for James Brown, but the star of this lengthy (almost 10-minute) cut is a soulful pianist.





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

What lies ahead for Midem Classique?

WHILE PAGE one of *Midem News* on the last day proclaimed that Midem Classique was definitely on for next year, there were rumours that the situation was by no means so certain.

For, while the numbers of stands were just enough to make Midem Classique an identifiable section amid the welter of pop, those there really to do business in the record industry were fewer than last year, I believe.

The emphasis was very much on French music industry

organisations and companies of various kinds, which was perhaps not surprising. Many labels and companies managed to become involved in Midem Classique by joining together on one stand — such as those on the Nordic Music Scandinavia and Harmonia Mundi stands.

But the absence of the majors — though there was some classical representation on the pop stands — still makes the event something of a backwater, into which it is pleasurable and even mildly profitable to stray — but not much more.

This was the view of Brian Couzens, whose Chandos Records was again the only UK independent to take a stand. He confirmed that Midem Classique 1984 enabled him to fix the last distribution deals he needed, and to contact existing distributors.

"I thought that Chandos should really fly the British flag again, but next year I will probably come to visit for a few days rather than take a stand," he admitted. "I think

This was the conclusion of many Midem participants.

John Deacon and Alison Wenham of Conifer spent a busy three days meeting contacts from the European and US record community and, as usual, being forced to turn down a number of tempting offers, and putting final details to a number of contracts still to be announced.

But until the majors participate (and it is difficult to see

what they would gain) and more UK independents establish a presence in a bid to expand into new markets (many having already fixed the big foreign distribution networks), Midem Classique will remain of intriguing but peripheral interest.

Despite his enormous success on Nonesuch with Bach's B minor Mass, recorded controversially with very small forces, Rifkin announced his move to Pro Arte following a contractual disagreement

The first record under his new, exclusive contract will be the premiere recording of Bach's Oboe Concerto discovered only recently. A release date has not yet been fixed.

The label - one of the most respected of US independents - is being imported by Conifer following a contract signed late last year.

TWO YOUNG conductors the charismatic American James Conlon and the English early music specialist John early music specialist 30mm Eliot Gardiner — are to play major roles in the 1984 campaigns launched by Erato, the largest French independent classical company.

of the Rotterdam Philharmonic, has been signed to an exclusive three-year contract during which he is recording extensively with the London Philharmonic and the Scottish Chamber Orchestra

as well as his own orchestra.

would be six Conlon releases would be six Colline releases with four in March. Two are with the LPO — Dvorak's New World (NUM 75112 and cassette) and Liszt's Concertos for Piano with François Rene Duchable Francois-Rene Duchable (NUM 75111 and cassette). There is also Mozart's (NUM 75111 and cassette). There is also Mozart's Symphonies Nos 31 and 41, with the Scottish Chamber Orchestra (NUM 75107 and cassette); and Berlioz' Symphonie Fantastique with the Orchestre National de France (NUM 75106 and cassette).

More Liszt and Mozart is being prepared for the future by Conlon, and compact discs are due in April.

Erato's long-standing involvement with Gardiner is continuing with Bach's continuing with Bach's Orchestral Suites expected in September/October, and Purcell's King Arthur also in the pipeline. But the company is to divide its early music repertoire between Gardiner (who is also recording for Philips) and the harpsichordist Ton Koopman.

Scandinavia takes a united stand

TEN SCANDINAVIAN companies TEN SCANDINAVIAN companies covering most areas of classical music in Denmark, Sweden, Norway and Finland gathered together on one stand at Midem under the title of Nordic Sound.

It was an interesting and worthwhile experiment which could lead to further international marketing on a communal basis, said its director Professor Hans Astrand.

The 10 companies represented were the Swedish Music Centre, Norwegian Composers, Norwegian Classics, Music Sveciae (a new label designed as an anthology of designed as an antitology of Swedish musical history) Caprice, Finlandia, the Danish Music Anthology, Proprius, Phontastic Artemis, and Swedish Radio Records

Though foreign sales of the individual companies were relatively small, collectively they were of small, collectively they were of commercial interest said John Deacon of Conifer.

There is no one UK distributor, with Conifer claiming some labels such as Caprice and Finlandia, Unicorn-Kanchana looking after Danish music, and Impetus Danish music, and importing Norwegian labels

Price-cutting is cutting the throat of the industry

INDEPENDENT DEALER Harry Atterbury (MW Opinion, January 28), is right to be cynical.

He has perhaps not emphasised sufficiently the fact that the modern retailers are not just cutting their own throats but those of the record companies as well, and the latter, in their ultimate stupidity, are helping

their ultimate stupicity, are helping this downward path to extinction. By debasing the price (and hence the quality of the product), the service, the knowledge and ability of service, the knowledge after ability of the staff, hundreds of records which could be sold every week by ordering, knowledgeable advice, or just plain intelligent stocking, are not

reaching the customers.
I am a small off-beat trader in a medium-size country town and yet I medium-size country town and yet in am continually told by customers that they have looked all over Bristol, or sometimes even London, for something I either have in stock or could get for them within a few

The combination of yet another chain store in this town centre and increased rent could eventually drive me out of business. The record companies wouldn't care, but a lot of business which I create through constructive enthusiasm and knowledge of music will go for ever. Repeat this around the country

and you have one of the reasons for the decline of record business in the the decline of record dustriess in the Eighties. As long as records are marketed like cheap grocery products this decline will continue. C W WILSON, Bath Place Records, Bath Place, Taunton.

whether we had any stock of Green Velvet and although it is a bit late to Velvet and although it is a bit late to tell him now, we had plenty in stock all through the week leading up to Christmas. We also had sufficient quantities of Brenda Lee, Chart Trek, Stages and Pipes Of Peace. I have heard from many independent dealers that the majors

were unable to fill their orders at Christmas and although they know wholesalers will have the goods they are reluctant to use us.

We would admit that as wholesalers we are far from perfect, but Martin Anscombe has a choice of suppliers if he would forfeit his settlement discount and percentage returns for the sake of a better fill of product, whereas we do not even have that choice. Hooked on Billy

HE'S CERTAINLY not given to great shows of pride, but the ironically-named Billy Bragg has more than a little reason to be feeling pretty pleased with himself these days.

pretty pleased with nimself these days.

After being turned down by "every record company from EMI to Cherry Red", Billy Bragg's debut LP, Life's A Riot With Spy Vs Spy (Go! Label) is firmly lodged at the top of the indies charts, while seemingly every paper in the country wants to speak to the endearing character with the gawky face and trebly guitar

trebly guitar.
"I never expected this," he says with disarming modesty. "I just wanted something to sell at gigs; a cheap LP with quality stuff on it. Something you could check out without laying out a fiver."

The LP first came about when Jeff Chegwin at Chappell Music offered Billy

some studio time — and then just let him get on with it. The seven tracks were laid down in a mere three afternoons — "They locked me in!" — and when the odd critic pointed to the amount of reverb on what was, in effect, a live LP, Billy loftily made references to the old Elvis Sun sessions with tongue firmly lodged in cheek.

Around the same time Billy met up with Pete Jenner, who was then with Charisma and now manages him. "He came to a gig I was playing at Greenwich. Just before Pete got there a fight broke out so I played incredibly hard to distract attention from it. When Pete arrived the atmosphere was

electric; he didn't know about the fight so he thought: 'God, this guy can generate an amazing atmosphere

generate an amazing atmosphere"."

The LP was finally released on Jenner's Utility labe" via Charisma. However, things didn't work out. Despite selling out the first pressing of 1,500 copies, the LP wasn't really pushed and the only promotion it got was through Billy's constant gigging and hawking the LP round the music press himself.

Ever on the trail of potential gigs, Billy went to the Edinburgh Festival. "I met Andy (Macdonald, of the Gol Label) before Edinburgh and he just kept turning up at gigs. At one of them I was booked for a really short set, but the other

bands didn't turn up and I found myself playing for 105 minutes. I don't know

how I did it."

Such is the stuff that Bragg legends are made of and these days he seems to be generating them as fast as the pop press can print them.

Jenner and Macdonald finally met and within a fortnight ("with nothing on paper") they began to re-press the LP.

As someone who has seen life from the other side of the counter (Low Price Records of East Ham, to be precise), Billy says: "I was elated when the album began to appear in the indie charts." With the LP at number one, things seem much the same for the unaffected Mr Bragg. He's still playing a ridiculous number of gigs a month and he's still refreshingly earnest about his career and his ambitions.

his ambitions. "It's just an alternative way of making a living," he muses. "I've' achieved a lot of my ambitions — like being on the cover of the *NME*. Now I want to be worthy of making the cover of the *NME* next year. I also want to play Kirkwall in the Orkneys after some bloke rang me to invite me there."

The pace of life at the moment obviously gives him little time left to write in, but Billy has enough songs in the pipeline for his next Gol LP. He expects his stark two-track sound to be fleshed out on a couple of tracks, but stoutly declarate be."

Case of the missing million

MILLIONS OF pounds of "lost" royalties may be being held in suspense because Anglo-American repertoire is insufficiently protected in Europe, and US and UK copyright owners are losing out.

This dramatic scenario was spelt out at the Midem IFPMP meeting by MCPS managing director Robert Montgomery, who urged that if music publishers wanted to ensure they picked up all their royalties, they should be a member of a mechanical society representing them throughout the world, and that their composers can be identified by the mechanical societies.

Montgomery said that the case of the missing millions came to light from examinations which MCPS has made of suspense accounts of some BIEM societies in search of lost royalties.

"We have been able to increase the flow of mechanical royalties to the UK

copyright owners and we were very much struck by the amount of royalties for Anglo-American repertoire in European societies' suspense accounts," he

Royalties are put in suspense if owners cannot be identified and this is

happening increasingly, particularly as information from record companies often only indicates title and writers, but not the publisher, of a work. There is also a growing amount of mechanical income from non-record sales via the new technologies.

new technologies.
Incorrect translations, titles mis-spelt or partially logged, all lead to difficulty in recognising a title and identifying an owner, said Montgomery.
"In the future the problem may get worse. Uses of music in the new technological areas will not be able to be licensed individually; legislation in Europe, whether national or EEC, may insist on societies handling it," he added.
"In the UK I believe we must give thought to a limited assignment to MCPS and to writer/publisher declaration. Rights owners must adapt to the market place and realise that the copyright societies can be stronger than individual publishers in certain areas, and that they can be an essential adjunct to a publisher's efforts.

"I urge all publishers to review whether they are getting their share of royalties through the societies and what they can do to increase the safety net to ensure they do get their full due."

Copyright: are territorial deals within the EEC legal?

rights within the Common Market countries may be negated by EEC law — which provided a controversial talking point at last year's Midem meeting of the IFPMP — were put into perspective by EEC competition law adviser Colin

Overbury this year.
In an address headlined, "Are Territorial Deals Within The EEC Legal?", Overbury sought to clarify and explain the tangled web that has been spun between national copyright law and Community law.

As

Anyone hoping for a clear-cut nswer was necessarily disappointed due to the complexity of the subject, and Overbury stressed that, as a civil servant, the views he expressed were his own and did not necessarily reflect those of the Commission, let alone the Court of

The problem stems from conflict

which may arise between the national copyright laws of member states which seek to exploit and protect rights owners, and the law of the Community, having the effect of partitioning the common market, preventing freedom of choice and

price competition.

"The resolution of this conflict is really a matter of harmonisation of really a matter of narmonisation of the economic policies and legislation of each member state so that the same provisions apply throughout the common market," said Overbury.

Overbury.

"Although this is a fundamental objective of the Treaty of Rome, noone is foolish enough to think that it can happen overnight. It is a long and difficult process and I doubt if any of us here today will live long enough to see it selficient. enough to see it achieved.

"In the absence of harmonisation the practical solution is to go step by step, case by case, to enforce and interpret the principles of the Treaty in accordance with the rules; to

identify the conflicts and to apply

Community law thereto."

In the music industry, that is what has been happening for the last 20 years, Overbury said, and a jurisprudence has been built up which defines the law with binding effect upon all member states. But there remains an area of concern for music publishers and producers: the enforceability of licences made under copyright and the extent to which provisions for exclusivity and territorial protection are valid under

Exclusivity can have an anti-competitiveness effect in that others who wish to exploit musical works are prevented from so doing, eithe completely or in certain defined

areas.
"Such exclusion prevents price competition, shuts out the outlets of producers and limits the freedom of choice of consumers. Where exclusivity is based on territorial limits, it may have the added effect

of partitioning the common market," said Overbury. On the other hand, he argued, the

on the other hand, he argued, the need to protect inventive talent is universally recognised as an exception to the principles of free competition and the Treaty of Rome accepts this, but you cannot use a copyright to frustrate the essential freedoms of goods or services or to distort competition within common market.

"You can therefore impose restrictions on the exploitation of copyright to prevent unlawful uses of that right, but you cannot use that right to restrict trade between member states or distort competition," he said.

Community law will not accept restrictions in licences for the sale of musical works which prevents third parties from re-selling that product anywhere in the common market, and a restriction on the licensee from re-selling in other member states may also be unlawful if a

licence has been granted in other member states and the effect of that restriction is to prevent competition between licensees.

Summing up, Overbury said that the Treaty recognises the existence of copyright and the need to protect its fundamental objectives. "Where, however, that copyright is exercised in relation to the sale of goods, exclusivity of distribution and territorial limitations can only be accepted if the Commission has been notified of these arrangements and the economic advantages are clearly demonstrated to outweigh their anti-competitive effects so that they justify exemption from the

"Exclusivity for performance, with or without territorial limitation, can. however, be accepted provided that such restriction does not exceed what is necessary for the proper and objectively valid exploitation of that right."

HE MOST interesting conclusion to be drawn from the two seminars at this year's Midem on the international market for radio programme sales is that the biggest obstacle to such a market's success is Midem itself

Radio stations throughout the world now rely on commercial discs for a vast proportion of their programmes. And, as long as the music of one country is available to radio stations in other countries on record, the opportunities for stations to sell their own material will be corres-

pondingly limited.

This is not to say that other conclusions reached at the seminars or at the International Radio Programme Market itself - at the Palais des Festivals - were necessarily all

Full house

Little of what emerged was sur-prising. It rapidly became clear, for instance, that the Americans and the Europeans differ radically in their views of what constitutes a market in radio programmes. The US, in common with Canada and Australia, common with Canada and Australia, has a radio system dominated by large numbers of independent commercial companies. In Western Europe, local commercial radio either does not exist or has only recently arrived, and broadcasting is in the hands of large, nationallyowned public service corporations.

In the US there is a tradition of

buying and selling syndicated and networked material. In Europe, the tradition is one of programme exchange rather than purchase, particularly of classical concerts, through organisations like the European Broadcasting Union. Syndication is viewed with some suspicion, and the local commercial

stations are not yet strong enough or well enough funded to support a programme market by themselves.

Many of the national broadcasters also have transcription services, all of which (except for the BBC) supply programmes free of charge. That distorts the market commercially, and further depresses the prospects for commercial syndicators in Europe.

Another problem foreign pro-ducers face when trying to sell to the national broadcasting organisations is that there is little that those organisations cannot produce them selves. Radio France employs 2,900 programme-makers producing 11,000 hours a year, and the BBC is in a similar position. ABC Watermark was vigorously

routing its oldest and most successful programme, the four-hour weekly show American Top 40 with Casey Kasem; but as Radio One controller Derek Chinnery said, why should he buy Watermarks pro

gramme when he has his own American Top 40, presented by an American, Paul Gambaccini, who is familiar and acceptable to British audiences on British TV?

And, of course, there is the language barrier. The French are never likely to buy much spoken word material from the British and Americans, and even music can

present problems.

For the UK, practical short-term consequences are likely to be slight. The BBC Transcription Service is showing some signs of becoming more commercially aggressive, and wants to expand in the US market. But for reasons that remain obscure, the ILR stations were not at Cannes and do not seem interested in trying and do not seem interested in trying to sell their programmes overseas — despite the quantity of concert material that Capital, in particular, has to offer.

Bartering

On the other hand one UK panellist, Aidan Day — former Capital programme controller and now European representative for US syndicator Westwood One believes that the bartering of syndicated programmes (in which the producer offers the programme free to a radio station in return for com-mercial airtime or a sponsor's mention) is inevitable in the UK and the rest of Europe, as the regulations presently banning it are dispensed

And if the UK's ILR stations once begin to carry domestically-produced bartered programming, what is to prevent them carrying the same sorts of programmes produced

BIG COUNTRY'S first single for Phonogram, the Chris Thomas-produced Harvest Home on Mercury Records, barely crept into the Top 100 and went un-noticed by the barely crept into the rop 100 and well difficulted by the majority of pop music fans. However, once the band switched producers to Steve Lillywhite, everything changed — the next single, Field Of Fire, came straight into the chart at 69 and became a Top 10 hit, and since then they've had two more Top 20 hits with In A Big then they ve had two more top 20 fills with A big Country and Chance. Their debut LP, The Crossing, was another triumph, reaching number three in the chart and becoming one of the biggest selling albums of 1983. Big Country (above) are nominated in the BEST BRITISH NEWCOMER category.



IT SCARCELY seems possible that 12 months ago Paul IT SCARCELY seems possible that 12 months ago Paul Young (above) was still trying to establish himself on the UK pop scene. As the frontman of Q-Tips he had built up a solid following on the live circuit and his distinctive vocals won a lot of fans, but real stardom evaded him.

After a couple of singles for CBS, including Love Of The Common People, the newly-solo Young covered an old Marvin Gaye song, Wherever I Lay My Hat (That's My Home), and the rest is now pop legend. Further Top 10 hits followed.

Apart from being nominated Best British Male Artist, Paul Young is also nominated in the BEST BRITISH NEWCOMER category.

Awards take place tomorrow at Grosvenor House in London's West End, and will once again include nominations for both popular and classical music. Music Week talent editor CHRIS WHITE and classical contributor NICOLAS SOAMES take a look at the nominees.

TRACEY ULLMAN'S achievements during the last year easily warrant her inclusion in the BEST BRITISH her inclusion in the BEST BRITISH FEMALE ARTIST category — three hit singles (Breakaway, They Don't Know and Move Over Darling), a hit album (You Broke My Heart In 17 Places), a role in Paul McCartney's new film Give My Regards To Broad Street and of course her regular. Street, and of course her regular appearances in BBC TV's Three Of A Kind series.

A chance meeting in a hair-dressers, of all places, with Rosemary Robinson, wife of Stiff Records boss Dave, sparked off the idea of a recording deal. Shortly afterwards Ullman signed with Stiff and her first release, a hit re-make of the Sixties number Breakaway, followed by They Don't Know which reached number two.

Tracey Ullman has also been nominated in the BEST BRITISH

BONNIE TYLER (below) is the perfect example of how a telented artist can be out in the cold for several years, and then make a triumphant return to the charts, given an imaginative producer and a

given an imaginative producer and a new musical direction. After a string of hits in the Seventies, several years in the pop wilderness followed.

This setback came despite the fact that Tyler was one of the few UK female artists to break in the US where her style was compared to

Rod Stewart's.
Tyler's spectacular comeback was masterminded by CBS chairman Maurice Oberstein, among others, who signed her to the company, and tthen put her in the studios with Jim Steinman. The results were an out-standing album, Faster Than The Speed Of Night, and the classic single, Total Eclipse Of The Heart, which was number one both sides of



FIVE YEARS after their initial success with Can't Stand Losing You, The Police (above) had one of their most successful albums to date with Synchronicity which topped the US album charts for 18 weeks (a record beaten by only five other LPs) and was also a platinum-seller here in the UK.

That LP featured several hit singles including Every Breath You

Take, which again topped the charts both sides of the Atlantic, as well as being a massive worldwide hit.

1983 was also an important year for the band from the point of view of gigs - they were on the road for almost six months, touring the US where their Shea Stadium gig sold out within two hours — Europe and, finally, the UK where they played four sell-out nights at the Wembley Arena.

For The Police members individually, it was also a good year — Sting finished a science-fiction film called Dune, Stewart Copeland became a dad, and Andy Summers published a portfolio of his work, Throb.



Recorded in Los Angeles, and produced by Quincy Jones, the album has spawned several million-selling singles including Beat It, Billie Jean, Thriller, Wanna Be Startin' Somethin', and The Girl Is Mine (co-sung with Paul McCartney). It has already outsold Off The Wall and topped the record charts in just about every major music

SOMEONE DESCRIBED Billy Joel's Uptown Girl as "the best record The Four Seasons never made", and, despite the remarkable similarity between that record and some of those made by the legendary American group, no one can deny

that it has restored Joel's fortunes.

His songwriting and performing magic has never been in doubt — Just The Way You Are is destined to a "standard" of the future" — but UK hits have been the exception rather than the rule.

Joel's infrequent UK concert appearances have always been sell outs, and his extensive catalogue of outs, and his extensive catalogue of albums for CBS ticks over consistently. The 1983 album, An Innocent Man, has hopefully changed his record sales fortunes however. The LP has sold more than 500,000 units, and given Joel another Top 10 single with Tell Her About It. Joel (above) is nominated in the BEST INTERNATIONAL ARTIST/GROUP NATIONAL ARTIST/GROUP.

Best British producer

TREVOR HORN (bottom right) is the only producer to have been nominated last year and this — in fact he's defending the title as he was voted BEST BRITISH PRODUCER in 1983 for his work with ABC, Dollar, Spandau Ballet

BRITISH PRODUCEH in 1983 for his work with ABC, Dollar, Spandau Bailet and Malcolm McLaren's World Famous Supreme Team.

Previously one half of Buggles — remember Video Killed The Radio Star? — Horn was virtually unknown as a producer of other people's hits two years ago. 1982 changed all that, of course. His production achievements during that year included ABC's Lexicon Of Love LP, which went straight into the chart at number one, and many music industry observers must have wondered if he could maintain the impetus.

if he could maintain the impetus.

The answer seems to have been "yes". Horn has continued his hit associations with Malcolm McLaren via two singles, Soweto and Double Dutch (both on Charisma) and the Duck Rock album. His greatest achievement came quite recently, however, when he was responsible for producing concurrent number one hit singles both sides of the Atlantic.

Horn produced Yes number one American single, Owner Of A Lonely Heart, taken from their 90125 album which he also produced. At the same time he was responsible for Frankie Goes To Hollywood's now-notorious Relax single, which has topped the charts in the UK.

DAME KIRI TE KANAWA'S recording of Canteloube's Songs of Auvergne, recorded for Decca in 1982 and released in March, is now risoz and released in March, is now chiefly remembered for the fact that it climbed into the pop charts, albeit briefly, therefore establishing the fact for once and for all that the soprano was approaching superstar

Success at the cash tills however, was not just the result of Dame Kiri's popularity, her Dame Kiri's popularity, her appearance at that famous Wedding



and her regular appearances on popular TV, as the critics agreed that her performance of the Songs of the Auvergne was by far the best. Frederica von Stade's version had only just been reviewed when this

recording, made with the English Chamber Orchestra under Jeffrey Tate, landed on the critics turntables, but they generally felt that Dame Kiri's version was the most "exhilarating" and Decca is already putting together another volume as a companion disc.

BENJAMIN BRITTEN'S the War Requiem has proved one of the outstanding productions in the post-War record industry, so perhaps it was not surprising that 30 years was to pass before it was seriously challenged.

But now a viable alternative does

exist — following EMI's initiative of inviting Simon Rattle and his City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra

which, incidentally, premiered
the work under the baton of the
composer — to record the Requiem,
and offer a different musical view.

Rattle's version was recorded in the Great Hall of Birmingham University in February 1983, Elisabeth Soderstrom, so soprano, Robert Tear, tenor, Thomas Allen, baritone and the Boys of Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford, and was produced by John Willan, one of EMI's most consistently-successful

producers.

For Rattle, too, the recording has a wider significance: "I feel that the climate is right for another recording when people are feeling so strongly about the futility of war."

STEVE LEVINE has rapidly become one of the UK's top record producers, and much of the credit for this elevation is due to his fine work with Culture Club.

Levine has produced both their albums, Colour By Numbers and Kissing To Be Clever, each platinum in the UK, and with more than a million units sales

Be Clever, each platinum in the UK, and with more than a million units sales each in the US. He has also been responsible for all the band's singles, including the million-selling Karma Chameleon (last year's best-selling single in the UK), Do You Really Want To Hurt Me? (the number which started it all for the band), Church Of The Poison Mind, Time and Victims.

He has also worked with David Grant (ex-Linx), producing his debut LP and hit singles, Watching You Watching Me, Love Will Find A Way and Stop And Go and produced two other hit singles during 1983: Jimmy The Hoover's Tantalise (Wo Wo Ee Yeh Yeh) on InnverVision and First Light's Explain The Reasons on London/Oval Reasons on London/Oval.

Levine has been nominated in the BEST BRITISH PRODUCER category

PETE COLLINS (top, right) inclusion in the BEST BRITISH PRODUCER category is well-deserved — in the past he has been associated with hits by Matchbox, The Lambrettas, Rosetta Stone, Kirsty McColl, Smokie and Alvin Stardust, but it has only been during the last 18 months that he has received full recognition for his production work

Through a business association with MCA Records, Collins was responsible for Musical Youth's worldwide hit, Pass The Dutchie, and the Youth Of Today

for Musical Youth's worldwide hit, Pass The Dutchie, and the Youth Of Today album and also scored hits with the Tygers Of Pan Tang.

In 1983 his credits included Tracey Ullman (three Top 20 singles, Breakaway, They Don't Know and Move Over Darling, plus the gold album, You Broke My Heart In 17 Places), more hits with Musical Youth (including the singles Sixteen, Tell Me Why and 007, and chart entries with Roman Holliday (Don't Try To Stop It on Jive Records), The Farmers Boy (For You on EMI), and The Saphires' My Baby Must Be A Magician (Stiff).

Collins has also worked with The Belle Stars, co-producing their debut LP with Brian Tench, plus several hit singles which included Sign Of The Times and Sweet Memory.

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
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
