This decision by the appeal judges was hailed as an impor-tant victory by the BPI in its long-

running campaign to outlaw the machines.

And although Amstrad was equally claiming a "victory" in that the Appeal Court ruled that

its marketing did not infringe civil law — thereby effectively scup-pering planned action by several record companies to seek damages from Amstrad — the BPI also saw this aspect as working in

also saw this aspect as working in its favour.

The BPI argued that because the Appeal Court judges had to resort to seeking precedents from previous "elderly cases under the Patent Act", they showed up the inadequacy of the Copyright Act in the face of modern technology, thereby giving the music industry more ammunition for its submissions to the Government for missions to the Government for copyright reform.

The appeal judges ruled that Amstrad could not be accused of inciting civil copyright breaches because its promotion and adverbecause its promotion and adver-tising material was aimed at the public "in general". Under civil law such incitement would have to be addressed to individuals.

Amstrad was appealing against the refusal of Mr Justice Whitford in June this year to grant a dec-laration that marketing the machines was lawful following an action started by Amstrad against the BPI in October last

Mr Justice Whitford had ruled that Amstrad knew its systems

would "inevitably" be used to copy pre-recorded cassettes and had therefore incited civil

had therefore incited civil breaches of the copyright laws.
The Court of Appeal agreed, but Lord Justice Lawton said: "Mere knowledge on the part of the supplier that equipment would probably be used to infringe someone's copyright does not make the supply valueful."





Summing up on behalf of John and Taupin, Mark Littman OC refuted an allegation that the singer/songwriter and his lyricist partner had only brought their claim for the return of songs written between 1968 and 1975 at the suggestion of lawyers.

"So long as these agreements remain in respect of this very large body of master recordings and songs — a third of them unpublished — it is very reasonable to bring such a claim," he said, and added that the writers were "less concerned with the past than the future".

John and Taupin argue that "undue influence" was used to get them to sign away for life their rights to the songs nearly 20 years ago, in return for a small share of royalties.

It was "inevitable" that Elton John's confidence and trust in James would be undermined after his alleged discovery that royalties he should have received had been "siphoned off" into subsidiary companies. As well as asking for the return of copyrights, John and Taupin are seeking to set aside publishing and recording agreements, and are also claiming damages.

Dick James and his companies deny all the claims.

# **Bouncing baby-boomers**

NEW YORK: There seems to be no end to the enjoyment of American baby-boom adults' experience in the reliving of their

Unit sales have topped 100,000 in two months. Rhino Records, recently pacted with Capitol for domestic (and eventually, perhaps, international) distribution, is also readying a TV Theme Sing Along album.

Also worth noting: the 24-week run of the "Happy Together Tour," a package roadshow featuring The Turtles, The Grass Roots, The Buckinghams and Gary Lewis. 

THOMAS LEER: The Scale Of Ten. Arista 207 208. Producer: Artist/Paul Hardiman. At last the Scottish wunderkind is given a Fairlight and allowed to fulfill the promise of his earlier indie ventures. The Scale Of Ten is a grand sweep of electro ideas, from the storming Relax-esque chant of Heartbeat, to the almost Radio Two smoothness of No 1, via one of the best singles of last year, International. Producer Hardiman has achieved a huge, impressive sound to rival that of Propaganda's A Secret Wish, and were he not such a low-key figure, Leer could comfortably become a Top 10 fixture with material of this quality.

MARSHALL CRENSHAW: Downtown. Warner Bros. 925 319-1. Producers: artist and T-Bone Burnett, Larry Hirsch and E Mitch Easter. New infusion of fresh production blood — including Easter, renowned for his work with REM and "Comboland" bands revives Crenshaw, whose fortunes seemed to flag with his last LP, Field Day. Where that album sounded flat, Downtown heads in a much more tuneful, rocky direction, simply oozing small-town Americana. It's all eminently likeable and uplifting. It's about time the diffident Crenshaw toured the UK again, with a name like his, he needs to remind the public who he is.

PHILIP GLASS: Mishima. Elektra EKT 23. Critically slammed for the pretentious and absurd Akhenaten, but darling of the young intelligentsia, Glass fleshes out his systems music here with such conformist instruments as guitars. Mesmeric, snaking, repetitive, occasionally majestic, this music really needs complementary visuals for full impact. But as this is the soundtrack for the imminent Lucas/Coppola movie Mishima, eagerly expected by film buffs to make the earth move, this could do very well.

VARIOUS: Record Shack Presents, Vol 2. Record Shack RSVP 2. Distribution: PRT. Double-album follow-up to the earlier successful compilation, which features Evelyn Thomas, Miquel Brown, Barbara Pennington, Village People and Laura Pallas among others. Mixed and segued by lan Levine, and doubtlessly another big club favourite.

MIQUEL BROWN: Close To Perfection. Record Shack SOHOLP 8. Distribution: PRT. Second album from Miquel Brown, and the title track has already been a big disco/dance chart hit. She's a singer who could very easily achieve cross-over acceptance, and with Record Shack's considerable promotion behind this album, the timing could be just right.

VARIOUS: The European Suite. Havoc House Records HHO1. Distribution: PRT. Guy Fletcher, who has been responsible for many pop hits, was the original inspiration behind this musical suite dedicated to 40 years of peace. He has been joined by James Johnson and Brian Daly in the project, and they have come up with an outstanding all-instrumental work that takes the various capital cities of Europe for its musical schemes. Deserves to reach a wide audience.

THEREZA BAZAR: The Big Kiss. MCA Records MCF 3239. Extremely commercial pop album from Bazar, previously one half of Dollar, but both singles released from it, The Big Kiss and Too Much, have failed to chart. With Arif Mardin producing, and songwriting including Graham Lyle, Terry Britten, Phil Pickett and Billy Livesey, the ingredients are all there, but without the benefit of a big hit single, the album's sales potential must be severely restricted.

JETHRO TULL: Original Masters, Chrysalis JTV 1. It's alarming the number of disparate Tull fans that crawl out of the woodwork on hearing this LP, but none would be disappointed with this fairly standard collection of the more bombastic works (Aqualung, Locomotive Breath, Minstrel etc etc). Effortlessly finds itself clear leader in The Least Inspiring LP Sleeve Of The Year Award.

RAY PARKER JUNIOR: Sex And The Single Man. Arista 207 252/407. Ray Parker's worldwide success with the Ghostbusters theme (10m units sold) should not obscure the fact that his recording career goes back some 15 years and he has worked with names like Marvin Gaye. His new solo LP features various musical influences, not least early Motown, and Prince, and could enjoy moderate chart success.

KAJA: Crazy People's Right To Speak. Parlophone KAJA 2. Previously better known as Kajagoogoo and now slimmed down to a three-piece, Kaja have got a lot of ground to regain if they are to achieve the chart status they enjoyed with former vocalist Limahl. Nick Baggs has now taken over the role, and this album features some jaunty numbers, but Kaja are facing some very tough competition at this time of the year.

MEZZOFORTE: The Saga So Far. Steinar STELP 07. Distribution: PRT. Yet another strong album from the Icelandic jazz-funk band who seem to be permanently based in the UK now. This is a compilation of their better known material, including Garden Party, which have been remixed, and some new tracks notable for the fact that they are the first to feature vocals. A refreshing change of direction for Mezzoforte.

Another striking sleeve graces the Viva El Ritmo LP, which is an eight-strong compilation of Cuban dance compilation of Cuban dance music. Perhaps spurred on by what many see as the banality of the home music scene, the number of people starting to check out the rest of the world is definitely on the up, and this is a fine starting point — all carnival atmosphere and unheard cries of "Ariba!".

# From little acorns...

From schoolboy assistants in their father Sydney's grocery store, via a tobacconist's in Barkingside, Barrie and Tony Gold have between them built up a business, founded on a first week's record sales of £11, that is now looking at over £12 million turnover this year, the company's 30th anniversary.

turnover this year, the company's 30th anniversary.

What has contributed to this huge increase in business — £2.5 million up on 1984 — in one of the four major wholesalers in the UK? Prices have not increased any more than usual, and there isn't exactly another record boom out there, though S. Gold and Sons have increased their share of the record market by 50 per cent. It has to be more sales through new customers.

In this anniversary supplement, MUSIC WEEK analyses the company's methods of working and its approach to the edge-of-the-seat wholesaling business; why it has such a good relationship with dealers, how it achieved such phenomenal success, and how the company plans to increase its market share in coming years. Seven years ago Barrie and Tony moved from two rooms above a Leytonstone record shop to a £65,000 warehouse, which opened just as the record business slumped. Somehow they pulled together, never let anyone down, and entered the video wholesaling business. It was clearly a good move, and characteristic of the Golds.

Business built up to such an extent that two years ago the company moved to its new huge premises in Flempton Road, Leyton — £1 million worth of warehouses and offices. Once again, the gamble has paid off. Though the company filled only a third of the space at first, there is now only a third left — poised for natural expansion and so far unknown new product.

With turnover at £12 million, up by £2.5 million from last year, Barrie and Tony explained how they survived seven years ago when so many other record wholesalers closed down. "Standards established when business was good — the reason we went into record wholesaling in the first place — stood us in good stead for the tough days," recalls Barrie. "Overnight delivery, accurate fulfilment of orders, a free catalogue, charts and as much dealer support as possible, tight credit control and the prompt payment

of invoices all contributed to our survival and our current growth."

Plus, of course, the canny instinct for new industry developments and the nerve to commit themselves wholeheartedly. The business has already expanded to include areas other than wholesaling; the pilot run of hardware wholesaling, the Philips Dealer Development Programme; an insurance scheme for dealers which includes immediate replacement of stock; a separately-contracted tele-sales and marketing services company, Konnekt, and the establishment of Palace-Virgin-Gold.

As well as S. Gold and Sons' involvement with new products — notably the Compact Disc, an investment that is reaping unexpected benefits — the company remains behind V2000 and LaserVision when fainter hearts have given up, and constantly courts new customers, both in the UK and abroad.

With the video side well established, the company has been able to concentrate on recapturing its share of the record and tape business. Their computerised list boasts 43,000 items — albums, 12" and 7" singles, EPs, cassettes, blank tapes, video, Laserdisc, CD and now, video hardware. The Golds, to their immense satisfaction, have seen record and tape sales increase by 50 per cent this year, and CD alone by over 600 per cent in the same period.

With the catalogues of all major record companies stocked, eye-catching displays in the cash-and-carry area, bar-coding to speed up service at the check out and stock control, and the continued investment in and promotion of music-on-video, S. Gold and Sons have good reason to celebrate their 30th year.

All they ask in return is better deals from CD distributors, if only a decent margin from those currently charging them trade price; better marketing back-up and larger margins for music-on-video, and to have their important role in the record business acknowledged by the majors, just as the music-on-video distributors have accepted that the business could not be run without them



# Service is the business

"Our roots are in music, so we will never stop selling records," stated Barrie Gold. It is, therefore, extremely gratifying to him that the company is achieving what it set out to do once the video business had settled down — recapturing its share of the record and

tape wholesaling business.

"This side of the business is 50 per cent up on last year, "Barrie continued," and that is without CD, though records in general are now only about 15-20 per cent of our business." Barrie says he is happy being "one of the big four" wholesalers. "We don't need to be Number 1," he said, "but we are heading there."

The £12 million turnover for this year — which may well be higher once the annual figures emerge — is a 25 per cent increase on 1984's high of £9.4 million. Much of the growth has been in video, and the company's leap is greater than that of its competitors. The sharp rise in business has been caused by volume, not price increases, and the continual addition of new customers —

not more shops, just more of them coming to S. Gold and Sons. Exports, too, are a growing proportion of revenue.

Though record sales, particularly CD and 12" increase, Barrie is not expecting music-on-video to achieve the levels of the same period last year. "There don't seem to be any ultramajor titles so far," he said. "I think we would have known about them by now."

He believes that the music-onvideo market may have been affected by the fact that certain artists have yet to commit themselves to the format. "For example, artists like Bruce Springsteen don't want to make videos, and there is still no sign of a Frankie Goes To Hollywood video. Some kids may have been disillusioned with video, and not bothered to ask what else was available.

"The compilation-type video, tied in with a record and advertised on TV always goes well, but there is still a resistance in video specialist stores to selling. There is still not enough merchandising support. We issue our Top 50 to our sales people and offer the same fast service nationally to dealers as we always have, based on good stock control. We believe in the music-on-

video market strongly. After all, there were 140,000 people who bought Thriller, so most shops must have been prepared to sell at least that title."

"If we had better margins we could do more," Barrie continued. "Last year, the companies said they could not afford to give us bigger margins. This year, some have dropped prices right down — in PMI's case to £9.50. There's something wrong somewhere. Are we to assume that what they told us before was rubbish?"

Part of S. Gold and Sons' video expansion can be put down to the increased buying by public libraries, quite a large sector now. Also, the company's own promotion of special-interest titles and their introduction of a separate catalogue two years ago. Then there is a "prestige" account: the Daily Mirror Video Club, for which S. Gold and Sons handle the mail order of Mirror Vision titles.


Other new areas include S. Gold and Sons' recent move into video distribution. Though any such potential deals are first offered to PVG, S. Gold and Sons now have the Apex label deal, the first for some time.

LaserVision disc sales are also gradually increasing, and Barrie feels that the introduction of the combined CD/Laserdisc player will help sales of LaserVision, particularly to music buffs. "There are dozens of new, excellent titles," pointed out Barrie, "and business is going well. Not dramatically, but I can see great

The company also stocks V2000, which no other wholesaler takes. "There is still a fair bit of business there," said Barrie. At present, there is also the seasonal range of pop calenders. And what are those still-empty areas of the building waiting for? "Well, we're not stocking C5s or telephones," quipped Barrie. "We will fill the space by natural expansion. But we will only stock new products related to our existing business."

Overall, Barrie puts the firm's continued growth down to its service.

"Our computer ordering system means that a package can be ready to send within 20 minutes of that dealer's phone call. In fact, with our sales team and the telephone sales company, Konnekt, we offer a better service than most of the majors. It's a pity they don't pay us to do it!"



# THE METEORIC RISE OF C.D.

The Compact Disc has been one of Gold's phenomenal successes of the year. Their considerable investment of two years ago has paid off — not so much in terms of profits, but in attracting new customers and cementing the company's reputation.

"Sales have increased by 600 per cent over last year," said Stuart Persky, record buyer. "The sales graph is practically vertical now."

Everyone is aware of the appalling stock position of CD, and S. Gold and Sons counteract this by buying as many of each new release as possible, occasionally being able to supply dealers long after the major distributor has gone out of stock.

Some majors, predictably, are being extremely unhelpful, Persky considered. Despite a year of selling every CD they can press, they don't hard sell the product and don't seem to have targets, possibly because the pressing crisis would make nonsense of

this anyway. "Few of the companies will give us any margin at all," he continued. Golds is one of two wholesalers stocking CD, and new CD customers often go away with records, tapes and video as well. This overspill business has contributed to the company's expansion this year, though actual CD profits are low. Where a major gives Gold's a discount the dealer is charged normal trade price. Where there is no discount, overheads have to be covered, so a nominal small percentage is added. "But we don't make anything out of it," said Persky. "The majors are cutting their own throats by treating us like dealers".

While majors long ago accepted that wholesalers were a crucial part of music-on-video, the same attitude does not seem to have filtered through to the CD marketeers, despite the fact that wholesalers are in a position to bring in new CD customers — for instance, the discs are being bought by

video hardware dealers and video software libraries, initially for Christmas.

Where the UK majors won't cooperate with margins, S. Gold and Sons will be forced to import titles from the majors' European counterparts when demand here is heavy.

The risk factor in ordering as many as possible of each title is that there are no returns with CD. "We sometimes order as many copies as we would a cassette," said Persky. "If we underorder, the majors are bound to be out of stock if we need more later."

If a dealer only gets a half order out of, say, a mixed batch of 1,000 CDs, "that's still the best deal he'll get anywhere," Persky explained. "We stock over 2,000 titles — pop, classical, and every title in the catalogues, with the exception perhaps of some of the smaller labels' product." The company will not be importing any titles that are not in the UK majors' catalogues despite tempting offers of alternative albums by top artists. This would be too confusing for the business.

"CD is a a heavy investment, and we are the only wholesaler doing it properly," said Persky. "CD is the biggest single growth area we have, and there are many outlets now and we are plagued with enquiries. This week two multiples called us — one with 64 shops, the other with 30. They haven't stocked records before. Major record companies please note."

Added Barrie Gold, "There is no

Added Barrie Gold, "There is no doubt that we have gained customers as a result of CD, so it has increased our market share."

Mused Barrie, "I would have expected the CD business to be even better than it is now. I suspect that once the CD/Laservision player is available, it will help both markets, and the port-

able CD next year.

"As sales increase, we are pitching for better margins. And my promise to the majors that are so far holding out is that we won't import any titles until we have heard that UK major's offer, especially now that prices have all gone up."

# Gold's No. 1 concern is the dealer

The major part of S. Gold and Sons' business is with dealers, and new dealers means continued growth. So any dealer visiting the Flempton Road warehouse is going to be given the best possible service.

"Every customer is special," said Stuart Persky. "We've always got time to talk to them, and the buck stops with me, who is buying in the stock. The established dealers are very good at selecting what they know will sell, so we don't need to give tips, except occasionally to a smaller shop. The ones that come here come regularly, so that they can keep their shelves filled without having to invest large sums at a time. Some only spend £50, but if they do that every day that's £1,000 a month, and that's fine. Others come and spend a fortune."

The company does not expect to be a dealer's exclusive supplier. "It keeps us on our toes knowing the competition is good," he said. "We know what dealers expect of us, so records and tapes is a full-time job because of the nature of the business. CD is the exception because of the stock problems, and one of our headaches is trying to explain to an irate dealer why

we can't give him a full order. It doesn't help anybody's profits to have to wait for stocks."

For the dealers who can't come in, S. Gold and Sons sends out as many sales aids as possible, plus a CD and 12" chart weekly. EMI recently sent an Iron Maiden display well ahead of release," and I wish everyone would do the same," Persky added. "We normally send display material to dealers who never see a record company rep.

never see a record company rep.

"Our sales people are always on the ball," he continued, "passing on information as soon as we have it, news of product, release dates and so on. The more we can communicate with dealers the quicker they can make their buying decisions."

In the Cash & Carry, which sees many customers a day, Jonathan Gold runs the check out, with Mick Bannocks on the floor assisting buyers. Barrie's wife (and Jonathan's mother) Barbara Gold comes in four days a week and will probably be in more often towards Christmas.

Jonathan has been working in his family's business for about six years, first as a Saturday boy, then in the first wholesaling office, then back to the

record shop as manager, finally ending up as a wholesaler as the business grew during the record boom. He remembers the cramped warehouse with boxes in everybody's way. For a while, customers just couldn't come in and browse, which was bad for business.

Jonathan pointed out the huge display area in the new building. "People can spend all day if they like, without getting hassled or tripping over parcels," he said.

As well as running the checkout, Jonathan supervises the despatch of the record and tape exports. Top countries buying at present are Germany, Switzerland, Scandinavian countries, France and territories as far flung as Fiji and Hong Kong, a particularly large market.

In the warehouse, chart records are displayed separately. Others are in companies, in alphabetical order of label, and within that by number. There are three assistants filling shelves and assisting customers. "Buyers also come in from abroad," continued Jonathan, "particularly from Europe, though recently we had a buyer in from Malaysia."

To speed up the check out, all products are currently being bar-coded. The video titles have all been done and


the records and tapes should be completed by Christmas. In charge of the computer side of this operation is another member of the Gold family — Michael.

The bulk of Gold's business, however, is done by phone orders or sales reps' orders, and here credit control plays a vital role.

Bill Roberts is credit control manager and has four assistants. "This is the busiest credit control department I have ever worked in," said Roberts, who joined the company soon after the move to the Leyton warehouse in 1983.

As the company's bills are paid on or before due date, Roberts is under constant pressure to keep the payments from dealers flowing in. Nothing is shipped out without the authority of Roberts' department. Dealers want their product in 24 hours, so it is only reasonable to expect them to pay their bills promptly. Roberts' department handles thousands of dealer accounts, for both records and video, plus the PVG business.

Credit control is now computerised, though Roberts originally had been doubtful about being able to continue a personal service to dealers. Now, he can't imagine ever having worked without it.

# **WE KNOW THE** RECORD MA

"Record companies have realised that wholesalers are not going to go away," said S. Gold and Sons' record buyer Stuart Persky. "We are a hefty chunk of their business now. If all record companies could do 100 per cent correct next-day deliveries, they wouldn't need wholesalers. In addition, we supply all those thousands of small accounts that they could never reach, which would require such a large sales force it wouldn't be cost-effective for them."

Persky, six and a half years with S. Gold and Sons, is responsible for negotiating with the majors and overseeing the incoming side of the record business. This has increased by over 50 per cent on last year, mainly because of renewed promotion of this area of the business, resulting in new custom, plus the attraction of new buyers initially

the attraction of new buyers initially coming in for CD stocks.

"I would say 12" accounts for 40 per cent of the singles business," he said, "but not nationally — it's London-based. Cassette sales are steady, at about one to three LPs. We've changed our policy recently and give cassettes very prominent display. The TV compilations particularly move fast.

fast. "With singles, it is, as always, difficult to keep up with the unexpected fast movers, especially with 12", and here we have to rely on the majors pressing enough. However, our customers know that as soon as we've got



it, they'll have it, and they'll receive at least a part-order the next day — that's a better service than most majors."

Interestingly, it's rare for S. Gold and Sons to go out of stock of an album. "And if it happens," continued Persky, "well, it's all part of the excitement of being in the record business. It would be a bit dull if we always knew exactly what was going to sell.

Thousands of each title are stocked, chart titles and new releases particulary. In addition, the company is renowned for stocking the entire cat-

alogues of most majors, returning those that become deleted.
"Our buying is tight," Persky explained. "You have to know the market well and watch it closely. We get it 95 per cent right I would say, which is fine, as we only get 5 per cent returns.



Album sales are better than 1984, but 7" not as buoyant. "Last year, there were six million-selling singles,"
Persky went on. "Band Aid's Do They Know It's Christmas has just gone over the 3 million mark, and our second biggest was Stevie Wonder's I Just Called To Say I Love You. But this year, we haven't had a monster, and sales are spread over a wider range of titles.'

The shift in emphasis to records whose share of Gold's business had dropped to 7 per cent — has been considerably helped by the increased warehouse and display space, and now accounts for about 20 per cent of the business, including CD. "There is room for eye-catching displays, all of which help the customer make his selection."

Concluded Persky, "The record companies are relying on us — but they don't know it yet."

Don Davis, administrative assistant to Stuart Persky, has had his work cut out in the past few weeks updating all the files and records to allow for the acrossthe-board seasonal music business in-

"All suppliers' prices have jumped," said Davis. "CDs, cassettes the same price as the equivalent album, 12" up all round, and 7" has gone up as


However, despite the dealers' grumbles, the price rises don't appear to have affected sales.

S. Gold and Sons has always been a family business, since the early days when Barrie and Tony helped their father, Sydney, in his grocery and delicatessen. Inevitably, a third generation of Golds has entered the business - Jonathan, who runs the check out and oversees exports despatch and his brother Michael, the self-taught computer buff who is now the company's computer manager. And not forgetting Barrie's wife Barbara who, having raised three sons (Nathan is still at business college) was "persuaded" about five years ago to help correct a catalogue, and now works four days a week looking after new customers, swapping staff from one place to another if there's a rush of work, and talking on the phone to customers. "There's always a Gold here to talke to," said Barbara "We've got to keep the customers happy. You can't have a business without

But the company has grown from a family business to a multi-million wholesaler, and now there are about 25 field sales staff, 55 people working at Flempton Road, and ten people at Konnekt, the tele-sales company, plus the PVG staff.

Video, particulary, has meant that more people had to be drafted in or transferred from records. One of these is Chris Holden, video manager, who moved from records almost five years ago. As well as overseeing incoming product and buying, he also assists Barrie with general company business and the newer ventures the Dealer Development Programme, for example.

As the vital part of the company is getting dealers' orders out, the despatch department, headed by Ivan Buckingham, works non-stop, sometimes putting out 1000 parcels a day plus PVG's product. The huge increase in turnover meant a complete change in the way despatch is managed, with the computer speeding up orders to the extent that an order can be parcelled within 20 minutes of the dealers' phone call. Buckingham's section is constantly on its toes.

Melton Sharrier has his work cut out handling export packages, all of which have to be air-freighted or air-mailed.

Now even the computer has been outgrown by the volume of business, and S. Gold and Sons are in the process of upgrading it.

Michael Gold, self-taught programming buff and computer manager of the company is also heavily involved in bar-coding at present, with video product all done and records due to be stamped by Christmas.

'Bar coding speeds up check-out, identifies our company's returns, prevents errors in billing, and speeds up stock control." Michael explained. Barcoding is widely used in other industries and is an invaluable aid to efficiency.

"If a dealer buys a computerised till and uses barcoded product, he will never get a price wrong," said Michael.

The computer handles all S. Gold and Sons' accounting apart from wages (which are done by the bank) and bought ledger, which is done manually. It also looks after PVG and the Dealer Development Programme product.

Michael, who has been a computer fan since the age of 11 and programming from the age of 14, continues to top up his knowledge with evening classes. He also hopes to go on a two-week course for the company's new computer.

Ron Day has so far resisted the lure of the computer. He says his department, bought ledger, operates best manually. With his two assistants looking after hundreds of accounts, he has a huge workload, with the additional edge that S. Gold and Sons has a reputation throughout the business for paying bills immediately, even to the extent of sending monthly accounts a week ahead with a post-dated cheque drawn on the due date.

As well as good relationshipos with suppliers, prompt payment means savings where settlement discounts are offered. "On 7-day accounts we pay on receipt of the invoice," said Ron Day, "though there are not so many of those. The monthly accounts may be 28 or 20 days, then there are the 10, 14 and 21 day accounts, the terms of all varying."

Day says his team are happy running the department without the help of the computer. "There are so many different permutations that I don't imagine the software exists that would deal with them," he said.



### **Directors** on the spot

Running the warehouse, dealing with the staff, and observing the nature of the business from the inside, Tony and Barrie Gold have watched the growth of the company from its tiny beginnings. Through the crisis days when margins were mean to now, when the company has expanded more than ever could have been envisaged.

As wholesalers take a slightly larger share of the record business, Tony has noticed the companies' attitudes changing. From the music-on-video point of view, he has welcomed the encouragement and

support of the big distributors.

"Business is expanding, though there are probably about 1,000 fewer outlets than a year ago. Those remaining are doing better business, and the whole retail area has become more professional." The wellknown resistance of rental shops to video as a sales item, based on dealers' fears that anybody will be able to sell videos, prompts Tony to remark that S. Gold and Sons started life selling sweets and tobacco.

Tony would like to see the rental shops pushing special interest programmes more — one of the company's growth areas, with a stock of about 2,500 "It would be a shame if this market was taken away from video or music shops and the business going

to, say, bookshops.

The importance of S. Gold and Sons in the video market is reflected in its 12.5 per cent share of the UK business, their proportion in the record market naturally being smaller, though increasing. Tony puts the expansion of the company down to stock and service.

"We carry 43,000 items on the computer," he said. "They are catalogued by artist, title and number so are easily found. And we deliver next day, including Saturdays.

The company also offers a dealer insurance scheme, which involves immediate replacement of stock lost by fire or theft on production of dealer invoices. The scheme is run by Golds and brokers Clegg Gifford of Ilford, Essex and is available to non-account holders as well, provided that the replacement stock comes from Golds.





# **PROMOTION** IS THE NAME OF THE GAME

As with any other business, it is essential that stock be promoted, marketed and sold. To this end S. Gold and Sons have a large sales force, equivalent to that of many smaller record companies, with more than 20 sales people and the tele-sales team working under the

auspices of Konnekt. (see separate story).

Bert Hamilton joined S. Gold and Sons in 1980, eventually becoming sales director. After a short period as a consultant, he has returned temporarily as sales manager, filling the gap at the busiest time of the year until a permanent sales manager has been appointed. Bert's area of operation is video, and the field reps, though not involved in hard sell, continually promote music-on-video. "They are all experienced reps and very keen to promote this area of the business," said Bert.

Field sales manager is Terry Ellacott, who keeps the reps up to date with information and whatever merchandising is available, plus catalogues, the sales people's computer records and copies of their customers' orders — everything they need to administer their areas. Product is supplied on a weekly basis, and the reps call on most customers fortnightly. Record and tapes can go on the same orders, a boon for small

At the time of going to press, it was a little early to say what's going to be the hot Christmas music video title. Terry was moving out some interesting new product — Jermaine Jackson, Carmen, the Talking Heads movie "Stop Making Sense", the Violent Femmes Now Let's Start Over, and was waiting for the Marc Bolan programme.


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


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

company contracted to handle S. Gold and Sons' phone sales business, and was set up by David Gornall, who originally arrived as the Philips man responsible for V2000. His company's services have expanded to include the operation of the Philips Dealer Development Programme.

Barry Daniels is Konnekt's manager. Eight telesales people are employed, making lots of call-outs each morning, leaving the lines clear for incoming orders in the afternoons.

"There isn't a moment when a phone isn't ringing," said Daniels. "With our computer system, orders can be keyed straight into one of the eight terminals here and the order printed out in despatch. If the customer rings later with additional titles, it's quite likely his first order is already on its way out of the

building."

The Dealer Development Programme, which involves VHS hardware wholesaling, is a new departure for Golds. "The VCRs are strictly marketed to non-hardware dealers only," explained Daniels. Orders are serviced overnight by express delivery carrier, and most buyers at this stage are video libraries. Service contracts are arranged with a nationwide company. "It is still a pilot scheme," said Daniels, "and will be reviewed in the New Year.

As part of the Philips V2000 Dealer Association, which decides on product for release on the format, Konnekt also packages the chosen titles — between 8 and 10 per month, on behalf of Philips. "Only top titles are chosen," added Daniels. Daniels feels that Laserdisc sales will improve soon, particularly as buffs have become used to the quality of sound on CD, and will want the equivalent sound and visual quality of Laser Vision.



'Palace-Virgin-Gold is the best indie in the business," stated Barrie Gold. Though based in the Flempton Road premises, PVG is a totally independent company.

'They sell to S. Gold and Sons in the same way as they sell to any customer," explained Barrie. "We don't steal a march on our competitors."

PVG is the only real threat to the major distributors, Barrie continued. "It's been phenomenally successful, with its first titles massive hits — Merry Christmas Mr. Lawrence, with Bowie, and of course Michael Jackson's Thriller.''

Michael Jackson's Thriller."

Now two years old, PVG originally only handled Palace and Virgin titles for sales and distribution, but has since added several other labels. The company has its own small tele-sales and field staff for both retail and wholesale outlets, and shares Gold's computer and despatch facilities, plus accounting. Directors are Tony and Barrie Gold, Nick Powell and Robert Jones (Palace) and Michael Watts and Robert Devereaux (Virgin).

# **International Outlook**

Exports account for 12 to 15 per cent of Gold's video business, many thousands of pounds worth of products each week. Titles go all over the globe and are of course predominantly films. But buyers, particularly in Europe, are showing increasing interest in music-onvideo titles.

"Any programme with international appeal is going to do well," said export manager Paul Wooding, four years with the company. "Music, obviously, has no language barriers and the same applies to cartoons.

International customers often call in and buy products at the cash and carry desk — records and tapes, as well as video. But obviously the main business is air-freight or air-mail of products, and here Golds have developed an extremely quick ordering system.

Wooding can telex new release information to about 80 per cent of customers; others receive the weekly Top 50. On any normal Monday, the orders have come back in as a result of Friday's telexing session, keeping turnover brisk.

S. Gold and Sons' export reputation has grown purely by word of mouth, said Wooding. Part of their policy is no "adult" products, and individual categories are carefully promoted.





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



SUZANNE VEGA is destined to be defined as student music be-cause of her folky simplicity and disregard for fashion. But seeing as this will place her among the likes of Prefab Sprout and Lloyd Cole, her record company A&M shouldn't be too worried.

Taking the stage at a packed but intimate LSE to an ovation, the earnest New Yorker was immediately at ease and kicked the evening off with the unaccompanied Times Diner, a brave choice for an opener.

Sensing a kindred spirit, the student audience hung on Suzan-

ne Vega's every word as she let them get to know her through her candid lyrics and surprisingly forthcoming revelations between

songs.

As to the music, it's pure Sixties though her backing band do'tend towards a Seventies hipeasy-listening Tom Scott-style when given too much of an upper hand. To say that Vega sounds like Joni Mitchell is a crude simplification but an understradable plification but an understandable one given the paucity of female (or male for that matter) artists willing and able to ally personal lyrics to tuneful, tender ballads. The overall feeling is definitely folky, but in today's eclectic climate, that's not going to put anyone off.
While Londoners will probably

get the chance to savour this per-formance again (it was taped by Radio London), nationwide the word is spreading via plenty of media coverage and her new LP and the single from it, Marlene On The Wall.

At her next UK concert, the au-dience will know all the words. Vega's star is rising.



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



SO, the UK has a new dance music weekly magazine, The Street Scene. We'll have to see how it settles down, but to judge from the first issue it doesn't do much more than can be found elsewhere, despite all its advance ballyhoo the influences on its layout and content are easy to spot!

ASCAP chose former pro footballer Mike Reid as its top writer, while To All the Girls I've Loved Before, written by Hal David and Albert Hammond, was tabbed top song.
