RECORD COMPANIES are getting a pat on the back for providing the kind of quality product that has helped Our Price shops to increase sales by almost one-fifth in a year. On a like-for-like basis, the individual stores' sales went up by 19.5 per cent in the last half of 1988 compared with the same period in 1987, according to the interim results from parent com-

Smiths managing director Mol-colm Field says contributory factors in the increase for Our Price and the allied success of the Smiths instore record departments include the strength of the video market and the fact that "music product has been very good". Asked whether Our Price's advances have taken anything away from the Smiths record depart-ments, chairman Sir Simon Hornby argues that the two sets of outlets are now appealing to substantially different groups of record buyers. Because of Smiths' move away from vinyl to concentrate on videos, cassettes and compact discs, Sir Simon contends that the two chains' coverage of the music

two chains' coverage of the music market is complementary. He adds that the Smiths depart-ments' results were "up very strongly" in the second half of last

Gallup stands firm in face of Scots criticism

GALLUP IS responding strongly to criticism of the UK chart by the Scottish record industry and sug-gests the issues raised are for the whole music industry to decide. The Scottish Record Industry Association claims that in many cases the UK chart was unrepresentative as far as sales in Scotland are con-

cerned.
It also says it is planning to set up its own Scottish chart because of its dissatisfaction with the UK chart compiled by Gallup.
But Gallup's reply denies the ac-

cusations: "We totally reject the sentative. It makes no difference if a record sells 30,000 copies in one a record sells 30,000 copies in one region or 30,000 copies spread over all regions — it would have the same chart position," says chart manager John Pinder.
"The Running album quoted by the SRIA charted at number 61, on

its week of release just before Christmas. However, there were 2m albums sold in the UK in that more copies than Runria.

"Gallup produces weekly UK sales charts and with Scotland representing under 10 per cent of the UK market it is inevitable that some local fovourites are autsold by reconstitutions." lacal favourites are outsold by rec-ords with a broader regional ap-peal. The issue of regional charts is one for the industry to decide. Uninformed criticism of Gallup's methodology does not confront this issue. We shall be contacting the SRIA to explain this methodol-ogy and to discuss the chart sys-tem."



The release of Climt Eastwood's Bird biopic of Charlie Parker has meant that the steady stream of Parker reissues has turned into a veritable torrent, but which are the goodies and which are the baddies? Stan Britt casts a Bird's eye

OR EVEN the most avid, collect-it-all fans of Chartie Parker, it is approaching a full-time job these days to keep track of the cornucapio of recordings by the master allo-sax-ophonist, which keep appearing with startling frequency.

CD-ROM: it's touch and go

FEW INNOVATIONS caused such a stir at Midem as Nim-bus's Touch and Buy CD-Rom system which was displayed for the first time with its latest touch-screen facility.




LEADING DISTRIBUTORS %




