Howells, 53, announced Thursday he was to leave and would be selling his 10% stake in PWL Records and his 5% share of PWL International to chairman Pete Waterman. Howells' departure is the second

Burke to guit Bard chair in September Virgin Retail managing director Simon Burke has confirmed he will step down as chairman of retail body Bard after two years in September. Nomination papers for elections at the forthcoming Bard agm, ch is due to be held on September 22, were sent out last week. Burke says he has enjoyed the experience but adds that the additional workload created by the Virgin/Our Price marger has made a second term impractical.

New Heritage minister gets BPI vote The BPI has welcomed last week's appointment of Loughborough MP Steven Dorrell to the post of National Heritage secretary as part of John Major's Cabinet reshuffle. Replacing Peter Brooke, who held the post from September 1992, Dorrell, 42, is "a rising politician", according to BPI director general John Deacon. "Peter Brooke did a very good job but we knew he was around for a limited period," says Deacon. "It's good to have a young man in the post, and we have already arranged to meet him to discuss industry matters." Meanwhile, UK copyright issues will now be handled by Esher MP Ian Taylor, who has replaced Patrick McGlaughlin as parliamentary under-secretary for trade and technology at the Department of Trade.

Alliance Corp close to buying Castle US media group Alliance Entertainment Corp is

understood to be close to completing the acquisition of Castle Communications. Last week Castle's share value remained high at 325p, after Castle admitted it was engaged in talks which could result in a takeover. Alliance has recently undergone financial restructuring. Alongside film sales and video interests it also owns two North American audio wholesalers.

Emap Trans World bid: ruling due soon Emap should know by the end of this week if its planned takeover of Trans World Communications will be permitted under the terms of the Broadcasting Act. The Guardian Media Group which owns a 20% stake in Trans World has challenged the Radio Authority's decision to allow the deal and a judicial review begins on Wednesday (July 27). Emap has admitted the deal may have to be scrapped if Mr Justice Latham rules in favour of The Guardian. Trans World is also against the takeover claiming the Emap offer undervalues the company

MusicLink dealt blow by supplier

MusicLink has been forced to fold its direct sales service after distributor EUK cancelled a supply agreement between the two comna

MusicLink, which offered consumers CD and cassette albums over the telephone at High Street prices to be delivered within three working days, closed the service following the EUK decision

Kingfisher-ov ened EUK agreed to supply MusicLink when it was launched last September but ended the agreement in March after only 2,000 albums were sold in six months

MusicLink had forecast sales of 100,000 albums in the first year, but that the company's actual turnover proved "economically unviable

MusicLink founder Ali Irvani disputes the figures. He says sales were ower than expected, but that was only because the company had not begun a substantial promotional campaign. "We had not turned on the taps yet as far as marketing was concerned. We wanted to get the service right first," he says. Irvani says EUK's decision to termi

ny in which he says £1m had been invested, can no longer operate. He says his lawyers are considering seeking compensation based on business proj tions for the next five years. He also alleges EUK went back on an agreement to provide nine months' termination notice

But Kingfisher says only an informal agreement existed between the two companies. The spokeswoman says nine months' notice was never agreed, although EUK did extend the notice period offered from three to four months when asked by MusicLink.

Smiths secures exclusive titles

WH Smith is focusing on exclusive ranges with EMI Classics, BBC Enterprises and Pickwick as the main thrust of its pre-Christmas activity

The retailer is launching 20 newly-packaged classical titles with EMI, ranging from popular classics by Verdi, Mozart and Beethoven to opera and ballet collections, with a CD price of £7.99 and cassettes £4.99. Doublepacks of Pickwick's Disney spoken word titles The Jungle Book, Aladdin and Snow White will also be stocked exclusively by WH Smith. retailing at £14.99.

And a re-packaged range of spoken word comedy classics has been produced with the BBC. The titles which include three £16.99 double-tape packs of episodes from Round The Horne, Hancock's Hali Hour and The Goon Show, will be promoted from October. The retailer is also planning significant instore promotions for the autumn's biggest rock and pop releases, which include titles from Madonna, REM and Eric Clapton among others.

The release of Disney's Aladdin will be the centrepiece of the chain's video promotion this autumn, but Smiths has yet to reveal what price it will carry. The retailer will also feature in its Christmas can paign children's titles such as Tales From Hans Christian Andersen, the BBC's Civilisation, Royal Ballet's Swan Lake and sports titles Man-chester United: Champions 2 and MCC Masterclass.



Pickwick is launching its Bananas In Pyjamas series of children's releases with a roadshow starting in Minehead next month. The midprice specialist releases an album based on the stars of the popular Australian children's TV series on August 1, followed by a single and video on August 22. The releases will be promoted by a roadshow in 10 sites, featuring appearances by the banana characters alongside teen bands Let Loose, 2wo Thirds, Get Ready, PJ & Duncan and Luciana. The first date of the tour is being held at Minehead's Butlins on August 2.

sales leapt 28% to 26.8% compared with the previous quarter, while PolyGram slipped 5% to 36.1%. As a result, the company's mid-price share dipped from 16.7% in the first quarter to 10% Meanwhile, Naxos remains dominant

in the budget sector, with 10.7% of the cal album market by volume. almost the same as in the previous quarter. PolyGram remained top distributor on 31.9%, down from 38% in the previous quarter.

Golden Mile tape pirates to feel heat

The BPI is planning a summer offensive to rid Blackpool's Golden Mile of pirate tape sellers.

Despite the success of last year's raid on the resort's seafront, the BPI's Anti-Piracy Unit says the pirates have arned in force APU head Tim Dabin says he is

preparing another raid. "Although [the level of piracy sales] is not as bad as last year, Blackpool does seem to be orse than other resorts," he says.

Meanwhile, the unit says its new get-tough policy on CD bootleg traders operating at record fairs has received an encouraging response from the pub lic and retailers. "We have gathered quite a lot of information as a result of the [Music Weck] story and we are now monitoring the situation before deciding our next move," says Dabin. Midem cuts rates to lure new faces

The Midem Organisation is overhauling its pricing structure in a bid to attract smaller companies to the annual south of France music conference.

The event's £1,000 single company registration fee – which allows up to three full-time employees to attend – is being replaced by a per-person charge of £390 (FF3.300) starting with next year's event which takes place in Cannes from January 30 to February 3.

Midem managing director Peter Rhodes says he has been negotiating with the IPA, BMI and the BPI for the last year to find a way to attract more small companies.

He says, "The organisations pointed out how expensive it was for some companies to attend. We want to encourage new people too."

Midem has also cut the cost of stands by more than 7% from around 24,100 (FF34,400) to £3,800 (FF32,200) for the smallest 4m x 3.3m unit and it will allow four free registrations per stand with a supplementary rate of £150 (FF1,250) for each extra person.

British hopefuls Dasis (pictured), Galliano and Echobelly were among the highlights of last week's New Music Seminar in New York, Dasis whose debut album Definitely Maybe is released by Creation on August 39 - packed out New York's Wetlands Arena on Thursday, on the same evening that Galliano headlined a Talkin' Loud party at the Supper Club which also featured performances by Marxman and Urban Species. Fauve's Echobelly kicked the conference off with a show at the Webster Hall on Tuesday, Late registrations boosted the UK turnout to match last year's figure of around 180. Delegates were predominately from A&R and the media. Keynote speaker Danny Goldberg, the president of Atlantic Records and former manager of Nirvana. made an impassioned plea for the industry to speak out against prejudice. Referring to the example set by Nirvana's late frontman Kurt Cobain, he said, "The issue of free speech and bigotry is of importance to everybody in the

Black Music Industry Development Agency Fixed Term Funding Agreement

The London Arts Board is offering a 19 month fixed term contract from September 1994 to March 1996 to undertake London-based development work for the black music industry in specified areas of training, advice/information and advocacy.

The fee will be up to £2,600 per month and it will be expected that the successful applicant will have the ability to substantially increase this funding base through applications to other grant giving bodies.

Don't shoot me, I'm only the manager!

Following George Michael's submission to the Abolition of Slavery Board, I would like to put forward a case for a much deserving section of the community who have for so long suffered so much for so

few – namely the artists' managers.

As a member of the IMF and previously the manager of X-Ray Spex, Adam And The Ants, Classic Nouveau, Amazulu, Danielle Dax and Trance Dance, I have been privileged to work with a few interesting, telented and exceptional artists. If asked, I would

have to say it's not easy.

I'm the first to acknowledge that managers tend to fall into two cate-

gories: selfless social workers or cynical greedy bastards. But if they are doing their job, they soon find themselves enslaved by the two masters of the universe – the rock of artistic obsession and

the hard place of commercial reality.

In George's case the status que was upheld once again by the judge, who described Rob Kahane as a "thoroughly unreliable and untrustworthy witness", whereas George was considered to be candid and honest and Sony was considered also to be above reproach. If in

doubt shoot the manager!

But Rob was obviously a man with an impossible job. He had to show total

commitment to his artist in his hour of distress — while dealing with personal anxieties as to where the next advance was coming from, and the prospects for his own career within the industry.

his own career within the industry.
As we all know a management contract carries very little security for the
manager — he is always disposable.

Music's speed of turnover — which makes most other fast-moving consumer goods look positively slow — creates its own particular pressures. The need to stock in depth and across different formats means retail suppliers must come up with imaginative solutions.

For the chains, providing their own unique shopping experiences is important. At HMV, for example, the emphasis

is very much on an upmarket environment that serves the dedicated music shopper, with, investment being made in an in-store database which enables customers to access information on artists, back catalogue and merchandise. At Virgin Retail much thought has been given to creating synergy between different product areas. Independents, like reggae specialist Dub Vendor, concentrate on creating an intimate atmosphere with in-store sound systems.

Shopfitting specialists are winning business and keeping customers by providing flexible systems which are visually exciting, show a high density of product and are guaranteed not to fall apart when in-store traffic gets heavy.

SETTING STORE BY THE RIGHT DESIGN

TO SUPPLY THE RIGHT RACKING FOR INCREASINGLY SALUBRIOUS STORES IS THE BRIEF THAT CONFRONTS SHOPFITTERS.

Now a host of specialists are providing solutions for such exacting demands. Ronnie Dungan reports

browsers.

Suppliers recognise that retailers can struggle to accommodate a variety of formats to their best advantage. One solution is free-standing racks which can be shuffled according to needs, and display a variety of different casings.

recently refitted many of Virgin Retail's European stores and is now marketing a new, freestanding, fully adjustable racking system, designed for quick assembly and flexibility.

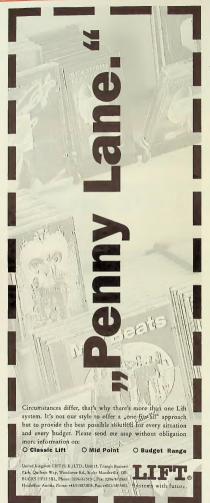

director Robert Walker. "But on this project we produced all the woodwork as well and supplied and fitted it. We keep the layout on our CAD [Computer Aided Design] system so our customers can change anything they want to, and we're quite happy to help them plan and get the best use out of the system."

Walker stresses that the benefits to Harrods of choosing a modular system is its flexibility.

"The cherry-stained vencer on the racks with complementary coloured metal creates a soft, warm and inviting image, appropriate to the store's upmarket ambience," he adds.

Meanwhile, the market leader, Lift UK, continues to develop new lines to complement its existing systems. The latest products include the Counter System, with modular components that can be adapted to a circular or rectangular shape, New Shop Line, which can accommodate videos, game books and accessories, and Slat Wall which can hold a high density of different products, "We recognise that entertainment retailing is becoming more diverse," says managing director Robert Walker. "We're using our high-tech manufacturing facilities to introduce fresh and innovative ranges to sit alongside our core range of music and video products. We're aiming to provide a bigger, better and faster service

While most shops rely on their in-store sound systems to produce ambience, listening posts are increasingly being recognised as an important addition to the armoury. With costs starting at around £300 for a post, they are clearly an investment that even small independents can afford to consider

Listening post manufacturers are using imaginative marketing tactics to get more posts into the stores. Mekon, for example, recently experimented with a scheme in association with companies such as Chrysalis, BMG and PolyGram. The posts were installed at no cost to the retailers while the record companies were charged to have releases played on them. Now this has been superseded by an exclusive deal with PolyGram, in which Mekon has installed 150 of its new posts into its origina network of stores, all dedicated to PolyGram releases

The posts hold 12 discs with two players and sets of headphones and are updated by

PolyGram every week. There is also the opportunity for third parties to sponsor the posts and have them positioned in other locations, such as student unions. Money-off vouchers for the featured artists are racked close

For stores which want to adhere to the tried-and-tested concept of sampling records in store, Lift has produced a Multi-Play Listening Station which enables the customer to listen to the CD of his or her choice With video becoming an increasingly important line, Oxford-based Electron has a range of video viewing posts it is marketing aggressively. The nosts feature LCD screens with sound transmitted through individual sets of headphones With three or four screens, the posts can be used to simultaneously feature a relection of films from a particular actor or direc any given theme. Virgin Retail has recently taken these posts on board and says the response of its

customers has been favourable. While retailers continually address new ways to maximise profitability, they are equally keen to find ways of minimising loss through theft. According to a survey sponsored by security specialist Sensormatic, shrinkage costs music retailers more than £90m every year and there is ongoing debate about the most viable and out-effective systems.

Sensormatic believes electronic article surveillance (EAS) is currently the most effective pilfering prevention option and is pushing its Ultramax as the state-of-the-art system.

EAS works by using a small adhesive electronic tag disguised as a bar code which is discreet enough to avoid spoiling the look of the packaging. This is removed, or deactivated, by the cashier when the sale is made.

Manufacturer Knogo also offers a number of security solutions, tailored to individual stores, including its Micro Magnotic tagging system which can be installed for a few pence per tag, although it involves substantial investment in the detectors at the door.

For those retailers which find many of their inlay cards mysteriously disappearing, TND Marketing's Kwik Case system also protects the product by sealing it in an electronically tagged plastic case on the shelf, which can then be removed at the counter when the purchase is made. The system also prevents CD, caseste and video cases being damaged on display and, unlike some forms of tagging, the security case can be used more security case can be used more security case can be used more displayed.

Most retailers agree that tagging at source would be the most efficient method of beating the thieves but as this requires co-operation from manufacturers and record companies, it seems some way off.

Inevitably retailers remain more worried about who is coming in through the door than who is going out. In the Nineties, specialist suppliers recognise that the priority for chains and independents is to sustain a trading identity which keeps their in-store environments spotner than the conformation of their target markets.

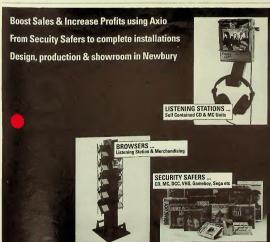

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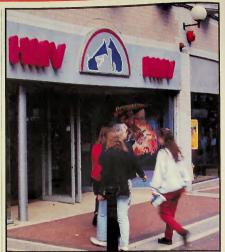

"If HMV sees a particular title doing well it can order more and pass the information on to its other stores as well. It means it has a more accurate idea of everything that is selling," says

"Environment is vitally important to us," asserts Dave Alder, head of marketing. Over the past four years the company has increased the space it devotes to other areas of entertainment alongside its core music product

The most recent design change is in the video section with the incorporation of a number of Video Dromes, self-contained video departments. The design has been changed so that the sections now look different from the rest of the store

"It's important that we position ourselves as a specialist in those areas. Otherwise we can be seen to be relegating the product as less important," says

Listening posts still remain of utmost importance to the retailer which was the first to introduce them more than five years ago Each store has an average of 25 posts, and the Oxford Street store now has 60, used mostly to promote product that does not get vast amounts of airplay

Alder breaks down Virgin's product commitment as being 60% music, 20% video and 20%

The important thing with all Virgin stores is that they have to be seen to be part of the Virgin

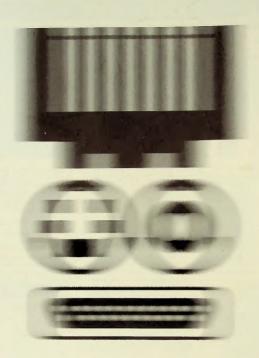
