End in sight for Monday blues

Pinnacle, EMI and Sony have become the first distributors to offer UK retailers regular Friday delivery of new releases.

Pinnacle will begin shipping product to all retailers on a Friday starting on February 17, for releases due on sale on the following Monday (20). Sony and EMI plan to follow a fortnight later.

Pinnacle managing director Tony Powell says, "This has been on the BPI/Bard agenda for years but we felt last year that the initiative wasn't going anywhere. We at Pinnacle decided we wanted to be the first to do it."

Sony's sales director John Aston says it has been considering the option for a year, and will make its first early deliveries on March 3. "This is a very positive move for retail," he says. "Retailers will be able to open at 8am if they want." EMI director of distribution Shaun Plunkett adds, "We've been aware that the industry was keen to make the move, and we've had a positive reaction from the trade." The company is hoping to begin on March 3 or 4.

All three are imposing strict terms and conditions and warning retailers that the facility will be withdrawn from dealers who break the embargo. All early delivery boxes will be clearly marked with the release date.

Bard chairman Charlie McAuley, who made earlier deliveries one of his main aims when he was elected in September, welcomes the move. "Bard is delighted that distributors are listoning and responding to the needs of retailers. We hope that other record companies will follow their initiative", he says. But he urges retailers to respect the sales embargo of releases. HMV managing director Brian McLaughin, who is chairman of the Bard/BPI liaison committee, says, "Common sense has at last prevailed. I think this is one of the best decisions taken by the industry for years."

The move is welcomed by indie shops in particular. "It's a cracking idea," says Soho Selectadisc's manager Tracie Pretten. "Now we'll have the releases on the shelves a good two hours earlier than we usually would."

The move follows a test conducted by Warner Music in September with its Three Tenors release. Warner director of operations Gween Pearce says, "We are still not convinced we can rely on retailers not to sell product early. As soon as we can work out a system to get round the problem, we'll reconsider it."



Network Chart overtakes BBC

mark in its history last week when ratings for its Network Chart Show overtook the BBC's official Top 40 show for the first time.

The Network Chart Show, which is broadcast across 63 commercial stations in the UK, scored a 3.74m audience compared with Radio One's 3.89m in Rajar's fourth quarter figures. The chart show now has a 1.5⁵ larger audience than Radio One, despite having a 6% smaller transmission area.

The Association of Independent Radio Contractors predicted the network show would overtake the BC's when it was revamped 18 months ago, says AIRC director Brian West. "We saw the figures moving that way in the previous quarter, but we didn't know whether we would manage to push head this time. It's a tribute to the producers Unique Broadcasting and the presenter Neil Fox."

Chart formats cut back again


The BPI has reached agreement with retail body Bard to reduce the number of formats qualifying for the chart from four to three.

The accord, which comes into effect from Sunday, April 2, follows nine months of negotiations botween the two sides. Leading BPI figures first voiced support for such a scheme last June.

It is the first change in format rules since the upper limit was reduced from five to four in June 1991. Labels will not be barred from releasing multiple formats, but must identify which three formats will count for the chart. Bard chairman and Woolworths' trading controller for entertainment Charlie McAuley acknowledges that the format mast likely to lose out is with future technology in mind. "Vinyl is a niche market," he says. "They are to be a progressive-thinking body, then we must embrane new technologies."

CIN charts director Catharine Pusey says smaller companies will be able to concentrate their efforts on new technologies such as CD-Rom. She adds, "Record companies sometimes feel they are forced to issue a fourth format, which is not necessarily cost effective." Sony Music chairman Paul Burger, a long-time supporter of the move to fower formats, says the agreement can only be good news. "[Labels'] marketing activity will support the song rather than supporting the multiple format," he says.

CIN figures for 1994 show record companies are increasingly releasing singles on only three formats. CIN data for 1994 shows 13 singles out of the Top 60 were issued on three formats including the year's fifth biggest seller All-4 One's I Sware. Last week's Top 75 chart included 22 titles on three formats and six on just two formats.

R1 claims ad push is not panic move

Radio One has denied that its decision to appoint a new advertising agency is a reaction to shrinking andience figures

A reported £2m has been set aside for a mixed marketing push in the spring by the Chiat Day agency. Its brief is to update the public's perceptions of the beleaguered pop station and show the "quality of Radio One is better than people think", according to account director Charlotte Zamboni .

Radio One marketing manager Sophie McLaughlin refused to comment on the ad budget speculation. She denies that the campaign is in response to the BBC flagship's poor recent performance. A further 190,000 listeners were lost in the final quarter of 1994, leaving it with 11.0m listeners - 4.8m less than at the end of 1993 (see page 8).

But she says, "The difficulties Radio One had makes it more important to get out there and shout about what we are doing."

The other marketing challenge for the agency to address in the campaign is Radio One's broad audience, McLaughlin says. "We are not demographically driven in the traditional sense, which makes things more complicated."

Zamboni says it is too early to discuss the exact mix of media for the Chiat Day campaign, but it will be led by press ads and posters and the use of cine-ma has not be ruled out. "The perceptions of Radio One are lagging behind the reality. We are going to show how good it is," she says.



The Who's Live At Leeds album is being re-released by Polydor on February 20 to mark the 25th anniversary of the group's most famous gig. The re-mixed, re-mastered and re-packaged release features eight tracks not included on the original Track album which George McManus marketing executive at Polydor, describes as "one of the most revered albums of all times". In addition to original memorabilia such as a rejection letter from EMI, the reissue will include sleevenotes and photos taken by Chris McCourt on the night of the set at Leeds University

OTP revamp applauded

TV pluggers have given the thumbs up to the revamped Top Of The Pops, which was launched last week with exclusive live performances from Annie Lennox and REM.

The 31-year-old BBC1 show's new look, comprising new titles, set and a theme composed by Brasure's Vince Clarke, was unveiled on Thursday's show, which was hosted by Kylie Minogue.

Pluggers have welcomed the changes which they say have updated the show without losing any of its identity. "It is still recognisable as TOTP, but it now looks like a glitzy 1995 chart show," says Double Impact's Phil Smith.

EMI splits with Dome

EMI Records has ended its three-year relationship with Peter Rohinson's Dome Records by mutual agreement. Robinson, a former head of A&B at Chrysalis and RCA, has bought EMI out of the 50/50 joint venture company. He is now seeking new marketing and distribution arrangements and intends to reposition Dome as an B&B label. The next release by the label was due to be Beverley Knight's Flavour Of The Old School, which Robinson still intends to issue shortly. Other artists signed to the label include Rio & Mars and Sinclair.

Dance album disqualified

The vinyl version of Network's dance compilation No Repetitive Beats has been disgualified from the chart because the triple pack includes a free DJ mix CD. CIN charts director Catharine Pusey says the album would only have been admissible if the extra music had been on vinyl as it would have constituted part of the whole album. The Birmingham-based dance label says: "We are outraged at the decision."

Boyzone faces battle over name

Polydor's successful Irish teen group Boyzone are being challenged to change their name by an existing band of the same name. The London-based Boyzone, who are registered on the National Band Register database, were signed to PolyGram France in the late Eighties. They released two singles on Polydor's sister label Phonogram in 1987 and 1988 but are currently unsigned and claim they will be unable to get a deal unless Polydor's act changes its name, Polydor's head of legal and business affairs Darrel Franklin says, "We're investigating the allegation."

Virgin expands Oxford St Megastore

Virgin Retail is opening its new 14,000 sg ft rock and pop department on the first floor of its flagship menastore in London's Oxford Street on February 28. It will stock more than 22,000 CDs and cassettes and contain 46 listening posts.

Coleman moves up at Sony

Sony has promoted Sylvia Coleman, one of the negotiating team which signed the Rolling Stones and George Michael, to the new position of vice president, business affairs, reporting directly to Sony Music Entertainment Europe president Paul Russell.

Viacom reconsiders Famous sale

Viacom is understood to have taken Famous Music, the music publishing wing of Paramount Pictures, off the market, Famous Music president Ira Jaffe says Viacon has been "reconsidering its position and probably won't sell it". A \$200m bidding war was sparked when Viacom suggested it would put the company up for sale after acquiring its parent company Paramount last summer, incurring debts of \$450m.

HO earns recognition for quality

Birmingham-based retailer HQ has received the Guild of Master Craftsmen's certificate for quality and service. HQ shop manager Bryan Taylor, who believes he is the first record retailer to earn the plaudit, applied to join the guild when it widened its scope of membership to include service industries.

Kennedy Street wins Wembley award Kennedy Street Enterprises has pipped Phil McIntyre Promotions to win Wembley Arena's promoter of the year award for the first time. The Manchester-based agency put on 19 concerts in 1994 including Take That. Barry Manilow and Meat Loaf. Phil McIntyre's 18 shows featured Wet Wet, Dina Carroll and former Olympic skaters Torvill & Dean who sold out 14 performances. Cliff Richard's 10-night stand secured third placing for the Mel Bush Organisation. Harvey Goldsmith and Marshall Arts tied for the fourth position.

Midem: younger and better

From the armies of landoos parading La Croisette to the industrial-strength carget protecting the shagpile in the Martinez bar, Midem doesn't change much. Or it least it doesn't usually.

This year, the Cannes industry-fest felt decidedly rejuvenated, with just about everything, even (arguably) boozing taking second place to business - and lots of it. Rejuvenated, too, in terms of the age of those milling pround the Palaie

Midem is no longer the preserve of the old-school lawyer and accountant. A hipper and more dynamic Midem emerged in '95, with as much talk generated by gay techno restaurant Barbarella's as snobs' paradise the Moulin De Mougins.

Not all this can be attributed to the British At Midem stand, but the initiative has more than proved its worth. drawing in small companies who couldn't afford to attend under their own steam, and providing a focal point for everyone from the UK in Cannes. Now there's talk it may not happen at all next year - and

that would be a tragedy.

At long last - early deliveries

Back home three of the UK's distributors have been honing the details of a scheme which is long-overdue At last retailers can be confident of having key records on sale the day they are released, or at least if they are are distributed by Pinnacle, FMI or Sony Independent retailers in particular will welcome the breakthrough. Warner's caution is understandable after the hiccups with the Three Tenors album, but no doubt it - along with BMG and PolyGram - will follow when retailers ave calmed fears about broken embargoes. HMV managing director Brian McLaughlin calls it one of the best decisions taken by the music industry for years. It's certainly going to make life easier for hundreds of retailers. Selina Wahh

Time to revitalise January It's all quiet on the retail front - again.

It was certainly back to earth with a bump for most retailers during the first month of 1995. Despite massive sales in December the dreadful weather and lack of new product plunged most music retailers back into the doldrums in January

It wouldn't take a lot to kick start January, so maybe next year a resourceful marketing department will unleash a top album or TV-advertise a major artist in the first 10 days of the new year and clean up.

Returning to returns policies

Considering that it started as a bit of fun, last month's Ton Five Indie Laments Chart suddenly seems to have taken on a life of its own. It certainly seems to have struck a chord with many retailers who faxed or phoned with suggestions for the next chart - so please keep the suggestions rolling in.

The major concern seems to be the returns policies (or lack of them) of some of the major distributors

PolyGram came in for more criticism than all the others combined. Its slow sale-or-return authorisation system and its privilege returns statements attracted numerous sarcastic comments. PolyGram is happy to take one combined order and accept one single cheque for all its different labels' product but cannot devise a simple scheme for privilege returns.

If the powers that be at PolyGram wish to duck the issue so be it - but how would it treat a dealer who paid his monthly account but refused to pay for, say, the Island and London product he received. It wouldn't just stop supplying Island and London product - would it? Still, at least we have had some good news this week with the positive developments concerning formats and deliveries - two other leading indie concerns. Paul Quirk's column is a personal view

The indie distributor, which was formed from the marger of APT and Revolver two years ago, revealed details of the move at last week's Midem

It will open the new 23,000 so ft centre in Bristol's Barton Hill industrial area in early April, says Vital director Pete Thompson

Thompson says, "We are going to a custom-built warehouse for the first time. This has given us the opportunity to re-evaluate the way we operate as a warehouse. The systems will he improved, the layout will improve, the working conditions will improve." The move, which coincides with the

the company's Portland Square centre close three years after Vital managing director Mike Chadwick moved into the office with Revolver Distribution. The existing warehouse in Dove Lane will be retained as a dedicated bulk and overstocks site, with 10,000 sq ft of space.

Chadwick says the expansion will also enable Vital to maximise its European operations. Belgian-owned Play It Again Sam, which holds a 50% e in the company - the other 50% is held by Revolver Distribution founder Mike Chadwick - has distribution net works in Benelux and France and is currently expanding sales operations at its new German office

The company's London office is also planning to move from Acton to the

The moves follow a year in which the mpany handled the year's biggest selling independent album, Creation's Oasis release Definitely Maybe. The company also has a busy two months ahead with encorly swaited albums by Sleeper (February 13), Elastica (March 13) and Gene (March 20). Other new material is due in 1995 from the James Taylor Quartet, Salad, Mother Earth and The Young Gods.

The company has also won back its istribution deal for indie label Too Pure 18 months after it moved to RTM. and is now distributing PolyGramlinked labels including A&M's Paradox and Island's Mango (excluding Chaka Demus & Plices), Blunted Vinyl, Axiom and Island Red imprints.

MCI targets musicals

Music Collection International is launching a new low-price label. Showtime, devoted to stage musical recordings.

The company has struck a deal with John Yan's That's Entertainment Records for a catalogue of 100 studio recordings.

The range, which will launch with 20 titles on March 13, will com prise packages of highlights from musicals including Oliver! starring Jonathan Pryce, The Mikado featuring Lesley Garrett and Eric Idle, **Camelot** featuring Richard Harris

and Godspell which stars Darren Day and John Barrowman.

The albums, which have previ-ously been available in complete form on full price, will be followed by a further 10 titles in June, 10 more in September and 30 more next year. Dealer price is fixed at £2.76 on CD and £2.21 on cassette.

All of the titles have been reackaged in artwork designed by Dewynters, the design company behind the original West End stage logos for Miss Saigon, Phantom Of The Opera and Les Miscrables.

Edel plans UK office to develop new acts

Hamburg-based independent Edel is establishing a London office as a new A&R source.

Edel is currently looking for a UK label head for the operation, which would complete the company's European network

Helge Trilck, head of Edel's international department, says the company has been waiting for the right time before setting up office in the UK. "It is so important," he says. "We had to do the right set up and find the right people. The UK was missing, but this finishes our European cov

&R men cheer instant pop hits

It was set up as a showdown - the naff versus the credible - but Midem's Manufacturing The Hits A&R session saw panellists agreeing on the worth of so-called conveyor-belt acts

Far from undermining the credibility of the record industry, producer-led acts were hailed for proving music can cross national boundaries as well as generating instant income to invest in longterm artiste

Dome boss Peter Robinson said dance and pop acts like 2 Unlimited and Cappella can have broader appeal than traditional rock acts. "Dance is really what has broken down the barriers in

terms of exporting music," he said.


And Tony Berk, president of Dino Music in the Netherlands, said, "We are all in this business because we love music, I don't think (manufacturing pop acts) is a crime, it's just very clever. The money you make can enable you to make possibilities for bands with guitars

Sony Soho Square managing diretor Muff Winwood was also enthusiastic out the rise of European pop dance although he admitted he preferred working with genuine live acts.

"Dance has produced some really great stuff, and kicked the whole indus try up the arse, but really it's a 10-minute thrill. When you work with longer term artists, the Sades of the world, the feel and the passion comes through," he said.

Winwood said no threat was posed to the development of rock acts by the advance of Europop and dance, although he warned that European A&R needs to reappraise its approach to the US market.

"A lot of Europeans seem to have forgotten how to deal with the US. Bands like Pearl Jam and Green Day have been working for two or three years, slogging around the road," he said

UK turnout buoys Midem business

British participants declared Midem '95 a roaring success in what was a record year for UK turnout, with the number of companies represented up by 28%.

Some 512 British companies attended – compared with 400 last year – making the UK the best represented country along with the US. By the end of Thursday, 3,360 companies had registered from 79 different countries with 436 taking stands. The UK took most stands, a total of 88.

The huge British turn-out was largely attributed to the success of the British In Midem initiative which brought the BPI, Music Publishers Association, PRS and MCPS together on one stand for the first time. The first British At Midem stand hast year was organised by the BPI alone.

The stand, which allowed 20 companies to attend for the first time, provided an important focal point for all British participants at Midem, says BPI chairman Rupert Perry.

And MPA chairman Andy Heath says the collaboration shows that the record business and publishing industry have buried their past differences.

But despite the success of the British At Midem project, BPI co-ordinator Paul Birch warns it may not happen next year. "The UK has to suffer a rule stopping

our companies from booking space on the stand for more than two years running," he says. "Exhibitors from other countries - such as Canada and Ireland - are allowed to remain on their national stands for as long as they want. If that is their attitude, we've decided that this is the last year for the British At Midem."

Overall, Midem '95 was described as one of the most business-like yet. Nick Titchemer of the Brothers' Organisation describes it as the best for four or five years. Ti was great. We got a lot of things done; he says. M&G Records bess Michael Levy used Midem to showcase acts from his new label, Wired Recordings. "There was a great buzz," he save.

And Pinnacle managing director Tony Powell adds, "We had an enormous amount of inquiries from people from Australia, Canada and South America wanting to know what we could do for them."

French police in swoop on Palais

Distributor Delta Music is considering its legal options after Cannes police raided the company's Midem stand and impounded all copies of its 1995 catalogue.

The police swooped on the stand in a two-hour raid on Wednesday accompanied by a judge from the nearby town of Grasse following a compliant made by EMI France. The label was objecting to the inclusion in a Delta catalogue of an Edith Plaf compilation on the Laserlight label.

But Croydon-based Delta – whose operations include budget jazz and classical imprint Target – stresses that the Piaf collection is not intended for sale in France.

Delta product manager Neil Kellas says, "The irony is that we struck a deal to license this tille in January 1991 with EMI Germany. We don't have any copies here and the catalogue clearly states that the title isn't available for France."

Delta's lawyer, Tony Morris of Marriott Harrison, anys the raid raises serious issues for catalogue distributors and labels. "There are countless tracks at Midem which are unavailable for licensing in France. Does this mean that anybody can make a claim and the police will simply act without investigating the matter property?"

Morris says that Delta's Midem business was affected, and that this might form the basis of any claim. "We are considering our options," he adds.

Ultimate Kaos sign Motown world deal

Polydor teen act Ultimate Kaos have been picked up for international release by Motown Records.

The Steve Jervier-produced group, whose ages range from 11 to 15, came to prominence as support on Take That's UK tour last autumn. Their first two singles reached the Top 20, and Polydor has high hopes for the ballad, Show A Little Love, due in March.

Motown, which has experienced a resurgence in the US over the past two years with Boyz II Men, is now finalising details for releases from Ultimate Kaos in America and other territories. Motown president Jheryl Busby, who

confirmed the signing at Midem last week, was at the trade event to announce the relaunch of offshoot label Tabu Records, which will house the company's international signings.

The first releases on Tabu are from South African reggae superstor Lucky Dube, Nigorian saxophonist Fela Kuti, Hong Kong "Catopop" singer Terry Lin and Dutch R&B quintet Ko-Shaw. Vocalist Alexander O'Neal has also been re-signed to the label.

New MCE link to cover more stores

Music Choice Europe has signed a deal with AEI Rediffusion which makes it the biggest UK supplier for in-store music programming. MCE and AEI are making an undis-

MCE and AEI are making an undisclosed equity swap to become strategic investors in each other's business and create the new jointly-branded service, AEI Music Choice.

"Good news for Radio One," were the first words from BBC Network Radio's head of marketing and publicity Sue Farr at last Monday's meeting.

Although the national pop station has not yet begun to gain listeners, its audience is certainly shrinking at a wer rate after a turbulent 12 months

For the three months from September to December 1994, its audience fell to 11.0m, indicating a loss of just under 200,000 listeners. Such a loss compares with 1.1m, \$76,000 and 1.1m in quarters one, two and three respectively, and appears to correspond with controller Matthew Bannister's prediction that the station's rapid rate of decline would begin to bottom out by the end of 1994.

We believe the figures for the last arter show the stabilisation Matthew Bannister predicted last year," says Farr. "Every BBC station has increased share this quarter in London, showing that powerful brands survive over time

Overall, the corporation still has fower listeners than the commercial radio sector - which overtook it for the first time three months ago and consolidated its lead: up from 27.7m to 28.0m. compared with BBC Radio's 27.8m (up from 27.6m). BBC Radio's gain of 180,000 listeners overall is largely thanks to Radio Five Live's audie growth of 360,000 on the last quarter, which puts it ahead of Atlantic 252. Classic FM and Virgin 1215

Besides the Network Chart Shlandmark breakthrough - overtaking Radio One's ratings for the official Top 40 for the first time - the commercial sector had a relatively quiet quarter compared with its spectacular rise in the rest of 1994

Commercial radio remains short of the 50% threshold, with its share of the market static at 49.0% despite the launch of five new regional stations, including Heart FM in Birmingham, Bristol's Galaxy Bristol's Galaxy Radio, and Manchester's JFM - while the BBC also retained the share it held during the summer, 48.6%

The figures indicate the growth of the nercial sector has lost its moment tum, a fact which the Radio Advertising Bureau's strategic planner Justin Sampson attributes to an unsettled marketplace caused by new launches and changes in format by existing sta-tions. Despite an increase of 268,000 listeners compared with the third quarter of 1994, the market has lost 500,000 since the same period last year.

Indeed, the boom seems to have halted abruptly for the national commercial stations Classic FM and Atlantic 252 which both lost listeners. The biggest loser is Atlantic 252, whose overall audience fell 367,000 to 4.5m after a year of gains, while Classic FM, whose national share rose to 3.2%, saw its audience fall 114,000 to 4.7m. Virgin 1215's audience used by 78,000 to 4.0m.

Although still confident of commorcial radio's continuing success, Sampson warns that listener growth cannot continue at the same rate as over the past two years. Since the third quarter of hours to 14.7 hours.

"There has been an enormous increase in listeners for commercial radio over the past two years but audi ences aren't going to keep on rising forever," Sampson says.



Meanwhile, Bon Jovi's Someday I'll Be Saturday Night gets wide support and is the highest new entry on the chart at number 14. It's particularly popular at Radio 1 where it ranks ninth. Virgin 1215 has stronger support for Bon Jovi playing seven of the group's songs 35 times last week It also adores Sting airing seven of his songs last week to It's interesting to note that the highest placed rock single on the CIN chart. (Greenday's Basket Case at number 14) got a mere seven plays from Virgin, ranking 35th in its chart, while pop band Roxette's Run To You, a small CIN hit which peaked at number 27 several weeks ago and has few rock pretensions nevertheless managed to register 28 plays on Virgin 1215 last week, enough for it to rank equal top of their chart with Annie Lennox's No More I Love You's and Simple Minds' She's A River.

Simple Minds' new album Good News From The Next World also generates support, with Virgin among the stati giving exposure to Night Music, which checks into the Airplay Chart at number 100. As the only album track registering enough support to compete in a chart dominated by singles, it clearly has potential

As one of the most critically acclaimed w bands, Suede still has a problem getting airplay. Their New Generation single debuts at number 40, but no fewer than 24 of its 47 plays come from Radio 1. The much-maligned station continues to offer brave, diverse programming its ommercial competitors can't match, giving substantial support to Belly, Heather Nova, The Tabernacle, EMF. Hootie & The Blowfish, Bad Religion and Weezer to name but a few who are being ignored by almost all other program

Unproven artists with unreleased records bubbling under the Top 50 include Heather Nova (number 59), Lavina Jones (65), The Tabernacle 66), Junior Reid (73) and Jodie (80).

Finally, it's interesting to note that though Paul Young's Grazing In The Grass picked up 211 plays last week, it was ranked 88th because it was played primarily by stations with small audiences. East 17's Be There got a mere eight plays, but ranks only five places lower, both records being exposed to around five and half million pairs of Alan Jones ears last week.


CENTURY FM

Century FM, on air for just 20 weeks and transmitting to a quarter of a million listeners in the North East, has beaten every other new station launched in 1994 with an 11% reach in its 2.2m transmission area, and its listeners tuning in for an average six hours a week each, according to the latest Rajar figures. The station has achieved a 16% reach of its 30-44-year-old target audience, playing a fairly equal mix of usic and speech. Century likes to call itself "Personality Radio", and ex-Radio One veterans Simon Bates and Gary Davies present

a couple of the station's top rated shows. In Century's current top 10 most played tracks, classic artists such as Joe Cocker and Cliff Richard rub shoulders with newer talent like Eternal We play songs that are a bit more melodic: adult contemporary music. It's very soft - no raucous stuff," says Century managing director John Myers. He believes one of the station's strengths is that it plays music throughout the night in contrast to other stations in the area which switch to phone-ins after midnight Catherine Eade







TRISHA YEARWOOD GEORGIA GIRL TUGS AT THE HEARTSTRINGS



When multi-platinum country star Trisha Yearwood recorded XXXs And 000s (An American Girl) for the TV pilot of a US mini-series it was a slightly speculative project outside her album deal.

But just six weeks later, the track ras sitting pretty at number one on the US country chart.

At the time, Yearwood was still centrating on promoting her 1994 album, The Song Remembers When. which had already yielded a number two hit with the title track lead single. But the follow-up only limped to the low twenties and MCA had its head down

The mini-series never came off recalls producer Garth Fundis, "but the oment Scott Borchetta [vice president national promotions, MCA Nashville] and the label heard the rough mixes of XXXs And OOOs they just busted their asses to get it to radio. I think it took

three weeks from final mix to get on the

A simple, powerful paean to "making it through", the song stressed Yearwood's native Georgia-girl phrasing, and tugged firmly at the same middle-American heartstrings that took Dolly Parton's 9-To-5 to the top in the mid-Eighties.

"It felt a little frustrating as well as good," says Fundis. "We got to number ne and the song wasn't even on the album we'd only just released.

This must be the kind of A&R problem that keeps you awake at night when you've had two albums certified platinum, a fistful of number one hits cluding your debut single) and you're in demand to record duets with Don Henley, Aaron Neville and George Jones. Oh, and maybe what to wear on Grammy night (two nominations this vear

But behind the sweet refrain and

catchy melody of XXXs And OOOs are the real secrets of Yearwood's lastin success in a market where beautiful, talented female singers who don't record their own material are playing and singing in a hundred Nashville hars overy night.

That's right where Fundis spotted Yearwood, working as a receptionist at a Nashville independent label by day and on her music at night

Fundis was Don William's long-time producer, and the man behind the desk for all of Keith Whitley's five straight US country number ones, so when he organises a showcase for a new talent the serious Nashville players show up.

MCA signed Yearwood the same night. Six months later, her debut single She's In Love With The Boy hit mber one and the debut album was well on the way to platinu

"She doesn't have to do gyrations to touch people's hearts," says Fundis,

who has produced all five of Yearwood's albums to date. "She's one of the classical singers I've ever heard . 110 there with Barbra Streisand."

Yearwood also has the kind of industry status that has made her CMT Europe's Showcase Artist of the Month for March, coinciding with the release of the new MCA album, Thinkin' About You, on February 20 (and Valentine's Day in the US).

"Our viewing panel just love her," says CMT Europe's director of programming Tracy Rogers, "Her style, her lyrics, she's young and pretty, her videos are great ... everything fits with our audience" - which is currently reaching around eight million homes across Europe.

Showcase status on CMT means four plays a day of the current title track US single, two plays a day of her back catalogue videos, a string of more intimate interview slots and promotion for the spring New American Music tour of the UK and Europe that Yearwood is co-headlining with Emmylou Harris and Marty Stuart. All this should help stimulate the audie interest, by-passed by MCA's practical sion not to throw a single against the brick wall of UK national radio's esistance to country music in the UK.

Her product manager at MCA UK Mark Bell, is confident that press ads, a South Bank Show appearance and a possible Pebble Mill slot in March will make a big enough splash. Meanwhile Fundis expects "double

platinum at least" in the US. "I wanted an album full of singles and I think we've got it. In the past we've recorded maybe 12 songs and released 10 ... this time we did 20 or so and picked the very best."

These include yet another standout ballad from the pen of Gretchen Peters, with a magical and evocative string arrangement from sometime Disney movie composer Mark Watters, a cow of a Melissa Etheridge song and an almost-Broadway version of Tammy Wynette's 1973 hit Till I Get It Right

"We have a pretty simple formula," says Fundis, "find the songs that really move us, live with them for a while to be sure, then cut them right. Trisha's performance in the studio does the rest. Add three extra tracks on the UK

release plus the current title track smash, the first album inclusion of XXXs And OOOs alongside Yearwood's ability to, in Fundis's words, "sell tickets across barriers and oceans", and it looks as though MCA will be able to keep its head up on this release for the rest of 1995 at least. TOWERING INFERNO COMMEMORATING THE HOLOCAUST

On the strength of an album which has sold just 2,000 copies, Towering Inferno are about to clinch a deal with a major.

As you might expect, the album in quartion - Kaddish - is no ordinary release. Recorded over three years in London and Budapest, the 21-track, 70ninute epic reflects on Jewishness, the Holocaust and its place in 20th century ulture, Musicians and film-makers Richard Woolfson and Andy Saunders make their message accessible by the use of rock, freeform jazz and classical ments alongside samples from Hitler's speeches and a multi-talented cast of musicians.

"Both of us are Jewish and about six years ago we started analysing where our music comes from, because it has always had an East European feel to it," explains Saunders

We realized that it stome from our background, which most Jewish rock nusicians ignore – people like Bruce Springsteen and Bob Dylan use the blues tradition, for example. For some reason there is a silence about the Holocaust, which of course feeds the Holocaust denial

Woolfson adds, "At the same time we became bored of the labels which are attached to rock, classical or jazz. We're interested in each of those areas and wanted to put everything together and incorporate all the music we love most."

By turns unsettling and elegiac Kaddish - Hebrew for lament - has attracted critical tributes from around the world and praise from artists such as Brian Eno who was sent a copy when the group released it on their own label, distributed by south London's Recommended Records in 1993

The indefatigable Eno, who describes Kaddish as "the most frightening record I've ever heard", has campaigned long and hard on the project's behalf

During his Internet conversation with David Bowie in Q's 100th issue last December Eno said "Have you heard about Towering Inferno? They are doing something amazing, working with projectors and film and all the best musical ideas ... right on that cusp between (performance artist) Robert Wilson and Megadeth."

Kaddish is understood to have come close to being shortlisted by last year's Mercury Music Prize judges but U2's PolyGram-distributed imprint Mother Records dallied over signing the group last summer

Last autumn, negotiations started in earnest with Island Records and David James – Jah Wobble's manager who took over handling Towering Inferno at the beginning of the year - has now cemented a five-album deal with plans for the reissue of Kaddish on April 1.

The music got its first live airing in London at the Queen Elizabeth Hall last Saturday night (February 4).

The show, a visual spectacle using 100 projectors screening different images, will be performed again in Berlin in May to mark the 50th anniversary of the end of the war followed by performances in the rest of Burope, Japan and the US.

Towering Inferno are now planning their next move, which they stress will not be another Kaddish. The UK's Paul Gorman



WILLIAM ORBIT ELECTRONIC PIONEER

As a teenager, William Orbit made music by cutting audio tapes and editing them together to create epics on his tape recorder.

Now, 20 years later, the electronic music pioneer has a major label offshoot, N-Gram Recordings, with WEA and plans to release his own material for the next decade and beyond.

Orbit, 36, first came to the attention of Rob Dickins, chairman of Warner Music, when he remixed Justify My Love by Madonna. Dickins says, "We have a common area of music. He doesn't want to be an artist, he wants to do a lot of different things, so we decided to do a label."

The first result of the deal is perhaps in unlikely offering, a single by cellist Caroline Lavelle, produced by Orbit who discovered her two years ago after hearing her play on the Massive Attack track. Home And Away.

Over the next four months, N-Gram is releasing Lavelle's debut LP, as well as the fourth album in Orbit's solo project series, Strange Cargo, work with his Torch Song trio and Pieces In A Modern Style, his interpretation of 20th entury classical music

Orbit says, "N-Gram is a vehicle for me and my collaborators. I am the common denominator of the label and its cohesion

Signed to Virgin in the late Eighti Orbit achieved commercial success for the label under the name Bass-O-Matic, a more dance-orientated project which spawned one album and a string of singles in the early Nineties



Orbit founded independent label Guerilla Records with Dick O'Dell in 1992 and recorded his own material as well as licensing club tracks. He remixed many of the Guerilla singles until the label folded last year - as well as tracks for Prince, The Cure, The Shamen and Seal.

But in recent years, Orbit has deliberately concentrated on his own work "I gave up remixing two years ago to concentrate on N-Gram. It's a big project and I don't want to be trapped by the chart drug - I want to develop it long term," he says.

Orbit rather whimsically describes his creative approach as "like Alice In Wonderland and the rabbit". "You catch a sight of an idea out of the corner of your eye and you have to follow it and see where it takes you," he says

And, if the beautifully restrained ands of Strange Cargo 4 and Caroline Lavelle's album are anything to go by. it's an approach which is paying off Elsa Sharr



Pennsylvania, hased Ween have released four albums on four different labels in the UK, a feat which has undoubtedly hampered their progress from indie favourites to big sellers.

Last year's Pure Guava, released here on Creation, brought them some attention, particularly for the marvellously poppy single Push The L'il Daisies, but their current work -Chocolate And Choese - has seen the band opt for a European release from New Zealand's premier india label Flying Nun.

Singer Aaron Freeman (aka Gene Ween) explains the reasons for the chopping and changing, "The first two albums were recorded for Twin Tone and Shimmy Disc and were released by their European arms while our contract with Elektra has allowed us to choose our own European labels.

"We felt Creation weren't into us so we left. Flying Nun was an obvious choice because we've always been pleased with [parent company] Mushroom's work for us in Australia." he says. "I now feel the next album could be our first major one

Flying Nun UK head Brian O'Neill has been a long-time fan of the band and was delighted to make them the label's first non-Kiwi signing.

Any thoughts that the hand might depart after the lifespan of this album are dismissed by O'Neill. "We're going to do such a great job on them and



boost their profile so much, they're not going to want to go anywhere," he says.

Freeman and Micky Melchiondo (Dean Ween), both 24, have at last found a permanent rhythm section strong enough for their needs in ex-Rollins Band bassist Andrew Weiss and ace sticksman Claude Colema

But the long-term musical partners ave no intention of altering the diverse nature of their set which vcers from Prince-style funk to hardcore punk via the odd rocker and spaghetti western-style instrumental

After releasing the debut album Ichabod And I, on Preston's Action label and a brace of EPs on Rough Trade, The Boo Radleys only turned to Creation when Rough Trade couldn't afford to release their second album.

"It was luck rather than judgement," dmits Creation managing director Dick Green. "We'd not paid the band that much attention in the past

Sadly, sales didn't quite match the praise for Giant Steps. Carr puts this own to the absence of a hit single while Green suggests that Giant Steps was a difficult record for people to grasp because of its variety and length.

"We spent hours trying to persuade Martin to shorten it, but at the end of the day, he was right to go with it the way he wanted. But the album broke down a lot of barriers for them everywhere

The new album's commercial zest is nothing to do with outside pressure: Carr simply realised the wider implications of chart success

The first single from the new ssions, Wake Up Boo, shows how well he has turned his hand to this task.

We'd have to substantially increase the amount of product we order to get the same spread of product of titles overall, and we just can't afford it at the moment


