A figure known in piracy circles as "Mr Toad" was understood to be one of five men arrested in a swoop on a fair at London's Electric Ballroom last weekend. Mr Toad is said by piracy campaigners to be one of the most powerful men in the bootleg CD trade, running five stalls around the country and supplying product through two separate labels.

David Martin, head of operations at the BPI APU, says, "We are delighted. Three of the people who were arrested are in the top six in the country and this particular man is the number one.

Rezon is currently working on promoting the chain regionally using local press advertising, and has introduced leafletting for customers inside and outside regional department stores. "We see Now as a sector of the mar-

ketplace that's under exploited," he says. "We've got a captive audience we want to exploit and we want to encourage more people into the stores."

### COMMENT

The Brits are coming - but slowly

The most depressing thing about the endless coverage of the Oscars was the way radio and TV insisted on replaying the tape of Colin Welland's cry of "the Brits are coming" when he won an Oscar for Charlots Of Fire. That was a decade ago, and of course it subsequently emerged that the British weren't coming at all. Chariots Of Fire was a single swallow that didn't make a spring. The lesson in that is that maybe we should resist the temptation to count our chickens, but yet more

encouraging signs come from the US in the wake of the South By South West A&R-fest, The only overriding message to come out of it is that the steam has gone out of US rock. It is producing lots of very competent acts who play well and make all the right moves and all the right noises, but who wouldn't know an original idea if it bit them on the bum. In fact the hottest gig of the

whole event was Elastica. This should come as no surprise. The gradual turnaround in the UK's fortunes has been happening for the last two years but there's still a long way to go. The "British revival" currently has very shallow foundations. It has been built on inspiration rather than perspiration. It is now that the real work begins: the touring, the PAs, the investment, the concrete commitment to the success everyone wants We shouldn't underestimate the scale of the mountain that has to be climbed. Green Day have sold the astonishing total of 7m copies of their debut album, Dookie, It will not be until a new UK act has equalled that level of sales that we can finally breathe a sigh of relief and say the talent drought is really over.

The reality is that while it is good to be proud and excited about what is being achieved by Oasis and Portishead and Elastica, ultimately it will be the boring bit, the follow through, that will decide whether the British really are coming. Steve Redmond

In-and-out chart misses potential hits Over the past six months there have been an increasing

number of records that haven't happened until the second or, in some cases, the third time of asking. Some - such as Nicki French's Total Eclipse, N-Trance's Set Me Free, Nightcrawlers' Push The Feeling On and Freak Power's Turn On, Tune In, Cop Out - have proved tremendous success stories, making the Ton Five and selling big quantities.

Their success suggests that deleting, creating a demand and then re-releasing may be the new way to market singles

If we look at our chart and the brevity of singles' chart life, it is not surprising that companies are being forced to have more than one crack at success with some singles. Most peak in the chart the first Sunday after their release; if they fail to make the Top 20 in that allimportant first week, it's usually curtains. All the time and money invested in achieving the week one position has been wasted. The punters need more time to discover these potential hits. So, too, does the media, of course, which invariably only jumps on the bandwagon when a single hits the magical Top 20, unless it's by an established act.

The puzzle is that the records which have become such big hits peaked so low - in the thirties, forties, fifties first time around, OK, some of them have remixes, but basically they are the same tunes. It can only prove that there are a lot of good records out there which, due to the fast turnaround of our chart, aren't with the public long enough for them to get to know, love and, hopefully, purchase them

Only the companies with bollocks and belief take the risk of deleting and re-promoting. How many potential hits are lost through the incredibly quick "in-and-out" chart? We'll never know Tilly Rutherlord's column is a personal view

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# DTI's rights report adds to confusion

Performers' bodies have slammed the long-awaited Department of Trade draft paper on rental and lending rights as a recipe for chaos.

The paper, outlining the government's proposals for implementing the groupsean Union directive, was published last Monday after months of delays. Originally due to be implemented in the UK by last July, the directive establishes, for the first time, performers' legal right to an "equitable" share of royalties for music broadcast on TV and rates.

muste broadcast on 14 and rano.

But the 25-page draft has been criticised for failing to outline what percentage share it considers "equitable" – it suggests only a "reasonable proportion" – or to propose any mechanism by

which such income should be collected.

It says proportion should be "agreed between the performer and the owner of copyright in the sound recording", raising the prospect of individual deals

between artists and labels, rather thar a general blanket rate.

Copyright specialist Nigel Parker of Lee & Thompson, who acts on behalf of the International Managers' Forum, says the draft leaves many unanswered questions, and he criticises a sugges-

tion in the draft that negotiations could be settled in the copyright tribunal. "It is not the appropriate forum for deciding on these matters," he says.

Basea secretary general Amanda Harcourt adds, "The Government has not grasped the nettle and has dumped on the talent. They have left the performers to battle it out with the multinationals and record companies." The draft also fails to give performers

a right to collect their own income leaving that right with the "copyright owner" or record company. The Incorporated Society of Musicians says. "Performers will be entitled to payment only when producers have licensed the copyright in the sound recording. They will lose out when producers fail to called license income."

PPL chief executive Charles Andrews voices concern about the prospect of 'tens of thousands of individual negotiations", but says he was most disappointed about the failure to amend section 72 of the Copyright, Designs &

Patents Act as expected.
The 1988 act exempts record companies and performers from any rights to public performers from any rights to public performance royalities for the broadcast of sound recordings, contrary to the EU directive. 'It is very disappointing and an outrage that this opportunity has been missed,' he says. 'Wo, and the performers, will do everything we can to persuade the Government to

London alternative rock station XFM will be back on the air in October for another 28-day period, while preparations are made for another permanent licence application.

XFM is planning to use the restricted service licence (RSL) to maintain pressure on the Radio Authority, which plans to advertise a new Londonwide FM licence next March. XFM's fourth RSL ended yesterday (Sunday, April 2).

XFM is planning to release a compilation album around the time of its next speel lon air. XFM managing director Sammy Jacob says, "We will be keeping the campaign for a permanent licence alive all year through PR, events and the album. Everyone says we are next in line for a licence, but that's not necessarily what the Radio Authority thinks so we have to keep the pressure up."

The authority is advertising the 104.9 FM London licence (previously occupied by Melody Radio) next spring, XFM has been tipped to win following last month's replacement of Lord Chalfont, who made the crucial easing vote against XFM in the last round of licence awards, as Radio Authority chairman by Tony Stollor.

But under its current systems, the MCPS cannot register an arrangement for separate copyright unless the original copyright owner agrees it is sufficiently different to warrant its own copyright.

The judgment holds further implications for producers and remixers. Currently, producers sign over a share of ownership in a track's copyright to the record company. Now, proof of existence of a separate copyright in an arrangement could discourage producers to come to "lump sum" agreements with a label.

Full Force, the creative geniuses behind hits by Lisa Lisa, Cheryl Pepsi Riley and Sam Fox among others, return with Can I Get Your Number?, a delicious soulful funk single on Forceful Records. Already a popular club record, it augers well for their upcoming Different Heads album...Country legend Tammy Wynette's new album, Without Walls, consists mainly of duets. Those with country stars Joe Diffie. Lyle Lovett and

Wynonna Judd are fine and dandy, but, for wider appeal.

it's her flirtations with Sting, Smokey Robinson, Elton John and Cliff Richard that make most sense. The Tammy & Cliff track, This Love, seems to have the greatest hit potential. Quality control seems to have gone out of the window for Bryan Adams' new single, Have You Ever Really Loved A Woman?, a simple, singalong song in waltztime, with acoustic Spanish style guitar picking...REM continue to mine the Monster album with the release of Strange Currencies, a sad, fragmented and very powerful ballad. Bonus tracks, all live, are otherwise unavailable, so expect another big hit for the group...Finally, Joshua Kadison's classy, retro (mid-Seventies) ballad Jessie is back again. ### Take That take chart by storm

t will be a surprise to no one that there's a new number one single this work in the form of Take That's Back For Good. But even their most optimistic dmirers must be somewhat taken aback admirers must be somewhat taken aback by the style in which they have taken the thome. Last week, Back For Good sold nearly 350,000 copies - the highest weekly nearly strained by any single since Band Aid's Do They Know It's Christmas and Whem's Last Christmas in 1984. Of every five singles sold last week, one was Back For Good, selling nearly as many copies as all the other records in the Top 10 added together. It gives Take That their sixth number one, a tally exceeded only hy Madonna (7), The Rolling Stones (8), Abba (9) Cliff Richard (13), Elvis Presley and The Beatles (17 each). All of Take That's number ones have debuted in pole

In all, 38 records have debuted at number one, but no other artist has turned the trick more than three times Of the last seven Take That singles only Love Ain't Here Anymore failed to reach number one. Take That's remarkable return is bad news for The Outhere Brothers, whose Don't Stop (Wiggle Wiggle) increased its sales week-on-week by upwards of 20% to more than 100,000, a figure which would usually guarantee they stayed at number one. In addition to Back For Good, no fewer than ten old take.That singles invade the Top 200 this week, as fans complete their collections.

After gaining the nomination as Britain's Eurovision entry with 30% of the half a million votes cast. Love City Groove's self-titled single enters the chart at number 52, just ahead of Londonbeat's I'm Just Your Puppet On A...(String!), which bows at number 55 after finishing sixth in an eight strong field. Simon Spiro's Rainbor And You, which was fifth, enters at number 137. Other songs entered in the Song For Europe competition were released today (Monday), and can be expected to show up next week.

Grace's Not Over Yet completes a tour of duty at the top of the club chart this week, and debuts at number one on the dance sales chart, defeating the former incumbent. Strike's U Sure Do, by a margin of greater than three to one. It also debuts in Top 75 at number eight. When it was originally released in 1993, it failed to make either the club chart, the dance chart or the Top 200.

Freak Power's other big supporter, naturally is Atlantic 252, where it was snun 89 times last week. That's six times fewer than the County Meath, Ireland-based station's top record - Scarlet's Independent Love Song, which managed 95 plays some 16 weeks into its life.

Radio One is usually first on new ords, and its top 10 frequently has a very different complexion from the overall airplay chart - but not at present, with eight of the Top 10 nationally also filling berths in Radio

The Outhere Brothers' outgoing number one Don't Stop (Wiggle Wiggle) continues to be an clusive item on the airwayes, Radio One gave it ten spins. with the other 54 stations monitored managing a mere 100 between them and a lot of that came from Network Chart exposure. Atlantic 252 finally recognised it - although it did limit it to just one play.

With all plays now correctly monitored. Tina Arena's Chains continues to have the most impressive profile of unreleased singles at present, climbing to number 21 with 442 plays. Radio seems to have tired of 2 Unlimited's formulaic singles, and possibly held the key to Here I Go ruining the group's previously unbroken run of 11 Top 20 hits. Here I Go reached only number 22 on the CIN sales chart, and has had little support from radio, although belated plays from Radio One last week allow it to enter the airplay top 100 at number 63 Unreleased tracks garnering



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### MUSIC VIDEO

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The new album from Marc Almond has put the singer back in touch with his past and with the styles of music that tounched his career.

Authough his last album, 1991's Although his last album, 1991's Tenement Symphony, spawned three hit singles - Jacky, My Hand Over My Heart and The Days Of Pearly Spencer – Almond was unhappy with the finished product and with his relationship with bis label at that time, WEA.

They would agree that it was not a marriage made in heaven. Working with Trever Horn producing was wonderful but I felt that I was being excluded. I felt like a stranger on my own record, he says.

own record, in a spa-Problems in his personal life had come to a head at that time and the singer became disenchanted with his mustal direction and very susceptible to outside influence.

It was a strange position for the star to be in, considering his long and varied career to that point, which had included hits as one half of Soft Cell, as leader of Marc And The Mambas and as a versatile solo artist.

But once his personal dilemmas had
been resolved, Almond quickly began
looking for inspiration for his next
move—and it was to lead to styles of
music far removed from the overblown
pomp and balladry of Tenement
Symphony

Later in 1993, Almond began writing with John Coxon, Steve Nieve and former Sigue Sigue Sputnik guitarist

Neal X.
Working with Neal was actually
[Warner UK chairman] Rob Dickins'
idea. Neal has a pop glam sensibility
and that went perfectly with my idea of
bringing a bit of pop flash and nonsense

back into my music," says Almond.
With a handful of songs in the bag,
Almond then headed for New York to
work with producer Mike Thorn, a man
who had contributed to Soft Cell's
recordings and one of a number of
former collaborators to reunite with

Frank discussions with WEA led to the major letting Almond free from his contract in early 1994. That left the star and his manager Stevo looking for a new home. Stevo turned to PolyGram chairman Roger Ames who, as an A&R man, originally signed Soft Cell to Phonogram in 1981.

Ames in turn suggested the duo get in touch with Phonogram head of A&R Dave Bates. When Bates got that call, he was barrified

Almond was at the time of Soft Cell coming to an end and he was smashing up my office. When I heard Stevo was coming to see me I was trepidacious to say the least," says Bates.

Almond recalls that last meeting with embarrassment. "Things had gone a bit stale and sour. There was a lot of bad feeling around and too many of the wrong chemicals were being consumed.

But a lot of lessons have been learnt since these days," he says.

Indeed, Bates is the first to admit that Almond was a changed man when he returned to his office in 1994. "He had cleaned up in every way and both he and Steve had changed from being monsters into totally charming and friendly people who have been absolute pleasures to work with," he says.

Almond presented Bates with an album of songs which the head of A&R loved but felt needed much better production. A deal was duly signed.

loved but felt needed much better production. A deal was duly signed. Bates' advice has prompted a rush of recordings over the past year which are still yet to be finished.

"Dave seemed to have an understanding of exactly what I wanted the album to sound like," says Almond. "I wanted a record that showed where I was and where I was going. A strong, positive album influenced by all kinds of things, from

glam to electro, R&B and punk."

Bates put Almond in the studio with a wide variety of producers from the past and present. These included The Beatmasters, Messiah and Bizarre Inc.—all of whom happened to be closely linked to manager Stevo—who gave the record an underlying Nineties dance feel.

And working with The Grid (which includes Dave Ball, who was Almond's partner in Soft Cell), former live collaborator Greg Jackman, Martyn Ware and Chris Hughes, put the singer back in touch with his pop dance heeinnings.

"I had spent some time running away from the past. But, to be honest, a lot the Eighties was bit of a blur for me, which is probably just as well," says Almond.

"It's a new decade and I wanted to get back to that dark pop with a twisted sense of humour – music with attitude and edge, uplifting and positive." Bates couldn't believe how prolific

Almond's writing had become and that so many of the new collaborations were successful.
"It could have been confrontational on many occasions but it's been the

on many occasions but it's been the opposite and very exciting," he says. Songs such as the techno pop first single, Adored And Explored, the Soft

single, Adored And Explored, the Soft Cell-styled Out There and the Gary Glitter-esque The Idol reflect a musically revitalised Almond and a man with a clear vision.

As Dave Bates says, "Marc has done something very challenging. He has always been adventurous musically but I really think this could be the best album he has ever made.
"I've had a fantastic time and the

best thing has been realising that people can change and become even better than they were before." The new album is scheduled for

September release, preceded by the first single, Adored And Explored, on April 24. Nick Robinson

### BEHIND THE COUNTER

MAXINE NORTHOVER, Omega, Northwich

"The thing that has been selling the best for us is the Four Weddings And A Funeral video. On the album front it was pretty quiet, though the Boo Radleys has been selling well. So has the new Take That single. Recently Gene has sold well for us, and so has the Orb. The surprise hit this week has been Duran Duran - that album has probably been second to the Boo Radleys. The one we're playing most at the moment is Radiohead and loads of people are asking about it. On the classical front, the Classic FM Nocturns album is very popular. We do well out of classical, and jazz as well especially Blue Note. Then there are T-shirts - Oasis and Offspring are the top lines at the moment. We do have our regular customers hecause of our dance and indie catalogues. The rest is a mix of people and we seem to do well in every area. In terms of competitors. we only really have Woolworths. For the new releases they give us plenty of competition as they can put stuff out very cheaply. But we are able to specialise in things they can't compete with, such as the back catalogue and the indie and dance stuff. In terms of displays, putting stuff in the window does seem to have a huge effect. We've out a Four Weddings And A Funeral display just inside the door and it really seems to be drawing people in."

### ON THE BOAD

WAYNE DUTTON, southern area regional manager, MCA "Thank God for the Take That single. It's the only thing that's pulling people into the stores. People are already asking how many months it

will be number one but, to be honest, it's selling so fast everyone who wants it will probably have a copy soon. We all get knocked for launching these copycat bands, but what else can you do? MCA's biggest single at the moment is Bobby Brown's Two Can Play That Game, which has been re-released - and I know this sounds crass - due to public demand. It's the club thing - it makes you wonder whether we shouldn't delete all dance singles after a week and then re-issue them a month later. Albumwise, The Boo Radleys seem to be selling fastest in my area (East Anglia). I'd love to see it knock Celine bloody Dion off the too, but if Elton John can't do it... On MCA, Live are a very exciting prospect, despite the awkward name. We had Hole on Top Of The Pops last Thursday - their first UK television appearance - and we're doing a big push on all five Nirvana albums, Look out for Sean Ryder's band, Black Grape, soon they're brilliant. They'll do well in my territory because there are a lot of fans and good record stores, but we desperately need more decent-sized venues to stimulate interest. I remain an optimist - I just wish people would buy a few more records."
