MTV buys Music Factory Rossi reclaims

An M&M staff report

HILVERSUM — MTV Networks is set to make its first European acquisition following an announcement that it intends to buy The Music Factory (TMF) from Dutch publishing giant Wegener.

Wegener has signed a letter of intent to sell TMF to MTV for an undisclosed amount, with a final agreement on the acquisition expected in the coming weeks. The deal will

cover all existing TMF operations, including the TMF music TV channels in the Netherlands and Belgium, and free online access provider TMF Web.

MTV last year launched a Dutchlanguage channel, MTV NL, but it has not proved as popular as its TMF rival, which has consistently been the market-leading music TV brand in Holland since its launch in 1995.

label was gearing up for the April 6 release of *Stupido Hotel*, the latest album from the 49-year-old "king of Italian rock" Vasco Rossi.

Guido Elmi, who produced the album and co-wrote the title track, is quick to play down the marketing hype. "I think I would be accused of arrogance if I agreed with that," he tells M&M, "[so] perhaps it should be for record buyers to decide. I'll say one thing, though—I do like the album."

Yet EMI's "event of the year" claim may end up being pretty accurate, with the album shifting 330,000 units in its first week of release, according to the company. That's more business than the Beatles' 1 did in its first week of release in Italy last year.

Riccardo Clary, president and managing director of EMI Italy, says: "Vasco Rossi continues to be a fundamental part of the Italian music scene on account of his ability to offer intense and genuine emotions."

The first single off the album, Siamo Soli, is already receiving extensive airplay. "The guy is a legend in Italy and he appeals to listeners of all ages," says Angelo De Robertis, director of music at CHR network Radio 105. "After his successful 1999 live album, Rewind, I'm sure this is the record that his fans were waiting for."

No panic on revenues, says the European radio industry

LONDON — Fears of a massive downturn in radio advertising revenues have been grossly exaggerated. At least that's the message coming from different sectors of the industry across Europe.

The ad downturn has been heavily trumpeted in the financial media fol-

lowing profit warnings issued last month by Luxembourg-based broadcaster RTL Group and London's Capi-

tal Radio group.

Capital warned that its profits for 2001 would be 10% down on last year, while RTL Group has predicted "relatively flat earnings" in 2001, with both broadcasters citing the downturn in advertise of a page 21

Radio, especially music radio, doesn't cost much to produce and broadcast, and once you hit the bottom line, it's all about profit. Radio groups like Capital in the UK or NRJ in France have been able to bank on returns of 40 to 50%, turning radio into one of the most profitable businesses around.

The past few years have been good to radio as a whole, with the overall advertising pie becoming bigger in most European countries. With a buoyant economic situation, plus the dotcom boom, advertisers have been spending more to attract consumers, and radio has been cleaning up.

There are some signs, however, that after what is described as "a record year" in 2000 by analysts in our front page story this week, the advertising market is slowing down, or at the very least not enjoying the same growth rate as last year.

Most of the experts and industry professionals interviewed by M&M are of the opinion that the radio industry in Europe doesn't need to panic-most countries are enjoying steady economic growth and the US recession has not yet affected Europe. Besides, radio often performs rather well in tough economic conditions, being instantly reactive and easy to book.

What is really eroding the big radio groups' profit margins, however, are the heavy investments most have made in technology (digital radio, especially) and the Internet. Capital Radio chairman David

Mansfield, for example, told the participants at Plug.In Barcelona two weeks ago that his group was investing some 10% of its cash flow in Internet-related ventures.

How much of this will actually pay off in the long-term is the question investors will no doubt be considering in the months and years to come.

Austria hails deregulation

VIENNA — Commercial radio stations in Austria are welcoming new legislation which took effect on April 1 that has loosened up ownership restrictions and creates the possibility of national commercial radio for the first time.

Previously, a single owner could only hold a maximum 26% stake in one station, and up to 10% in two other stations. But under the new legislation, a single company can hold 100% of an unlimited number of stations, as long as they aren't in the same broadcast area.

Marco Huter, head of Austria's commercial broadcasting association, believes the changes will make for a much more financially viable commercial radio sector. "Investors can come in and create economically positive radio stations," he says.

The previous ownership restrictions led to very diversified shareholdings, which Huter believes did-

n't foster a healthy climate for investors. "There was no money to improve," he says.

And in another move which may improve investment prospects for the industry, the country's newly created broadcasting authority, KommAustria, is to investigate whether there are enough spare frequencies to advertise a licence for a national commercial station.

The creation of KommAustria under the April 1 legislation has been praised by broadcasters. Huter says it will be a "more or less a one-stop shop," which will deal with regulations, licences and frequencies.

Until now, commercial broadcasters in Austria have had to deal with a number of agencies, including the Regional Radio Authority, which issued licenses; the Ministry of Transportation, Innovation and Technology which handled frequency allocation; and the Chancellor's office for legal

Downbeat tone at UK's DDMI conference

LONDON — The survivors of the digital shake-out congregated at London's Royal Lancaster Hotel on April 2-3 for two days of networking and panel discussions at DDMI Global (Digital Distribution and the Music Industry).

While the general mood at DDMI only a year ago was described by the official brochure as "euphoric," this time it was a rather sobering experience as a result of the dark clouds currently hovering above the dotcom sector.

The conference felt that recording artists had been expecting more crossover between the online and the offline worlds. Singer song-

writer Toby Slater complained: "Very few record companies actually care about the Internet. I have attracted thousands of downloads from my site, but only one from a



record company. The Internet is more of a one-to-one thing—getting mass exposure is difficult. It doesn't replace the power of radio and TV."

On the same panel, Chris Cass, CEO for digital platform Vitaminic in the UK, conceded that the "Internet has proved to be just another piece in the marketing toolbox."

A more optimistic note, however, was sounded by Ben Drury, head of music at British Telecom's new online music project Openworld. "Don't forget that from an access technology point of view, a lot is still coming—subscription services via broadband Internet access and the third generation of mobile phones all might provide opportunities to exploit catalogue material."

Heldal pioneers cross-industry switch ON THE BEAT

Oslo — The appointment of Nils Heldal to the position of managing director at EMI Norway (M&M, April 14) marks the first time that a radio industry executive has become the head of a major label in the country.

Heldal resigned from his Trondheim-based job as station manager at public CHR station NRK Petre on April 3, and is expected to take up his new position in Oslo on June 1.

"Heldal is very energetic and a seasoned music man, who truly belongs to the new generation of industry executives," EMI savs Music Scandinavia & Finland president and CEO Michael Ritto. "He has an affection for all the impor-

tant areas, including technology bands." and unsigned

Prior to his most recent job at NRK Petre, Heldal was the station's music director and has been involved with Petre since it launched in 1992. Marius Lillelien. Petre's current music director, will temporarily take over Heldal's duties at NRK. Atle Bredal, who is a music producer at Petre, will in turn take on Lillelien's duties.

"Heldal is a brilliant choice for the job," says Svein Bjørge, managing director of Playground Music Scandinavia and a board member of labels' body IFPI Norway. "He can add a whole lot of vision to the industry, and he has also got a young mind—he knows

most of the new genres, from hip hop to black metal.'

When Heldal joins EMI he will inherit a roster of artists including Atakama, Corvine, Anneli Drecker, Odd, Savoy, Jahn Teigen, Tungtvann and Bertine Zetlitz.

Eivind Brydøy, who manages Zetlitz, says he is "glowingly happy" EMI's move for Heldal. "I think that his experience from Petre and his general competence will be very good for EMI."

Heldal, in a prepared statement, said: "I've had some fine years with NRK and am especially happy about having helped develop new talent, in terms of both artists and presenters. What's tempting now is to work closer with artists."

JIM pumps out the music in Flanders

BRUSSELS — VMM, the owner of Flemish TV channels VTM and Kanaal 2 as well as radio networks Top Radio and Radio Mango, has launched a new musicdriven TV channel in Flan-

JIM-TV, launched on April 1, is available on all Flemish cable networks. It intends to capture "at least 10% of its potential audience in its first year of existence," according to VMM CEO Erik Claeys.

"We want to position JIM-TV to appeal to a slightly older audience than [public TV channel] Ketnet or [commercial music TV channel] TMF Vlaanderen,"

Some 70% of the programming will be music videos hosted by "i-jays," or



interactive DJs. As for the rest of the output, "the channel is airing three hours of live television a day including the weekly chart show, JIMlist," says Hoogland. "There are also features on the Internet and gaming as well as short news bulletins.'

"I was looking forward to the launch of JIM-TV," says Bert Bieseman, TV promotion manager at Warner Music Belgium. "I have the impression that they have a very motivated and dynamic team. But there's a lot of competition in the music market—they're all fishing in the same pool."

"With [Flemish public broadcaster] VRT axing its main music programme, I think JIM-TV will become extremely important," says Johan Vansina, product manager with BMG Ariola Belgium. "Their approach goes beyond just video clips and offers extra possibilities for artists.'

Riverhorse makes progress against the tide

LONDON — After the termination of its funding agreement with Sony Music and the major's European SINE division, UK indie label Riverhorse has new UK distribution by 3MV, its first domestic top 40 entry under that agreement, and is developing artist-by-artist relationships with international indie partners.

"My artists are very close to me, they understand completely what we've gone through and luckily they stood by me," says Robin Godfrey-Cass, founder of Riverhorse and former managing director of Warn-

er Chappell Music UK. "Sony made a corporate decision, and I know I'm going to prove them wrong.

Founded in 1999, Riverhorse's most successful artist to date, garage singer-writer Lonyo, has built on Summer Of Love, his number eight UK hit during the Sony agreement last July, with a top 40 appearance in the UK singles chart for the follow-up Garage Girls. It is Riverhorse's first hit as an independent and precedes a European rollout for Summer Of Love beginning via Kontor in Germany and Valle in Spain. Godfrey-Meanwhile

Cass has completed a licensing deal with Polydor for the world outside the US for Nightcrawlers, and will continue to develop singers Sherena Dugani and Martay.

"I'm really pleased that I can cherry-pick the labels I want. I know they'll work hard because they're paying me in advance, and these independent companies can't waste their money," adds Godfrey-Cass. "The three records I put out [via Sony] all charted, but my label was more pop crossover-driven, it wasn't an indie label where you could make a record for £20,000."

Audio Mill's Bitbop Tuner scans the Internet for radio stations that are playing what the user tells it they want to hear, displaying a real-time selection of playlists and allowing the user either to listen to the station or to pick and choose individual songs. The user can also record as a Real Audio format file, but the integral digital rights management system means that each saved recording is encrypted and can only be played on the computer that recorded it. It can even record preset requests while the user is absent. The Bitbop Tuner is free. Future versions of it are planned to incorporate an e-commerce function that will allow users to buy CD-quality downloads.



Music Radio's more constructive dialogue

This year's Radio Academy Music Radio conference in the UK was, as ever, highly entertaining but lacked some of the controversial flashpoints of recent years. Jon Heasman and Siri Stavenes Dove report.

Radio conference is a fairly unique event in Europe in that it attracts a genuine 50/50 mix of radio and music industry professionals.

Historically, that has been a recipe for a number of public slanging matches between the two industries, which although inter-dependent clearly have different aims and objectives. This year was refreshingly notable for the absence of such exchanges, such exchanges, although Radio Authority member Feargal Sharkey in his radio keynote (M&M, April 14) did chastise the music business for not being awake enough to appreciate the potentially damaging consequences for it of further ownership deregulation in the radio sector.

Overall, there was a sense that music industry executives have come to accept previously controversial issues such as the use of music research, although there is perhaps a feeling persisting among music executives that the UK radio industry is not doing all it might to extend the variety of formats available.

In the "Rock Off!" panel devoted to discussion of the current "nu metal" wave, Tim Parsons, managing director of concert promoters SFX Music Division, claimed that the "male youth today are totally disenfranchised by radio," and even Xfm/London programme controller Andrew Phillips admitted

he Radio Academy's Music * that "kids have gone off radio. The formatting has killed it a bit."

The pop pariah?

Kerrang! magazine editor-in-chief Phil Alexander said that hard rock had always been an underground phenomenon. "This kind of music is looked on as being a pop pariah," he said.

However, Alexander claimed that there was a "sea change" taking place amongst teenagers at the moment. "The audiences [for rock] are getting younger and younger. They're bored of manufactured pop crap. Radio stations need to understand what the audience wants.'

Phillips, echoing comments he made to M&M in our recent Xfm Station In Focus (M&M, April 7) said that his station had to be "careful" how it rides the nu metal

wave. "We've got to keep our credibility in how we treat that music."

Phillips and other programmers present would have no doubt appreciated Tom Hunter's soapbox session, in which the Piccadilly Key 103/Manchester managing director emphased the need for topquality, well-paid music programmers. He said that in days gone by, when there was much more of a consensus of musical taste amongst the public, radio stations could just employ cheap "spotty 12year-old boys" to compile the playlist, as it was a relative nobrainer activity based on the current chart. In an era of complex genre fragmentation, he said, we need to employ "talented artists and pay them a lot of money.'

More Euro-beats

A panel entitled "FCUK 2000" looked at the increasing airing of continental European repertoire by UK stations, particularly in the dance sector and especially the the so-called "French touch" artists such as Daft Punk, Air and Modjo.

Matt Jagger, managing director of Ministry Of Sound Recordings, said that continental European repertoire was succeeding on the radio because it was generally more melodic than UK dance production, which tended to be more cutting edge and focused on genres such as

trip hop and drum 'n' bass. "UK dance producers have abandoned the mainstream," he admitted.

BBC Radio 5 Live presenter Nicky Campbell proved to be a spiky moderator for the now - obligatory panel about future radio platforms entitled "Is Anyone Out There?".

That title seemed particularly apt when Bruno Brookes, managdirector Storm Digital Broadcasting (the owners of online radio station Storm Live) seemed determined to avoid giving anyone even the roughest ideas of listening figures for his station, explaining that the technology is not advanced enough to get accurate figures. "We get 980,000 hits in a week, but that means nothing in terms of listening figures," he admitted.

Defending digital radio's corner were Simon Nelson, controller of new media, BBC Radio & Music and Nick Piggott, digital content manager of GWR Digital. Nelson agreed with Piggott that "DAB is the future of radio," although he cautioned that the BBC aims to provide new audio services on all available platforms.

When asked when digital radio would become the dominant radio platform, Piggott responded: "When a digital radio set is £49.99." Asked when that would be, he replied: "Some time in the next 10 years."

Exposed: Britain's musical youth

US research guru Larry Rosin, co-founder and president of Edison Media Research, was at Music Radio to present the findings of some exclusive research commissioned by the Radio Academy and carried out by NOP into the listening habits of 11-15 year olds in the UK.

Some 506 children took part in the survey, which was conducted in schools throughout the UK via the internet.

Before going to school, 43% of those surveyed watched breakfast TV, with exactly same percentage listening to the radio, although at the weekend a 55% majority turn on the TV when they wake up. When asked what they had been doing in the previous 24 hours, 95% said they had watched TV, 83% had listened to the radio and 66% had read a magazine.

Showing the continued strength of pop among this age group, 51% of the children surveyed chose Top 40/chart as their favourite type of music. 15% voted for the category dance/soul/house/garage/R&B, 14% chose rap and hip hop, while 9% said they preferred heavy rock.

Given a choice, 49% of the children in the survey would prefer to listen to CDs or tapes at home in preference to the radio (18%), although 33% said they liked both equally. A major positive result of the survey was that 75% said they listened to the radio more now than they did a year ago. 12% said their listening levels were about the same, while 13% listened less. Of the 13% who were listening less, 57% said they couldn't find the music they like on the radio; 41% said there was too much talk. 18% said they didn't think there was a station aimed at them.

91% of the respondents use the Internet at home and 84% at school. These figures were particularly high, of course, because of the survey itself being conducted online. 52% had downloaded music from Napster. This was second only to visiting chatrooms when it came to online activities. 43% had listened to a radio service online, while 76% owned a mobile phone.

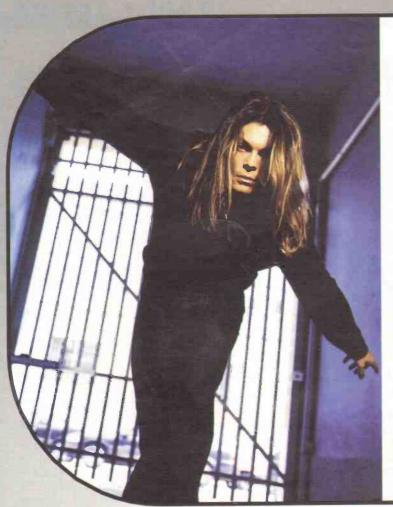

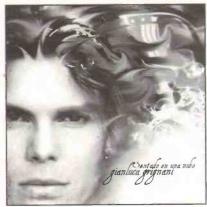

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Hats off to Latin music boom

incredible thing happened to the German album charts. A set of songs by Buena Vista Social Club, a bunch of Cuban musicians—the eldest, Compay Segundo, is still going strong at 93-stayed at number one for several weeks.

Admittedly, Buena Vista Social Club was conceived by non-Cubans, being the brainchild of small UK indie label World Circuit, produced by highly acclaimed US guitarist Ry Cooder, and boosted by a documentary-film of the same title shot by German director Wim Wenders.

But there is no escaping the fact that the execution by Cuban musicians resulted in a set of sublime renderings of traditional Cuban "son" and associated repertoire that captured the hearts of music lovers worldwide, and opened up a new music genre to generations of record buyers sated with pop-rock and other Anglo-European stock product. Worldwide sales approaching four million units speak for themselves.

And yet, when you talk to people of the subsequent Latino boom in music, the majority will come back with names like Ricky Martin and Jennifer Lopez, and other artists who speak English better than Spanish. Even their surnames-Martín and López-lack the usual accent marks used in the world's 20plus Spanish-speaking countries, underlining the fact that the so-called Latino boom is perhaps just another facet of US pop music.

Definition problem

So there is clearly a definition problem when talking about Latino music. There is no doubt that in Europe an audience exists for quality music sung in Spanish or Portuguese (don't forget, Portuguese-speaking Brazil is the other Latino music powerhouse



next to Cuba and, lately, Puerto Rico). But when it comes to sales and airplay, it's the old story of simpler Anglo-strained Latino pop sung in English that's grabbing the headlines.

Yet another curious fact is that Spain, which for historic, linguistic and cultural reasons is a European stronghold for product from Latin America, the Spanish-speaking Caribbean and US Latino markets, actually lags behind other markets in terms of especially France and sales. Germany.

A key factor is that Latino music is nothing new for Spain, while in the rest of Europe the "Latino boom" has been the result of discovery. Spain has always been familiar with traditional Latino music, mainly due to the Canary Islands acting as a staging post during centuries of sea travel between the "Mother Country" and its

After the 1936-39 Spanish Civil War, Cuban singers with their distinctive music-such as the great Beny Moré or Antonio Machín-were very popular in Spain. The "bolero" genre of romantic music is a native of the Canary Islands as much as it is of Cuba or Argentina.

Low sales in Spain

Even so, Spain's 2000 sales figures issued by labels' association and IFPIaffiliate show one surprising fact-Latino pop, which presumably covers all those in the Martin-Lopez bracket, accounted for just 1.1% of unit sales. Of course, much of the 34.25% of domestic pop would count as Latino music for the purposes of this article, including Spain's two biggest-selling albums of 2000, Alejandro Sanz's El Alma Al Aire (Warner Music Spain, 1.3 million), and Estopa's eponymous debut album (BMG Ariola, one million).

And a glance at Music & Media's European Top 100 Albums chart earlier this month reveals that just five albums qualify for "Latino music" status—Jennifer Lopez's J.Lo, Jarabe de Palo's De Vuelta Y Vuelta, Ricky Martin's Sound Loaded, Paulina Rubio's Paulina, and Estopa's eponymous effort.

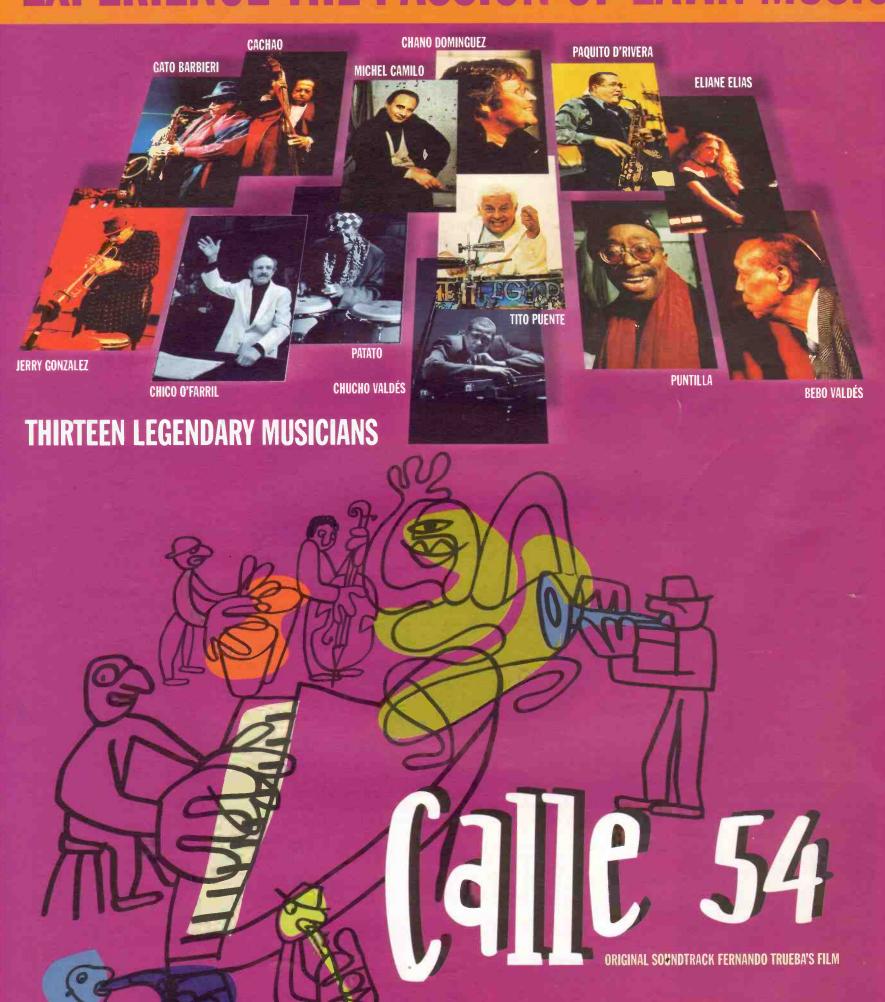
Paulina Rubio, referred to as "the Mexican cyclone" in the Spanish press, has reached number one and gone platinum (100,000 units) with her first album release in Spain but fifth in Mexico, Paulina (MuXXIc), and is now set to storm Europe. Rubio is in fact a latin replica of Madonna, complete with a picaresque face, blond hair, cowboy hat, and mini-skirt that is in fact a wide belt-indeed, Rubio (which means "blond" in Spanish) claims to have invented the "far west" aesthetic before Madonna.

Also poised to take Europe by storm is Daniela Mercury, a fine singer from Salvador-Bahia, Brazil's most exciting musical city with a large slave descendent population. Mercury—who in January was accorded the honour of a 'Time' magazine cover photo to accompany an article on the Rock In Rio spectaclehas played in much of Europe since 1992, and is now Brazil's biggest act with more than four million unit

late March, Mercury told M&M she had played 24 European concerts in 2000, and cited France as typical of a country where "people are ready to accept listening to different languages, because it's the rhythms that count, and mine are a mix of bossa nova, reggae, samba and African". In Spain, on the other hand, she feels "I have to sing some songs in Spanish to win acceptance".

Mercury sang with Spanish singer/songwriter Pedro Guerra late March at the Premios de la Música awards ceremony in Madrid, and cites it as a case of "inter-Latino crossover". She explains: "I was introduced to Pedro's music by [the great Brazilian singer] Caetano Veloso, and as Pedro is from the Canary Islands, I noted rhythms and forms that were not far from me. It was easy to play with him." But she also admits that she has approached Anglo-American pop rhythms too on her latest BMG album, Sol Da Liberdade.

Distinguishing the types

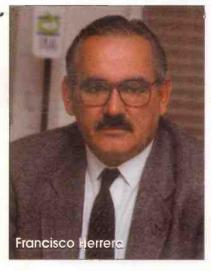
Seju Monzón is EMI Spain's director of Cuban music and a Latino music expert, having headed a Caribbean music band for 15 years and owned Madrid's pioneer salsa club. "Latino music is well liked in Europe, but it is important to distinguish two main types," he says.

A new Guerra double album called Colección Romántica (Karen Music) was released late last year in Spainwhere it went gold with sales of 60,000 units-and other European territories. But special packaging made it an expensive item, and it is being relaunched this month across Europe at a lower price.

The radio pioneer of Latino music in Spain is Francisco Herrera, director of Cadena SER's Latino music network Cadenal DIAL, the second most popular music network in the country with some 1.7 million listeners daily. "When we launched the station in 1989, 70% of records sold in Spain were from the Anglo-Saxon market," he recalls.

"Today, 60% are in Spanish. The pedestal as English-singing artists. But at the beginning of the 90s, things changed—ballads by the likes of Julio Iglesias, then the Cubans, and now everything that covers the Latino boom, from traditional Cuban to Spanish rock like Heroes del Silencio who were very popular in Germany in the mid-90s."

Becoming established

Bautista points out that what happens in the US is generally repeated in Europe. "The US will soon be the third biggest Spanish speaking country, after Mexico and Spain. Even after the Latino boom has passed, there will still be more and more Latino music coming out of the US as pop music and passing into Europe. It will become established here.'

In late March, a Latin jazz album won a gold disc (50,000 unit sales) for the first time in Spain. Calle 54 (Chrysalis) is the soundtrack to a documentary-film of the same title made by Oscar-winning director and Latin jazz fanatic Fernando Trueba. The album was released in France in December and across Europe this spring by EMI. Featuring giants such as Chuchu Valdés and his father Bebo, Paquito D'Rivera, Chano Domínguez, Michel Camilo, Gato Barbieri, Tito Puente and Chico O'Farrill, it is likely to set milestones for Latin jazz in many countries.

At the Premios de la Música awards ceremony, an interesting live experiment enthralled the audience and 2.5 million viewers watching live on TV, which could indicate a key future development. Ricky Martin performed a flamenco-based pop medley with Ketama and promising newcomer, 20-year-old Estrella Morente. Martin played the cajon, or wooden percussion box, for the first time, and enjoyed himself as much as everybody else. "This was real Latino inter-action," says Sony's Claudio Condé. Artists spicing things up for Latin music

Radio Tarifa (BMG Spain)

Ever since their 1993 debut, Rumba Argelina, Spanish trio Radio Tarifa have been among the most lauded acts in world music. Their style is a fascinating hybrid of North African, medieval and Iberian music, including flamenco, filtered through centuries of Arabic and other Mediterranean influences. Their second album, 1996's Temporal, with its sephardic influences and flamenco focus, underlined the compulsive rhythms which are one of their main attractions. Their concerts at such festivals as WOMAD, which often include Arabic or flamenco dancers, draw increasingly enthusiastic fans. Now their impressive new album, Cruzando El Rio, to be released in some territories by World Circuit, expands on those roots, and will surely help spread the word.

Manu Chao (Virgin France)

May 28 is the street date for Proxima Estacion: Esperanza, the long-awaited new album from Manu Chao. The iconoclastic artist's second solo project since his former band Mano Negra broke up in 1994 follows his first solo outing, Clandestino, which was universally acclaimed by critics on its release three years ago this month. The album burned slowly, only reaching the top spot in France in January this year. Worldwide sales for the musically daring and provocative album now stand at 2.5 million. An intriguing mix of third-world rhythms, exotic instruments and rock attitude, it's lyricssung in French, English and Spanishspeak of poverty, margination, and solidarity with humour and a conviction reminiscent of Bob Marley.

Alejandro Sanz (Warner Music Spain

The Latin music boom is not a one-way street-it crosses the Atlantic in both directions. Spain's charismatic singer and composer Alejandro Sanz is proof of that, and his music reaches beyond the danceable, increasingly formulaic pop which typifies the genre. Lyrically and melodically complex, he has managed the rare feat of forging his own style while building a huge international following. His current album, El Alma Al Aire sold an incredible one million copies in its first week in Spanish stores last September, and has gone on to move 2.5 million units worldwide. Apart from virtually sweeping the Best Artist and Album categories in all three of Spain's major music awards, Alma was also nominated for the Best Latin Pop Album Grammy. His previous CD, Mas has sold some five million copies to date.

Pedro Guerra (BMG-Ariola)

Already certified Gold in Spain, Pedro Guerra's fourth solo effort *Ofrenda* offers more of the singer-songwriter's intelligent, intimate and tuneful music, enhanced by collaborations from two of Brazil's most popular singers, Daniela Mercury and Lenine, among others. The CD is lush with

African, Arabic and Latin rhythms, as befits an artist born in the Canary Islands, the crossroads between Europe and both southern continents. The 35-year-old is already considered the most influential Spanish songwriter of his generation, and *Ofrenda* will be released internationally, primarily in Latin America, in June. A further example of Spain's ability to meld diverse musical traditions into a supremely modern style.

Daniela Mercury

Brazil has provided the world with a rich multitude of musical styles, from bossa-nova to samba, to the more explicitly African-influenced sounds of Bahia, where singer Daniela Mercury grew up. Well on the path to global stardom, Mercury's energetic dance-filled performances are already legendary. Since her first CD in 1991 she's racked up worldwide sales of four million. Sol da Liberdade, her sixth album and first for BMG, displays her powerhouse artistry, combining fiery Bahian rhythms with the samba-reggae she heard as a child, along with densely layered arrangements and collaborations with world music heavyweights like Milton Nascimento and Angelique Kidjo. She recently won Latin American Artist of the Year at Spain's Onda awards.

Jarabe de Palo

For a band whose 1996 debut album, La Flaca (Virgin), almost sank without trace, Jarabe de Palo has plenty to smile about. La Flaca was rescued after the title track was used in a TV ad, and eventually hailed as the album of the year in 1997 with sales in excess of 700,000. Better yet, over a year later the album triumphed in Italy with more than 300,000 sales, and its follow-up, Depende, sold similar amounts in both Spain and Italy. Virgin France took an interest and sales took off there too, and the band's third CD, De Vuelta Y Vuelta was released across Europe, Latin America and the US in February and March. Jarabe de Palo is now Virgin Spain's biggest signing, and with leader Pau Donés combining his pre-Jarabe skills as a publicity executive with those of a fine songwriter, future pan-European success seems guaranteed.

Compay Segundo (DRO East West)

A fairly obscure cultural event organised by a town council in southern Spain in 1994 led to the rediscovery of Compay Segundo, who had survived 35 years of what his manager calls "unjustified oblivion" after three decades of success in Cuba. The invitation to the then 87-year-old led to a signing with Spain's DRO East West label in 1995, since when he has become the only person ever to sell more than one million copies of new recordings made after the age of 88. says sales of five albums released in six years total some 1.3 million. Compay's success was enhanced by his participation in the *Buena Vista Social Club*, and Segundo can be held largely responsible for an entire generation of music lovers discovering traditional Cuban "son", the core music of many other Cuban genres, including salsa.

Estopa (BMG Ariola)

The Spanish sales phenomenon of last year were young brothers David and José Múñoz, who as Estopa sold more than one million copies of their debut album of the same name. Having regenerated a style of flamenco-related music called Catalan rumba within a rock context, the duo have created a new space for Latino rock. The success shook everybody, and BMG has made the album a worldwide Latino market priority for 2001. Estopa is released in May in France and Italy, and the band will also play France's prestigious Printemps de Bourges festival. Although they performed at last year's PopKomm trade fair in Cologne, BMG international exploitation manager Sonsoles Armendariz says the Bourges festival "is the start of Estopa's European campaign".

Eliades Ochoa (Virgin Spain)

Perhaps the most skilled musician in the original Buena Vista Social Club was Cuba's Eliades Ochoa, who since 1978 has led traditional Cuban music band El Cuarteto Patria. Signed to Virgin Spain, the 55-year-old is the "youngster" of the "Social Club", and for that reason alone carries the banner of traditional Cuban music into the future. He sells well in much of Europe, especially France, although his biggest market is the US, where he has twice been nominated for a Grammy. Most people remember him as the singer of Compay Segundo's legendary Chan Chan, but Ochoa is also a formidable guitarist. A relentless tourer whose concerts inevitably end with the entire audience dancing, Ochoa shows us that "son" has plenty of energy, is highly danceable, and not just the preserve of veterans.

Juan Luis Guerra (Karen Music)

For any Latino artist to triumph commercially outside Latin America and gain cultural respect was unthinkable just a decade ago. And then came along Juan Luis Guerra, a mild-mannered deeply religious singer from the Dominican Republic who introduced Caribbean dance style "merengue" into Europe. Until then, Latino music was considered in Spain to be flashy and cheap, and to admit to liking salsa or merengue was to be corny. Guerra changed all that, selling one million units of the album Ojalá Que Llueva Café in Spain. It also went to number one in the Netherlands. Guerra opened the door 10 years ago to Latino music, and continues to demonstrate that Latino music is more varied than a glance at the sales charts might suggest.

(Mute) Release Date: April 23 Depeche Mode began life as Composition of Sound in Basildon, Essex, in 1980 and included Vince Clarke in their line-up, who subsequently left

to form '80s synth-pop group Yazoo. Dave Gahan then joined Martin Gore and Andrew Fletcher and Depeche Mode were signed to Mute within a year. To date, the band have released 11 studio albums beginning with 1981's Speak & Spell. The latest, Exciter comes out on May 14 and was produced by Mark Bell, who worked on Björk's *Homogenic* and *Selmasongs* records. It is also Depeche Mode's first album of new material since 1997's Ultra. "We immediately went with their new single because the band is important to us, and our listeners," says Kristian Bartos, head of music at Stockholm's Modern AC station WOW! 105.5. "Like all great bands Depeche have the ability to evolve and bring something new and fresh to the table whenever a new album is released, and this time is no different." Bartos adds, "It's a good, long-lasting single that might not kick you in the head the first time, but might well do the second time and will stay with you. I believe Dream On has that quality."

The four MCs and vocalist Ming-Xia who make up Spooks make melodious hip-hop which is well produced and easy on the ear-not at all dissimilar to the sound of the Fugees in the '90s. Both singles are taken from the band's debut album S.I.O.S.O.S. which came out earlier this year and has played an important role in the explosion of hip-hop and rap across Europe over the last few months. Jan van Hoorick, head of music at CHR station VRT Radio Donna in Flanders, says that although the track doesn't quite measure up to Things I've Seen, "it's an obvious successor when you look at the album. But I am not so sure about the hit potential-it's a division lower than Things I've Seen." Radio Donna usually focus on pop tracks from the Top 40, since black music and R&B has never caught on in the region. But with Things I've Seen, Wu Tang Clan's Gravel Pit and OutKast's Ms. Jackson, hip hop is starting to establish itself on the station. Things I've Seen is still spinning on the A-list while Karma Hotel has so far been placed on the B-list. SSD

Danish-signed act Safri Duo holds at number one for the second week running with their Played-A-Live (The Bongo Song) (Universal) still enjoying massive support across Europe.

There is more movement a bit further down the chart, as three tracks move into the top 10 for the first time. Ricky Morrison and Frank Sidoli aka M&S presents...The Girl Next Door jumps from 15 to seven with Salsoul Nugget (If U Wanna) (Sigma/ffrr & Sony). Club chart entries in France and parts of Scandinavia, as well as sales in Britain and Ireland, are behind the climb that also earns the act a number three ranking on the movers chart.

French electronica act Daft Punk, who recently set an all-time record after staying 13 weeks in a row at number one in the chart, from early December 2000 until the end of last February with One More Time, waste no time in moving in the right direction with their new track Aerodynamic (Labels), which goes up from 20 to eight this week, charting in Britain, Germany and Ireland. Italian DJ/producer Mauro Picotto's Like This Like That (BXR-Media) is also a fast climber, rocketing from 22 to number 10 in its second week in the chart. Outside Picotto's native Italy, the track is strong in Germany, Austria and Spain.

Particularly strong in Britain and throughout Scandinavia, Janet Jackson's All For You (Virgin) climbs from 36 to 11 this week. Also on an upward trajectory is another French track; Darlin (Yellow) by Bob Sinclair features American legend James "D-Train" Williams. The 33-14 jump is based on entries in Germany and Britain.

DuMonde's Never Look Back (Superstar Recordings) first appeared in dance charts in the Netherlands (on Combined Forces) despite being German. It finally moves into its home market as well as Britain this week, and climbs to 25 from

The highest new entry this week is Germany's Netrecord-z.de-signing Yoda with Definitely at 37, helped by entries in dance charts in Germany and in Spain via import.

One to look out for in the coming weeks is ATB's new track Let U Go (Kontor/Urban), which has charted in Germany.

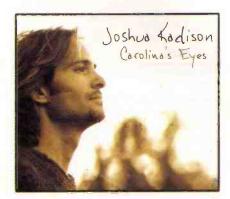

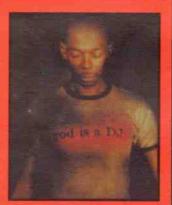

As a result of massive support from radio right across Europe, the number one spot in this week's European Radio Top 50 is occupied by the youngest of the Jackson siblings, Janet Jackson (pictured), with her new but retro-



sounding single All For You (Virgin).

The biggest chart point gainer this week is Madonna, with the third single from her Maverick/Warner Bros. album Music. The dreamy ballad What It Feels Like For A Girl is set to follow in the successful footsteps of her previous singles.

In fact, seems to be the week for rock and pop old-timers, with the highest three of the nine new entries coming from established and veteran acts.

REM score the highest new entry with their Imitation Of Life (Warner Bros). The track comes straight in at number 18 after topping M&M's Most Added chart for three weeks in a row. prised if the track wasn't a success.'

The new single by UK '80s act Depeche Mode, Dream On (Mute), enters the chart at 36. Dream On is the first single to be taken from the band's new album Exciter, out on April 23.

"I am a bit surprised the track has been that successful," says Rosenauer. "It certainly doesn't remind me of the previous Depeche Mode songs. In this track, acoustic guitars replace synth-pop. I think it will be a hit, but not as big as the REM release."

The third highest new entry this week is from a band which can chart its pop career all the way back to the '60s. It's the Bee Gees with their single This Is Where I Came In (Polydor).

Rosenauer reckons that the reason so many radio stations across Europe have picked up on the song is due to "a respect for, and awe of, the Bee Gees name. They are a great band who have been around for a long time, and they have built up a large fan base," he notes. "For young people they might have a certain cult appeal. Their music keeps changing and this song doesn't have any of the Saturday Night Fever feel to it. Yet it fits the CHR format.

Looking ahead, Westlife are almost guaranteed an entry in next week's European Radio Top 50. Their Billy Joel cover Uptown Girl (RCA) has shot up from 83 to number 51 on this week's chart.

EU ministers pass Digital Copyright Directive

BRUSSELS — EU ministers have given their final agreement to the hotly-contested Digital Copyright Directive.

The EU's Council of Ministers backed last minute amendments to the proposal from the European Parliament, which had sought to strengthen the legal rights of copyright holders by insisting that copies

should not be made for "indirect" commercial gain. This strengthened the previous draft, which only covered "direct" commercial gain.

Ministers and the European Commission had judged that these changes reflected the delicate balance struck last year at the Council, following months of wrangling over the conflicting rights of copyright holders, libraries and academic researchers.

Following the April 9 vote by the Council to finally pass the Directive into European law, the EU Internal Commissioner Bolkestein said: "This is a very significant achievement. Not only is this Directive the most important measure ever to be adopted by Europe in the copyright field, but it brings European copyright rules into the digital age. Europe's creators, artists

and copyright industries can now look forward with renewed confidence to the challenges posed by electronic commerce.'

Adoption and implementation of the Directive by member states will enable the EU to ratify the World Intellectual Property Organisation's 1996 Phonograms and Performances Treaty on the protection of performers and phonogram producers.

MTV buys Music Factory

den one. "In our annual report, published half a year ago, we mentioned that we were looking for a strategic partner, so we have been working on this deal for several months.'

The TMF sale marks Wegener's latest retreat from the music and entertainment business, following its disposal of the Arcade Music group in 1999. It admits that it is also now actively pursuing "a separate partnership" for its commercial radio interests in the Netherlands, which comprise Gold station Radio 10 FM and Soft AC cable outlet Love Radio.

Noting that the TMF purchase marks something of a change in strategy for MTV in Europe, Simon Guild, chief operating officer for MTV Europe, comments: "This opportunity arose and it seemed like a fantastic way to



take a big leap forward. While we have invested organically, they [TMF] have clearly gone in there much faster to a more localised place than we have been going. We have been focussing on our markets not one at a time, but almost. We were relatively small in Benelux, so this was an opportunity for us to build a substantial presence in music television there.'

Asked whether this could be the start of further acquisitions for MTV in Europe, Guild responds: "It could

well be, if the opportunity exists for buying more businesses where it fits with us and where we can add some value. This [TMF deal] is about building a better offer for the audience, for advertisers and for the music industry, and diversifying as much as possible."

Wegener's Houwert tells M&M that both TMF and MTV NL "will continue to exist" after the deal, and a statement from MTV claims that no job losses will result, although it says it hopes to "realise synergies between TMF and its existing skills and oper-

Guild tells M&M that decisions on the future programming formats of TMF and MTV NL—which at present compete for a broadly similar youth audience-will be taken by the local

management. "It won't be up to us sitting here in London to tell them how to do it," he says. "We want to hear from people in the Netherlands what they think the best way forward is. We want to give it some time. We are definitely going to keep the [TMF] brand and the employees. These are the two major assets we've bought-people who have been doing a great job and a brand that's very strong in the market."

Guild is also excited about TMF's strong Internet presence. "This is a real opportunity for us. We think we can build on the infrastructure they have created to grow this more. This is all about expansion, expanding both MTV and TMF through this acquisition and building some great businesses both in TV and online."

No panic on revenues

revenues. Sales director of the Capital Radio group Chris Bennett admits that "it's the severity of the slowdown, and the speed that it has happened that has taken us all by surprise." He says that revenue never really picked up after the Christmas break. "We are still suffering from a New Year hangover-and it's now spring.'

Media services agency Zenith Media have downgraded UK radio's predicted revenue growth for 2001 by nearly half, from 15% to 7.9%, although the latter figure is still nearly double Zenith's revised growth rate for all UK media in 2001 of 3.6%. This means that, although revenues will be down, UK radio is likely to increase its share of the advertising market. Earlier this year, Zenith predicted a 9.6% growth in European radio revenues in 2001, but this figure has yet to be revised.

John Quinn, commercial director of London-based Unique The Production Company, who previously worked in radio sales at Kiss 100, Atlantic 252 and Virgin Radio, says: "Capital's profits warning has been taken a bit out of context. They had a huge increase year-on-year last year. That can't be sustained because a lot of that was riding on the back of the over-hyped tech market."

The factors behind the ad downturn seem to be manifold, but industry executives and analysts point to a general malaise, a drop in dotcom advertising and a downturn in the US market.

"The problems began in the States in the tech market stocks," notes "A lot of companies have burnt all the cash they had through

their initial funding, which has led to a break in confidence in the market. That drop in confidence has led to a lot of the issues we are involving ourselves in now."

However, Alain Neuville, chief executive of Paris-based European media consultancy company Anima, says that this year's first quarter advertising figures and the forecasts for the rest of the year should not be seen as being unduly bad for the radio industry, given that they come hot on the heels of "a record year in 2000".

"Last year, in most countries including the US and with most media, the problem was servicing the clients as space was scarce," he elaborates. "Besides, we were fully into the dotcom craze. So it really doesn't come as a major surprise that 2001 will not be as good. It seems to me that, as the year goes by, we will probably come with a flat year in terms of ad expenditure, which in itself will be quite an achievement, taking into account what a good year 2000 was."

Commenting on the recent drop in value of media stocks in Europe, Neuville believes there has probably been some overreaction from the mar-"The market was reacting to recent announcements to the advertising situation, but you have to take it with a pinch of salt—the stock market is probably reacting to the fact that most media companies posted record revenues and profits last year and they are quite likely to be lower this year."

Susanna Bervå, managing director of the MTG Radio group in Sweden, believes that customers are scrutinising their ad budgets more carecontinued from page 1

fully in 2001. "We increased 10% last year and that will not happen this year. But I am not worried yet.'

She adds: "There's not so much dotcom money around as there was last year, and we feel that they have disappeared, but not enough to lower the overall revenue. It's been a slow start to the year, but we haven't yet seen a reduction in advertising revenue.'

While, following Capital Radio's profit warnings, share prices for the UK's GWR Group also slipped, the latter remains upbeat about the current revenue situation, saying it expects its own ad revenues to increase by 10% this year.

"We are taking a more active view of the economy than other people," says Simon Cooper, GWR's group public affairs director. "There has been an upturn in US indicators since the profit warnings were issued and we take a more positive view than others on that."

The relative optimism at GWR reflects the company's greater reliance on local advertising. "Around 40% of our income comes from locally-booked advertising," says Cooper. "And that's much more resistant to change than national advertising."

Capital's Bennett says the way to combat the trend is by not panicking. "We carry on doing what we're good at. We've come on a long way since the last slump in 1991-92, and the radio industry is more sophisticated than it was. We are appraising the deals we do and are looking for larger shares of smaller budgets.

matic figure. His 1982 hit Vita Spericolata (Dangerous Life) became something of an anthem for Italian youth. Born the son of truck driver near Modena, the home town of Luciano Pavarotti, he has had a somewhat chequered past-including a brief stint in prison for cocaine possession. And yet, says De Robertis, Vasco "has long since shaken off the bad boy image and he has now reached maturity".

That maturity is reflected in the time and care taken to make the new album. Recording took place in Bologna at the Chorus and Fonoprint studios before moving on to Los Angeles' Hanson Studios. The record was then mixed at Townhouse in London and Capri Digital Studios-a process which took over a year from recording to mastering.

"This time we invited many of the principal retailers to hear bits of the album as it was being made in the studio, to give them the idea of a work in progress," reveals Clary.

Stupido Hotel, the title track of

which is a tribute to the tedium of a musician's nomadic existence, is accompanied by an innovative game at the album's official website (www/stupidohotel.it). Visitors can enter the hotel and, if they make it all the way into Vasco's room, they get to listen to tracks from the album.

Elmi, meanwhile, is particularly pleased with the track Ti Accontento, featuring rapper Black Diamond. "I don't know whether this is the first an American rapper has appeared on an album by an Italian artist, but it's pretty original," he says.

Hotline has learned that seven or eight bidders have expressed interest in Ireland-based long wave station Atlantic 252, which has been put up for sale (again!) by current owner RTL Group. Sources say the price tag for the station, which covers two-thirds of the UK with its CHR/dance format, could be in the region of £20-40 million (\le 32-64m). Meanwhile, a number of other RTL stations are also rumoured to be on the market, and one source, a former executive for the group, even goes as far as suggesting that RTL Group's entire radio portfolio could be up for sale, since RTL's new majority owner Bertelsmann is more interested in developing the broadcaster's TV assets.

The Universal Music Group (UMG) has agreed to acquire US-based online service EMusic for roughly \$23 million (€25.3m). The deal gives UMG access to EMusic's catalogue of 13,000 indie albums, which are likely to be included in UMG's new Duet subscription service with Sony Music.

Groupo Prisa's chairman Jesus de Polanco has been officially named the richest man in Spain. He owns 64.3% of the leading Spanish media group, whose assets include radio stations Los 40 Principales, M-80 and Cadena Dial, as well as the daily El Pais newspaper. His wealth is estimated at €2.3 billion, according to business publication Actualidad Economica.

At EMI Music Publishing UK, Caryn Tomlinson, who was head of corporate PR for the company, is leaving after seven years. She will join Rolling Stones frontman Mick Jagger as business coordinator. Jagger is currently working on a solo project and preparing for the 40th anniversary of the Stones next year.

Hot on the heels of the Beatles *I* compilation, **EMI Records** is gearing up for a **Pink Floyd** greatest hits, due to be released the first week of November. The announcement was made in London during a presentation to retailers by **EMI:Chrysalis** UK MD **Mark Collen**. "The record will be aimed at a mainstream audience," said Collen, adding that the track listing is currently being finalised.

project director Bill Morris.

BMG has chosen Vitaminic to be its pan-European partner in its offer of free downloads to promote the label's artists, including Outkast, Dave Matthews Band and Etta James. The partnership follows Vitaminic's recent successful commercial deals with Sony, Universal and BMG in the US.

Finally, the Italian government has told Radio Vatican that the power supply to its radio transmitters will be cut off unless the religious station does not comply with new restrictions on its transmitter power by April 16. The warning follows a survey indicating that electromagnetic radiation from the transmitters could be responsible for an abnormally high level of infantile leukemia in the villages near Rome where the masts are located.

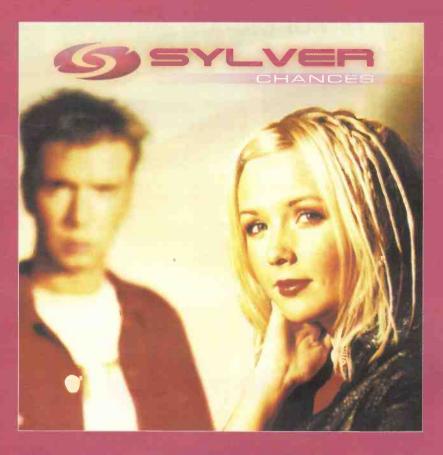
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
