# US radio giants set to buy UK stations?

LONDON — The radio industry has been

expressing its surprise at the contents of the UK government's draft Communications Bill, which proposes allowing non-EU companies to own majority shareholdings in British broadcasters for the first time.

for the first time.

It means that—if the Bill is passed in its current form—US media giants such as Clear Channel, Viacom, Disney and AOL Time Warner will be able to take full control of UK radio and TV groups, despite the fact that foreign companies are barred from controlling US broadcasters. The government's

PARIS — A teenage Filipino artist signed to a UK-based indie label but broken in France looks well placed to become one of pop music's sensations of this summer.

Nineteen-year-old Billy Crawford's single *Trackin*' on V2 Music has already spent over 30 weeks on M&M's Eurochart Hot 100 Singles—mostly due to its popularity in France.

The French success for the US-based dancer, singer and actor (he is scheduled to start filming a prequel to The Exorcist in June) came after *Trackin'* went to radio at the end of June last year, and went top of the French airplay charts by the end of August 2001.

# La Falce calls for lower CD prices

MILAN — Universal Music Italy president Piero La Falce has controversially called upon the industry to lower CD prices as part of its fight against musical piracy and poor record sales.

"One of the solutions that we propose is that full-price albums should be lowered from 20 euros to 15 euros—something that we did during this year's Sanremo Festival for albums by Gianluca Grignani and Francesco Renga—and which we will now do for Francesco Tricarico; a midprice of 10 euros and a catalogue price of five euros. I hope that our colleagues at other labels will follow suit."


La Falce made his appeal to a group of journalists invited to Universal's Milan headquarters for a press conference entitled "The boom in music: the crisis in record sales" on May 7.

La Falce told M&M afterwards that he sees price cuts as a way of bringing people back into record shops.

"I don't share the view that CDs in Italy are too expensive but, when you're competing against the free music of piracy, then they can seem expensive," he said. "I expect that this will provoke a reaction from other labels but, in these troubled times, I think that could be a good thing. After all, when Universal, along with EMI, threatened to boycott this year's Sanremo Festival, that produced results."

La Falce adds: "I also hope that this announcement will encourage the industry as a whole to look at its costs of production." In order to illustrate his point, he presented a pie chart of the typical costs of a full-price CD album. They were royalties (28%),

# Upfront

Just when we all thought that we pretty much knew what was going to be in the UK government's draft Communications Bill, culture secretary Tessa Jowell has sprung something of a surprise.

If the Labour government's bill gets passed in its current form, companies from outside the EU will now be able to buy majority stakes in British broadcasting companies; something not even the ultra-freemarket Lady Thatcher dared to suggest during her tenure of office.

The UK media was last week making a big fuss about fact that, following the proposed changes to cross-media ownership rules, Rupert Murdoch's BSkyB will be now be allowed to buy terrestrial TV broadcaster Channel 5. Yet surely this is a minor detail compared to the significance of US media giants such as AOL Time Warner, Viacom, Disney and Clear Channel being allowed to buy the country's biggest and most prestigious commercial broadcasters.

The government's logic seems a little curious on this one. We have been consistently told that the main justification for relaxing internal UK ownership restrictions is so that leading British media companies can gobble up their domestic competitors and grow larger, thereby being able to compete effectively on the international stage. Yet the concern must be

that, if the government at the same time also gets rid of the non-EU ownership restriction, these companies will never get that chance to develop. To put it bluntly, a company such as Capital Radio may become part of Clear Channel before it ever gets the chance to compete with Clear Channel.

The decision of the UK government has implications for the rest of Europe, too. If the Communications Bill is passed in its present form, Britain will become the first major EU country to allow non-EU ownership of its terrestrial broadcasters—at present, only a handful of smaller countries such as Denmark and Norway permit non-EU ownership. It will also surely reduce the chances of continental European groups such as NRJ and RTL/Bertelsmann making headway into the UK market.

The "US invasion" may not happen overnight, though, and possibly may never happen, particularly in the radio sector where UK stations are priced very highly. And in their past public pronouncements, US radio companies with overseas ambitions have gener-

ally said that they prefer to work in partnership with local broadcasters rather than going for 100% take-overs.

Interestingly enough, Clear Channel's CEO Lowry Mays is due to give a keynote address at the UK Radio Festival in Cambridge on July 2. Delegates had better pay attention-'cos he could soon be their new boss

## Virgin Spain freezes three imprints

MADRID - Virgin Spain has suspendoperations at three of its imprints-Chewaka, Yerbabuena and Drac-in a significant cost-

cutting move.

No frontline music staffers have been made redundant, however, and Virgin Spain managing director Lydia Fernández says that "virtually all artists" have been retained.

"Times and market situations change, and we're being hit by 30% piracy lev-

els, as well as media phenomena such as [TV talent show] Operación Triunfo, which eat away the market from our artists," says Fernández. "So I see myself irremediably obliged to redefine my strategies and to re-arrange Virgin's structure."

All three imprints were launched in the last five years. Their artists, including flamenco singers Estrella

Morente (pictured) and her father Enrique (both on Chewaka), locallysigned Cubans Eliades Ochoa and Pepesito Reyes (on world music imprint Yerbabuena) and those on

Barcelona-based Drac, are all moving to Virgin Spain.

imprints will The remain as a trademark, and their logos will still be used on new releases. An unspecified number of Virgin back-office staff are being transferred to EMI Spain's main offices just outside Madrid.

"Only the structure of the imprints is on hold, and when the market permits we shall fully reestablish the working structure of these labels," says Fernández. "The teams that head the three labels remain with Virgin."

The label directors are Javier Liñan (Chewaka), Rafael Prieto (Yerbabuena), and Gerardo Sanz

News of the restructure was initially revealed in a note sent by Fernández to the local music media. "Due to the current market situation, I feel the need to give the following explanation to the media," it began, and was followed by a history of Virgin Spain since the her arrival at the label in 1993, when a domestic roster was first formed.

During that period Virgin Spain's market share rose from just 2% in 1993 to peak at 10% in 1998, and is now steady at around 7%.

Virgin Spain executive manager Patricia Munn says the changes are not the result of pressure from new EMI Recorded Music Spain president Roberto "Chacho" Ruiz.

"There was a union of interests between the two, and Lydia made the decisions-they were not necessarily imposed on her," says Munn.

Fernández declined to give details of either the company's current losses or the savings expected from the cost-cutting exercise.



# Emap secures student radio slots ON THE BEAT

LONDON — The UK's Emap Performance Network (EPN) is to run three of its networked radio shows on student radio network SBN, after signing a commercial content deal.

"This coincides with a new way of thinking," says Emap Advertising broadcast sales director Tim Bleakley. "Them raising their profile as well as us extending our brands. It's a case of quid pro quo."

From September SBN-which provides campus radio stations around Britain with a free sustaining service-will carry three EPN programmes: Friday Night Kiss, the dance show presented by Bam Bam

which already goes out on EPN's London dance station Kiss 100 and its local CHR Big City Network; the pop show The Smash Hits Chart, which is also carried by the Big City stations; and a brand new rock programme, the Kerrang! Show. The three Emap shows will SBN-produced replace shows and will be broadcast across the 49 student radio stations which currently take SBN's service.
"This is part of us


improving programming quality," says SBN managing director Chris Spratling. "It's a cute deal for Emapthey extend their Friday Night Kiss show and give it national coverage—and, at the same time, it's content our listeners will enjoy."

As the Friday Night Kiss and The Smash Hits Chart shows are already aired on Emap Big City stations, a few student stations will find themselves duplicateing the output of their their local commercial stations.

But Spratling Bleakley contend there is no conflict. "The students are listening to their stations," argues Bleakley. "The Kiss show is marketed as a dance show for them. SBN maintains its listeners and we extend our reach.'

Spratling adds: "Most students don't listen to commercial radio."

SBN is jointly owned by Campus Media and Channelfly, and has been quoted on the Alternative Investment Market since March.

## Universal, AIM sign 'burning' deals with VMS

LONDON — Universal Music and UK indies body AIM have signed deals with CDburning company Virtual Music Stores (VMS) to allow their repertoire to be made available to the public via VMS kiosks in UK stores.

The kiosks allow customers to burn their own compilation CDs, with selected tracks being transferred from the repertoire owner via satellite to an instore "pressing plant".

"This deal enables us to open up digital distribution channels to our retail partners," says Steve Gallant, commercial director of Universal Music UK. "This will enable consumers to access much wider ranges of titles from every type of retailer

than the physical con-straints of stock holding would normally allow."

Both deals are nonexclusive and cover both catalogue and new releases.

The AIM agreement creates a framework for the body's 650 member labels to

make their music available to the public. Mushroom Records has already confirmed its partic-

"This is a brilliant deal, as it will enable AIM's mem-

bers to distribute their music through the High Street in a new and innovative way," says AIM's chief executive Alison Wenham.

After completing successful trials with newsagent WH Smiths and UK supermarket chain Sainsbury's, VMS began trialling its system with supermarket chain Tesco in March.

Adam Turner (pictured), managing director of VMS. predicts: "The ability to increase choice with no

inventory risk will help sell more music to more people and revenues grow across the board."

Following similar previous agreements with EMI and BMG, Sony and

Warner are the only major labels yet to sign up with VMS, although Turner tells M&M that "in principle we have the backing of all the majors, and it's just a question of finalising a couple of

#### POLITICIAN GUNNED DOWN OUTSIDE 3FM

HILVERSUM — Dutch public CHR station Radio 3FM immediately changed its programming following the murder of right-wing politician Pim Fortuyn just outside its studios. Fortuyn had been at 3FM to give a live election campaign interview. Normal music programming was suspended in favour of sombre music and e-mails from shocked listeners. Paul van der Lugt, programme controller at 3FM—who witnessed the murder—posted a message on 3FM's website. "We are shocked," he wrote. "A human being has been murdered right at our door-a door that always has been wide open for everyone's opinion."

LONDON — UK labels' body the BPI is sounding out retailers about campaigns to promote British music in Japan and Germany, in a move similar to its upcoming project with Virgin Megastores in the US. The BPI has approached Tower Records as a potential retail partner for a drive to celebrate British music in Japan; however, talks have not progressed due to the chain's pressing financial concerns. Any tie-ups are unlikely to come to fruition before the completion of the month-long "Best of British" promotion in the US, set for July 9-August 4 at six major Virgin outlets.

#### RNE RADIO 3 CELEBRATES CONCERT MILESTONE

MADRID — On May 5, Spanish public broadcaster RNE marked the 600th edition of its liveradio and TV concert series with the broadcast of a "best of" show on Radio 3 and La 2 TV. "Radio 3's daily concerts are

# Music specialists score at Sonys ON THE BEAT


LONDON - Three of the UK's most enduring specialist music broadcasters were honoured at the 20th Academy Sonv Radio London's Awards at Grosvenor House Hotel on May 2.

John Peel, who has been presenting alternative music shows on public CHR network BBC Radio 1 since its inception in 1967, was presented with the Gold Award for his contribution to the industry. World music specialist Charlie Gillett took home the Specialist Music Award for his work at BBC London, another world and

music enthusiast, Andy Kershaw, received two accolades-the Music Programming Award (for single programmes) and the Speech Award—for work at public classical station BBC Radio 3.

It was an emotional night for John Peel, who dedicated the award to his former producer John Walters, who died last year.

judges cited The the "impressive breadth as well as length" of Peel's radio career-he has successfully diversified into speech radio in recent years with his Home Truths show for the BBC's flagship speech station Radio 4.



This year Charlie Gillett celebrates 30 years of presenting specialist music shows in the London radio market. The Sony Awards judges described Gillett, who currently works for public full-service station BBC London, as "beyond convention—the quiet master of music journalism."

Accepting his Music Programming Award, Andy

praised BBC Kershaw Radio 3 controller Roger Wright "for having the guts to put me on Radio 3" after his long career at BBC Radio 1 had come to an end.

In a night dominated by the BBC, the Emap Performance Network was the

star commercial radio performer, picking up the awards for Station of the Year with an audience over one million (Radio City 96.7/Liverpool); the Station Sound Award (Kiss 100/London); and the Competition Award (96.3 Radio Aire/Leeds). The GWR Group scored a victory in the Station of the Year with an audience under 300,000 category through its

CHR outlet in Milton Keynes, FM 103 Horizon.

National station of the year was, for the second year running, the BBC's AC/MOR network BBC Radio 2, which the judges said enjoyed "an impressive command of its market." The station's Terry Wogan beat off stiff competition to win the Breakfast Music Award

#### BARTOLI TOPS CLASSICAL BRIT NOMINATIONS

LONDON — Italian opera singer Cecilia Bartoli (pictured) has received three nominations ahead of the third annual Classical Brit Awards, set to take place at London's Royal Albert Hall on May 23. Her album Gluck, Italian Arias (Decca/Universal) is up for Album Of The Year, and she is

also nominated as Female Artist Of The Year and for the Critics' Award, voted on by a panel of UK media representatives. Veteran Hollywood composers Tan Dun, Howard Shore and Hans Zimmer will compete for the new category of Contemporary Music Award.

#### CLEAR CHANNEL EXPLORES UK SPONSORSHIP DEALS

- Concert promoter Clear Channel Entertainment (CCE)'s European music unit has named James Campling as UK sponsorship director as part of its bid to expand its sponsorship activities. Campling, former head of sponsorship at London-based Capital Radio, will report to Tim Smale, CCE Europe's sales VP for the UK, and another former Capital Radio employee. Smale, who joined CCE Europe last year, recently helped the company complete its three-year sponsorship deal with UK brewers Carling.

#### SEMEL SLAMS MUSIC INDUSTRY'S ONLINE EFFORTS

Los Angeles — Terry Semel, chairman of Internet giant Yahoo and former co-head of Warner Music and Warner Bros. studios, has attacked record companies for failing to deliver content for online distribution. At a conference in Los Angeles, Semel urged the music industry to adapt its business model to make room for online services. He criticised the majors for not making content available and for keeping control of their content through their Pressplay and MusicNet platforms. "The music companies got together and made sure nobody could touch it," said Semel. "[The platforms] have limited amounts of music and they're not offering what people want."

## MNR enjoys newfound financial stability

STOCKHOLM — Sweden's Music Network Records Group (MNW) has begun the year on a more even keel, after four years of financial problems, executive turmoil and unsuccessful attempts to sell its operations.

According to figures issued for the first quarter of 2002, MNW posted profits Skr 100,000 (euros 10,673) on revenues of Skr 41 million, compared to a deficit of Skr 6.2 million on revenues of Skr 49.3 million last year.

The situation is very different from 2000, when Connolly replaced Terry Peter Yngen

president/CEO of the company in order to sell it off. The total deficit then was Skr 46.5 million on revenues of Skr 164 million. Connolly left the company last year after failing to find any suitors.

Since then, the company—now headed by Niklas Nyman-has hired a new board of directors, downsized its staff, reduced the number of represented labels, terminated several regional offices, divested itself of its joint ventures and decreased its involvement in music publishing.

"The MNW I inherited," explains Nyman, "had an unclear strategy and vision, created a lot of expensive

side-projects, employed a lot of people, and generally cost too much to run."

MNW has now defined its core business area as being a record company, overseen by head of A&R Per Helin, who says he is focusing on "strengthening the MNW imprint as our main source for Swedish language repertoire."

Among the labels represented by MNW are V2, Rykodisc, Burning Heart, Nuclear Blast and Music For Nations.



Despite its rather inauspicious name, ORB Fritz is one of the most radical stations in Europe, providing the German capital Berlin and the surrounding state of Brandenburg with an adventurous diet of fresh new music. *Michael Lawton* reports.





ritz may conjure up the image of a fat middle-aged man who likes watching football on television with a beer in hand and spends his summer barbecuing in the back garden, but it's also the name of Berlin-Brandenburg public broadcaster ORB's youth station.

The somewhat uninteresting name is believed to have been the idea of the station's director-general back in 1993, who is said to have taken it from a car dealer called Fritz near the then studios. As EC Zander, the station's head of music programming, says: "You can't sing it or say it erotically, it's very German, and not at all hip. We weren't happy with it at first, but it's worked."

In fact, the name Fritz is so bad, it's good, and that fits the disrespectful image of the station quite well. Until recently, Fritz came out of the overcrowded studios at the ORB's broadcasting centre in Potsdam, and its studios resembled a shared student flat. Now, Fritz has moved to spacious new digital studios next door, and it will take some time before the place once again looks like it sounds on air.

#### Mainstream competition

Fritz fills a particular niche in the Berlin-Brandenburg market, but Zander says the station's main competition is not, as you might expect, Berlin CHR stations KISS FM or Energy, but the Brandenburg regional market-leader, Hot AC-formatted rs2. "The main competition is Dad saying Turn that rubbish off' at breakfast time," he says, but adds that he also notices a tendency for young Berliners to turn to the main-

stream stations themselves.

Fritz is also partly funded by the Berlin-based public broadcaster SFB, under a co-operation agreement with Brandenburg-based ORB. The two public broadcasters produce eight stations jointly for the whole region, and two stations specifically for their own markets. Fritz doesn't do very well in the competitive Berlin market, coming ninth in the

latest MA figures with 39,000 listeners per average daytime hour. It's fourth in Brandenburg, however, with 85,000

Freestyle format

Zander refuses to place Fritz in any format pigeon-hole—he describers it as "freestyle"—but most people would call describe it as alternative, or at the very least, extremely edgy CHR. Bernd Albrecht, one of the station's four music producers, says that Fritz's music is selected by gut feel, backed up by discussion. "It's a strange idea," he muses, "that some stations should test music like washing powder. My stomach turns at the thought. We are music lovers here."

There's no formal playlist meeting at Fritz. Instead, each of the station's four producers listen to new CDs and sticks a post-it note on those they think are good. If everybody likes something, it automatically gets scheduled via Selector. If there's disagreement, they discuss it; if two producers like it and the other two are indifferent, it still goes in. "Some music polarises, and you have to think hard about when you play it, but we trust each other's taste," says Albrecht. "Record companies should stop complaining that radio stations don't play new music.

music. Each evening offers a different speciality—rock, hip hop, electronica, jungle, techno and hard n' heavy—with well-known presenters such as Marusha and Paul van Dyk. And every Sunday (19.00-20.00) Fritz plays an hour of unsigned bands and artists from

tion also records bands in session, and boasts its own record label, BerlinMachtSchule.

"We were the first station to play Rammstein, and many bands, such as Die Toten Hosen, Die Ärzte, Fantastisches Vier and Fettes Brot say that we had the courage to play them when others didn't," says Zander. "For example, we were the only ones to play Die Toten Hosen and Die Ärzte's antiright-wing political songs."

Zander says the record companies tend to push Fritz harder than most stations, because they know it's more receptive to new music. "They go to great lengths," he says. "We've even been invited on cruises to the Caribbean, which of course we haven't taken!"

Although the music is important, it's ultimately the presenters who connect the station to its listeners. Uniquely, all the weekday daytime presenters work on a one week-on, one-week-off rotation basis. Breakfast and drivetime are both double-headed shows. "Our presenters aren't stars but they have to be good," says Zander.

The station has its own 24-hour newsroom, and Fritz is also able to draw upon the worldwide network of German public radio correspondents, some of whom are slowly learning to file the type of reports which fit into a youth station format.

Zander says that, when Fritz started, it kept quiet about its public radio status; now it announces the fact several times a day. "It was important to hide the connection at the start, because it wasn't felt to be helpful in positioning the station with young people," he says, "but now we can afford to be proud of it."

# The reinvention of Lauryn Hill



The success of Lauryn Hill's Grammy winning, multi-platinum debut album *The Miseducation Of Lauryn Hill* was certain to be a hard act to follow. Yet, with her live album of new music for Columbia, Hill abandons her hip-hop and R&B roots in favour of a solo acoustic performance. As such, the May 6 release of *Lauryn Hill MTV Unplugged No. 2.0*—originally premiered on MTV2 in the US in March—is a soul-bearing and bold move for such a high-profile artist.

According to Hill, the urge to perform in a stripped down format is something she wanted to do since she was a member of the Fugees. "When I was still with the Fugees I would pick up the guitar and I used to always say, 'Wyclef, just get out there and do that thing with the guitar'."

The 27 year-old's two-hour unplugged set is quite unconventional, but was welcomed by specialised outlets in the UK. "The album was worth the wait," says Willber Willberforce, programmes editor at BBC 1xtra, the new digital station for black music. "I'm sure the album will be a huge success. It embodies the best black music has to offer, from the first track you know that the double CD signifies the growth of an extremely talented artist—she's an artist that turns words into pictures—priceless," he continues

Shurwin Beckford, channel manager at UK's MTV Base agrees, "The album takes the MTV Unplugged series on another step, as Lauryn is a 'true' performer, and is perfectly suited to the unplugged platform. She is one of the most gen-



uine artists in black music; a true risk taker who speaks from the heart and the album proves her to be comfortable with herself and her music. The set will open the doors to new fans as it highlights what a complete, honest and truly talented performer she is, qualities that turn artists into legends." Lauryn Hill Unplugged was premiered in the UK on MTV BASE on April 21, and is repeated throughout May.

Jo Headland, marketing director at Columbia Records in the UK, says that Hill's new musical direction adds another dimension to the Unplugged series—one that will enable the artist to approach a broader audience. "Right from the beginning of her career Lauryn Hill has been a genre-defying artist," Headland says. "Her audience has reflected this and are equally diverse. The songs on MTV Unplugged contain her unique sense of soul and as such will undoubtedly connect to her fans."

Despite The Miseducation Of Lauryn Hill becoming the best-selling debut release ever for a female act—to date it's sold 12 million units—it's still not known when the artist's next studio album will surface or whether any of the songs on the new acoustic record will be included on it. Nevertheless, Headland believes that the Unplugged album will be a success in Europe, continuing Hill's musical legacy. "Lauryn has always had a broad audience—you don't sell a million albums in the UK alone without connecting to a wide spectrum of people. This album is part of Lauryn's continuing musical journey which never fails to generate interest and acclaim worldwide."

## Paola's pop confectionary sweetens Swedish radio

An art school graduate and avid toy collector, Paola—who prefers to withhold her surname—is a refreshing addition to the Swedish pop scene. The Chilean-born, Stockholm-bred club DJ and vocalist is somewhere between Belinda Carlisle-meets-Mamas And The Papas with a twist of contemporary rock courtesy of songwriter, producer, and Teddybears Sthlm guitarist Klas Åhlund.

Paola's often naïve and tender yet edgy sound is appealing to a range of AC and CHR-formatted stations across Sweden. The track Above The (Dolores Recordings/Virgin/EMI Candystore Sweden), commercially released April 29, is already added on several local student outlets and has obtained B-rotation at both public national CHR station Sveriges Radio P3 and public local AC station P5 Radio Stockholm. It has also been added on local CHR station Radio Match in Jönköping. "She's a cool girl and the song is a 'pearl'. It makes us sound fresh," says the station's head of music Karin Gunnarsson. The single has also secured B-rotation on Swedish youth TV channel ZTV and breaker rotation on MTV Nordic.



Her debut solo album *Stockcity Girl* is released domestically on May 13. In conjunction with the release, the artist is doing DJ sets in Stockholm and Gothenburg, and making several national TV

appearances and interviews with key magazines and newspapers. No European plans have yet been mapped out, according to her manager Alex Strehl at Sapphire Entertainment in Stockholm, who also represents compatriot pop acts Robyn and Titiyo.

Of his motivation to work with Paola, he enthuses: "She is a true artist with a personality and character that is hard to find." Virgin Records Sweden's VP of A&R, Klas Lunding, agrees: "The decision to work with Paola was a no-brainer for us. We knew her well, and she's perfect to work with."

Originally one of 18 members in the local hip hop/reggae/electronica collective Moder Jords Massiva and a stand-in vocalist on a Teddybears Sthlm track, Paola possesses a "go-ahead" attitude which nearly borders on being cynical. "I want to be on stage just like any other artist," she tells M&M. "I'm just as good as anyone else, if not better. There are many artists who complain that they don't get anywhere, but maybe it's because they're not talented enough. It's not always necessary to know the right people. You just need to take yourself seriously and obtain the tools you need to accomplish what you want."








#### DAVID CHARVET LEAP OF FAITH

native country, but with Leap Of Faith—co-written with Steve Robson and John McLaughlin—he sings in English for the first time. He adds, "I think Joe Cocker is the right person to sing this song. He sings it with a lot of emotion. Cocker is a 'big' singerit's like a new song and doesn't sound like a cover. It's very powerful and just right for the summer." British-born Cocker is now a 58year old grandfather who lives on a ranch in Colorado in the US. His new album is produced by John Shanks, who has previously worked with Sheryl Crow and Chris Isaak. 



M&M's weekly airplay analysis column

It would appear that people across Europe do very little work at all in May-the whole month seems to be crammed with public holidaysand, likewise, the European Radio Top 50 is moving at a more leisurely pace. However, a number of brand new tracks are bubbling

under, waiting to get on air in time for the summer.

Eminem's (pictured) controversial single Without Me (Interscope), in which he concludes that the world is a boring place when he is not in the headlines, tops the

Most Added chart, though without managing to squeeze into the Top 50.

Meanwhile, it seems that European radio still can't get enough of Kylie. While In Your Eyes, which topped the European Radio Top 50 in April, is still sitting at two, Kylie's new offering Love At First Sight (Parlophone) is quickly gaining airplay, in the UK in particular, and looks set for a high debut next week.

Stations including CHR formatted Bayern 3 in Germany, Beat 106 in the UK and The Voice in Denmark have added the track this week. If that wasn't enough, Kylie's rendition of Can't Get You Out Of My Head voiced over New Order's Blue Monday, as performed at the Brit Awards in February, has been picked up by radio under the title Can't Get Blue Monday Out Of My Head

delivering Despite some of the biggest hits of the last year, Kylie's recent press coverage has mainly concerned her bottom (pictured) and whether or not it has been surgically enhanced. Breakfast show host Mads Vangsø at CHR station The Voice in Denmark recently quit his job because he



refused to promote a station competition in which the winner will receive buttockenhancement treatment. "The Kylie Contest' is running under the banner "Win an arse like Kylie's," and involves listeners sending in photos of their bottoms so that the station staff can determine which derriere is in the most need of rearranging.

Vangsø has been replaced on the show by former Voice presenter "Lille" Lars Sandström, who had been working at a TV station also owned by Voice parent company SBS. A few years ago the Voice staged a similarly tasteful contest, giving away breast enhancement surgery.

Meanwhile, Westlife's Bop Bop Baby (S/RCA) is, as predicted, the highest new entry this week, at 46. Lighthouse Family follows closely at 47 with new track *Run* (Wild Card/Polydor). For next week, Irish girl band Bellefire's poppy version of All I Want Is You (Virgin), U2's classic Rattle And Hum (Island) track, may well break into the chart. Badly Drawn Boy's Silent Sigh, taken from Nick Hornby's latest film About A Boy's soundtrack, is also a strong contender.

pressing (8%), payments to collecting society SIAE (10.5%), distribution (7.5%), recording (8%), marketing (15%) and "residual" (23%).

La Falce said: "All areas are up for discussion in future contracts, and we have to look at ways of lowering the costs. The situation in Italy at the moment is disturbing, to say the least. The industry's turnover in 2001 fell by 8.6% [to euros 574.3 million] and the received wisdom is that the percentage fall for 2002 will be even more dramatic, somewhere between 15 and 20%. And yet this is happening at a time when concerts are selling out and sales of musical instruments are increasing. I'm sure that in a few years' time when the industry finds viable methods for selling music digitally all will be well but, until then, we have to find solutions to a major crisis."

When asked whether the lowering of prices, especially in the five euros catalogue category, might be counterproductive for the music industry, La Falce said: "Not at all. The plan to sell 150 titles at five euros is a temporary measure that will only be in operation until June 30. Our real aim is to bring attention to the state of the industry and to get consumers back into record shops."

A source at Universal Music International tells M&M the plan in Italy was designed to respond to a particular local situation. It is "an experiment" which which is unlikely to be extended to the rest of Europe.

### **UK Communications Bill**

ers' interests are best served by having as many potential people as possible interested in investing in our company. But from a practical politics approach, I find it slightly baffling. Radio spectrum is a one-off asset—it's in short supply and has a cultural significance. In the same way that we're not giving up our slots at Heathrow airport to the Americans without trying to get something back in return, I find it just odd that we're prepared to give up control of our broadcast spectrum without getting something back in return."

Paul Brown, chief executive of UK commercial radio trade body the CRCA agrees that "it's a funny way of doing business to say 'we'll let you all in and we'd very much like it if you'd let us in by return'."

However, Emap's Schoonmaker believes that even if the legislation is passed in its current form, US companies could be deterred by the high prices of UK radio stock. "I think there will be a flurry of excitement among bankers trying to earn their Christmas bonuses," he predicts, "but the prices are so high already that a company coming into the [UK] market without any existing synergies will find it very hard to stomach the prices."

Riley also concedes that "we might be too expensive for them," but warns that "the other possible view is that it's a no brainer—if [US radio companies] want to get bigger, we're a 50 million population market that speaks the same language. I would have thought it's more than likely that we'll see significant American interest."

M&M asked a number of US media groups for their reaction to the news that they may soon be allowed to own UK radio companies.

A spokesperson from Clear Channel Communications, the country's biggest radio group, says: "We welcome the proposed legislation in the UK. If it does become law, we believe that it provides opportunities for both buyers and sellers of radio properties and we will evaluate our position at that time."

Viacom, which owns 180 radio stations in 40 different countries (as well as 34 TV channels and music broadcaster MTV), said in a statement: "We welcome the UK's move toward deregulation and believe that it will ultimately stimulate the industry and the economy and provide more programming choices for British audiences. While we never speculate on specific deals, we would look seriously at any accretive opportunities to expand our core businesses internationally, including in the UK."

At Emmis Communications—which owns 22 radio stations in the US, as well as Slager Radio in Hungary and two stations in Argentina—spokeswoman Kate Healey was more cautious. "While we are extremely pleased with the successes we have experienced in Buenos Aires and in Hungary," she says, "our primary focus continues to be radio in the United States."

Elsewhere in the Communications Bill a number of cross-media ownership restrictions are lifted, giving newspaper and TV owners increased freedom to buy both local and national radio stations.

In terms of radio-specific legislation, the government—as expected—proposes abolition of the radio ownership "points" system which had limited radio groups to a 15% share of the market. This will be replaced by a system which imposes no national ownership limit but will require there to be at least three separate commercial radio owners (in addition to the BBC) in every local market.

However, this liberalisation still doesn't go far enough for the CRCA, which argues that the local ownership proposals are still too restrictive, particularly compared to the regimes being proposed in the bill for other media. "Our major concern is that local radio now appears to bear the remaining brunt of ownership regulation—we carry the torch for plurality," says the CRCA's Brown. "That seems to me a bit odd bearing in mind there are far more punchy media about in terms of size and resource."

Riley agrees that "I do think the radio-specific local ownership rules look unduly restrictive, and I think there will be some intense lobbying to try to get those pushed back. If the bill says [terrestrial TV channels] ITV and Channel 5 can come under common ownership at some point, how can that be reconciled with an insistence on three separate owners in local radio markets? Its non-sensical that the two things could be in the same bill."

## Billy Crawford comes of age

"That's rather fast for France," says V2 France managing director Sophie Zannettacci. "I found that the French media and the public reacted quite readily to Billy. The only stations that didn't play us were the ones outside the format."

Pierre Lebrun, music programmer at Paris-based national dance station Fun Radio, shares the view that Crawford is a major new talent. "He's the type of artist you should watch very closely," he says. "We can foresee a great career for this young man."

Released last October, *Trackin'* went platinum in France, reached number two in the Belgian charts, number one in the Netherlands, was a top five success in Switzerland and went into the

top 20 of the German charts.

"In general, that kind of instant take-up normally only occurs with established artists," says Zannettacci. "For a young artist like Billy, it's a lot more impressive. At the same time, when you see this artist perform, you realise that it's not a coincidence. He is a star."

Zannettacci says that Crawford's triumph in Europe was all the more impressive as "at the time when we broke Billy, there was huge competition, a lot of big stars. The new Michael Jackson album, Jamiroquai, Anastacia. We had to push a young artist through the middle of those established acts," she says.

The success in France prompted V2

to try to break the artist elsewhere and made him an international priority for the company. In January, V2 owner Richard Branson flew to Midem in Cannes to support his act, who was appearing at the NRJ Awards. On April 15, over 300 media people from around Europe were flown to Paris for a showcase by the artist to coincide with the release of his album.


The album, *Ride*, was released on April 16 in France, Belgium and Switzerland—where it has already shipped gold. It will be out early June in Germany and in Holland on May 13, "but we've not had time to do anything yet in the UK because of his commitments with The Exorcist film," says Frank Niedlich, international product

manager at V2 Music in London.

The push in the UK, Italy, Spain and Scandinavia will happen after the summer, adds Niedlich, followed by further touring and promo in mainland Europe. The follow-up single When You Think About Me is out in many European territories this month.

Although superficially similar to many of the current crop of teenage pop acts, Zannettacci considers Crawford a more long-term prospect. "He's going to explode everywhere, because it's not fabricated," Zannettacci says. "He didn't learn his career last year to release an album this year. He's a true entertainer who co-writes many of his songs."

As part of this restructuring, Music and Media's Netherlands-based publisher and international sales director Ron Betist has relinquished all his duties on the magazine, effective May 1.

Betist comments: "Music & Media has been an intricate part of my—and my family's—life, but all good things come to an end. It is now time for change. It has been an incredible, fun ride for me and it has been a wonderful experience to work with such an innovative group of people over the years."

Betist will remain a consultant to M&M. His publisher's duties will be taken over by M&M director of operations Kate Leech and editor-inchief Emmanuel Legrand. Both report to VNU

Entertainment Media UK managing director Jonathan Nowell.

"Ron has played an invaluable part in the history and the success of M&M, and we will miss his energy and his sense of humour," comments Leech. "We wish him all the best in his new challenges."

Joining Music & Media as international sales director is Archie Carmichael, effective May 9. Based in London, he will be in charge of defining and implementing M&M's advertising sales strategy, and will report to Leech.

Carmichael's 15-year career in the entertainment publishing industry includes stints at Screen International, Variety and Video Guide. Until recently he was international account manager at United Business Media, working on such titles as MBI, Fono and Music Week.

Hotline hears that Mariah Carey's new label, part of her new deal with Universal Music's Island Def Jam Music Group, is most likely to be called Monarc. Carey will sign the artists to the imprint, which will be run by Jerry Blair, with whom Carey worked while she was signed to Columbia Records.

25-year old **Simon Long** is the new programme director at London dance station **Kiss 100**. Former head of music at the **Emap Performance**-owned station, Long replaces **Andy Roberts**, who is now Emap's group programme director.

Michael Jackson has severed his ties with EMI Group—that is, the Michael Jackson who is president and CEO of the now Vivendi Universalowned Networks'USA Entertainment, and who was a non-executive director of EMI. His resignation, effective May 7, is to avoid a potential conflict of interests.

Official UK RAJAR audience figures for the first quarter of 2002, released just as M&M was going to press, brought bad news for two of the country's key music stations. Public CHR BBC Radio 1 continued its recent downward spiral, slumping to a 8.4% share (down from 9.1% last quarter), while London CHR 95.8 Capital FM recorded its lowest ever share of 10.0%, down from 10.9% last quarter. New regional MOR/talk station Saga 107.5, offering UK commercial radio's first "grey" format, debuted with a respectable 9% reach and a 3.7% share in the competitive West Midlands market. Detailed RAJAR analysis will appear in next week's issue.

France has a new minister of culture and communications in the shape of Jean-Jacques Aillagon, the 55-year-old president of the Georges Pomipidou Centre in Paris. Respected in the arts sector, Aillagon has little experience of the media world that will form the main part of his portfolio.

One media group has been particularly swift to react to publication of the UK government's draft Communications Bill (see story, front page). Guardian Media Group has tabled a £41 million offer for the Jazz FM group, in which it already owns a 18.5% stake. The Jazz FM board will meet in the next few days to consider the offer.

Export Music Sweden is preparing its first formally-organised assault on the French market on June 6, Sweden's national day. A press conference and three showcases featuring V2 act Eskobar (pictured), Virgin



artist Nicolai Dunger and the \$1000 Playboys (Massproduktion/MNW) will take place in Paris.

In the six months ending February 28, the UK's Chrysalis Group recorded a pre-tax profit of £648,000 (euros 1.04 million) compared to losses of £5.6 million in the same period last year, while turnover rose by 21% to £113.7m.

Finally, BMG and Lycos Europe are teaming up with The Mild Seven Renault F1 team in a marketing partnership, which will focus on joint promotional opportunities, including the attendance of BMG acts at Grand Prix events. The team drivers and BMG acts will also be involved in online promotions throughout the Lycos Europe network.




