

KENNY LYNCH scored a double triumph in the first British Song Festival on Wednesday night. He sang and wrote (with Hal Shaper) the winning entry—"I'll Stay By You" —gaining 115 points from a jury of 14 ITV

In second place came "Leave A Little Love" by Les Reed and Robin Conrad, and sung by Lulu, scoring 108 points. Third was "Long Time Comin'," written and featured by Wayne Fontana, gaining 99 points.

99 points.

This was the climax to a successful three-day Festival, at the Dome, Brighton, which did much to promote British songs, not only with the TV viewers, who followed the contest on three consecutive nights, but with song publishers from all over Europe who attended the event and took back many songs for publishing in their own countries.

countries.

The Festival, sponsored by the Music Publishers' Association, brought some 600 entries, from which the 16 songs were chosen. Most of these have been recorded by the singers presenting them in the Festival.
