



Are EPs and LPs more important than Singles?

ARE extended-play records collaring the market at the expense of singles? Are they slowly but systematically gaining in appeal, both with the fans and with recording artists? These but systematically gaining in appeal, both with the fans and with recording artists? These asks DEREK JOHNSON but systematically gaining in appeal, both with the fans and with recording artists? These questions are, of course, prompted by the recent Top Ten success of the Manfred Mann and Rolling Stones EPs. And all the evidence points to a decline in singles sales, and a corres-

ponding jump in the sales of both EPs and LPs. The drop in singles is, to some extent, understandable. The reason is two-fold. First, the regular seasonal slump, when sales figures invariably tail off, pending a renewed burst of activity leading up to the pre-Christmas peak.

Secondly, it was inevitable that sales would fall following the boom of the last two years. Demand for proof to reached an all-time high, records reached an all-time high. He was only to be expected that these abnormal figures could not be maintained.

At the same time sales of more expensive discs have increased proportionately. Could it be that the British market is following the pattern.


