

# Shouldn't he record instead of relaxing?

ELVIS PRESLEY has goue home to Memphis for the Christmas holidays; he's been gone almost a month and he will be there until early in January, enjoying THREE MONTHS of leisure. Nothing unusual about that for El—he's used to two days holiday for every one he works now!

How does he spend all that time? I got coneching of an insight into his life when we met in September—even though he was working at the time. I use the word "working" in the loosest possible sense since no one can have a more relaxed way of doing anything than Elsis Presley.

On the film set he calmly played scene after scene with little sign of effort. Between shooting he stood around on the set, arms folded and obviously at ease, although everyone around him gave the appear-ance of being a neurotic!

ance of being a neurotic?

At his house he sat watching television most of the time, surrounded by the twelve buddles whose daily tasks seem to be little more than keeping our El company. Leader of these is Joe Esposito, Joe and El met when they were both serving with the U.S. Army in Germany. Joe's most important role seems to be that of Presley-Parker Haison officer. He is also responsible for the security of Eris' movements.

If life at his mansion home in Memphis is anything like it is at Elvis' (rented) Bel Air home above Hollywood, then I picture him at home this weekend playing records, watching television and occasionally shaking hands with fans who have been brought in as a reward for hours of waiting at the gate.

A love life? He had a girl with him the evening I called; a vivacious brunette in a figure-hugging dress. Elvis did not introduce her. In fact, he rarely spoke to her and not once did I see him put a friendly arm round the girl or hold her hand. No, there was no sign of a burning romance there!




