"FIHS piquant and litting number, soloced by Paul McCartney on the Beatles' album, is really delightful. It's a simple yet charming metody, which resisters quickly, in fact I found myself humming it after only one spine—could well become a Beatle standard.

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

# Beatles get to No. 1; Stones racing up

The Beatles British chart-topper "We Can Work It Out" moves up one place to top next week's Hot 100 published by "Billboard," cables Nat Hentoff. The flipside "Day Tripper" goes up eight places to No. 10.


