As for Diana (and it's hard to keep off the topic of the tigerish Miss Ross), some light may be thrown on her own future plans by these quotes from an American magazine:

"I'd like to have my own televi-sion show, although it's very hard for a Negro. "I think it's a fact to say that Negroes do have to work twice as hard to get something like that.

"I mean, if we were three white girls who had as many hit records as we do, we'd probably have our own show by now. "Another thing I'd like to do is to get involved in the business end of the recording industry—producing records and so forth.

"And eventually, I'll finish a book I've just begun.
"It just tells about all the things that have happened to me in my life. Good . . , and bad."


