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

Georgie explained, "Nothing I've written has been

times but there was nothing to release as a single." That, I can imagine, is pretty frustrating, especially when you've been working with someone as talented as Bob Johnston who also records Bob Dylan.

"He's a very talented guy and easy to work with,"
Georgie commented, "and I'd like to do some more
with him if I go to the States. If we'd had more time
we could have got an album out, but we spent a bo
of time getting the sound and arrangement right."

"Peaceful" isn't the sort of song I'd normally sociate with Georgie and I asked him how he got hold

of it.

"I was chatting to Tony Bramwell of Apple in the Speakeasy one right about three or four months ago publishing it here and hg thought it'd be right for me. "It was recorded as a single and it's not what you'd call an instant amash by a long shot. In fact, no quite well. The trouble is, after a long gap people expect something special."

Georgie's road manager came into the dressing room to sort out some arrangements for the show. Georgie began to change and, as he did so, we talked some more about record-

"I want to handpick some guys for a single and then, if I could persuade them, go on the road with them," he said. "I don't want to devote my whole career to cabaret or special concerts."

He plans some work with the Harry South Band, beginning with a couple of broadcasts, and also wants to get some good material written.

"I'm a very casual person," he said with a grin. "I have to be pushed into things."




