



MAXWELL'S SILVER HAMMER

THIS is the most obviously commercial track on the Beatles' "Abbey Road" album and a version of it is bound to make the singles chart. But just which one, must depend largely on who gets the most TV and radio plugs as there's little difference in the treatment

of the three mentioned here. The song itself? Mid tempo, in-antly remembered melody with triguing and amusing McCartney rics set to a light piano and brush um backing.

FOR my money the version which has a slight edge comes from GEORGE HOWE on mes from GEORGE HOWE on MCA label who also has advantage of being the first the market.

The Philips cassette is a plastic box, 4½ inches long, 2½ inches wide and ½ inches deep, open at one (long) side so that the tape from one enclosed spool can run past the player's magnetic head (which produces the music) and then rewind on to the second spool.

The cassette has a window on each side to show you how much tape is on each spool, and an indication gauge under the window helps you locate passages on the tape.

## Rewinds

The players play from left to right only but have fast rewinds each way. Most players can be used as tape recorders as well as players.
