





KEITH EMERSON WANTS CLASSICAL MUSIC TO SURVIVE By RICHARD GREEN

ONE of the highspots of Keith Emerson's career occurred only a fortnight ago, When the Nice played with the London Symphony Orchestra at Croydon's Fair-field Halls. The reception was, to say the least, tumultuous and much of the credit for this outstanding success must go to Keith, who did the arrangements and wrote the new "Five Bridges Suite."

To organist-composer Keith, who will be 25 on Sunday, classical music is something which must not be allowed to fade with time. He has a duty to himself, it seems, to ensure that this does not happen and, to his credit, appears to be succeeding.
