

Glasgow Green.
Will it be as messy? As messy as the noble Scots can make it and, having won a Best New Festival award in 2017, it'll definitely be every bit as good. The headliners are world class, and though some of the support acts seem to be there to lure in passing trade on its way to All Bar One (hello James Bay), it's a winning list.
Still, what about them Monkeys, eh? Quite, TRNSMT is the only UK festival headline set Arctic Monkeys have announced so far.
So it's basically our only chance to see them in 2018? There is a tour, but this is your one for Monkeys-in-a-field thrills. Unless you happen to go to Europe at any point where, looking at their exhaustive schedule, they'll almost certainly be playing within 50 feet of your hotel.

The long-running new music festival has been a key hub of discovery for many years now. MIA, Janelle Monáe, Alabama Shakes and many more have all found a global audience after early appearances there.

The local music scene

Head to Austin on any regular week and you'll be able to find a ton of great bands to entertain you. Home of the likes of Spoon and White Denim, it's also a hotbed of up-and-coming talent, such as rock'n'rollers Black Pistol Fire or R&B singer Mélat, or the acoustic tenderness of Hovvdy.

The biggest artists always appear at Austin City Limits

The line-up for 2018 has yet to be announced, but you can bet it'll be another corker. Last year, Jay-Z, Red Hot Chili

Peppers, The xx, Skepta, and Chance The Rapper were among the acts to appear at the October event.

Levitation books the best of the underground

If you like your music a little weirder, Austin's got you covered too. The annual Levitation weekend brings together boundary-pushers and psych heroes. This year, they've nabbed big names including The Brian Jonestown Massacre, Ariel Pink and Ty Segall to play alongside Stranger Things soundtrackers S U R V I V E, Colombian funk troupe Superfónicos, Brazilian psych heads Boogarins and more.

It also boasts the longest-running music series in US TV history

The Austin City Limits TV series has been going since 1976 and there's even an

Janet Planet, Confidence Man

You were a big hit at the Aussie festivals last year, right?

"Yeah, Golden Plains was particularly insane. We'd only been a band for a month or two,

and within probably 10 minutes of us playing there was this huge crowd literally running down the hill. At, like, 2pm on a Sunday. That video went viral and we'd sold out our Melbourne

show before we got home."

Is having fun your key aim onstage?

"When I get up on stage I just kind of do my own thing, so the audience feels like they can do the same. That

in itself is the best part about the band, just getting up there and everyone thinking that what I'm doing is intentional – but actually I'm just not very good. People find that really freeing.

There's not enough dork in dance music these days, and that's what we bring a bit of. The more money we make, the more we'll throw at the show. I want to ride in on white horses."

Emo heroes **Fall Out Boy** are headlining Reading & Leeds this year. **Tom Connick** asked bassist **Pete Wentz** what to expect

You're headlining Reading & Leeds! You and that festival have some history.

Pete Wentz: "Yeah! We co-headlined before [in 2016], but we played second to last. It's just been a cool, real build for us over the years. We're pretty psyched."

What are your best memories of Reading & Leeds?

"I think that backstage is just wild, when you're like, 'Oh man, Trent Reznor just walked by' I grew up listening to Nine Inch Nails! It's super surreal. And then I once went with my buddy [DJ/producer] Dillon Francis – we went and watched a Knife Party set, they had this weird house thing built [on the stage], and that was pretty cool. The thing to me that is the wildest is the muddy, crazy

kids. It's hard to describe what it is to Americans who haven't experienced British festivals, because it just doesn't sound like it makes sense, but I'm like, 'No it's a lot of fun... but it's pretty crazy.'"

Panic! At The Disco are topping the bill as well – you've both been friends forever, and have followed a similar trajectory. Is it nice to both be topping the bill at the same time?

"Yeah, it's pretty crazy, and in some ways it's great for the perspective, because it's hard to see when you're the one looking out. Brendon [Urie, PIATD] really started young, as a kid, and to watch him, it's like, 'Wow, this guy is headlining this thing...' It feels pretty cool. It always feels better when you've made it with your friends."

You both started out as rock and emo bands, and you've moved towards a more diverse, pop-influenced sound – particularly on your new album 'Mania'. What brought that on?

"We went away for three years, and when we came back the landscape of music was utterly different. I mean like, how people listen to music – streaming was a thing, people were curating their own

playlists, and it really became apparent to us that genre mattered less. The kids are like, 'I can listen to Lil Uzi Vert and then I listen to Diplo and then I listen to Panic! At The Disco', or whatever. For us, it's freeing, because we were

always this band that leaned in other directions, but you're withheld a little bit by whatever you think the parameters are. In order to do new music that was compelling to people, we had to reinvent ourselves."

Were you worried about going out-and-out pop?

"Some of the stuff is there no matter what – Patrick [Stump]'s voice is real signature – but we had to reinvent the whole thing. Honestly, when you do something like that it can go one of two ways, it can either really work or really not work, and I think we got lucky, or like 'right place, right time', for it to work."

Reading & Leeds is similar – it used to be a rock and metal festival and now you've got rap acts such as Kendrick Lamar headlining.

"In my house, we live in a hip hop world. You go to the mall, and all these kids are dressed like Travis Scott, or Kanye, or

Migos. Ezra Koenig from Vampire Weekend tweeted something like, 'If Mick Jagger and Keith Richards started today, they'd start a squad not a band.' I do think it's a larger trend, but I also think that good stuff is just going to come through - you're gonna have all kinds of different, diverse stuff, and if it's good

and it reacts with people then it's still gonna make it through."

The emo scene you came up in has been re-evaluated, and 'post emo' artists like Lil Peep are mixing up rock, pop and hip-hop. Do you think emo is more accepted now?

"Totally. I think time does an interesting thing where you get far enough away from things and they look different. When The Beatles started, they were kind of a boy band, and as you get further and further away, time lends... maybe not credibility, but a different perspective on things."

What's next for Fall Out Boy?
 "We're in a brave new world. The Weeknd dropped six songs today, and iTunes announced that they're maybe shutting down iTunes. Right now is the time to be like nimble and lithe, and I think that Fall Out Boy is designed to do that. It's just full steam ahead - embrace it."





Leaders of the pack

Theo Ellis of Latitude-bound badasses **Wolf Alice** looks forward to a summer in the fields

You're supporting Liam Gallagher at Finsbury Park in June. What does that mean to you?

Theo Ellis: "I can't speak for everyone, but I think the general consensus is it's just f***ing mega really, innit! What's better than getting an offer to support Liam Gallagher? *That* is untouchable."

Which festival, if you had to choose one, do you want to headline?

"We want to headline

Glastonbury. It's the best festival, isn't it? I always went to Reading as a kid, but now that I've been to Glastonbury, I've realised that it's f***ing sick and I want to headline it."

You're headlining the BBC Radio 1 tent at Reading & Leeds. Does that feel like a milestone for you?

"Yeah, that was where all my friends went to watch our favourite bands – in that tent at that festival. It was always the bands that we thought were cool playing there and to

get the opportunity to headline, it's just really, really exciting."

What was the first festival Wolf Alice played and what are your memories of that?

"I wasn't in Wolf Alice when they played their first festival, but the first one I remember playing was *Barons Festival* in 2013. That was a classic night. Royal Blood were on before us and I remember everyone walking around going, 'Oi, those guys are gonna be really, really big' [Former tour manager and The Holloways drummer] Dave Danger also convinced the people who owned the bouncy

castle to let us go on for free cos we said we were doing a video interview for *NME*."

What's your funniest festival memory?

"Me and Ellie [Rowell, singer] set up a tent in the dark at Fieldview. We realised when these huge headlights and a couple of golf buggies were coming towards us that we'd pitched it in the middle of a road. When we played Reading a year, I went to sleep in the van. I remember just waking up and 'Sh*t, I've got to go play Reading', and finding the police were looking in the back of the Transit."
