Another slick chick with "I Love Billy J." written on her sweater, confessed, I'll Keep You Satisfied is his best record ever. "I'll buy it, and all my friends will too." So it seems, judging by just a few opinions that Mr. Kramer (what a marvellous pop name, by the way) is all set for another lengthy stay in the Top Five! With tour after tour ahead of Billy J. and The Dakotas, there are no indications that they are getting tired or even bored with the many routine jobs that have to be done before they go on-stage. This is one point everyone has noticed about Billy J. and the boys. How ready they are to give up whatever they are doing and help

Hi there!

A recent glance at the Top 30 revealed no fewer than fourteen "group" discs holding positions—what a change has taken place over the last twelve months! Out of these fourteen groups, eight fell into what could be called the "Mersey Sound" type of performers and it is worth noting that groups of this type occupied the first, second and third positions in the chart.

This completely disproves what has frequently been said in the past, that the charts were the preserve of just a few "regulars" and no matter what sort of disc "so-and-so" brought out it would go straight to No. 1. Ten of the discs in the chart in question were by artistes unknown a year ago. Yes, 1963 has disproved quite a few old theories about pop music and toppled one or two "Kings" from their thrones, which have been very smartly reoccupied by newcomers.

We hear constantly that the Northern groups will be ousted by a new sound coming from the Midlands or the South or the West Country. Will they be pushed out? Only time will tell-but at the moment they seem to me to be very firmly seated astride the top!



JUST LIKE HEINZ

Just Like Eddie a lot of people said, was maybe a bit too different to hit the charts. Fourteen weeks later it was still in the Top Ten! Heimz, the blond bomber with a stage act that leaves you open-mouthed, and a voice that is decidedly different sat in front of me, and talked about his latest release. The record? Country Boy. "I think it's going to get in the charts O.K." he said rather nervously. "I like it better than Just Like Eddie now. It has the same sort of different touches about it that Just Like Eddie had but the words are much easier to remember. I'm only hoping that it will get to No. 1."

Heinz himself, a tall, always well-dressed figure, is one of the most modest and politest stars I have ever met. There is a saying that some stars show their true feelings only when anyone from the Press isn't around, but not so with Heinz. With fans, friends, other stars, or even odd people, he still remains polite and very, very calm. I haven't met another pop singer so stirred by ambition, either. Heinz's nights and days are filled with plans, dreams, hopes, and whenever he isn't working (hardly ever) he sits drawing notes about a new stage act.

Recently, he proved that a good stage act, and Heinz has got to be seen to be believed, can stop a show at any time. In his current act, he jumps on to the top of a piano, and "Twists," singing at the same time whilst the group The Saints also get very near to the edge of the stage. On one of his shows recently, he found out, too late, that there wasn't any piano on the stage! Suddenly, halfway through a number he spotted a piano in the pit, about six feet away from the stage, and with one flying leap landed on top! The audience went wild, and Heinz himself had to stop singing as hundreds of girl fans attempted to pull him off the top of the piano!!

For the spring tour next year, Heinz reckons he has another new act which is guaranteed to raise the roof! What it is no one has heard, and certainly you won't hear about it or see it until the beginning of Heinz's spring tour. Back for a minute to the most important point in Heinz's career, indeed in the whole of his current activities—his new record, Country Boy. Everyone who attended a pre-hearing of the disc while I was there agreed on one thing—that it would reach the Top Five!

All they couldn't agree on was whether or not the disc would reach No. 1 I definitely say No. 1 or No. 2 and after the disc would reach with the disc pick of the week for you! On second thoughts I'll say a definite No. 1!



Let's Give Mike A Leg-up!!

Every so often, you will see the lines reading "so and so is one of our most under-rated artistes." Quite often, it's probably true, but forgive me if I push to the forefront an artiste who really is underrated, in my eyes, and I know thousands of fans will agree with me. Real name? Michael Bourne. When he appears on one-nighters, TV or radio, he is screamed at, fervently listened to and deafeningly applauded by a countless number of fans. Yet, somehow, he still isn't being rated as he

should be. Popularitywise he's very, very big. Recordwise, he turns out very good discs, which, as I mentioned earlier are either big sellers or hits. Stagewise, again, great reaction. Yet instead of being rated as on the same par as Adam or Joe Brown from a national newspaper point of view, there is hardly anything mentioned about him! In show biz, he is reckoned as one of the most talented singers, stage performers, and nicest guys one could meet, yet still the big nationals have not really spotted him.

Regardless of how good The Beatles are, surely some of the nationals and the big TV people could lay off for just a few weeks and try putting Mike Berry in the limelight. Plus also Mike has a great, great backing group in The Innocents who have also scored discwise with a vocal titled Stepping Stones. Mike's datebook is filled with one-

nighters, TV and radio, but still I say he isn't getting enough exposure for someone so popular.

Mike, I'm sure, would agree with me, but not in hearing distance of anyone, for he must be the original modest pop singer. I've yet to hear a fan complain about Mike Berry, except that they don't see enough of him!!

Little Richard speaking: "Those boys I heard on radio the other day. Carter-Lewis and The Southerners, wasn't it? Well, their sound is REALLY something. Those boys should be one

of your hottest properties . . .

Well, the boys ARE hot. But they haven't yet reached full heat. Their fans, their advisers, themselves—all hope that the latest disc from their dynamic pairs of tonsils will make it big. The title: Your Momma's Out Of Town—and it's a wow, knock-out, gem, triumph, sensation and sundry other words of praise.

They love the performing side of their lives. Fair enough. They get enough praise lavished on them by fellow performers—and the music business generally likes them enough to rave wildly. But they're determined to keep up with their song-writing. They've actually written the best part of 250 numbers, but Here's Hopin', a number which put them largely and roundly on the disc scene was NOT one of their own. That was by ex-John Barry sidesman Les Reed.

Say Messrs. Carter-Lewis: "We know what it is to struggle in this business. We can't help recalling the time we decided to break in on the London scene. We left our homes in Birmingham and decided to take cheap-day excursion tickets to London. We had to travel that way because we just didn't have enough money to spend the

night in London!

"We thought it'd all be so easy. It wasn't. We toted our songs round any number of publishers before meeting up with Terry Kennedy at Southern Music. He was interested enough to show us into the office of Bob Kingston, the boss there, and sure enough we signed a contract as song-writers."
The performing bits 'n' pieces came later. The boys first sang in a rather private way, by making demonstration discs of their own songs. This way they got their distinctive tones and harmonic variations across to people like Tommy Steele, Frank Ifield and Clinton Ford, who thought they were mad to concentrate purely on demo's when they could so easily turn out a hit record of their own. The boys took the hint. And Pye Records entered the scene.

Say the boys: "We've had a few stabs at disc success and we're glad to say our following is getting bigger all the time. Of course, we'd like to have the really big hit. Who wouldn't? We can only hope that Your Monma's Out of Town will be the one to make the

big break through.'

That's a thought that is agreed upon by many fans of Carter-Lewis and the backing boys. They're stylish enough to make hits all the time. They're talented enough to deserve 'em.

After a nerve-wracking summer season, he continues to get back into his old spirit in the same amazing way on his current autumn tour. In fact, from what various other artistes on the tour have said, this has been one of Billy's happiest tours yet. "We've all got pea-shooters and waterpistols" said one of The Tornados when I met them at Chesterfield ABC, "and we're having a marvellous time. Some people might think it's childish but it's not true, not really.

"It's just that we haven't had a chance to get outside the theatres because of the fans, so this is one way of not being so miserable!!" The two teams are made up of Billy Fury, The Tornados, sorry, half of The Tornados, half of The Wildcats and The Ramblers. The other team comprises Dickie Pride, half of The Wildcats, and the Karl Denver Trio!
