"Anything that holds back the development of new, more competitive ways of delivering the product that consumers want - that is, the music - should be the entire UK recordings industry.

In future Pickwick will be concentrating only on its three major multiple accounts in Ulster, and combining this with its budget service, under area manager Billy Steele. Gordon Smyth, managing director of Symphola, told RB that economic conditions in Northern Ireland allied to "horrendous unemployment", running at over 20 percent, were making record retailing an increasingly tough proposition. He pointed out that over the last 12 months over 15 shops had dropped records from the range of merchandise because dealers were not prepared to shoulder the total stock risk. As a result, he foresaw opportunities for expansion of racking. "Shops which are wary of committing to a stock investment become ideal prospects for conversion to racking," said Smyth.

Sir Charles won his first Grammy for the above record and another first time recipient was Neville Marriner for the Best Choral Performance Haydn: The Creation, for Philips.

Yoko Ono received the award for Album Of The Year, Double Fantasy, on Geffen Records. Sheena Easton was named Best New Artist while The Police won awards for Best Rock Group and for the Best Instrumental, 'Behind My Camel'.

Other incidentals included an award for the cover of the Rolling Stones' Tattoo You album designed by Peter Coriston, and Quincy Jones picking up his eleventh Grammy for his arrangement of 'Ai No Corrida', written by Englishman Chas Jankel.

## MAM denies singer's 'con' court claim

POP MANAGER Gordon Mills told the High Court in London last week how he gambled on the talen of Gilbert O'Sullivan and made him into a star. He told Mr Justice Mars Jones that he was "intrigued" by tapes and photographs O'Sullivan sent him in 1979 when working as a postal clerk in London

Despite doubts expressed by others in the music business Mills agreed to become his manager and produce his records. Mills was opening the defence evidence on the eighth day of a hearing in which O'Sullivan is asking for cancellation of a number of agreements made between himself, and Mills and, Management Agency and Music Ltd.

O'Sullivan has claimed that the agreements were illegal and deprived him of copyright over his own works as well as substantial sums in royalties. During the early 1970s, Mills said he developed a strong personal relationship with O'Sullivan. "He became like a member of the family or a very close friend," said Mills.

But the relationship turned sour when the two disagreed over the way the records should be produced. Crossexamined by O'Sullivan's counsel, Andrew Bateson, Mills denied having "conned" his young protege or that he had taken advantage of his implicit trust. He said all the management, recording and publishing agreements. were explained to O'Sullivan fully before he signed them.

He also denied that he had set up companies which served no purpose other than to cream off royalties. Raymond O'Sullivan and Gilbert O'Sullivan Ltd are asking the court to set aside agreement made with Mills, of Los Angeles, and with the MAM Group, of New Bond Street, London. O'Sullivan is also asking the judge to cancel employment agreements made with Ebostrail Ltd, of Chancery Lane, London, and a recording agreement with CBS Inc. in New York.

The defendants all deny O'Sullivan's claims that the agreements were illegal and are counter-claiming for breach of

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
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## Record labels can sue bootleggers, says court

RECORD COMPANIES, as well as their artistes under exclusive contract, are entitled to sue those who deal in bootleg recordings of live performances, Mr Justice Vinelott ruled in the High Court last week.

The judge dismissed an application by Geoffrey Pollard, of Langley Moor, Durham, seeking to strike out a damages claim by RCA Corporation and RCA Ltd, on the grounds that it disclosed no reasonable cause of action. against the ruling.

RCA allege that Pollard had dealt in bootleg records of the late Elvis Presley, who was under exclusive contract to the company.

The judge rejected Pollard's argument that the Performers Protection Act was passed solely for the benefit of performers, and not for the record companies. He said the company was entitled to sue to protect its interests.

Barry McCloud Enterprises has also formed a new division called Punch Distribution, acting as auxilliary distributors to clients served by the group's promotion arm but will also take on work from outside firms. Noted Designs is a company set up by McCloud and designer Babette Landau with offices in both Shepperton and California.

## Indies stick to rules and sell more

A RECENT headline in RB read "UK indie system can now deliver hits on its own" but, equally, the headline could have read "Too many small labels missing out on sales".

I believe the indies could deliver many more hits if only some of them adhered to certain principles and their product was more readily available to dealers. Despite the heavy promotion and advertising of such as Red Lightning, Spartan, Stage One, Pinnacle and the 'indie consortium' very few indie singles see the light of day in the Top 75.

Naturally, when an item gets airplay customers ask for it and retailers find it listed. Inevitably both customer and retailer get pretty annoyed when supplies are not forthcoming. More often than not, the problem lies with the small

Distributors and the promotional vehicles such as the consumer and trade press, as well as radio stations, reap the wrath of customers through retailers as a result. In many instances the indie situation is deplorable and it is high time that the industry as a whole did something about it.

story of 'The Morris Minor Song' by a gentleman called Mike Redway. He published it under his own label Red Rock Music and gave it the catalogue number RR1 - as every retailer knows, a number which belongs to RAK Replay's 'House Of The Rising Sun' by The Animals. Copies were supplied to radio stations without any accompanying release information.

As it happens my local BBC radio station was just beginning a series of phone-ins on the subject of old cars which led to it sponsoring a rally. The record was ideal and was featured for several weeks. The rally was a great success and a local hit was there for the

Four months later, after much effort, I released on a new label called Button, through PRT, with the number BTN 101. I needed a few copies for those customers who had hung on, but PRT

did not have the number on the computer.

A further month later it did register on PRT deivery notes but as a 'new release'. Still no records. Redway rang me himself at the time and told me that he had seen 500 copies on the shelf at PRT. Having been played in August the record finally arrived in time for Christ-

To my mind the lessons are: that there must be tighter control on catalogue numbers; BBC and ILR stations should not play records unless they have some information as to their source; and the popular and trade press should avoid publication of release information which cannot be justified.

(Information is printed in good faith as supplied by distributors and labels, justification enough for publication - Editor.)

Unfortunately this is not an isolated case. Radio-2 is still giving isolated play to the Dragonic Bros 'Dance Little Birdie' - RB listed October 5 as on the Picador label PIC 1, through Pinnacle. The distributors know nothing of it while the label is nowhere to be found. There are labels which change arrangements after release information has gone out. Even when an address is given, enquiries are often ignored = GG Records is a prime example.

I have mentioned Pinnacle quite a lot but there are many other distributors of To illustrate the problem here is the indie labels. As Paul Groves of Pinnacle told me: "As often as not we are let down by the labels we hande. We set everything up, notify the trade press, get whites out for airplay, the orders start coming in, then the label runs out of money or something and supplies don't turn up.

> As things stand, if one of the recognised indie distributors refuses to handle an item it goes totally on its own with the likelihood of even less control and availability to the average retailer. To the small record companies and independent labels I say: If you confuse the retailer don't expect sales.

To the industry I say Sort It Out. Issue a code of practice requiring promo discs to be accompanied by licensing copyright, origination and marketing was informed that the single would be information. ### Counterfeit tape case is 'feather in industry's cap'

PICKWICK RECORDS (Ireland) and EMI (Ireland) have been granted permanent injunctions against Apollo 1 and Sean Fagan Wholesalers. In two separate cases the record companies brought actions against the wholesalers for dealing in counterfeit cassette tapes. The injunction prohibits the wholesalers from selling counterfeit tapes and costs and damages were awarded to the record companies.

Shay Hennessey of Pickwick Ireland, chairman of the IFPI, said that it was almost impossible to assess the sales lost as a result of these counterfeit tapes. He added that it was a particular feather in the cap for the industry and its prompt action to stamp out this kind of operation. Pickwick and EMI took their fund of IR£2,000. action on behalf of the whole record industry in Ireland, a fact that can be seen from the list of artists counterfeited. Apart from EMI and Pickwick names like Barry Manilow, Duran Duran and Sheena Easton, the bogus tapes also included albums by Police, Joan Armatrading, Chris de Burgh and Meat Loaf.

THE NATIONAL Song Contest 1982, held to find Ireland's entry for the Eurovision Song Contest in Harrogate on April 24, is to be held in Dublin on Sunday March 14.

The contest, produced by RTE, takes place in its studios in Donnybrook, Dublin. There are eight songs in the final heat of the contest, which attracted an initial entry of over 400 songs. The eight finalists are: 'Is There Anyone Out There' written by Jody McStravick and sung by the composer; 'Tissue of Lies' written by Paul Lyttle and sung by Chips, 'All Over Again' written by Andy O'Callaghan and sung by Deuce of Hearts (Aileen Pringle and Roger Gillen); 'Wherever You Go' written by Daniel McGann sung by Tony Kenny; 'Here Today Gone Tomorrow' written by Sally Keating and sung by The Duskeys: 'Qu'il Passe' written by Alan Jamison and Iain Frederick and sung by Iain Frederick; 'Go Raibh Maith Agat' written by Thomas McParland (sung by last year's winners Sheeba); and 'Goodbye To Loneliness' written by Siobhan Kennedy and Kevin Keating and sung by Heads. Of the eight composers, one

has written a winning National Song before. He is Paul Lyttle who wrote 'Cross Your Heart', Ireland's 1974 Eurovision entry.

Meanwhile in Charleville, Co. Cork the fifth Song of the South International Song Contest takes place on Thursday June 17. The prize here is IR£2,200 plus trophies. The fund is divided up thus: IR£1,000 for the first place; IR£300 for second; IR£200 for third and each of the remaining finalists will receive IR£100. Closing date for entries is Monday March 31 and entry forms can he had from Song of the South International Song Contest, Charleville, Co. Cork, Ireland (telephone Charleville 744). The Charleville contest also operates a system of travel grants to enable composers to attend the contest.

Another song contest just announced is the 3rd Ballina International Amateur Song Contest, for May 4-7 with a prize

1982 IS not just another year in the eyes of Eurovision winning composer Shay Healy. For 1982, the centenary year of James Joyce's birth, is being marked by the release of a special record. 'Finnegan Are You Really Dead?' is written by Shay Healy and Gerald Davis and performed by established folk-singer Danny Doyle. The idea of evoking the sense of place and characters of Joyce's writings in song was first suggested by artist and Joyce enthusiast Gerald Davis. He contacted Healy and put the idea to him.



AS JANET KAY's 'You Bring The Sun Out' on Black Roots continues to put the lovers rock among the disco in this week's top 50, the record has also been picked up by a major label. It will be released by Phonogram next week on Megafunk, in both 7-inch and 12-inch versions, catalogue numbers MF 2 and MFX 2 respectively. Also going to the Phonogram/Decca group via ex-Casablanca label manager's new Project Records set-up are Goldie Alexander's import hit 'Go Back' (still hanging onto its top 50 anchor position for the second week in a row), and the remix of Barbara Roy and Ecstacy, Passion & Pain's 'If You Want Me' which also saw some strong regional action and a touch in the lower end of the charts recently. The Goldie Alexander catalogue numbers are PRI/ PRJX 1, and Barbara Roy's are PRJ/ PRJX 2.

Back too after a quiet spell is the indie disco label Record Shack, which has two new 12-inchers on the market immediately: 'Close Your Eyes' by Queen Samantha (SHACK 1210), and the Oceans with 'Racific Dream' (SHACK 12 9). Most indie wholesalers will probably have these eventually, but dealers wanting speedy servicing should contact Record Shack direct on 01-437 3655, as the initial shipment will be self-distributed.

Again the flow of imports seems a healthy one. The new winner looks like being the 12-inch by Sharon Brown, 'I Specialise In Love' (Profile); this has already made the RB top 50 in almost record time for an unknown song and artist. New albums from across the waves are War's Outlaws (RCA), Ambiance by Nolan & Crossley (Gordy), the Dazz Band on Live It Up (Motown), France Joli's Now (Prelude), and Charles Earland with Earland's Jam (US Columbia).

With jazz-funk going strong, plus some noticeable echoes of the swing and be-bop eras apparent in current pop, jazz is healthier than for years, as **Chris Welch** reports.

## More albums out as new generation discovers jazz

and WEA have both announced new jazz-only labels, and Charly is to begin releasing the classic Bethlehem cata-

Charlie Parker, Freddie Hubbard, Eric Gale, Ornette Coleman, Duke Ellington, Dexter Gordon and Archie Shepp are among the top names to be featured. And many contemporary jazz artists will be given rock star treatment, and signed to longterm contracts instead of one-off deals.

It's good news for artists and fans. For years jazz has been suffering from neglect at the hands of record companies, discouraged by poor sales. Small independent labels proved there was still a market for jazz of all styles and from all eras. Now the rise of jazz-funk

A JAZZ boom has encouraged record has reawakened interest in improvised companies to launch new jazz labels and music among young record buyers. step up album output. Island Records Jazz, with its huge variety of stylists and sounds, is being discovered by a new generation.

> So far the interest has been reflected in a growth in the number of jazz venues and jazz-rock groups. This has also benefitted older musicians, now being hailed as heroes. For example veteran tenor saxist Flip Phillips played nightly to packed houses during his London visit. But so far this trend has not been reflected in a significant rise in album sales. Greater public awareness of the quantity and quality of records available is the key.

> There is no reason why companies should lose money on jazz. Artists can make albums in much less time and more cheaply than the average rock band, hungry for large advances and hours of studio time. When production costs are low and budgets are tight, then sales of up to 10,000 can seem attractive.

> SUCH ECONOMICS have made sense to the major companies, where top executives who are also jazz fans have been given the chance to support the music they love. Elektra Musician for example, being launched by WEA is in the care of Bruce Lunvall, one time president of Columbia who joined Elektra in New York last year.

> Says London Elektra spokesman Simon Frodsham: "Bruce is a great jazz fan and is highly respected in jazz circles. He has been given this new label to run and there will be 20 releases this year, with the first batch due this week."

> The albums also have informative sleeve notes, written by the artists, where possible. Among the first batch of albums set for release are Griffith Park Collection (K52361), featuring Lennie White, Chick Corea and Freddie Hubbard; Eric Gale's Blue Horizon (K52349); Ira Sullivan and Red Rodney's Spirit Within (K52360); Freddie Hubbard's Ride Like The Wind (K52362); a re-issue of John McLaughlin's My Goals Beyond (K52364); and Lee Ritenour's Rio (K52350), a collection of 'live' recordings featuring Lee on acoustic guitar.


One of the most interesting of the scheduled releases is Charlie Parker With The Orchestra (K52359), a previously unreleased recording from 1953 when Parker apparently sat in and jammed with a string orchestra in Washington. The tape has been held by recordist Bill Potts for 29 years, until Bruce Lunvall negotiated a deal for its release. And says Simon Frodsham: "The sound quality is surprisingly

THE JAM: The Gift (Polydor POLD 5055) Prod: Peter Wilson

Majestic new album from The Jam, destined for a long run at the top of the LP chart. The band's political stance has hardened up with a change of sound to coincide - presumably by courtesy of new producer Peter Wilson - and with the addition of a brass section on much of the material there is a definite Motown influence to be discerned. Other cuts have the relentless beat and mild hysteria of Teardrop Explodes, and most show an increasing maturity in Paul Weller's songwriting as he attacks town planners, or the confused political ambitions of the working man, with whom he is now strongly identified.

VARIOUS: Twenty With A Bullet (EMI EMTV 32) Prod: Various

EMI's TV hits compilation features recent number one 'The Model' by Kraftwerk and 'Golden Brown' by The Stranglers which deserved the position but stuck at number two. Hits from EMI artists both from the UK and US top track here is the Grammy award winning 'Bette Davis Eyes' from Kim Carnes. All the songs included were hits either this year or last, with the exception of The Dots' 'Helen In Your Headphones', Classix Nouveaux 'Is It A Dream' and Billy Squier 'The Stroke'. Names such as Diana Ross, Kim Olivia Newton-John and Sheena Easton should sell the collec-

## Best of the rest

STEEL PULSE: True Democracy (Wiseman Doctrine WMDLP 001) Prod: Karl Pitterson

Now on their own label, Birmingham's Steel Pulse continue their progress towards being the best British reggae band in the business. Highly-charged with Rasta sentiments though the material generally is, the band has a great feel for a good melody and in Ronald McQueen and Steve Nesbitt possess a rhythm section to rival many a Jamaican outfit. 'Blues Dance Raid' is a particularly 'English' black song, but 'Ravers', for instance, is a catchy dance song which cleverly uses a certain recent disco hit as a hook.

PIGBAG: Dr Heckle and Mr Jive (Y Records Y 17) Prod: Pigbag/Disc O'Dell

The marathon success of 'Poppa's Got A Brand New Pigbag' points to a band that has a great deal of grassroots appeal and this debut album proves that the outfit has more than one shot in the locker. Six multiinstrumentalists with a taste for the bizarre and a choppy beat, they mix perfectly serious improvised passages with outright whimsy like 'Brian The Snail'. Listen to 'Orangutango' in-store and see if it gets the feet moving. Distribution is via Rough Trade.

GAMMA: Gamma 3 (Elektra K 52355) Prod: Ronnie Montrose

Surprisingly deft new album from Ronnie Montrose's Gamma project that is still firmly in the American hard-rock vein without relying for its total effect on Montrose's penchant for the powerchord. Lyrically quite strong and in places arranged like a British record, the band seems to have hit an intelligent groove that combines driving rock with tunes and brains.

SINGERS & PLAYERS: Revenge Of The Underdog (On-U/Situation 2 SITU 4) Prod: Adrian Sherwood

A collection of musicians from such luminaries as Creation Rebel and the Roots Radics Band with vocals from Prince Far-I among others. Producer Adrian Sherwood is a master at collecting talented musicians and creating enjoyable albums from what would be called jams in rock terms. The New Age Steppers is probably the best example of the standards which can be achieved. Price Far-I stands out as the vocalist on several good tracks but musicians such as Crucial Tony do well in the unacustomed role of singer. First class reggae recorded in the UK.

MICHAEL NYMAN: Michael Nyman (Sheet SHEET 1) Prod: Michael Nyman/David Cunningham

One of those superb off-the-wall albums which promises nothing and delivers extravagantly. A tongue in cheek cover sticker describes the music as 'Gothic Rhapsodies' and advises dealers to file under 'Pop' or 'Birdsongs'. Nyman, and his band of iazz and classical musicians, have captured in five short tracks and one longer work a rich vein of melodies which sets this album apart. Production by David 'Flying Lizards' Cunningham completes the idiosyncratic success.

NICODEMUS/TOYAN: DJ Clash (Greensleeves GREL 32) Prod: Henry 'Junjo' Lawes

The choice is the listeners' - will they vote for ante-post favourite Toyan or Nicodemus. Greensleeves' latest idea is to set these two rapping DJs in competition, taking a track in turn throughout the album. Both are backed by the excellent Roots Radics Band and truthfully there is little between them. The music is high quality Jamaican reggae which should sell well. The album contains a printed postcard so that the public can vote which they thought the better vocalist.

LAURA LÖĞIC: Pedigree Charm (Rough Trade ROUGH 28) Prod: Phil/Steve/Laura

Throughout a career which has included X-Ray Spex and Essential Logic saxaphone player Laura has garnered her fair share of critical acclaim but precious little commercial success. This album contains her most commercial work to date, including the excellent single 'Wonderful Offer which could still be a hit given the right promotion. The remainder of the album sees Laura and four musicians in fine form with good material.
