

ALL ABOUT THE LOOT—THE 2nd GROUP TO EMERGE FROM ANDOVER (HOME OF THE TROGGS)

LARRY PAGE once upon a time found a group in Andover, of all places. Group was called The Troggs and we all know what happened when they were let loose upon the industry with "Wild Thing" and so on. "Andover?—where's that?" people queried, except me—and I used to live near

there.

Now Larry has come up with yet another star-sounding outfit from the very same town. No wonder he says: "I'm thinking of becoming a naturalised Andoverian" . . . as he introduces The Loot. Five fellows in this group and it looks as if they'll match, near enough, the immediate impact of their fellow townsfolk, the four-strong Troggsse "Big bad bass sounds" . . . says Larry. "That's why I'm so convinced that 'Baby Come Closer' will hit the charts. I'm also sure that lead singer Chris Bates, who is twenty, will be very big." Chris is quite clearly a character. He is a horse-racing enthusiast and at home rides his own Irish stallion, "Shamus" . He, being a character, has a mother who is a character: a marvellous lady who cycles through the streets of Andover with her parrot, "Peter Green", perched on the handlebars.

There is also rhythm guitarist, 21-year-old Dave Wright, who missed out on being a Trogg by 48 hours exactly. He decided to leave the Troggs just before they came to London and make a name .. Dave staying behind to work on his career as an engineer with a firm making articulated lorries. He also has a horse. If I tell you it is called "Wild Thing"

There is Jeff Glover, 19, bassist, who used to be a Civil Servant and also a member of the Soul Agents. His horse is called "Rocket", and I tell you no lie. Roger Pope, eighteen-year-old drummer, is a highly talented young man . . oh, yes, his horse is called "Big Fellow". The "outcast" who doesn't even have a horse is called Bruce Turner, and he is a fine guitarist and says he USED to be a trendsetter. "There is a threat that the others will buy me a donkey," says Bruce. Anyway, this group called Loot: they tour with the Troggs and Gene Pitney and everything is clicking into place to give them an undeniable start in the business. Larry Page, himself once a singing "rage", is no slouch when it comes to organising a career and he is blandly confident that the Loot will make it. Even more sure than he is that Chelsea Football Club will win the League championship.

Says spokesman Dave Wright: "What we really need now is a television series of our own. After all, if something is good enough for Andover these days, it's surely good enough for the rest of the world."

Andover? A Hampshire township of some 17,000 souls. Early closing Wednesday, Market Day on Saturday, 66 miles from London, pubs open at 10.30 in the morning.

Ray Davies on Holly, & the rocking Kinks



ne of the nice things about interviewing Ray Davies is that he doesn't come out with all the usual stock phrases that most group members do. You can't predict what he's going to say about anything which makes a change from most groups who are ultra-predictable and type-cast.

Funnily enough, whenever I talk to Ray the subject seems to work around to Buddy Holly who is a mutual favourite of us both. It was eight years ago to this week when Buddy Holly died, on February 3, 1959.

"When Buddy Holly was alive, I wonder if anyone used to interview him and write things about him like this" mused Ray. "I remember reading things about him, with the Crickets posing with Cricket bats and all that. But his records — you know, they still sound so fresh. The voice is clear and stands up above the backing, and the guitar sound is so good. I don't know why they bother to alter the backings, the original ones were great.

"It must be uncanny when they play about with the master tapes and re-dub backings. Because in between the different vocal takes, you would be able to hear Buddy's voice talking to the producer and the Crickets — all this stuff is left on the tape — telling them what went wrong, and what to do and everything. It must be strange hearing someone talking informally like this, someone who has been dead for eight years."

"It must have been very strange for him to hear his own father's voice on those tapes. I'm surprised that Hank Williams hasn't become more popular I thought he could have been the next thing after Chuck Berry..."

Ray went on to talk about the attitudes of the rest of the group lowards the type of songs that they are now recording.

"I think that Pete and Dave are happier playing rock in roll. Mick and I seem to prefer the kind of thing that were doing now, but I'd like to make a rock in roll record — as a single. Yes! I think we're capable of it, but I'm afraid that everyone would think we were copying the Trougss!

"I can't see us changing the type of song that everyone with the seem of t

"Yes: it was great there, I don't usually enjoy touring too much — it's the travelling. I like playing though, and in Germany the audiences were fine Perhaps a bit older than here. DEL Shannon looked justifiably pleased with himself. After a longish spell in the wilderness that lies OUTSIDE the charts, he'd arrived in London to excellent reviews for his new single "She." He said: "At long last, this is what we were looking for. This is what we've been after . . ."

It was written and produced by Tommy Boyce and Bobby Hart, the young couple who perform similar chores for the Monkees, which can't be bad. Said Del: "It's been great knowing that so many fans in Britain keep rooting for me—you can't blame me for saying they're the most faithful in the world."

With or without a hit, Del remains one of the key figures in the pop world... part of the development of today's sounds. What, I wondered, did he think was the strongest thing he had contributed? Said Del: "Oh, the falsetto for sure. And also the organ sound. They'd be the main trademarks. But now everybody's got in on both those sounds. It's pleasing, but there is a difference between my falsetto and most of the others. With me, it goes like this ..." And he let rip a couple of falsetto notes, proving the power and the purity.

Del, of course, started his musical career in Germany while serving with the Field Artillery Unit of the U.S.
7th. Army. On demob, he turned to real estate as a career but maintained his interest in singing. Later he made demo discs of some of his own songs: and "Runaway" was the immediate massive-hit result. He's a great booster of British products, notably the diate massive-hit result. He's a great booster of British products, notably the Beatles and Shirley Bassey, and Roy Orbison remains one of his great personal favourites. favourites.

Of a more personal level, it's obvious that Del (decorated in a flare-sleeved polka dot white shirt and a jacket that defies description) still keeps himself very fit.

At one stage he wanted to be a professional footballer, which would have suited his massively muscled shoulders, but instead was invited to step inside a recruiting depot. He still fishes, boats, bowls and plays the odd game of football. But, hit or not, he is one of the busiest performers in American pop, touring nonstop and currently based on the West Coast where he feels the action is currently at.



"Pop music has struggled to better itself, to lift itself from maudling depths. It's succeeded, by and large. But now the Monkees, by the sheer sham phoniness of their sudden jump to stardom, have put the whole industry back five years. Why? Because they have been, launched as recording stars without having any basis of talent. If four good-looking boys, with no talent, can top the charts — can beat the sales of real stars — then it's all worthless.

"I'm not saying they can't play at all. I'm saying that they can't play well. I'm also saying that their TV series, fount of 90 per cent of their disc fame, is blatantly based on the earlier Beatle films

of their disc fame, is blatantly based on the earlier Beatle films . . . and that they owe a lot of their disc hits to Beatle influences. I'd feel less strongly about them if only they had tried to adapt something completely new. It's like some massive act of retaliation by the Americans, still smarting over Beatle-domination. "I'm not worried even about the allegations that the Monkees only sang on their disc sessions. There's a touch of fraud about it, but it does happen with other groups. But the whole thing smacks of a big-business attitude of: These boys will be successful because





After the show, there was a mad dash off-stage straight into The Beatles' limousine, loaned for the tour by Brian Epstein Back to The May Fair After everyone had bathed and changed, the idea was to take over The Bag o' Nails. In the end, nobody made it. And a party began in the hotel which finally finished around eight a.m. Just over an hour later, there was a mass exodus. To coach, car and train And we were all en route to Liverpool.

At the famed sedate Adelphi hotel, NEMS PRO Tony Barrow and Brian's ultra-hospitable brother. Clive Epstein, awaited us. A press party ensued Then another frantic rush. To the Odeon, Lead singer Levi Stubbs — the hardest-working, most professional performer of his kind I've ever known — nearly missed the first show. After snatching his first hour's sleep in two days. But he made it. And went on-stage and sang his heart out. To what was meant to be a tough "we-heard-it-all-years-ago-wack" audience. And really broke it up.
