Instead they paced themselves so that there would be loads of free time for exploration between shows. Their music became like a globel package tour of influences which were knitted together with increasing skill. David Sylvien has become a kind of musical David

Attenborough. "Travel is important," mused Devie. "It shows in the progression of the albums. In the first two we hadn't really travelled at all and it's not until "Quiet Life' thet you start picking up the influences.

"When you arrive in a piece for the first time, the smell and temperature are so different. It's very distinctive and that's something I love to recreate on






