

Yorkshire-born boys, Mike and Ali grew up in Liverpool and were — until recently — "religious" Koppites. Like most hrothers, they fought. "Over everything," they chorused.

"He'd want to listen to the radio," said Ali, "and I'd want the telly on. Parents were out at work and we'd start fighting. We had smashed noses, black eyes, cauliflower-ears, scratches, bites, all kinds of things."

"There was one," added Mike, "where me mate Ian tried to hreak it up. So we beat him up, the two of us. He interfered much too early in the proceedings."

With his smalled nose. Mike grew up to become a bardresser, ending up with two shops, both of which disappeared as his interest in musc increased. Punctuality, you will oft hear it lamented, is rare indaed amongst musicians. The two membars of Blancmange are no excaption. To his credit. Stephen Luscombe only keeps your reporter waiting 20 Arthur strolls in, sevaral cups of coffea have been downed, two hefty toasted bacon and tomato sandwiches devoured, and a full hour passed by.

Strangely enough, his excusa note stands up to closa scrutiny None of your usual tales of traffic jams and idiot cab drivars. No, Neil has bean to the doctor. Seams thara's somathing mysterious wrong with his blood, an after effect of a bout of food poisoning. This was brought on by injudiciously munching a "a faw too many sea urchins" whila making their "Living On The Ceiling" video in Cairo. Ah yes. Egypt.

"I hated it!" axclaims Stephen. "I was shocked by it!" declares Nail.

"You sae, we'd never bean to a Middle Eastern country before, Stephen alaborates.

I havan't actually travallad much at all," admits Nail, "I've been to Wales for my holidays 14 times.

And they'ra off. When Blancmanga get excited thara's no stopping them. It's the double act approach to interviews interrupting each other, finishing each other's santences, and oftan collapsing into laughter.

We said, let's do a bit of music together. It didn't mean that would be it and we'd see each other every day." "Get marriad," Stephen starts

glggling. "That'd be nice," chuckles Neil.

When we have an initial idea about some music," Nell takes up, "wa often used to reprasent it pictorially. Because neither of us can read music we'd do graphic charts, like blocks of colour or shapes to show whether somathing would build up or slow down. It sounds daft, but it was really good."

"Graphics also teaches you to ba resourceful, to use a bit of initiative.

And thare's one more thing they both have in common. They are sick to death of jokas about jellies, moulds, puddings, desserts ... "The thing is," chucklas Neil, "We started it."

"But when we invented the name Blancmange we didn't think it would go this far," arguas Stephen. "We had no raal ambitions, it happened by accidant."
